Kickoff – Cal at Colorado

Sat., Sept. 10 (1:37 p.m. MT/12:37 p.m. PT)

Cal will continue its 2011 season with its first true road game of the campaign at Colorado. The Golden Bears are visiting Boulder for the first time since 1982 when Cal came away with a 31-17 victory. This Saturday's contest is the second in a home-and-home series the schools scheduled for the 2010 and 2011 seasons prior to the Buffaloes joining the Bears in the Pac-12. The 2011 game will be played as a non-conference contest and not count as part of either team's league record, although the two schools are now in the same league.

Cal was a 52-7 winner over Colorado the last time the teams met at Memorial Stadium on Sept. 11, 2010. The meeting had been the first time the teams had played in 28 years since the 1982 contest in Boulder. The teams have played only five times in their history, with Cal a 10-0 winner in the first ever meeting in Berkeley (Sept. 28, 1968) before Colorado won each of the first two of three meetings in Boulder (20-10 on Sept. 9, 1972; 34-27 on Sept. 13, 1975).

Different Directions

Cal and Colorado are coming off opposite results in the first week of the 2011 season.

The Bears were a 36-21 winner over Fresno State in the neutral-site game dubbed the "TicketCity Battle by the Bay" at Candlestick Park in nearby San Francisco on Saturday, Sept. 3.

Colorado traveled about 4,100 miles each way to play a game at Hawai'i, falling 35-17.

Now the Buffaloes return home, while the Bears will cover approximately 1,250 miles for their first road game of the 2011 campaign.

Bears Win Season Opener

Cal was a 36-21 winner over Fresno State as Marvin Jones (5-118, career-high 2TD) and Keenan Allen (8-112) became the first two Cal players to both go over 100 yards receiving in the same game since 2006. Zach Maynard (16-35-1-266, 2TD) made a strong Cal debut at quarterback in what was believed to be the first regular-season college football contest to have ever been played at Candlestick Park. Maynard added 52 yards rushing on six carries, including a 43-yarder that was the longest run of the day by either team. Isi Sofele rushed for 88 yards and two touchdowns on 24 rushes, all career bests. Mychal Kendricks led the Bears' defensive effort, totaling game-highs of nine tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss (-10 yards) to go along with being credited for 0.5 sack and a pass breakup.

Sustained Success

Cal averaged 8.0 wins per year in the first nine seasons (2002-10) under head coach Jeff Tedford for a 72-42 record that ranked tied for third among Pac-10 teams during that period.

Tedford at 73 Career Wins, One Shy of Cal's All-Time Mark

Head coach Jeff Tedford improved his all-time record both at Cal and in his collegiate career as a head coach to 73-42 (.635), moving only one victory shy of equaling the school's all-time leader Andy Smith (74, 1916-25) and into a tie for second place all-time with James Schaeffer (73, 1909-15). Tedford became Cal's all-time modern-era victory leader as well as its all-time leader in games coached during the 2010 season.

On The Road

Cal will play the first of six true road games during the 2011 regular season at Colorado this Saturday. The Bears have had distinctly different levels of success on the road in the past two seasons. Last year, Cal lost each of its first four road games (Nevada, Arizona, UC, Oregon State) before avoiding a winless season on the road with a victory at Washington State in its its road contest of the campaign. Two seasons ago in 2009, the Bears posted a 4-2 record in true road games to register its best mark in those contests since 2004. The Bears won at Minnesota, UCLA, Arizona State and Stanford, with the two losses coming at Oregon and Washington. The 2004 squad was 5-1 in true road contests. Prior to 2009, Cal hadn't posted a winning road record since 2005, when the Bears were 3-2 in true road games.

Jones Off To Strong Start, Nears 100 Career Catches

Marvin Jones began the 2011 season right where he left off last year by catching five passes for 118 yards and a career-high two touchdowns in the season-opening 36-21 win over Fresno State. Jones is Cal's active career leader with totals of 99 catches for 1,542 yards and 12 touchdowns. His 12 receiving scores leave him just one shy of moving onto the school's all-time record books, with four players currently tied for eighth with 13. Although he's not quite knocking on the door yet for career receptions or receiving yards he still has an excellent opportunity to reach both of those by the end of the season. Jones has led Cal in both receptions and receiving yards for each of the last two seasons. Jones posted career highs of 50 catches and 765 receiving yards, while ranking second on the club with four touchdown grabs during his 2010 honorable mention All-Pac-10 campaign.

Allen Another Big Season Opener

Keenan Allen set out to show their no such thing as a sophomore jinx when he equaled a career-best with eight catches for 112 yards in his first game of the 2011 season, a 36-21 win over Fresno State. Allen was coming off a season in 2010 in which he set a Cal single-season school record for receptions by a true freshman by making 46 catches for 490 yards (both second on the team behind Marvin Jones), while picking up a team-high five-touchdown grabs. Allen surpassed DeSean Jackson's school record of 38 receptions by a true freshman set in 2005. In addition, he led the team with a kick return average of 22.6 yards (No. 9 Pac-10) on a team-high 18 kick returns, while adding a 17-yard touchdown pass to fellow wide receiver Jones on his only passing attempt. Allen ranked second on the club behind Shane Vereen with 1,040 all-purpose yards (136 rush, 490 receiving, 8 punt return, 406 kick return) and third on the squad with 46 points. Allen began his record-setting rookie season by making one of the most memorable debuts in Cal football history in the season opener against UC Davis on Sept. 4

when he caught four passes for 120 yards, including a 48-yard touchdown reception. His 120 receiving yards were the most by a Cal wide receiver since LaReylle Cunningham had 138 yards at Maryland on Sept. 13, 2008 (since surpassed by Jones' 161 yards at Nevada).

Allen and Jones Both Go Over 100 Yards Receiving

Keenan Allen (7-105) and Marvin Jones (5-118, 2 TD) became the first two Cal players to both go over 100 yards receiving in a game for the Bears when they accomplished the feat in the season opener since current NFL receivers DeSean Jackson (7-114, 3 TD) and Lavelle Hawkins (9-125) did it in a 42-17 victory over Minnesota at Memorial Stadium on Sept. 9, 2006.

Zach Maynard Makes Debut as Starting Quarterback

Zach Maynard made his debut as Cal's starting quarterback in last Saturday's 36-21 win over Fresno State, completing 16-of-35 passes for 266 yards and two touchdowns with one interception. Maynard also ran six times for 52 yards, including a 43-yarder that was the longest run of the game.

Head coach Jeff Tedford announced on May 14, 2011, that Maynard would be the team's starting quarterback heading into the 2011 season, and Maynard has remained in the role since.

"Zach showed a tremendous amount of upside during spring practice and is the quarterback that gives us the best opportunity to win football games," Tedford said. "He has the ability to both throw and run the ball effectively, giving us another dimension at that position that we haven't had in a while."

"I'm excited and honored to have been named the starting quarterback at Cal," Maynard said. "I enjoyed competing for the job with some excellent competitors during spring practice and will continue to work hard to keep the starting role. I have an excellent opportunity to help lead this football team and plan to take full advantage of it."

Maynard accepted a scholarship offer from Cal in February of 2010 and sat out last season to become eligible after transferring from Buffalo. He has two years of eligibility remaining at Cal, including the 2011 campaign.

Maynard played in all 12 games and started 11 contests during his 2009 sophomore season with the Bulls when he completed 218-of-379 (57.5%) passes for 2,694 yards and 18 TDs with 15 interceptions. He was also Buffalo's third-leading rusher with 300 yards on 87 carries and one touchdown on the ground. Maynard had a huge day in the second start of his career against Big East power Pittsburgh, passing for career highs of 400 yards and four touchdowns to set and tie single-game school records as he hit on 24-of-35 attempts. Maynard was named the Mid-American Conference East Division Performer of the Week for the performance. He rushed for a career-high 61 yards on six carries and scored his rushing touchdown against Miami, Ohio.

Allan Bridgford claimed the No. 2 spot on the team's two-deep following training camp.

Sofele Next in Line of Successful Tailbacks

Starting tailback Isi Sofele looks to be the next tailback to make a run at the 1,000-yard rushing mark that a Cal rusher has reached in eight of the last nine campaigns. Sofele rushed for 88 yards and a pair of touchdowns on 24 carries (all career highs) during his first game in the role as the starter against Fresno State on Saturday. Sofele's current average of 88.0 yards per game would give him 1,056 over a 12-game regular season. Cal's string of seven straight seasons in which a running back gained over 1,000 yards rushing ended in 2009 when Shane Vereen's then career-high and team-leading total of 952 yards fell just short, while Jahvid Best added 867 despite missing the final four games due to injury. But Vereen started a new streak in 2010 with a career-high total of 1,167 yards on the ground.

Mychal Kendricks Starts Senior Season Strong

Preseason All-American Mychal Kendricks started his senior season strong with game highs of nine tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss (-10 yards), as well as a half-sack (-1 yard) and a pass breakup to lead Cal's defense during a 36-21 victory over Fresno State. Kendricks is in his fourth season at Cal and has played in all 39 games possible during his career. He is the Bears' active career leader in tackles (161), tackles for loss (24.5), sacks (11.0), fumble recoveries (5) and blocked kicks (1). The national honors candidate was Cal's most decorated player in the 2011 preseason and is on watch lists for the Bednarik Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy, Butkus Award, College Football Performance Awards Linebacker Trophy, Lott IMPACT Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Award. He earned second-team All-Pac-10 honors in 2010 and was one of the conference's top big-play players, leading Cal and ranking among the conference leaders with 8.5 sacks (0.71 spg, No. 2 Pac-10, No. 26-T NCAA), 15.0 tackles for loss (1.25 flpg, No. 4 Pac-10, No. 28-T NCAA) and three fumble recoveries (0.25 frpg, No. 1-T Pac-10). His 66 tackles for an average of 5.5 stops per game ranked No. 31 in the conference.

D.J. Holt Steady Again

D.J. Holt, who was second on the team in tackles in 2010, started right where he left off last season with another steady game in the season opener. Holt was second on the team with eight tackles and added 1.0 tackles for loss for five yards. Last season, Holt was second on the club behind Mike Mohamed with a career-high 85 stops for a 7.1 per-game average that tied for 13th in the Pac-10. Holt also led the club and was tied for fourth in the Pac-10 with three forced fumbles (0.25 per game), while adding 5.5 tackles for loss (-21 yards), 2.0 sacks (-13 yards), three pass breakups, a quarterback hurry and a fumble recovery. Holt's three career forced fumbles are the most by any active Cal player, while his 144 career tackles are second, his two fumble recoveries tied for second, his 11.0 tackles for loss third and his six pass breakups fourth.

Guyton and Jones Honors Pick up Week 1 Honors

Trevor Guyton and Marvin Jones both received honorable mention recognition by the College Football Performance Awards for their performances in last Saturday's win over Fresno State. Guyton was among a group of players to receive honorable mention honors for the CFPA's Linebacker Performer of the Week after returning a fumble 19 yards for a touchdown and adding a tackle. Jones' five catches for 118 yards and a career-high-tying two TD receptions made him an honorable mention selection for the CFPA's Wide Receiver Performer of the Week.

Veteran Offensive Line

The Bears' 2011 offensive line features several players with a significant amount of experience as the five members of the group that started the 2011 season opener against Fresno State have combined to make 90 collegiate starts in Mitchell Schwartz (39), Justin Cheadle (24), Brian Schwenke (14), Matt Summers-Gavin (14) and Dominic Galas (2).

Defense Back on Top

Under now second-year defensive coordinator Clancy Pendergast, Cal's defense continues to impress. After the first week of the 2011 campaign, the Bears lead the Pac-12 in total defense (218.0 ypg, No. 18 NCAA) and are tied for the conference leads in sacks (6.0 spg, No. 5-T NCAA). The Bears' 2010 defense led the Pac-10 and ranked in the top 25 nationally in per-game averages for sacks (2.83 spg, No. 13), total defense (319.08 ypg, No. 18) and pass defense (187.00 ypg, No. 21). Cal was also first in the conference in 2010 in first downs allowed (217).

National Rankings

Cal has been ranked among the nation's top 25 teams at one point in each of the last seven seasons and eight times in nine campaigns since 2002 prior to the 2011 campaign. The Bears began the 2011 campaign unranked for the second straight year. They started the season ranked nationally five times during the first 10 seasons under head coach Jeff Tedford, with the highest preseason ranking coming in 2006 at No. 9 by AP (No. 12 USA Today). The Bears have also been ranked as high as No. 12 by both AP and USA Today to begin both the 2007 and 2009 seasons. In 2004, AP started the Bears at No. 13 (No. 15 USA Today), and Cal opened 2005 ranked No. 19 by AP (No. 20 USA Today).

Cal in Top 25, Cal vs. Top 25

The Bears are 15-8 when playing as a top-10 team and 36-21 when the club is ranked in the top 25 of at least one set of rankings since head coach Jeff Tedford took over in 2002. Cal has played 30 nationally ranked teams during the Tedford era and posted a 13-17 record in those contests. Cal is 0-3 under Tedford against No. 1 ranked teams, most recently falling 15-13 to Oregon at Memorial Stadium on Nov. 13, 2010. Cal also lost 35-10 to USC at Memorial Stadium in 2005 and 23-17 to the Trojans in 2004 at the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum. In 2009, the Bears recorded back-to-back wins in consecutive weeks over nationally ranked teams for the first time since 1950, defeating No. 18 Arizona (Nov. 14) before winning at No. 14 Stanford (Nov. 21).

Score 30 Points, Usually Win

Cal is 56-5 all-time when putting 30 points or more on the scoreboard under head coach Jeff Tedford, adding its most recent victory to the mark with a 36-21 win over Fresno State last Saturday. The Bears had won 30 consecutive games when they scored at least 30 points prior to a 52-31 loss at Nevada on Sept. 17, 2010. When the Bears don't score at least 30 points, their record under Tedford is 17-37.

On the Tube

Cal has appeared on live television 57 times over its last 58 contests through the end of the 2010 regular season. The lone exception was a non-televised home contest vs. Washington State on Oct. 24, 2009, that snapped a string of 38 straight games on TV. A total of 97 games have been televised in the first nine seasons under head coach Jeff Tedford.

Turnover Margin a Key

The turnover battle has been emphasized since head coach Jeff Tedford's arrival in 2002 and rightly so. The Bears are 41-6 when committing fewer turnovers than opponents during the Tedford era, compared to 17-10 when tied and 15-26 when opponents win the battle. In conference games, the stats are even more decisive as Cal is 25-4 with a positive margin in turnovers, 10-7 when the turnover table is tied and 9-22 with a deficit. Cal and Fresno State both committed two turnovers (one interception, one fumble) in Cal's 36-21 win over the Bulldogs last Saturday.

Lots of New Faces

A total of 15 Cal players – C.J. Anderson (Jr., TB), Michael Coley (Fr., S), Kameron Jackson (Fr., DB), Mustafa Jalil (Fr., DE), Kameron Krebs (Jr., LB), Mike Manuel (Jr., TB), Zach Maynard (Jr., QB), Chris McCain (Fr., LB), Stefan McClure (Fr., DB), Bryce McGovern (Fr., WR), Viliami Moala (Fr., DL), Richard Rodgers (Fr., TE), Brennan Scarlett (Fr., LB), Avery Sebastian (Fr., DB) and Cecil Whiteside (Fr., LB) – made their first appearance in a Cal uniform for the 2011 season opener against Fresno State.

Jed Barnett (Fr., P), Allan Bridgford (So., QB), Gabe King (Fr., DE) and Bill Tyndall (So., LT) are others on the two-deep that have yet to see action at Cal.

Cal in the NFL

A total of 215 former Cal football players have been drafted or have experience on an AAFC, AFL or NFL roster as of Sept. 9, 2011, including 31 players that are currently on NFL rosters according to ESPN.com, which is the second-most among Pac-12 schools behind only USC. Rodgers and Bishop Super Bowl Champs; Rodgers MVP

Former Cal football players Aaron Rodgers and Desmond Bishop are reigning Super Bowl champions after the Green Bay Packers defeated the Pittsburgh Steelers, 31-25, at Cowboys Stadium in Super Bowl XLV. Rodgers was the first former Cal player to be named the game's MVP, and is also the first of the record four former Cal quarterbacks to start the game to be victorious.

"I watched the game with great pride and admiration for what Aaron and Desmond accomplished," head coach Jeff Tedford said. "They are two class individuals who did a lot for Cal and have continued their growth as leaders and major contributors to the World Champions! They deserve all the accolades coming their way!"

Rodgers completed 24-of-39 passes for 304 yards and three touchdowns with no interceptions for a quarterback rating of 111.5. He had one touchdown throw in each the first, second and fourth quarters.

Bishop had eight tackles, a game-high 3.0 tackles for loss and a key fumble recovery on Pittsburgh's first play of the fourth quarter that led to Green Bay's final touchdown of the contest.

The appearance of Rodgers and Bishop marked the 10th consecutive season Cal has had at least one player on a Super Bowl roster.

Four 2011 Selections Add To Cal's Strong NFL Draft History

Four former Cal players were selected during the 2011 NFL Draft. Cameron Jordan was the first Bear picked when he was taken in the first round by the New Orleans Saints with the No. 24 overall pick. Shane Vereen and Chris Conte were selected on the draft's second day, with Vereen going to the New England Patriots in the second round (No. 56 overall) and Conte being chosen in the third round by the Chicago Bears (No. 93 overall). Mike Mohamed rounded out Cal's selections when he was picked up on the final day of the draft by the Denver Broncos in the sixth round (No. 189 overall).

"I'm happy for all these guys," head coach Jeff Tedford said. "All of them are really, really happy. It's gratifying to me for the reason that they entrusted their careers to come to Cal to see their dreams come true."

Cal Draft Notes: Cal's four players selected in 2011 were the most Bears taken in an NFL Draft since six were picked in 2008 ... Cal had three players in the top 100 to rank tied for sixth among schools nationally ... Cal has had 36 NFL Draft selections in the last 10 drafts ... Jordan was Cal's 26th first-

round pick and the eighth in the last 10 drafts ... Jordan became the second consecutive defensive lineman chosen from Cal in the first round in as many years, joining the No. 10 overall selection of Tyson Alualu by Jacksonville in 2010 and making the Cal only the second team in the Pac-12 to have ever had defensive linemen selected in the first round in back-to-back drafts (USC is the other) ... Cal has had four first-round draft picks in the last three drafts, with at least one in all three ... Jordan was selected with the same overall pick (No. 24) as former Cal quarterback and reigning Super Bowl MVP Aaron Rodgers was by the Green Bay Packers in 2005.

Academic Prowess Continues

Cal has posted 94 Pac-10 All-Academic honors from 2002-10 under head coach Jeff Tedford, second-most in the conference during that span. Mike Mohamed was named a first-team Pac-10 All-Academic selection for the third time in 2010, leading a group of 11 Cal student-athletes honored on the Pac-10 All-Academic Football Team. Cal's second-team selections included Alex Lagemann, Ernest Owusu, Giorgio Tavecchio and John Tyndall. Justin Cheadle, Richard Fisher, Chris Guarnero, Mitchell Schwartz, Matt Summers-Gavin and Beau Sweeney were selected honorable mention.

In 2008, Alex Mack earned the Draddy Trophy (later renamed the Campbell Trophy) honoring college football's top scholar-athlete, while Mohamed was a finalist for the honor often referred to as the "academic Heisman" in 2010 after earlier being given an NFF Scholar-Athlete Award.

2011 National Signing Day

Cal signed 11 prep All-Americans and 22 student-athletes to National Letters of Intent to join the Cal football program on National Signing Day on February 2, 2011. Cal's 2011 signing class ranked as high as No. 13 according to according to Athlon. Scout had Cal at No. 14 and Rivals at No. 17, while ESPN listed the Bears at No. 18 and MaxPreps at No. 20.

"We are excited about the student-athletes that we have signed in our 2011 recruiting class," head coach Jeff Tedford said. "We feel like the members of this class will be able to fill some of the needs we have on both sides of the ball in an expedient fashion. Many of the players are among the nationally elite at their respective positions and will have an opportunity to make an immediate impact on the Cal football program."

The 2011 class included six players who were selected for the U.S. Army All-American Bowl – LB Jason Gibson (Gardena, CA/Junipero Serra HS), DB Stefan McClure (Vista, CA/Vista HS), DL Viliami Moala (Sacramento, CA/Grant HS), OL Jordan Rigsbee (Chico, CA/Pleasant Valley HS), DL Brennan Scarlett (Portland, OR/Central Catholic HS) and DB Avery Sebastian (McDonough, GA/Eagle's Landing Christian HS). DL Todd Barr (Lakewood, CA/Lakewood HS) played in the Under Armour All-America Game.

Quick Look at 2011 Bears

Cal is an experienced group in 2011 with a roster that features 20 players with significant collegiate starting experience, including four that earned at least one 2011 preseason All-American honor in Bryan Anger (Sr., P), Sean Cattouse (Sr., DB), Mychal Kendrick (Sr., LB) and Mitchell Schwartz (Sr., OL). Nine Bears have been bestowed with preseason All-Pac-12 honors, with the All-American foursome being joined by Keenan Allen (So., WR), Trevor Guyton (Sr., DL), D.J. Holt (Sr., LB), Marvin Jones (Sr., WR) and Giorgio Tavecchio (Sr., PK). The team's current two-deep has 16 of the 28 positions occupied by seniors and another eight manned by juniors. During 2011 spring workouts, head coach Jeff Tedford continued to learn a tremendous amount about a solid core of younger players from the 2010 recruiting class that ranked as high as No. 11 nationally. He also had the advantage of seeing a pair of early entrees from the 2011 recruiting class that ranked as high as No. 13 in the nation.

Who's The New Guy

A look at the Cal roster shows an Avery "Sebastian" wearing No. 4. It's really not a new player but rather the former Avery Walls, who is planning to officially change his last name to "Sebastian" shortly after turning 18 years of age on Sept. 11, 2011. We're starting early.

For Openers

After a 36-21 victory over Fresno State in its 2011 neutral-site season opener at Candlestick Park last Saturday, Cal has an all-time record of 80-39-4 in season openers. Cal has won seven of its last eight season openers, including all six of its home season openers since head coach Jeff Tedford arrived prior to the 2002 campaign to 6-0. The Bears have home victories over Baylor (2002), Sacramento State (2005), Tennessee (2007), Michigan State (2008), Maryland (2009) and UC Davis (2010) during the period. Cal is 8-2 overall in season openers under Tedford, also with a victory at Air Force (2004), and losses in a neutral-site game vs. Kansas State (2003) and a road opener at Tennessee (2006).

Neutral-Site Games

Cal has played 30 regular-season neutral-site contests since Memorial Stadium was built in 1923 and is 19-11 in those contests, including a 3-5 mark in season-openers at neutral-site venues after last Saturday's 36-21 win over Fresno State at Candlestick Park.

Cal Readies for AT&T Park; Back to Memorial Stadium in 2012

After playing the last 88 seasons and every home game at Memorial Stadium since the facility opened for the 1923 Big Game, Cal will host its home games outside of Berkeley for the first time in 2011 while Memorial Stadium undergoes an extensive renovation and retrofit.

Cal's 2011 home schedule at San Francisco's AT&T Park is highlighted by visits from Pac-12 rival USC on Thursday, Oct. 13 (6 p.m. PT) and conference newcomer Utah on Saturday, Oct. 22. The game against USC will be a live national telecast on ESPN 3D. The Bears will also host Presbyterian at AT&T Park in their home opener on Saturday, Sept. 17 (2:30 p.m.), as well as Washington State (Saturday, Nov. 5) and Oregon State (Saturday, Nov. 12). Starting times for all games other than USC and Presbyterian will be announced at later dates when the information becomes available, as will television broadcast information.

Bowling and Winning Bears

Cal's school-record bowl game streak of seven seasons from 2003-09 finally came to an end in 2010 when the Bears finished 5-7, which also ended the team's school-record-tying string of eight consecutive winning campaigns. Cal posted a 5-2 (.714) record during its seven straight bowl appearances that also included a school-record four straight bowl wins from 2005-08. The Bears were 67-35 (.657) overall during their eight winning seasons in a row.

New Coaches on Board for 2011

Head coach Jeff Tedford announced a series of changes to Cal's offensive coaching staff on February 5, 2011, when Jim Michalczyk returned to the Bears as offensive coordinator/offensive line coach and Marcus Arroyo was hired as quarterbacks coach. At the same time, associate head coach Ron Gould was promoted to the team's run game coordinator, while it was announced that recently hired Eric Kiesau, who like Michalczyk had previously coached at Cal, would serve as the passing game coordinator/wide receivers coach. The announcement followed the previous hiring of defensive backs coach Ashley Ambrose and the move of head strength and conditioning coach Mike Blasquez from men's basketball to football.

Four Preseason All-Americans, Nine All-Pac-12 Selections Highlight 2011 Preseason Honors

National honor candidates Bryan Anger, Sean Cattouse, Mychal Kendricks and Mitchell Schwartz have each been recognized as preseason All-Americans prior to the beginning of the 2011 campaign. Anger (Phil Steele), Cattouse (Sporting News) and Schwartz (GoDaddy.com) are third-team picks, while Kendricks (GoDaddy.com) is an honorable mention choice.

A total of nine Cal players have earned 2011 preseason All-Pac-12 recognition, with the four preseason All-Americans being joined by Keenan Allen, Trevor Guyton, D.J. Holt, Marvin Jones and Giorgio Tavecchio.

Media Picks Cal To Finish Fifth in Pac-12 North

Cal was picked to finish fifth in the Pac-12 North in a preseason poll of media members who regularly cover the league. Defending Pac-12 champion Oregon was the choice to win the 2011 Pac-12 Conference football title. The Ducks were also listed in the top spot in the North Division by 29 of the 42 voters participating in the poll, collecting 239 points. Twenty-eight of those pollsters tabbed the Ducks to come out on top in the inaugural Pac-12 Championship Game. Stanford was picked to finish second in the North Division, collecting the other 13 first-place votes in the balloting for the division race, with 11 of those members of the media casting a vote for the Cardinal to capture the Pac-12 title.

USC was picked to win the South Division with 230 points, edging out Arizona State, which tallied 207 points. Due to NCAA sanctions, USC is on probation and ineligible to participate in the postseason. Therefore, the Trojans would not be able to represent the South Division in the Pac-12 Championship Game. Should USC capture the South Division crown, the team finishing second would be the South Division's representative in the Pac-12 Championship Game. Arizona State collected 13 first-place votes in the division race, with three of the pollsters predicting a Pac-12 Championship crown for the Sun Devils.

The media poll has correctly selected the conference champion in 27 of 50 previous polls, including 10 of the last 11.

Cal in Pac-12 North in 2011; New Conference Media Rights Deal

The Pac-12 has taken major steps to transform itself into a dynamic new enterprise by forming two football divisions that maintain traditional rivalries, creating the first-ever Pac-12 Championship Game, establishing schedule models for all other sports and agreeing to move to an equal revenue sharing plan for the first time in conference history on Oct. 21, 2010. The Chancellors and Presidents of the 12 member institutions voted to create a new North-South division structure that allows the conference to continue to play its traditional rivalry games, including the long-standing annual games among the California schools, delivers a football championship game to the home field of the top team in the regular-season conference standings and is easy for fans to follow. The new divisions will feature California, Oregon, Oregon State, Stanford, Washington and Washington State in the North; and Arizona, Arizona State, Colorado, UCLA, USC, and Utah in the South. Each school will play five divisional games and four cross-divisional games each year. To preserve all of the historic rivalries, including those among the California schools, the new scheduling format locks in annual inter-divisional games between the Northern and Southern California teams that date back to the 1930s.

On May 4, 2011, the Pac-12 announced it is teaming up with ESPN and FOX Sports Media Group on a landmark agreement for a broadcast and national cable television package that extends and expands long-time partnerships with both companies. At the same time, Pac-12 Commissioner Larry Scott announced the creation of a new media company, Pac-12 Media Enterprises,

which will own the Pac-12 Network, the Pac-12 Digital Network, and Pac-12 Properties. This new company will control and distribute on its platforms and on all devices, the Pac-12 games not licensed to ESPN and FOX Sports, and will hold other media and event rights. This entity will be wholly owned and controlled by the Pac-12 Conference and will exist side-by-side with the newly announced ESPN and FOX Sports arrangements.

Although terms of the ESPN and Fox Sports agreements were not disclosed, Scott called it a "landmark deal" on several fronts. He pointed out that the Pac-12's member institutions would, for the first time ever, share equally in the revenue from the new arrangement, and that the equal revenue distribution would start immediately when the deal goes into effect in 2012.

California Memorial Stadium Renovation

Since it opened in the fall of 1923, California Memorial Stadium has generated scores of unforgettable memories for generations of Golden Bears. From the Wonder Teams of the 1920s to the Pappy Waldorf years mid-century to the current success attained under head coach Jeff Tedford, the venerable facility has treated fans of all ages to many of the greatest games in the history of Cal football. Work has been underway since June 2010 to renovate the historic building, bringing it up to modern standards and creating a facility that will significantly reduce seismic risk and create a more enjoyable environment for the hundreds of thousands of fans who attend games every year – all while maintaining the architecture and character of the celebrated structure. Construction on the \$321 million project is expected to be completed in time for the 2012 season opener.

By Feb. 1, the old press box had been removed, as had all of the west-side seating and concrete below the mezzanine level. Late April signaled the end of the demolition phase and beginning of construction, with only the historic facade remaining on the west side of the facility. Now, four tower cranes rise from what was the field, and the stadium is beginning to take shape from the bottom up.

The Golden Bears are scheduled to return to their on-campus facility in September 2012 after playing their home games at AT&T Park this fall. Fans can follow daily progress through a webcam stationed high above the eastern rim at CalBears.com/stadiumcam or by visiting Vista Point on Stadium Rim Way also on the east side, and open to the public during regular construction hours.

When Memorial Stadium reopens, the facility will have a capacity of approximately 63,000 and feature modernized gameday facilities and services, upgraded access for the disabled and improved seismic safety.

Cal defeated Stanford, 9-0, in the first game played in Memorial Stadium on Nov. 24, 1923. The Bears compiled a 317-213-16 (.596) in 88 seasons in the venue from 1923-2010. The last game played in the old configuration of Memorial Stadium was a 16-13 loss to Washington on Nov. 27, 2010.

Student-Athlete High Performance Center

Cal's Student-Athlete High Performance Center, which will house football and 12 other sports on a daily basis, will open this fall after more than two years of construction. The month of September will be used to get the Olympic wing ready for occupancy, such as bringing in furniture, establishing phone service, and setting up computers and other technology requirements. Move-ins will begin in early October and be conducted in phases, starting with all sports and administrative units that will be housed in the Olympic wing.

Football, due to the size of its operation, will move its temporary headquarters just east of Memorial Stadium in December or January contingent upon its bowl game schedule and full building completion. Final phase construction will continue throughout many portions of the building, much of it in the football offices and the central High Performance Zone,

throughout most of the fall.

The SAHPC is a revolutionary student-athlete training, coaching, and applied sports science and sports medicine center that embodies the High Performance Initiative (see CalHighPerformance.com), Cal's innovative performance philosophy designed to build competitive advantage, maximize efficiency and enhance the student-athlete experience.

A 142,000 square-foot facility, the SAHPC is a state-of-the-art complex with year-round access for over 450 student-athletes.

Jeff Tedford

Head Coach • 10th Season at Cal (73-42, .635)

Jeff Tedford has established Cal as one of the elite football programs in the Pac-12 and lifted the Golden Bears into the national discussion on a consistent basis. The Bears won the fourth-most games of any Pac-12 school since his arrival in 2002, have finished ranked among the nation's top 25 in four of the last seven seasons and been in the top 10 at some point in five of the past seven campaigns heading into 2011.

Cal posted a school-record run of seven straight bowl appearances from 2003-09 and is 5-2 in the postseason under Tedford, making him the only Cal mentor with more than two bowl victories, including a school-record string of four consecutive postseason wins from 2005-08. The Bears also put together a school-record-tying eight consecutive winning campaigns from 2002-09. Cal has twice posted a school-record-tying 10 wins under Tedford, the sixth and seventh times in school history, in 2004 and 2006.

Tedford boasts Cal's modern-era record for victories with a 73-42 (.635) all-time mark at the school and is tied for second on the all-time list only one victory behind the school's all-time win list behind Andy Smith (74-16-7, 1916-25). With his most recent victory over Fresno State (Sept. 3, 2011), Tedford tied James Schaeffer (73-16-8, 1909-15), with the majority of Schaeffer's victories coming when Cal played rugby rather than football. Tedford has now coached 115 games at Cal, setting the school record for most games coached during the 2010 campaign. Only two others – Pappy Waldorf (103, 1947-56) and Stub Allison (102, 1935-44) – have coached 100 games at Cal. Tedford also already has the school record with 25 road wins and is an impressive 44-33 (.571) in conference games. To top it off, he is 7-2 in the Big Game, equaling Waldorf's school record of seven wins against Stanford.

In the first nine NFL Drafts since he has been Cal's head coach, the Bears have had 36 players selected in the NFL Draft including eight first-round picks. As of Sept. 4, 2011, Cal's 38 active NFL players according to ESPN.com rank second among Pac-12 schools.

He has also earned a reputation as a strong recruiter, with his last two classes in 2010 and 2011 being ranked as high as No. 11 and No. 13 nationally. Prior to the 2011 campaign, Sporting News bestowed the honor of the Pac-12's best recruiter on Tedford.

All of this at the head of a program that won just one game in 2001, the year prior to his arrival. The Cal football renaissance over the past decade rates as one of the most impressive turnarounds in college football history.

But Tedford's teams have not only got it done on the field, they've also got it done in the classroom. His players have been recognized as Pac-10 All-Academic honorees 94 times since his arrival. Of the 182 seniors who played for Tedford in his first nine seasons, 160 (88%) earned their college degrees and/or have gone on to NFL careers.

Nationally, Cal has also had multiple Heisman Trophy candidates under Tedford, including J.J. Arrington (2004), Marshawn Lynch (2006), DeSean Jackson (2007) and Jahvid Best (2009).

Other national recognition has come the Bears way in recent years. Alex Mack was the winner of the 2008 Draddy Award (often referred to as the "academic Heisman"), while Mike Mohamed was one of 16 players across the country in the 2010 National Football Foundation's Scholar-Athlete Class of 2010 and a finalist for the prestigious honor won by Mack now known as the William V. Campbell Trophy. In 2006, the Bears had a pair of players collect national awards. Jackson was the recipient of the inaugural Randy Moss Award as the top returner in the country, while Daymeion Hughes earned The Lott IMPACT Trophy, given to a defensive player to equally recognize his athletic performance and personal character.

Despite his success as a coach and mentor, Tedford still follows a basic philosophy.

"We try to focus on one game at a time and try to reach our full potential," Tedford said emphatically.

And he still values each and every member of his football team.

"Whether it is the guys who are suited up, the guys who are going to play 50-60 plays or the guys who aren't going to play at all, I want them all to understand that they are very important to the success of the program," he said. "Their contributions are invaluable."

Tedford's hard work and dedication not only inspire his players, it has also made him a role model to the young men in the Cal program.

"Coach Tedford wasn't just a coach, I think of him as more like a father figure," said All-Pac-10 linebacker and current NFL player Desmond Bishop, who was a key player on the Packers' Super Bowl XLV winning squad. "He taught us lessons about life. He taught us to have integrity, to have character. He prepared us to be men."

BERKELEY – Kevin Riley threw a career-high-tying four touchdown passes and California topped Colorado, 52-7, last season.

Shane Vereen caught one touchdown pass and ran for another score as the Golden Bears broke out to a 31-0 halftime lead against the Buffaloes.

Riley threw a 13-yard TD pass to Vereen to cap Cal's second drive and the blowout ensued. Jarred Price stripped Hansen on a sack and Mychal Kendricks recovered at the Colorado 31. Six plays later, Riley found Marvin Jones for a 4-yard score in the closing minute of the first quarter.

On the first play of the second quarter, Hansen threw up a floater after being hit and Bryant Nnabuife came up with the interception that set up Giorgio Tavecchio's 31-yard field goal that made it 17-0.

Vereen scored on a 3-yard run to cap the Bears' next drive and with 10:29 left in the opening half Cal led 24-0 and was outgaining Colorado 152 to minus-1.

Colorado got inside the Cal 5 on one drive in the second quarter before two penalties and a sack backed them up to the 24.

Kendricks finished with 12 stops, 2.5 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks and a fumble recovery. In all, the Bears had 6.0 sacks and force five turnovers on the afternoon.

- Current Cal assistant coaches Eric Kiesau and Ashley Ambrose were a part of the Colorado coaching staff a year ago when the Buffaloes lost in Berkeley, 52-7. Kiesau spent five years at Colorado (2006-10), while Ambrose was on the football staff for three.

- Cal's stingy defense heads to Boulder with a defense that ranks 18th in the country and first in the Pac-12 in total defense (218.0). The Bears are also third in the nation and lead the conference in tackles for loss (12.0), while ranking tied for fifth nationally with an average of 6.0 sacks per contest.

- Marvin Jones' next catch will be the 100th of his career. He has hauled in at least one reception in the last 26 games. He is also quickly approaching numerous Cal top-10 lists.

- In last year's 52-7 Cal victory over Colorado at Memorial Stadium, Jones hauled in a 62-yard reception and a touchdown, Mychal Kendricks notched a sack and a fumble recovery on back-to-back plays, Marc Anthony posted a then-career-high seven tackles, Steve Williams recorded his first career interception and Keenan Allen scored, as well. Former Cal quarterback Kevin Riley threw for a career-high four TDs.

- Cal's defense dominated the 2010 contest between the clubs, forcing five turnovers including an 82-yard fumble recovery by Darian Hagan and a 41-yard interception return by Mike Mohamed, both brought back for Cal touchdowns. Cal also had 11.0 tackles for loss.

- The home team has won four of the previous five meetings in this series.

- The last time Cal played Colorado in Boulder was in 1982. The Bears won, 31-17, the only road team to earn a victory in this series.

2011 NFL Draft

Former Cal players Cameron Jordan, Shane Vereen, Mike Mohamed and Chris Conte were selected in the 2011 NFL Draft.

Jordan (New Orleans Saints, 24th overall) was selected in the first round, and is the 26th player in Cal history to be selected in the first round, while seven Bears have been taken in the first round and 36 selected overall since Jeff Tedford became the team's head coach prior to the 2011 season.

Vereen and Conte were selected on the draft's second day, with Vereen was going to the New England Patriots in the second round (No. 56 overall) and Conte being chosen in the third round by the Chicago Bears (No. 93 overall). Mohamed rounded out Cal's selections when he was picked up on Saturday's final day of the draft by the Denver Broncos in the sixth round (No. 189 overall).

2011 Cal in the NFL Player Notes

LORENZO ALEXANDER (LB – WASHINGTON REDSKINS)

- Will begin his sixth season in the NFL with Washington Redskins in 2011. A Redskin since 2006, Alexander collected 32 tackles last season.

TYSON ALUALU (DT – JACKSONVILLE JAGUARS)

- The 10th overall pick in the 2010 NFL Draft, Alualu started all 16 games with the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2010. Alualu, along with Jahvid Best, were both first-round draft picks in the 2010 draft.

NNAMDI ASOMUGHA (CB – PHILADELPHIA EAGLES)

- Signed with the Philadelphia Eagles during the offseason after playing for the Oakland Raiders for each of the previous eight seasons and his entire NFL career. He is a four-time All-Pro and NFL Pro Bowl selection.

JAHVID BEST (RB – DETROIT LIONS)

- The 30th overall pick in the 2010 NFL Draft had the third fastest overall 40-yard dash time and was the fastest among running backs at the NFL Combine. Although his rookie season was shortened due to injury he still managed 555 yards on the ground.

DAVID BINN (LS – FREE AGENT)

- Released on Aug. 30, 2011, after spending 17 seasons (1994-2010) as the long snapper for San Diego, including 1994 squad that played in Super Bowl XXIX against the San Francisco 49ers.

DESMOND BISHOP (LB – GREEN BAY PACKERS)

- A key member of the defending Super Bowl champion Green Bay's defense, recovering a fumble in the fourth quarter to help seal the victory over Pittsburgh.
- Had 12 tackles in Green Bay's 42-34 win over New Orleans to open the 2011 regular season on Sept. 8.

KYLE BOLLER (QB – OAKLAND RAIDERS)

- Currently serving as Jason Campbell's backup with the Oakland Raiders, Boller ranks second all-time in the Baltimore Ravens' record book for most career passing yards (7,846).

ANDRE CARTER (DE – NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS)

- Signed with New England during the offseason after having spent the previous five campaigns with Washington.
- Drafted by the San Francisco 49ers in the first round of the 2001 NFL Draft. With the Niners, he amassed 154 solo tackles and 32 sacks in 69 games.

CHRIS CONTE (S – CHICAGO BEARS)

- One of the four former Cal players selected in the 2011 NFL Draft by the Chicago Bears, registering a tackle in one of the team's preseason games.

BRIAN DE LA PUENTE (OL – NEW ORLEANS SAINTS)

- Has been a member of five teams during his NFL career and is now currently with New Orleans.

THOMAS DeCOUD (S – ATLANTA FALCONS)

- Was drafted by the Atlanta Falcons in the third round of the 2008 NFL Draft. In 2010, he started all 16 games at free safety and finished with 68 tackles (57 solo), two sacks, two forced fumbles, seven pass deflections and three interceptions.

DONOVAN EDWARDS (OL – FREE AGENT)

- Released in late August by San Francisco after spending time in training camp with the 49ers.

JUSTIN FORSETT (RB – SEATTLE SEAHAWKS)

- Currently backing up former Cal teammate Marshawn Lynch. Forsett boasts a career rushing average of 4.9 yards per carry and six touchdowns.

SCOTT FUJITA (LB – CLEVELAND BROWNS)

- A member of the 2009 New Orleans Saints' squad that won Super Bowl XLIV, Fujita currently plays for the Cleveland Browns.

MIKE GIBSON (G – FREE AGENT)

- Was a member of the Seattle Seahawks for two seasons (2008-10), seeing action in 17 games and making eight starts (all in 2010) before being one of the team's final cuts during the 2011 preseason
- Drafted by the Philadelphia Eagles in the sixth round of the 2008 NFL Draft.

MATT GIORDANO (S – FREE AGENT)

- Helped the Indianapolis Colts win Super Bowl XLI over Chicago, coming into the game in the fourth quarter and having a huge pass breakup on a fourth-down play.
- Returned to the Oakland roster just prior to the season after having been among the team's final cuts.

TONY GONZALEZ (TE – ATLANTA FALCONS)

- Now in his 15th NFL season, Gonzalez is in his third year with the Falcons in 2011 following 12 seasons with Kansas City. He became the first tight end in NFL history to reach 1,000 receptions and the seventh player overall when he hit the mark in the 2010 season opener. Later in the season, Gonzalez became the first NFL tight end to get to 12,000 career receiving yards.

DARIAN HAGAN (CB – FREE AGENT)

- Released in late August by Cleveland after spending time in training camp as a cornerback for the Browns after ... originally signed with the club as an undrafted free agent following his 2010 senior season at Cal.

NICK HARRIS (P – FREE AGENT)

- Played 10 seasons in the NFL with Cincinnati (2001-03) and Detroit (2004-10) before being among the Lions' final cuts at the end of the 2011 preseason.

LAVELLE HAWKINS (WR – TENNESSEE TITANS)

- Has seen limited playing time over the last three seasons with Tennessee, the team that drafted him in the fourth round of the 2008 NFL Draft.

DERRICK HILL (NT – FREE AGENT)

- Spent time during Oakland's 2011 training camp after signing with the club as an undrafted free agent but was twice released, including when he was among the team's final group of cuts.

DANTE HUGHES (CB – SAN DIEGO CHARGERS)

- Known as Daymeion Hughes during his Cal career, he previously spent time with the Indianapolis Colts.

DESEAN JACKSON (WR – PHILADELPHIA EAGLES)

- With at least one receiving and rushing TD in each of his first three NFL seasons, he is the first NFL receiver to accomplish the feat since Jerry Rice from 1985-87. Jackson is also an All-Pro and a two-time Pro Bowl selection. Jackson became the first player to be selected to the Pro Bowl at two different positions for the same game when he was named to the 2010 Pro Bowl as a wide receiver and return specialist

CAMERON JORDAN (DL – NEW ORLEANS SAINTS)

- Selected in the first round of the 2011 NFL Draft by New Orleans, and was the 26th player in Cal history to be taken in the first round.

L.P. LaDOUCER (LS – DALLAS COWBOYS)

- Joined the Dallas Cowboys in 2005 and has been the team's longtime consistent long snapper.

RYAN LONGWELL (PK – MINNESOTA VIKINGS)

- Boasts a career field goal percentage of 83.5 with a career-long 55-yarder. He has spent his long NFL career with Green Bay and Minnesota.

MARSHAWN LYNCH (RB – SEATTLE SEAHAWKS)

- Boasted one of the most memorable plays of the 2011 NFL Playoffs, when he rattled off a 67-yard touchdown run and broke eight tackles en route to the touchdown for Seattle in a wildcard round win against defending Super Bowl champion New Orleans.

ALEX MACK (C – CLEVELAND BROWNS)

- A 2011 Pro Bowl selection who scored his first career touchdown on a lateral in the game. Has started all 32 games for Cleveland over the past two seasons.

BRANDON MEBANE (DT – SEATTLE SEAHAWKS)

- Has been a key contributor to the defensive line for Seattle since being drafted by the Seahawks in the third round of the 2007 NFL Draft.

MIKE MOHAMED (LB – DENVER BRONCOS)

- The fourth Cal player to be selected in the 2011 NFL Draft as a sixth-round pick.

CAMERON MORRAH (TE – SEATTLE SEAHAWKS)

- In line for quality playing time with Seattle in 2011, his third with the club.

BRYANT NNABUIFE (CB – FREE AGENT)

- Acquired by Arizona as an undrafted free agent after his final season at Cal in 2010 and spent time in the team's 2011 training camp before being among the final group released by the club.

RYAN O'CALLAGHAN (T – KANSAS CITY CHIEFS)

- Selected by the New England Patriots in the fifth round of the 2006 NFL Draft, he has been with the Kansas City Chiefs since 2009.

AARON RODGERS (QB – GREEN BAY PACKERS)

- Named the Super Bowl XLV MVP after leading Green Bay to a world championship in 2010. In addition, Rodgers was named the FedEx Air NFL Player of the Year in 2010. He also was a Pro Bowl selection in 2009.
- Completed 27-of-35 passes for 312 yards with three touchdowns and no interceptions in Green Bay's 42-34 win over New Orleans to open the 2011 regular season on Sept. 8.

JEREMY ROSS (WR – FREE AGENT)

- Released in late August by New England after spending time in training camp as a punt returner and wide receiver for the Patriots after signing with the club as an undrafted free agent following his 2010 senior season at Cal.

CRAIG STEVENS (TE – TENNESSEE TITANS)

- Has spent his each of the first three seasons of his NFL career as one of the Tennessee Titans' tight ends after being drafted by the club in third round of the 2008 NFL Draft.

NICK SUNDBERG (LS – WASHINGTON REDSKINS)

- Originally picked up as an undrafted free agent by Carolina and signed with Washington in 2010.

WILL TA'UFO'OU (FB – CHICAGO BEARS)

2011 Game Summaries

Game 1

Cal 36, Fresno State 21

September 3, 2011 • TV: CSN California • Attendance: 31,563

SAN FRANCISCO – The Golden Bears' defense harassed Derek Carr and Fresno State offense all game to win their season opener 36-21 over the Bulldogs on Saturday.

While Cal was in control after scoring three touchdowns in the first quarter, it was a defensive score that put the game away in the third.

Linebacker Cecil Whiteside came off the edge and got to Carr before he could get rid of the ball. He knocked it out of Carr's hand and the ball fell right to Trevor Guyton, who ran it back 22 yards for the touchdown that made it 33-14.

Cal quarterback Zach Maynard threw an interception in his first pass but bounced back to throw for 266 yards and connect with Marvin Jones on two touchdown passes.

Isi Sofele ran for 83 yards and two touchdowns, Jones had 118 yards receiving and Keenan Allen caught eight passes form his half-brother for 112 yards to give the Bears an emphatic start to the season a year after posting a losing record.

The Cal fans had much more to cheer about--especially after Maynard recovered from the early interception that helped give the Bulldogs a 7-0 lead.

Maynard completed 16 of his 35 pass attempts and had a knack for the big play as he capitalized against a Fresno State defense missing injured safety Phillip Thomas.

Maynard's mobility helped him win the job, and he showed it off with a couple of long runs, including a 48-yarder on Cal's opening drive of the second half that set up his second TD throw. The 23-yarder to Jones made it 26-14 and made that early interception a footnote to this game.

Notes

- This was the third all-time meeting between Cal and Fresno State. The Bears are now 1-2 all-time against the Bulldogs. The previous meetings were in 1995 (25-24, Fresno State) and 2000 (17-3, Fresno State). This was also the first time 10th-year head coach Jeff Tedford, who played quarterback at Fresno State, faced his alma mater as a head coach.

- This was the first-ever Cal game played at Candlestick Park, and is believed to be the first-ever collegiate football game played at Candlestick, as well.

- Cal has an all-time record of 73-39-4 in season openers over the first 116 campaigns of Cal football that began in 1982. Cal has won seven of its last eight season openers. The Bears' most recent neutral-site season opener was a 41-13 loss to Florida in Tampa, Fla., on Sept. 13, 1980.

- The Bears are now 19-11 in regular season neutral-site games since Memorial Stadium was built in 1923, including a 3-5 record in season openers. In the only other regular season neutral site contest during the Tedford era, Cal lost to Kansas State in 2003 at Arrowhead Stadium in Kansas City, Mo.

- With today's win, Tedford is now just one win away from tying Andy Smith for the school's all-time leader in wins. His current record is 73-42. He tied James Schaeffer for the second most wins.

- Cal's 19 first-quarter points were the most by a Cal team in the first quarter since Cal scored 24 points in the first quarter against Washington State on Oct. 24, 2009. It was also the most points in any quarter by Cal since the Bears scored 21 in the fourth quarter of a 52-7 win over Colorado on Sept. 11, 2010.

- LB Mychal Kendricks, a Fresno native, led all tacklers with nine and had 2.5 tackles for loss. Fellow LB D.J. Holt added seven tackles, two for a loss.

- TB Isi Sofele scored the second rushing touchdown of his career, and the first for the team this season, on the second drive of the game. In the next Cal series, Sofele rattled of a 39-yard touchdown run, recording the first two Cal scores of the year. The 39-yard scamper was the longest of his career. His first career touchdown came on a 22-yard run against Eastern Washington. Sofele finished with 24 carries for 83 yards.

- WR Marvin Jones caught two touchdown passes for the second multi-touchdown game of his career (UCLA, 2009). Jones finished the game with five catches for 118 yards and two touchdowns. It was Jones' fifth career 100-yard game.

- WR Keenan Allen hauled in a career-high tying eight receptions for 112 yards, his second 100-yard game. The last time two Cal receivers had 100 yards receiving was in 2006 when DeSean Jackson and Lavelle Hawkins accomplished the same feat on Sept. 19, 2006.

- DL Trevor Guyton recovered a fumble (forced by Cecil Whiteside) and returned it for his first collegiate touchdown. Whiteside also registered his first collegiate sack.

- DB Josh Hill, LB David Wilkerson and LB Ryan Davis registered their first collegiate sacks and Steve Williams picked off his second career interception. Hill also had two tackles for loss.

- The Cal defense held Fresno State to only convert two of its 14 third-down attempts.
