Financial Aid Legislative Update

Financial Aid

- 2011-96 MISCELLANEOUS EXPENSE ALLOWANCE (MEA) and INSTITUTIONAL FINANCIAL AID
 - › Legislation has been **SUSPENDED**. Will be discussed at Board of Directors meeting on January 14th.
 - › Any MEA that has been offered and signed for will be honored.
 - › No new MEA offers can be made until a final decision is made.
- Options for the Board of Directors:
 - › Do nothing, keep it in suspension until an override vote occurs (April), OR
 - › Eliminate it, OR
 - › Alter the proposal to address the concerns. Will then enter another 60-day voting period.

Financial Aid

◎ 2011-97 MULTI-YEAR AWARDS

- › Legislation is currently still in effect but will be discussed at the Board of Directors meeting on January 14th.

◎ Options for the Board of Directors:

- › Maintain their action, keep it in effect until an override vote occurs, OR
- › Rescind the proposal, OR
- › Alter the proposal to address the concerns. Will then enter another 60-day voting period.

NLI Reminders

Football, Track/Field, Soccer

NLI Reminders

- ⦿ The signing period begins February 1, 2012 at 7:00 a.m.
- ⦿ No signing prior to 7:00 a.m. in the prospect's time zone.
- ⦿ A NLI is valid for 14 days from the date of issuance.

NLI Reminders

- NLI can be express mailed to a prospect, but no other materials can be in the envelope.
- NLI cannot be hand delivered off-campus.
- Coaches cannot be present when a prospect signs a NLI off-campus.
- PSA can receive NLI while they are on-campus for a visit, but cannot sign until the signing date.

Publicity and NLIs

- ◎ Subsequent to signing an NLI and/or financial aid agreement:
 - › May release information only after CU has received signed (and valid) NLI and financial aid agreement.
 - › No limits on the number of times CU may release information.
 - › May not purchase or receive commercial advertising to be used to identify a prospect by name or picture (e.g., print, media, billboard).
 - › May use a PSA's photograph in printed institutional items.

Publicity and NLIs

◎ Press Conferences

- May conduct one formal press conference on campus to announce signees. PSAs may not be in attendance.
- Coaches may attend functions designed to celebrate signees, including discussions with the media. PSAs may not be in attendance.
- May show video clips of signees during press conference.

Publicity and NLIs

⦿ Restrictions

- › PSA may arrange own press conference. CU coach may not be involved.
- › CU is responsible for signings on campus. Media may not be present and may not have contact with the PSA. These signing should take place in Gate 1.
 - Please be aware of the dead periods January 30-February 2nd!

Contact and NLIs

- Unlimited phone calls the day after a PSA signs a NLI.
- Unlimited texts the day after a PSA signs a NLI.
- No limit on the # of contacts, but contact restrictions still apply.
 - › Dead period, competition site, etc.

Camps

Camps

- Two types of Camps:
 - › Institutional
 - › Noninstitutional

What does this mean??

Camps

Institutional Camps are owned or operated by CU or a staff member.

Noninstitutional Camps are NOT owned or operated by CU or a staff member.

Institutional Camps

- ◎ Purpose of CU camps:
 - › Exception to the tryout rule. Provides specialized instruction or practice and may include competition.
 - › Places special emphasis on a particular sport.
 - › Designed to improve overall skills and general knowledge in a sport.
- ◎ Camps are not for recruiting...

Institutional Camps

- ⦿ Cannot recruit during camp.
 - › This includes verbal offers of aid.
 - › Men's Basketball Excepted!!
- ⦿ No facility tours during camps.
 - › May tour facilities that will be used in camp.
- ⦿ May conduct tours before or after camp, but not during (unofficial visits).
- ⦿ Cannot show a recruiting video or give a recruiting presentation. Basketball must have a compliance presentation at any camp including prospects!

Institutional Camps

- Attendance Restriction. Camp attendance can only be limited by:
 - AGE/GRADE LEVEL
 - GENDER
 - NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS

Be sure to include the phrase “Open to any and all entrants” on all brochures!

Institutional Camps

● Employment at CU Camps:

- › Prospects may not be employed at CU camps (HS and 2-yr students are PSAs).
- › CURRENT student-athletes may be employed at CU camps (except football-PSA camp only).
- › Must be paid the going rate.
- › Student-athletes cannot be paid for demonstration only. Must have some supervisory duties as well.

Institutional Camps

● Employment at CU Camps:

- MEN'S BASKETBALL ONLY—Cannot employ (paid or volunteer) an individual associated with a recruited prospect.
- MEN'S and WOMEN'S BASKETBALL ONLY—Cannot employ an individual associated with a prospect to be a speaker only.

Noninstitutional Camps

- Should have prior approval before working at a noninstitutional camp or clinic.
- Must be run in the same manner as CU camps.
- Please complete the form and return to Jill Gainey.

Noninstitutional Camps

- Basketball staff members cannot work at noninstitutional camps/clinics.
- Football staff is limited to their two, 15-day periods for noninstitutional camps.

Graduate Transfer Rules

Graduate Transfers

- There are two types of graduate transfer exceptions.
 - 1- Aid was nonrenewed at 1st institution
 - 2-Transferring to study a program that was not offered at original institution

Graduate Transfers

- ◎ One-Time Transfer Exception for FB, MBB, WBB:
 - › Must meet original one-time transfer exception.
 - › Must have one season of competition remaining.
 - › Aid must not have been renewed at previous institution for that academic year.

Graduate Transfers

- ◉ Studying a program that is not offered:
 - › Waiver process—not a guarantee!!
 - › Need approval from original institution.
 - › A letter from the FAR documenting the graduate program of studies is unavailable.
 - › Must have otherwise been eligible.
