Recruiting Policy

Recruiting Policy

- **CU's on-campus recruiting policy is very specific.**
- **1:00 am curfew. Must check in with coach or operations staff member.**
- **Cannot partake in drugs, alcohol or other inappropriate behavior. This can affect the PSA's ability to attend CU.**
- **Student-athlete hosts are also held responsible for the activities on an OV. Their eligibility could be at stake!**

Recruiting Policy

- Compliance emails each PSA our expectations for their visit.
- Coaches should also review this with the PSA.
- When signing the host form, SAs should be reminded of the rules and expectations.
- Must have meeting with PSA at the end of the visit to review, and PSA signs form confirming they have followed all rules.

Reporting Violations

Reporting a Violation

- Athletics Staff Members are obligated to report any violations of which you are aware. If you are not sure, ask!
- This is certified yearly by the NCAA's Certification of Compliance Form.
- Other institutional staff members are encouraged to report violations.

Reporting a Violation

A report of a violation or possible violation can be made to the following:

- the Director of Compliance;
- the Director of Athletics;
- Associate Directors of Compliance;
- the Faculty Athletics Representative ("FAR");
- the Chancellor;
- the Office of University Counsel.

All individuals to whom the violation or possible violation is reported, with the exception of the Director of Compliance, are obligated in turn to report the violation to the Athletics Office of Compliance Services.

Reporting a Violation

A report of a violation or possible violation should include the following:

- date(s) and time(s) of violation;
- individual(s) involved in the violation;
- description of the violation;
- reason(s) the violation occurred, and
- if applicable, a statement of actions which have been or will be taken in order to prevent a similar violation from recurring

Things to Keep in Mind During an Investigation...

- Often, because of the nature of the investigation, the DOC cannot inform you, as a coach, that an investigation is being conducted.
- When being interviewed, you may be tape recorded and you will be asked to review/sign-off on NCAA Bylaw 10.1.
- When you are interviewed by the investigators, you will be admonished to not share any information from the interview with anyone else on your staff.
- You and your program WILL make mistakes and we will report- that's something you will have to accept.

New Legislation

R-2014-1 Resolution to Modernize Collegiate Model

This is not actual legislation but more of a commitment to a new vision of the “collegiate athletics system”:

- Balance of academics and athletics
- Enhanced Student-Athlete Support
 - Current and Former SA Undergraduate education, Multi-Year Grants, Medical Support, Academic Support
- For near-future changes
 - Time demands, Career Related Insurance, Agent/Advisor relationships for career planning.
- Continued Evaluation
 - Healthy/Safety, Enforceable Recruiting Rules, Eligibility Rules

New Legislation

2014-11: Concussion Safety Protocol

Institutions must have a concussion safety protocol submitted to a new committee by May 1, 2015 for review and implementation by 2015-2016.

- Requires yearly review of the processes.
- Requires concussion education to SAs.
- Must include “return-to-learn” policy.
- AD signs the policy.
- Must provide any requested information to the new committee for data research, not review of medical protocol.

New Legislation

2014-12 Loss of Value Insurance

- Allows a SA to borrow against future earnings potential to purchase loss-of-value insurance.
- Brings LOV insurance to the same level as Exceptional SA Disability Injury/Illness Insurance.
- This does not allow CU to use our budget to pay for it, but we have the ability to use SAF, if approved through the SAF process.
- Boosters/donors cannot be involved in this process.

New Legislation

2014-13 Cost of Attendance

New definition of a full grant-in-aid to also include “other expenses related to attendance, up to the cost of attendance”.

- An institution may award up to the COA, we do not have to.
- As determined by CU’s financial aid office. Not athletics, not a coach. Must use federal guidelines.
- OFA can use professional judgment to adjust an individuals COA. Must be applied consistently.

New Legislation

2014-13-1 Cost of Attendance/Student Assistance Fund

SAF can be used for its intended purposes without counting toward determining the permissible amount of financial aid.

- Remember, SAF cannot be use for tuition/fees, room/board or books during the academic year.

New Legislation

2014-13-2 Cost of Attendance/Reporting Variances

This proposal was defeated by the autonomy membership.

CU will obviously follow all federal and institutional financial aid guidelines and will not be in the business of manipulating COA.

New Legislation

2014-13-3 Cost of Attendance/Proportionality

This proposal was withdrawn by the SEC.

Therefore, equivalency proportionality will be calculated using just one simple fraction:

Athletics Aid Received (numerator)

COA (denominator)

New Legislation

2014-13-4 Cost of Attendance/Books

This proposal was defeated by the autonomy membership.

The proposal was to use the figured used by CU in COA for books, not the \$800 placeholder. We are now to continue using the \$800 placeholder, with the exact logistics to be worked out.

New Legislation

2014-14 No Athletics Reasons in Reduction or Nonrenewal of Award

If a SA received athletics aid in their initial year of full-time enrollment, that aid cannot be reduced or nonrenewed the following academic year or years of their SA's five-year period of eligibility.

The only time aid can be taken away after the period of the award is for the same reasons that aid can be taken away during the period of the award.

New Legislation

2014-14 No Athletics Reasons in Reduction or Nonrenewal of Award

Reduction, Cancellation or nonrenewal permitted if:

- 1- SA renders himself or herself ineligible for competition.
- 2- SA fraudulently misrepresents any information on an application, letter of attendance or financial aid agreement.
- 3-Engages in serious misconduct warranting substantial disciplinary penalty, as determined by the institution's regular student disciplinary authority.

New Legislation

2014-14 No Athletics Reasons in Reduction or Nonrenewal of Award

Reduction, Cancellation or nonrenewal permitted if:

4-Voluntarily withdraws (requesting PTC is not w/d).

5-Violates a nonathletically related condition outlined in the financial aid agreement or violates a documented institutional rule or policy (e.g., academic policies or standards, athletics department or team rules or policies).

New Legislation

2014-14 No Athletics Reasons in Reduction or Nonrenewal of Award

This does not mean you must sign all PSAs to a 5-year award, but you cannot reduce/cancel aid as you have in the past.

Applicable to incoming students only, you can provide a student who has been at CU, not on aid, a one-year scholarship and take it away at the end of the period of the award.
