In the final series meeting as Big 12 Conference members, Baylor (4-2, 1-1) travels to the Centennial State to face Colorado (3-2, 0-1) in Boulder. Kickoff is set for 6 p.m. CDT. The game will be televised nationally on FOX College Sports Central.

Baylor, 0-3 in its last three Big 12 games away from Waco, has scored 93 combined points in its last two conference games — the most by a Bears team in the Big 12 era. Baylor ranks third in the Big 12 in scoring defense (19.8 points/game) and has allowed only two touchdowns and five field goals in four victories this season.

QB **Robert Griffin III** continues his record-setting sophomore season after becoming the second Baylor QB to pass for 300+ yards in back-to-back Big 12 games. Griffin III leads the Big 12 and ranks fourth nationally in total offense (329.0 yards/game). The Copperas Cove, Texas, native is Baylor's career leader in completion percentage (62.3), passing efficiency, touchdown responsibility and TD-INT ratio. With the return of Griffin III, Baylor's scoring has increased from 20.8 points per game in 2009 to 33.5 through six games in 2010.

Colorado (3-2, 0-1) dropped its Big 12 opener last weekend at Missouri, 26-0. The Buffaloes have scored 30+ points only once this season, while BU has reached the 30-point plateau in five of their six games.

Baylor's receiving trio of IR **Kendall Wright**, WR **Terrance Williams** and WR **Josh Gordon** have combined for 73 receptions, 1,135 yards and 11 receiving TDs. Colorado's receivers have combined for 966 yards on 96 catches with five TDs.

All Baylor football games are broadcast live on the Baylor/ISP Sports Radio Network; Waco's 1660 ESPN Radio is the network's flagship station. Live streaming audio and GameTracker also are available for all Baylor football games online at www.BaylorBears.com, the official website of Baylor Athletics and a member of the CBS College Sports network.

BAYLOR-COLORADO SERIES

Saturday marks the last series meeting between the schools as Big 12 Conference members. Colorado leads the all-times series 9-6, while holding a 5-3 advantage in Boulder. In the last trip to Boulder, the Bears won a three-overtime thriller, 34-31. The road team has won three of the last five meetings.

SERIES NOTES: Baylor is 1-2 in Boulder in the Big 12 era and 5-5 all-time in the state of Colorado ... The winning team has scored 34+ points in each of the last five meetings ... Colorado's 54-yard FG to end first half in 2007 meeting was the longest against Baylor since SMU's John Stewart's 55-yard in 1993.

YES, THERE ARE TWO ROBERT GRIFFINS

For the last two seasons, there was only one **Robert Griffin** on the Baylor football team — QB **Robert Griffin III**. This season, there are two Robert Griffins — RG3 and **Robert T. Griffin** (no relation). RTG, a right guard, enrolled at Baylor in January 2010, transferring from Navarro Junior College. Griffin III has started all six games at QB, while RTG has four starts to his credit.

QUICK NOTES

- Baylor is 3-5 all-time in Boulder and 5-5 in the state of Colorado.
- Baylor is 44-87-2 all-time in televised games.
- Baylor's 93 combined points in consecutive conference games are the most by a Bears team in the Big 12 era.
- BU has allowed only two TDs and five FGs in its four wins, holding opponents to a 7.3 points-per-game average.
- Baylor ranks second in the Big 12 in sacks against (1.00) and third in scoring defense (19.8 points/game).
- Baylor ranks second in the Big 12 in passing efficiency (154.4), third in total offense (476.7 yards/game) and third in passing offense (312.7).
- Baylor ranks seventh nationally in passing offense (312.67) and 12th in total offense (476.67).
- Baylor is 17-for-21 in redzone opportunities this season — nine TDs, eight FGs.
- Baylor trails in average time of possession — 31:03 to 28:57 — through six games.
- Baylor opponents are averaging just 6.0 second-half points through six games (13.8 points in first half).
- Baylor boasts six graduates on its 2010 active roster — that number is tied for 12th in FBS.
- 17 different players have caught passes through Baylor's first six games in 2010, including LB **Antonio Johnson** and QB **Robert Griffin III**.
- Six different Baylor receivers have caught TD passes, including three tight ends.
- Six true freshmen have played this season (not as many as last year's 10 true and 15 redshirt freshmen that saw action): **Ahmad Dixon**, **Sam Holl**, **Dominique Jones**, **Prince Kent**, **Tevin Reese** and **Tyler Stephenson**.
- QB **Robert Griffin III** has tossed 11 40-yard passes (eight for TDs), including six 50-yard passes (five TDs).
- **Griffin III's** 94-yard pass play to WR **Josh Gordon** vs. Kansas on Oct. 2 was the longest offensive play in school history and equaled the sixth-longest in Big 12 history and the longest pass thrown by a Big 12 sophomore QB (breaking previous mark of 93 yards set by Texas A&M's Mark Farris in 2000).
- **Griffin III** ranks fourth nationally in total offense and 22nd in passing efficiency.
- **Griffin III** ranks first in the Big 12 in total offense (329.0 yards/game), second in passing efficiency (154.5) and fifth in passing yards (289.2 yards/game).
- **Griffin III** is Baylor's career leader in touchdown responsibility (passing and rushing) with 53 TDs, rushing TDs by a QB with 21, passer rating (minimum 300 attempts) with 146.80 and a 6.40 TD-INT ratio (minimum 15 TDs).
- **Griffin III** is 10-10 in 20 career starts as Baylor quarterback.
- **Griffin III** has thrown for 300+ yards in two consecutive games.
- **Griffin III** is responsible for 19 of Baylor's 24 touchdowns in 2010 (13 pass, six rush).
- **Griffin III** is the current Baylor career leader with a 62.3 completion percentage (minimum 250 attempts).
- **Griffin III** ranks seventh all-time in Baylor history with 4,307 career passing yards — 34 yards shy of tying **Neal Jeffrey (4,341)** for sixth on Baylor's career list.
- TB **Jay Finley** ranks ninth in Baylor history with 1,746 career rushing yards.
- P **Derek Epperson** ranks fourth all-time in Baylor history with 45 career punts of 50+ yards.
- S **Byron Landor** is seventh in the Big 12 with 8.8 tackles per game.
- DE **Tevin Elliott** is third in the Big 12 in sacks (0.83/game) and fourth in TFLs (1.17/game).
- KR **Mikail Baker** is Baylor's career leader in kick returns (68) and kick return yards (1,688).
- PK **Aaron Jones** is tied for seventh nationally in FGs per game (1.83) and 25th nationally in scoring (9.50 ppg).
- **Jones** has made more FGs (11) through five games than Baylor made as a team all of 2009 (nine).
- **Jones** has kicked a FG in all six career games played.
- TE **Jerod Monk** and IR **Kendall Wright** have recorded a TD via run, pass and reception in their careers.
- **Wright (5)** and **Gordon (5)** have combined for 10 of Baylor's 16 pass plays of 30+ yards.
- **Wright** ranks fifth in career receptions (149), seventh in career receiving yards (1,838) and eighth in receiving TDs (12) at Baylor.
- **Wright** has a catch in each game of his career (30 games).
- **Wright** has five career receptions of at least 50 yards.
- **Wright** has three of Baylor's five 100-yard receiving games this season.
- **Wright** is tied for 10th nationally among FBS receivers with a reception in 30 consecutive games.

LAST TIME VS. COLORADO

COLORADO 43, BAYLOR 23

OCT. 6, 2007 • FLOYD CASEY STADIUM • WACO, TEXAS

Blake Szymanski's third 400-yard passing effort of the season was not enough to lead Baylor to victory as the Bears fell to Colorado 43-23.

Baylor out-gained Colorado 465-450, but much of the Bears' offense came in the second half when the game was nearly out of reach. Szymanski finished 36-of-60 for 410 yards and a touchdown with two picks, establishing Baylor records for completions and attempts.

Colorado marched 82 yards on seven plays. The drive was keyed by a 27-yard pass on third-and-seven that followed a Colorado delay of game and a timeout on the game's third play from scrimmage. Cody Hawkins' 26-yard touchdown pass to Dusty Sprague capped the drive.

The Buffaloes got a 41-yard Kevin Eberhart field goal late in the first. Colorado pushed its lead to 17-0 with 11:43 remaining in the second quarter when Hawkins connected with Demetrius Sumler from seven yards out.

Baylor finally got on the board at the 7:29 mark of the second on Shea Brewster's 26-yard field goal. After a Sumler 3-yard touchdown run pushed Colorado's lead to 24-3, Brandon Whitaker found the end zone on a 2-yard run with 4:04 remaining before the half but the Bears missed the extra point. Two late Eberhart field goals pushed the Buffs' lead to 30-9, including a 54-yarder at the gun.

Eberhart's 42-yard field goal early in the third and Sumler's 2-yard touchdown run with 6:08 remaining in the period gave CU a commanding 40-9 lead.

Szymanski connected with Justin Akers for an 18-yard touchdown pass late in the third, and Jay Finley added a 4-yard touchdown run with 5:04 remaining in the game. Eberhart's fifth field goal of the night — a 30-yarder — was sandwiched between the two Baylor scores.

Whitaker finished the night with 11 receptions for 166 yards, both career highs and both single-game Baylor records for a non-receiver. His receptions total tied for the fifth-best single-game total in school history and was one shy of the overall Baylor record.

David Gettis added 225 all-purpose yards, Baylor's best single-game total since Jerod Douglas' school-record, 257-yard performance at Oklahoma in 1997.

TELEVISION COVERAGE

Saturday's game at Colorado will be televised live nationally on FOX College Sports (FCS) Central. The Colorado contest will be Baylor's sixth televised game of the season. Drew Goodman (play-by-play), Yogi Roth (analyst) and Samantha Steele (sideline reporter) will serve as the on-air talent for the FCS telecast.

ART BRILES

HEAD COACH
THIRD SEASON



The 2010 season marks year three of the Art Briles era at Baylor, and hopes are high in Central Texas that a solid foundation is being laid to foster successful football teams for years to come.

Briles assumed Baylor's head coaching post Nov. 28, 2007, ushering in a new era and a new attitude to the storied Bears football program. From his first game on the sidelines in Waco it was quickly evident that the Briles regime was underway at Baylor; from the innovative offense, to the reintroduction of a solid running game, to competitive games and no acceptance of moral victories.

Nowhere is Baylor's steady improvement under Briles more evident than in the back-to-back recruiting classes his staff put together in 2009 and 2010 — the school's highest-ranked signing classes in the Big 12 era. The 2010 signing class was ranked 39th nationally by *Rivals.com* including a defensive backfield rated fifth nationally.

After a promising start, the 2009 season suffered injury setbacks in the season's first month, including the season-ending loss of superstar quarterback and face-of-the-program Robert Griffin III in the third game (all told, eight different starters missed games in 2009 due to injury). The Bears remained competitive, but a season that began with a road win over ACC power Wake Forest and the team receiving votes in the AP Top 25 poll ended with a 4-8 record. The Bears notched a second impressive road victory in 2009, upsetting defending Big 12 North champion Missouri, 40-32, in Columbia.

Briles' 2008 Bears squad finished with a 4-8 record, but six of eight defeats were at the hands of ranked opponents (four in top 10) and three losses came by a touchdown or less.

Highlights of Briles' first season at Baylor included the emergence of sensational true freshman quarterback Griffin, the Big 12's top newcomer and freshman All-American, a rushing attack that ranked 21st nationally and third in the Big 12 with 195.8 yards per game (2,349 yards, most since 1981) and 29 touchdowns, and a memorable 41-21 home win over Texas A&M.

Baylor's 1.33 turnover margin ranked fourth nationally and linebacker Joe Pawelek ranked seventh nationally in tackles (10.7) and interceptions (.50).

Briles is a proven developer of professional talent, evidenced over the last four NFL drafts where his protégés include the second center selected in 2010 (80th pick J.D. Walton of Baylor), the first lineman selected in 2009 (second overall pick Jason Smith from Baylor), the first receiver selected in 2008 (33rd pick Donnie Avery of Houston) and the third quarterback selected in 2007 (36th pick Kevin Kolb of Houston).

A native of West Texas, Briles became Baylor's 25th head football coach after resurrecting the University of Houston's football program in a five year stretch from 2003 to 2007.

A former wide receiver for the Cougars from 1974 to 1977, Briles was a member of the 1976 Cougar squad that captured the Southwest Conference championship in UH's first season in the league. He later played in the 1977 Cotton Bowl against fifth-ranked Maryland, a game the Cougars won 30-21.

He received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Texas Tech in 1979 and a Masters of Education degree from Abilene Christian in 1984.

A Big Country Athletic Hall of Fame inductee for his West Texas exploits, Briles and his wife, Jan, have three children: Jancy, a UH graduate who works in the Dallas Cowboys Public Relations office; Kendal, a UH graduate and Baylor assistant coach; and Staley, a UH graduate; as well as one grandson, Jaytn Briles. Briles was inducted into the Texas High School Football Hall of Fame in April 2008.

A HALF OF DIFFERENCE

Baylor is averaging 21.0 first-half points as compared to 12.5 second-half points through six games in 2010. Conversely, Baylor opponents are averaging 13.8 points in the first half and 6.0 in the second half. Baylor is outscoring the opposition in all four quarters.

BACK-TO-BACK 300s

In the first 19 games to open his career, sophomore QB **Robert Griffin III** had never thrown for 300+ yards. In the last two games, Griffin III has thrown for the seventh- and eighth-highest single-game passing yards in school history. After throwing for 380 yards in Baylor's 55-7 win over Kansas on Oct. 2, Griffin III threw for a career-high 384 yards in the Bears' 45-38 loss to Texas Tech on Oct. 9.

AN ACCURATE RG3

Sophomore QB **Robert Griffin III** has completed 73.1 percent of his passes (57-of-78) in two Big 12 games this season, while throwing for 764 yards and a 176.5 passing efficiency. In the eight Big 12 games during his 2008 freshman campaign, Griffin III completed 59.8 percent of his passes (113-of-189) with a 129.9 passing efficiency.

PASSING HIS WAY THROUGH BAYLOR'S RECORD BOOKS

Robert Griffin III ranks seventh all-time in Baylor history with 4,307 career passing yards — 34 yards shy of tying **Neal Jeffrey (4,341)** for sixth on Baylor's career list. Griffin III is 693 yards shy of becoming only the sixth 5,000-yard passer in school history.

Griffin III enters the Colorado game as Baylor's career leader in passing efficiency (146.8), completion percentage (62.3) and touchdown responsibility (53). As it stands now, his 64.4 completion percentage and 154.46 passing efficiency through six games would set single-season school records.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

With the return of sophomore QB **Robert Griffin III**, Baylor's offensive numbers have improved drastically through six games of 2010 as compared to the 2009 season. Griffin III has thrown as many touchdowns (13) in 2010 as Baylor threw as a team in 2009.

Baylor is averaging 476.7 yards of total offense in 2010 — 131.8 more yards-per-game than the Bears accumulated in 2009 (342.9). The Bears are averaging 312.7 yards passing and 164.0 yards rushing through six games in 2010 (242.3 passing and 100.6 rushing in 2009).

'STORK' HAS ARRIVED

Redshirt freshman PK **Aaron Jones**, nicknamed 'Stork' by coach **Art Briles**, is 11-of-13 on FG attempts, including 9-of-10 from 30+ yards. Through six games, Jones has made more FGs (11) than Baylor did as a team during the entire 2009 season (9-of-14).

Jones' 11 FGs are tied for 10th-most on Baylor's single-season list and are the most by a Baylor kicker since **Ryan Havens** drilled 11 FGs in 2006.

BIG PLAY ROB

QB **Robert Griffin III** has accounted for 16 plays of 30+ yards in 2010, including 11 for touchdowns (10 pass, one run). In addition, Griffin III has tossed six passes of 50+ yards with five going for touchdowns and 11 passes of 40+ yards. Five different receivers have caught a 40+ yard TD pass from Griffin III this season.

SACK MACHINE

Redshirt freshman DE **Tevin Elliott** has recorded 5.0 sacks through the first six games of 2010, the most by a Baylor defender since **John Garrett (10.0)** in 2003. With his next sack, Elliott will move into a tie for eighth place on Baylor's single-season sacks list, joining **Robert Watters (1986)**, **James Francis (1989)**, **Darrin Franklin (1989)** and **A.C. Collier (2001)**.

BEARS TALLY RECORD-SETTING WIN IN BIG 12 OPENER

Several school records were broken during Baylor's 55-7 record-setting win over Kansas in the Big 12 Conference opener for both schools on Oct. 2. Below is a list of school records broken:

- Baylor established a school record with 678 yards of total offense;
- Baylor established a school record with 434 passing yards;
- Baylor's 55 points were the most in a Big 12 Conference game;
- The 48-point margin of victory was Baylor's largest in a conference game;
- **Robert Griffin III's** 94-yard TD pass to **Josh Gordon** was the longest offensive play from scrimmage in school history.
- **Griffin III** established a school record with 444 yards of total offense.
- **Griffin III** became Baylor's career leader in rushing touchdowns by a QB with 19.

YOUTH IN NUMBERS

Six true freshmen and 14 redshirt freshmen have played through six games in 2010. In comparison, a total of 25 true and redshirt freshmen saw action in the entire 2009 season. Additionally, 22 total sophomores have played this season. All told, 42 of the 75 players who have played this season for Baylor are either freshmen or sophomores (15 juniors, 18 seniors).

WRIGHT'S STREAK HITS 30

With a career-high-tying 11 receptions in Baylor's 45-38 loss to Texas Tech on Oct. 9, junior IR **Kendall Wright** has now recorded a reception in all 30 games of his career. Wright's streak of 30 consecutive games with at least one reception ranks 10th nationally among Football Bowl Subdivision players. His streak is the second-longest active streak by a Big 12 player with Oklahoma's Ryan Broyles (30). Colorado's Scotty McKnight leads the nation with 42 consecutive games with a reception.

GRIFFIN III HAS EYES ON THE END ZONE

Not only does sophomore QB **Robert Griffin III** currently own the Baylor career marks for passing efficiency, touchdown-interception ratio and touchdown responsibility (53), he is also climbing two other career TD charts. Griffin III is tied for second in school history in passing touchdowns with 32. RG3 needs six more TDs to tie and seven to overtake **Shawn Bell (38)** for the Baylor school record.

Griffin III ranks fourth in career rushing touchdowns with 21 — the most by a Baylor QB. Griffin III needs three more to tie and four to overtake former Pittsburgh Steelers RB **Walter Abercrombie (24)**.

EPPELSON PUNTING HIS WAY UP BAYLOR CAREER CHARTS

Baylor senior P **Derek Epperson** ranks in the top six of all five major career punting categories at Baylor. Epperson ranks third all-time with a 42.69 yards-per-punt average behind only **Buzzy Sawyer (43.44)** and **Daniel Sepulveda (45.24)**. Epperson ranks fourth all-time in Baylor history with 45 career punts of 50+ yards and needs three more to overtake **Ron Stowe (47)** for second place.

Epperson is one of only five punters in Baylor history with more than 8,000 career punting yards; he ranks fifth all-time with 8,409 yards. He also ranks fifth in both total punts (197) and sixth in punts of 60+ yards (five).

WRIGHT CLIMBING BAYLOR RECEIVER CHARTS

IR **Kendall Wright** is quickly climbing Baylor's career charts for receptions and receiving yards. Wright is fifth on Baylor's career list with 149 career receptions. He needs 35 more catches to become Baylor's all-time leader in career receptions. Last season, Wright became the first Baylor player with 100 career receptions by the end of his sophomore season.

Wright ranks seventh in Baylor history with 1,838 receiving yards; he trails San Francisco WR **Dominique Zeigler (1,923)** by 85 yards for sixth place. Against Buffalo on Sept. 11, he became only the eighth 1,500-yard receiver in Baylor history.

TRIPLE THREATS

Second-year sophomore TE **Jerod Monk**, a former high school QB, recorded his career-first receiving TD Sept. 25 at Rice — a 6-yard pass from **Robert Griffin III**. With that score, Monk has recorded a TD via rush (1-yard keeper vs. Kent State, 10/3/09), pass (3-yard pass to **Justin Akers** at Iowa State, 10/17/09) and reception (6-yard catch at Rice, 9/25/10).

Monk is joined by IR **Kendall Wright**, who threw his career-first TD pass Oct. 2 vs. Kansas. For his career, Wright has caught 12 TD passes, while rushing for two more.

TIGHT ENDS INCLUDED

In 2009, Baylor's tight ends **Brad Taylor** and **Justin Akers** combined to make nine receptions for 72 yards without a TD. Through six games in 2010, Baylor's tight end trio of Taylor, **Jerod Monk** and **Willie Jefferson** have combined for 161 receiving yards on 11 catches and three touchdowns. As a junior TE in 2008, Akers had eight catches for 118 yards and two TDs.

SPREADING THE BALL AROUND

With career-first receptions by senior LB **Antonio Johnson** and sophomore QB **Robert Griffin III** last week vs. Texas Tech, 17 different Baylor players have recorded a reception through the first six games of the 2010 season.

Johnson registered a 34-yard reception from QB **Brody Trahan** on a fake punt, while Griffin III caught a nine-yard pass from IR **Kendall Wright**. Baylor QBs Griffin III and **Nick Florence** have also completed passes to 15 different receivers, including 12 in the Bears' 34-3 season-opening win against Sam Houston State.

Six different receivers have registered a TD reception in 2010 — **Kendall Wright** (two), **Josh Gordon** (four), **Terrance Williams** (three), **Brad Taylor**, **Willie Jefferson** and **Jerod Monk**.

In total, seven players have recorded their career-first receptions in that span — sophomore QB **Robert Griffin III**, senior LB **Antonio Johnson**, true freshman IR **Tevin Reese**, sophomore TE **Jerod Monk**, junior FB **Kaeron Johnson**, redshirt freshman FB **Erik Wolfe** and sophomore IR **Michael Valdez**.

FINLEY, RG3 RUSHING UP BAYLOR CAREER YARDAGE LIST

Baylor's 1-2 backfield punch of senior TB **Jay Finley** and sophomore QB **Robert Griffin III** have racked up 2,905 career rushing yards. Finley has 1,746 career rushing yards, the ninth-best career total in Baylor history. He needs 254 yards to become just the seventh 2,000-yard rusher in Baylor history.

During Baylor's 34-6 win over Buffalo on Sept. 11, Griffin III became the 29th 1,000-yard rusher — and first 1,000-yard rushing QB — in school history. Griffin III ranks 28th all-time with 1,159 career yards. He needs 341 yards to become the 16th 1,500-yard rusher in school history.

HALFTIME TRENDS

The Bears have lost 27 of their last 28 games when trailing at halftime (the lone win was 40-32 victory at Missouri in 2009 after trailing 27-16 at half) dating to 2006. Conversely, the Bears have won 11 of their last 14 games when leading at halftime. The lone losses in that time were at Texas Tech (2008), Nebraska (2009) and vs. Texas Tech (2009).

30 POINTS KEY FOR THE BEARS

Since 2001, Baylor is 26-3 (.897) when scoring at least 30 points and 10-71 (.125) when scoring less than 30 points. The losses in that span when scoring 30 points were at Texas in 2006 (63-31), at Oklahoma in 2005 (37-30 in double overtime) and vs. Texas Tech in 2010 (45-38).

Prior to Baylor's 45-38 loss to Texas Tech in last Saturday's Texas Farm Bureau Insurance Shootout, the Bears had won 15 consecutive games when reaching the 30-point plateau. It was Baylor's first loss when scoring 30+ points since a 63-31 setback at Texas in 2006.

Conversely, the Bears have lost 30 of their last 31 when not reaching the 30-point plateau. The lone victory in that stretch was a 24-21 win at Wake Forest in the 2009 season opener.

SEVERAL GRADUATES ON BAYLOR ROSTER

Baylor's roster boasts six student-athletes who have earned their undergraduate degrees. The six graduate players are seniors **Tim Atchison** (FS), **Mikail Baker** (DB/KR), **Chris Buford** (DT), **Derek Epperson** (P), **Jay Finley** (RB) and **Brad Taylor** (TE). An additional four student-athletes are on pace to graduate in December; the quartet includes seniors **Antareis Bryan** (CB) and **Phil Taylor** (DT), junior **Terrance Ganaway** (RB) and sophomore **Robert Griffin III** (QB).

Baylor is tied for third among Big 12 schools and is tied for 12th nationally among Division I FBS programs with six graduates on its active roster.

EPPELSON A SEMIFINALIST FOR 'ACADEMIC HEISMAN'

Baylor senior P **Derek Epperson** has been selected as one of 115 semifinalists for the William V. Campbell Trophy, The National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame. Epperson, a native of Southlake, Texas, is one of 47 semifinalists representing the Football Bowl Subdivision and one of only six from the Big 12 Conference.

The Campbell Trophy is in its 21st year honoring college football's top scholar-athlete. Candidates must be seniors or graduate students in their final years of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2, have outstanding football ability, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship.

The NFF Awards Committee will announce up to 15 finalists Oct. 28. Each finalist will be recognized as part of the 2010 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class, receiving an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship. The winner will be announced at the NFF's Annual Awards Dinner Dec. 7 at the Waldorf Astoria in New York City.

Linebacker **Joe Pawelek** was honored as a finalist for the Campbell Trophy (considered by many to be the "Academic Heisman") in 2009. It was the first time a Baylor student-athlete earned a post-graduate scholarship from the NFF since **Don Trull** became the first in 1963.

BLAKE NO. 1 ON 2011 CFL DRAFT PROSPECT LIST

Baylor junior C **Philip Blake** is projected as the No. 1 prospect for the 2010 Canadian Football League Draft, according to the CFL's Scouting Bureau. Blake, a native of Toronto, Ontario, is one of two Canadians on Baylor's starting offensive line, joining fellow countryman **Danny Watkins**.

WATKINS SELECTED NO. 4 OVERALL IN 2010 CFL DRAFT

Baylor senior offensive tackle **Danny Watkins** was selected fourth overall in May's Canadian Football League (CFL) Canadian Draft by the British Columbia Lions. The native of Kelowna, B.C., opted to return to Baylor, anchoring the Bears' line in 2010 and is projected to be drafted in the 2011 NFL Draft.

Watkins started all 12 games for Baylor at left tackle in 2009 in just his third season playing football. The native Canadian grew up playing hockey and rugby and was a firefighter before trying his hand at football at Butte College in California in 2007. The 6-4, 310 pound Watkins took over Baylor's starting left tackle position vacated by 2009 No. 2 NFL draftee **Jason Smith**.

BAYLOR ISP SPORTS NETWORK

The "Voice of the Bears," **John Morris** (Baylor, 1980) enters his 24th year broadcasting Baylor football and men's basketball in 2010-11. Morris, who has broadcast 251 consecutive Baylor football games entering the 2010 season, will broadcast his 260th consecutive game Oct. 20 when the Bears travel to Texas.

A Kentucky native, Morris also produces the daily "State Farm Baylor SportsBeat," daily Big 12 reports and co-hosts the award-winning "Inside Baylor Sports" television show. Morris also hosts the "Raising Canes Baylor SportsBeat" (weekdays at 7:20 a.m. and 5:20 p.m.), the "State Farm Baylor Hour" January through May and a daily 60-minute program, "The John Morris Show," on Waco's 1660 ESPN Radio. This is Morris' 15th year as signature voice of Baylor athletics since succeeding the legendary Frank Fallon. In November 2002, he was presented the Frank Fallon Sportsmanship Award by the Greater Waco Chamber of Commerce.

Three-time Academic All-American **J.J. Joe** returns for his seventh season as color analyst. The Bears' leading passer for four consecutive seasons from 1990-1993, Joe graduated as Baylor's career passing and total offense leader and is one of the school's most decorated student-athletes as a three-time Academic All-American. He was inducted into the Baylor Athletic Hall of Fame in 2006.

Ricky Thompson returns for his 11th season providing sideline color and analysis. Thompson is a former SWC long jump champion and was the Bears' leading receiver in 1975 before embarking on a seven-year NFL career. He also is a member of the Baylor Athletic Hall of Fame.

Baylor's radio team also includes the multi-talented **Craig Harper**, who, in his 24th year as a member of the crew, serves as executive producer of the football broadcasts.

GRIFFIN III ON TRIO OF WATCH LISTS

Entering the 2010 season, Baylor sophomore QB **Robert Griffin III** is listed on three different award watch lists for the Maxwell Award, Davey O'Brien Award and Manning Award. In July, he was listed among 30 quarterbacks on the watch list for the Davey O'Brien Award, which is presented annually to the best college quarterback by the Davey O'Brien Foundation.

In August, Griffin III was added to the watch lists for the Maxwell and Manning Awards. The Maxwell Award has been presented to the nation's most outstanding college football player since 1937.

EPPERSON NOMINATED FOR 2010 LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Baylor senior punter **Derek Epperson** is one of 30 NCAA football bowl subdivision student-athletes selected as a candidate for the 2010 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award in football.

Epperson, a Southlake, Texas native, is one of nine candidates on the list with a cumulative grade point average of 3.5 or better. Just three years after enrolling at Baylor, Epperson graduated with a double major in management and management information systems in August. He is one of six student-athletes on the 2010 Baylor football team with an undergraduate degree.

A four-time member of the Dean's List, Epperson has also racked up quite a few awards on the field. He earned honorable mention All-America honors and was a consensus All-Big 12 pick after punting for a 44.8-yard average during the 2009 season. Additionally, Epperson has been named to the Ray Guy Award watch list in each of the last two seasons, including selection as a semifinalist in 2008. In his first season at Baylor, he earned freshman All-American honors in 2007.

The candidate pool will be narrowed to 10 finalists midway through the regular season.

WATKINS ON LOMBARDI AWARD WATCH LIST

Baylor senior offensive tackle **Danny Watkins** is one of only three Big 12 offensive linemen on the 41st annual Rotary Lombardi Award watch list. Watkins, who is in his second year at Baylor after transferring from Butte (Calif.) College, is among the 87 members of the watch list. In his first season with the Bears in 2009, Watkins stepped in at left tackle and was one of 11 Bears to start all 12 games. Replacing departed All-American **Jason Smith**, Watkins recorded 103 total knockdowns and averaged an 89 percent grade from offensive line coaches.

The Rotari Lombardi Award is presented annually to the college football lineman who, in addition to outstanding performance and ability, best exemplifies the discipline of Vince Lombardi. The award is open to offensive and defensive linemen, as well as linebackers who set up no farther than five yards deep from the line of scrimmage.

The watch list will be periodically updated and revised through the conclusion of voting to determine the 12 semifinalists. The 2010 Rotari Lombardi Award will be presented Dec. 7-8 at the George R. Brown Convention Center in Houston, Texas.

FINLEY NAMED TO DOAK WALKER WATCH LIST

Baylor senior RB **Jay Finley** is one of 49 FBS student-athletes named to the 2010 Doak Walker Award watch list. The Doak Walker Award, which is in its 21st year, is named after the three-time All-American running back from SMU. Semifinalists for the award will be announced Nov. 10, with the finalists to be announced Nov. 22.

WRIGHT ON BILETNIKOFF WATCH LIST

Baylor junior IR **Kendall Wright** is one of 51 student-athletes on the 2010 Fred Biletnikoff Award watch list, which was announced in August by the Tallahassee Quarterback Club Foundation. As a sophomore in 2009, Wright led the Bears with 66 receptions, 740 receiving yards and four touchdowns on his way to being named to numerous All-Big 12 teams. His 66 receptions rank as the third-most in a single season in program history.

The Biletnikoff Award, first presented in 1994, is named for former Florida State All-American **Fred Biletnikoff**. It is presented annually to the nation's most outstanding receiver in college football. Ten semi-finalists will be announced Nov. 15, with three finalists selected Nov. 22. The winner of the 17th Biletnikoff Award will be announced as part of the Home Depot ESPNU College Football Awards Show on Dec. 9.

MINIMAL POSITION CHANGES

Compared to recent seasons, minimal positional changes occurred during the offseason – six during spring drills and three at the start of fall camp. The spring moves included only one player switching sides of the ball, as former defensive lineman **Kaeron Johnson** made a permanent switch to fullback, and four other prominent Bears made slight changes, as senior **Tim Atchison** returned to safety after two seasons at cornerback, sophomore **Willie Jefferson** moved from outside receiver to tight end, junior **Tracy Robertson** moved from defensive end to the interior of the line and junior **Philip Blake** moved from offensive tackle to the center position. In the fall, three redshirt freshmen made moves, including two that switched sides of the ball as **Kelvin Palmer** moved from the D-line to the offensive line and **Jeramie Roberts** made the switch from offensive line to defensive line. Additionally, **Darius Jones** moved from the inside receiver to outside receiver position.

KEEPING UP WITH THE JONESES, JOHNSONS AND THE WILLIAMSES

Baylor's 2010 roster features four student-athletes with the last name Jones, including starter **John Jones** (offensive guard). Also on that list are PK **Aaron Jones**, WR **Darius Jones** and DL **Dominique Jones**.

In addition to the Joneses, there are also three student-athletes with the last name of Johnson or Williams on Baylor's 2010 roster. All three Williams players are on the offensive side of the ball — RB **Issac Williams** and WRs **Stacy Williams** and **Terrance Williams**. Two of the three Johnsons on the roster play offense — FB **Kaeron Johnson** and OL **William Johnson** — while senior LB **Antonio Johnson** patrols the defensive side.

2009 FRESHMEN BACK AS EXPERIENCED SOPHOMORES

Baylor played 25 freshmen (10 true freshmen and 15 redshirt freshmen) in 2009. Twenty-three of those (17 scholarship players) remain on the 2010 roster as sophomores. Returning starters among the sophomore class include OL **Ivory Wade** (2009 freshman All-American), CB **Chance Casey** (2009 All-Big 12 freshman) and QB **Nick Florence**. QB **Robert Griffin III** is a redshirt sophomore (true sophomore in 2009) back to assume the starting position in 2010.

COACHING STABILITY

The Bears' coaching staff has remained the same since being assembled by head coach **Art Briles** prior to the 2008 season. Baylor is one of nine schools nationally in its third-plus season with an entire staff intact. Baylor is joined by Indiana, Iowa, Navy, Nebraska, Penn State, Texas, Virginia Tech and Wake Forest.

Robert Griffin III threw a 68-yard touchdown pass on his second series, ran 30 yards for a touchdown on his next possession and led Baylor to a 34-3 victory over Sam Houston State in his first game since tearing a knee ligament early last season.

A freshman sensation in 2008, he played only 2 1/2 games last season. He came back bigger and stronger, but also wearing a brace on his right knee.

He proved right away that his arm was fine, completing his first three passes and drilling the short pass that turned into the longest TD throw of his career. The big tests were running and taking his first hit.

Both came at the start of the third drive. He scrambled right for 15 yards, getting jerked down by his legs. He jumped right up, drawing a huge cheer. A few plays later, he scrambled left, saw an opening and zipped through the defense, holding up his right index finger as he crossed the goal line. He had another TD run in the fourth quarter called back because of a penalty.

Griffin III stretched the lead in the second quarter. Two plays after freshman **Tevin Reese** narrowly missed a juggling touchdown catch, Griffin III saw **Terrance Williams** break free toward the goal line and hit him for the easy score.

The Bears went up 28-0 when **Jay Finley**, who is coming back from offseason ankle surgery, ran 44 yards up the middle for a touchdown on the first play of the second half.

Griffin III went 19-of-36 for 242 yards, playing all but Baylor's final drive. He was sacked once and didn't have any turnovers. He also ran six times for a team-best 59 yards. Griffin III accounted for three of Baylor's four touchdowns — his eighth career three-TD performance.

Sam Houston State didn't break Baylor's 20-yard line until the fourth quarter, then had to settle for a 27-yard field goal. They gained just 195 yards.

Baylor's defense enjoyed a first-half shutout for the first time since 2006. Sam Houston's only points came with 10:35 left.

DE **Tevin Elliott** recorded a team-high eight tackles, two tackles-for-loss and one sack in his first career game. **Byron Landor** tied a career high with seven tackles, while recording a career-high two TFLs. Elliott, Landor and **Phil Taylor** recorded a team-high two tackles-for-loss each.

Six players made their career-first starts Saturday — LB **Elliott Coffey**, LB **Chris Francis**, DE **Terrance Lloyd**, DE **Gary Mason Jr.**, RG **Robert T. Griffin** and WR **Terrance Williams**.

Robert Griffin III passed for a career-high 297 yards, including 230 in the first half, and had a hand in all four Baylor touchdowns to lead the Bears past the Buffalo Bulls, 34-6. Baylor is 2-0 to start a season for the first time since 2005.

Griffin III put the Bears in control with a five-yard scoring run on fourth-and-two late in the first quarter and two long second-quarter touchdown passes. One was a 61-yarder to **Kendall Wright**, who has caught a pass in all 26 career games.

Buffalo quarterback Jerry Davis struggled in his second career start while the Bulls were falling behind in the first half. He finished 18 of 46 for 163 yards and no touchdowns after throwing for 302 yards and four scores in the opener.

Griffin III ran for two touchdowns, the latter a 1-yard plunge that put Baylor ahead 34-3 early in the third quarter.

Griffin III's final TD could have been the second for Wright, but the receiver fell down while all alone at the 1 after stretching out to catch Griffin III's 47-yard pass. He had five catches for 128 yards.

Besides harassing Davis into a rough night, the Bears mostly held the Buffalo running game in check until the game was decided.

The Bulls didn't get a first down until their fourth possession, and promptly fumbled two plays later. Griffin III kept the subsequent drive alive with a nifty fumble recovery, completed a pass to get the Bears to the Buffalo 4, then scored the game's first touchdown on a designed run around right end on fourth-and-2 from the 5.

The Bears would like someone other than the multitallented Griffin III to be their leading rusher, and **Jay Finley** obliged against Buffalo. He didn't score but finished with 76 yards on a 5.8-yard average before going to the bench for good in the third quarter.

The only blemish for Griffin III was the first nonconference interception of his career, by Domonic Cook after a tipped pass. Griffin III had several other tipped passes, and a couple of those were almost intercepted.

After not allowing a touchdown in its first two games, Baylor gave up five touchdowns on TCU's first five drives, falling 45-10 to the fourth-ranked Horned Frogs in Fort Worth.

TCU's 45 points are the most by a Baylor opponent since a 56-14 loss to UAB in 2004. Baylor has now lost the last three series meetings with TCU since the Southwest Conference dissolved in 1996. TCU's win broke the tie in the series, as the Horned Frogs now lead the all-time series, 50-49-7.

Ed Wesley, who became the first Baylor opposing player to rush for 150 yards since 2008, ran for a game-high 165 yards and two scores, while Andy Dalton completed 21-of-23 passes for 267 and two TDs. The Horned Frogs built a 35-3 lead and had 335 of their 558 total yards by halftime.

Dalton, whose 91-percent completion rate was a single-game TCU record, hit his first 11 passes. His first incomplection didn't come until four minutes into the second quarter.

On the opening series of the game, Dalton hit a wide-open Jeremy Kerley streaking down the middle of the field for a 28-yard score.

After Baylor dual-threat quarterback **Robert Griffin III** was stuffed for a five-yard loss on his first snap and the Bears went three-and-out, Wesley took a handoff over the left side, busted through the line and had a clear path to the end zone for a 14-0 lead less than 7:30 minutes into the game.

Freshman PK **Aaron Jones** tied a career-long with a 48-yard field goal to put Baylor on the board for the first time. TCU then scored 24 unanswered points to take a 38-3 lead.

Griffin III threw a 53-yard TD pass to **Josh Gordon** in the third quarter, but was frustrated most of the day by TCU's stifling defense. Griffin III finished 16-of-28 passing for 164 yard and ran 14 times for only 21 yards.

Gordon and **Terrance Williams** combined to catch nine of Griffin III's 16 passes. **Jay Finley** led the Bears with 56 rushing yards on nine carries.

Robert Griffin III passed for 268 yards and three touchdowns to lead Baylor to a 30-13 win over Rice on a rain-soaked night that included a 67-minutes weather delay.

Baylor led 7-3 early in the second quarter when the game was suspended for about an hour because of lightning in the area. After the rain passed and the teams returned to the field, the Bears built a 20-3 lead by scoring on their last three possessions of the first half.

Griffin III added a 46-yard touchdown pass to **Josh Gordon** in the third quarter that stretched the lead to 27-6. Gordon shrugged off his coverage and grabbed the TD pass, then took a late shot from Brian Stacey as the Owls were flagged for unnecessary roughness.

Nick Fanuzzi had 204 yards passing with two interceptions for Rice. The Owls' only touchdown came when Sam McGuffie scored on an 11-yard run that made it 27-13 with about six minutes left.

The second half got off to a wild start with three turnovers in a four-play span. Baylor's **Kendall Wright** had a reception for 17 yards before fumbling at the end of the play. **Mikail Baker** intercepted a pass by Fanuzzi on the next play to give the Bears the ball back.

But Baylor coughed it up again two plays later when Griffin III's pass was intercepted by Chris Jammer.

The Owls took advantage of that mistake, making it 20-6 early on a 43-yard field goal.

Griffin III found **Laneer Sampson** on a 47-yard pass that got the Bears to the 3-yard-line just before halftime. Baylor settled for a 20-yard field goal after an incomplete pass to lead 20-3 at halftime.

Griffin III didn't take long to get the Baylor offense going after the delay, finding Wright on a 40-yard touchdown pass about 7 1/2 minutes before halftime to push the lead to 14-3. That drive came after **Chance Casey** intercepted a pass by Fanuzzi.

Wright finished with seven receptions for 106 yards.

Jerod Monk put the Bears on top when he grabbed a 6-yard touchdown pass from Griffin to make it 7-3 with about three minutes left in the first quarter.

The Owls took an early 3-0 lead when Chris Boswell connected on a 42-yard field goal in the first quarter.

Baylor's **Aaron Jones** missed a field goal from 26 yards with about 10 minutes left in the game, but hit one from 37 that made it 30-13 with about 3 minutes left.

Robert Griffin III threw for a career-best 380 yards with two of his three touchdowns to **Josh Gordon**, who turned a short pass into a school-record 94-yarder, and Baylor beat Kansas 55-7 for its most lopsided conference victory ever.

The Bears had never won a Big 12 game by more than 28 points. Their largest conference margin had been a 47-point Southwest Conference victory over Arkansas in 1922.

Griffin III passed for 288 yards before halftime, only nine shy of his previous mark set in Baylor's last home game three weeks ago. He finished 26 of 36 and ran eight times for 64 yards with a 1-yard TD before coming out after three quarters.

His 444 total yards were a single-game school record, as were the 678 yards for the team.

Griffin III hit Gordon in stride in the end zone for a 39-yard TD on the opening drive. Late in the first half Griffin III dumped a pass in the right flat to Gordon, who avoided a desperate diving tackle attempt by a linebacker then sprinted untouched along the sideline in front of the Kansas bench for the 94-yarder.

The Jayhawks have never won in Waco, going 0-5 including losing all four since the inception of the Big 12 in 1996. No other league team has lost more than twice there in that span. The Jayhawks' losses there in 1998 and 2002 were the bookends to Baylor's 29-game conference losing streak.

Griffin III threw an 11-yard TD pass midway through the third quarter, though he went a lot farther. Griffin III went back to the 30 retrieving a snap over his head, then ran toward the left sideline fleeing defenders before throwing against his body to **Terrance Williams** wide open in the end zone.

When Kansas got the ball back, **Tim Atchison** intercepted a pass thrown by Jordan Webb and returned it 14 yards for a touchdown to make it 48-7.

Williams also caught a 50-yard touchdown on a double-pass play from fellow receiver **Kendall Wright**.

Griffin's 1-yard keeper early in the second quarter put Baylor up 17-0, though he had to do it twice after officials nullified the first one because they were reviewing a 34-yard catch by Williams on the previous play.

Aaron Jones kicked a 50-yard field goal on the final play of the first half for a 27-7 lead, after he had given the Bears a 10-0 lead less than five minutes into the game. His 10 field goals are already one more than two Baylor kickers combined for last season.

Robert Griffin III passed for a career-high 384 yards and tallied four touchdowns, but it was not enough as Baylor fell to Texas Tech 45-38 in the Texas Farm Bureau Insurance Shootout at the Cotton Bowl.

The Red Raiders were coming off consecutive losses to Texas and Iowa State. Texas Tech hadn't been 0-3 in league play since 1990 when it was a member of the now-defunct Southwest Conference.

Taylor Potts, who completed 15 straight passes at one point in the first half and finished 42-of-59, guided an offense which gained 635 total yards.

Baylor has dropped 15 consecutive games to Texas Tech. The Bears were looking to start 5-1 for the first time since 1994, the last year they played in a bowl game.

Terrance Ganaway returned an onside kick for a touchdown and Griffin III's great performance included a 2-yard run that cut Texas Tech's lead to 45-38 early in the fourth quarter.

The Bears had chances to tie the game after that. They had a drive stall at the 16 when they couldn't convert fourth-and-15.

Baylor had one last opportunity when it took possession at its 34 with 57 seconds left. The Bears drove to the Tech 31, but time expired before they got off a final play.

The Red Raiders led 35-28 at halftime and quickly built on their advantage in the third quarter.

Matt Williams kicked a 30-yard field goal and Potts went 6-of-8 on an 84-yard touchdown drive. Baron Batch caught a 7-yard pass to make it 45-28.

Texas Tech's Detron Lewis had 11 receptions for 95 yards and Batch rushed for 97.

Potts, who was 25 of 32 for 306 yards in the first half, threw a 3-yard scoring pass to Alex Torres that gave the Red Raiders a 28-21 lead in the second quarter. Torres also had a 1-yard TD in the opening quarter.

Kendall Wright, who had 145 yards receiving and tied a career high with 11 receptions, hauled in a 62-yard touchdown pass from Griffin III to bring Baylor within 35-28 with 1:17 left in the first half.

The teams combined for 685 total yards in the first half, with Texas Tech gaining 418 of those.

The Bears went 82 yards on its opening drive, which was capped by Griffin III's 1-yard sneak. The Red Raiders answers when Eric Stephens broke free for a 10-yard touchdown run on fourth-and-1.

Baylor's special teams was also successful on a fake punt which led to Griffin III's 34-yard touchdown pass to **Josh Gordon**, putting the Bears on top 21-14.

Batch broke three tackles on a 37-yard TD run which evened it at 21 with 10:53 left in the first half.
