GENERAL RULE

Transfer student-athletes must serve academic year in residence to be eligible for competition.

Bylaw 14.5.1

CONDITIONS AFFECTING TRANSFER STATUS

A transfer student is an individual who transfers from a collegiate institution after having met any one of the following conditions at that institution.

Bylaw 14.5.2

CONDITIONS AFFECTING TRANSFER STATUS

- ◉ Report for regular squad practice
- ◉ Enrolled full-time and present on the opening day of classes; and
- ◉ Received institutional financial aid while in summer school prior to initial full time enrollment.

2-4 TRANSFERS

- ◉ A transfer from a 2-year institution must sit an academic year in residence unless the following eligibility requirements are met:
- ◉ Qualifier:
 - Has spent at least one full time semester at the 2-year institution (excluding summer)
 - Has presented a minimum GPA of 2.000
 - Has satisfactorily completed an average of 12 semester hours of transferable degree credit to any baccalaureate program at CU for each full time term at the 2-year college

2-4 TRANSFERS

- ◎ All students have attended a collegiate institution for 4 semesters or more must meet Progress Toward Degree (40%, 60%, 80%) at CU.
- ◎ Once we have a transcript, please contact Herbst for a PTD evaluation from the college the prospect chooses to major from.

2-4 TRANSFERS (CONTINUED)

- ◉ Not A Qualifier:
- ◉ Eligible for financial aid, practice and competition in the first year if:
 - Graduated from the 2-year college;
 - Satisfactorily completed 48 hours of transferable credit toward any baccalaureate program at CU, including 6 hours of transferable English credit and 3 hours of transferable Math credit

2-4 TRANSFERS (CONTINUED)

Has attended the 2-year college as a full-time student for at least three semesters;
and

Has achieved a cumulative GPA of 2.000

No more than 18 hours of the transferable credit may be earned during summer terms and not more than 9-semester hours may be earned during the summer prior to the transfer.

2-4 TRANSFERS (CONTINUED)

Multiple 2-Year Colleges

At least 25 percent of the transferrable degree credit must come from the 2-year college awarding the AA degree.

There are many exceptions to this rule, so please consult your NCAA Manual

2-4 TRANSFERS (CONTINUED)

- Please be reminded that CU Boulder does not transfer in PE Activity Courses **of any kind.**

4-YEAR TRANSFERS

- ⦿ Generally, a 4-year college transfer must sit a year in residence.
- ⦿ One Time Transfer Exception
 - The student is not a M/W basketball player or an FBS football player
 - The student has not transferred previously from one 4-year school to another
 - At the time of transfer, the student would have been eligible at the institution from which he/she is transferring (does not need % toward degree)

4-YEAR TRANSFER (CONTINUED)

If transferring from an NCAA or NAIA school the student's previous institution shall certify in writing it has no objection to the transfer.

4-YEAR TRANSFER (CONTINUED)

- To be eligible for competition, a transfer must meet the following requirements based on attendance at the previous institution. May use hours of academic credit earned at any collegiate institution:

4-YEAR TRANSFER (CONTINUED)

- ◉ *Equivalent of one semester – 6 hours*
- ◉ *Equivalent of two semesters – 24 hours*
- ◉ *Equivalent of three semesters – 30 hours*
- ◉ *Equivalent of four semesters – 6 hours*

4-YEAR TRANSFER (CONTINUED)

- ◉ If the prospect has been at the 4-year institution for 4 semesters or more they will also need to make Progress Toward Degree (40%, 60%, 80%) at CU.
- ◉ Once we have a transcript, please check with Herbst regarding a PTD review by the college of the prospect's choice.

4-2-4 TRANSFER

- ◎ The student shall complete one academic year in residence at CU unless:
- ◎ The student has completed an average of 12 semester hours of transferrable degree credit with a cumulative GPA of 2.000, acceptable toward **ANY** baccalaureate degree program at the certifying institution for each full-time term at the 2-year college.

4-YEAR TRANSFER (CONTINUED)

- ◉ Please note: We must also obtain a High School Transcript for every transfer student to determine their Core and MAPS
- ◉ (Minimum Academic Preparation Standards)

If a student is deficient in one of these categories and they have exhausted all of their elective courses they may need more than 120 hours to graduate.

4-2-4 TRANSFER (CONTINUED)

- ◉ One calendar year has elapsed since the student's departure from the previous 4-year college, and;
- ◉ The student has graduated from the 2-year college.
- ◉ There are other more rare exceptions to this rule, so please consult your NCAA Manual

NEW LEGISLATION

◎ INITIAL ELIGIBILITY

- Effective for those entering August 2015 (current high school freshmen)
- 10 of the 16 core courses must be completed prior to the start of senior year in high school.
- 7 of the 10 core courses must be English, math, and natural/physical science.
- These courses must be used when calculating the core GPA for the sliding scale.

NEW LEGISLATION

◎ INITIAL ELIGIBILITY

- Current sliding scale is still in effect in order to practice for their first term at CU. In order to practice during the second term the student must pass 9 credit hours. Remember, Fall 2015!
- IN ORDER TO COMPETE—a prospect must have a minimum 2.3 GPA. Also, must have about .5 high GPA on the sliding scale corresponding with their test score.

NEW LEGISLATION

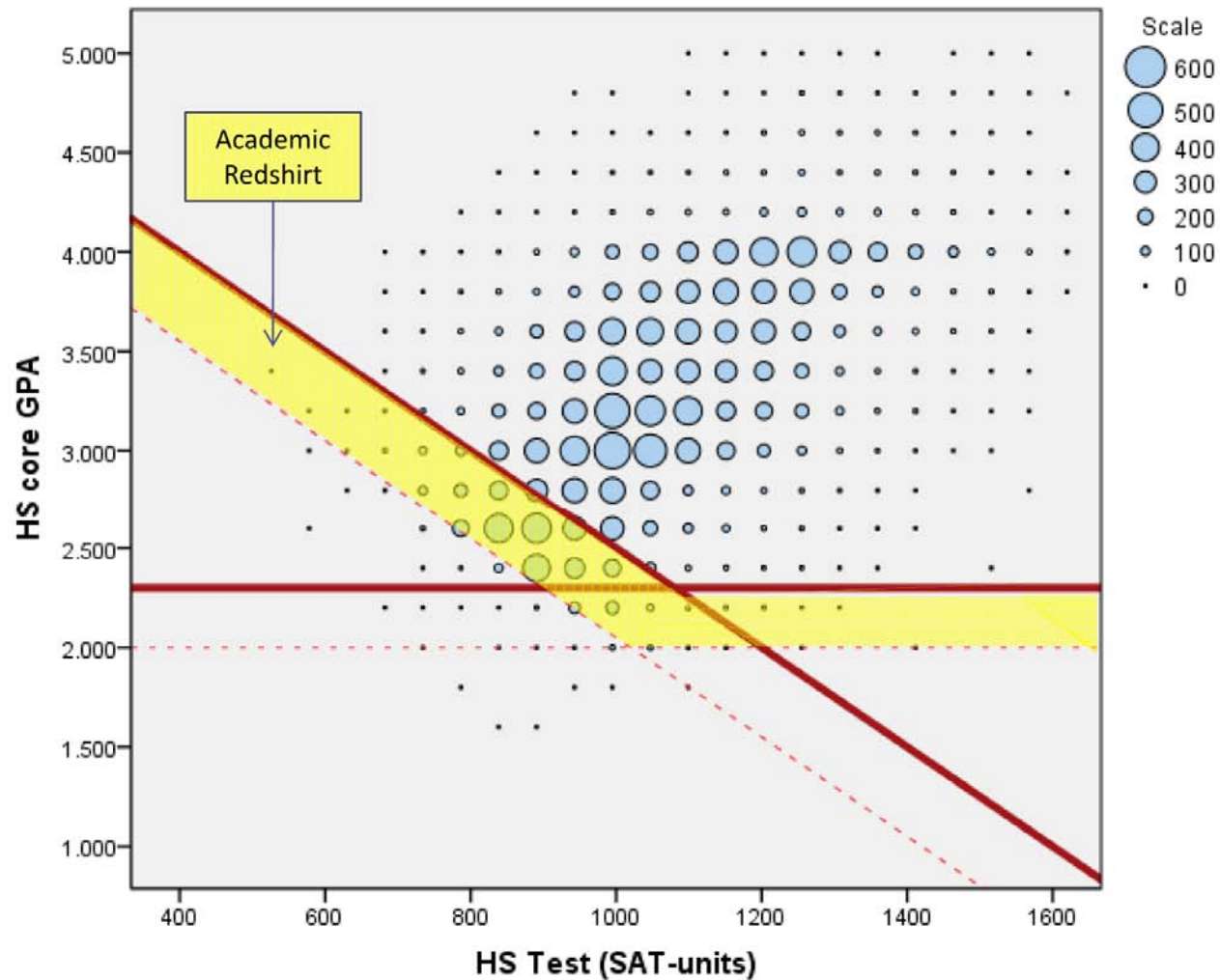
◎ CURRENT LEGISLATION:

- Student has 2.00 GPA and 1010 SAT/86 ACT.
- QUALIFIER, eligible for practice, competition and aid.

◎ FUTURE LEGISLATION:

- Student has 2.00 GPA and 1010 SAT/86 ACT.
- ACADEMIC REDSHIRT, eligible for practice, aid only.
- Student with same test score will need ~ 2.5 GPA to be a QUALIFIER and eligible for competition.

NEW LEGISLATION



NEW LEGISLATION

Juco Transfers

- ⦿ Required GPA is now 2.5 instead of 2.0.
- ⦿ Maximum 2 PE (activity) courses.
- ⦿ Requires a transferrable science course in addition to the required math and English courses for non-qualifiers.
- ⦿ Effective for **August 1, 2012**.

NEW LEGISLATION

APR

- ⦿ Your team must have 930 APR to be eligible for post-season competition.
- ⦿ Transition will take place over 3 years (900 for 2012-13, 2013-14; 930 for 2014-15 and beyond).
- ⦿ Waiting for actual legislation to come out to interpret this further.

NEW LEGISLATION

FINANCIAL AID – “Miscellaneous Expense Allowance”

- Full Grant-in-Aid Student-Athletes will be eligible to receive \$2000 per year (\$1000/semester @ CU).
- Will still be able to receive Pell Grant (\$5500) in addition to this new allowance.

NEW LEGISLATION

FINANCIAL AID Multi-Year Awards

- ⦿ Scholarships contracts can now be written for anywhere from 1 to 5 year awards.
- ⦿ Can be through the student-athlete's eligibility (i.e. transfer cannot sign 5 year award).
- ⦿ The student is not bound by the multi-year award, **but CU is** still held to it.
- ⦿ Student is still held to one-year agreement of NLI.

NEW LEGISLATION

FINANCIAL AID Multi-Year Awards

- ⦿ Cannot be taken away or reduced for athletic reasons.
- ⦿ May only be reduced for same reasons that a one-year award can be reduced.
 - Engaged in Serious Misconduct
 - Ineligibility (render themselves academically ineligible)
 - Voluntarily withdraws from team
