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CHANCELLOR'S ADDRESS

Wednesday, September 21, 2011 at 10:00 a.m. Chancellor DiStefano will be speaking to all athletic department staff members. This meeting is MANDATORY and will be held in the Dal Ward Varsity Room. Anyone who is unable to attend must notify their supervisor ASAP. This meeting is held on a yearly basis and is required by NCAA rules. Chancellor DiStefano will state his expectations for the department regarding following NCAA, Pac-12 and CU policies, procedures and rules.

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COACHES OF PROSPECTS

It is not permissible for CU to provide coaches of prospects (HS, AAU, Prep School, Juco, etc.) with any benefits. The only permissible items are two complimentary admissions to regular-season home events. Meals, transportation and entertainment would all be considered improper recruiting inducements. In addition, CU cannot reimburse a coach any expenses incurred while transporting a prospect to campus for a visit.

NONATHLETICALLY RELATED CONDITIONS

It is permissible for an institutional financial aid agreement to include nonathletically related conditions by which the aid could be reduced or cancelled during the period of the award. Examples of permissible conditions include: compliance with academic policies or compliance with departmental rules. These conditions must be agreed upon by the coach, student-athlete and sport supervisor. The conditions must also be a feasible request or they cannot be included.

PERMISSIBLE TRAVEL EXPENSES

When considering team travel, it is permissible to combine the 48 hour departure and 36 hour (24 in mbb) return limits so the team does not need to return to campus prior to departing for the second competition if it takes place within 84 hours (72 for mbb).

PERMISSIBLE to not return to campus: Team competition is completed by 10:00 pm Wednesday, next competition is 11:00am Saturday. (61 hours)

IMPERMISSIBLE, must return to campus: Team competition is completed by 10:00 pm Wednesday, next competition is 1:00 pm Sunday. (87 hours)

Please be mindful of missed class time as this must be approved by Dr. Clough.

GOLF PRACTICE ROUND

While in season, in the sport of golf, a practice round may exceed the 4-hour per day CARA limit, provided no other CARA takes place on that day. The 20-hours per week limitation is still in effect, this exception just allows for a qualifying round prior to competition. Don't forget, no other CARA on the day that you use this exception!!

DONATION REQUESTS

It is not permissible for any CU sport program or staff member to donate any memorabilia, apparel or tickets to an event, auction or fundraiser that will benefit prospects. If you receive a request that is not permissible, please feel free to forward to the compliance office and we will respond accordingly.

18 CREDIT HOUR RULE

All student-athletes must pass a minimum of 18 credit hours between the fall and spring semester to be eligible the following year. This benchmark must be met each year, along with all other continuing eligibility rules. If a student-athlete first enrolls during a spring semester, they must pass 18 credit hours between that spring and the following fall to be eligible. After that, their eligibility will be certified on a fall to spring basis. Each student-athlete is certified on a case-by-case basis.
