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SENIOR BANQUET

A 5th year senior whose parents may have received free admission the year prior, cannot receive free admission a second time. Please be sure you work with the business office and special events to coordinate free admission.

POST-SEASON TICKETS

With the basketball post-season approaching quickly, please remember that CU cannot provide any complimentary admissions to prospects, their parents or the coaches of prospects. This includes any post-season events on our campus like the Women's Basketball NCAA Tournament games or off-campus events such as the basketball conference tournaments. Student-athletes participating in the events are still permitted to receive their complimentary admissions for friends and family.

SUMMER FINANCIAL AID

For student-athletes on a partial scholarship that are approved to receive summer financial aid, the process has changed for 2013. Instead of receiving their scholarship percentage of both tuition/fees and room/board, the student-athlete will receive their scholarship percentage of the total, put towards books first, then tuition/fees first, and any remaining will go towards room/board.

This will affect the partial scholarship student-athletes only. A student who might have received a small summer stipend in the past, may just be receiving more towards tuition/fees. The student will receive the same amount; it will just be applied to their account in a different manner.

SPRING BREAK CARA

For those teams that are 'in season' during CU's spring break, CARA daily and weekly limitations do not apply. However, practice following competition and CARA activities between midnight and 5:00 am are still impermissible. Please be sure to continue to track your CARA during this time for submission to Jo Marchi.

SUMMER COURSES

Coaches, please be sure to remind your student-athletes to take care of any outstanding bills with the university in order to enroll in summer courses. If bills are not taken care of by March 18th, your student-athlete will be automatically dropped from that course.

AGENTS

All CU student-athletes need to be aware of their amateur status and make sure their interactions with agents do not affect their eligibility. Student-athletes should not enter into any type of agreement, oral or written, with an agent. Further, student-athletes should be aware of those who do not consider themselves an agent, but meets the definition of an agent per the NCAA. This includes, but is not limited to, runners, advisors and the like. Also, CU staff members need to remember that you cannot be involved in facilitating a relationship between a student-athlete and an agent and receive compensation for it.
