WILDCATS (5-5, 2-4) vs. Colorado (9-1-1, 6-0)

'CATS AND BUFFALOES: Kansas State wraps up the 1990 campaign with today's game at Folsom Field in Boulder. It's the 12th consecutive year that these two have collided in the regular season finale. Overall, it's the 19th time that KSU and CU have closed out the regular slate together. K-State, which hasn't won its finale since a 38-6 triumph over CU at Manhattan in 1984, is gunning for its first winning season since 1982.

HERE TO HELP: K-State is represented in the press box by sports information director Kenny Mossman. Assistant SID, Ben Boyle, is also on hand. He is the sideline commentator on the Wildcat Radio Network.

POST-GAME POLICY: Kansas State's lockerroom is closed. Head coach Bill Snyder and requested players will be brought outside.

TEEVEE: Prime Sports is carrying today's game on a delayed basis. In selected markets in Kansas, the game will air tonight at 10:30 p.m.

SNYDER AVAILABLE ON SUNDAY: Tomorrow is the last Sunday that Bill Snyder will be available to the media. The meeting will take place in the Big Eight Room of the Vanier Football Complex.

LAST MEDIA CONFERENCE IS WEDNESDAY: Bill Snyder will have his last media conference of the season on Wednesday, Nov. 21, at 1:30 p.m., in the Vanier Football Complex. At noon that same day, Dana Altman will hold a basketball media conference in the Bramlage Coliseum Legends Room.

WILDCAT RADIO NETWORK: The Wildcat Radio Network carries each K-State football game live on the largest collegiate sports network in the state of Kansas (41 affiliates). Mitch Holthus is back for his eighth consecutive season of play-by-play work, while color analyst Stan Weber is in his fourth season. Sideline reports are provided by KSU Asst. SID Ben Boyle in his first season on the network. The executive producer/engineer is Ed O'Donnell, celebrating his 20th season on the network. WIBW-AM (580) flagships the Wildcat Network. WIBW, located in Topeka, also flagships the Kansas City Royals Network.

K-STATE HEAD COACH BILL SNYDER: Big Eight Coach of the Year candidate Bill Snyder (William Jewell '63) is in his second season at Kansas State with a record of 6-15-0. He is 2-11 in Big Eight games, 0-7 in league road games, 2-4 in league home games, 0-1 vs. CU and 0-0 vs. CU in Boulder. Prior to his present position, he served as offensive coordinator at Iowa for 10 years.

SNYDER'S IMPACT: Bill Snyder and his staff have impacted KSU's program way beyond simple numbers, but here are a few anyway: With a 5-1 home record this season the team has its best home winning percentage since 1917 (minimum of games played). ● Snyder is the first coach since Wes Fry in 1937 to be at or above the .500 mark after his first 12 home games (6-6). ● Has coached KSU to two conference wins, a first since 1984. ● Snyder now has six wins after his first 20 games -- the same number KSU posted in the 55 games and five years prior to his arrival. ● With a 5-5 record, KSU is at the .500 mark after 10 games for the first time since 1982. (keep in mind, all of this has happened while KSU has 63 players on scholarship and only six seniors among its top 48 players.)

LAST GAME FOR THESE GUYS: Here is the list of Kansas State seniors: FB Richard Boyd, P-QB Chris Cobb, RB Antoine Dulan*, LB James Enin-Okut, RB Pat Jackson, C-TE Jon Krull, DB Mike Moore, SS Danny Needham, DE Billy Ray Smith, TE Scott Smith, QB Carl Straw, PK Jason Vajner and DT Anthony Williams. *KSU is petitioning for an injury hardship on Dulan.

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THE SERIES: The Buffaloes lead it, 33-12-0, and have won the last five in a row between the two. At Boulder, CU holds a 20-2 lead. Kansas State's last win in the series came in 1984 when the Wildcats prevailed at Manhattan, 38-6. KSU's last win in Boulder was in 1973, 17-14. CU is one of two Big Eight teams to fall to KSU four times since 1978. The other is Kansas. By the way, as an addendum to the opening note in these notes, next year the Big Eight Conference schedule rotates and KSU and CU will no longer play each other in the regular season finale. KSU and CU will meet in the eighth game of the season, while the Wildcats' new last-game foe will be Missouri on Nov. 16. Next year, Kansas State will play Nebraska, Colorado and Oklahoma on successive Saturdays.

SERIES NOTE: The last time Kansas State returned a kickoff for a touchdown, Colorado was the foe. It took place in the 1984 game and was probably one of the stranger plays in series history. CU attempted an onside kick, which bounced neatly into the hands of tight end Kent Dean, who was on the front line of KSU's kickoff return team. He broke through the oncoming Buffs and returned the ball 47 yards for a touchdown. Prior to this season, KSU's last punt return for a touchdown had also been against Colorado (Charlie Green went 73 yards in '78). However, this season, the Wildcats blocked a New Mexico State punt and returned it 36 yards for a score. Thomas Randolph caught the deflection out of the air and raced in for the six points.

ABOUT TATE WRIGHT: PK Tate Wright is not listed in the media guide so the following bio is provided: 5-11, 175-pound true frosh from Stillwater, Okla. ... number 18 ... has made 30-32 extra points and 7-13 field goal attempts (longs of 44 and 48 yards) ... his brother, Todd, was the all-Southwest Conference kicker at Arkansas last year, and continues as the Hogs' PK in '90 ... as a senior at Stillwater HS he made 23-of-24 PATs and 9-of-12 field goals, including a long of 50 yards ... as a junior, he helped Stillwater to a 10-3 record and the state semi-finals, and as a senior the team was 11-2 and again reached the semis ... all-stater, who played on Sooner Stampede, a group of Oklahoma All-Stars that played in Australia, New Zealand and Hawaii ... also played WR and DB ... won three letters in football, two in track (high jump and long jump) ... son of Joe and Charlotte Wright ... born Nov. 21, 1971, in Dallas, Texas ... full name is Michael Tate Wright ... his mother is a professor of oil and gas accounting at OSU ... only Oklahoman on KSU roster.

WRIGHT TIES RECORD: When Tate Wright converted his extra point kick at Oklahoma last Saturday it was his 29th PAT of the season. That ties the school record set by Max Arreguin in 1969. Earlier this year, Wright tied the school record for PATs in a game when he booted seven against New Mexico State.

POST-SEASON CONSIDERATIONS: As you consider coaches and players for post-season honors, KSU suggests a look at Head Coach Bill Snyder, DE Elijah Alexander, LB Brooks Barta, TE Russ Campbell, LB James Enin-Okut, WR Frank Hernandez, RB Pat Jackson, CB Jaime Mendez, SS Danny Needham, C Quentin Neujahr, LB Chris Patterson, CB William Price, WR Michael Smith and QB Carl Straw.

MENDEZ TOP NEWCOMER: Redshirt freshman CB Jaime Mendez, who's versatility has allowed him to play all four secondary positions this season, is a leader for Big Eight Defensive Newcomer of the Year. Through 9 games played, he is first in the Big Eight with five interceptions (which he has returned for 130 yards and one touchdown). Those five interceptions are just one away from the school record for one season. In addition, Mendez has 37 tackles (including three for 26 yards in losses), two fumble recoveries, one fumble caused and three passes broken up. He has also shown a flare for the big play: As New Mexico was driving for a tying touchdown, he picked off a deflected pass and returned it 72 yards for a touchdown. ● Picked off a pass against Oklahoma State and returned it 25 yards to the Cowboy 19 to set up KSU's game-winning touchdown. ● Against Iowa State, he caused Cyclone RB Blaise Bryant to fumble the ball at the K-State one, then recovered the fumble and returned it nine yards to the 10.

STRAW THIS YEAR: Senior QB Carl Straw, who has played just four full games this season (a total of 15 halves), due to injury or lopsided KSU advantages, has completed 142-of-251 (56.6) passes for 2,011 yards. He is only the second K-State quarterback to throw for over 1,000 yards in three different seasons and 2,000 yards in a season -- the other in both instances was Lynn Dickey. His completion percentage of 56.6 is shattering the previous KSU single season mark in that category -- 53.9% by Paul Watson in 1989.

STRAW'S CAREER: Carl Straw ranks ninth for passing yardage in a career in Big Eight history with 5,078 yards. He enters today's game with 4,992 yards of career total offense, and could become just the ninth player in league history to surpass the 5,000-yard mark in that area. He will easily set new school standards in career passing efficiency (107.34 entering today, while the old mark is 102.05 by Darrell Ray Dickey) and career completion percentage (his 54.2 mark is better than Lynn Dickey's record of 50.4). He ranks third in touchdown passes in KSU history with 19.

OF THE GUYS WHO THROW IT, STRAW KEEPS POSSESSION BEST: Based on interceptions thrown per passing attempts, Carl Straw has avoided the turnover bug better than any of the other league's top QBs: Straw throws one every 28.9 attempts, ISU's Pedersen throws one every 28.7 attempts, KU's Hilleary throws one every 22.4 attempts, CU's Hagan throws one every 18.6 attempts and MU's Keifer throws one every 18.3 attempts.

SMITH STILL LEADS: WR Michael Smityh now has career marks of 121 catches for 1,663 yards. He is seventh on the all-time receptions list in Big Eight history, and stands 12th in receiving yards (see charts later in these notes). At KSU, he is second in both statistics. He needs seven receptions to become K-State's all-time leader in that category and needs to average 6.8 catches over his last 12 games to tie Hart Lee Dykes (Oklahoma State) as the Big Eight's all-time leading receiver. In his career, he has a school-record seven 100-yard receiving games, including four in 1990. With 770 yards in 10 games, Smith is already enjoying the third-best season in school history. The school record for receiving yards in a season is 928 by Greg Washington in 1988. Smith, who was called the Big Eight's best clutch receiver by *The Sporting News*, continues to make an impact in tight situations. Thirty of his 43 receptions (40%) have resulted in first downs, and 7-of-30 (31%) have come on third or fourth down. Smith is averaging a whopping 17.9 yards per reception this season. If that number stands up, it will easily exceed the best average ever posted in one season by a KSU receiver. The previous best was set by Charlie Green in 1978 -- 15.8 yards per catch.

BARTA OVER 100: LB Brooks Barta, who could miss today's game with a knee injury, has become just the third player in KSU history to record 100 or more tackles as a sophomore at KSU. The other two were Gary Spani in 1975 and Theopolis Bryant in 1974. Barta has 106. Last year, Barta set a KSU freshman record with 81 tackles. He was the 1989 Big Eight Defensive Newcomer of the Year. He is the team's leading tackler and appears to be a sound bet to become only the sixth player since 1966 to lead the team in tackles in back-to-back seasons ('66 is the first year tackle records were kept at KSU). By the way, Barta ranks fourth in the Big Eight and third among league linebackers in tackles.

JACKSON EYEING 1,000 YARDS: RB Pat Jackson is just 34 yards away from becoming the 11th 1,000-yard career rusher in school history. If he accomplishes the feat, he'll become the first Wildcat to do so in a two-year career. The most recent career 1,000-yard rusher was Tony Jordan, who wrapped up his four-year stint in 1987 with 1,593 yards. In his two-year career, Jackson has 1,411 all-purpose yards (that's nearly five yards every time he touches the ball). With 638 rushing yards this season, he ranks 10th for a single season at KSU.

HERNANDEZ OUT OF THE SHADOW: If Frank Hernandez has been overshadowed in KSU's high-powered passing game, he is no more. He ranks fourth in the Big Eight in receptions per game with 3.9 and fifth in the league in yards per game at 55.5. He needs just five catches today to reach 100 for his career (he would become only the third KSU receiver to reach that plateau. He ranks seventh on KSU's career receiving list by yards with 1,236, and is just one shy of the school record for touchdown receptions in a career with nine. Keep in mind, he is only a junior.

BIG EIGHT'S BEST?: K-State's Russ Campbell continues to lead the league's tight ends in receiving yardage. He has 23 catches for 395 yards. He is one of four 'Cats averaging better than 14 yards per grab.

GREEN, MENDEZ WANT ONE MORE: Junior CB Rogerick Green and freshman CB Jaime Mendez both have five interceptions this season. The school record is six.

NEEDHAM ON THE TACKLE: SS Danny Needham needs four tackles to reach 200 for his career.

ACADEMIC PICKS: LB Brooks Barta and TE Russ Campbell were first-teamers on the Lee Jeans Academic All-Big Eight Team announced this week. Campbell carries a 3.6 grade point average in math education, while Barta carries a 3.1 in education. Aside from Campbell and Barta, who were KSU's only first-team pick, K-State's other academic all-league choices include: WR Laird Garner, C Quentin Neujahr, DE John Butler and DB Thomas Byers.

AMONG THE BEST AT IMPROVING: Formulas aside, KSU's improvement by record ranks as one of the best in the nation with two weeks remaining in the season. With five wins this season compared to one last season, the Wildcats rank a +4. The only other division IA teams with a +4 from last year to this are North Carolina (1-10 to 5-3) and Wyoming (5-6 to 9-1).

HOGGING THE PIG: Kansas State ranks second in the nation (behind Florida State and tied with Washington) in turnover margin at +1.60.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION: Granted, KSU has two tough opposing defenses left to play, but it's worth noting that the 357.7 yards of total offense would rank as the best at the school since 1969 if it holds up. This Kansas State team has become just the ninth in school history to go over 200 points for a season. The total of 252 in '90 is the fourth best scoring output Kansas State has ever had.

JUST CALL THEM WILDKITTENS: Youthfulness runs rampant on KSU's football team. Next season, Kansas State will return both starting receivers, the entire offensive line (in fact, the entire two-deep of the offensive line), the entire starting defensive line, three of the top four linebackers, both defensive ends and three of the four starters in the secondary. Twenty seven of the team's top 46 players will be eligible TWO years from now.

INJURIES: Defensive end Reggie Blackwell and Quarterback Paul Watson are both out of today's game.

CATRIVIA: KSU's long FGs and kickoffs are handled by #39 Warren Claassen ... Frank Hernandez owns the longest starting streak on the team at 29 straight and he also owns the longest streak with at least one reception at 22 ... K-State's captains are LB Brooks Barta, FS Danny Needham, WR Michael Smith and QB Carl Straw ... Kansas State's football program presently has just 63 of the NCAA allowed 95 scholarshiped players ... this Kansas State team has become just the ninth in school ... KSU opponents are just 50-of-146 on third-down conversions at 34.2% ... 11 of Chris Cobb's 50 punts have pinned the opponent inside the 20, while seven have gone inside the 10 ... KSU has penetrated the foe's 30 yard-line 33 times this season and has scored 26 times.

TEAM MILESTONES THIS SEASON

● **Total Offense:** 3,447. Ranks fifth for a season at Kansas State. The record is 3,896 by the 1969 team. That '69 club also holds the record for most average yards per game at 389.6. With 357.7 yards per game this season, the team has posted the third-best season in school history (behind 1969 and 1970).

● **Rushing Offense:** 1,238. It's the best total at the school since the 1987 team rushed for 1,394. Last season, KSU rushed for 657 yards and averaged 1.9 yards per carry. This year, the team has averaged 3.1 yards per tote. Pat Jackson enters today's game with 161 carries, the ninth highest total in school history.

● **Passing Offense:** 2,339. It's the best total since the 1988 team passed for a school record 2,578. The Wildcats need 240 yards today to break that record. The average of 233.9 per game this stands third for a season at KSU. The '69 team averaged 250.1 yards per game and the '88 team averaged 234.6. It's interesting to note that KSU enters today's game with 50 more passing yards than it accumulated last season. Interestingly, the 'Cats have accomplished that feat with 44 fewer completions and 89 fewer attempts. The average per completion of 13.8 is the at the school since the '81 team averaged 13.8 per completion.

● **Scoring Offense:** 252. KSU has its best scoring total since 319 in 1969. It's the fourth best total in school history. Last year, KSU scored 134 points, a total it surpassed this year in the fourth game of the season. This team has rushed for 23 touchdowns as compared to eight last season.

● **First Downs:** 189. It's the ninth best total in school history.

● **Turnovers:** 17. This team is trying to become only the second in school history to post fewer than 20 in a season. The 1961 team set the standard with 13.

● **Team Defense:** 3,826. KSU hasn't given up less than 4,500 yards in a season since the 1985 team gave up 4,126.

● **Rushing Defense:** 2026. CU could rush for 350 yards today and KSU would still have its best defensive season against the rush since the '82 bowl team surrendered 1,952.

● **Passing Defense:** 1,800. It's one of the highest totals in the last 10 years, but there's a reason for that -- teams are having less success running. Opponent's completion percentage against KSU stands at a paltry 42.6. Only two teams have completed 50 percent of their passes against KSU this season.

● **Scoring Defense:** 229. KSU hasn't given less than 300 points in a season since 1985 when they gave up 295. Before that, one must go back to '82 to find a sub-300 season (166).

● **Takeaways:** 33. It's the fourth-best total in school history, the fifth-best season overall (two teams had 38). The school record is 39 by the '86 team. K-State's margin of +16 is the best in school history, challenged only the by '82 team that finished at +15. KSU needs three more interceptions to set a new school record in that statistic (currently have 18). KSU has picked off at least one pass in seven of the 10 games, and in the three games in which they did not, the opposition completed just 19-of-47 passes (40.4%).
