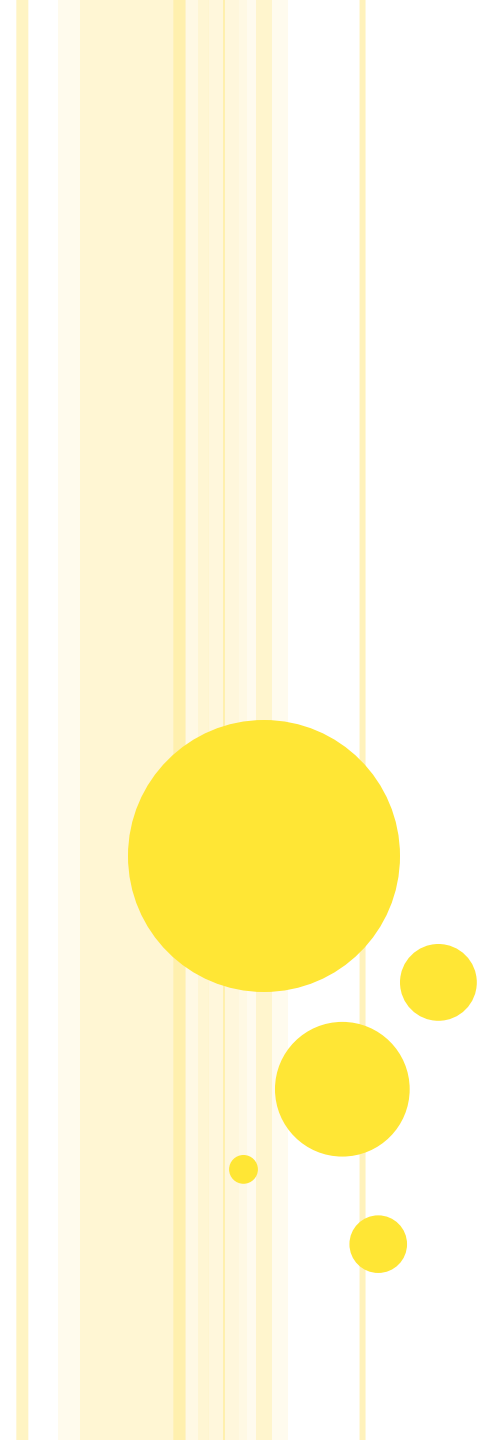

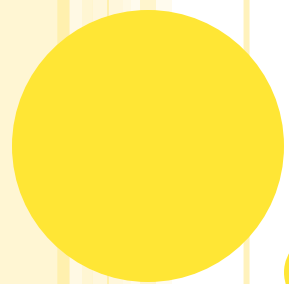

MORE NEW LEGISLATION

Proposal No. 2011-18

PERSONNEL AND RECRUITING -- RECRUITING
COORDINATION FUNCTIONS -- TELEPHONE CALLS --
RECEIPT OF CALLS FROM PROSPECTIVE STUDENT-
ATHLETES

To eliminate the restriction on the receipt of telephone calls from prospective student-athletes (or prospective student-athletes' parents, legal guardians or coaches) that requires such calls to be received by the head coach or one or more of the assistant coaches who count toward the numerical limitations.

Effective Date:

Immediate



WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

- Operation staff member can receive phone calls from PSAs and their parents.
- No need to transfer immediately to the coach—can talk with the PSA and/or parents.
- Helps with OV planning, answer questions while coaches are gone, etc.



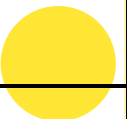
Proposal No. 2011-24

AMATEURISM -- AMATEUR STATUS -- EXPENSES
FROM A SPONSOR FOR PRACTICE OR
COMPETITION IN INDIVIDUAL SPORTS PRIOR TO
FULL-TIME COLLEGIATE ENROLLMENT

In individual sports, to specify that, prior to full-time collegiate enrollment, an individual may accept up to actual and necessary expenses associated with an athletics event and practice immediately preceding the event, from a sponsor (e.g., neighbor, business) other than an agent, a member institution or a representative of an institution's athletics interests.

Immediate



Proposal No. 2011-25

AMATEURISM -- EXCEPTIONS TO AMATEURISM RULE
-- PRIZE MONEY PRIOR TO FULL-TIME COLLEGIATE
ENROLLMENT -- TENNIS -- \$10,000 PER YEAR

In tennis, to specify that, prior to full-time collegiate enrollment, an individual may accept prize money based on his or her place finish or performance in open athletics events, not to exceed \$10,000 per calendar year; further, to specify that once the individual has reached the \$10,000 limit, he or she may receive additional prize money on a per-event basis, provided such prize money does not exceed his or her actual and necessary expenses for participation in the event.

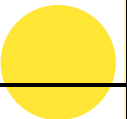
Proposal No. 2011-28-B

RECRUITING -- PERMISSIBLE RECRUITERS --
GENERAL EXCEPTIONS -- ON-CAMPUS CONTACT
WITH RELATIVES OF ENROLLED STUDENT-
ATHLETES

To specify that on-campus contacts between a prospective student-athlete or his or her relatives (traditional or nontraditional) or legal guardians accompanying the prospective student-athlete and the relatives (traditional or nontraditional) or legal guardians of an enrolled student-athlete shall be permissible.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

- Prospects on official or unofficial visits may have contact with the parents, siblings, grandparents of student-athletes ON CAMPUS.
- Be careful with tailgating parties—PSAs on UOV and SA's parents must pay for their own food!!
- Gives current parents and opportunity to discuss and answer questions PSA's parents might have.
- Contact cannot continue beyond the on-campus situation.



Proposal No. 2011-29-B

RECRUITING -- PERMISSIBLE RECRUITERS --
STUDENT-ATHLETE -- OFF-CAMPUS CONTACTS

To specify that off-campus, in-person contact between an enrolled student-athlete and a prospective student-athlete is permissible, provided such contact does not occur at the direction of an institutional staff member.

Effective Date:

Immediate



WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

- During an unofficial visit, a prospective-student-athlete is permitted to stay in an enrolled student-athlete's dormitory room if the prospective student-athlete pays the regular institutional rate for such lodging; however, the prospective student-athletes are then prohibited from socializing off-campus with the student-athlete.
- Student-athletes can now have the off-campus contact with prospects during an unofficial visit, as long as it does not occur at a staff member's direction.
- CU's recruiting policy is still in effect!



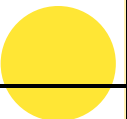
Proposal No. 2011-32

RECRUITING -- TELEPHONE CALLS -- PERMISSIBLE
CALLERS -- EXCEPTIONS -- PRIOR TO COMMITMENT
-- COMPLIANCE ADMINISTRATORS

To permit compliance administrators to make telephone calls to or receive telephone calls from a prospective student-athlete (or the prospective student-athlete's parents or legal guardians) with no limit on the timing or number of such calls, provided the calls relate only to compliance issues.

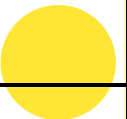
Proposal No. 2011-40

RECRUITING -- OFFICIAL (PAID) VISIT --
ENTERTAINMENT/TICKETS ON OFFICIAL VISIT --
STUDENT HOST -- ENTERTAINMENT ALLOWANCE

To increase, from \$30 to \$40, the allowance that an institution may provide a student host for each day of a prospective student-athlete's official visit to cover all actual costs of entertaining the student host(s) and the prospective student-athlete; further, to increase, from \$15 to \$20, the additional allowance an institution may provide the student host per day for each additional prospective student-athlete the host entertains.

Effective Date:

August 1, 2012



WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

- If a student-athlete is hosting a prospect for 2 days, there is a maximum of \$80 in host money.
- If a student-athlete is hosting two prospects on one day, there is a maximum of \$60 in host money.
- You do not have to allow the maximum; you can give less, but not more!



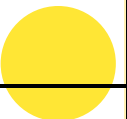

RECRUITING -- SPORTS CAMPS AND CLINICS --
RECRUITING CONVERSATIONS DURING
INSTITUTION'S CAMPS AND CLINICS -- EXCEPTION --
SPORTS OTHER THAN MEN'S BASKETBALL

In sports other than men's basketball, to specify that it is permissible for an institution's coach to engage in recruiting conversations with a prospective student-athlete during the institution's camps or clinics.

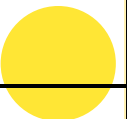

RECRUITING -- PRECOLLEGE EXPENSES --
DONATION OF ATHLETICS EQUIPMENT --
ELIMINATION OF 30-MILE RADIUS

To eliminate the restriction that precludes an institution from donating athletics equipment to a bona fide youth organization outside a 30-mile radius of the institution's campus.

Effective Date:

August 1, 2012



Proposal No. 2011-54

RECRUITING -- RECRUITING CALENDARS -- WOMEN'S BASKETBALL -- JULY EVALUATION AND DEAD PERIODS

In women's basketball, to specify that during the time period of July 6-31, the recruiting calendar shall consist of, consecutively, a seven-day evaluation period, a 10-day dead period, a seven-day evaluation period and a two-day dead period.

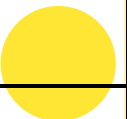

FINANCIAL AID -- SUMMER FINANCIAL AID --
ENROLLED STUDENT-ATHLETES --
PROPORTIONALITY RESTRICTION -- EXHAUSTED
ELIGIBILITY EXCEPTION

To specify that the summer aid proportionality restriction shall not apply to a student-athlete who has exhausted his or her eligibility and is enrolled in course work acceptable toward his or her degree requirements.

Effective Date:

Immediate



WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

- A student-athlete on 50% aid who has exhausted his/her eligibility *could* receive more than 50% for summer school that goes towards their degree.
- Must be approved by the summer school committee.



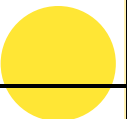

AWARDS, BENEFITS AND EXPENSES -- EXPENSES
FOR STUDENT-ATHLETE'S FRIENDS AND RELATIVES
-- PERMISSIBLE EXPENSES -- LIFE-THREATENING
INJURY OR ILLNESS -- EXPENSES FOR ANY
STUDENT-ATHLETE

To specify that the institution may pay transportation, housing and meal expenses for any student-athlete to be present in situations in which a student-athlete or a family member or legal guardian of a student-athlete suffers a life-threatening injury or illness, or in the event of a student-athlete's or student-athlete's family member or legal guardian's death.

Effective Date:

Immediate



WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

- Can use SAOF funds for this trip.
- Must complete request form and be approved prior to reimbursement.



Proposal No. 2011-80-B

AWARDS, BENEFITS AND EXPENSES -- EXPENSES PROVIDED BY THE INSTITUTION FOR PRACTICE AND COMPETITION -- NATIONAL TEAM TRYOUTS -- NOT MORE THAN TWO EVENTS -- IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE

To permit an institution to provide actual and necessary expenses for a student-athlete to participate in not more than two national team tryout competition events, including events from which participants are selected for another tier of tryout competition or events from which final selections are made for the national team that will participate in the Olympic Games, Pan American Games, World Championships, World Cup or World University Games.

Effective Date:

Immediate

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

- Old rule allowed CU to pay for just ONE tryout event.
- Must be approved prior to participation.



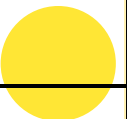

**AWARDS, BENEFITS AND EXPENSES -- OTHER
TRAVEL EXPENSES PROVIDED BY THE INSTITUTION
-- CONFERENCE-SPONSORED LIFE SKILLS
PROGRAM**

To permit an institution or conference to pay actual and necessary expenses for a student-athlete to attend a conference-sponsored life skills program (e.g., leadership, personal development, conflict resolution).

Effective Date:

Immediate



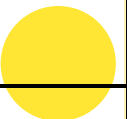

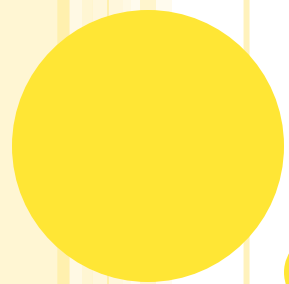
AWARDS, BENEFITS AND EXPENSES -- PROVISION OF
EXPENSES BY INDIVIDUALS OR ORGANIZATIONS OTHER
THAN THE INSTITUTION -- BENEFITS, GIFTS, AND SERVICES
-- MISCELLANEOUS BENEFITS -- FUNDRAISERS FOR
STUDENT-ATHLETES OR IMMEDIATE FAMILY MEMBERS

To specify that proceeds from fundraisers for student-athletes (or their immediate families) due to extreme circumstances beyond the student-athlete's control (e.g., life-threatening illness, natural disaster) may be given directly to the beneficiaries, with receipt kept on file by the institution, which must include the amount of expenses incurred and the total amount received.

SUMMER EMPLOYMENT

SUMMER EMPLOYMENT

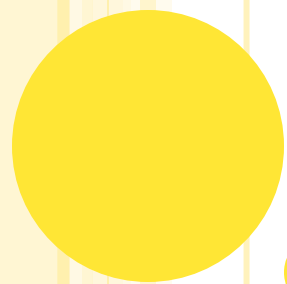
- Many student-athletes obtain jobs during the summer. All employment (including academic year) must be reported to the compliance office.
- SAs must be paid the going rate for work actually performed.
- No additional benefits can be received that are not offered to other employees at the same level (benefits, travel, etc.)



SUMMER EMPLOYMENT

- An institution may arrange for employment or employ any prospective student-athlete, provided the employment does not begin prior to the completion of the prospective student-athlete's senior year in high school. **Camp Employment Not Included**
- Incoming transfers cannot be employed at CU camps, regardless of summer school enrollment.

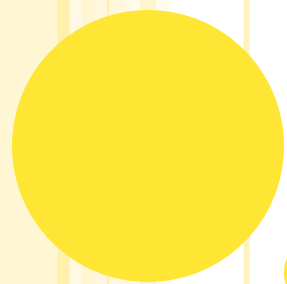
- We will be conducting the coaches exam during the MCM time slots next month.

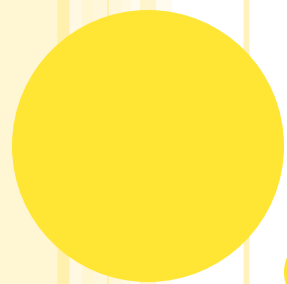

FROM THE NCAA--APRIL

NCAA EDUCATIONAL COLUMN

- Recruiting -- Electronic Transmissions -- Microblogs (I)
- Date Published: April 26, 2012
- NCAA Division I member institutions should note that it is permissible for an institution's website or an athletics department staff member's personal website (or personal page on any site) to include information related to the institution's athletics program, subject to the restrictions applicable to an institution's athletics website. Accordingly, **a coach may post general informational content not created for a recruiting purpose such as game scores, team updates, facility updates or generic updates regarding the coaching staff and/or team to the extent they do not mention a specific prospect.** These formats may include website posts, online personal journals such as blogs and microblogs, which are a form of blogging resulting in a stream of short blog posts that are generally limited by a total number of characters. A current example of a microblog is Twitter.



NCAA EDUCATIONAL COLUMN

- Recruiting -- Electronic Transmissions -- Microblogs (I)
- Date Published: April 26, 2012
- Microblogs and Publicity.
- Before the signing of a PSA to a NLI or FAA, CU may comment publicly only to the extent of confirming its recruitment of the PSA. CU may not comment generally about the PSA's ability or the contribution that they might make to the institution's team. Further, the institution is precluded from commenting in any manner as to the likelihood that the PSA will sign with that institution.
- It is not permissible for an institution to post the name, nickname, or other personally identifiable information (e.g., address) of a PSA on a microblog unless it is in response to an inquiry by the media in order to confirm recruitment of a PSA.
- Communication with or about a PSA in the public's view (e.g., Twitter, "@replies," or "mentions") is an impermissible form of electronic communication with a PSA.

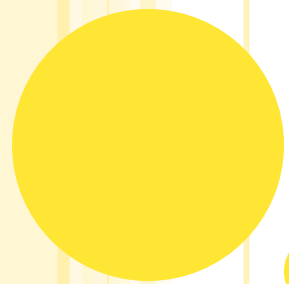
- Recruiting -- Electronic Transmissions -- Microblogs (I)
 - Date Published: April 26, 2012
 - Microblogs and Publicity.
 - CU may not publicize (or arrange for the publicity of) a PSA's visit to campus.
 - CU may photograph a PSA during a campus visit but may not use the photograph until the PSA has signed a NLI or FAA and the PSA's name or photograph is not used in any promotional items that involve the purchase or receipt of commercial advertising (e.g., season ticket advertisement in newspapers or on a billboard).
 - It is not permissible for a CU staff member to post a photograph of a PSA taken during an institutional camp to the staff member's microblog, personal website or CU website prior to the PSA's signing of a NLI or FAA.

NCAA EDUCATIONAL COLUMN

- Recruiting -- Electronic Transmissions -- Microblogs (I)
 - Date Published: April 26, 2012
 - Microblogs and Electronically Transmitted Correspondence.
 - CU may send electronically transmitted correspondence to a PSA beginning September 1 at the beginning of the PSA's junior year in high school. In men's basketball, CU may send electronically transmitted correspondence to a PSA beginning June 15 at the conclusion of a PSA's sophomore year in high school.
 - Electronically transmitted correspondence that may be sent to a prospective student-athlete is limited to electronic mail (email) and facsimiles until either after the calendar day on which a prospective student-athlete signs a NLI or FAA, or CU has received the enrollment deposit. All other forms of electronically transmitted correspondence (e.g., Instant Messenger, text messaging) currently are prohibited.
 - Email communication is not limited to traditional email services (e.g., Gmail). Accordingly, it is permissible for an athletics department staff member to send electronically transmitted correspondence to a PSA using a service that permits a private message to be sent between only the sender and recipient in a manner comparable to traditional email (e.g., Twitter/"direct message").

NCAA EDUCATIONAL COLUMN

- Date Published: April 26, 2012
- Microblogs and Electronically Transmitted Correspondence.
- CU staff members may not use a service or software to convert email into a text message (or other prohibited form of electronically transmitted correspondence) when received by a PSA. Therefore, to the extent an athletics department staff member is aware that a PSA is receiving a permissible form of electronic communication in an impermissible format (e.g., receiving email as text messages), such electronic transmission is prohibited. However, if a coach is unaware of how a PSA has elected to receive a particular form of communication, the coach is not responsible for sending an impermissible form of electronic correspondence.
- If a coach is aware that a PSA has elected to receive Twitter direct messages as text messages and the coach continues to engage in a direct message conversation as a means to circumvent the restrictions on text messages, the coach has committed a violation. However, if the coach is not aware that the PSA has chosen to receive these direct messages as text messages, the coach has not acted contrary to the legislation.
- In men's basketball, effective June 15, 2012, there shall be no limit to the form of electronically transmitted correspondence, provided the correspondence is sent directly to the PSA (or his or her parents or legal guardians) and is **private** between only the sender and recipient.

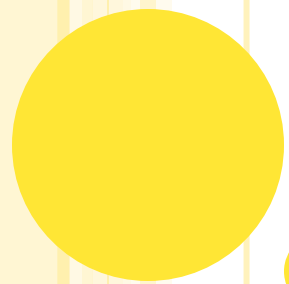


MAJOR INFRACTIONS
