PHONE CALLS

Phone Calls

- ▣ July 1 was the start date for calling prospects who have completed their junior year in high school.
- ▣ 1 phone call per week.
- ▣ Week is defined as Sunday-Saturday.
- ▣ Only coaches may place phone calls, no operations staff members. Ops may answer calls, but cannot place them.

Phone Calls

- ▣ Cross Country/Track & Field, Lacrosse and Volleyball can make unlimited phone calls during a contact period.
- ▣ Still limited to one phone call per week outside of a contact period (evaluation, quiet or dead period).

Phone Calls

- ▣ Men's Basketball may make unlimited phone calls beginning June 15th following the completion of their sophomore year.
- ▣ Football may make 1 phone call April 15-May 31 of junior year. Then starting September 1st of senior year, one per week. Unlimited during contact period of senior year.

Phone Calls

▣ Women's Basketball

- 1 call in April of Junior year on the Thursday following the final four.
- 1 call in May of junior year.
- 1 call June 1-June 20 of junior year.
- 1 call June 21-June 30 of junior year.
- 3 calls in July following junior year — not during July eval period and only 1 per week.
- Thereafter, 1 call per week, unlimited during contact period.

Phone Calls

- ▣ If you reach the prospect's parent and ONLY leave a message, please indicate that in scoutware, but it does not count as a phone call.
- ▣ If you reach the prospect's parent and do anything more than leave a message, it MUST count as a phone call.
- ▣ Once you have reached your limit, no more calls, even if you know you will be leaving a message.
- ▣ Skype (video chatting) is considered a phone call.

Phone Calls

- ▣ Official Visit Exception-5 days prior to visit and during visit...UNLIMITED.
- ▣ NLI exception-Signing date and two days following...UNLIMITED.
- ▣ Camp exception-no restrictions on calls related to camps and clinics logistical issues. This does not mean you can call a prospect to invite them to camp.

NONINSTITUTIONAL CAMPS

Noninstitutional Camp Employment

- ▣ Any staff member working a noninstitutional camp must receive approval prior to working camp.
- ▣ A noninstitutional camp must meet NCAA legislation in order for a staff member to be employed (paid or volunteer).
- ▣ Basketball, football and volleyball have sport specific rules.

REMINDERS

Pac-12 Official Visit Per Diem

- ▣ The limit of \$70 per day for meals was removed by the Pac-12.
- ▣ However, CU's max limit of \$50 per meal is still in effect.
- ▣ Impermissible Restaurants:
 - Flagstaff House
 - Greenbriar Inn
 - Q's Restaurant in the Boulderado
 - Red Lion Inn
 - Elways – unless you have a set menu

Eligibility Center Registration Fee Increase

- ▣ Effective September 1st, 2012 the EC will increase their registration prices.
- ▣ US and Canada will go from \$65 to \$70.
- ▣ International Students will go from \$95 to \$120.
