GAME NOTES: COLORADO BUFFALOES (9-1-1) vs. KANSAS STATE WILDCATS (5-5-0), NOVEMBER 17, 1990

Special Welcome... to the Kansas State contingent headed by Athletic Director Steve Miller and SID Kenney Mossman...we'd like to welcome KCNC-TV and Prime Sports, both televising this afternoon's game, as well as Steve Hatchel and Arthur Hertz from the Orange Bowl...also with us today is Tim Allen, Big Eight assistant commissioner...we're glad to have you with us this afternoon, along with all of our regulars...if we can be of any assistance to you, please don't hesitate to ask.

The Game... Colorado (9-1-1, 6-0-0 Big Eight; ranked 2nd in AP & UPI) vs. Kansas State (5-5-0, 2-4-0 Big Eight) in the both teams' regular-season finale... ● A win today would give the Buffs back-to-back outright Big Eight titles, the first time that has ever happened to a school other than Oklahoma or Nebraska... ● Colorado is shooting for its ninth consecutive win, after opening the season tying Tennessee (31-31) in the Pigskin Classic, beating Stanford (21-17), and then losing at Illinois (23-22)...next came wins over Texas (29-22), Washington (20-14), Missouri (33-31), Iowa State (28-21) Kansas (41-10), Oklahoma (32-23), Nebraska (27-12) and Oklahoma State (41-22)... ● CU is looking to extend its home win streak to 14 games, one shy of tying the school record, while also looking for its 14th undefeated home season... ● Meanwhile, Kansas State has been one of the most improved teams in 1990, and a win today would give the Wildcats their best record since a 6-5-1 finish in 1982... ● KCNC-TV (channel 4 in Denver) is televising the game live, with Les Shapiro (play-by-play) and Dave Logan (color analyst) calling the action... ● Prime Sports is carrying the game on its network (tape-delayed basis), as Dave Armstrong (play-by-play) and Dave Lapham (color) handle the announcing duties... ● KOA-Radio (850 am in Denver) originates the 27-station CU Football Network...Larry Zimmer, the voice of the Buffs, will handle the play-by-play, while his partner, Kent Groshong, adds his color analysis.

The Crowd... A crowd of over 51,000 is expected to be on hand... ● As of Friday afternoon, about 1,000 tickets still remained for this afternoon's game... ● For more on 50,000-plus crowds at Folsom Field, see page 4 of the game notes.

The Coaches... Colorado head coach Bill McCartney (Missouri '62) is in his ninth season at Colorado...his overall record stands at 55-46-2 (.544 pct.), while his career mark is the same...McCartney is 48-21-1 (.693 pct.) over the last five seasons, and 41-12-1 (.769 pct.) since the start of the 1986 Big Eight season...he is coaching his 104th game at CU, which puts him third in longevity, as well as being second in league longevity (NU's Tom Osborne is first)...in Big Eight games, Mac is 35-26-1 (.573 pct.), and 31-10-0 (.756 pct.) since 1985...he owns a 6-2 mark vs. Kansas State (3-0 in Boulder)... ● Kansas State head coach, Bill Snyder (William Jewell College '63), is in his second season at KSU, posting a 6-15 (.286 pct.) record...his career mark is the same, while he is 0-1 vs. CU.

Post-Game Press Conference... with Coach McCartney will be held in the SE meeting room of the CU team house (enter on south side of building) following a 10-minute cooling-off period after the game...the Buff locker room is open to the media...members of the CU Athletic Media Relations office will be in the locker room to help with interviews... ● Check with Kansas State SID Kenny Mossman for the Wildcats' postgame locker room policy.

The Series... It's the 45th meeting for these two, as Colorado holds a 32-12 edge in the all-time series, including five straight wins...during that time (since 1985), CU has outscored K-State 235-28, and has a 2,471-1,080 edge in total offense... ● In games in Boulder, it's the Buffs with a 20-2 advantage, and the Wildcats haven't won in seven trips here (since 1973, 17-14)... ● The last time these two teams met, the No.2 ranked Buffs were paced by 246 yards rushing from J.J. Flannigan enroute to a 59-11 win...it was the most points scored by CU since 1970, while their 518 rushing yards were the most in 18 seasons.

Folsom Field Streak on the Line... In the summer of 1989, the 11-year-old artificial turf at Folsom Field was removed and replaced with a new carpet of AstroTurf-8... ● All three times that the AstroTurf has been replaced at Folsom, the Buffs have posted wins in the first game played on the new carpet...in fact, when the turf was replaced in 1971, the Buffs went undefeated at home that year (carried over into 1972 season for nine-straight victories) and in 1978, CU opened with five wins at home... ● Last season, the Buffs went 6-0 at home to record another undefeated season at Folsom...this year, CU is looking for its sixth home victory, as they have yet to lose on the new artificial turf at Folsom.

Another Streak... The Buffs are shooting for their 14th straight win at Folsom Field, just one shy of tying the school record of 15 straight (1908-1912)...CU's last home loss was 17-14 to Oklahoma in 1988... ● CU has set the record for consecutive wins at Folsom Field with 13 (old mark was 11 from 1941-43)... ● Here's CU's last 13 home wins:

 The Buffs have had 15 50,000-plus crowds at Folsom Field since 1980 (38 all-time), including this year's five 50,000-plus crowds (50,669 vs. Stanford; 52,868 vs. Washington; 51,861 vs. Iowa State; 51,967 vs. Oklahoma; 51,873 vs. Oklahoma State)...
 ● Of the 14 50,000-plus crowds since 1980, six were against Nebraska, three against Oklahoma, and one each against Iowa State, Missouri, and Oklahoma State...
 ● Before this year's non-league sellout vs. Washington (52,868), the last time the Buffs soldout against a non-conference opponent was vs. Notre Dame in 1983 (52,692)...
 ● Colorado posts a 22-16 mark all-time in front of 50,000-plus crowds at Folsom Field...
 ● At the left is a look at Colorado's 50,000-plus crowds since the 1980 campaign:

- Colorado has the second-best record in college football since the start of the 1989 season at 20-2-1 (.891 pct.)...only Notre Dame has a better winning percentage mark than CU over the last two years at 19-2 (.905 pct.).
- In its last 22 games on artificial turf, Colorado is 21-1.
- Colorado is looking to become the first team, other than Oklahoma or Nebraska, to win back-to-back Big Eight titles outright...the last time CU won back-to-back titles in any league was in 1923-24, as a member of the Rocky Mountain Faculty Athletic Conference.
- In Bill McCartney's tenure at CU, the Buffs are 36-12-1 when scoring first, and 19-33-1 when the opponent has drawn the first blood.
- Colorado has allowed 40 or more points only twice in the last five-plus seasons (spanning 65 games)...Oklahoma State was the culprit both times...only OSU, Tennessee and Missouri have been able to score more than 30 points on the Buffs' defense in their last 55 games.
- The Buffs have thrown only 27 interceptions in the last 39 games, covering 483 passes.
- Colorado has only 62 turnovers in its last 35 games, an average of 1.77 per outing...CU has had 11 turnover free games in its last 45, most recently vs. Oklahoma this year.
- Colorado is in its 55th season at Folsom Field (originally called Colorado Stadium)...CU's all-time record on the "hilltop" stands at 217-109-8 (.662).
- Coach Bill McCartney is working his 104th game as the CU mentor, third all-time at CU.

Colorado Player Notes...

- Colorado's team captains this year are OG Joe Garten (offense) and OLB Alfred Williams (defense).
- OG Joe Garten now has 43 career starts, starting every game of his career (27 in a row)...he missed a game as a sophomore due to a sprained ankle.
- SS Tim James, OT Mark Vander Poel and OLB Alfred Williams have all started 35 straight games, the longest current streaks on the team.
- Four of Colorado's 24 seniors have already earned their sheepskin and are enrolled in graduate courses this fall...CB David Gibbs and CB Dave McCloughan (both marketing majors) are enrolled in CU's M.B.A. program, while TE David Brown and SS Tim James (both sociology majors) will be taking graduate courses in criminology.

- The average Buff this year (based on the 120 active roster players) stands 6-1 1/2 and weighs 217 pounds...the total height of the team is 8,814 inches, or 734 1/2 feet, while the total weight is 25,995 pounds, or 13 tons.
- TB Eric Bieniemy... The nation's leading rusher and Colorado's all-time rushing leader with 3,825 yards (broke Charlie Davis's record of 2,958 yards at Missouri this year)...ranks first in 100-yard rushing games at Colorado with 20...also ranks first in career touchdowns with 42 (41 rushing, 1 receiving)...CU's all-time leading scorer with 254 career points (broke Bobby Anderson's record of 212 points in the Kansas game this year)...first player in CU history to achieve two 1,000-yard rushing seasons...ranks first in the Big Eight and the nation with his 151.3 yard-per-game average...listed 6th on the all-time Big Eight rushing slate...best performance this year came against Missouri when he rushed for 217 yards on 29 carries...has compiled 1,513 yards on 266 carries this season (5.7 yards per carry)...set the CU single-season rushing record last week against Oklahoma State (broke Charlie Davis's record of 1,386 yards which he set during the 1971 campaign).
- QB Darian Hagan... Had his best rushing performance of the season against Stanford, gaining 103 yards on 20 carries...has compiled 1,702 yards of total offense for the Buffs this season (1338 passing, 364 rushing)...did not start in either the Missouri or Iowa State games due to an injury (sprained left shoulder)...has completed 68-of-149 passes for 1338 yards and 10 touchdowns...ranks 5th on the Colorado career passing list with 2,373 yards...threw for a career high 237 yards last week against Oklahoma State which also included a school record four touchdown passes.

- **WR Mike Pritchard...** Second-leading ground-gainer on the Buffs this season with 375 yards...while filling in at tailback for the suspended Eric Bieniemy, he rushed for 217 yards against Tennessee in the season-opener...top receiver on the team with 651 yards on 25 receptions (grading out to 26.0 yards per catch)...has been a threat on reverses this season...ranks third in the Big Eight in all-purpose yardage (120.5 yards per game)...ranks fourth on Colorado's all-time receiving slate with 1,159 yards...best game receiving this season came against Kansas (114 yards on four receptions)...averages 19 yards every time he touches the football...needs just 30 yards to set a school record for receiving yards in a season (held by Jon Embree, 680 yards receiving in 1984).
- **FB George Hemingway...** Has gained 324 yards on 72 carries this season (4.5 yards per attempt)...has also caught 13 passes for 187 yards and two touchdowns...ranks 55th on Colorado's all-time rushing list (658 yards)...best rushing performance this season came against Texas when he gained 76 yards on seven carries (also caught three passes for 54 yards and a touchdown in that contest).
- **OLB Alfred Williams...** Colorado's all-time sack leader with 35.5 career sacks...that includes at least half a sack in Colorado's first 10 games this season...ranks 11th on all-time tackle list (260 stops)...has 12.5 sacks and 85 tackles (54 solo, 31 assists) this season, averaging out to 7.7 tackles per game...a Butkus and Lombardi candidate, as well as being named a preseason All-American...recorded a safety in the Texas game during the final minute of play...unanimous Defensive-Player-of-the-Year in the Big Eight Conference last season...selected as one of two team captains (along with Joe Garten).
- **OLB Kanavis McGhee...** Ranks sixth on Colorado's all-time sack list with 14...has 92 tackles for the season (53 solo, 39 assists)...ranks seventh on CU's career tackle list with 295 hits...one of four finalists for the 1989 Lombardi Award...a unanimous all-Big Eight selection in 1988, while garnering second-team All-America honors that same year.
- **LB Greg Biekert...** Colorado's leading tackler with 145 for the year (100 solo, 45 assists) grading out to 13.2 tackles per game...had 20 tackles against Illinois (including a school record 19 solo stops) and was named the Big Eight's Defensive Player-of-the-Week for his performance...has 11 tackles for 20 yards in losses.
- **DT Garry Howe...** Has 93 tackles for the season (58 solo, 35 assists), grading out to 8.5 tackles per game...had a great game against Illinois this year when he recorded 11 tackles and two sacks...ranks second on the team in QB sacks with nine, behind Alfred Williams' team-leading 12.5...has recorded 11 tackles for 20 yards in losses...played a solid game in last year's Orange Bowl with seven tackles (two for losses), a quarterback sack and a blocked field goal against Notre Dame...could be considered the Buffs' biggest over-achiever this season.
- **SS Tim James...** Team leader in interceptions with six, ranks second in the Big Eight in interceptions...has 67 tackles for the season (52 solo, 15 assists), grading out to 6.1 per game...had two interceptions in the season-opener against Tennessee at the Disneyland Pigskin Classic...ranks third on the CU career interception list
- **CB Dave McCloughan...** Has four interceptions for the season (ranks second on the team)...has filled in nicely for former Buff return specialist Jeff Campbell (now with the NFL's Detroit Lions) as he leads the nation and the Big Eight in punt returns (15.9 yards per return)...has returned two punts for touchdowns this year (a 55-yard return against Tennessee and a 90-yarder at Kansas).

Colorado Player Notes (cont.)...

- **CB Deon Figures...** Has two interceptions this year (one of them a pick in the end zone against Washington that preserved the 20-14 CU victory)...has 82 tackles for the season (65 solo, 17 assists), grading out to 7.5 tackles per game...had an excellent game against Tennessee in the season-opener with 13 tackles (10 solo)...was named the Big Eight's Defensive Newcomer-of-the-Year as a freshman following the 1988 campaign...sat out last year.
- **NT Joel Steed...** was named Big Eight Defensive Player-of-the-week last week for his performance against Nebraska which included 11 tackles (seven solo, four assists) and 1.5 sacks...has compiled 61 tackles on the season (40 solo, 21 assists)...has recorded 7.5 sacks on the year which ranks him third on the team...won the Hale Irwin Award as the top sophomore-to-be in the Spring of 1989.

Last Year... Colorado finished the regular season with an 11-0 mark, the nation's only undefeated team, and won its first Big Eight title since 1976...the Buffs attained their first-ever No.1 national ranking, and had a shot at the national championship, only to come up short in a 21-6 loss to Notre Dame at the Orange Bowl... ● Kansas State finished with a 1-10 mark, including an 0-7 record in Big Eight play (eighth).
