THE GAME - The Arizona State University Sun Devil football program continues its four-game stretch against Pac-12 South foes this weekend as it welcomes the Colorado Buffaloes to Tempe, Ariz., on Saturday, Oct. 10. The game is scheduled for a 7 p.m. PT kickoff and will be broadcast live on the Pac-12 Networks.

THE BUFFALOES - The Buffaloes enter the game with a 3-2 record this season and are 0-1 in Pac-12 action following a hard-fought 41-24 loss to Oregon last weekend in a game that was much tighter than the final score might tell.

Colorado is a team that has gotten off to a solid start this year, already surpassing last year's win total (2) just five games into the season. The squad has done so behind an emergent rushing offense that is currently 18th nationally and third in the conference at 233.0 yards per game. They have done so with a committee of rushers that includes three players averaging over 60 rushing yards per game.

ASU holds the all-time series record against the Buffaloes, 6-0, and have won all four contests against CU in the current Pac-12 era. In those games, ASU has outscored the Buffs, 245-85, and have an average margin of victory of 43.3 points per game. Of all the teams that ASU has played at least six times throughout history, Colorado is the only one that ASU has an undefeated record against.

THE PAC-12 - The Sun Devils are now 16-21-1 all-time in Pac-12 road openers but have won three of four with Todd Graham at the helm. The UCLA victory keeps ASU just a half game back behind Utah for first in the Pac-12 South.

In the past two plus seasons, ASU has responded in an exemplary fashion following its first conference loss of the season - in the conference opener against Stanford in 2013, the second game of conference play against UCLA in 2014 and the first Pac-12 game this season against USC - compiling a 14-2 conference record following those losses.

AN ASU VICTORY WOULD...

- » Improve ASU to 7-0 all-time against Colorado.
- » Make it a five-game winning streak in conference games against the Buffaloes, its longest winning streak against a conference foe outside its nine straight wins against Washington.
- » Improve ASU to 276-100-3 (.731) all-time at Sun Devil Stadium, the 15th best record of all programs that have been at their home stadiums for at least 50 years.
- » Improve ASU to 19-5 all-time at Sun Devil Stadium under Todd Graham.
- » Improve ASU to a Pac-12 South leading 21-9 record in conference games since 2012.
- » Move ASU to 15-2 in all conference games following its first Pac-12 loss of the season in the past 2+ seasons.

General

The Sun Devil Athletics media relations staff understands the importance of assisting the media in providing coverage of the institution, its athletics programs, administrators, coaches and student-athletes. We pride ourselves in being able to disseminate information as widely, uniformly and fairly as possible using normally accepted media standards. To this end, the best attempt will be made to fill reasonable requests by recognized media outlets. Members of the media are encouraged to work with the Sun Devil Football media relations staff to assist in that endeavor. It is not permissible for media members to contact any athletics department administrator, associate, coach or student-athlete directly without working through the media relations department.

Practice Policies

Due to the nature of Arizona State game dates this season, practices schedules each week will vary dependent upon that week's game. The ASU media relations office will provide a practice schedule prior to each game week for the media. Media members will be able to view three periods, beginning with team stretch. Media wishing to shoot practice will be able to do so for the first two of the three allowed periods, beginning with team stretch and followed by the individual drills. Following that open viewing period, the members of the media will be escorted out of the facility and reconvene near the end of the practice period for post-practice interviews.

Interview Policies

Interviews are conducted at the end of each practice. Due to high demand, several players and members of the coaching staff might only be available on a limited basis each week. A full availability schedule will be provided to the media each week.

Following home contests, Arizona State will bring several student-athletes to the Dutton Theater for a post-game press conference. Head Coach Todd Graham will follow the student-athletes. Any members who wish to contact a student-athlete or coach outside of the aforementioned interview periods should contact Thomas Lenneberg (480-965-6594 or Thomas.lenneberg@asu.edu) to arrange a time outside of practice or post-game for interviews.

Weekly Press Conferences

Head coach Todd Graham will resume his weekly press conferences each Monday prior to

game week. The press conference is tentatively scheduled for 12 p.m. (Noon) Arizona Time each week. When the team practices on Mondays, Coach Graham will not be available following practice.

Following home contests, Arizona State will bring several student-athletes to the Dutton Theater for a post-game press conference. Head Coach Todd Graham will follow the student-athletes.

All press conference will be streamed live via the Pac-12 website at <http://pac-12.com/live/arizona-state-university>. Additionally, ASAP Transcription Services will provide a transcript following each press conference throughout the year that will be made available via TheSunDevils.com and will also be sent to members of the media following each press conference.

Credentials

Media credentials for Sun Devil home games for the 2015 football season will be handled online through Sports Systems. For access to the online portal request system, please contact Doug Tammara (tammara@asu.edu). For road games, please contact Mark Brand (mark.brand@asu.edu) for more information.

Photography/Videography

Media wishing to shoot practice will be able to do so for the first two of the three allowed periods, beginning with team stretch and followed by the individual drills. On-camera interviews will be conducted at the end of each practice.

For home games, a photographer work area has been established inside the Carson Student-Athlete Center (first floor). Internet access to transmit files is available in the photography workroom. Credentials must be worn in plain view throughout the game while on the field and all photographers must adhere to painted lines and instructions given by security personnel and/or Arizona State staff members at all times.

Weekly Media Teleconference

The Pac-12 Football Coaches Weekly Media Teleconference Call will take place each Tuesday during the season. Coach Graham is scheduled to speak at 12:05 PT/1:05 MT each Tuesday. The teleconferences will be recorded and available at Pac-12.com that same afternoon of the call. Members of the media may reach out to the Pac-12 (925-932-4411) for the media-only phone number for the teleconference.

Media Highlights Policy

Highlights include Pac-12 Networks/ESPN/FOX broadcasts and all home hosted non-televised competitions, including those that are live streamed.

Live Broadcasts

It is not permissible for any non-rights holder to broadcast over the air, stream over the internet (audio or video), or transmit in any other way, any live event without the consent of the Sun Devil Athletics Department. Live events include varsity contests, press conferences (including but not limited to weekly scheduled and postgame press conferences) and any other group media availability. Exceptions may be made for any major news-breaking event and will be communicated in the media advisory for the event.

Third-Party Website Highlight Policy

No third party organization may post competition footage of any Pac-12 game or any non-conference home game on its website without a license to the content from the Pac-12 Networks or its licensing partner (XOS Digital), with the exception of news window privileges described below. Third parties are permitted to post video on their websites through the use of the Pac-12 Digital embeddable video player (embed code available at <http://video.pac-12.com>).

News Outlet Highlight Policy

Certified news outlets may use a maximum of 3 minutes of Pac-12 event footage on their newscasts during the 48-hour news window following the conclusion of included events. If these highlights do not contain a Pac-12 mark, the news outlet must insert "Courtesy of the Pac-12 Conference" over the footage. Highlights may also be posted to certified news providers' websites, but must be removed 48 hours after the conclusion of any included event, unless a license for that footage is obtained from the Pac-12 Conference. Highlights may not be posted to YouTube, Facebook, or other social media properties. Beyond the 48 hour news window, certified news outlets are permitted to use a maximum of 1 minute of footage - on their television newscasts only - for 14 calendar days after the conclusion of the game in question. This policy pertains to the 2013-14 academic year only and is subject to change in subsequent years.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION

Saturday's contest will mark the third ASU game of the season that will be broadcast on the Pac-12 Networks. Kevin Calabro will be on the call alongside analyst Yogi Roth while Lewis Johnson will provide insight from the sidelines. ASU is 12-1 all-time on games played on the Pac-12 Networks.

The Pac-12 will again provide access to Armed Forces Network for carriage of Pac-12 football games in 2015 for the benefit of the men and women in the military.

Dr. Javier Cárdenas

Dr. Javier Cárdenas of Phoenix's Barrow Neurological Institute is on the sidelines of every Sun Devil home football game to consult with players who may have sustained a concussion. Dr. Cárdenas, an ASU alumnus, is one of the nation's foremost experts on the diagnosis and treatment of concussion and other forms of brain injury.

Dr. Cárdenas is the medical director of the Barrow Concussion and Brain Injury Center, which is part of Dignity Health St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center. He leads ASU's S.N.A.P. (Sideline Neurologic Assessment Program), which includes a certified athletic trainer in a press box booth. There are two neurologists on the field and all are in communication with each other and a designated team physician on the sidelines. Dr. Cárdenas is the only Arizona neurologist on the NFL's Head, Neck and Spine Committee, where he advises the NFL on best practices for concussion prevention and management. Dr. Cárdenas is on the sidelines of every home Arizona Cardinals game and worked both the 2015 Pro Bowl and Super Bowl 49 at University of Phoenix Stadium.

Dr. Cárdenas graduated Magna Cum Laude in Special Education from ASU in 1999 and received his MD from the University of Arizona College of Medicine in 2004. He later served residencies at St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center and Barrow Neurological Institute. Barrow neurologists also run S.N.A.P. at ASU women's soccer home games.

#BYTHENUMBERS

The defensive duo of linebacker Salamo Fiso and safety Jordan Simone has been a force this season. The two lead the team in tackles this season (Simone at 45, Fiso at 44) while Fiso is currently second nationally and leads the Pac-12 with **7.8 solo tackles per game**, just ahead of Simone in third/second with 7.4 solo tackles per game. The duo has combined for 14.5 tackles for loss and Fiso is 18th nationally and first in the Pac-12 with 1.7 TFL per game.

ASU is one of just **seven teams in the country** that has at least four players with 15 or more receptions this season (Foster/Richard/Lucien/Kohl). Mike Bercovici, the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week, has shown his chops as far as being able to spread the ball around this season. In each of ASU's five games this season, a different player has led the team in total receiving yards (Jefferson/Lucien/Richard/Chambers/Foster).

ASU has gone on the road to defeat an AP Top-10 team **just four times in program history** following its win against then No. 7 UCLA this past weekend. The last time it happened was a 45-42 thriller over No. 8 Oregon in Eugene in 2002. ASU could get a chance at another when it faces current No. 5 Utah in Salt Lake City next week. The last ASU played two Top-10 teams on the road was 2005 (#7 Cal and No. 1 USC), losing both games.

ASU has thrived on being able to limit its opponents in the first half under Todd Graham. Since 2012, ASU has **lost just one game** (Notre Dame in 2013) in which is held its opponent scoreless in the first quarter and is 21-1 overall and 3-0 this season in doing so. Additionally ASU has **lost just one game** under Graham when leading at halftime (Oregon State in 2014) and has a 27-1 record in such games.

- Mike Bercovici and Matt Haack took two out of three of the @Pac12 Player of the Week honors, taking offensive and special teams accolades.
- Of Demario Richard's 748 yards from scrimmage this season, 329 have come after first contact (44.0 percent/3.0 yards per play).
- Salamo Fiso and Jordan Simone are now ranked 2nd/3rd nationally and 1st/2nd in the Pac-12 at 7.8 and 7.4 solo tackles per game. #DynamicDuo
- D.J. Foster became just the fifth person in FBS history to reach 2,000 career yards rushing AND receiving against USC.
- ASU is one of just seven schools nationally with at least four players with 15 or more receptions this season. #SpreadingTheWealth
- ASU is 20-9 in Pac-12 games since 2012, one game ahead of UCLA's 19-10 mark in that same time span for the best Pac-12 South tally.
- The Sun Devils are 6-0 all-time against Colorado, the only team ASU is undefeated against in six or more contests.
- In past 2+ seasons, @FootballASU has compiled a 14-2 conference record following early @Pac12 losses (Game 1 in '13, Game 2 in '14, Game 1 in '15).

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

- » Wide receiver D.J. Foster extended his streak of at least one reception to 45 games against UCLA, the longest active streak in FBS and also John Jefferson's long-standing school record in the process.
- » With four receptions, Foster now has 189 in his career, and stands alone in second all-time at ASU. The ASU school record is 258 by Derek Hagan.
- » Demario Richard made it five games this season with 100+ all-purpose yards against UCLA with 134 total (79 rushing, 55 receiving). He is currently 17th nationally and second in the Pac-12 in averaging 149.60 all-purpose yards per game this season.
- » Salamo Fiso and Jordan Simone continue to be one-man wrecking crews, now ranked second and third nationally and first and second in the Pac-12 at 7.8 and 7.4 solo tackles per game.
- » The Sun Devils continue to dominate in tackles for loss, averaging 8.8 per game this season, good for ninth nationally and second in the Pac-12.
- » Coach Graham notched his eighth win over an AP ranked team in four seasons at ASU, including the second against a top-10 team (#8 Notre Dame in 2014).
- » The Devils have gone 8-5 in their past 13 games against ranked teams.

STRIKE FIRST

- » Arizona State has scored first in 32 of the 45 games with Todd Graham at the helm and is 26-6 in the Graham era when getting on the scoreboard first.
- » The Sun Devils are currently 3-0 when scoring first this season, doing so vs. Cal Poly, UNM and UCLA. ASU was 7-1 when scoring first last season.

STRIKE FAST

- » 184 of ASU's 251 offensive scoring drives under offensive coordinator Mike Norvell have come in three minutes or less (73.3 percent).
- » Of ASU's 22 scoring drives this season, 16 have come in under three minutes following five sub-minute drives out of six against UCLA.

GETTING STARTED ON THE RIGHT FOOT

- » The Sun Devils have outscored their opposition 406-214 in the first quarter under Todd Graham.
- » The Sun Devils are 21-1 under Graham when holding their opposition scoreless in the first quarter and are 3-0 this season when doing so.
- » The Sun Devils were 36th nationally against FBS teams in 2014 in giving up just 5.1 points per first quarter while being 31st with 8.0 points scored per first. ASU is giving up just 3.5 points per first quarter vs. FBS team this year.
- » ASU has posted an impressive 27-1 overall record under Graham when leading at halftime.

FOSTER THE PEOPLE

- » D.J. Foster has the seventh-most career receptions of all active FBS players with 189 and his 11 career receiving TDs were most among all active FBS running backs prior to his position switch.
- » Foster now has 4,326 career all-purpose yards (2,186 rushing, 2,063 receiving, 16 return) and finds himself ranked third among all active players in the category behind only SJSU's Tyler Ervin (4,647) and Louisiana Tech's Kenneth Dixon (4,646). That comes despite having just 16 career return yards - a category that is the bread and butter among many leaders in the all-purpose category.
- » With 62 receptions in 2014, Foster became just the third player in program history to log 60 or more receptions. He leads the team with 26 receptions this season and now has 189 in his career, a total that ranks him second all-time among Sun Devil receivers.

GO D.J., THAT'S MY D.J.

- » Foster is the only active FBS player who has accounted for over 2,000 career rushing yards (2,190) AND over 1,500 career receiving yards (2,120).
- » Foster became just the fifth player in NCAA history to reach 2,000+ rushing AND receiving yards against USC, joining Stanford's Darrin Nelson, Tulane's Mewelde Moore, Texas Tech's Taurean Henderson and Houston/West Virginia's Charles Sims. Should he reach 2,500 yards in both, he would be the first Division I player to accomplish the feat.
- » Foster has the nation's longest active streak of games with a reception at 45 and broke John Jefferson's (1974-77) long-standing school record. The Pac-12 record is 48 by USC's Kareem Kelly (99-02).

DON'T CROSS THAT LINE

- » Against UCLA, the Sun Devils forced 27 plays that did not earn positive yardage (18 incomplete passes, seven tackles for loss and 2 stops for no gain) out of 68 total plays (39.7 percent)
- » Under Graham, ASU has forced 1,153 plays that have not resulted in positive yardage out of 3,230 total plays (35.7 percent).

SERIOUSLY, DON'T CROSS IT

- » With 44 tackles for loss this season, ASU's 8.8 tackles per loss per game is ranked ninth in the nation and second in the Pac-12.
- » ASU's is also averaging 2.20 sacks per game this season, a total that ranks 45th nationally and third in the conference.
- » Entering the game against Colorado, ASU was first in the Pac-12 and second in the nation (Clemson) with an average of 8.02 TFL per game under Graham and one of two teams in the nation with more than 360 total tackles for loss (Clemson). They rank third in that time with 3.13



sacks per game (Stanford, Utah).

LIGHT' EM UP

- » ASU has scored 50 or more points 12 times since Todd Graham and Mike Norvell arrived in Tempe.
- » To put that in perspective, ASU eclipsed 50 points 10 times total in the previous 10 years before the current coaching regime (2001-11).
- » ASU went 86 games without scoring 60 from 2005-2011. Under Coach Graham it has scored 60 or more three times (63 NAU, 62 Navy, 62 USC).
- » The Sun Devils finished 10th nationally in 2013 at 39.7 points per game and scored 556 total points, just six points behind the 1972 school record.
- » ASU finished 2014 ranked 16th nationally in scoring offense, averaging 36.9 points per game.

SUPER DEMARIO

- » Demario Richard has eclipsed 100 all purpose yards in every game this season.
- » Richard now has 10 touchdowns in his past six games dating back to the Sun Bowl last season.
- » With 151 receiving yards and 104 rushing yards against UNM, Richard became just the fourth FBS player since 1996 to eclipse 150 receiving and 100 rushing yards in a game and is just the second player in Pac-12 history to do so.
- » Richard is currently 17th nationally and second in the Pac-12 in averaging 149.60 all-purpose yards per game.
- » Of Demario Richard's 748 yards from scrimmage this season, 329 have come after first contact (44.0 percent/3.0 yards per play).

BERC-ING FOR THE WEEKEND

- » With 13 touchdown passes in his first five career starts, Bercovici topped Rudy Carpenter's previous school record of 12

touchdowns in his first five starts.

- » Mike Bercovici's is responsible for 72 of ASU's 138 points this season (52.2 percent). He has nine passing touchdowns and three rushing touchdowns, making up eight of ASU's 17 total touchdowns this season.
- » Oddly enough, Bercovici has ASU's two longest touchdown rushes this season. His career-long 34-yard scamper against UCLA topped his previous team leading 19-yard rush in the season opener against Texas A&M.

LIKE MIKE

- » Mike Bercovici enters the weekend in the national top-30 in completions per game (15th/24.00), passing touchdowns (25th/9), passing yards (19th/1,344), passing yards per game (27th/268.8), points responsible for (17th/72) and points responsible for per game (29th/14.4).
- » Bercovici has shown his chops as far as being able to spread the ball around this season. In each of ASU's four games this season, a different player has led the team in total receiving yards (Jefferson/Lucien/Richard/Chambers/Foster).
- » ASU is one of just seven schools nationally with at least four players with at least 15 receptions this season, also a testament of ASU's ability to spread the ball.
- » Out of all the players on last year's team with a reception that weren't named Jaelen Strong or D.J. Foster, there were 137 total receptions made on the season. Bercovici, in his limited action, was responsible for 61 of those passes (44.5 percent).

TAKING OFFENSE

- » Entering the game against Colorado, ASU ranks second in the Pac-12 and tenth in the nation at 37.18 points per game (Baylor, Oregon, Ohio State, Marshall, Texas A&M, Florida State, Georgia, Alabama, Oklahoma State) in the Graham era.

- » ASU ranks second in the Pac-12 and 10th in the nation with 1,673 total points (Baylor, Oregon, Ohio State, Marshall, Florida State, Texas A&M, Alabama, Georgia, Northern Illinois) in that time.

MAKE 'EM PAY

- » Under Todd Graham, ASU has outscored opponents 427-205 in points off takeaways, though it uncharacteristically trails 55-10 this season.
- » The Sun Devils outscored the opposition 142-62 in points off turnovers in 2014, ranked fourth nationally behind only Louisiana Tech's 172, Nevada's 170 and Oregon's 164.
- » ASU scored 22 times following 27 total takeaways (81.5 percent) and scored touchdowns on 19 of those occasions (70.4).
- » In 2013, ASU outscored its opponents 146-42 on points off turnovers while posting a +15 takeaway number, putting points on the board following 75.8 percent of opponent turnovers (25-of-33) compared to just the 33.3 (6-of-18) percent clip ASU opponents scored off of Sun Devil turnovers.

A HAND IN THE COOKIE JAR

- » ASU finished with 27 takeaways in 2014 (2.1 per game) after having a streak of 29 consecutive games forcing a turnover come to an end in the season opener. The total was good for 24th nationally and third among Pac-12 schools.
- » ASU led the Pac-12 with 33 takeaways in 2013, finishing fifth nationally. The team was seventh nationally with a 1.1 turnover margin that season.
- » The Sun Devils have forced 97 turnovers under Todd Graham in the past four seasons, which the seventh-highest total in the country in that span.
- » ASU has 11 interception returns for touchdowns under Graham, compared to posting just four total in the previous three seasons prior to 2012. The total currently leads the nation in for the most interception returns for touchdown in that span and ASU has added three fumble returns in the span as well for a NCAA-leading total of 14 defensive touchdowns in the last four seasons.

TURNOVER FACTORY

- » Entering the week, ASU ranked second in the Pac-12 and sixth in the nation with a .71 average turnover margin per game (Oregon, Michigan State, Houston, Boise State, Louisville) since Graham took over the helm and was second in the Pac-12 and seventh in the nation with a plus-32 total turnover margin.
- » Also entering the Colorado tilt, ASU was first in the Pac-12 and sixth in the nation with an average of 1.36 interceptions per game (Houston,

TCU, Boise State, Louisville, Tulane) since 2012 and is tied for first in the Pac-12 and tied for fifth in the nation with 61 total interceptions.

GOLD ZONE

- » The Sun Devils have scored on 18 of its 23 trips to the red zone this season (78.2 percent) and have scored touchdowns on 13 of those.
- » In 2014, ASU scored on 58 of its 64 trips inside the red zone (90.6 percent), ranked 12th in the nation in conversion percentage. In 2013, ASU points on the board 91.3 percent of the time in the red zone against FBS opponents in 2013, finishing sixth nationally in the category.
- » In 2012, ASU scored on just 76.1 percent of their drives inside the 20 and ranked a lowly 93rd in the nation against FBS opponents.
- » In 2013 ASU allowed its FBS opponents to score 88.9 percent of the time when entering the red zone (ranked 106th nationally). In 2014, however, ASU held its opponents to 35 scores in 46 red zone appearances (76.1 percent) - good for 23rd nationally.
- » Opponents are currently 13-for-17 (76.8 percent) inside of the red zone against ASU this season, good for 32nd nationally and third in the Pac-12.

WINNING THE BATTLE FOR FIELD POSITION

- » Under Todd Graham, ASU has had an average starting yard line of its own 34.9 in 31 victories compared to a starting yard line of the 25.8 for their opponents in such contests.
- » ASU allowed just 11 drives to start inside its own territory in 2014, tied with Arizona for the fewest as far Pac-12 teams went. ASU has allowed seven such drives this season
- » Conversely, opponents have an average starting field position of their own 32.7 yard line compared to ASU starting at its own 28.2 in ASU's 14 losses under Graham.
- » In 2012, ASU posted an average starting spot of its own 33-yard line that ranked 10th in the nation, according to the folks at Football Outsiders (www.footballoutsiders.com) and in 2013, the team ranked 13th nationally (average starting yard line: 33.3). With a 32.6 average starting spot in 2014, ASU was 13th nationally.
- » The Sun Devils also held their opponents to an average starting line of their own 28-yard-line, a total that ranked 24th nationally in 2012 and was 32nd in 2013 (average opp. starting yardline: 28.2). ASU jumped to 11th nationally in 2014, forcing their opponents to an average field position of their own 26.9 yard line.

SEAL THE DEAL

- » ASU has outscored other teams 431-300 in the fourth quarter and overtime under Todd Graham.
- » The Sun Devils finished sixth nationally against FBS teams with 10.6 points



per fourth quarter in 2014.

- » ASU finished 10th in the nation in points per fourth quarter in 2013 against FBS opposition (9.9) after finishing the 2012 season with 9.3 points per fourth quarter, which was good for eighth nationally. ASU's 16.8 second-half points per game against FBS squads in 2013 was 24th nationally.

ROAD WARRIORS

- » The Sun Devils are winners of eight of the last 10 true road contests.
- » ASU has 12 wins in the past 19 road games, including 10 Pac-12 Conference road wins in the past 15.
- » Todd Graham has 10 Pac-12 road victories under his belt already, the second-most among all ASU coaches since 1980 behind only Bruce Snyder's 18 from 1992-2000.
- » Graham is 10-5 in Pac-12 road games at ASU, notable as the Devils were 5-13 in four seasons prior.
- » The Sun Devils have won their Los Angeles games in each of the last three seasons (UCLA in '13, USC in '14, UCLA in '15). Only once before in the Pac-12 era ('91-'93/USC/UCLA/UCLA) has ASU accomplished that.

T.N.T., WE'RE DYNAMITE

- » The Sun Devils have a classification of "explosive plays" that equal a run of 12 or more yards or a passing play of 16 or more yards. ASU had 10 such plays against UCLA and 43 this season (8.6 per game).
- » ASU is currently 23rd nationally in plays over 10 yards this season with 82 thus far.
- » ASU finished 24th nationally with 20 plays over 40 yards in 2014 after having just 16 total in 2013 and eight the year before. ASU was 26th nationally in plays of 20 or more yards with 71.
- » The Sun Devils finished 2013 tied for seventh in the nation in plays longer than 20 yards with 86 after having 72 in 2012, which was good for 19th in the country in the category.

BETTER SUITED FOR HANDKERCHIEFS

- » Despite some atypical penalties this season, the Sun Devils are still ranked in the top-20 in all the fewest penalty/fewest penalty yard per game categories: 5th in fewest penalties (18), 3rd in fewest penalties per game (3.6), 12th in fewest penalty yards (179) and 7th in fewest penalty yards per game (35.80)
- » The Sun Devils averaged just 4.5 penalties for 32.4 yards per game, ranked 16th in fewest penalties per game and fourth in fewest penalty yards per game in D-I in 2014. In 2013, the Sun Devils finished eighth in fewest penalties per game (4.00) and seventh in fewest penalty yards per game (31.4).
- » Entering the game against Colorado, ASU ranks first in the Pac-12 and

second in the nation with an average of 33.29 penalty yards per game (Navy) under Graham and ranks first in the Pac-12 and sixth in the nation with an average of 4.18 penalties per game (Navy, Air Force, Army, Ball State, Iowa).

MORE ON PENALTIES

- » Twenty-four of ASU's 28 least penalized games since 2006 have come under Todd Graham.
- » Since Todd Graham arrived at Arizona State, the Sun Devils have had just 187 penalties in 45 games (4.16 penalties per game).

PROTECT THIS HOUSE

- » ASU is now 18-5 at Sun Devil Stadium under Todd Graham though it has dropped its Pac-12 home opener in back-to-back seasons.
- » In 23 regular season home games under Todd Graham, the Sun Devils have averaged 41.8 points per game.
- » ASU has posted under 20 points in a regular home game just twice in Todd Graham's tenure - a 19-16 overtime victory over Utah in 2014 and a 42-14 loss to #19 USC in 2015.
- » The Sun Devils are 275-100-3 (.731) all-time at Sun Devil Stadium since 1958, the 24th-highest active winning percentage in a stadium among all FBS schools.

ON THE RISE

- » ASU is 20-9 in Pac-12 games since 2012, one game ahead of UCLA's 19-10 mark in that same time span for the best Pac-12 South tally.
- » ASU is 15-5 in Pac-12 games in the past two seasons, ahead of UCLA (13-7) and USC (13-7) for tops in the Pac-12 South.
- » ASU has finished first or second in each of the last three seasons in the final Pac-12 South standings.

USE THEM WISELY

- » Since the start of the 2012 season, ASU has used 52 timeouts on defense in third down situations, and have forced a turnover or not allowed a first down on the ensuing play on 36 of those occasions (69.2 percent).

RUNNING THE CLOCK -- OR NOT?

- » In 2013, ASU averaged 30:21 minutes of possession time per game - a total that ranked fourth in the conference and 51st nationally. The team had 13 scoring drives over four minutes in 2013, compared to just three in 2012.
- » In 2014, ASU averaged 28:42 minutes of possession per game - ranked 99th nationally and picked up five victories when trailing in time of possession, improving its Todd Graham era record in that category from 9-8 to 14-8.
- » ASU is, however, 15-6 when leading time of possession under Coach Graham - though it is 1-2 this season - and 15-9 overall when trailing in the category.

IN-ZANE IN THE MEMBRANE

- » Zane Gonzalez is currently fifth among active FBS players in averaging 9.3 points per game in his career. Navy's Keenan Reynolds leads all active players at 10.7 points per game.
- » Additionally, he is fourth among all active kickers with an average of 1.68 field goals made in his career, trailing only WVU's Josh Lambert (1.93)
- » Zane Gonzalez averaged 9.8 points per game in 2014, ranked 12th nationally and four among kickers while sitting first overall in the Pac-12.
- » His 81.5 percent field goal percentage on 22-of-27 kicking was 22nd nationally.
- » As a freshman, Gonzalez led the Pac-12 with 25 field goals and was named one of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Award, given annually to the nation's top kicker. He was a semifinalist award last season as well and named to the preseason watch list for 2015.

FG-GONZALEZ

- » Gonzalez finished with 138 points in 2013, breaking the long-standing school record in the category that was previous held by Wilford White's 136 in 1950.
- » Gonzalez's 138 points demolished the previous scoring record by an ASU kicker that was 118, set by Thomas Weber (2007) and Mike Barth (2002).
- » With 25 field goals in 2013, Gonzalez tied the NCAA freshman record of 25 that was set by UCLA's Kai Forbath in 2007 (25-30) that was four more field goals than any other player in the FBS in the process.
- » Gonzalez finished with 118 points in 2014, good for a tie for fourth all-time on ASU's single season scoring list.
- » Gonzalez has 52 field goals to his credit in his career, one of just four Sun Devil kickers to surpass 50 and currently third all-time at ASU.
- » With 288 career points, he is currently tied with all-time great Woody Green (288) for sixth on ASU's career record books.

TODD-BITS OF INFO

- » Over his four seasons prior to coming to ASU -- one at Pittsburgh and three at Tulsa -- Todd Graham's teams rushed the ball on at least 53.4 percent of their total plays. The 2012 Sun Devils rushed the ball on 59.1 percent of their total plays followed by a 55.2 percent tally in 2013 and a 52.1 percent in 2014. In 2011, ASU rushed just 44.5 percent of the time.
- » Over the past nine seasons at Pitt, Tulsa, Rice and now ASU, only one Graham-coached team has ranked outside the top 50 nationally in sacks. The Sun Devils averaged 4.0 sacks per game in 2012, the second-best mark in the nation, and then finished with 2.9 per game in 2013 and 3.0 per game in 2014 to finish 17th and 13th, respectively, in the country.
- » In nine seasons, Graham is 29-24 in true road games. ASU was 3-3 in such games in 2012, 3-2 in 2013 and 4-2 in 2014 (10-7 overall). In the previous four seasons prior to Graham's arrival, ASU was 5-16 in true road contests.
- » In eight of the past nine years, Graham's teams have ranked 39th or better nationally in fewest penalty yards per game. The Sun Devils averaged 34.92 penalty yards per game in 2012 (eighth nationally), 31.36 per game in 2013 (seventh nationally) and 32.38 per game in 2014 (fourth nationally).

HOLD ON TO YOUR SEATS

- » ASU played in four games in 2013 decided by seven points or less, going 3-1 in those contests. The total is notable as ASU was just 4-13 in the previous four seasons in games decided by less than a touchdown.
- » ASU was 3-1 in 2014 in games decided by less than a touchdown following the team's 36-31 Sun Bowl victory over Duke.
- » ASU has now gone 7-2 in games decided by a touchdown or less since the 2012 Arizona comeback in Tucson. To put that in perspective, ASU had gone 6-16 in such games since the 2007 season up until that Tucson game.

HOLD ON TO THAT BALL, ALSO

- » In 2014, the Sun Devils had six games where they did not turn the ball over and went 6-0 in those contests. That number is notable because in the previous two seasons, ASU had just five combined games where it did not turn the ball over.
- » ASU is now 10-1 under Todd Graham in games where it does not have a turnover.

TODD'S WINNING WAYS

- » Graham has won 31 games in his first four seasons at Arizona State, becoming just the third Sun Devil coach outside Frank Kush and Darryl Rogers to accomplish the feat by his fourth season.



- » He has become the only ASU head coach to reach a bowl game in each of his first three seasons at the school outside of John Cooper.
- » He has led ASU to three consecutive eight win seasons for the first time since 1971-73.
- » Of all the coaching hires made prior to the 2012 season, Graham has posted the fourth-best record at 31-14, ranking behind only Urban Meyer (42-3), Jim Mora (33-12) and Kevin Sumlin (33-11) in the last three seasons.

NOT WASTING TIME

- » In his first three seasons, Todd Graham found himself with an average of 9.33 wins per year at ASU, which ranks him number one all-time in ASU lore.
- » His 31 wins are tied for the sixth-most among coaches in program history while his .689 win percentage sits fourth all-time.
- » Graham became the third-quickest coach to reach 30 wins, doing so in 43 games (Frank Kush and Darryl Rogers each did so in 40).
- » As far as Bowl Games go, Graham has wasted no time establishing himself in the record books as his three appearances with the Sun Devils are already tied for third among all ASU coaches and his two wins are tied for second.

ELITE COMPANY

- » Head Coach Todd Graham had a school-record 28 wins in his first three seasons as head coach at ASU, one more than College Football Hall of Fame Coach Dan Devine (1955-57).
- » Coach Graham has recorded 10 wins in five of his nine seasons as a head coach (Tulsa 2007, 2008, 2010; ASU 2013, 2014.) Since 2007, Coach Graham currently sits tied for No. 4 nationally in most 10-win seasons with five at FBS institutions, ranking behind only Nick Saban, Bob Stoops and Chris Peterson.

DOUBLE THE DIGITS, DOUBLE THE FUN

- » In 2014, ASU secured back-to-back 10-win seasons for the first time since Frank Kush notched double-digit victories from 1970-73. That was drought of 31 years since it last happened, providing further evidence of how difficult an achievement back-to-back 10-win seasons are to come by.
- » Back-to-back 10-win seasons hadn't happened at Arizona State since 1970-73. But a quick look around the nation shows that only 12 schools have posted back-to-back 10 win-seasons the past two years. Here are the double-digit dozen.

TAKING DOWN THE TOP

- » ASU is currently 1-1 against teams ranked in the AP Top-25 Poll this season and in the middle of a gauntlet that could potentially have the Devils facing four Top 25 teams in five weeks (a loss to USC, a win at UCLA, on the road against current No. 5 Utah, and at home against a receiving vote Oregon team).
- » ASU was 3-2 in 2013 against team's ranked in the AP Top-25 Poll and the three victories were the most since 1997 when the team went 3-1 against teams ranked in the AP poll.
- » ASU's 2014 schedule put the team on a collision course with three consecutive AP Top-25 teams (UCLA, USC, Stanford), a streak that ASU had faced only twice in program history. The last that happened was 2001,

where ASU went 0-3 against No. 13 Washington, No. 8 Oregon and No. 11 Washington State. In 1994, ASU defeated No. 20 BYU in between losses to No. 23 Washington State and No. 21 Oregon.

- » ASU came out of the gauntlet with a 2-1 record with back-to-back victories over No. 16 USC and No. 23 Stanford. It was the first time ASU has won back-to-back games over ranked opponents since 1997, when it took down No. 25 Stanford on Oct. 18 before defeating No. 10 Washington State on Nov. 1 following a bye week.

SLAYING DRAGONS

- » The Sun Devils have gone 8-5 in the last 13 games against ranked teams.
- » In four seasons at the helm, Todd Graham is 8-8 against AP-ranked opponents and the team was 4-2 in such teams in 2014.
- » Graham has more than doubled Dennis Erickson (3) and Dirk Koetter (2) during their tenures.
- » In the previous 14 seasons, ASU was 5-40 in games against teams ranked in the AP poll. -- Other notable victories include the come-from-behind victory over Arizona in 2012, winning a game in the Coliseum last season for the first time since 1999 and defeating USC in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1996-97. ASU also ended a four-game losing streak to Stanford.

GOLD RUSH

- » Since the Coach Kush era, ASU has scored 20 or more rushing touchdowns in three or more consecutive seasons just one other time (1985-87) outside the current streak (23 in '11, 27 in '12, 36 in '13 and 20 in '14).
- » The current streak of four straight years with 20+ rushing touchdowns is the second longest streak in ASU history since 1960 behind only the seven straight Kush-led teams from 1967-73.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

- » The Sun Devils are in the midst of a four-game stretch where they are scheduled to play three (potentially four) teams currently ranked in the AP Top 25. The Sun Devil played then-No. 19 USC in Tempe followed that with a contest at then-No. 7 UCLA that will subsequently be followed by tilts against current No. 5 Utah next weekend and against Oregon (currently first among teams receiving votes the following weekend after that).
- » While the season is still young, ASU's scheduled is currently ranked as the third-toughest schedule in the NCAA with Sun Devil opponents (past and future) currently posting a 29-11 overall record (0.725). ASU's past opposition record is currently ranked second nationally with a 12-2 overall record (.857) while its future schedule is 26th nationally at 17-9 (.654)

DYNAMIC DUO

- » The defensive duo of Salamo Fiso and Jordan Simone has been a prominent 1-2 punch this season. Simone leads the team with 45 tackles with Fiso just behind him at 44.
- » Fiso is currently 19th nationally and leads the conference in averaging 1.7 tackles for loss per game and already has 8.5 through five games. Simone is second behind him with 6.0 TFL this season for a combined 14.5 tackles for loss between them
- » The two have done much of the work on their own as well. Fiso is second nationally and leads the Pac-12 with 7.8 solo tackles per game (and leads the nation with 39 total solo tackles) with all but five of his total tackles coming on his own. Simone is just behind him at third in the nation and second in the conference with 7.4 solo tackles per game.

HAACK LIKE A MAN

- » Matt Haack has been a game changer in the field position battle this season and his effort against UCLA was a testament to that. He pinned five balls inside the UCLA 20-yard line, none more important than his final one - a 46-yarder that skipped out of bounce at the Bruins 1-yard line that help ASU put the game away.
- » Haack was named the Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week for the effort and named the Ray Guy Award Punter of the Week as well.
- » Haack is averaging 43.6 yards per punt this season, good for second in the Pac-12 and 32nd nationally. He has eight punts of 50 or more yards out of 30 and has pinned 12 punts inside the 20.

Arizona State kicked a field goal before Allen connected with freshman Kirk on a short pass and he dashed 66 yards for a touchdown to make it 31-17. Kirk also returned a punt 79 yards for a TD in the second quarter.

Mike Bercovici threw for 199 yards and a touchdown for the Sun Devils.

It was the first-ever meeting between these teams and the loss dropped the Sun Devils to 0-7 against the Southeastern Conference.

Allen finished with 198 yards passing with two touchdowns and an interception. Murray threw for 49 yards with an interception and ran for 69 yards.

A&M's revamped defense under John Chavis, the former LSU coordinator, forced two turnovers, had nine sacks and 14 tackles for losses. It was the most sacks the Aggies have had since they had 10 against Texas Tech in 1995.

TEMPE, Ariz. -Sun Devil Football scored two touchdowns in the fourth quarter to emphasize its 35-21 home-opening win against Cal Poly Mustangs on Saturday at Sun Devil Stadium.

Arizona State took a 14-0 lead less than two minutes into the second quarter and quarterback Mike Bercovici tossed a pair of touchdowns in the final frame to push the Devils to a 14-point victory in front of the Double Inferno and reinvented Sun Devil Stadium.

Sophomore tailback Demario Richard tallied a career-high 121 rushing yards on 25 carries and scored a pair of touchdowns to pace the Sun Devils' 531 yards of total offense. Senior wide receiver D.J. Foster finished with 134 all-purpose yards, including 76 rushing and 58 receiving, and added a 14-yard touchdown catch in the opening quarter.

The Sun Devils defense held Cal Poly scoreless in the first and fourth quarters as four linebackers notched double-digit tackles, including sophomore linebacker Christian Sam, who co-led the Devils in tackles for the second consecutive game with 12 and added a team-high two sacks. Redshirt senior safety Jordan Simone also added 12 solo tackles, including three of them for a loss, and redshirt junior Laiu Moekiola set career highs with 11 tackles and three tackles for loss, respectively.

The Sun Devils offense began with a spark when Bercovici connected with Foster on a 15-yard pass for the first play of the game. The catch marked 42 consecutive games with at least one reception for Foster and brought him within two games of tying the school record set by Sun Devil legend John Jefferson's streak.

Bercovici spread the wealth among his receivers as he completed 23 of 35 passes for 283 yards and three touchdowns. ASU's aerial attack involved four Sun Devils with three or more catches, including seven by first-year Sun Devil Devin Lucien and six from Foster.

Mike Bercovici threw for three touchdowns and ran for another and the Sun Devils overcame a sluggish start to beat New Mexico 34-10 on Friday night.

PASADENA, Calif. (AP) Kalen Ballage ran the ball into the teeth of UCLA's defense in the final minute and refused to go down. One after another, his Arizona State teammates pushed and shoved him away from the Bruins and in for the clinching touchdown.

The Sun Devils knew they could only overcome their disappointing start to the season if they gave a boost to each other - and in Ballage's case, they really meant it.

Mike Bercovici passed for 273 yards and two touchdowns and ran for another score, and Arizona State got its season back on track with a 38-23 victory over No. 7 UCLA on Saturday night.

Tim White and D.J. Foster caught scoring passes for the Sun Devils (3-2, 1-1 Pac-12), who responded to their dire situation after two September losses with an inspired effort in their second straight win at the Rose Bowl.

Arizona State built a 29-10 lead on UCLA (4-1, 1-1) heading into the fourth quarter. Thomas Duarte caught his second touchdown pass from Josh Rosen with 9:19 left, trimming the Sun Devils' lead to 29-23 and getting the Rose Bowl rocking.

But after Matt Haack's exceptional punt and a defensive stand forced the Bruins to take a safety with 4:16 left, Ballage wrapped it up with a 23-yard TD run with 45 seconds to play, covering most of that distance with UCLA defenders hanging on him in what looked like a rugby scrum.

Prolific UCLA tailback Paul Perkins was held to 63 yards rushing and a fourth-quarter touchdown.

From the moment he was introduced as Arizona State University's head football coach on December 14, 2011, Todd Graham made it clear he was a visionary. A throwback. A teacher who truly believes in the virtues of hard work, dedication and giving back.

He made it clear he was going to infuse the program with a culture that was about winning in

all facets of a student-athlete's life. Graham referred to it simply as, 'The Sun Devil Way.'

"Our goal as a program is that we are going to first and foremost bring out the best in every single person's character that's involved in our program," Graham said. "I'm not only interested in winning on Saturday... I want to win every day in every way. We will compete in the classroom as we compete on the field.

"On the field we're going to be passionate and disciplined. Discipline is the key to winning football games. We're going to be involved in the community. The greatest joy that I've had in my life is to learn to be a giver... I want our players to understand that family and character and bringing out the best and being a giver, that's what I call unique character, is giving every day."

Graham, the 2013 Pac-12 Coach of the Year, enters his fourth season at the helm of the Arizona State University football program. Under his leadership, Sun Devil football has reached levels of success not seen in more than 30 years as last year's squad became the first to post back-to-back 10-win seasons since 1973. The accomplishment is the sum of many brilliant achievements orchestrated by Graham and his staff the last three seasons. With Graham at the helm entering the season...

- ASU's high-octane offense has eclipsed 50 points in 12 games and the Devils are second in the Pac-12 and seventh in the nation at 38 points per game during that stretch.
- ASU's attacking defense has outscored opponents 417-151 in points off takeaways. The Devils are second in the nation with a plus-35 turnover margin and rank in the top three in the nation in tackles for loss, sacks and interceptions. They are one of only four teams in the nation with more than 300 total tackles for loss, and their 130 sacks and 56 interceptions are both the second-highest totals among FBS teams.
- ASU has become one of the least penalized teams in the nation (third over the last three seasons in fewest penalty yards per game) and the most disciplined team in the Pac-12 (first in fewest penalties per game).
- ASU has earned three consecutive bowl bids and won the Pac-12 South in 2013.
- The Sun Devils are 16-4 at home under Graham and in the last two years have won seven of 10 games on the road.
- The Sun Devils have also reached new heights in the classroom. ASU's 12 Pac-12 All-Academic honorees in 2014 were the most in program history (26 in three years). In addition, 97 football student-athletes have earned Scholar Baller® recognition – which honors Sun Devil student-athletes who achieve a 3.0 GPA or higher – in his three seasons.

In 2014, Graham's Sun Devil squad posted a 10-3 record, including 6-3 in Pac-12 play, a second-place finish in the Pac-12 South Division and a 36-31 victory over Duke in the Sun Bowl. Tasked with replacing nine starters on defense, Graham led a unit that ranked near the top in the nation in sacks and tackles for loss, forced 27 turnovers and scored five touchdowns during the season.

On the other side of the ball, ASU finished the season ranked 16th in the nation in scoring offense and averaged more than 440 yards per game behind record-breaking quarterback and Pac-12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year Taylor Kelly, 1,000-yard rusher D.J. Foster and 1,000-yard receiver Jaelen Strong.

A total of 28 FBS schools hired coaches prior to the 2012 season, 17 of which remain at those schools. Of those coaches, Graham has posted the fourth-best overall record in his first three seasons behind only Urban Meyer (38-3), Jim Mora (29-11) and Kevin Sumlin (28-11).

In 2013 Graham's Sun Devils brushed aside the prognostications from skeptics who felt that an early-season string of games against Wisconsin, Stanford, USC and Notre Dame would be a little bit too much to overcome. Then, sitting with a 5-2 record after seven games and still very much in the race for the Pac-12 South crown, the Sun Devils would have their endurance and desire questioned again as they had to navigate their way through a stretch of three of their next four games on the road. In a gut-check, 20-19 win at Utah, the Sun Devils dug deep and proved they had the toughness and resilience to fight through any challenge that lay before them.

That belief would serve them well two weeks later in a winner-take-all showdown at No. 14 UCLA. At stake: a trip to the Pac-12 Championship game. There would be no hesitation to seize the moment as the Sun Devils ambushed the Bruins, jumping out to a 35-13 halftime lead. Despite its early dominance, ASU could not leave UCLA's Rose Bowl Stadium with a win until having to overcome yet another test.

A furious rally by the Bruins got them to within one score. Down 38-33 and with 3:21 remaining, the Bruins took over possession of the ball at their own 35. In a similar situation one year earlier, UCLA responded by taking the ball down the field for the game winning field goal. Despite Hollywood being only 15 miles away, the Sun Devil defense ensured there would be no sequel on this day as a pair of critical sacks forced the UCLA offense into submission. And just like that, the Sun Devils were champions of the Pac-12 South.

One week later ASU would keep possession of the Territorial Cup after blitzing Arizona 58-21. With the win the Sun Devils clinched a berth in the 2013 Pac-12 Championship Game.

ASU outscored its opponents 146-42 on points off turnovers while posting a +15 takeaway number in 2013. ASU put points on the board following 75.8 percent of opponent turnovers (25-of-33) compared to just the 33.3 (6-of-18) percent clip ASU opponents scored off of Sun Devil turnovers.

The duo of defensive tackle Will Sutton and linebacker Carl Bradford combined to give ASU the most dynamic defensive tandem in the country as the two combined for 24.5 sacks and 44.0 tackles for loss in 2012. Their collective average of 1.92 sacks per game was the highest in the country by two players on the same team since the 2006 season. Bradford racked up 40.5 tackles for loss in two years under Graham, tied for the fourth most by any player in the nation in that time.

Sutton became ASU's sixth winner of the Morris Trophy and the 18th consensus All-American and first since 2007. Sutton also became the fifth ASU player to win the Pac-10/12 conference Defensive Player of the Year award. After accomplishing all of that as a junior, Sutton returned for his senior season and repeated as the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year and Morris Trophy Winner while adding numerous All-American accolades.



Although the 2013 Sun Devils would come up short of their ultimate goal of getting to and winning the annual Rose Bowl Game, they proved they had the right people on board. And leading that ship a captain in Graham, who, surrounded by the best lieutenants in the land, would put them in position to get there again.

Graham was named the 2013 Pac-12 Coach of the Year and as he and his staff of talented assistants – all committed to winning, ‘The Sun Devil Way – guided the team through a turbulent schedule to post a 10-4 record and an 8-1 record to earn the program’s first Pac-12 Championship game berth.

“The honor says, ‘Coach of the Year,’ but it really should say ‘Team of the Year,’ because none of this would be possible without the work of our tireless coaching – I’m very blessed to have tremendous teachers, men of great character that do a tremendous job – and the trust of our kids to believe what we are teaching them is going to take us where we want to go,” said Graham.

In his first season at Arizona State, Graham guided the team to an 8-5 record as the program recorded its first winning regular season since going 10-2 in 2007. ASU ended the season with three straight wins for the first time since 1978 and just the 14th time in school history.

That season, ASU beat Arizona in a dramatic fourth-quarter comeback in Tucson to reclaim the Territorial Cup and went on to win a bowl game for the first time since 2005 and the 13th time in school history. Additionally, ASU was one of just four Pac-12 teams to win at least three conference road games (3-2) in 2012, doing so for just the fifth time in the program’s Pac-10/12 history.

While known for leading programs that have annually been among the nation’s leaders in offensive production, Graham gained national acclaim for his coaching prowess on the other side of the ball after leading defenses that helped West Virginia (2002) and Tulsa (2003) engineer two of the top single-season turnarounds in recent memory. With head-turning accomplishments like those it is easy to see why Graham believes that defense wins championships.

Employing an approach that emphasizes excellent fundamentals and hard and disciplined play, the Sun Devils’ extraordinary improvement on defense played a paramount role in the team’s rise improvement in 2012. After finishing at or near the bottom of the Pac-12 in several defensive categories in 2011, the Sun Devils experienced an amazing reversal in 2012 as they led the conference in tackles for loss (No. 1 in the nation), pass defense (No. 3 in the nation), and pass efficiency defense (No. 10 in the nation) and finished second in the league in sacks (No. 2 in the nation), interceptions (No. 4 in the nation) and total defense.

Graham was named the 23rd head football coach in program history on December 14, 2011, arriving in Tempe from the University of Pittsburgh.

Graham became well-known on the national scene following a four-year stint at Tulsa (2007-2010) where he led the Golden Hurricane to a 36-17 mark, which included three bowl wins and three seasons of 10-plus wins. Tulsa was one of just 11 schools to post back-to-back 10-win seasons in 2007 and 2008.

The native of Mesquite, Texas, had seasons at Tulsa which included records of 10-4 (2007), 11-3 (2008) and 10-3 (2010) and in his final season the Golden Hurricane won games at Notre Dame and then topped No. 24 Hawaii 62-35 in its own bowl game. The Notre Dame win was dubbed the biggest upset of the 2010 college football season by ESPN’s Kirk Herbstreit.

One distinguishing characteristic of Graham-coached teams has been their propensity for lighting up the scoreboard. On two occasions Tulsa led the nation in total offense (2007 at 543.9 yards per game and 2008 at 569.9 yards per game) and ranked fifth in 2010. His 2010 Tulsa team also led the nation in interceptions (24) and was third in turnovers gained (36). His 2007 squad not only led the nation in total offense at 543.9 yards per game, it set 29 school records, 15 conference marks and four NCAA records. Tulsa routed Bowling Green 63-7 in the GMAC Bowl, the largest bowl margin of victory in NCAA history.

His 2008 team again led the nation in total offense (569.9 yards per game) while ranking second in scoring (47.2 points per game), fifth in rushing (268 ypg) and ninth in passing (301.9 ypg). His team finished 11-3, capped by another large bowl win, a 45-13 victory over No. 22

Ball State in the GMAC Bowl.

Including ASU’s 62-28 win over Navy in the 2012 Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl, Graham’s offense has enabled three different teams (two at Tulsa) to score 60-plus points in a bowl game, making him the only coach to accomplish the feat multiple times.

Prior to taking the head job at Tulsa, Graham led Rice to its first bowl game in 45 seasons in 2006 and earned Conference USA Coach of the Year honors that same season.

Graham began his coaching career in 1988 as an assistant at Poteet High School/Middle School in Mesquite (1988-90) and then helped lead East Central University from a .500 program to NAIA national champions in his third year as he served as defensive coordinator from 1991-93. One year later he was at Carl Albert High School in Midwest City, Okla., and then spent time from 1995-2000 at Allen High School in Allen, Texas. While at Allen, north of Dallas, he also served as athletic director and led a program that had no district wins in the year prior to his arrival to five playoff berths in six seasons (1995-2000).

Graham was hired as the linebackers coach at West Virginia in 2001 and one year later he was promoted to defensive co-coordinator as the Mountaineers went from 3-8 to 9-4, the top turnaround in the country in 2002.

In 2003 Steve Kragthorpe hired Graham as the defensive coordinator at Tulsa. For the second time in as many years, a Graham-led defense proved instrumental in helping a program post the nation’s best turnaround as the Golden Hurricane went from 1-11 in 2002 to 8-5 in 2003. Graham’s defenses would help lead Tulsa to a pair of bowl games before he moved on to take over the head job at Rice.

Graham was an all-state defensive back at North Mesquite High School and, after graduating in 1983, he played for East Central University in Ada, Okla., where he was a two-time NAIA All-American defensive back.

Born Dec. 5 1964, Graham earned his bachelor’s and master’s degrees in education from East Central University. He and his wife, Penni, have six children: Bo, Natalie, Hank, Haylee, Dakota and Michael Todd Jr.
