CARA

Countable Athletically Related Activities

- **CARA**
 - Any required activity with an athletics purpose involving student-athletes.
 - At the direction of, or supervised by a coaching staff member.
- Academics, compliance meetings, travel days, time spent in training room, promotional activities are not considered countable.
- Practice, Competition, Strength/Conditioning, Film, Team Meetings are all countable.

Countable Athletically Related Activities

■ In Season

- 20 hours per week (your declared week)
- One day off per week
- Maximum 4 hours per day
- Competition Day is 3 hours, regardless how long it lasts.

■ Out of Season

- 8 hours per week
- Maximum 2 hours of skill instruction, the rest can be weight training and conditioning.
- Two days off per week

Countable Athletically Related Activities

- **September 15/April 15**

- Prior to September 15 and after April 15, if you are 'out of season' (i.e. 8-hour weeks) no more than 4 student-athletes may participate in skill instruction at one time, in any facility.
- 4 student-athletes in new practice facility with Coach A, 4 student-athletes on Coors court with Coach B. **IMPERMISSIBLE.**
- 2 student-athletes at Prentup with Coach A, 2 student-athletes in the bubble with Coach B. **PERMISSIBLE.**

Countable Athletically Related Activities

■ Finals Week

- If you are 'out of season' (i.e. 8-hour weeks) it is not permissible to conduct CARA during finals week and the week prior.
- Student-athletes may work out on their own, but coaches cannot be around, nor can it be required. VOLUNTARY!

■ Conditioning Activities

- Cannot simulate offensive or defensive alignments.
- Equipment cannot be used.

Countable Athletically Related Activities

- **Voluntary Activities**

- SA cannot report back to staff any information regarding the activity.
- Activity must be initiated and requested solely by the SA.
- SA's attendance and participation (or lack of) may not be recorded for reporting info to coaches.
- SA cannot be subject to penalty or rewarded for participation or lack of.

- Once you have reached your limit for the day/week student-athletes cannot request more work with the coach.

- Exceptions: Safety exception sports.

Playing and Practice Seasons

Playing and Practice Seasons

Your season should already be declared and turned into Jo.

- Once you have declared your 'week' it must remain the same.
- Count all days except vacation and holidays when practice is not required and the day off for that week.
- All sports other than FB and basketball may divide season into two consecutive segments.
- All regular season competition must be included in the count as well as conference championships.

Playing and Practice Seasons

- Date of competition: A single date on which any games/matches/meets/exhibitions/scrimmage or joint practices with another institution take place.
 - Regardless of formality.
 - Between CU's team or an individual representing CU and any other team or individual not representing CU.
- A practice that includes CU and another institution would be considered a countable contest

August 1st Legislation

New Legislation –August 1

- June, July, August recruiting—no need to tag back to campus, provided no more than the permissible number of coaches are recruiting on the same day.
- Media Guides—may be sent via hyperlink or attachment to an email only. No more flash drives, DVDs, hard copies.

New Legislation –August 1

- Comp Tickets—UOV can now use nontraditional family exception to receive 5 tickets.
- Senior Banquet—CU may provide complimentary admissions for the student-athlete's parents or legal guardians on one occasion at an institutional awards banquet at which the SA is being honored.

Recruiting Materials

Permissible Mailings

- September 1 (June 15 for MBB) begins when you may send mailings to juniors.
- Permissible:
 - Letter on CU Letterhead
 - CU Note Card/Postcard with only logo and institution's name.
 - Business Card
- Game programs may only be provided during official or unofficial visit. CANNOT BE MAILED!

Impermissible Mailings

- Impermissible:
 - Media Guide
 - Posters
 - Anything created with a recruiting purpose
 - Schedule Cards
 - Cash
 - Anything personalized with PSA's photo.

Permissible Mailings

- Always Permissible:
 - Camp Brochure
 - Questionnaire
 - NCAA Guide For the College Bound Student-Athlete
 - Institutional (not athletics) information such as admissions, academic brochures

CU vs. CSU Football Game

September 17th

CU vs. CSU 2011

- This game is considered a HOME game for CU for the 2011 year, therefore CU may provide complimentary admissions for prospects on both official and unofficial visits.
- CU may also provide tickets to HS coaches, maximum 2 tickets.

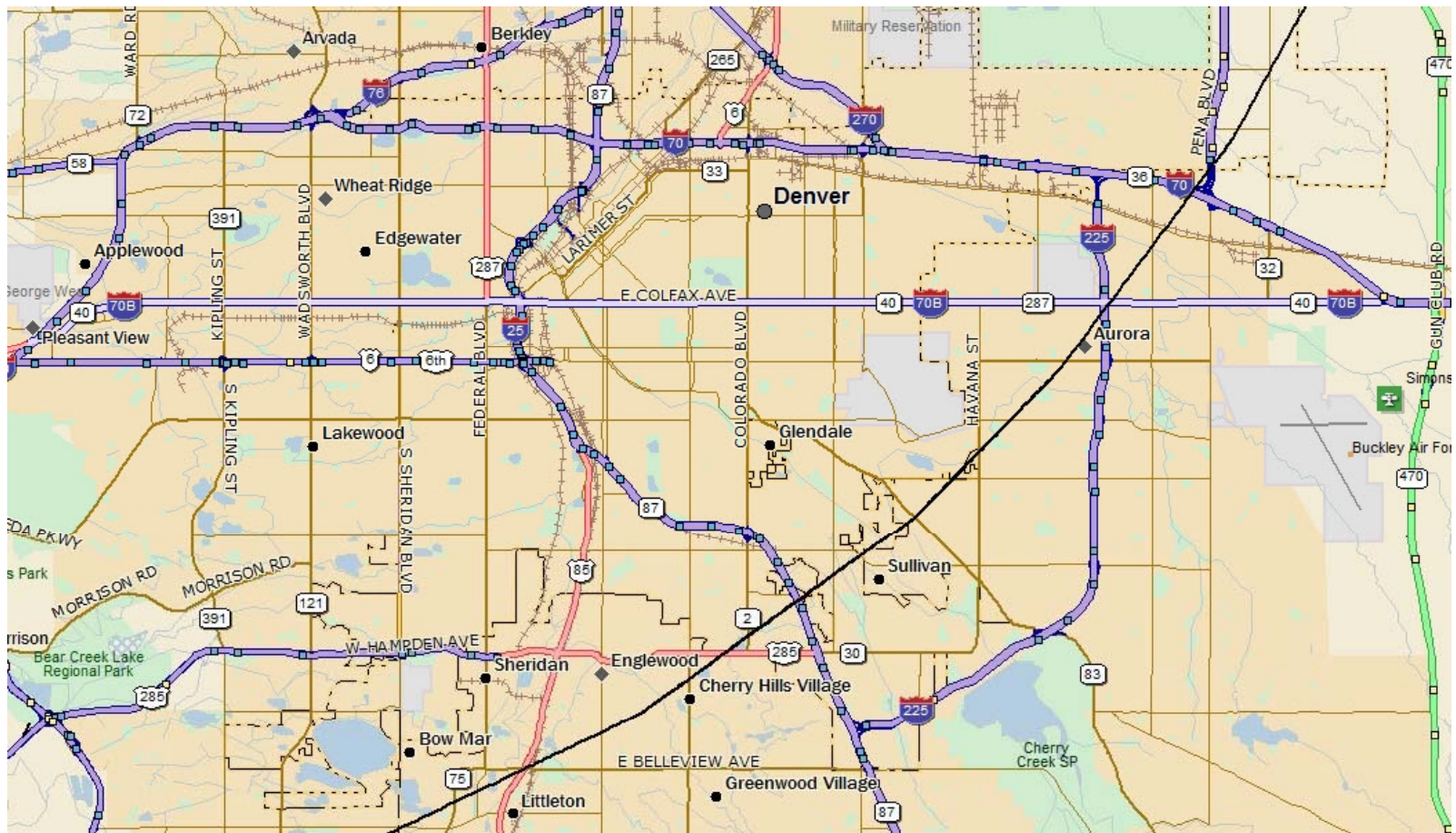
CU vs. CSU 2011

- OFFICIAL VISITS:

- May provide three tickets, five if nontraditional family.
- May provide transportation and parking for the game.
- May have a meal in the area of the game—please be mindful of the 30-mile radius.

CU vs. CSU 2011

- UNOFFICIAL VISITS:
- Bylaw 13.7.2.2 - Home Games at Site Other Than Regular Home Facility.
 - If an institution schedules any regular-season home games at a site not designated as its regular home facility, the host institution may provide a maximum of **three** complimentary admissions to any such game for the exclusive use of a prospective student-athlete and those persons accompanying the prospective student-athlete. Tournament and postseason games are excluded. The institution shall not arrange or permit any other entertainment or payment of expenses, including transportation.

CU vs. CSU 2011

- UNOFFICIAL VISITS:
 - Only three tickets—did not change with new legislation.
 - May NOT provide transportation to the game.
 - May NOT have a meal in the area of the game, unless you are utilizing one of your three permissible contacts with a **senior**.
 - SENIORS ONLY!
 - They must pay for their meal.
 - Be aware of the # of coaches you have recruiting off-campus at one time.

CU vs. CSU 2011

- Staff Tickets

- Staff Tickets are typically club seats.
- These tickets cannot be provided to prospects or their family or coaches.
- It is permissible for PSAs to be in the club prior to but not during the game. The same goes for being on the field (if Invesco allows this.)

Pac-12 Legislation

Pac-12 Legislation

- \$70 per diem for Official Visit meals.
 - This is for breakfast, lunch and dinner—not the snack.
 - Does not include tip, tax or other set up or catering fees.
- 48 Hour Departure—approved by FAR.
