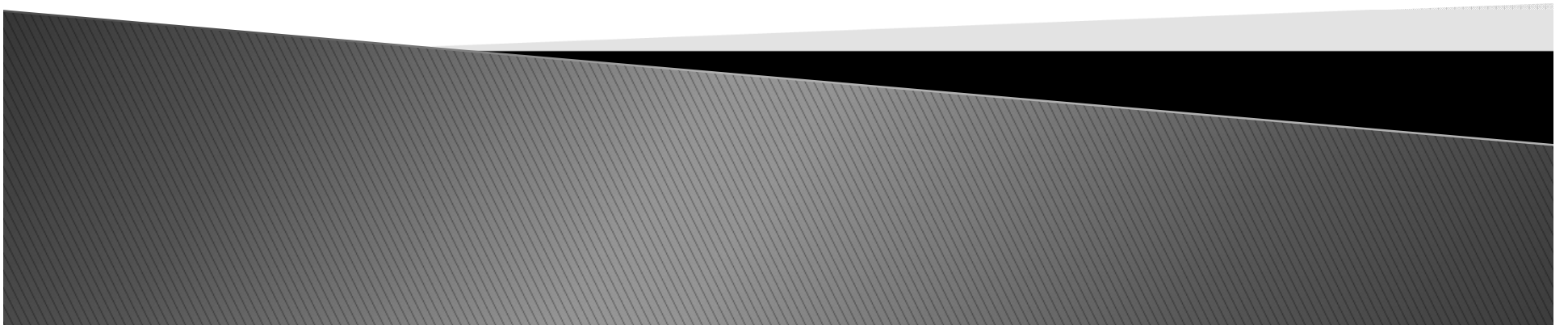


Updates


- ▶ Prospects who have signed a NLI can now work your summer camps.
- ▶ Walk-ons could also work camps if they have submitted their enrollment deposit.
- ▶ Must be paid the going rate. Cannot be paid for only serving as a lecturer or demonstrator.
- ▶ Start camp employment paperwork early so there is no delay in their ability to work camp!




Speaking Engagements



Speaking Engagements

- ▶ In order for a coach to speak either at a prospect's educational institution, or at a place other than their education institution, the follow must occur:
 - ▶ (a) The meeting or banquet is initiated and conducted by the PSA's education institution OR an entity other than the coach's institution;
 - ▶ (b) The coach does not make a recruiting presentation in conjunction with the appearance;
 - ▶ (c) The coach does not have any direct contact with any prospective student-athlete (or a prospective student-athlete's parents or legal guardians) in attendance; and
 - ▶ (d) The coach does not engage in any evaluation activities.

Speaking Engagements

- ▶ These speaking engagements cannot occur during a dead period.
 - ▶ No recruiting presentations, no powerpoints, no handing out camp brochures.
 - ▶ No Q & A with prospects or their parents.
 - ▶ Can have questions prepared prior to the speaking engagements.
 - ▶ Must be general in nature and not CU specific.
 - ▶ College coaches look for 3.0 students. **PERMISSIBLE.**
 - ▶ At CU, coaches want multi-sport athletes. **IMPERMISSIBLE.**


Speaking Engagements

- ▶ Noncoaching Non-Sport Specific Staff Members Speaking at Events Involving Prospective Student-Athletes

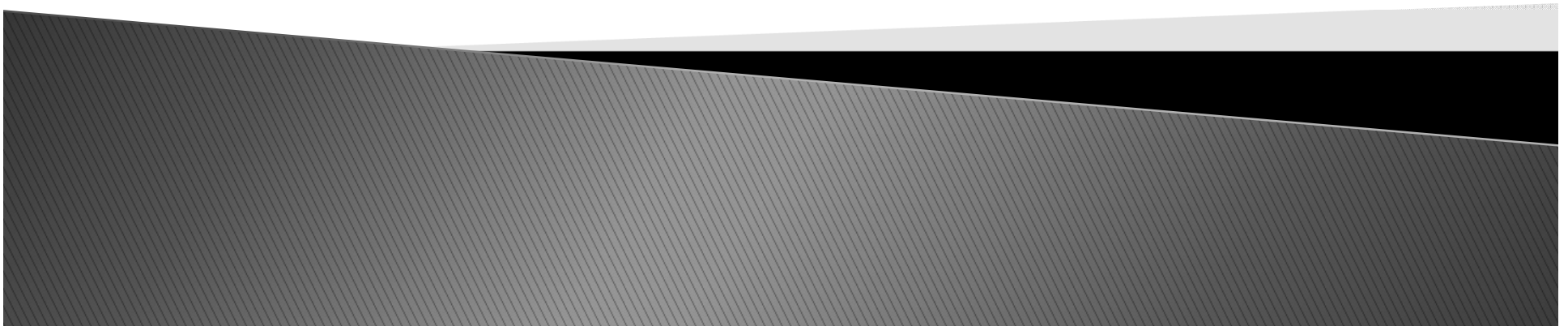

The Legislative Council determined that a noncoaching athletics department staff member who does not have sport-specific responsibilities (e.g., athletics director, compliance administrator, athletics academic counselor) may have direct contact with prospective student-athletes (or individuals yet to become prospective student-athletes) in conjunction with a speaking engagement related to NCAA rules, provided the event does not include a recruiting presentation and no recruiting conversations occur. Further, an institution may initiate such a speaking engagement, provided it does not occur during a dead period for any sport.

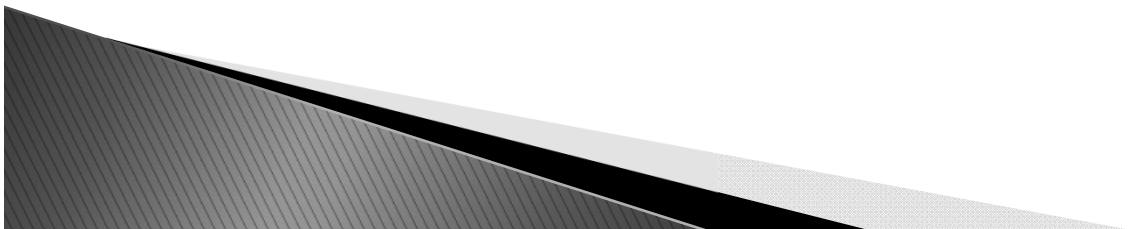


Use of Institutional Facilities



Bylaw 13.11.3.2

- ▶ **Activities Not Involving Institution's Staff.**
- ▶ The use of a member institution's facilities for physical activities by a group that includes prospective student-athletes shall not be considered a tryout, provided the institution's athletics department staff members or representatives of its athletics interests are **not involved in the conduct, promotion or administration of the activity** (other than activities incidental to supervising the use of the facilities) and are subject to all applicable NCAA recruiting legislation.




NCAA Educational Column

- ▶ **Use of an Institution's Facilities for Physical Activities by a Group that Includes Prospective Student–Athletes (I, II, III)**
- ▶ **Date Published: August 20, 2007**
- ▶ For example, while it would be permissible for athletics department staff members or representatives of its athletics interests to open and close the facility, prepare the facility for the event, and perform maintenance on the facility, it would not be permissible for athletics department staff members or representatives of its athletics interests to sell apparel, concessions or tickets for the event, advertise the event, or work at the scorer's table.

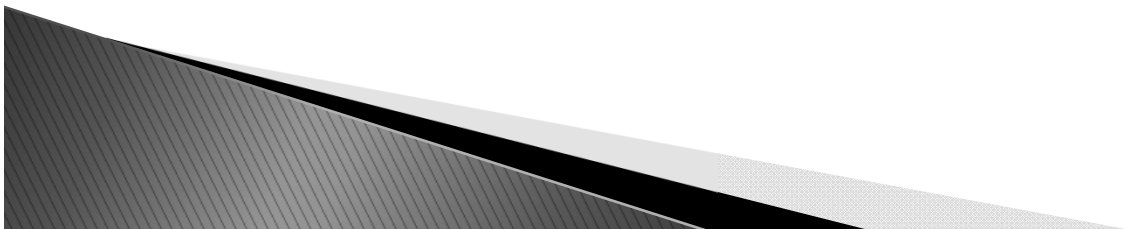


Bylaw 13.11.1.14

- ▶ **Tryout Events.**
 - ▶ A member institution or conference may not host, sponsor or conduct a tryout camp, clinic, group workout or combine (e.g., combination of athletics skill tests or activities) devoted to agility, flexibility, speed or strength tests for prospective student-athletes at any location.
 - ▶ An institution or conference shall not host, sponsor or conduct any portion (e.g., instructional clinic) of an event that also includes agility, flexibility, speed or strength tests for prospective student-athletes that are conducted at a separate location.

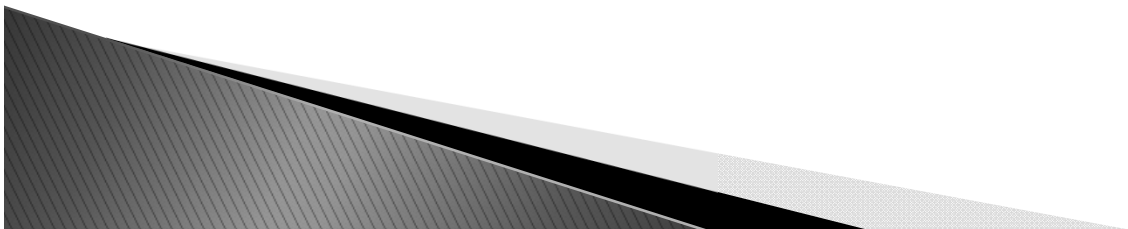
REMINDERS

- ▶ Skeleton crew must be used to run facilities.
- ▶ Must pay the going rate to rent the facilities and coaches cannot be involved in the rental arrangements.
- ▶ All recruiting restrictions apply.
- ▶ Be sure to check your recruiting calendar!




Violation Example 1

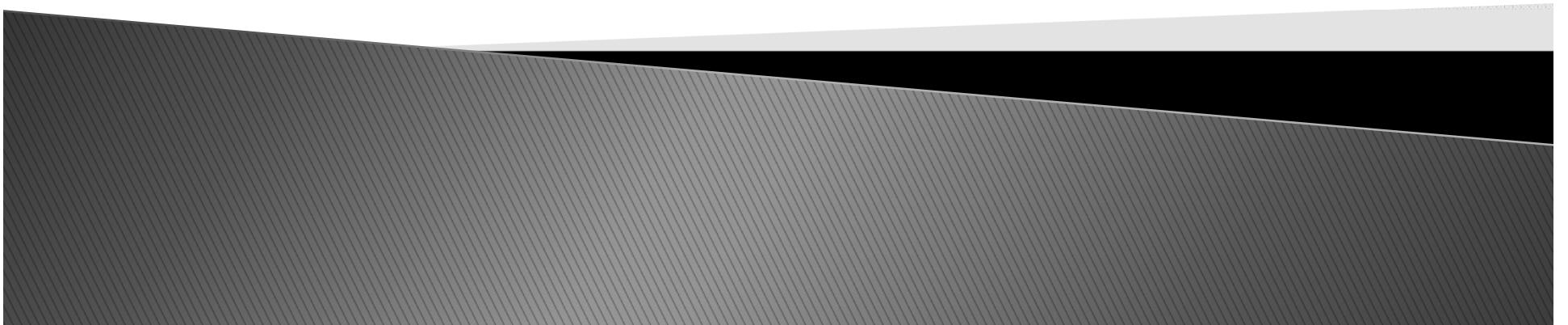
- ▶ Coaching staff was directed to not be involved in any way with team of prospects utilizing campus facilities.
- ▶ Coaching staff performed duties beyond administrative duties for the use of facilities.
- ▶ **IMPERMISSIBLE!**
- ▶ Staff was issued a letter of admonishment and rules education on the topic.




Violation Example 2

- ▶ Coaching staff allowed the use of institutional facilities at no charge for a team of prospects.
 - ▶ Coaching staff also gave a tour of facilities, arranged practice times and set up equipment for the PSAs practice.
 - ▶ IMPERMISSIBLE!
 - ▶ Staff was issued a letter of admonishment, PSAs were declared ineligible until repayment of extra benefits.

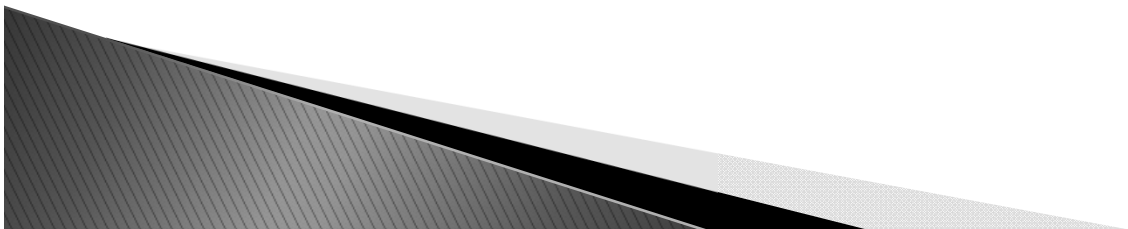
Eligibility

- ▶ Student-athletes must pass a minimum of 6 credit hours in the previous term to be eligible for competition the following term.
 - ▶ Student-athletes must pass a minimum of 18 credit hours between the fall/spring semesters to be eligible the following term.
 - ▶ Student-athletes must pass a minimum of 24 credit hours prior to the start of their second year of enrollment.

Eligibility

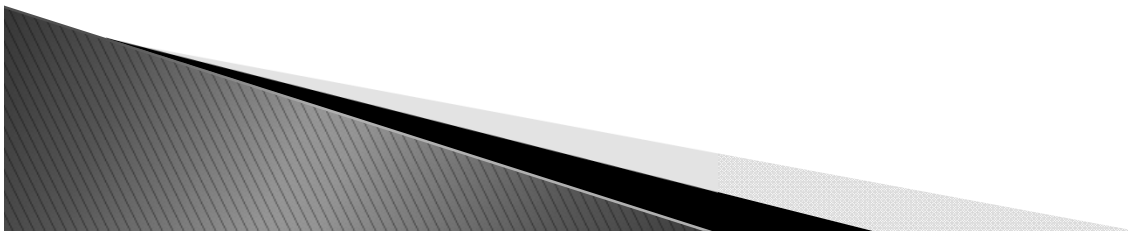
- ▶ Freshman SA passes 6 during the fall 2013 term.
- ▶ SA passes 6 during the spring 2014 term.
- ▶ SA passes 12 during summer 2014 to reach 24 prior to their second year.

- ▶ Is the SA eligible for the fall of 2014??



Eligibility

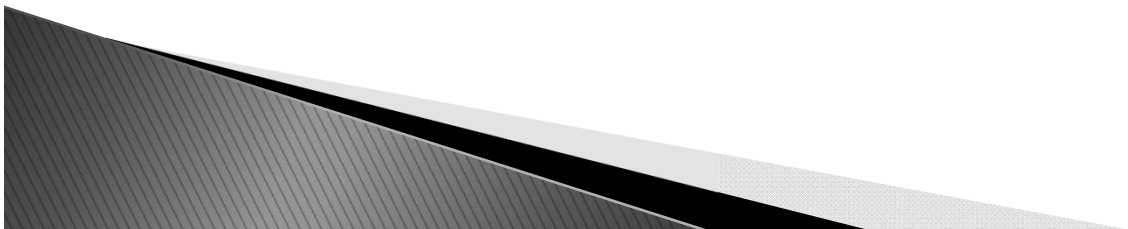
- ▶ No, SA did not pass 18 between fall/spring terms.



Eligibility

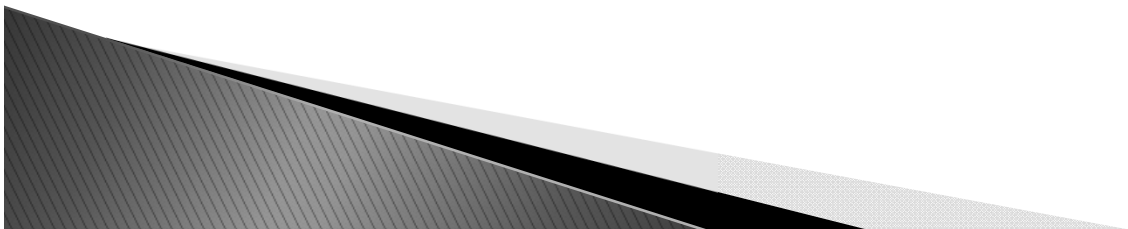
- ▶ Freshman SA passes 6 during the fall 2013 term.
- ▶ SA passes 12 during the spring 2014 term to reach the 18 for fall/spring.
- ▶ SA passes 3 during summer 2014.

- ▶ Is the SA eligible for the fall of 2014??



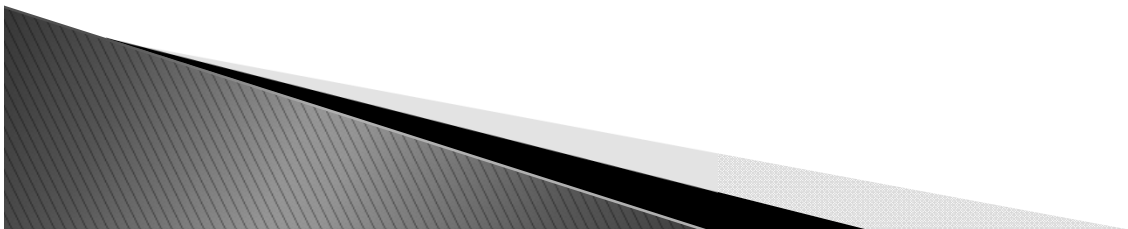
Eligibility

- ▶ No, SA did not pass 24 credits prior to their second year.



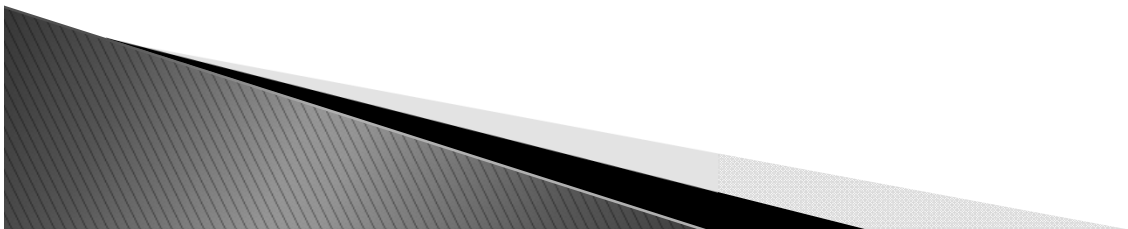
Eligibility

- ▶ Student-athletes must meet percentage of degree requirements each year following their freshman year.
- ▶ Must complete 40% of degree requirements prior to start of third year.
- ▶ Must complete 60% of degree requirements prior to start of fourth year.
- ▶ Must complete 80% of degree requirements prior to start of fifth year.



Eligibility

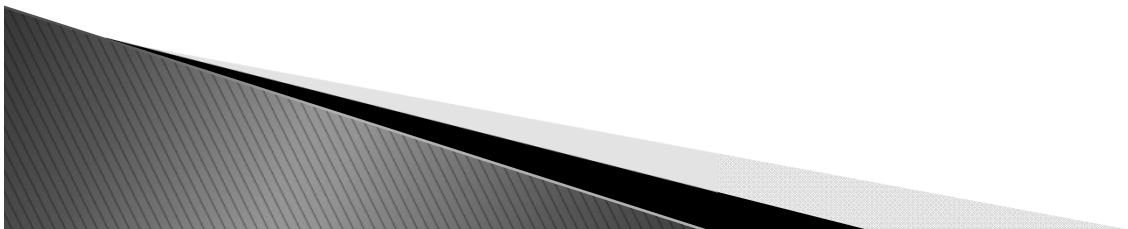
- ▶ For degree programs with 120 required credit hours, here is the breakdown.
- ▶ 40% = 48 credits
- ▶ 60% = 72 credits
- ▶ 80% = 96 credits



Eligibility

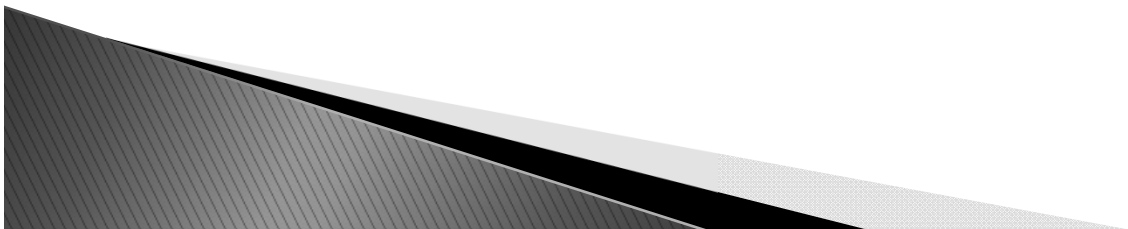
Student-athletes must meet GPA requirements following each year and term.

- ▶ Must have minimum 1.8 GPA prior to and during second year.
- ▶ Must have minimum 1.9 GPA prior to and during third year.
- ▶ Must have minimum 2.0 GPA prior to and during fourth and fifth years.




Eligibility

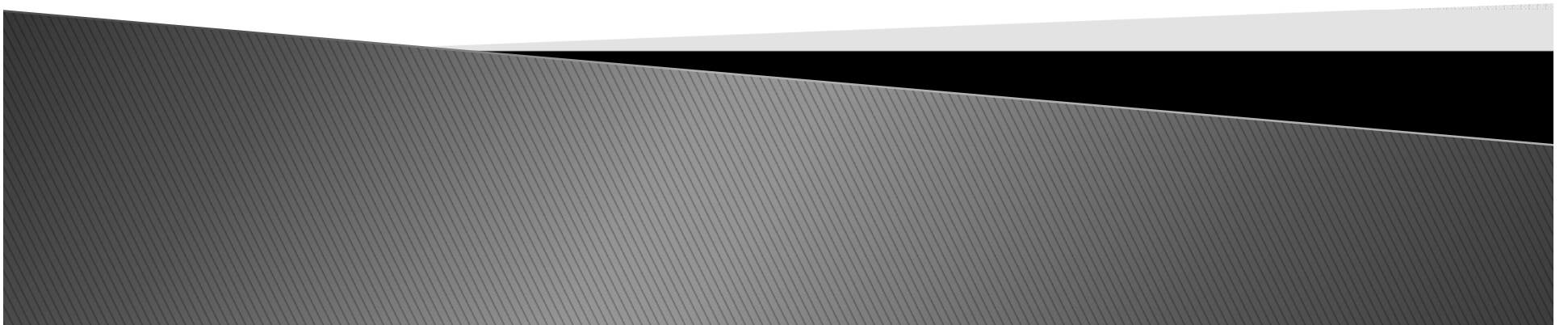
- ▶ Don't forget—CU policy requires a student with a GPA below a 2.0 to obtain a 2.0 in the next semester to remain in school.
- ▶ Therefore, if a SA has two consecutive semesters below 2.0, SA will be ineligible for competition.



Eligibility

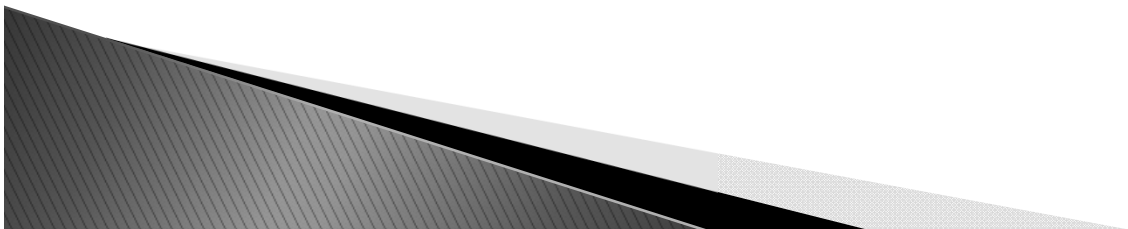
- ▶ Student-athletes must be enrolled full-time in order to participate in competition.
 - ▶ During the first week of the semester, a student-athlete could be enrolled less than full-time and practice, but may not compete!
 - ▶ Check the less than 12 list that Kris has been sending out.
