HIGH SCHOOL: Bethea won the Alaska State 4A Cross Country Championship in 2010 after winning the Alaska Regional III Championship the week before. She went on to compete at the Nike Cross Northwest Regionals, placing 41st overall. Bethea placed 18th at the state cross country championship in 2009 as a junior, improving from a 20th-place finish as a sophomore. She was also successful on the track at KHS, owning the 800 (2:21.18) and 5,000-meter (17:24.08) school records. Bethea won the Alaska State 4A Championship in the 1,600 as a senior after a runner-up finish in 2010. She also placed second as a senior at the state meet in the 3,200 and was sixth in the 800. In the summer of 2011 she raced to an eighth-place finish in the 5k at the USATF Junior Outdoor Championships. She also competed in the 100, 400, 300-hurdles, shot put, high jump and pentathlon as a member of the KHS track and field team. COLLEGE- 2010: Biegner earned his way onto the varsity roster as a redshirt sophomore. He started off by placing 31st at the Rocky Mountain Shootout, crossing the finish as CU's tenth harrier. Biegner ran in the open race at NCAA Pre-Nationals, placing 29th overall. At the Big 12 Championship, he was the seventh Buffalo to cross the line and was 47th overall with a time of 25:25.41. Biegner took 60th at regionals and finished the season by placing 234th at nationals.

2009: During the 2009 season, Biegner ran in three races. He was 59th at the Rocky Mountain Shootout and took 24th at the Fort Hays Invite. Biegner ran unattached in his final race of the season and took 30th at the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference open race.

COLLEGE- 2010: Bosshard had an outstanding redshirt sophomore season and started it by placing first at the Rocky Mountain Shootout to lead the Buffs to a first-place team finish. Two weeks later at the NCAA Pre-National Invitational he placed seventh overall in the 'white' race, once again leading the Buffs and awarded the Big 12 Runner of the Week honor. Bosshard earned his first all-conference selection at the Big 12 Championship when he was the sixth runner to finish the race (he was CU's No. 2 scorer), helping CU to a second-place team finish. A couple of weeks later he led CU again, this time placing eighth at the NCAA Mountain Region Championship. With the finish Bosshard earned his second all-region honor in two years. He ended the year on a high note, finishing 26th overall at the NCAA Championship to earn his first All-American cross country honor. Bosshard was named the CU Athlete of the Week for his outstanding performance.

2009: Bosshard was one of three redshirt freshmen to make the varsity squad but was the only one to score for the Buffs. He was named the Big 12 Runner of the Week after racing to a first-place finish at the Fort Hays State Open. Bosshard followed up that performance with a 19th-place finish at the Big 12 Championship; although he did not score for CU as he was the sixth racer to cross the finish. Bosshard recorded his first all-region honor two weeks later as he finished 24th overall. He was the fifth Buffalo to finish, scoring for the first time in his career. Bosshard ended his frosh campaign by taking 80th overall at the NCAA Championship and moved up to the fourth scoring position for CU. **2008:** Redshirt. Did not compete.

HIGH SCHOOL: Bosshard won three letters in cross country and four on the track. While competing in Wisconsin, he was a two-time member of the Mississippi Valley Conference cross country first team. On the track he earned MVC honorable mention honors in the 3,200-meter run. Bosshard finished fourth at the 2006 Wisconsin Division III Cross Country Championships. In 2007, he placed 27th at the Foot Locker Midwest Cross Country Championship. He also placed second in the 3,200m at Mt. Sac Relays. Bosshard competed in the Nike Outdoor National Meet in the 5,000m and ran a mark of 15:12.

At pre-nationals he was 64th and scored as CU's No. 5 runner. Clayton placed 24th at the final Big 12 Championship for CU and was the sixth CU harrier across the finish. He followed up that performance with a 42nd-place finish at the regional championship and ended the year at NCAAs with a 210th-place finish.

2009: Clayton raced in a pair of meets for CU. He started the season off with a 10th-place finish at the Rocky Mountain Shootout; crossing as the sixth Buff in 25:59. Clayton followed up that performance by taking 15th in the open race at pre-nationals.

2008: Redshirt. Did not compete.

2007: Clayton ran in three meets for the Buffs. In his collegiate debut, Clayton placed 27th and was the 12th Buff to reach the finish at the Rocky Mountain Shootout. His best race came at the Air Force Invite where he took fifth overall and was the No. 2 CU harrier.

COLLEGE- 2010: Coburn continued to play an important role for the Buffs as a junior. She raced to her best finish at the Rocky Mountain Shootout, placing second overall and just one second behind teammate Laura Tremblay. Coburn helped the team out two weeks later to a second-place finish in the 'white' race at pre-nationals, taking 14th overall. She earned her first all-conference honor at the Big 12 Championship after finishing fifth overall. The team placed second to Texas Tech by just nine points. Coburn took her second all-region honor two weeks later at the NCAA Mountain Region Championship after finishing 11th. She ended the year at nationals with a 53rd-place finish as CU took sixth overall. **2009:** Coburn continued to shine for the Buffs during her sophomore campaign. She started the season out strong by racing to a third-place finish at the Rocky Mountain Shootout behind teammates Jenny Barringer and Allie McLaughlin. Two weeks later Coburn helped the Buffs to a win at pre-nats; taking 32nd overall as the fifth Buff to finish. She continued to score for CU as she was also the fifth harrier for the Buffs at the Big 12 Championship, coming in 22nd overall. Coburn earned her first all-region honor after she recorded a 16th-place finish and improved to the No. 4 position on the team. Coburn finished the season at nationals. She was the No. 2 Buff and finished 115th overall.

2008: Coburn was one of two freshmen women to score for the Buffs and did so in four meets. She started off her career with a 25th-place finish at the lowa State Invitational and was the sixth Buff to cross the finish. She followed up that performance with her best finish of the season (eighth) at the Rocky Mountain Shootout (fourth Buff). Coburn was 139th at the pre-national meet (fifth to score). During the two postseason races, Coburn was the No. 3 runner for CU. She placed 27th at the Big 12 meet and was 30th at regionals.

HIGH SCHOOL: Coburn was an all-state performer for four years for the Titans; including two fourth place finishes at the state cross country meet in 2006 and 2007. She placed 29th at the 2007 Foot Locker Midwest Championship. On the track Coburn is an eight-time 2A state champion. She owns five CBHS records: 400m (1:02), 800m (2:16), 1,600m (5:11), 3,200m (11:32), the 4x800-meter relay and in the high jump (5 feet, 1 inch). She ran the 2,000-meter steeplechase at Nike Outdoor Nationals. Coburn placed second in 2008 and fourth in 2007 to earn a pair of All-American honors.

COLLEGE – 2010: Cumming missed the first race of her junior year, but had a good showing at pre-nationals when she placed 69th overall. She followed that up with a 37th-place finish at the final Big 12 Championship where the Buffs took second in the team race. Cumming just missed all-region recognition at the NCAA Mountain Region Championship with a 27th-place finish. She ended the year finishing 215th at the NCAA championship.

2009: Cumming continued to hold on to her spot on the varsity team as a sophomore, starting with a ninth-place finish at the Rocky Mountain Shootout. At the following meet, pre-nats, she was the seventh harrier for CU, taking 72nd overall. She improved to 33rd at the Big 12 Championship, moving up from 49th the previous season. Cumming just missed all-region honors when she was the 27th to cross the finish line as CU's No. 6. She finished the season with a 150th-place finish at nationals and moved up to the No. 4 spot on the team.

2008: Cumming was one of three freshmen to earn a spot of the varsity roster although she did not score for CU during the season. She was 29th in her collegiate debut at the lowa State Invitational and was the No. 7 Buff to finish the race. At the Rocky Mountain Shootout, Cumming was 11th and was the No. 6 harrier, finishing in 22:33. Two weeks later at Pre-Nationals, she placed 157th and was once again the No. 6 racer for CU. The Big 12 meet saw Cumming placing 49th overall (No. 7) in 22:42.9. Her best time of the season was at regionals when Cummings placed 58th as CU's No. 6 runner in 21:57.3.

HIGH SCHOOL: Cumming earned eight letters in cross country and track & field at Hudson High School and was an all-conference selection all four years. She owns Hudson High School records in the 3,200-meter run (10:53, June '08), the 4x400-meter relay (4:05.37, June '05) and the 4x800 (9:27.74). Her 3,200m and 4x800 records are also Big Rivers Conference records. She was a member of the honor roll in high school and a Wisconsin Academic All-State selection all four years. McLaughlin recorded the second best freshman finish ever at nationals behind Shalane Flanagan (2000). Because of her outstanding finish, she was named the CU Athlete of the Week.

HIGH SCHOOL: McLaughlin won the Colorado State 5A title by more than a minute as a senior with a PR of 17:04, which doubles as the AAHS and meet record. She was undefeated her senior season, winning the conference and regional titles, and set three course records as well as four meet records. 2009: Medina continues to be one of the most consistent performing members on the team. During his junior year he was either the No. 2 or 3 harrier on the team; helping the Buffs to second-place team performances at pre-nats, Big 12s and regionals. At the first race of the season, the Rocky Mountain Shootout, Medina recorded a fourth-place overall finish after running a course PR 25:09. COLLEGE—2010: Tremblay moved into a leadership role guickly for CU, leading the Buffs in every varsity race as a sophomore. She won the Rocky Mountain Shootout with the 10th-fastest time in course history (20:29), out-sprinting teammate Emma Coburn by just one second. She was named the CU Athlete of the Week as well as the Big 12 Runner of the Week for her performance. Tremblay once again earned Big 12 Runner of the Week honors after recording a second place finish at pre-nationals. Two weeks later she earned her second All-Big 12 honor after racing to a fourth-place finish at the final Big 12 meet, helping CU to a second-place team finish. Tremblay earned CU Athlete of the Week and all-region honors after finishing third at the NCAA Mountain Region Championship. Tremblay continued to pull off good times for CU at regionals as she recorded her first top-10 finish when she crossed the line ninth overall; this time as CU's No. 3. Tremblay finished her NCAA season by taking 199th at nationals. She continued her season at the USA Cross Country Championships and placed fourth overall in the junior race to earn a spot on the roster for the IAAF World Championships in Poland where she placed 51st overall.
