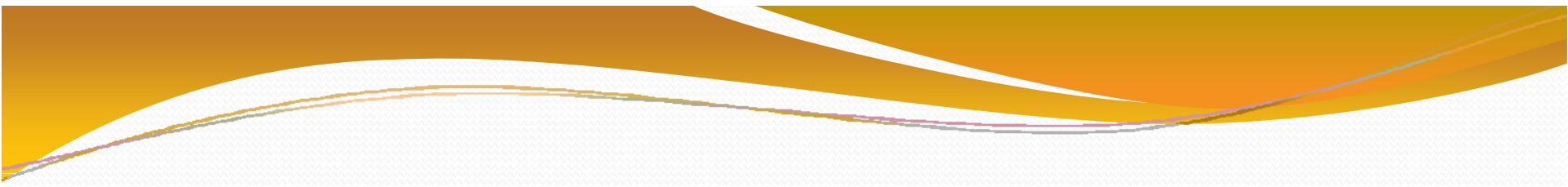
SPORTS OTHER THAN FOOTBALL/MEN'S BASKETBALL

- Proposal 2010-30 was overturned so the legislation that was going to be effective August 1, 2011 is tabled until October 2011.
- You will continue making permissible phone calls as you were able to do so.
 - July 1 of their senior year.
- WBB—you will continue with:
 - 1 call in April (jr year), 1 call in May (jr year), 1 call June 1-20, 1 call June 21-30, 3 calls in July (1 per week), 1 per week thereafter and unlimited during contact period of senior year.



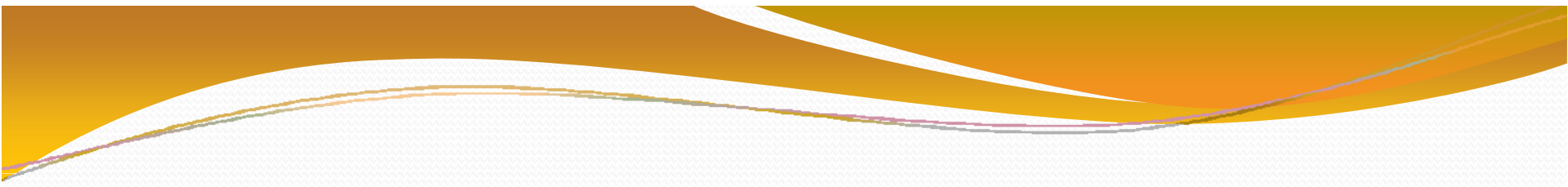

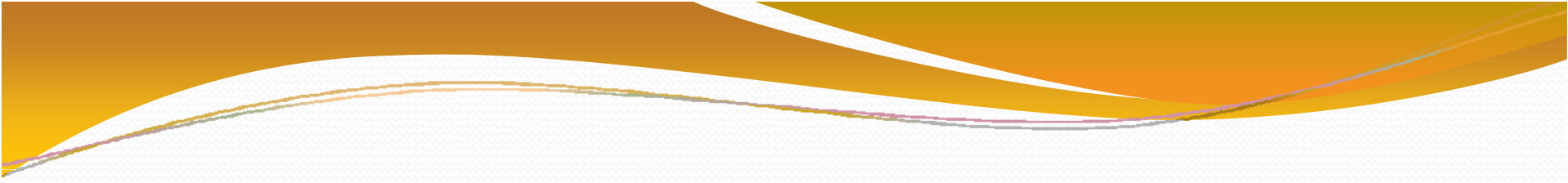
Definition of a Prospect

- Any student who has started 9th grade, regardless of athletic ability, until they enroll at a 4-year institution.
- Two-Year College students.
- Prep school students.
- MBB ONLY-7th through 12th grade.



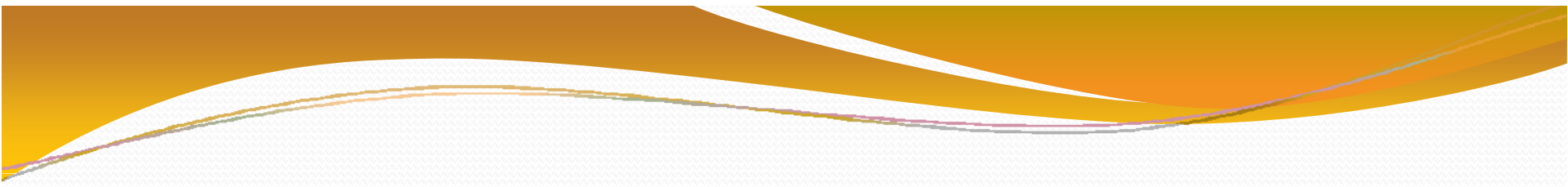
Telephone Calls

- Starting July 1 following PSA's junior year.
- One phone call per week.
- Week = Sunday - Saturday
- Once you have reached your limit, no additional calls, even if you know PSA will not answer.
- Cross Country/Track, Volleyball—unlimited calls during a contact period in their senior year.



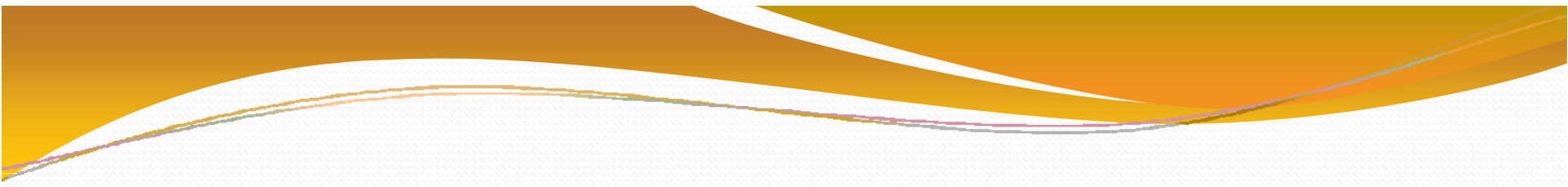
Men's Basketball

- 1 call per month June 15 following sophomore year through July 31 following junior year.
- 2 calls per week starting August 1 prior to senior year.
- Unlimited calls during contact periods beginning August 1 prior to senior year.



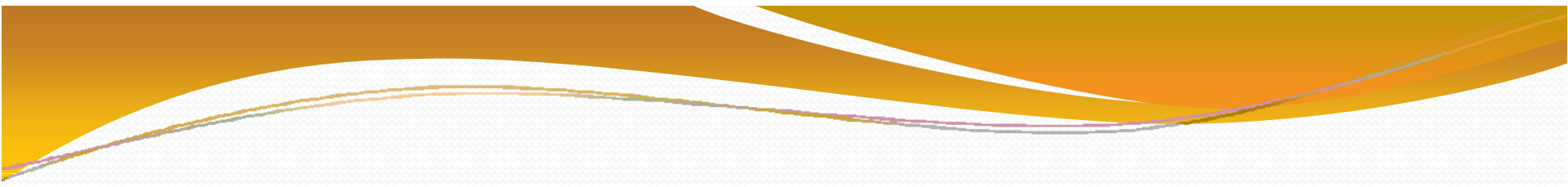
Women's Basketball

- 1 call: April of junior year on the Thursday following Final Four
- 1 call: May of junior year.
- 1 call: June 1 – June 20 of junior year.
- 1 call: June 21-June 30 of junior year.
- 3 calls: July 1-31 following junior year (max 1 per week).
- 1 call per week: August 1 following junior year.
- Unlimited calls: contact periods after August 1 following junior year.



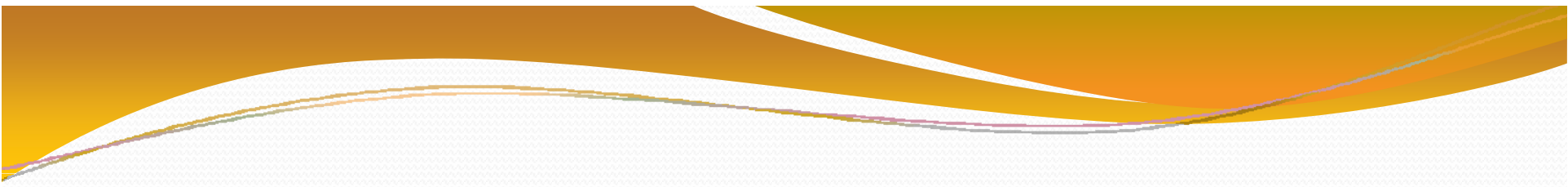
Football

- 1 call: April 15-May 31 of junior year.
- 1 call per week: September 1 senior year.
- Unlimited calls: Contact periods after September 1 of senior year



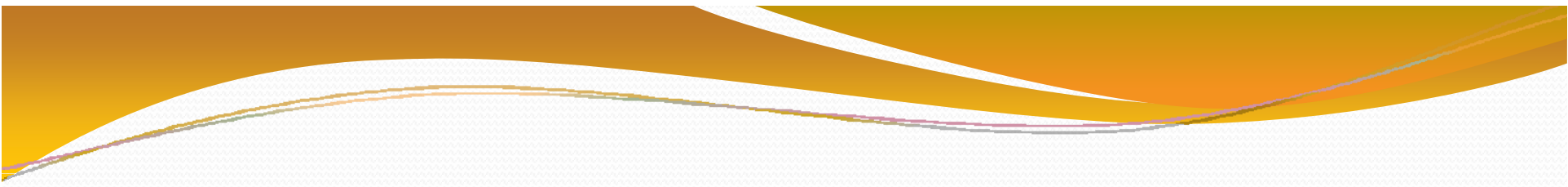
Phone Call Exceptions

- Official Visit: Unlimited calls the 5 days immediately preceding the visit.
- NLI signing date: Unlimited calls on initial signing date and the two days following.
 - Football-Unlimited calls 48 hours prior to signing date and 48 hours after 7 am on the signing date.
- Off-campus contact: Unlimited calls on the day of a permissible off-campus contact.
- Camp/clinic logistical issues: Permissible and noncountable provided no recruiting conversation occurs.



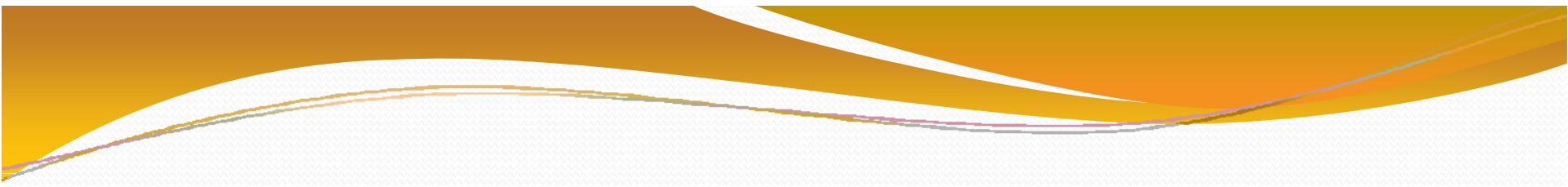
Who can make phone calls?

- Coaching staff members only! (FB GA's are ok)
- Few exceptions:
 - **President or chancellor/FAR/AD/SWA:** May RETURN but not initiate phone calls. Must count towards the phone call limitations for that prospect.
 - **Academic Coordinator:** May make or receive phone calls related to admissions or academic issues. Must count towards the phone call limitations for that prospect.
 - **Compliance:** May RETURN phone calls regarding compliance issues. Does not count towards phone call limitations.
- Noncoaching staff members/noncountable coaches:
 - May initiate or receive phone calls **during** official visit transportation and **during** the visit. Not to set up the visit!
 - Unlimited calls beginning the calendar day after NLI signing.
 - Unlimited calls beginning the calendar day after receipt of financial deposit.



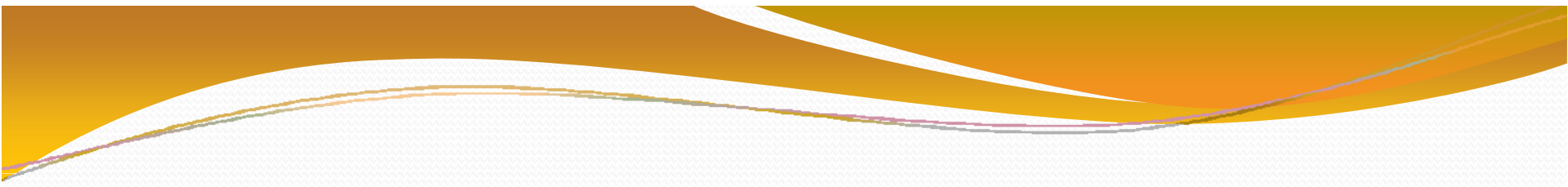
Who CANNOT make phone calls?

- Boosters
- Student-Athletes at the direction of their coaches.
 - May receive phone calls at the expense of the PSA, provided there is not direct involvement of athletic department staff members.



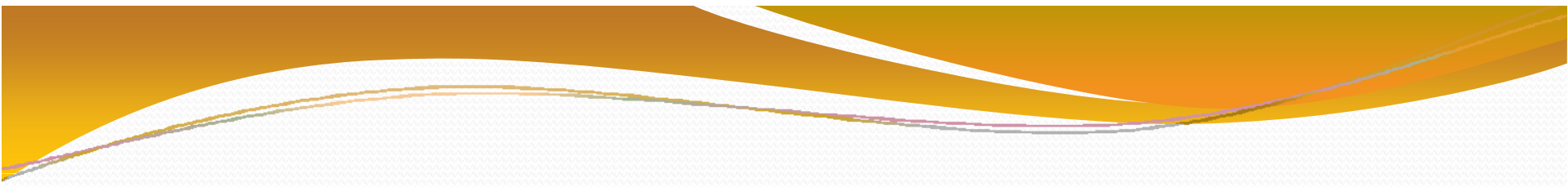
Recruiting Periods

- Contact Period: In-person, on and off-campus contacts and evaluations can be made.
- Evaluation Period: Off-campus activities to assess the academic qualifications and playing ability of PSAs. No in-person, off-campus contact can be made.
- Quiet period: In-person, on campus ONLY recruiting contacts.
- Dead period: No in-person, on or off-campus contacts or evaluations can be made. Phone calls are still permissible.



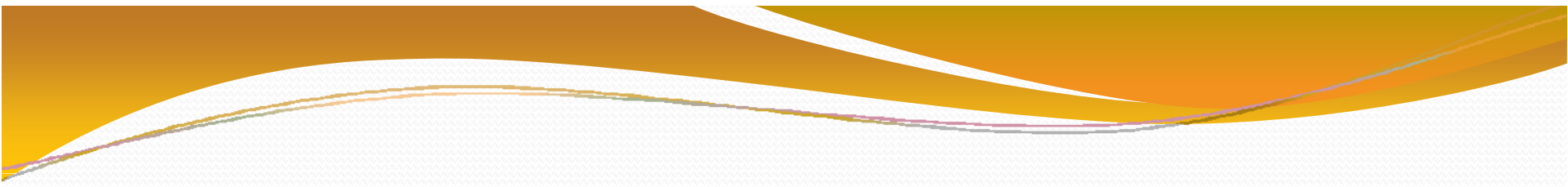
Who can recruit?

- Off-campus: Coaching staff members only!!
- Spouse of staff member may be involved in on campus recruiting.
- Spouse of staff member may be involved off-campus only during an official visit within the 30-mile radius (i.e. dinner).
- Spouse does not include: fiancé, partner, girlfriend, boyfriend.
- Institutional staff members may be involved in on campus recruiting.
- Institutional staff members may be involved off-campus only during an official visit within the 30-mile radius.



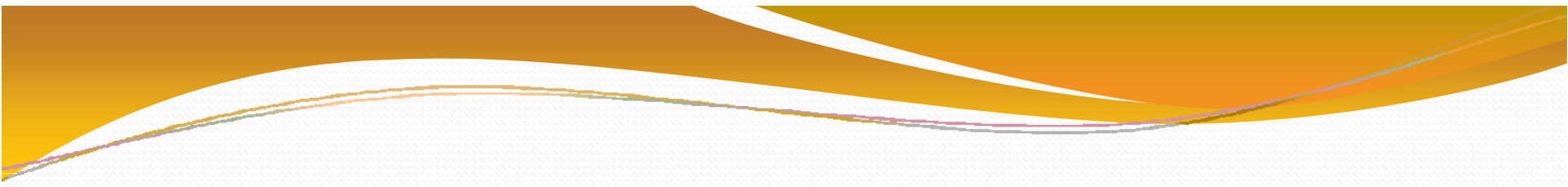
Contacts

- Permissible beginning July 1 following junior year.
- Two-year prospects:
 - Nonqualifier-after completion of first year at 2-year school.
 - Qualifier-anytime, recruiting restrictions apply.
- Four-year prospects:
 - Must have permission to contact.
 - If permission is granted, all recruiting restrictions apply.



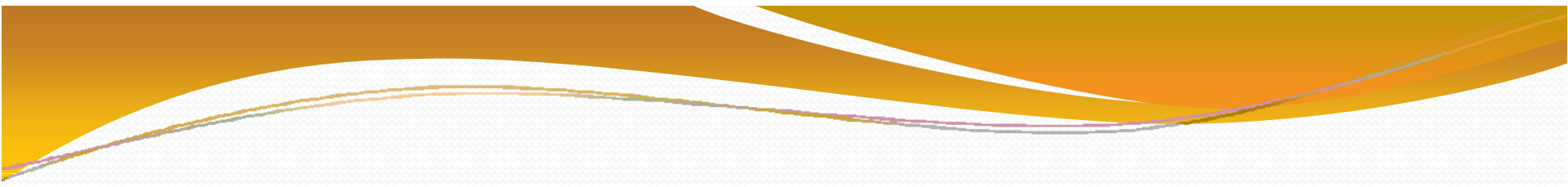
Contacts

- Limited to a maximum of 3 contacts per prospect (counts towards the 7 total recruiting opportunities).
- Football-6 maximum contacts per prospect.
- Any off-campus face-to-face contact must count towards the limits (at school, home, after event, etc.).
- Any number of contacts on the same day count as just one contact.
- Contacts during the summer must count towards the limit.



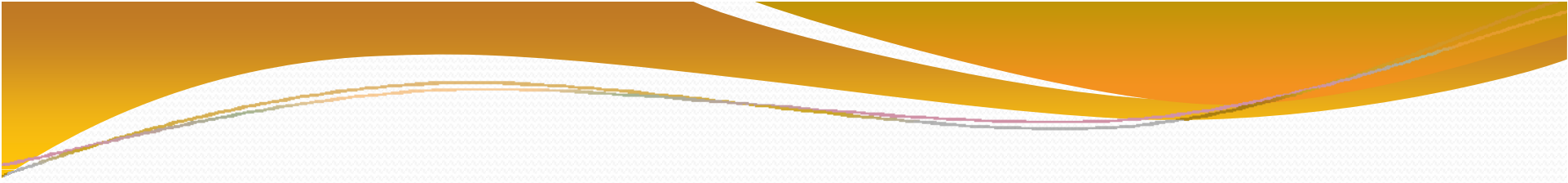
Evaluations

- Maximum of seven evaluations per academic year.
 - During senior year, evaluations and contacts combined, if 3 contacts used, only 4 evaluations remaining.
- Evaluations during the summer do not count.
 - This is based on the PSA's academic calendar, not CU's.
- Any number of evaluations on the same day, count as one evaluation.



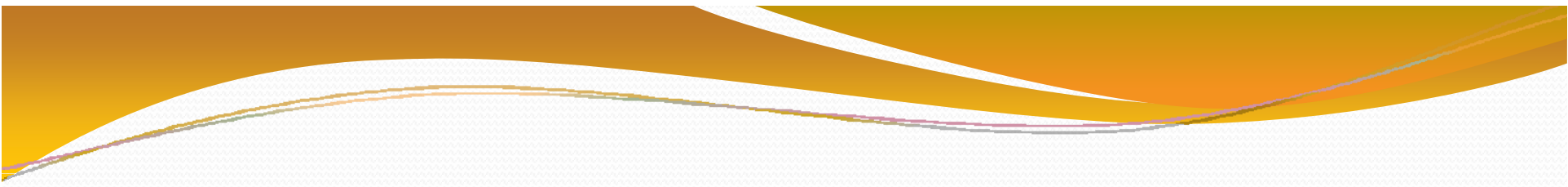
Evaluations

- Tournament Evaluations
 - Evaluations on consecutive days of a tournament count as just one evaluation.
 - Multiple day events (jamboree, round robin) will count as separate evaluations unless it is conducted in a tournament format and a winner is determined.
- Individual sport evaluations—evaluation only used for those prospects that were evaluated. If contact was also made, it must count as both contact and evaluation.



Evaluations

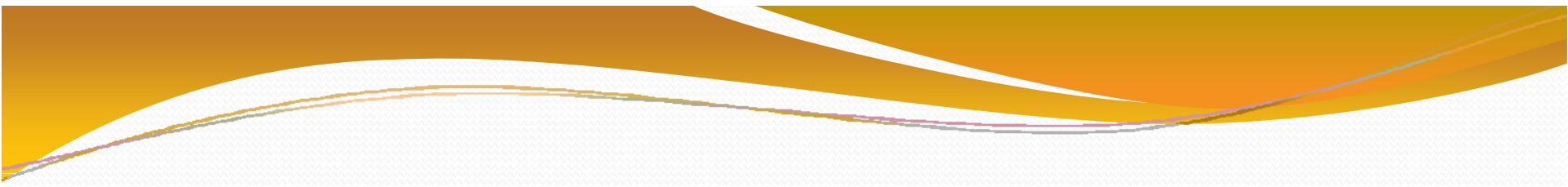
- Team sport evaluations count as an evaluation for each prospect participating in the competition/practice.
- Contact and evaluation on same day—count as contact only.
- Recruiting person days:
 - Men's Basketball: 130 days
 - Women's Basketball: 100 days
 - Volleyball (evaluation days): 80 days
- Each coach out recruiting counts towards the days.



Evaluations

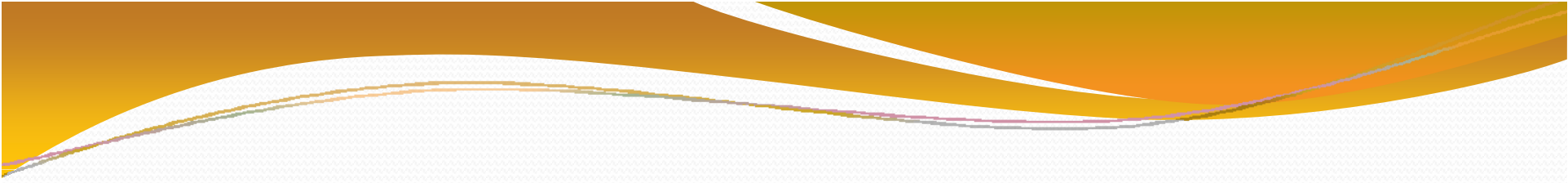
Noncoaching Staff Members with Sport-Specific Responsibilities (i.e. Director of Operations)

- May not attend an on or off-campus athletic event in their sport that involves PSAs.
 - Exception: Legal guardian of a participant in the activity.
 - Attendance cannot be for evaluation purposes.
 - No direct contact with PSA or PSA's parents/guardian participating in the activity.



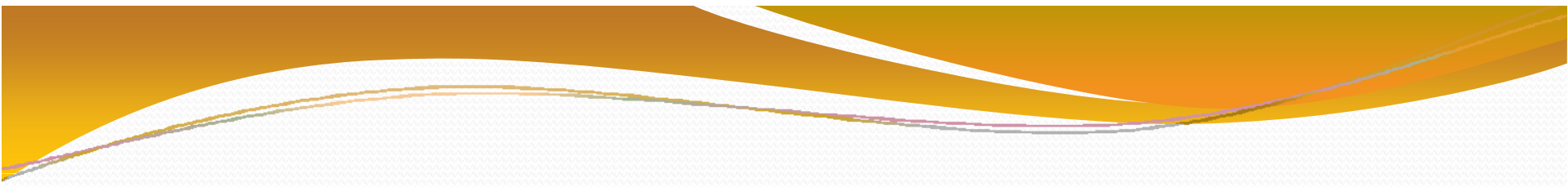
Official Visits

- Official (paid) visits may be taken during senior year, with first opportunity being the first day of classes for the PSA, not CU.
- Maximum 5 total visits per prospect, no more than 1 per school.
- Post-High School Visit is permissible starting October 15 following the completion of high school.
- Maximum 5 total post-high school visits.
- Nonqualifier may not visit in their 1st year at 2-year institution.



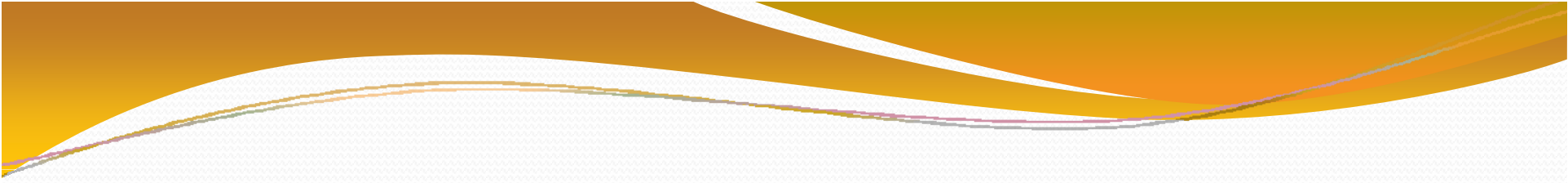
Official Visits

- Requirements for OV:
 - ACT/SAT/PLAN/PSAT test score
 - HS or college transcript
 - Register with NCAA Eligibility Center (no fee issues)
 - AAA committee approval



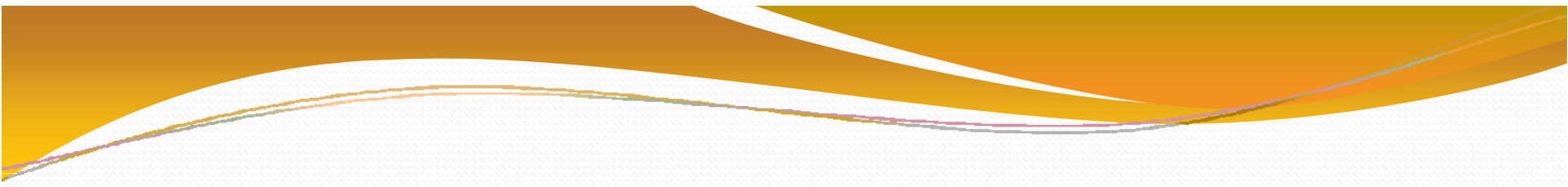
Official Visits

- 48 hour limit.
- 3 complimentary admissions (2 additional if stepparents are in attendance).
- May only pay for meals of parents/guardians who are attending OV with the PSA. No siblings, aunts, uncles, etc. can receive a free meal.



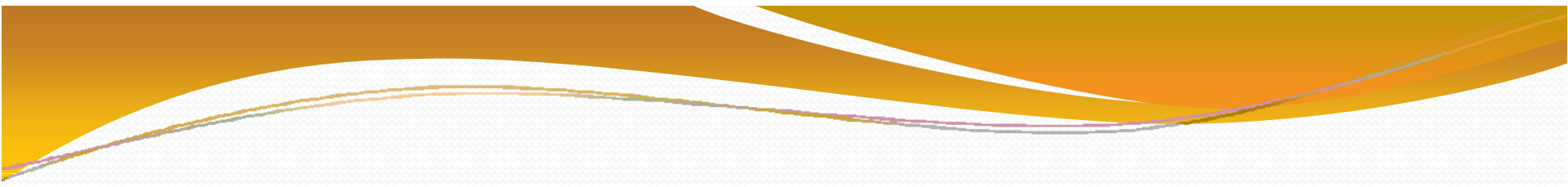
Unofficial Visits

- Unofficial (unpaid) visits may be taken at any time, except during a dead period.
- PSA must pay for all expenses.
- 3 complimentary admissions (5 if stepparents are in attendance)



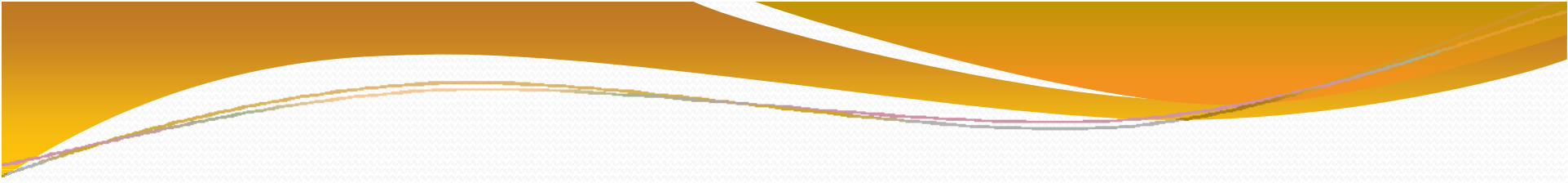
Unofficial Visits

- May provide transportation to view practice and competition sites in the PSA's sport (i.e. golf is the only sport that can have an unofficial visit at Colorado National).
- No off-campus transportation.
- If you choose to have a meal with the PSA off-campus:
 - Must count as a contact
 - Be aware of your off-campus limitations on coaches
 - Can only be with a senior PSA
 - Cannot provide transportation



Coaches of PSAs

- Maximum 2 complimentary admissions to home CU regular season events.
- Cannot reserve additional tickets for them to purchase. They must purchase as the general public would.
- Nothing else may be given to coaches of PSAs (meals, travel expenses, etc.)
