NCAA BOD

The four tabled proposals were suspended until the next phase of deregulation.

- ❖ This means text messaging and chatting is still impermissible (except with NLI signees).
- ❖ First permissible contact date is still July 1 of senior year.
- ❖ Telephone calls are limited to once per week.
- ❖ Only coaches are able to place telephone calls and evaluate/select prospect.

NCAA BOD

Recruiting Materials: Recruiting Material restrictions are still in place. No media guides, Fat Heads, etc. Still letterhead, notecards and post cards.

Scouting of Opponents: The board upheld their original decision to not allow scouting of future opponents, and this decision puts the proposal back into a 60-day override period. 5/8ths of the membership must vote against the proposal or it goes into effect August 1, 2013. This is ~222 votes.

Update on 2016 Initial Eligibility Standards

Last week, the NCAA Division I Board reconsidered the 2016 initial eligibility standards that were adopted in October 2011. The Board had ample input from various committees and organizations.

1) Course Progression -- "7-10-16"

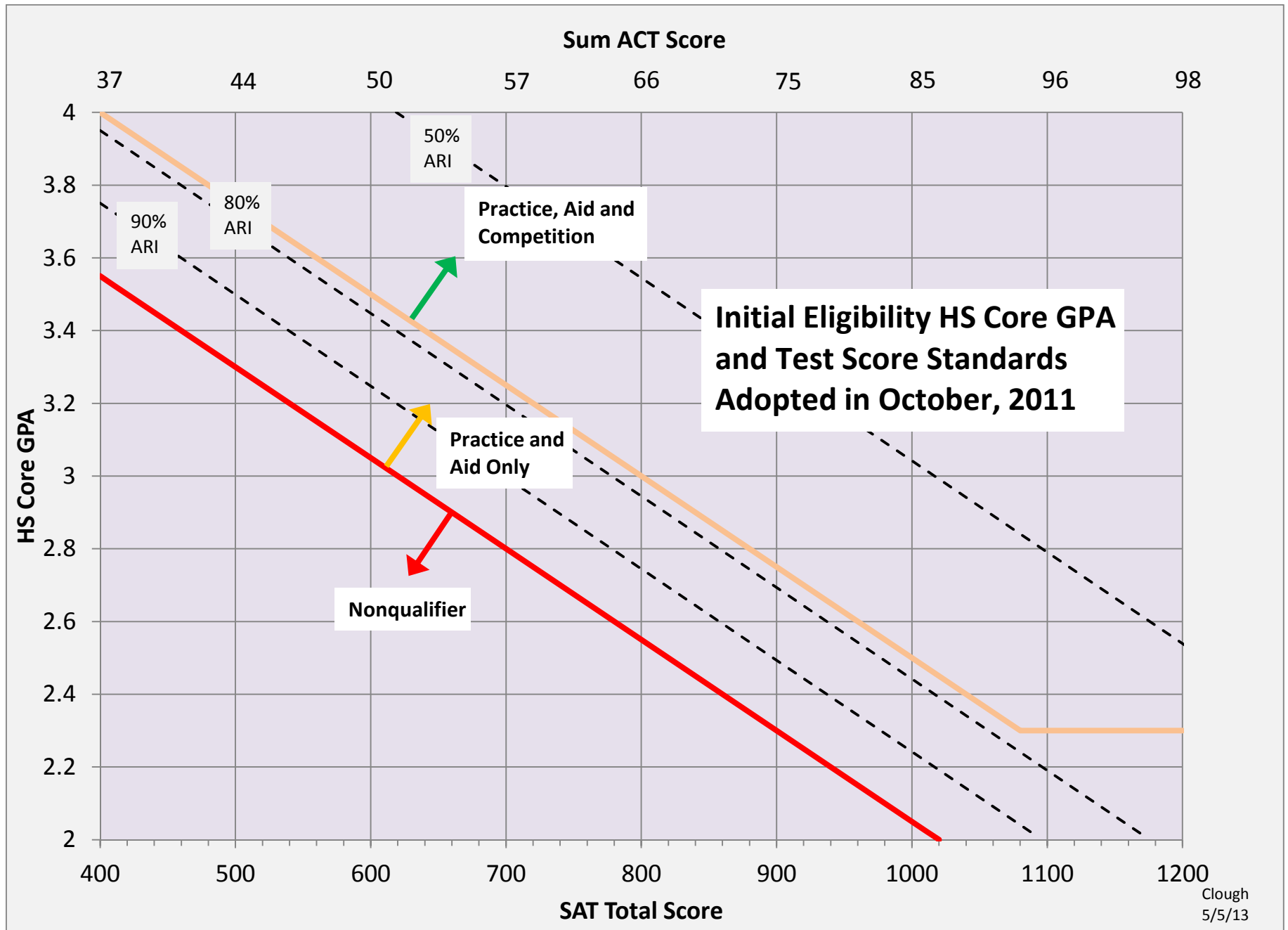
- the requirement for 10 core units by the end of the 6th high school term (end of the junior year) was upheld**
- the requirement that 7 of these 10 core units be in the English-math-science categories was upheld**
- a new requirement was approved: that only the best 16 units may be used to compute the core HS GPA and those units must include the best 7 and 10 above**

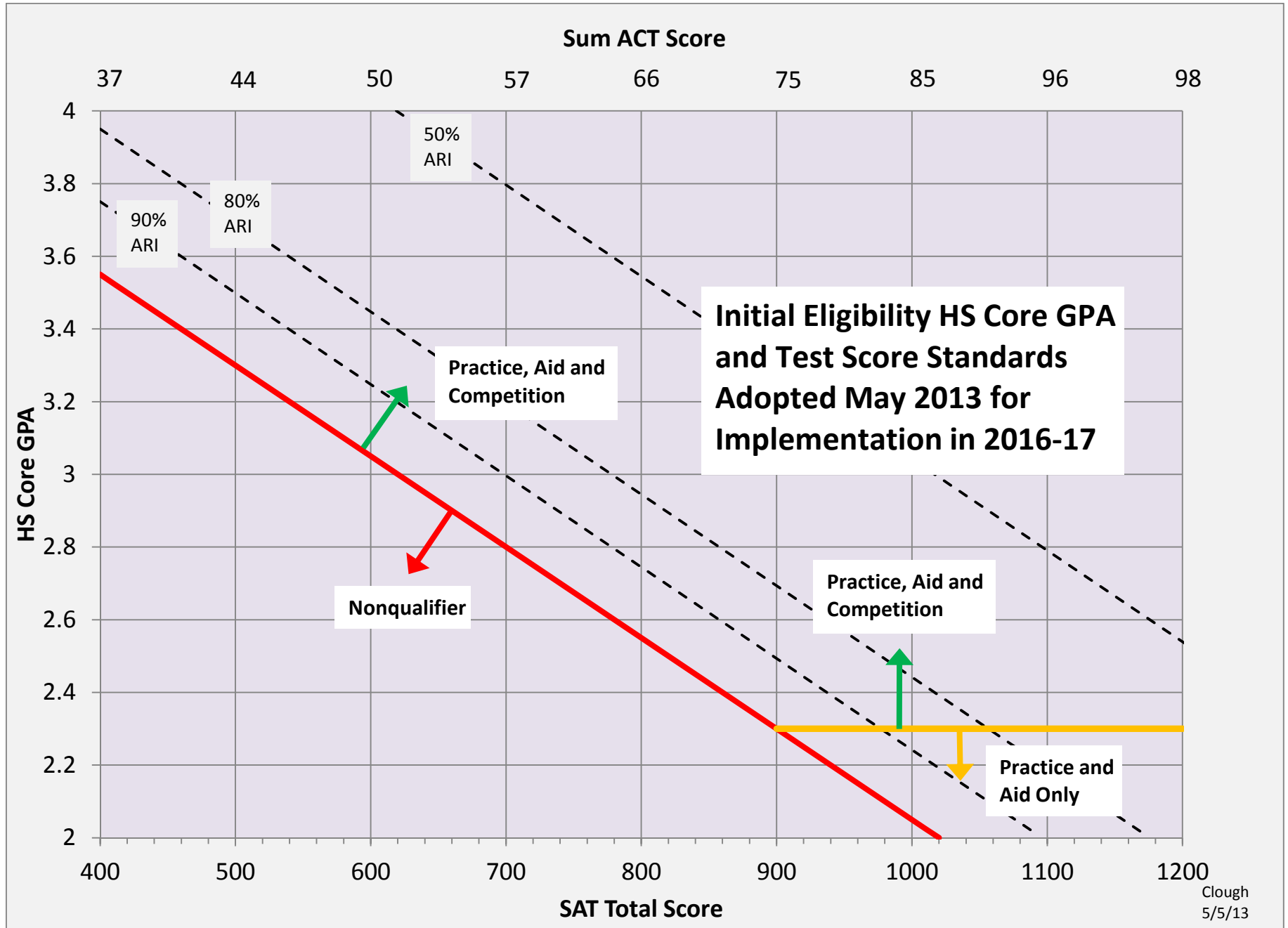
2) Freshman Competition Standard

- the 2.3 HS Core GPA standard was upheld
qualifiers with a Core GPA ≥ 2.0 but less than 2.3 may practice and receive athletically-related financial aid in their first year, but may not compete
- the competition sliding scale was rescinded
prospective student-athletes with a HS Core GPA ≥ 2.3 may practice, receive athletically-related financial aid, and compete in their first year as long as they are qualifiers by today's sliding scale

3) Implementation Date

- August 1, 2016 was upheld as the implementation date





Telephone Calls



Telephone Calls

Iowa State recently has a major infraction due to not logging or incorrectly logging telephone calls.

1405 impermissible calls due to not logging correctly!

Without logging calls, another coach cannot see if you have already called a PSA, thus putting them in the position to make an impermissible phone call.

Today, we will be reviewing the process for logging telephone calls.

Telephone Calls

STEP 1: Comply & Verify Prospect Submission Form to Jo Marchi: Name, high school, year in school, dates of contact with PSA, gender, any applicable phone numbers (parents, too).

STEP 2: Enter all calls in Scoutware system, including calls in which you left a message or the PSA/parent was not reached. Indicate what type of call it was.

A TWO-STEP PROCESS. Easy?

Telephone Calls

If you drop a call, it is permissible to call the PSA back, however you must document that it was a dropped call.

Calls to coaches of PSAs do not have to be logged, unless the coach is also the parent of a PSA.

If you do not reach a PSA, leave a voicemail or leave a simple message (with no conversation) with a family member, indicate that on your call log.

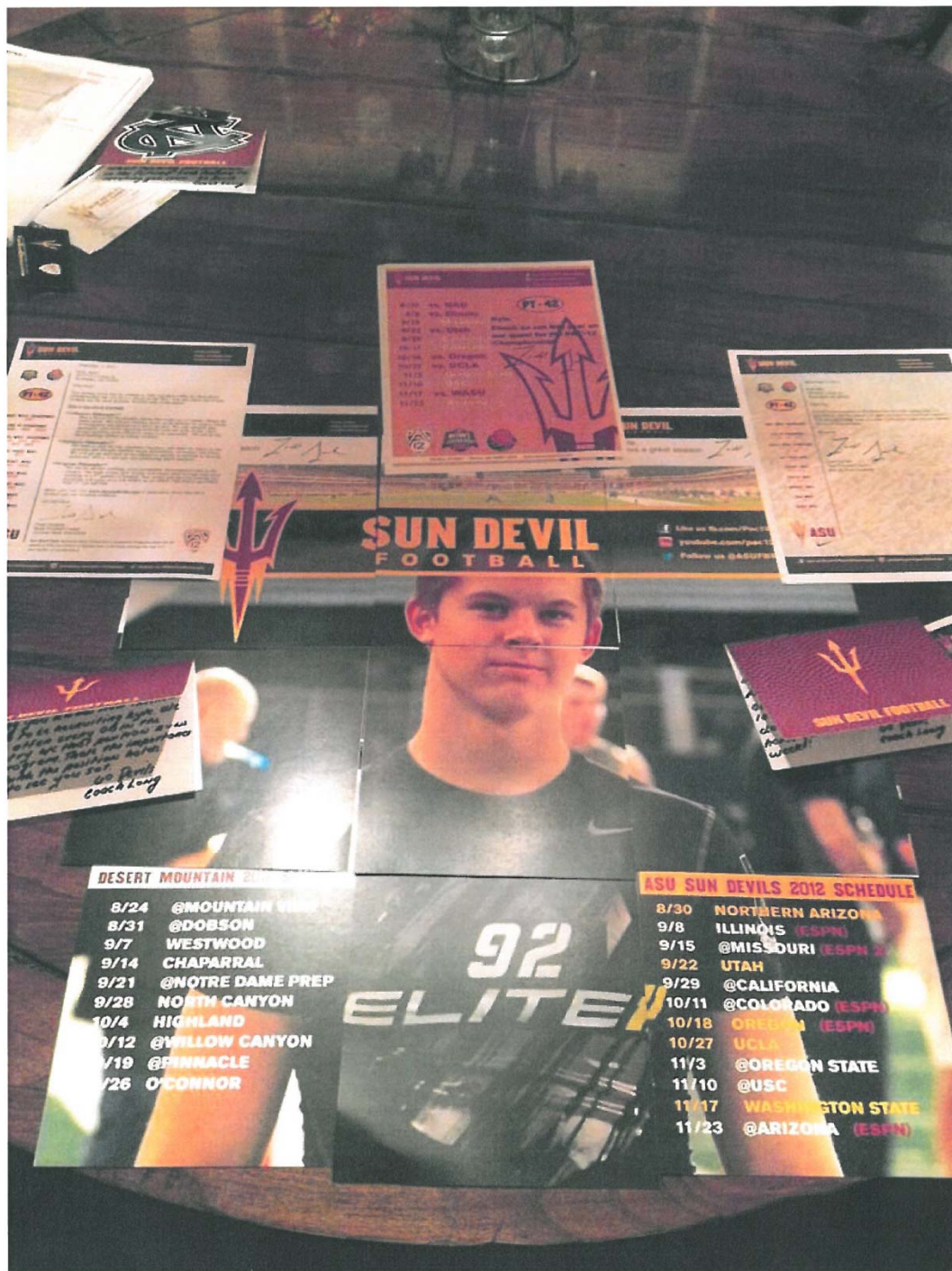


Recruiting Materials

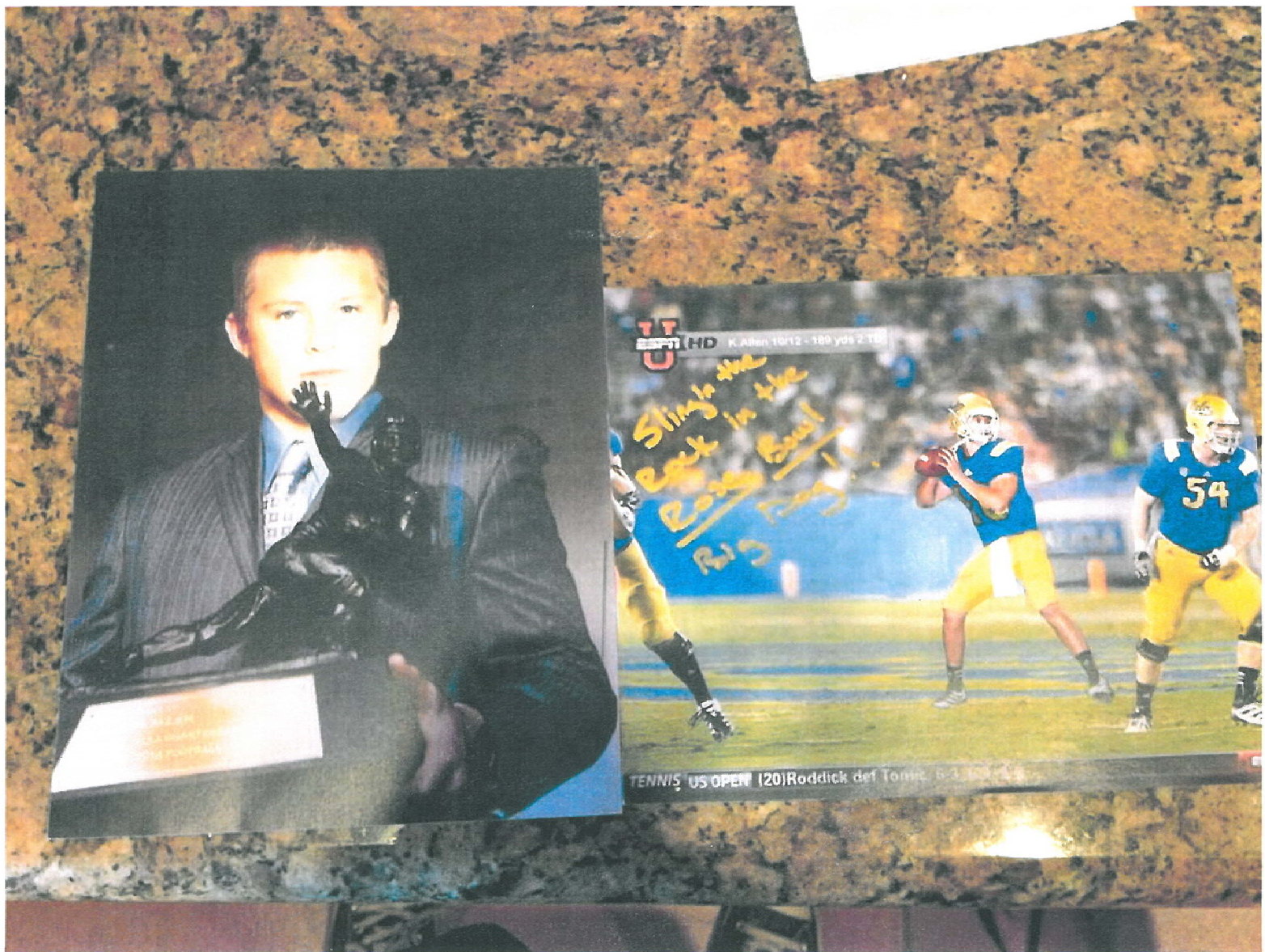

REMINDERS



INITIAL ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATION

Remind your 2013 prospects to submit their FINAL, OFFICIAL transcript (including graduation date) to the Eligibility Center ASAP following graduation.

Many incoming students still need to request their Final Amateur Status.

International students cannot be issued an I-20 until they have a Final Qualifier status. Issuing the I-20 before that status is final puts CU in noncompliance with federal law and subjects us to investigation by the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) of Homeland Security.

Summer Recruiting

Contact still count against your limit for the PSA in the summer, but evaluations do not.

Volleyball—evaluations in the summer count against your 80-day limit (August 1-July 31).

June and July—no baton rule, but still limited to permissible number of coaches off-campus. Basketball—July only!

Starting August 1, no baton rule for any sport and no limit on the number of coaches off-campus recruiting.

When is a Prospect no longer a Prospect?

- ☞ They officially begin classes full-time in the fall (August 26th, 2013).
- ☞ They participate in regular practice or competition that occurs before the beginning of fall term. (Football, Volleyball, Cross Country, Basketball foreign tour practices).
- ☞ They attend classes during the summer prior to initial enrollment.

When is a Prospect no longer a Prospect?

- ✎ They attend classes during the summer prior to initial enrollment.
- ✎ They are no longer considered a prospect for the contact limitations of Bylaw 13 and all of Bylaw 16 (awards and benefits).
- ✎ They are **STILL** considered a prospect for the remainder of Bylaw 13 and all other Bylaws (eligibility, financial aid, playing and practice seasons).

When is a Prospect no longer a Prospect?

☞ What does this mean?

☞ They can participate in occasional meals.

☞ They cannot participate in promotional activities.

☞ They can utilize the weight room.

☞ They cannot work at CU camps/clinics (until next summer!)

When is a Prospect no longer a Prospect?

☞ HOWEVER—

- ☞ This changes on August 1, 2013. Your NLI signees will no longer be prospects for Bylaw 13.1 (contacts and evaluations).
- ☞ So, no Dead Period contact during May/June/July, but permissible in August if NLI signee.

SUMMER ACTIVITIES

∞ Prospective Student-Athletes

□ Scenario 1

- Enrolled in summer school.
- Has not signed NLI.
- May participate in voluntary workouts **conducted** by strength/conditioning coach.
- Participation may only occur from the first day of class until final exams.
- May receive workout apparel on an issuance and retrieval basis.

SUMMER ACTIVITIES

∞ Prospective Student-Athletes

□ Scenario 2

- Enrolled in summer school.
- Has not signed NLI.
- During time in which class is not in session, prospect may participate in voluntary weightlifting or conditioning activities **in the presence of** strength/conditioning coach.
- Such activities cannot be prearranged, the strength/conditioning coach is performing normal duties in the supervision of the facility in use and does not work directly with the prospect.

SUMMER ACTIVITIES

∞ Prospective Student-Athletes

- ❑ Scenario 3 – SPORTS OTHER THAN FOOTBALL/BASKETBALL
 - ❑ Not enrolled in summer school.
 - ❑ Has signed NLI or is 4-year transfer who has signed financial agreement.
 - ❑ May participate in voluntary weightlifting or conditioning activities **in the presence of** strength/conditioning coach.
 - ❑ Such activities cannot be prearranged, the strength/conditioning coach is performing normal duties in the supervision of the facility in use and does not work directly with the prospect.

SUMMER ACTIVITIES

∞ Prospective Student-Athletes

❑ Scenario 4 – FOOTBALL/BASKETBALL

- ❑ Has signed NLI or is 4-year transfer who has signed financial agreement,

OR

- ❑ Is enrolled in summer school at CU.
- ❑ May participate in voluntary weightlifting or conditioning activities **conducted by** strength/conditioning coach.
- ❑ May receive workout apparel on an issuance and retrieval basis.

CURRENT STUDENT-ATHLETES

Individual Sport SAs may request assistance from their coach during the summer. This MUST come from the SA.

Individual Sports: Cross Country, Golf, Ski, Tennis, Track.

This is NOT permissible in: Basketball, Football, Lacrosse, Soccer, Volleyball.

However, a coach may watch a SA involved in organized competition during the summer (basketball league games, club games). No open gyms, weight room workouts, etc.
