#10THINGS (Twitter-Friendly Notes)

1. D.J. Foster has 3 40+ rushes this yr. No Sun Devil w/ more than 2 last year. @FootballASU with 5 40+ yard rushes in 2 gms, 5 total in 2013.
2. Of the 20 all-time 200-yard rushing games in ASU history only three of them have occurred since 1994 following Foster's UNM effort.
3. @FootballASU has outscored UNM 21-7 in points off turnovers in the game. Under Todd Graham, ASU has outscored opponents 296-107 in the category.
4. D.J. Foster is currently third nationally in rushing yards (363) and fifth in rushing yards per game (181.5) and rushing TDs (4).
5. @FootballASU's victory over UNM was its first over a non-conference opponent since 2006 and first road opening win since 2007.
6. Averaging 7.5 solo tackles per game, Damarious Randall is ranked third nationally in the category with 15 of his 16 tackles being solo.
7. #Devils rank 1st in #Pac12 in fewest penalties, penalties per game, penalty yards & penalty yards per game #Discipline
8. Through two games, the #Devils have outscored opponents 103-37 & out-gained 1191 yards to 645 yards #HighOctane #LeftLane

10. Seventeen of ASU's 20 least penalized games since 2006 have come under Todd Graham. Two of those have come this season.

#BYTHENUMBERS

216 In rushing for 216 yards against UNM, D.J. Foster became the first Sun Devil to rush for over 200 yards in a game since Delvon Flowers rushed for 226 yards against Oregon State in 2001. He became just the third Sun Devil since 1994 to rush for over 200 yards in a game out of the 20 total 200-yard rushers in ASU history and his 216 yards are tied for the ninth-highest total in program history. He already has three rushes of over 40 yards this season, notable as no Sun Devil had more than two in the entirety of last season.

206 The Sun Devils are 5-0 all-time against the Buffalo with all games being played in the past decade (two in 2006-07 before CU joined the Pac-12 and three Pac-12 South tilts). **ASU has outscored CU, 206-61, in those competitions - including a 54-13 rout in Tempe last season.** The Sun Devils are 2-0 in games played in Boulder. ASU's five game winning streak against CU is its second longest active streak against a Pac-12 school outside an eight game winning streak against Washington.

17 Todd Graham has had a knack for having some of the most disciplined teams in the nation when it comes to penalty yards. **Seventeen of ASU's 20 least penalized games since 2006 have come under Todd Graham.** Since Todd Graham arrived at Arizona State, the Sun Devils have had just 119 penalties in 29 games (4.1 penalties per game). The Sun Devils were penalized just four times for 30 yards against UNM. The Sun Devils have just eight penalties for 60 yards this season, ranked 15th in penalties and penalty yards per game in D-I this season

16 The quick-hitting offense has become a staple of the Todd Graham-coached Sun Devils, with 128 of ASU's 171 offensive scoring drives under offensive coordinator Mike Norvell coming in three minutes or less (74.9 percent). **All 16 of ASU's scoring drives this season have come in less than three minutes.** Arizona State has scored first in 23 of the 29 games with Todd Graham at the helm and is now 18-5 in the Graham era when getting on the scoreboard first and 2-0 this season following the UNM contest.

Interview Policy

Due to the nature of Arizona State game dates this season, practices schedules each week will vary dependent upon that week's game. Weekly Press Conference

Head coach Todd Graham will resume his weekly press conferences each Monday prior to game week. The press conference is tentatively scheduled for 12 p.m. (Noon) Arizona Time each week. When the team practices on Mondays, Graham will not be available following practice.

Media Guides/Statistics

Members of the media may request a physical media guide from the Sun Devil Media Relations office. Weekly and seasonal statistics can also be found through the Sun Devil main page at www.TheSunDevils.com. Statistics, which also appear in the back of this note packet, will be available each week at Coach Graham's Monday press conference and in the press box of Sun Devil Stadium.

Photography/Videography

Photographers (still and video) may shoot the first hour of practice, unless the drill is team related. On-camera interviews will be conducted at the end of each practice. For home games, a photographer work area has been established inside the Carson Student-Athlete Center (first floor). Internet access to transmit files is available in the photography workroom. Credentials must be worn in plain view throughout the game while on the field and all photographers must adhere to painted lines and instructions given by security personnel and/or Arizona State staff members at all times.

Weekly Teleconference

The Pac-12 Football Coaches Weekly Media Teleconference Call will take place each Tuesday during the season, starting Tuesday, August 26 and concluding Tuesday, November 25. Due to shifting practice schedules during the first six weeks of the season, the first call on Aug. 26 will start at 10:25 a.m. PT/11:25 a.m. MT, calls from Sept. 1 through Sept. 30 will start at 10:05 a.m. PT/11:05 a.m. MT. Starting Oct. 6, and continuing each Tuesday through the remainder of the season, the calls will begin at 10:25 a.m. PT/11:25 a.m. MT. Todd Graham is slated to speak at 12:05 p.m. PT/1:05 p.m. MT each week. A separate call of the head coaches competing in the Pac-12 Football Championship Game will be scheduled for Monday, December 1. The teleconferences will be recorded and available at Pac-12.com that same afternoon of the call. Members of the media may reach out to the Pac-12 (925-932-4411) for the media-only phone number for the teleconference.

Media Highlights Policy

Highlights include Pac-12 Networks/ESPN/FOX broadcasts and all home hosted non-televised competitions, including those that are live streamed.

Third-Party Website Highlight Policy

No third party organization may post competition footage of any Pac-12 game or any non-conference home game on its website without a license to the content from the Pac-12 Networks or its licensing partner (XOS Digital), with the exception of news window privileges described below. Third parties are permitted to post video on their websites through the use of the Pac-12 Digital embeddable video player (embed code available at <http://video.pac-12.com>).

News Outlet Highlight Policy

Certified news outlets may use a maximum of 3 minutes of Pac-12 event footage on their newscasts during the 48-hour news window following the conclusion of included events. If these highlights do not contain a Pac-12 mark, the news outlet must insert "Courtesy of the Pac-12 Conference" over the footage. Highlights may also be posted to certified news providers' websites, but must be removed 48 hours after the conclusion of any included event, unless a license for that footage is obtained from the Pac-12 Conference. Highlights may not be posted to YouTube, Facebook, or other social media properties. Beyond the 48 hour news window, certified news outlets are permitted to use a maximum of 1 minute of footage - on their television newscasts only - for 14 calendar days after the conclusion of the game in question. This policy pertains to the 2013-14 academic year only and is subject to change in subsequent years.

NEW MEXICO, 13

TEMPE -- Taylor Kelly accounted for three touchdowns and Marion Grice ran for two more in a dominating first half, leading Arizona State to a 54-13 rout over listless Colorado on Saturday night.

Arizona State (4-2, 2-1 Pac-12) wanted to make a statement after a tough stretch in the schedule and did just that, overwhelming the Buffaloes with 25 points in the game's first 11 minutes.

Kelly threw for 233 yards and two touchdowns, ran for another score and Grice pushed his nation-leading touchdown total to 15 as the Sun Devils went up 47-6 at halftime.

Colorado (2-3, 0-3) kept it close against Arizona State in Boulder last season before being outscored 31-0 in the second half.

The Sun Devils nearly matched that in the first quarter and never let up on the Buffaloes, forcing four turnovers while sending

them to their 11th straight Pac-12 loss.

Colorado replaced quarterback Connor Wood in the first quarter after an interception and freshman Sefo Liufau wasn't much better, throwing two more interceptions. Colorado also lost a fumble and finished with 268 total yards - Arizona State had 531 - in its third straight lopsided Pac-12 loss.

#SUNDEVIL FOOTBALL NOTES

TEMPE-- The No. 16/14 Arizona State University Sun Devil football program open the Pac-12 season on the road on Saturday, taking on the Colorado Buffaloes in Boulder, Colo., at 7 p.m. PT on ESPNU. Last weekend, ASU used a strong second half and a career day by D.J. Foster to rout New Mexico, 58-23. The Sun Devils opened the season with an efficient and thorough 45-15 victory over Weber State in Tempe on opening weekend, increasing their season-opening win streak to 12 straight games.

Arizona State is now in its 102nd season of competition in 2014. The Sun Devils are 575-370-24 (.606) all-time and have appeared in 27 bowl games, compiling a 13-13-1 record in such contests. The Sun Devils are coming off an impressive 10-4 campaign in 2013 that saw ASU finish as the Pac-12 South Champions and advance to the National University Holiday Bowl as head coach Todd Graham earned Pac-12 Coach of the Year accolades.

ON THE AIR Hear the hometown with broadcaster Tim Healey and color analyst Jeff Van Raaphorst as well as sideline reporter Doug Franz call all the action for Sun Devil Football this season. The MidFirst Bank Sun Devil IMG Sports Network airs statewide and is buoyed by Booneville's powerful sports/talk lineup of 620 AM KTAR, 98.7 KMVP and 92.3 KTAR News FM. Don't miss a play this upcoming season with the additional worldwide coverage brought to you by the TuneIn App which can be downloaded to your smartphone, tablet or laptop. This week's game will broadcast on 620 KTAR News AM. The game's home radio coverage will also be broadcast on Sirius Channel 136/XM Channel 197, .

LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION Saturday's contest will mark the first game for the Sun Devils this season on the ESPN family of networks as the action will be broadcast via ESPNU. Anish Shroff will be on the call alongside analyst Kelly Stouffer while Cara Capuano will roam the sidelines. The Pac-12 will again provide access to Armed Forces Network for carriage of Pac-12 football games in 2014s for the benefit of the men and women in the military.

ON THE BUFFALOES The Sun Devils are 5-0 all-time against the Buffalo with all games being played in the past decade (two in 2006-07 before CU joined the Pac-12 and three Pac-12 South tilts). ASU has outscored CU, 206-61, in those competitions - including a 54-13 rout in Tempe last season. The Sun Devils are 2-0 in games played in Boulder. ASU's five game winning streak against CU is its second longest active streak against a Pac-12 school outside an eight game winning streak against Washington.

LAST TIME OUT - NEW MEXICO

--The Sun Devils are now 23-5-1 all-time against the Lobos and now hold a 104-34-2 record all-time against schools currently in the Mountain West.

--ASU had not won a non-conference road-game since defeating a then non-conference Colorado team in Boulder, 21-3, in 2006. The last time ASU beat a non-conference team on the road that isn't currently playing in the Pac-12 was against Northwestern in Evanston in 2004, a 30-21 victory. That was also the last time ASU had played a road game in the second game of the season.

--ASU had not won its first road game of the season since 2007 - a 41-3 rout over Stanford in Palo Alto in the fifth game of the season - and had lost six straight first road games of the year. Todd Graham is 7-5 at Arizona State in true road games and ASU has been a winner of four straight road games, their last loss coming in the Notre Dame game last season. ASU had eight road wins in the entirety of the previous coaching regime from 2007-11.

--ASU outscored New Mexico 21-7 in points off turnovers in the game. Under Coach Graham, ASU has outscored opponents 296-107 in the category.

--D.J. Foster now has four 100+ yard rushing games in the last five games with eight rushing TDs in that span. In the 24 games prior to that, he had no 100+ yard games and just four rushing touchdowns. Foster has set a new career high rushing marks past three games (132 against Texas Tech, 147 against Weber State and 216 tonight).

--Armand Perry became the third true freshman Sun Devil to start on defense this season and ASU started three true freshman against UNM, its most in a single game since at least 1983.

NOTABLE NUMBERS

--The UNM game was the 10th time under Todd Graham and Mike Norvell that ASU has scored 50 or more points. That number is significant as ASU had 10 such games TOTAL from 2001 through 2011.

---With a 9-yard pass to Foster to open the fourth scoring drive of the game in the second quarter, Taylor Kelly became the fourth quarterback in ASU history to pass for more than 7,000 yards. He has 7,126 career passing yards after throwing for 192 against the Lobos.

--The Devils racked up 423 rushing yards on 48 carries and scored six touchdowns on the ground, including five by different players. They averaged 8.8 yards per carry as a team, including 11.4 by Foster, 8.4 by Kelly and 14.3 by Richard. The 423 yards on the ground were the most by the Devils since they had 405 against Oregon in 1997.

--D.J. Foster became the first Sun Devil since to rush for over 200 yards in a game since Delvon Flowers rushed for 226 yards against Oregon State in 2001. He became just the third Sun Devil since 1994 to rush for over 200 yards in a game out of the 20 total 200-yard rushers in ASU history and his

216 yards are tied for the ninth-highest total in program history.

--The Devils put together three separate scoring drives of three plays under one minute (36 yards, 32 seconds; 24 yards, 45 seconds; 41 yards, seven seconds) against UNM, their three shortest drives of the season in terms of time and number of plays, and also put together a 10-play, 2-minute, 52-second scoring drive, their longest of the season. None of ASU's 16 scoring drives this season have lasted longer than 2:52.

WE ARE THE YOUTH GONE WILD In a complete 180 from the strong veteran presence on the 2013 Sun Devil roster, the 2014 ASU squad will rely heavily on the youngsters to help lead the way as the season progresses. Entering the weekend, the Sun Devil two-deep depth chart features 26 freshmen and sophomores who could see playing time this season. That total ranks tied for 12th in the nation among Division I programs (Oklahoma State and Tulane lead with 32 underclassmen on the two-deep). In the opener, true freshmen DJ Calhoun and Tashon Smallwood each got the nod as starters, becoming just the seventh and eighth Sun Devils in program history to start in the season opener as true frosh, joining John Jefferson, Terrell Suggs, Zach Milner, Will Sutton, D.J. Foster and Jaxon Hood on the exclusive list.

SENIOR DISCOUNT With such an abundance of underclassmen set to make their presence felt this season, it should come as no surprise that there is a bit of a shortage on seniors. In fact, ASU's senior class this season sits at 11 members - a tally that ranks tied for the second fewest total among all Division I institutions behind only Temple's eight total seniors. The quality of those seniors is impressive however with eight of them appearing on the opening weekend two-deep depth chart and another set to participate on special teams. Even with the high percentage of total seniors seeing playing time, ASU's eight seniors on the two-deep are tied for the fourth-lowest total in the nation behind only Temple and Tennessee (6) and Baylor (7). ASU had nine first-time starters in the opener (six on defense, three on offense) and has had 11 first-time D-I starters this season.

STRIKE FIRST Arizona State has scored first in 23 of the 29 games with Todd Graham at the helm and is now 18-5 in the Graham era when getting on the scoreboard first and 2-0 this season following the UNM contest.

STRIKE FAST The quick-hitting offense has become a staple of the Todd Graham-coached Sun Devils, with 128 of ASU's 171 offensive scoring drives under offensive coordinator Mike Norvell coming in three minutes or less (74.9 percent). All 16 of ASU's scoring drives this season have come in less than three minutes. ASU's high-powered offense resonates with the high number of quick scoring drives, scoring in three minutes or less on 62 of the team's 89 scoring drives in 2013 (70.0 percent). There was a direct correlation between the time of ASU's scoring drives in 2013 and the points per scoring drive as well. When ASU scored in three minutes or less, it averaged 6.2 points per drive. When the drive lasted longer than three minutes, ASU's average dropped to 5.4 points per drive. In ASU's 14 drives in 2013 lasting longer than four minutes, the team averaged just 4.3 points per score.

START STRONG...FINISH STRONG The Sun Devils have now outscored their opposition 317-146 in the first quarter under Todd Graham after taking a 22-7 advantage through one frame against UNM. The Sun Devils are 14-1 under Graham when holding their opposition scoreless in the first as they did against the Weber State in the opener. ASU improved to 18-0 when leading at halftime with Graham as head coach following the UNM contest as well.

WINNING BY WAY OF TKO (TAYLOR KELLY OFFENSE)

Following the UNM contest (12-for-20, 192 yards, two TDs, no INTs), Taylor Kelly now has 7,135 career passing yards, good for fourth in school history and 1,692 behind Jake Plummer for third place. His two TD passes against UNM also gave him 60 for his career, good for fifth in school history and just four behind Danny White for fourth. In 14 games in 2013, Kelly had 3,635 passing yards and averaged 259.6 yards per game, both ranked in the top five in school history. He is just the second Sun Devil to have multiple seasons with 3,000+ passing yards behind only Andrew Walter (3). Statistically, the team relies heavily on Kelly's ball protection, as ASU is 6-8 with Kelly as the starter when he throws an interception, compared to a 14-1 record when he doesn't - the lone loss coming in the Pac-12 Championship game last season against Stanford. All six of the victories with interceptions came in 2013, showing an improved ability to overcome adversity at the hands of turnovers. Kelly finished last season ranked 13th nationally in points responsible for with 222 (28 passing TDs, nine rushing), breaking the previous school record in the category of 198 previously set by Mike Pagel in 1981. Kelly is responsible for 71 touchdowns in his career (60 passing, 11 rushing) - good for the fourth-highest total among all ASU quarterbacks

VETERAN LEADERSHIP There won't be a lot of turnover in the Pac-12 this season at the quarterback position. All but two teams return their starting quarterback from last season. Even with that in mind, Kelly is currently tied with UCLA's Brett Hundley with the second-most career starts for a QB in the conference at 29. Only Sean Mannion (33) has more starts in his career, leading the nation's active quarterbacks in the category. In fact, among all power conference programs, only Rutgers' Gary Nova (30 starts) has more than Kelly and Hundley following the injury to Ohio State's Braxton Miller (34 career starts would have led the country entering the season).

HE'S GOT LEGS, AND HE KNOWS HOW TO USE THEM

Taylor Kelly has done plenty to get it done through the air, but its his aptitude in the running game that has made him as potent a quarterback. Kelly rushed 10 times for 84 yards and a touchdown against UNM. His ability to extend plays has been exceptional from the start, as demonstrated by his 516 net rushing yards on 134 attempts in 2012 - a mark skewed by the fact that sacks count against a quarterback's rushing totals. If you take out sacks, Kelly would have led the team in yardage and yards per carry with 690 net rushing yards in 2012 on 103 carries (6.7 ypc). Sacks aside in 2013, Kelly had 826 rushing yards on 134 attempts (6.2 ypc) and was on fire in the final nine games with nine rushing touchdowns while rushing for 599 yards (sacks excluded) on 106 carries (5.7 yards per rush). Those nine touchdowns were notable as Kelly had just one rushing touchdown in 18 games prior to the season-ending streak. Kelly was second on the team last season with 43 rushes for first down, trailing only Marion Grice (45). He was also second on the team in "explosive plays" on the ground (ruses of 12 or more yards) with 18 in 2013, trailing only Marion Grice's 19. Kelly has 1,246 rushing yards in his career - the second most of any ASU quarterback in program history. Additionally, Kelly has now punted 15 times in his career, with 11 of those being downed inside of the 20-yard line - including one in the opener against Weber State.

TAYLOR MADE ON THIRD DOWN The senior quarterback led the team in third down rushes in 2013 with 30. Fifteen of those went for a first down and six for a touchdown, more than the entire team had combined on third down on the season,

rushing or receiving (3). Kelly averaged a team leading 7.6 yards per rush on third down and finished tied for second nationally in touchdown rushes on third down with six. Kelly has rushed twice on third down this season, logging one first down and averaging 8.0 yards per rush on his attempts.

FOSTER THE PEOPLE D.J. Foster is the only returning player in the nation to amass 400+ receiving AND rushing yards last year and his eight career receiving touchdowns are the most among all active running backs. Last season, Foster was second on the team in all-purpose yardage with 1,170 yards in 2013 (501 on the ground, 653 by air and 16 on KR). Foster made his mark in the receiving game in 2013 with 63 grabs for 653 yards (10.4 ypc), ranking second on the team in both categories. The 63 receptions set a new school record for catches by a running back. He also had a knack for getting to the first down marker and finished tied for second on the team with 53 first downs on 156 touches last season (34.0 percent). This season, Foster leads the team with 14 rushing first downs of ASU's 27 total rushing first downs this season and has 17 total first downs on the season.

GO D.J., THAT'S MY D.J. With 216 rushing yards against UNM, Foster became the first Sun Devil since to rush for over 200 yards in a game since Delvon Flowers rushed for 226 yards against Oregon State in 2001. He became just the third Sun Devil since 1994 to rush for over 200 yards in a game out of the 20 total 200-yard rushers in ASU history and his 216 yards are tied for the ninth-highest total in program history. Foster has racked up four 100+ yard rushing games in his last five games and has eight rushing touchdowns in that span. He had zero 100+ yard rushing games in his previous 24 games with just four rushing touchdowns.

RUN, D.J., RUN D.J. Foster's 216 yards rushing is the most by a running back in the Pac-12 this year and he is the only back to surpass the 200-yard mark in the league in 2014. His 216 yards rushing against New Mexico is the eighth-most single-game rushing total in the nation this year and tied for the ninth highest total in ASU single game history. Foster currently is third in the nation and first in the league with 363 rushing yards this season while his 181.5 rushing yards per game are fifth nationally and first in the Pac-12. Foster has 12 "explosive" plays this season (ten 12+ yard rushes, two 16+ yard receptions) to lead the team. He already has three rushes of over 40 yards this season, notable as no Sun Devil had more than two in the entirety of last season.

A STRONG START Jaelen Strong wasted no time picking things up where he left off in the opener, hauling in 10 passes for 146 yards in just a single half of action. As far as openers go, only Mike Jones' six catches for 162 yards in 2008 vs. NAU and Keith Poole's nine catches for 162 yards in 1995 against UW were more prolific stat-wise in the past two decades. Last year, The junior college transfer led the team in receptions and yards with 75 grabs for 1,122 yards (5.4 rpg/80.1 ypg) and seven touchdowns in 2013. In his first four games, Strong made his mark by posting the best four starts of any receiver in term of yards and receptions in school history. Prior to Strong, no Sun Devil wide receiver in history had posted more than one 100+ yard game in their first four starts. Strong now has eight 100-yard receiving games in his career, trailing only Derek Hagan (18) and Shaun McDonald (12) for the most 100-yard receiving games in program history.

THE FORCE IS STRONG Just as impressive as Jaelen Strong's statistics were, his ability to make catches when they count can't be overlooked. Of Strong's 13 receptions this season, 11 have gone for a first down. Last season, a total of 47 of his receptions went for first downs while he also drew 10 pass interference penalties against opposing defenses (six of which resulted in first downs, four were declined as they were all still caught for either a first down, touchdown or two-point conversion), thus playing a role in 53 of ASU's 340 total first downs last season. Additionally, Strong was second on the team in explosive plays (rushes over 12 yards and receptions over 16 yards) with 29 last season. He has five such plays this season.

DON'T CROSS THAT LINE ASU prides itself on its aggressive defense under Todd Graham and tackles for loss and no-yardage plays play a big role in that. Against UNM, ASU had eight tackles for loss, seven stops at the line of scrimmage and forced four incomplete passes for a total of 19 plays that did not earn a single yard out of the 68 total plays run by the Weber State offense (27.9 percent). In 2013, the ASU defense had 101 tackles for loss and held offenses to 353 plays (out of 942 by the opposition) that did not earn positive yardage (including incomplete passes) - a 37.4 percentage rate of plays run from the line of scrimmage. In 2012, ASU forced 117 tackles for a loss of 497 total yards in 2012 - a 9.00 TFL per game mark that led the nation. All told, in three seasons under Graham, ASU has forced 736 plays that have not resulted in positive yardage out of 2,024 total plays (36.4 percent).

LIGHT 'EM UP ASU racked up 58 points against UNM, marking the 10th time since Todd Graham and Mike Norvell arrived in Tempe that the team accomplished the feat. To put that in perspective, ASU eclipsed 50 points 10 times total in the previous 10 years before the current coaching regime (2001-11). Putting points on the scoreboard won't typically be a problem with Norvell heading the offense, as ASU eclipsed 50 points six times in games in 2013, breaking the school record held by the 1973 team. ASU went 86 games without scoring 60 from 2005-2011. Under Coach Graham it has scored 60 three times (63 NAU, 62 Navy, 62 USC). The Sun Devils finished 10th nationally last at 39.7 points per game and scored 556 total points, just six points behind the 1972 school record. ASU is currently eighth nationally in scoring offense, averaging 51.5 points per game. ASU's 43.7 points per game in non-conference games since 2012 is the seventh-highest average in the FBS in that time.

RETURNING FIRE Perhaps the most exciting part about last year's offensive breakout is the fact that ASU returns a good majority of those players for the 2014 campaign. In fact, ASU is the only school in the Pac-12 Conference to return a 3,000+ yard passer (Kelly), a 1,000+ yard receiver (Strong) and two 500+ yard rushers (Kelly/Foster). The Sun Devils are actually one of just three teams in the entire country to lay such a claim with Houston and Marshall being the only others.

BETTER SUITED FOR HANDKERCHIEFS The Sun Devils don't give referees much reason to reach for their pockets under Todd Graham. In each of his eight seasons as a head coach, Graham's teams have been consistently ranked among in the top half of the least penalized teams in the country in both yards and penalties per game. The Sun Devils have just eight penalties for 60 yards this season, ranked 15th in penalties and penalty yards per game in D-I this season. In 2013, the Sun Devils finished eighth in fewest penalties (4.00) and seventh in fewest penalty yards per game (31.4).

MORE ON PENALTIES Todd Graham has had a knack for having some of the most disciplined teams in the nation when it comes to penalty yards. Seventeen of ASU's 20 least penalized games since 2006 have come under Todd Graham. Since Todd Graham arrived at Arizona State, the Sun Devils have had just 119 penalties in 29 games (4.1 penalties per game). The Sun Devils were penalized just four times for 30 yards against UNM.

MAKE 'EM PAY ASU isn't in the habit of leaving points off the board following turnovers. The Sun Devils took advantage of three UNM fumbles to the tune of 21 points, outscoring the Lobos, 21-7 in points off turnovers in the contest. In 2013, ASU outscored its opponents 146-42 on points off turnovers while posting a +15 takeaway number. ASU put points on the board following

75.8 percent of opponent turnovers (25-of-33) compared to just the 33.3 (6-of-18) percent clip ASU opponents scored off of Sun Devil turnovers. ASU had 18 touchdowns in 2013 on 33 opponent turnovers, aided by five interception returns for touchdowns. In 2012, the Sun Devil offense put points in the bank on 70.0 of its conversion opportunities, scoring 18 touchdowns off of 30 turnovers forced. ASU outscored opponents 139-58 in points off turnovers over the course of that year, despite posting just a middling +6 number in the takeaway category. That year, ASU's opponents scored on just 41.7 percent of their drives following an ASU turnover and scored just seven touchdowns on 24 turnovers. In three years under Todd Graham, ASU has outscored opponents 296-107 in points off turnovers.

TURNOVER FACTORY The Sun Devils streak of 29 consecutive games forcing a turnover game to a halt against Weber State, bringing an end to what was the second-longest active streak in the nation. ASU rebounded to the tune of three fumble recoveries against UNM and hold a +2 turnover margin in games this season. Last season, ASU led the Pac-12 with 33 takeaways in 2013, finishing fifth nationally. The team was seventh nationally with a 1.1 turnover margin. The squad had forced 66 turnovers under Todd Graham in the last three seasons, the fifth-highest total in the country in that span. In the Pac-12, only Oregon, ASU and Washington have had a positive turnover ration in each of the last three seasons. Additionally, ASU is the only team in the league with at least 30 takeaways in each of those seasons.

#NOFLYZONE The Sun Devil secondary has limited its opposition to an average of 143 yards per game thus far this season, the 20th-best total in the country. Last season, ASU finished third in the conference in passing yards allowed in Pac-12 games (222.3 per game). ASU has eight interception returns for touchdowns under Graham, compared to posting just four total in the previous three seasons prior to 2012. The total is tied for second with Baylor behind only SMU (9) for the most since the start of the 2012 campaign. ASU had 21 interceptions in 2013, ranked first in the conference and third nationally, and had 62 passes defended, ranked 42nd nationally. ASU's five interception returns for touchdowns in 2013 were tied for first nationally with Florida State, Baylor and Arizona. The Sun Devils have 42 interceptions in the last two seasons, second in the FBS behind only Houston (47) and Oregon (44).

GOLD ZONE One area that saw improvement last season for the Sun Devils was red zone offense, with ASU putting points on the board 91.3 percent of the time against FBS opponents in 2013, finishing sixth nationally in the category, as per TeamRankings.com. ASU has picked up where it left off so far this season, scoring on all 12 of its trips inside the red zone this season, racking up 10 touchdowns in that streak. In 2012, ASU scored on just 76.1 percent of their drives inside the 20 and ranked a lowly 93rd in the nation against FBS opponents. On the flip side, ASU allowed its FBS opponents to score 88.9 percent of the time in 2013 when entering the red zone (ranked 106th nationally). ASU has held its opponents to three scores in five red zone appearances this season (60.0 percent), good for 17th nationally.

WINNING THE BATTLE FOR FIELD POSITION The Sun Devils are largely exceptional when it comes to starting field position and continue to resonate a point Todd Graham makes about being successful in the field position battle to win games. Under Todd Graham, ASU has had an average starting yard line of its own 36.2 in 20 victories compared to a starting yard line of the 25.5 for their opponents in such contests. ASU has allowed just two drives to start inside its own territory thus far this season. Conversely, opponents have an average starting field position of their own 33.7 yard line compared to ASU starting at its own 29.2 in ASU's nine losses under Graham. In 2012, ASU posted an average starting spot of its own 33-yard line that ranked 10th in the nation, according to the folks at Football Outsiders (www.footballoutsiders.com) and in 2013, the team ranked 13th nationally (average starting yard line: 33.3). The Sun Devils also held their opponents to an average starting line of their own 28-yard-line, a total that ranked 24th nationally in 2012, though the squad dropped a bit to 32nd last season (average opp. starting yardline: 28.2). ASU had 10 scoring drives of 80 yards or longer in 2013, a notable feat as ASU had six such drives in the entirety of the 2012 season. ASU has had three such drives this season, including a school-record matching 99-yard drive against Weber State that was ASU's longest drive since a 99-yard drive in 2008 against Northern Arizona.

CLOSING THINGS OUT ASU has outscored other teams 271-158 in the fourth quarter under Todd Graham. ASU finished 10th in the nation in points per fourth quarter in 2013 against FBS opposition (9.9) after finishing the 2012 season with 9.3 points per fourth quarter, which was good for eighth nationally. ASU's 16.8 second-half points per game against FBS squads in 2013 was 24th nationally.

HALFTIME MOMENTUM The Sun Devils did a good job of building some cushion heading into half-time last season, finishing fourth nationally in second quarter points per game at 12.6. The Sun Devils scored 20 or more points in five second quarters in 2013 and outscored the opposition 192-115 on the season in the second quarter of games - the highest point discrepancy between ASU and its opponents

in any quarter on the season. ASU has outscored the opposition 24-14 in the second quarter this season and improved to 18-0 under Todd Graham when leading at the half following the UNM contest.

USE THEM WISELY Todd Graham doesn't hesitate to use his allotted three timeouts per half when his squad is on defense, a coaching technique that has plenty of detractors. A closer look at the result of the play following those timeouts might quiet some, however. Since the start of the 2012 season, ASU has used 38 timeouts on defense in third down situations, forcing fourth down or a turnover on the ensuing play on 27 of those occasions (71 percent).

#NOFIRSTDOWNFORYOU Last season, the ASU defense forced opponents to 80 three-and-outs on 189 drives (42.3 percent), ranked fifth nationally with 5.71 three-and-outs per game. ASU's 80 total three and outs forced during the 2013 season were the second most nationally behind only Baylor (83). The Sun Devils forced five three-and-outs in the opener against New Mexico and has forced nine total in two games this season out of 26 total drives (34.6 percent).

GOLD RUSH The Sun Devils rushing offense has been off with a bang thus far this season, averaging 345.0 yards per game thus far - the sixth-highest total in the nation. ASU put up 423 yards on the ground against UNM for its first 400+ yard rushing game since logging 405 against Oregon in 1997. The Sun Devils already have five rushing plays over 40 yards this season, compared to having five total in the entirety of last season. ASU finished the 2012 season averaging 205.5 yards per game on the ground, which was the second-best mark in the past 25 seasons (since 1988). Only the 234.1 yards per game put up by the 1996 Sun Devils were better. It was a little bit of a slow start for the Sun Devils in 2013 but the team found its running legs by the end, averaging 191.4 yards per game and ranked 40th nationally. Even after ASU's slow start to the season in the category, the squad still posted the fourth-highest single season rushing mark of the last 25 seasons.

ROAD WARRIORS Winning away from home in college football is difficult, especially in conference games. Under Coach Todd Graham, ASU is beginning to assemble a pretty good resume of road/neutral site victories, collecting four in 2012 (at California, Colorado, Arizona and vs. Navy at the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl). In 2013, ASU garnered three straight road wins (at Washington State, at Utah and at #14 UCLA) and are winners of five of the last six road games under Graham (four straight) and eight road wins in the past 13 road games for ASU, including six Pac-12 Conference road wins in the past nine Pac-12 road games. Prior to UNM, ASU had not won a non-conference road-game since defeating a then non-conference Colorado team in Boulder, 21-3, in 2006. ASU also had not won its first road game of the season since 2007 - a 41-3 rout over Stanford in Palo Alto.

SOMETHING YOU DON'T SEE EVERY YEAR Saturday's contest against Colorado is the next step in a weird schedule for the Sun Devils in that they will play three road games in the first five games and four road games in the first seven. Since football picked back up after World War II, ASU has played three road games in the first five games just nine times with the most recent being 1997 while the team has played four road games in the first seven games just six times with the last occurring in 2010.

RECORD NOTABLES Last season, ASU reached six Pac-10/12 wins for just the fourth time in 36 seasons since it joined the league in 1978. It was 8-0 in 1996, 6-2 in 1997 and 7-2 in 2007. The league only played seven league games in 1978 and 1979, eight in 1980, then went to a seven-game slate from 1981-90. The league went to an eight-game slate in 1991 and then a nine-game slate in 2006. The team's eight wins matched the 1996 school record for the most conference wins in Sun Devil history (including Border and WAC schedules). With the Territorial Cup win, ASU reached 10 wins for the first time since the 2007 season. In fact, in the history of Sun Devil football, ASU has reached the 10-win plateau just 12 times. Additionally, all eight of ASU's conference victories came consecutively and capped a streak that marked just the 13th time in history the Sun Devils won five or more conference games in a row (Border and WAC years included). Prior to last season, ASU had won five or more conference games in a row just three times ('96, '97, '07) since 1987.

EXPLOSIVE You'd be hard-pressed to listen to a Todd Graham press conference that didn't involve the word "explosive" at some point as the head coach makes no attempt to hide the fact that that's what he wants his team to be. The Sun Devils have a classification of "explosive plays" that equal a run of 12 or more yards or a passing play of 16 or more yards. ASU has 29 explosive plays (12 passing, 17 rushing) this season, ASU finished with 142 such plays in 2013 (82 passing, 60 rushing) and 165 (90 passing, 75 rushing) in 2012. The Sun Devils finished the season tied for seventh in the nation in plays longer than 20 yards in 2013 with 86 after having 72 in 2012, which was good for 19th in the country in the category. ASU is currently second nationally with six plays over 40 yards this season and 11th nationally in plays of 20 or more yards.

#SUNDEVIL FOOTBALL NOTES

PROTECT THIS HOUSE

With the victory in the opener, ASU is now 12-3 at Sun Devil Stadium under Todd Graham. With the loss to Stanford in the Pac-12 Championship, ASU finished last season with a 7-1 record at Sun Devil Stadium. The 2013 season marked just the second time ASU has gone undefeated at home in the regular season in the past 16 seasons (since 1997), also going 6-0 in 2004. ASU also had a perfect record at home in '59, '64, '68, '70, '71, '73, '75, '81 and '96. After 13 games under Todd Graham, the Sun Devils have averaged 46.0 points per game at home. The lowest score the Devils have recorded in a regular season home game under Graham is 21 against Oregon in 2012 - the only regular season game under Graham that ASU has scored less than 30 points - and ASU has scored 20 or more in 21 consecutive regular season home games, dating back to 2010. ASU's 49.1 points per game at home in 2013 were sixth in the nation, just shy of the school record for scoring offense at home, which was 49.2 points set by the 1972 team.

RUN THE CLOCK

One of the biggest areas of improvement for the Sun Devils in 2013 was the clock management side of things. In 2012, ASU ranked seventh in the Pac-12 and 80th nationally in time of possession, holding the ball an average of 29:15 per game. In 2013, ASU averaged 30:21 minutes of possession time per game - a total that ranked fourth in the conference and 51st nationally. ASU had 31:11 minutes of possession in the opener to Weber State's 28:49. The team had 13 scoring drives over four minutes in 2013, compared to just three in 2012. "So, ASU's offense scores fast and thus time of possession is irrelevant," you say? Not so fast, my friend. ASU is 12-2 when leading in time of possession under Todd Graham compared to a 8-7 record when trailing in the time of possession category.

IN-ZANE IN THE MEMBRANE

Zane Gonzalez had a nice hot streak in 2013, hitting 18 straight field goals beginning with the USC game on September 28 before missing one in the Pac-12 Championship game against Stanford. The Deer Park, Texas, product did, however, earn Pac-12 First Team honors for his incredible season. Gonzalez finished the year hitting 25 of 30 field goals (83.3 percent) and booted 63 of 65 extra points. Gonzalez finished No. 10 in the nation in scoring at 9.9 points per game and led the Pac-12 kick scoring category by a large margin. The next kicker on the list was Stanford's Jordan Williamson at 8.8. His 138 points by kick scoring were No. 1 in the Pac-12, far ahead of No. 2 Travis Coons of Colorado (107 points). Gonzalez was No. 1 in the Pac-12 in field goals at 1.7 per game. Gonzalez led the Pac-12 with 25 field goals, seven ahead of Williamson's 18 field goals this season. Gonzalez was named one of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Award, given annually to the nation's top kicker. Gonzalez is averaging 8.5 points per game thus far this season.

FG-ONZAL-EZ

Gonzalez finished with 138 points last season, breaking the long-standing school record in the category that was previous held by Wilford White's 136 in 1950. Gonzalez's 138 points demolished the previous scoring record by an ASU kicker that was 118, set by Thomas Weber (2007) and Mike Barth (2002). With 25 field goals last season, Gonzalez tied the NCAA freshman record of 25 that was set by UCLA's Kai Forbath in 2007 (25-30) and made more field goals than any other player in the FBS in the process and four more than any other freshman in the nation. Gonzalez's aim was true in his one attempt against Weber State and he was a perfect 6-for-6 on extra points.

TODD-BITS OF INFO

Over his four seasons prior to coming to ASU -- one at Pittsburgh and three at Tulsa -- Todd Graham's teams rushed the ball on at least 53.4 percent of their total plays. The 2012 Sun Devils rushed the ball on 59.1 percent of their total plays followed by a 55.2 percent tally in 2013. In 2011, ASU rushed just 44.5 percent of the time. Over the past eight seasons at Pitt, Tulsa, Rice and now ASU, only one Graham-coached team has ranked outside the top 50 nationally in sacks. The Sun Devils averaged 4.0 sacks per game in 2012, the second-best mark in the nation, and then 2.9 in 2013 to finish 17th nationally in the category. In eight seasons, Graham is 25-22 in true road games. ASU was 3-3 in such games in 2012 and 3-2 in road games in 2013. In the previous four seasons prior to Graham's arrival, ASU was 5-16. In seven of the past eight years, Graham's teams have ranked 39th or better nationally in fewest penalty yards per game. The Sun Devils averaged only 34.92 penalty yards per game in 2012, which was good for eighth in the nation, and bettered that in 2013 at just 31.36 penalty yards per game (seventh nationally).

HANG ON TO YOUR SEATS

ASU played in four games in 2013 decided by seven points or less, going 3-1 in those contests. The total is notable as ASU was just 4-13 in the previous four seasons in games decided by less than a touchdown.

TODD'S WINNING WAYS

At one point ranked 11th in the AP Poll, Todd Graham achieved his highest ranking as a head coach in his career in 2013. The team also peaked at 11th in the BCS standings, also a new high for Graham. Graham has won 20 games in his first three seasons at Arizona State. To put that into perspective, it took Frank Kush until the third game of his third season to reach the 20-win plateau whereas it took Graham until the second game of his third season. Of all the coaching hires

made in prior to the 2012 season, Graham has posted the fifth-best record at 20-9, one game behind UCLA's Jim Mora at 21-8 and half a game behind and Fresno State's Tim DeRuyter (20-8) with only Urban Meyer (25-3) and Kevin Sumlin (22-6) ahead of them.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

The Sun Devils' 10 wins in 2013 were made even more impressive by the fact that the team held the nation's sixth toughest schedule based on the winning percentage of opponents played. ASU's non-FCS opponents in 2013 posted a 84-50 record on the season (62.7) and marked the toughest schedule played by a Pac-12 institution.

TAKING DOWN THE TOP

ASU was 3-2 last season against team's ranked in the AP Top-25 Poll. ASU defeated No. 20 Wisconsin, No. 20 Washington and No. 14 UCLA in 2013 while losing to Stanford twice. ASU's three victories were the most since 1997 when the team went 3-1 against teams ranked in the AP poll. The school record for AP wins is five, set by the 1986 Rose Bowl team.

EIGHT WINS AND NO EASY LAYUPS

In 2013, California went 0-9 in Pac-12 play, the 13th team to go winless in league play since the Pac-10 was created in 1978. ASU missed Cal on the schedule, making ASU's eight-wins in Pac-12 play even more impressive. Only twice prior has the team that has won a Pac-10 or Pac-12 championship not played a winless team in those 12 seasons. In 1982, the Pac-10 Champion UCLA Bruins did not play the Oregon State Beavers, who went 0-7 in the conference. And in 1997, Washington State - who was named co-champions with UCLA - did not play a Beavers team that went 0-7 in the conference that year.

SCHOLAR-BALLERS

The Sun Devils have had a recent history of putting numerous student-athletes on the field that have already earned their degrees and the 2014 roster is no different. ASU will feature eight players this season that have earned their undergraduate degrees and will be pursuing graduate coursework. That total ranks in a tie for 13th nationally and is tops among Pac-12 institutions. Additionally, ASU has 40 student-athletes on its roster that are members of Sun Devil Athletics' Scholar-Baller Program, which honors athletes who maintain over a 3.00 GPA in the classroom.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. (AP) - D.J. Foster and Taylor Kelly left New Mexico behind - in a hurry - as the No. 17 Sun Devils defeated the Lobos, 58-23, on Saturday.

Foster ran for a career-high 216 yards to become the first Sun Devils back to top 200 yards since Delvon Flowers had 226 against Oregon State in 2001.

Kelly added 84 rushing yards from the quarterback position and Arizona State (2-0) had 423 yards on the ground - its most since 1996.

Kelly was 11 of 20 for 129 yards two touchdowns, both in the third quarter.

The Sun Devils took a 22-0 first-quarter lead behind rushing touchdowns from Deantre Lewis, Kelly and Kalen Ballage, who also had a scoring run in the second quarter.

Arizona State scored two touchdowns in the third quarter and New Mexico's only two points in the second half came on a blocked extra point that Brandon Branch returned 98 yards.

The Sun Devils had 621 yards of total offense, with Cameron Smith adding four receptions for 77 yards and a score. Kelly added 192 passing yards and two touchdown passes.

Coming off an outstanding inaugural campaign as Sun Devil head football coach, Todd Graham enjoyed much success in his second season and will be looking for his second straight bowl win at the helm of the ASU program.

Coach Graham earned Pac-12 Coach of the Year honors last season as he led the Sun Devils to a 10-4 record, the Pac-12 South Division Title and a berth in the Holiday Bowl, the program's third consecutive bowl game. He was also named a finalist for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year Award.

The Sun Devils hosted the Pac-12 Championship game after winning a conference-best eight Pac-12 regular season games to match a school record set in 1996. Notable games included the team's second consecutive Territorial Cup® win, as well as home victories over top-20 opponents Wisconsin and Washington, and a road win over then-No. 14 UCLA.

ASU was ranked in the top 25 of the AP Poll nine weeks last season, including seven consecutive weeks to end the season, and moved up as high as No. 11 in the Dec. 1 poll, the highest December ranking for the Sun Devils since 1996.

The program has become one of the least penalized in the nation since Coach Graham's arrival in 2012, and this season the Devils rank seventh nationally in penalties per game (3.7) and fourth in penalty yards per game at (29.2), and lead the Pac-12 in both categories.

A staple of Coach Graham's attacking defense, the Sun Devils have forced a turnover in 26 consecutive games, the second-longest active streak among all FBS institutions, and have recorded 21 interceptions this season, including five returned for touchdowns.

On the other side of the ball, Coach Graham's high-octane offense has eclipsed 50 points in six games this season to break the school record held by the 1973 team.

Under Graham's tutelage, All-American defensive lineman Will Sutton became one of the elite linemen in ASU history and became just the second player in Pac-10/12 history to win the Pat Tillman Defensive Player of the Year Award in two consecutive seasons.

Among the accomplishments of last year's Sun Devil football team:

- At 8-5, the Sun Devils posted their first winning regular season since going 10-2 in 2007.
- ASU ended the season with three straight wins for the first time since 1978 and just the 14th time in school history.
- ASU beat Arizona in dramatic fashion in Tucson to reclaim the Territorial Cup.
- The Sun Devils won a bowl game for the first time since 2005 and the 13th time in school history.
- ASU was one of just four Pac-12 teams to win at least three conference road games (3-2), doing so for just the fifth time in the program's Pac-10/12 history.
- One year after finishing last (120th) in the FBS in penalties and penalty yards per game, Graham brought immediate discipline to the program as evidenced by the Sun Devils finishing the 2012 season tied for 10th in fewest penalties per game (4.23) and eighth in fewest penalty yards per game (34.92).

Employing an approach that emphasizes excellent fundamentals and hard and disciplined play, the Sun Devils' extraordinary improvement on

defense played a paramount role in the team's turnaround last season. After finishing at or near the bottom of the Pac-12 in several defensive categories in 2011, the Sun Devils experienced an amazing reversal last season as they led the conference in tackles for loss (No. 1 in the nation), pass defense (No. 3 in the nation), and pass efficiency defense (No. 10 in the nation) and finished second in the league in sacks (No. 2 in the nation), interceptions (No. 4 in the nation) and total defense.

In addition to distinguishing himself as an exceptional leader, Graham has also developed a reputation for identifying and hiring some of the nation's top assistant coaches. The teaching and instruction done by Graham and his first Sun Devil staff were responsible for several exceptional achievements in 2012:

- The Sun Devils finished No. 14 in the country in scoring offense (38.3 ppg), scoring 40 or more points seven times.
 - In his first season as the full-time starter, quarterback Taylor Kelly set the school single-season record for completion percentage (67.1). Kelly also finished tied for second in single-season school annals with 29 touchdown passes.
 - Running back Marion Grice found the end zone 19 times, tying him for third on ASU's all-time single-season touchdown while his 114 points tied him for fifth on ASU's all-time single season scoring list.
 - Tight end Chris Coyle set the school's single-season record for receptions by a tight end with 57, one more than Zach Miller had in 2004.
 - Punter Josh Hubner finished second in the nation in net punting, helping the Sun Devils finish No. 7 in the nation as a team.
- Off the field, the changes were just as obvious. Graham overhauled the football offices, leading a complete facelift that saw new, engaging wallpaper placed throughout the third floor at Carson Center that shows off ASU's rich history as well as the goals and expectations as a program.

The Sun Devils improved immensely in the classroom as well, with football student-athletes missing just 19 total classes in his first year at the helm – down from 141 the previous season. Additionally, the number of "Scholar-Ballers" (student-athletes with a 3.00 GPA or higher) on the team increased from 30 in 2010-11 to 51 this past season (2012-13). That is the highest total in the program history and makes up just under half of the Sun Devil roster.
