Colorado Head Coach Mike MacIntyre

General

"First of all, I want to congratulate [UCLA QB] Jerry Neuheisel on an unbelievable finish (UCLA defeated Texas 20-17 Saturday night). I saw it before I came in here, and knowing the dad and knowing the boy and all that I think that was pretty special. Our game: Wow. It really hurts, it really hurts. Can't turn the ball over, but we have to cause turnovers on defense. Our kids kept fighting, kept battling. We are improving, but golly that hurt. They are a really good football team – Arizona State – very athletic, very big, and I thought our guys kept fighting, kept battling. A couple third down stops we didn't get. We have to get the ball in the end zone when we're down there (in the Red Zone). We have to keep working on it, and find a way to get that done. But, I thought we flew around and fought and battle hard out there tonight."

On Fumbling The Ball Just Before Halftime

"[That was] huge, huge, huge. You have to hold on to the ball in there, [ASU] is trying to pull it out. That was the first fumble [TB Michael Adkins'] had since he's been here, but we have to stop them there too. We stopped them, but then they got it in (for a touchdown) on a third down on us. We have to make them kick a field goal there, and we didn't. Had some chances; the last turnover, [QB Sefo Liufau] is going to be really upset with himself because there was a guy wide open and we would have scored a touchdown -[ASU] busted a coverage. But, all the kids played valiantly. I have to do a better job coaching them on some situations, we have some things we need to fix, but we're definitely improving. The last week was the best week of practice we have had since I've been here, period. So, I see us getting better, and better, and better, but we have to get it done because there are a lot of great football teams in our league with some talent."

On Fans Leaving Early

"I did not notice that, but if they did, I would definitely love for them to stay for those kids (CU players) because they are fighting their hearts out. We're getting better and we're going to end up doing some good things eventually."

On QB Sefo Liufau Being Taken Out Of The Game

"He had been beat up a little bit and then he had just thrown that pick, and he was kind of limping around. I wanted to give [QB Jordan Gehrke] a chance and get him some experience and get going. I thought he did some good things. I thought I was going to have to put him in earlier because Sefo [Liufau] got hit so late one time. But, that's why we did that."

On The Game Changing When ASU QB Taylor Kelly Left The Game With An Injury

"I didn't realize Kelly was hurt until they brought [ASU QB Mike Bercovici] in. He's an option-type running guy, but I

thought he was a good quarterback too, there's no doubt. Taylor [Kelly] made some good plays for them of course, we just needed to make a few more. We didn't care which quarterback it was, the kids just kept playing and kept fighting."

On Getting Explosive Plays From The Running Game

"That was satisfying as far as getting those explosive plays, there's no doubt about it. We just keep working at it hard. Christian [Powell] made a couple nice runs, Donovan [Lee] came in and did a good job on the reverse, so I thought those were some good plays for us. It's just a tough game, I felt like we definitely had chances to win it. [ASU] made a couple of plays there in the opening drive, we had two third downs with chances to stop them, and they made good plays and a couple close calls to say the least."

On Kickoff Coverage Improving

"Yeah, we got better at that. They never returned one, so we'll see. From the sidelines you could see guys running free that would have (been able to make a play), they weren't locked up and blocked like before (in past weeks). So, yes, I agree with you on that."

On WR Donovan Lee And What He Adds To Offense

"He just adds ability to run after catch and do some things. We had only been playing about five receivers right now and if felt like we needed to get another guy going a little bit in case anyone gets injured or anything like that and they'll have their feet wet, ready to play. He can do some good things, good with the ball under his hands and he can do some things after the catch."

On Nelson Spruce's Second Touchdown Catch

"Pretty good, wasn't it? He's made some spectacular catches, I guess just dial him up for two touchdowns every week, that's what he does. He's so strong; you guys have heard me say that, he's just so strong with his hands. He just catches everything. He competes, and he finds a way to go get the ball. Nelson has played really, really well, and I'm proud of what Nelson is doing, and we need to keep him doing the same thing week in and week out."

On Defense Playing Well Against A Top-Ranked Offense

"Yeah, we did. We're getting better. Our athletes are starting to understand where to fit better, starting to understand what they see better, diagnosing quicker, tackling in space well, some good one-on-one tackles and getting them down. They are a bunch of young guys that are playing more and more and getting better. In the game, they are seeing things, asking questions, talking about things, they're understanding and communicating with each other, they know when they screw up, which is all super. In the past it was, 'I don't know what I saw, I don't know what happened,' now they are seeing it and understanding it and we are able to communicate well and that's why we are able to fix things and that just comes with experience and playing."

On WR Shay Fields Making Plays Against Pac-12 Opponent "Shay is an excellent player, he has good hands, the game is not too big for him, he'll keep making plays."

Arizona State Head Coach Todd Graham

On Colorado

"I want to congratulate Coach MacIntyre, heck I'm just telling you, I told you guys before that there is a tremendous football coach here who does a great job. I thought they showed great heart and determination. They played extremely hard, we were rolling along there. We thought we would make it 21 to 0, those guys fight and scratching, you can tell their coach has a lot of character and heart. So I want to congratulate those guys for hard fought effort tonight."

On His Team

"We are really proud of our team; some unbelievable performances tonight. I'm really proud of our team; we had 100 percent ball security on offense. Two out of three times this year we put the ball on the ground one time in three games. If you have 100 percent ball security you are going to win most games in the Pac-12."

On The Offense

"I was really proud of the offense and how they played and how we got (Mike) Bercovici coming in and it takes a little diversity with Taylor (Kelly) coming out of the game. I'm really proud how he came in and played, obviously. DJ and those guys played really well."

On The Defense

"Defensively, how many turnovers on downs we had at least three or four. We had three take-aways defensively, so we had six or seven times guys, Jordan Simone and Damarious Randall, they were absolutely phenomenal. Armand Perry gave up great coverage over the top that was a heck of a catch by Colorado receiver. I'm really proud Matt Haack he really had that game we've been looking for him to have. Christian Sam, you got Latu who goes down who practice with Ezekiel Bishop he just wasn't ready. It was a lot of critical errors; we were pretty much discombobulated when that happened."

General

"The coaching deal is a little over rated. I don't know if I have been more proud of my team then I was tonight, just all the different things that happened tonight and how they respond; this team has got great character, tremendous brotherhood, finding out ways to win, getting better every week I'm really proud of this team"

On The Status Of Taylor Kelly

"All I know is he is out for tonight and we will evaluate it tomorrow; same thing with Latu."

On How Concerned He Was About Injuries

"Pretty concerned, I believe that was the tough part tonight but the best part about it is that you have to be able to respond. We talked about it on the sidelines. We got a lot of confidence in (Mike) Bercovici, he prepares like he's playing every week. So these guys were very important to us, two team captains that you lose but we'll work harder on it. We got a week and a half so we have a chance to get those two back, so we will see how that goes."

On Teams Pass Rush Effort

"By far the best pass rush effort. We have been playing unconventionally. We played a half the first week against Weber State and then last we played a triple option team, so I thought we made the most improvement we made all year long in our pass rush. We got after the quarterback pretty good tonight. The biggest thing I didn't like was the eight penalties which I think is a record in my tenure and really really dumb penalties. The game is over, we've stopped them and we roughed the quarterback, really really dumb penalties. We cannot have those; that was the most penalties we've ever had and they were all legit penalties. Three pass interference penalties, we got a holding penalty when we were trying to run the clock out; it's just a lot of things we don't do and so we got to really work on that. That's coaching; penalties are coaching so we have to do a better job of that. "

On Momentum Swings In The Game

"The one thing these guys are responding on to is that they get a feel for the game defensively; they really get it about attacking the football. We've attacked the football really well in the last two weeks and Jordan has been phenomenal. We had some big time hits tonight. We were playing physical, that's how you win games, you don't get those three take-aways you might be in trouble. I like this team, I like how their spirit, I like the improvement we are making and Jordan has really emerged as a play maker and that's a long way to go in three weeks."

Colorado Players

OB Sefo Liufau

ON HIS PERFORMANCE – "There were ups and downs. That's always going to happen in games, but I just made two critical errors. The safety in the first pick played well in quarters and came back to help his guy. I put too much on the ball on the second one, I got fooled. So there are little things to fix, but ultimately that's probably seven points in the beginning. I just have to elevate my game for next week."

ON ENCOURAGING TAKEAWAYS FROM THE GAME – "The guys fought all game and you can't take that away from us. We moved the ball up and down the field, the defense made plenty of stops. We should have won that game flatout. That's how I feel and that's how the whole team feels."

ON THE BALANCE OF THE OFFENSE – "I think we've found a nice balance between the run and pass, especially the running game. The running backs are doing a good job of finding the holes that the offensive linemen are opening up for them. We're just taking what they give us. I applaud the offensive line, especially up front for opening up the holes for our running backs and making some plays."

ON THE CROWD – "It was great. It's great to have that support with all of those fans here, especially we applaud those who stayed to the end to support us."

ON STRATEGY AT THE END OF THE FIRST HALF – "I think we didn't need the timeouts, they were gassed. You could see the linebackers with hands on their hips and the offensive linemen weren't getting set fast enough, so we didn't want to give them any time to catch their breath."

TB Christian Powell

ON THE RUNNING GAME - "It's a matter of how much we practice it and execute. That's all it is, it's a football game. There are things that aren't always going to go the way that you want, but there are just things that we have to keep working on. I feel like everyone has bought in to that and that's what we're going to do for the rest of the season."

ON THE OFFENSE SCORING IN THE SECOND QUARTER – "The team clicked. Everybody figured out that it was time to go. Everybody started motivating each other and motivating themselves. The defense made stops, the offense got into the end zone and we just fought off of each other's energy."

DE Derek McCartney

ON HOW THE DEFENSE PLAYED – "We made mistakes, too many mistakes."

ON THE DIFFERENCE WITH TAYLOR KELLY OUT OF THE GAME – "They're just a good team and their second quarterback was really good too. We just have to step our game up for next week."

WR Nelson Spruce

ON HOW THE OFFENSE GAINED RHYTHM – "Offensively, I think after the first couple of drives that we got into a good rhythm, we started to get some momentum on offense. That turnover kind of hurt us, so if we could eliminate that, I think going into half time we were doing pretty well."

ON THE TAKEAWAYS FROM THE GAME – "I think it shows that we can play at this level. Last year this was a team that dominated us in all aspects, but today I never felt as if we were out-manned at all. I think we learned a lot about ourselves from this game."

ON WHETHER COLORADO SHOULD HAVE WON – "Obviously it's football, there's a lot things that go into that, but if we do a few things here-and-there, eliminate a few turnovers and get a few stops...You can say that after any game I guess, but this is one that we really feel like we could have had."

ON PLAYING AGAINST ASU'S STRONG OFFENSE -"I am encouraged what we did in the second half. We kind of held them. We really picked it up in the second half. We could have made a little bit more plays. We made a slip ups on third downs, which kind of hurt us, but we are going to get it next week."

ON CU'S PERFORMANCE TONIGHT AGAINST ASU'S QUARTERBACK – "It's a big confidence builder. We were always confident in ourselves. Kenny Crawley had a big game. Tedric [Thompson] had a big game and Greg [Henderson] had a big game too. We just need to clear some things up. Little penalties that they threw on third downs on Tedric, we really didn't think it was a penalty. So, if we clear those things up, we will be good."

ON ASU'S OFFENSE - "We always believe in ourselves. We have never doubted ourselves. That was for all the non-believers. We always have that sense that we have to win every game that we play, no matter what their rank is, but that one was for all the people that didn't believe in us. Now they know that we aren't messing around this year." ON THEIR RUNNING GAME - "Yeah, that was probably the best week of practice that we've had since I've been here. We were just trying to clear a lot of thing us. We were playing a good Pac-12 team, Arizona State. We just have to keep this momentum going. We have to clear those things us and try and get more W's."

ON TAKING ONE GAME AT A TIME - "We just have to have every week of practice like we had last week and it will be very good. We should be competing well in the Pac-12."

QUICKLY With ESPN sliding the kickoff back from its originally intended 8:06 p.m., the **8:11** kickoff was the second latest in Folsom Field history (ESPN also televised the latest: Sept. 15, 2007 vs. Florida State – 8:15 p.m.) ... The end time of **11:36** was also the second latest ending in Boulder (the FSU game ended at 11:46) ... Colorado is **21-24-1** wearing all black uniforms (nine straight losses), but debuted a new "matte black" helmet tonight ... Teased over the course of the week and on ESPN Game Day this morning by **Chris Fowler**, Ralphie was officially introduced by South Park's **Eric Cartman**; the voice of Cartman, **Trey Parker**, and the show's animator, **Eric Stough**, are CU alumni (as is co-creator **Matt Stone**)... Three Buffs saw their first career action: **WR Donovan Lee** (who had a 45-yard run on a reverse); **OT Jonathan Huckins** also saw his first action, subbing for injured Jeromy Irwin at tackle

Colorado went "three-and-out" on its first three possessions, the same number it did in the first two games (26 drives) ... Arizona

State gained **222** yards in the first quarter: **210** on first downs, **12** on second downs and **0** on third downs ... ASU ran just 10 plays in CU territory in the second half (after 18 in the first; CU ran 24 in plus territory in the second after just 13 in the first) ...

CU had 28 first downs – earned by **13** different players ... **TB Michael Adkins** suffered his first career fumble after 142 touches to open his career without one (125 rushes).

Arizona State now leads the all-time series, **6-0**, though this marked the first game CU outgained ASU in total offense (**545-426**; that margin was **523-204** the last three quarters). ASU gained 253 of its 426 yards on seven of its 60 plays.

99 IS SO NICE TB Christian Powell started it with a 42-yard burst and Sefo Liufau-to-Nelson Spruce ended it with a 31-yard touchdown pass for Colorado's seventh 99-yard scoring drive in its history, the first since 2001 (and in the third fewest plays and just the second time in Boulder):

99—vs. Northwestern at Evanston, Sept. 29, 1951 (TD; 6 plays).

WR NELSON SPRUCE (7-97, 2 TD) He just missed out on becoming the third player in CU history to record three straight 100-yard games (and the first since 1993—Charles E. Johnson). He has three straight 2-TD reception games, the first player in CU history to accomplish that feat, and his 6 TDs this year are already tied for the 13th most in a single-season. He now has 123 career catches (ninth) for 1,442 yards, as he moved into 10th place tonight in the latter, passing Monte Huber (1,436). He has 24 catches for 346 yards this season.

WR SHAY FIELDS (7-36, 1 TD) He set a school record for the most receptions for the first three games in a career with **21**; that broke the old mark of 20 set by Scotty McKnight in 2007 (Fields and McKnight both hold the record of 14 for the first two games).

MR. PLATOON? Colorado has had its fair share of players through the years play on both offense and defense; FB George Frazier practiced this week at defensive end and played both positions in the game –the first CU player to do so since DT John Guydon played 13 snaps on defense and three at offensive guard at Texas on Oct.15, 2005.

- ▶ PK Will Oliver (1-1 FG, 3-3 PAT, 6 points) He has now made 70 consecutive extra points (adding to his school record), and now has 211 career points.

Record Updates

In its 102nd season of competition, Sun Devil Football's all-time record is 576-370-24. The Devils are now 6-0 all-time against the Buffaloes, including 3-0 in Boulder. ASU's six-game winning streak against CU is its second longest active streak against a current Pac-12 school.

Getting It Done On The Road

Todd Graham is 8-5 at Arizona State in true road games and the Sun Devils are winners of five straight on the road and four-straight Pac-12 road contests. their last loss coming in the Notre Dame game last season. ASU had 8 road wins in the entirety of the previous coaching regime 2007-11.

Strike First

ASU has now scored first in 24 of 30 games under Coach Graham and are 19-5 in such contests.

Start Strong

ASU outscored Colorado 14-0 in the first quarter. The Devils have outscored opponents 53-7 in the opening quarter in 2014 and 331-146 overall under Coach Graham.

A Game of Firsts

- Linebacker Antonio Longino became the 12th different Sun Devil this season to earn their first career start this season
- Quarterback Taylor Kelly's nine-yard pass to tight end De'Marieya Nelson on the opening drive was the first completion to a tight end this season for the Sun Devils
- Tight end Kody Kohl caught his first career pass, an eight-yard gain near the end of the first quarter
- Safety Jordan Simone recorded his first career interception, and the first interception of the season for the Devils, and also forced his first career fumble
- True freshman linebacker Christian Sam collected his first career sack (a loss of three yards) in the third quarter and added his first career interception in the fourth corner

Offense

Red Zone Efficiency

ASU is now 16-for-16 in the red zone this season with 13 TDs and 3 FGs.

A Sustained Drive

The first score of the game was the first drive this season that ASU had a scoring drive over three minutes (3:07). Nevertheless, ASU's five other scoring drives in the game came in under three minutes and 133 of 177 scoring drives (75.1 percent) in Todd Graham's tenure have come in less than three minutes

40-yard Rushes

ASU now has seven rushes this season of 40 or more yards. They entered tonight's game with a NCAA-best five, and added two more against the Buffaloes (Foster 52-yard rush in the first quarter, Kelly 50-yard rush in the third quarter). The number is notable as ASU had five in the entirety of 2013.

#FosterFacts

Through three games in 2014, Foster has 510 rushing yds. In 2013, he didn't pass the 400-yard mark until the Holiday Bowl. It took Marion Grice 7 games in 2013 to reach the 400-yard plateau.

Foster has now scored in eight consecutive games and has a rushing touchdown in seven of those eight. He now has nine rushing touchdowns in the last six games. He had four total in 24 games prior to the current streak.

Foster now has four 40-plus rushes this year after putting together a 52-yard carry in the first quarter. No Sun Devil had more than two in 2013.

Kelly Tidbits

Kelly's 50-yard touchdown run was the longest touchdown run of his career and marked his second consecutive game with a rush of 50 or more yards (52-yarder in first quarter vs. New Mexico).

Kelly's three touchdown passes vs. CU gives him 63 in his career, one behind Danny White for fourth on ASU's career passing touchdown list.

A Barrage of Ballage

True freshman running back Kalen Ballage scored his first career receiving touchdown – a 38-yard catch-and-run from Taylor Kelly - and now has four touchdowns in three career games.

Defense

Capitalizing On Turnovers

ASU outscored Colorado 14-0 in points off turnovers in this game and 35-7 in 2014. Under Coach Graham, ASU has outscored opponents 310-107 in the category.

Simone's Impact

Redshirt junior safety Jordan Simone forced two turnovers in the game, including an interception in the first quarter and a forced fumble in the second quarter, and led the team with a career-high 13 tackles, including 12 solo and two for a loss. Both turnovers led to touchdowns for the Devils. His interception was the first of his career and the first interception of the season for the Sun Devils. Simone also recovered a fumble against New Mexico in week two. His forced fumble was also the first career.

The 13 tackles were the fourth-most by a Graham-coached Sun Devil in the past three seasons (Damarious Randall had 17 at Notre Dame last season, Brandon Magee had 17 at Arizona in 2012 and Chris Young had 14 at Utah last season).

Fourth Down is ASU's Down

Opponents are 1-for-6 on fourth down this season. The Devils have stopped opponents on fourth down once in all three games this season, including two goal line stands (against Weber State and at Colorado).

Tackles For Loss

ASU had nine tackles for loss against CU, including two each by safety Jordan Simone and linebacker Antonio Longino.

Career Highs

- Linebacker Antonio Longino set a new career high in tackles for the second consecutive game with 10.
- Safety Jordan Simone set a new career high in tackles with 13
- Armand Perry had a new career high with nine tackles
- DJ Calhoun had a new career high with seven tackles
- Christian Sam set a career high in tackles and had his first career sack and interception in the game
