A&M enters the weekend fresh off an impressive 35-10 win over Iowa State on Saturday at Kyle Field ... the Buffs, meanwhile, suffered a 36-17 setback to Missouri in Boulder ... today's 12th Man is senior Ryan O'Bryant (Houston).

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- Sophomore **CYRUS GRAY** (DeSoto) is 70 yards shy of joining Texas A&M's 1,000-yard club in career rushing yardage. In 20 career games, Gray has gained 930 yards and scored six touchdowns on 195 carries (4.8 per carry average).
- Sophomore placekicker **RANDY BULLOCK** (Klein) is six points away from 100 career points.
- Junior QB **JERROD JOHNSON** (Humble) is within range of a variety of records and milestones, including: season passing touchdowns (has 20/his school record is 21); career passing yards (has 4,850, needs 150 to become sixth QB to 5,000); career passing touchdowns (has 43 / Kevin Murray's record is 48, JJ is currently No. 4 on list); season passing yards (has 2,365 / Reggie McNeal's record is 2,791).
- Junior **VON MILLER** (DeSoto) has 13.5 quarterback sacks, which is No. 7 on school list. He is on pace to break Jacob Green's 29-year old record of 20 sacks. Miller is one shy of 20 career sacks, which would put him in a tie for No. 10 in school history.

ONE OF A KIND OFFENSE

Texas A&M is the only team in the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision to rank in the top 25 of all four major offensive statistical categories.

AGGIES ARE EFFICIENT ON THIRD DOWNS

Texas A&M leads the Big 12 and ranks No. 4 nationally with a 52.5 percent success rate in third-down situations. The Aggies have been successful on 63 of 120 third-down tries in 2009, and are the only Big 12 team that converts over 45 percent of their third-down tries.

AGGIES REVERSE TROUBLING EARLY SEASON PENALTY TREND

The 2009 Aggies are living proof that penalties are correctable mistakes. Through four games, A&M was one of the most penalized team in all of college football with 41 flags for a whopping 382 yards. In the last four games, however, the Aggies have cut their penalties down by more than half with just 18 infractions for 163 yards.

AVERAGING OVER 80 OFFENSIVE PLAYS PER GAME

Texas A&M is one of only two teams in the NCAA FBS to average over 80 offensive plays per game. Former A&M offensive coordinator Kevin Sumlin's Houston Cougars lead the nation with an average of 83.2 plays per game and the Aggies are right behind with 83.1 plays per game.

GROUND GAME IS HITTING STRIDE

Just two games ago, the Aggies were ranked No. 49 nationally in rushing with an average of 156.8 per game. After posting the top two rushing games of the year the past two weeks, the Aggies are now averaging 191.1 yards per game and rank No. 23 nationally. The Aggies rushed for 321 yards on 59 carries against Texas Tech and showed it wasn't a fluke with 267 yards on 49 carries last Saturday against Iowa State (two-game total of 588 yards on 108 carries).

PICKOFFS PICKING UP FOR AGGIES

The Texas A&M defense matched its season total with a pair of interceptions against Texas Tech on Oct. 24. The Aggies entered the game with two pickoffs in the first six games of the season, and then picked off a pair of errant opponent aeriels in the seventh game of the season against the Red Raiders. Cornerback **TERRENCE FREDERICK'S** interception in the endzone late in the first half marked the first pickoff by an Aggie defensive back in 2009.

The Aggies built on that performance with two more interceptions in the 35-10 win over Iowa State.

JOHNSON KEEPS THE CHAINS MOVING

Texas A&M junior quarterback Jerrod Johnson is on a record pace as a passer, but he consistently relies on his legs to keep drives going. Over half of his 71 rushes this season have produced a "money play," which is defined as a play that results in a first down or touchdown. Johnson is especially proficient on third and fourth down rushes with 19 money plays in 23 attempts, including 14 on 17 third down rushes.

JOHNSON HAS BEEN A DIFFERENCE-MAKER IN 2009

In his second season as a starter, quarterback Jerrod Johnson has developed into a difference-maker in 2009. He ranks among the nation's top quarterbacks in virtually every important statistical category.

In the last two weeks, Johnson's passing numbers have declined slightly from 315.5 to 295.6, but his pass efficiency rating has risen. After the KSU game, Johnson's rating was 138.21 and ranked No. 38 nationally. After the Texas Tech and Iowa State games, Johnson's efficiency rating rose to 143.80 and No. 26 nationally.

JOHNSON SETS SCHOOL RECORD FOR 300-YARD PASSING GAMES

Junior **JERROD JOHNSON** hit the 300-yard mark in for the fourth time this season with 314 passing yards against Kansas State (Oct. 17), which is a new school record. It also extended Johnson's school mark for career 300-yard passing games to six.

ALL-AMERICA CANDIDATE MILLER KEEPS RACKING UP SACKS

A part-time starter in his first two seasons at A&M, junior Von Miller has emerged as the nation's most feared pass rusher in 2009. Miller, who shifted to a hybrid defensive end/linebacker position last spring, has been atop the NCAA's sack leaders list all season and remains on pace to break Texas A&M's school record of 20 sacks by Jacob Green in 1979. Through eight games, Miller has compiled 13.5 quarterback sacks for a loss of 88 yards, and stands No. 7 on A&M's illustrious single season sacks list. The five players ahead of Miller on the list combined to earn four All-America awards.

EYE ON THE "WATCH" LISTS

Four Aggies are mentioned on "watch lists" for various national awards in 2009—quarterback **JERROD JOHNSON** (Manning Award), center **KEVIN MATTHEWS** (Rimington Trophy), tight end **JAMIE MCCOY** (Mackey Award) and "Jack" **VON MILLER** (Hendricks Award).

QB JERROD JOHNSON (MANNING AWARD)

Record-setting signal caller broke several notable school records and flirted with a variety of other school marks in his first season as a starter in 2008 ... moved into the starting lineup due to an injury to current Dallas Cowboy Stephen McGee, and he ended up starting the last 10 games at quarterback (also started a game at wide receiver) ... set school records for season passing touchdowns (21) and single game passing yards and total offense (419 and 487 vs. KSU) ... his late father, Larry Johnson, was a defensive back for the Aggies in the late 1970s.



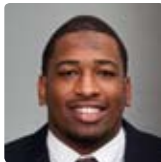
C KEVIN MATTHEWS (RIMINGTON TROPHY)

Second-year starter at offensive center for the Aggies ... the son of NFL Hall of Famer Bruce Matthews, Kevin is the catalyst for the Aggies' offensive front ... a former walk-on, Matthews earned a scholarship after serving as a backup to current San Francisco 49er Cody Wallace for two seasons.



TE JAMIE MCCOY (MACKEY AWARD)

Dynamic athlete who found a home at tight end after Head Coach Mike Sherman's arrival in Aggieland ... in his first season at the position in 2008, McCoy caught at least one reception in every game and finished the year with 43 catches for 500 yards and five touchdowns ... an amazing 30 of his 43 catches resulted in first downs for the Aggies ... McCoy arrived at Texas A&M as a dual-threat quarterback and saw action at the position as a freshman in 2006 (he had a 32-yard rushing touchdown against Louisiana Tech). He moved to wide receiver in 2007, but didn't see any action at the position.



JACK VON MILLER (HENDRICKS AWARD)

Playmaker who shifted from linebacker to a hybrid defensive end/linebacker position called the "jack" in Aggie defensive vernacular this season ... junior leads the nation with eight sacks through the first three games of 2009 ... also tops the country with eight tackles for loss ... has led the Aggie defense to 14 total sacks in 2009 after making just 16 for the entire 2008 season.



Miller could become Texas A&M's first first-team All-America selection since cornerback Jason Webster earned All-America honors in 1999.

NCAA SACK LEADER MILLER NAMED BUTKUS SEMIFINALIST

With just 5.5 sacks and 66 tackles in his first two seasons, **VON MILLER** (DeSoto) was somewhat of an unknown commodity coming into the 2009 season. But after registering a NCAA-high 13.5 sacks in the first eight games of the season, the accolades are beginning to roll in for the junior. Miller was added to the Ted Hendricks Defensive End Award "watch list" after two games and was recently named one of 16 semifinalist for the Butkus Award, which is given annually to the nation's top linebacker.

TANNEHILL IS FIRST SOPHOMORE TO 80 CAREER CATCHES

Sophomore quarterback/receiver **RYAN TANNEHILL** (Big Spring) reeled in the 80th reception of his career in the third quarter of last Saturday's game, making him the first sophomore in school history to reach the 80-catch plateau. Tannehill grabbed No. 80 in the 19th game of his career, which matches the fast start by Jamaar Taylor who also hit No. 80 in his 19th game at A&M. Taylor, however, transferred to A&M from Notre Dame and his 19th was nearing the end of his junior campaign.

WIDE RECEIVER VETERANS FIND THE FIRST DOWNS

The Aggies are completing over 50 percent of their third-down situations in 2009 and that's in large part to the play of A&M's veteran trio of wide receivers, **RYAN TANNEHILL**, **JEFF FULLER** and **HOWARD MORROW**. The trio have combined to produce 21 first downs on 23 third-down receptions in 2009.

BIG PLAY NWACHUKWU

Texas A&M true freshman **UZOMA NWACHUKWU** (Allen) doesn't rank among the NCAA's top 100 in receptions, and doesn't even lead his team in catches per game. But the big play ability of the nation's No. 3 freshman in terms of receiving yards per game is undeniable. Nwachukwu (pronounced watch-uh-coo) ranks No. 5 among all receivers with 20.7 yards per catch average and his touchdown per catch ratio of 1/4.5 is No. 3 in the nation.

MORROW MOVES UP THE CHART

After two games this season, **HOWARD MORROW** (Keller) had four catches for 25 yards and ranked No. 6 on the Aggies' receiving chart. Check in six games later and the senior has jumped to the top of A&M's receiving list with the most productive series of games of his career. In the last six games, Morrow has been the Aggies' most prolific receiver with 29 catches for 303 yards. He leads the Aggies in catches (33) and ranks third in receiving yards (328m). A part-time starter in his previous three seasons, Morrow came into his senior year with 23 career catches for 323 yards.

PRESSURING THE QUARTERBACK

The Aggies already have 23 quarterback sacks and rank in a tie for No. 14 in the NCAA FBS in sacks just a season after posting only 16 sacks for the entire 2008 season and ranking No. 100 in the NCAA statistics. Led by hybrid linebacker/end **VON MILLER**, the Aggies have sacked the opposing quarterback 21 times in seven games or 3.0 per game. Miller has contributed 12.5 sacks, and defensive mates LB Kyle Mangan, DL Tony Jerod-Eddie, DL Eddie Brown, "jack" Matt Featherston and DE Matt Moss have combined for 8.5 more.

VETERAN PUGH STANDS TALL IN SECONDARY

Senior Jordan Pugh is the anomaly on Aggies' youthful defense with a team-best 32 career starts and action in 45 career games. Pugh's experience has been key to the Aggies' two-game winning streak as the senior has turned in 17 tackles and produced game-changing plays in the wins over Texas Tech and Iowa State. Against Texas Tech, Pugh was credited with five tackles and had a fumble recovery at the beginning of the fourth quarter that took away all hope for a Red Raider comeback in the Aggies' 52-30 win in Lubbock. A week later, Pugh's pickoff on Iowa State's second drive helped propel the Aggies to a 14-0 first quarter lead. Since missing the Oklahoma State game with a concussion, Pugh has produced 27 tackles (9.0 average), a fumble recovery, an interception and another broken up pass.

UNDERCLASS FLASH

The Aggies have produced 65 plays of 20 yards or more, including an eye-catching 54 coming from freshmen or sophomores. Nine of the Aggies' top 10 longest plays of the season have been produced by underclassmen.

AGGIES PLAYING 18 TRUE FRESHMEN IN 2009

Texas A&M is playing an extraordinary number of true freshmen in 2009. The Aggies have used 18 true freshmen from head coach Mike Sherman's second signing class, which is a school record. The previous high number of true freshmen to see action for the Aggies was 15 for Tom Wilson's 1980 team, which finished 4-7. Including among the 1980 freshmen were future NFL Draft picks Jeff Fuller Sr., Keith Guthrie, Mark Lewis, Ken Reeves, Tommy Robison and Thomas Sanders.

Since 1972, the Aggies have awarded varsity letters to 10 or more true freshman in a season only a handful of times: 15 in 1980, 11 in 1973 and 10 in 1972 and 2008. Interestingly, only once since the advent of freshman eligibility have the Aggies not played a single true freshman (1989).

HEAD COACH MIKE SHERMAN

A former head coach and general manager for the NFL's Green Bay Packers, Mike Sherman is in his second season as head coach of the Texas A&M football team. Sherman was hired as Texas A&M's 28th head football coach on Nov. 26, 2007.



Sherman compiled an impressive 59-43-0 record (.578) at the helm of the Packers from 2000-2005, which included three playoff appearances and two 12-win regular seasons. As an assistant coach in the NFL, Sherman helped the Packers and Seattle Seahawks to the playoffs, including the Packers' run to the 1998 Super Bowl.

In the college ranks, Sherman has compiled a 9-11 record as a head coach. As an assistant coach at Texas A&M (1989-93, 95-96), UCLA (1994), Holy Cross (1985-88), Tulane (1983-84) and Pittsburgh (1981-82), Sherman helped win three conference championships and been a part of eight bowl teams (five New Year's Day bowls).

An accomplished recruiter, Sherman's current class of 2010 commitments is currently ranked No. 10 nationally by ESPN.com and features verbals from three members of ESPNU 150 national recruits. Sherman's first signing class was ranked No. 22 nationally by Rivals.com and was bolstered by Sherman's late additions of 2008 Freshman All-Americans Jeff Fuller and Trent Hunter, Cyrus Gray and Terrence Frederick. Both Hunter and Gray earned Big 12 Player of the Week just months after being targeted by Sherman.

NUMBER-CRUNCHING THE UNDERCLASSMAN IMPACT

Freshmen and sophomores are having an enormous impact for the Aggies in 2009. Underclassmen have accounted for 1,016 of A&M's 1,262 net rushing yards or 80.5 percent. Despite two of the Aggies' top four receivers being seniors, underclassmen have accounted for 1,529 of 2,161 receiving yards or 70.8 percent. Over 80 percent of the Aggies' 251 points have been scored by freshmen or sophomores (80.9 percent). Defensively, 329 of 511 total tackles have come from underclassmen (64.4).

JOHNSON'S PICKOFF-FREE STREAK ENDS IN BIG 12 RECORD FASHION

Junior quarterback **JERROD JOHNSON** (Humble) threw his first interception of the season against Kansas State (Oct 17), but not before breaking the Big 12's single season record for consecutive pass attempts without a pickoff. Johnson threw 225 straight passes without a pickoff to open 2009 before KSU's Tysyn Hartman stepped in front of his pass attempt in the second quarter. He broke the old single season mark of 213 set by Kansas' Todd Reesing in 2007. He had increased his overall Big 12 record streak to 242 attempts, which dated back to last year's Baylor game.

The 2009 Texas A&M football roster is dotted several players whose father were accomplished professionals in the NFL or NBA.

Senior offensive center **KEVIN MATTHEWS'** father, Bruce, was a perennial All-Pro offensive lineman for the Houston Oilers and Tennessee Titans, and was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2007.

Sophomore wide receiver **JEFF FULLER's** father, Jeff Sr., was a standout defensive back for the Aggies from 1980-83 and then the San Francisco 49ers from 1984-88.

True freshman defensive lineman **SPENCER NEALY's** dad, Ed, was an All-Big Eight forward at Kansas State and played 10 seasons in the NBA, including with the 1992-93 Chicago Bulls that won the NBA title.

True freshman defensive lineman **WELLS CHILDRESS'** father, Ray, still ranks in the top five in tackles and QB sacks in A&M history and went on to a long career with the Houston Oilers in NFL.

"BULL" MARKET

A question mark a year ago, the placekicker position appears to be a strength for the Aggies in 2009 with the return of sophomore **RANDY BULLOCK** (Klein, Texas). In last year's season-opener, the Aggies missed a pair of field goals from less than 40 yards in a 18-14 loss. Bullock pulled off his redshirt in the sixth game of 2008 and responded with 6-of-7 field goals and made 20 straight extra points after missing the first one of his career. Bullock also showed a strong leg by booting a 46-yard field goal against Texas Tech, which was the longest by an A&M kicker since 2004.

Through eight games in '09, Bullock has converted seven of nine field goal attempts, with one of the misses being a fourth-quarter block by Utah State. His 50-yard boot against Oklahoma State was a career best and was the longest by an Aggie since 2000. In addition, Bullock has converted all 35 extra points in '09 and has made 55 in a row entering Saturday's game.

IMPRESSIVE ASSISTANTS

- **MIKE SHERMAN's** coaching staff at Texas A&M is an impressive blend of veteran NFL and college assistant coaches. Tapping into his deep NFL ties, Sherman plucked **NOLAN CROMWELL** from the Seattle Seahawks, **TOM ROSSLEY** from the Green Bay Packers and **KIRK DOLL** from the Denver Broncos. From the college ranks, Sherman hired **JOE KINES** from Alabama, **RANDY JORDAN** and **BUDDY WYATT** from Nebraska, **CHARLES McMILLIAN** from TCU and **JIM TURNER** from Delaware. He retained **VAN MALONE** from the previous coaching staff.

- Several members of Sherman's staff had successful NFL playing careers. **NOLAN CROMWELL** was a four-time Pro Bowl safety and the NFC Defensive Player of the Year in 1980. **RANDY JORDAN** played in the 2003 Super Bowl with the Oakland Raiders and received the 2001 Ed Block Courage Award. **VAN MALONE** played five seasons for the Detroit Lions and served as the special teams captain.

- Prior to Texas A&M, Sherman served on the same coaching staff with **NOLAN CROMWELL** with the Green Bay Packers and Seattle Seahawks, **TOM ROSSLEY** with Holy Cross and the Packers, and **KIRK DOLL** at Texas A&M.

- As head coach at SMU from 1991-96, **TOM ROSSLEY** led the Mustangs to a 21-21 tie with the Aggies in 1994, which ended A&M's record 27-game conference winning streak. It was the only blemish on the Aggies' undefeated season that year.

- Three members of the staff had previous ties to the A&M program. **KIRK DOLL** was the Aggies' linebackers coach from 1988-93 under Jackie Sherrill and R.C. Slocum. **BUDDY WYATT** coached the defensive line at A&M from 2000-02 under Slocum and **VAN MALONE** is in his fourth season coaching the safeties.

COLLEGE STATION (AP)—Jerrod Johnson threw three touchdown passes in the third quarter and Trent Hunter intercepted two passes in the fourth to lead Texas A&M to a 24-17 win over Colorado at Kyle Field.

Johnson shook off a sluggish first half to complete 15 of 31 passes for 214 yards. Freshman Jeff Fuller caught two TD passes and the Aggies (4-5, 2-3 Big 12) won for the second time in six home games this season.

Freshman quarterback Tyler Hansen rushed 16 times for 86 yards, but threw the two late interceptions for the Buffaloes (4-5, 1-4).

Colorado held A&M to 76 yards in the first half and led 10-3 at the break.

Johnson went 4-for-4 on the Aggies' first drive of the second half, finishing it with a 32-yard touchdown pass to Ryan Tannehill. Later in the third quarter, Johnson threw a 59-yard touchdown pass to Fuller down the sideline to give A&M its first lead.

Cyrus Gray broke a 54-yard run on the Aggies' next possession. Gray started for leading rusher Mike Goodson, who sat out the second straight game with a sprained left knee.

Johnson threw a 10-yard touchdown pass to Fuller on the last play of the third quarter. Fuller leads the Aggies with seven touchdown catches.

A&M defensive end Cyril Obiozor sacked Hansen on consecutive plays early in the fourth quarter. The Buffaloes gained only 75 yards on their first four possessions after halftime.

Hunter got his first interception with 8:11 left. But after an Aggies' punt, Colorado drove 98 yards in 11 plays and cut the deficit to 24-17 on Demetrius Sumler's 10-yard touchdown run with 2:59 remaining.

A&M punted again, but Hunter made a diving interception along the sideline with 2:29 left to put the game away.

Johnson averaged 361 passing yards and thrown six touchdown passes in the last three games, but he went 6-for-14 for 62 yards in the first half.

After Johnson fumbled on A&M's first series, Cody Hawkins, Colorado's other quarterback, took a lateral from running back Darrell Scott and found tight end Riar Geer down the sideline for a 23-yard gain. Three plays later, freshman Rodney Stewart scored on a 6-yard run to put the Buffaloes ahead.

Hansen replaced Hawkins for Colorado's fourth possession. Coach Dan Hawkins took off Hansen's redshirt three weeks ago and has been alternating Hansen and Hawkins.

Kicker Aric Goodman hit the upright on a 46-yard field-goal try, his seventh consecutive miss. Goodman slipped to 3-for-11 on field-goal tries this season.

A&M's Randy Bullock kicked a 39-yard field goal with 5:43 left in the first half.

On Colorado's next possession, Aggies' linebacker Von Miller was flagged for a horse-collar tackle on Stewart and the Buffaloes' leading rusher sat out the rest of the game with a sprained ankle.

Scott, Stewart's backup, then leapfrogged an A&M defender on a 42-yard run, the Buffaloes' longest play from scrimmage this season. But A&M cornerback Jordan Pugh intercepted Hawkins in the end zone with 2:40 left in the half.

After an A&M punt, freshman Jameson Davis, who handles kickoffs, booted a 30-yard field goal with 3 seconds left.

Jeff Fuller caught an 18-yard pass from Johnson early in the second quarter, setting up Randy Bullock's 22-yard field goal. Fuller led A&M with 10 catches for 111 yards in the game. Michael, one of 12 freshmen to play for A&M in the first half, broke two runs over 20 yards on the Aggies' next possession. Michael went out for a rest and Cyrus Gray's 13-yard touchdown run put A&M up 17-0 with 4:44 left in the half.

A&M marched 86 yards in 12 plays to start the second half. Johnson went 6-for-6 on the drive and Michael finished it with a 2-yard touchdown run. Aho matched his career best with a 48-yard field goal later in the third quarter. A&M answered with a 17-play drive, capped by Johnson's 7-yard touchdown pass to Fuller. Johnson threw a 44-yard touchdown pass to freshman Kenric McNeal with 9:14 left. Tommy Dorman finished the game at quarterback for the Aggies.

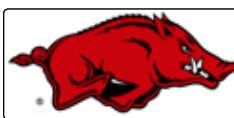

COLLEGE STATION (AP) — Zac Robinson threw two touchdown passes and No. 15 Oklahoma State overcame the absence of their top two playmakers to beat Texas A&M 36-31.

The Cowboys (4-1, 1-0 Big 12) played without All-America receiver Dez Bryant, who was ruled ineligible by the school this week for lying to the NCAA about contact he made with a former NFL player. Oklahoma State was also missing Kendall Hunter, the Big 12's leading rusher in 2008, who sat out with an ankle injury.

Robinson completed 14 of 25 passes for 279 yards, Keith Toston ran for 130 yards and Beau Johnson ran for two scores as the Cowboys won at Kyle Field for only the second time since 1983.

Jerrold Johnson threw three touchdown passes for the Aggies (3-2, 0-1) and set a Big 12 record by extending his streak of consecutive passes without an interception to 228. But Johnson faced constant pressure and the Aggies, who came in with the nation's second-ranked offense, were held to 382 yards.

Leading 29-25 early in the fourth quarter, the Cowboys put it away with a 16-play, 93-yard touchdown drive that chewed up almost eight minutes. Robinson converted two third downs with long passes and Beau Johnson scored with 7:15 left in the game.

Jerrold Johnson found Howard Morrow in the end zone with 3:35 left, but the two-point conversion try failed and A&M trailed 36-31. Oklahoma State regained possession and Toston picked up two yards on a fourth-and-1 with two minutes left.

Randy Bullock booted a 50-yard field goal on the first play of the fourth quarter, the longest by an A&M kicker since 2000.

The Cowboys drove to the A&M 6 in the first quarter, but a pack of Aggies stuffed Robinson at the line on fourth-and-1.

The Aggies drove inside the Cowboys' 10 early in the second quarter and came away empty when Bullock hooked a 32-yard field-goal try.

MANHATTAN, Kan. (AP) — Daniel Thomas ran for four touchdowns in the first half and Brandon Banks returned the second-half kickoff 97 yards for another score, leading Kansas State to an improbable 62-14 win over Texas A&M.

A week after allowing 66 points and more than 700 yards in a disheartening loss to Texas Tech, Kansas State (4-3, 2-1 Big 12) steamrolled Texas A&M on both sides of the ball for its most lopsided conference win since beating Iowa State 58-7 in 2002.

The Wildcats led 38-0 at halftime after Thomas scored on runs of 7, 3, 9 and 17 yards, then scored 21 points over the first 5:12 of the third quarter before Texas A&M (3-3, 0-2) finally started to put points on the board.

Keithen Valentine ran for a pair of touchdowns in the second half and Grant Gregory was steady after being replaced by Carson Coffman last week, throwing for 147 yards and a touchdown on 10-of-13 passing.

Kansas State's defense forced five turnovers while holding the Aggies to 70 first-half yards and minus-13 yards rushing overall.

The Wildcats also harassed Jerrod Johnson, the Big 12's total offense leader, with six sacks and three interceptions, ending his Big 12 record at 242 pass attempts without throwing a pick. He finished with 314 yards passing and threw two touchdowns to Uzoma Nwachukwu - both after Kansas State had built a 59-0 lead.
