**BUFFALO GAME DAY**

"GREEN GAME NOTES" Instead of running up to 60 pages of notes and statistics, Colorado has gone "green" to conserve paper. All seats in the press box receive the CU "short stack," four pages plus stats; we do have a few sets of full in-depth game notes for those who would like them. Also, due to NCAA regulations and limitations, we no longer print a bound media guide; we do have all that information available in a supplement, but we are not allowed to bind; you'll have to punch holes in it or take to Kinko's to have it wire bound (not our choice, it's actually against NCAA rules to do so). Just ask for either or both at the Colorado SID area of the press box!

THE QUICK OF IT The Colorado Buffaloes (0-1, 0-0 Pac-12) have their 2011 home opener this afternoon against the California Golden Bears (1-0, 0-0 Pac-12) in a 1:37 p.m. kickoff at Folsom Field (53,613) ... As stated several times, this is a non-conference game as it's the back end of a home-and-home series the schools finalized way back on Feb. 15, 2004, well before either knew they would wind up as conference mates ... CU's record in home openers is **89-28-4**, with a 2-1 mark against Cal (wins in 1972 and 1975 and a loss in 1982) ... This is also the first home game for CU head coach **Jon Embree**, who last coached a game in Folsom on Sept. 6, 2003 as the wide receivers coach for UCLA (CU won that game, 16-14); his last game on the sidelines as a CU aide was on Nov. 16, 2002 in a 41-27 Buff win over Iowa State ... Today's crowd should be anywhere in the 47-50,000 range, as about 6,500 tickets remained at the close of business Friday (student business was brisk Friday, as CU's up to 10,480 sold of the 12,000 allotted to the student body).

THE WELCOME To our guests from the University of California, including athletic director **Sandy Barbour** and SID staffers **Herb Benenson** and **Kyle McRae** (Cal SID seats: row 1, seats 19-21). Other notables present tonight in the *Fred Casotti Press Box* include four bowl representatives: **Scott Jenkins** and **Dennis Wong** (Tournament of Roses), **Larry Baber** (Holiday) and longtime friend and CU alum, **C.A. Howlett** (Fiesta); former Buff standouts, linebacker **Ted Johnson** ('94) and safety **Ryan Sutter** ('97, and yes, he has "The Bachelorette" Trista with him). There are also scouts from eight NFL teams: Atlanta, Buffalo, Dallas, Denver, Miami, New England, N.Y. Jets and Tampa Bay.

DUELING "SCHENKELS" The last two recipients of the NFF/College Football Hall of Fame's Chris Schenkel Award are in the house broadcasting this afternoon's game. CU's **Larry Zimmer**, the 2009 winner, and Cal's **Joe Starkey**, the '10 honoree, were both honored for their long-time contributions to college football and their tenure with their current programs. The award is named for the late ABC broadcaster who was one of the first national premier college football announcers.

9/11 COMMEMORATION To recognize the 10th anniversary of those who perished in the cowardly terrorism acts of Sept. 11, 2001, CU is honoring First Responders and the military with a video tribute and a moment of silence prior to the national anthem. One of the representatives of the military will be retired General **John Sattler**; a student-athlete himself at the U.S. Naval Academy (a three-time participant in the NCAA wrestling championships), he would hold several key posts in the U.S. armed forces. Those included Commander, Combined Joint Task Force, Horn of Africa; Director of Operations, US Central Command, Tampa, Fla.; Commanding General, First Marine Expeditionary Force (IMEF) and Commander, Marine Forces Central Command in Iraq, Afghanistan and the Horn of Africa for all branches of our armed forces. During that time he also commanded the Marine Expeditionary Force in combat, most notably as the commanding General in The Battle of Fallujah — the largest battle for the U.S. since the '68 TET offensive; it is recognized as one of the greatest battles in Marine Corps history. Prior to his retirement, he served as the Director for Strategic Plans and Policy the Joint Staff at the Pentagon.

NEW P.A. MAN As most know, **Alan Cass** retired last year as CU's public address announcer; he held the post since 1982. CU's new voice of Folsom Field is **Conor McGahey**, 26, who is the game operations coordinator for Colorado Avalanche and the Colorado Mammoth. The '07 DU graduate has been doing public address since 2005 for the University of Denver (hockey, basketball, lacrosse) and fills in for the Avalanche on occasion. He might be a good luck charm; when Cass was ill in 2007, McGahey filled in and announced the Oklahoma game, when the Buffs upended the No. 3 Sooners, 27-24.

THE LOOKOUT Here are some things to look for in today's game from the Colorado perspective:

- ☒ **TB Rodney Stewart** has 2,796 career rushing yards, good for fifth all-time at CU; he's zeroing in on 3,000 yards, but is 163 yards away from passing Charlie Davis (1971-73; 2,958) into fourth.
- ☒ **TB Brian Lockridge** has 948 career kickoff return yards, needing 52 to reach 1,000 which will make him the 101st player in CU history to reach 1,000 yards in a statistical category.

THE WEEK AHEAD Sunday is now the team day off (no interviews); Monday is video review and a short practice, mostly conditioning (5:10-5:30); **Jon Embree's** weekly press luncheon is Tuesday (11:30 a.m. lunch, 12:00 Embree, 12:30 selected players), with practice roughly from 4-6 p.m. Tuesday and Wednesday and 4-5:30 on Thursday, with a Friday walk-through (in Boulder) ahead of next Saturday's game against Colorado State (11:30 a.m., FSN). Interview windows are Monday through Wednesday from 12:45-2:00 and after practice.

LOCKERROOM POLICY... Colorado's lockerroom is closed; **Jon Embree** and 3-4 players will speak to the media in the defensive meeting room on the sub-basement level (B-2) of the Dal Ward Athletic Center; additional players are available in the hallway outside CU's lockerroom. Associate SID **Curtis Snyder** will coordinate the conference; assistant SID **Andrew Green**, GA **Cole Mickelson** and student assistant **Anthony Lepine** will coordinate player interviews (no deadline to submit requests). **David Plati** coordinates notes and the injury report.

THE WEATHER The temperature at kickoff is expected to be right around 70 degrees (high of 76 forecast); no precipitation is expected and the skies should be sunny; winds will be in the 5-8 mph range from the south.

- **Last Time Rain at Folsom:** light rain fell in the second half on Oct. 14, 2006 vs. Texas Tech.
- **Last Heavy Rain at Folsom:** fourth quarter on Sept. 14, 1996 vs. Michigan (most/all of game: Sept. 11, 1982 vs. California).
- **Last Snow at Folsom:** throughout the game on Nov. 11, 2000 vs. Iowa State (snow has fallen during a game at Folsom just six times since 1949).
- **Last Significant Winds at Folsom:** first half on Sept. 18, 2008 vs. West Virginia (18-35 mile per hour gusts).
- **Last "Game Affecting" Winds at Folsom:** all game long on Nov. 11, 1995 vs. Missouri (wind gusts of 30 to 67 miles per hour).

INSTITUTIONAL COMMERCIAL FORMAT (Radio/Local TV)

2011

The basic **3-3-3-3** commercial format applies to non-network television broadcasts (three each in the first, second, third and fourth quarters). The below are all guaranteed and are the only breaks; here are the actual lengths of each, including the 10 seconds of both lead-in and get-out time:

A fourth break of 1:50 that follows the completion of a game may be moved into the fourth quarter during a natural timeout (occurring after a score or during a team-called timeout). As always, the intent is to not call a media timeout that will interrupt the flow of the game, e.g., each team having one possession at the start of each half if the team that gets the ball first commits a turnover. In those rare instances where there are not three natural breaks in a quarter, timeouts not taken in the first and third quarters transfer to the next quarter (and only at an appropriate time). All team timeouts not utilized as part of the media commercial format will be 35-seconds in length; the 25-second clock will start at the end of these 35 seconds, so timeouts taken by the media are at their own risk.

INSTANT REPLAYS: Depending on the flow of the game, there is an OPTION for a commercial break for no longer than 60 seconds upon a booth review.

Break between 1st & 2nd Quarters: 130 seconds (2:10).

Break between 3rd & 4th Quarters: 130 seconds (2:10).

Overtime: If there is overtime, television will not break away and remain live through the coin toss for the overtime period. Following the toss, there will be a 150-second break (2:30) taken prior to the start of the first overtime period. There will be a 110-second break (1:50) after each overtime period (if a team takes its one allowed timeout during an overtime period, the length is 90 seconds (1:30) and will NOT be extended for television).

REMINDER / NCAA RULE: The play clock will start upon return from the commercial break at the red hat signal; that clock will be 25 seconds in length and NOT the 40 between plays. **TEAM TIMEOUTS** not utilized as media timeouts will be 35-second breaks (the 25-second play clock starts at end of 35 seconds).

WIRELESS & ETHERNET INFO The Fred Casotti Press Box has its own wireless network (or SSID) to help battle problems from electronic use in the stands (iPods, etc.). Media should select the wireless network **PBNET** and follow the instructions on screen. Additionally, there are several Ethernet connections along the first row, with a connection box complete with cords every three or four seats. There is one thing all should be aware of: you will be going through the CU system to access the Internet, so you will need to have the latest virus protection software and all windows updates should be installed to protect both our system and your laptops (otherwise, you may not attain access).

Should **PBNET** be down or not functioning properly, **UCB WIRELESS** is our backup service. Instructions are provided below and we also have ITS personnel on hand; the access codes UCBWIRELESS for this season (2011-12) are: **Login**—confatha / **Password**—NVgERcfS_1

Until the computer is registered, the only network connection allowed will be to the registration web pages. More information can be found at <http://www.colorado.edu/its/networking/dhcpreg.html>.

HOW TO REGISTER A COMPUTER ON THE NETWORK

1. **TCP/IP Network settings must be set to automatically obtain IP and DNS server addresses.**
2. **Open a web browser on your computer (Windows computers must use Internet Explorer).**
 - A. Windows computers will automatically be scanned for known vulnerabilities.
 - B. Updates/patches must be installed before registration will be successful. Links will be available.
 - C. Once required updates are completely installed, start at #1 again.
3. **Review, then click to "accept" policy on Use of CU-Boulder's Computing and Network Resources.**
4. **Enter your CU Guest login name (confatha) and password (NVgERcfS_1).**
5. **Enter your name and organization under Computer Owner Name.**
6. **Submit. Receive successful registration message.**
7. **Power off computer. Restart.**

2001 BIG 12 CHAMPION TEAM REUNION

At halftime, CU is honoring the 10th anniversary of its 2001 Big 12 Conference championship team; that squad finished 10-3 and ranked No. 9 in the nation, but after an opening 24-22 loss to Fresno State in the Jim Thorpe Classic game, reeled off 10 wins in its next 11 games. Included at the end of the run was a demolition of No. 2 Nebraska, 62-36, and then a 39-37 triumph over No. 3 Texas in the league title game. Here's the list of 51 players returning as of Friday afternoon (six are still in the NFL and couldn't attend, and **WR Jeremy Bloom** is handling sideline duties for FSN for the Virginia Tech at East Carolina game); head coach **Gary Barnett** is also back, with four assistants from that team on the current staff: **Jon Embree, Eric Bieniemy, Brian Cabral** and **Steve Marshall**:

SERIES HISTORY—CU VS. CALIFORNIA

The Colorado-California series is rather brief, with Cal leading by a **3-2** margin, with the first five games all between 1968 and 1982 until the series was resumed last year. The first game in the series was in Berkeley, with Cal breaking a scoreless halftime tie with a third quarter touchdown en route to a 10-0 win; that was the only game of the four in Berkeley. The next three all were in Boulder: in 1972, the No. 2-ranked Buffs methodically dispatched Cal, 20-10; in 1975, the Buffs captured a 34-27 victory, and in 1982, Cal came into Boulder and won in a rainstorm, 31-17. This year's game is the back end of a home-and-home series and is thus a non-conference game since the Buffs were originally slated to join the Pac-12 in 2012. CU coach **Jon Embree** is 0-0 against California, while Cal coach **Jeff Tedford** is 1-0 against Colorado.

SERIES DID YOU KNOW?—The 1982 game was one of the occasional though rare instances where both programs were playing their first game under a new head coach: **Bill McCartney** for Colorado and **Joe Kapp** for California. Cal won the game in a rain storm, 31-17, and McCartney got his first win the following Saturday at Washington State (12-0) en route to a 2-8-1 season. Cal finished the year with a 7-4 mark, ending of course with a 25-20 win over a John Elway-led Stanford team in the infamous game where Stanford's band had run out on to the field at the end.

SERIES SIGNATURE ANNIVERSARY GAME— 36th (nothing on the usual 5/10-year synch): in 1975, in the wildest game in the series, the Buffaloes won 34-27 in Boulder. The scoreboard lit up with 61 points in the first three quarters, and **David Williams'** 12-yard run put CU ahead by the final score with 2:25 left in the third quarter. At that point, the defenses took over for the final 17:25; Cal's last ditch effort with 30 seconds remaining ended at the CU 26, where current Buff linebacker coach **Brian Cabral** intercepted a pass to essentially end the game. It was the first interception of Cabral's career, coming in his sophomore year; he'd go on to swipe three more the rest of his career.

BAY AREA REVENGE WEEKEND?

No doubt many of the San Francisco Bay Area media will spend three or four days on the Front Range, as the Denver Broncos open the 2011 NFL season Monday (Sept. 12). There's an irony to the weekend: in 2010, the Buffs lost at California, 52-7, or by 45 points, while the Broncos fell behind 35-0 to the Oakland Raiders in the first quarter en route to their worst home loss in history, 59-14 (yep, 45 points). Now despite the obviously lopsided score, Cal used turnovers and field position to pull away from CU and got over half its yards in the fourth quarter against CU's second-team defense, but the opposite was true for the Broncos, as from the get-go the Raiders dominated (leading 38-0 with 7:38 left in the first half). So you might bill this as a "revenge weekend," Front Range vs. Bay Area.
