

IMPORTANT OFFICIAL VISIT FACTS

- ◆ The prospect's visit extends up to 48 hours on the CU campus.
- ◆ You may NOT consume alcohol or drugs while with the recruit. You may NOT provide alcohol or drugs to the recruit.
- ◆ There is a 1:00 AM Curfew for all prospects to be returned to their lodging and a staff member must confirm that the PSA is in the room.
- ◆ Any contact with a booster (planned or unplanned) is not permissible.
- ◆ Only one student-athlete may receive a free meal while they are serving as a student host (in the event another student-athlete is present).
- ◆ The prospect may be provided with 3 complimentary admissions per sporting event.

⇒ For example, if the prospect's parents attend a CU sporting event with the prospect, ALL 3 complimentary admissions are used for that sporting event.
- ◆ If you accompany a prospect to a CU sporting event, you may receive one complimentary admission.
- ◆ A student-athlete may not spend host money on friends, significant others, or family members of the prospect. These individuals must pay for their own meals. CU can only pay for meals of the parent or legal guardian of the prospect.
- ◆ Under no circumstances should cash be given to the prospect.
- ◆ A prospect can only borrow appropriate clothing, if there is an immediate and inclement change in the weather. ALL items must be returned by the prospect before their departure. (i.e., Raincoat, hat & gloves, etc.)

IMPORTANT UNOFFICIAL VISIT FACTS

- ◆ You may NOT consume alcohol or drugs while with the recruit. You may NOT provide alcohol or drugs to the recruit.
- ◆ Prospects may NOT be transported off campus during an unofficial visit. Exception: Traveling to YOUR sport's practice or competition site (East Campus, South Campus) with a CU staff member (coach, professor, etc.) in the car is permissible.
- Prospects may NOT have meals off-campus.
- The prospect must pay for their own meals. Meal plans may not be used for the prospect.

⇒ Example: You may still eat with a prospect but he/she must pay for his/her own meal. For example, a prospect may eat with you at the C4C but they must still pay for the meal.
- You may not give your parking pass to the prospect. Visitor permits are available for purchase at Parking Services.

As a CU student-athlete, you are an integral part of an outstanding university and athletics program. You have earned the **privilege** of representing yourself, the entire student body, faculty, staff and the alumni of the University of Colorado, in addition to representing the state of Colorado as a CU Student-Athlete.

This honor and privilege comes with a commensurate level of **responsibility**. As a member of the Athletics Department, **you are accountable for your own actions and for the actions of your teammates**. It is therefore incumbent upon you to demonstrate exceptional character, which can be exemplified by your integrity and honesty both as a member of the campus community and as a participant in athletics competition.

WHAT MAKES A GREAT HOST?

What it means to be a host: Being a host is an important job with many responsibilities. These guidelines have been set forth by the NCAA and CU Boulder and violating them may result in making you or your team ineligible for competition. To have fun and avoid potential ineligibility, just know the guidelines.

ENTERTAINMENT MONEY:

You may receive up to **\$40** per day to entertain a prospect, \$60 per day if you have two prospects at the same time.

- ◆ Prospect's meals (breakfast, lunch, and dinner) and one snack are NOT included in this \$40 (coach pays for it).
- ◆ Any additional meals or snacks MUST come out of the daily \$40 allowance.
- ◆ Host money must pay for the entertainment of everyone in attendance.

⇒ If you, the prospect, and an assistant coach go to a movie, the money must cover everyone.

ENTERTAINMENT IDEAS:

The NCAA does not list any specific activities but here's some good ideas:

- ◆ Go to a movie at the 29th Street Mall
- ◆ Walk around Pearl Street, get ice cream
- ◆ Paintball, lasertag, mini-golf
- ◆ Haunted Houses @ Halloween
- ◆ Hiking in the foothills
- ◆ Go support fellow Buffs at their games/contests

HOST MONEY MAY **NOT** BE SPENT ON

- ◆ Souvenirs or other CU mementos given to the PSA
 - ⇒ For example, if you have additional host money you didn't spend, buying a hat for the prospect at the UMC is not allowed.
- ◆ Alcohol/Drugs/Solicitation

ENTERTAINMENT TO AVOID

- ◆ Any situation with alcohol or drugs
 - ⇒ For example. You may not consume any alcohol or drugs while the prospect is present. This includes the prospect. {even if they are 21 years old}
- ◆ Any adult entertainment club

AREA LIMITATIONS

The NCAA limits taking prospects more than 30 miles away from campus.

- ◆ Trips to Ft. Collins or Colorado Springs are not permitted.
- ◆ Certain areas of Southeast Denver exceed the 30 mile radius
 - ⇒ See 30 mile radius map online at the Compliance Corner at www.cubuffs.com or in the Office of Compliance Services
- ◆ Skiing trips are prohibited.

TRANSPORTATION

- ◆ CU is not permitted to provide you with a vehicle & never allow the recruit to use your car without you.
- ◆ If you use your own vehicle, student host money may be used for gas.

PROFESSIONAL SPORTING EVENTS

- ◆ Free tickets to professional sporting events (Broncos, A's) given to CU or to the host cannot be used.
- ◆ Host money must cover ticket prices for both host and prospect, parking, other attendees, and any additional food outside provided meals.
 - ⇒ A Rockies, Rapids, or Crush games can be within the price restrictions but **NOT** Broncos, Nuggets, or Avalanche games.

HOST MONEY PICK-UP AND DROP-OFF:

- ◆ Pick up the host money in the Business Office M-F 8am-4:30pm. Bring a PHOTO ID to pick up the money.
- ◆ You may keep unused money at the end of the visit to fill your gas tank or replenish the food eaten at your house by the PSA, etc.
- ◆ **Please spend the money on the recruit.** It is important you show them all the opportunities available to them at CU, Boulder and Colorado.
- ◆ After the visit, you must report back to your coach/operations staff detailing what you spent the money on while the PSA was here.
- ◆ You may be subject to a post-visit interview with the Compliance Office to obtain information about the activities during a PSAs visit. Be sure to follow the guidelines!
