WEATHER CONDITIONS: Temperature: 72 degrees at 1:30 P.M. / Humidity: 34 percent / Wind: East at 7 mph / Skies: Sunny

COIN TOSS: Colorado wins the toss and defers to the second half; California receive and will defend the south goal, CU will kickoff and defend the north goal.

FIRST QUARTER

Castor to kickoff for Colorado. Deep for California is Edmond and Sofele. The kickoff is taken by Edmond at the CA3 and returned **27** yards (Castor, Harlos)



CALIFORNIA GOLDEN BEARS (14:49)

- 1-10 CA30 *Maynard. Sofele rushes up the middle for **6** yards (Harigan)
- 2-4 CA36 Sofele rushes around right tackle for **0** yards (Orms)
- 3-4 CA36 Maynard pass incomplete on the right side, intended for Jones, dropped
- 4-4 CA36 Anger to punt. Richardson deep to receive. Anger punts **39** yards to the CO25, downed

Colorado Head Coach Jon Embree

General – “Disappointed. I thought we would win. We continually find a way not to finish. I’m not taking anything away from Cal. Coach Tedford, they’ve obviously have had their road issues so this is a big win for them to come in here and get a win, especially since we took the momentum from them late in the game. They found a way to win the game. Congratulations to them, but I’m very disappointed.”

On Discipline In Game – “The one in regulation, I’m ok with it. Close, it is what it is. The first half penalties, there are no excuses, I don’t understand the issues of snapping a football. I’ll get that fix; that is on me. I will get that fixed. The offensive penalties were self-inflicting fouls and then we kicked the ball out of bounds again. We will get a guy that can kick it inbounds.”

On O-line Penalties Being A Result Of New Players – “It doesn’t matter if you snap the ball on one, it is on one. I can get the Superior little league to do that. We will have to be able to snap the ball. It doesn’t matter who is in there. We shouldn’t have that issue.”

On The Struggles Of The Running Game In The Red Zone – “That was part of it, I thought the last play we ran – the one that was almost picked – I thought that really had a chance. I thought P-Rich [Paul Richardson] rushed it a little bit. He had a great game, he just needed to be a little more patient. Tyler [Hansen] needed to be a little higher with the ball. We did have some issues; I will have to look at the tape to see if it was the inability to run down there. I thought they fought their butts off, I don’t know when the head coach decided to go for that fourth-and-inches – I don’t know if that was in the red zone. We started to look like an offense; we started to look like a team that knew what they were doing. They knew what they were doing with the football, it was the Tyler Hansen that I expected to see last week. Rodney [Stewart] played well, he ran hard. What do you say about Paul Richardson, all of the guys showed up and did the roles that they were supposed to, we just have to win. We have to win.”

On What He Told The Team In The Locker Room – “I told them that close isn’t good enough.”

On Cal WR Keenan Allen – “We were just playing defense, we were just playing what we play. We didn’t do anything special for Keenan Allen. They have two good receivers, you just can’t game plan for one. You just have to do your stuff and make plays.”

On If WR Paul Richardson Surprised Him At All – “No. I think Paul Richardson is a star in the making and we are seeing it. I told him late in the game that he has to run more. We have to get into better shape so he doesn’t get gassed. I have to give credit to No. 1 on Cal [Steve Williams], he made a terrific play in knocking that ball out right down in the red zone. I can’t remember if it was overtime or at the end of regulation, but it was a heck of a play by that kid. If he touches it, he catches it. It is always great to have that as a quarterback and as a head coach.”

On Injuries – “[Ryan] Dannewitz I think is fine. [Jack] Harris – and don’t quote me on this – but either has a broken bone in his leg or has a severe sprain. I can’t remember, I was getting so many injury reports. Hansen is fine, he was just cramping. He was getting tired at the end running around and scrambling. It was a little bit warmer on the field than the guys anticipated.”

On His Makeshift Offensive Line – “We didn’t play good enough – we lost. I don’t care if we run for two yards or 1,000 yards, we have to win the game. I don’t care how many sacks, we have to find a way to win. So we didn’t play good enough.”

On The No-call On P Darragh O’Neill Being Taken Down – “The official ruled that it was partially blocked so it is what it is. I don’t know what happened after that, that led to points. That is what it is going to be frustrating because you will watch this game and you are just going to be sick to be sitting here 0-2. So many opportunities, so many chances.”

On The Offense Progressing Being A Positive – “Yes, but I also expected to be 2-0. That team and that staff expected to be 2-0 and we are not. I don’t want to sound sour, I don’t want to diminish what the kids have done, but we came here to win. We prepared and we trained to win. Not to be close, not to ‘Oh, next week’ – it is too much work and it is too hard and ‘so close’ ain’t it.”

On Overtime Summing Up The Team’s Running Game – “I don’t know what happened because we ran a play called ‘Blast.’ It’s downhill and up the gut. We’ve been hitting them with it and I don’t know if someone fell off the block or missed a cut – I don’t know what happened. That little stretch and then fourth-and-one, we went for it early in the game. If we are going to be what we say we are, if we are going to have that identity that we want to have in this program and in this offense, those have to be no brainers. That is the only way you can fix it, is to keeping grinding on it.”

On Keeping Morale Up – “It starts with me. When they see me Monday, I am going to be optimistic. I am going to point out the good, the bad and the ugly, and start motivating them and preparing them to try and go win a football game. I am not going to let them drag around. We are going to go out, we are going to practice, we are going to coach them hard, we are going to keep being demanding, and we are not going to lower the standard. We are not going to give them the old, ‘atta boy.’ I keep the standard where it is at. We the coaching staff has to get them to that standard somehow, someway. Part of it is putting players in position to make plays and I think the one negative about being in a new staff, you get kids into game situations and you really don’t know who some of the guys are – the ones who are playmakers in certain situations – and obviously as we continue to grow as a staff and as a team, we will get better at that. But we have to keep them at that standard. Nobody is going to let them feel sorry for themselves. CSU does not feel sorry for us at 0-2. The Showdown at Mile High, we have one team undefeated, we have one team coming in without a win – so let’s go.”

On Not Taking Advantage Of Cal’s Third-And-Long Situations – “As a defense, it’s all about third down. We had a situation with the field goal issues that they were having. If we knocked that pass down, forced them into a long field goal, I would like to think that we would win. We left them off the hook in a couple third-and-longs. The last touchdown drive they had, they had a third-and-12 or something like that. You can’t give those up. You work too hard to get them in that situation and then to let a guy to throw the ball and get it, that is poor on our part.”



Embree continued

On PK Will Oliver – “It was the reason I picked him. It was a gut feeling. That kid is going to be good and he was the answer for us. I don’t know how many he made for us. The most impressive was the low snap. He didn’t panic. He only had one step and he knocked it through like no big deal, but we also kicked a ball out of bounds, so we have to fix that too. There was a reason why we picked Will. He is doing a good job and he is going to have to continue. All that he has to understand is that the expectations – Right now he has been gambling with house money and he is going to have to start gambling with his own money. He has to be ready on take that step.”

On Oliver’s Kicking Range – “He is like a wide receiver that is always open. He is like, ‘Coach, I can go 58 this way and 50 the other way,’ and I say, ‘I’m not going to let you kick a 58-yard field goal.’ That is one of the reasons why I love the kid – he doesn’t know any better. I don’t know what his range is, but I believe in this team and that is why I went for it on fourth-and-short. After the halftime speech, that is why I went for it on fourth-and-short coming out. There were some things said in there and I wanted them to understand that I meant it. There is a few times that I told Eric [Bieniemy] to be ready for fourth down. I believe in this team and I believe in every guy. The scout team, I trust them.”

On Atmosphere In First Home Game As A Head Coach – “It is Folsom Field; it is how we do it. We have to get a few more people here. That is how we do it here. I expect that from the crowd every time we come out. This is a special place. There are a lot of things that give us home field advantage here. I’m sure if you ask those guys, once they take their oxygen masks off, at Cal about the altitude – ask them about the crowd. Those are advantages that we need. We are at the point in our program that we need all of the advantages that we can get. I want to thank the people today for coming out. We need to continue to fill this place up. We need everybody in the state to help us win.”



California Head Coach Jeff Tedford

On The Missed Extra Point - "Obviously that's something we have to get better at. We cleaned it up after that but it should have never have come down to that. That's the second week in a row that we've done that."

On What They Did Well - "Defensively in the red zone, we made some big plays. QB Zach Maynard made some huge throws down the stretch, the one on 3rd-and-10 down the right side and the one in OT down the left side. He did a nice job of hanging in there. It was the second game he missed a couple balls but he also made some big plays. He earned his stripes today. After that first pick, he did a good job of making some nice decisions."

On Tailback C.J. Anderson - "C.J. did a great job running through the tackles and obviously that big touchdown. And today, he earned some more playing time."

On CU Wide Receiver Paul Richardson - "We knew that Paul Richardson was a very good player. They had a nice design. He did some things one on one and they made some nice throws. Once he gets in the open field, he's really hard to catch."

On Defense Against Tyler Hansen - "We didn't disrupt his throws and when he pulled it down he always got positive yards. They did a lot of max protection stuff when he was in there. They did a very good job with one on one max protection."

On Zach Maynard Getting Off To A Slow Start - "The first series we dropped the ball on third down, that wasn't Zach's fault."

On The Offense Getting Off To A Slow Start - "We just have to execute, it doesn't matter who it is, we just have to execute. It wasn't about Zach starting slowly; it's the offense that needs to make plays. I don't remember what happened on the second series but on the first series we have a first down if we catch the ball."

On What He Thinks Of Colorado - "They are a very good football team. We were playing in a very hostile environment. The fans did a great job for them. They are a good football team. Last week, I think it was a fluke when Hawaii beat them. Hawaii's quarterback made some plays pulling it down, but anything designed, I think Colorado's defense played very well."

On What The Win Says About This Team - "To go up and then have them go back up and in a seesaw game like that, I still believe our guys are going to make plays. Our guys continued to fight and all the things we talked about, it validates everything that we've been working for and believe in."

On QB Zach Maynard - "He is a passionate person and a passionate competitor, he has guys around him who are also passionate competitors. Everybody today stepped up and made plays. Anthony (Miller) made a big one handed catch in the end zone, Keenan (Allen) made some big catches as well. Guys took turns running the football. We had too many penalties down the stretch but then even still we fought back. When we were way back in overtime we showed a lot of character."

On Penalties And Mistakes - "It wasn't too bad there were some (penalties) down the stretch but I thought it was a pretty clean game. Really no turnovers beside that first interception, very few penalties, I thought it was a great clean game."

On His Thoughts Prior To The Final Play - "As soon as we lined up I knew it was a touchdown. The corner was playing tight and Keenan (Allen) can juke people, so just depending on a good throw I knew it was a touchdown."

On C.J. Anderson Providing Depth - "Isi (Sofele) is pretty beat up right now, he played a physical game. So someone will have to help take the load off of Isi. Isi is our starter, we just need the one-two punch."

What This Win Means For His Team - "It is very important because we took a young team on the road and we fell behind and had to find a way to win. It was a total team effort I thought. We played well on special teams, on defense we allowed some big plays but we held strong when it counted."

On Injuries - "Isi (Sofele) was banged up, Zach (Maynard) is beaten up a little bit but I don't think anyone came out of the game for injuries."

QB Tyler Hansen

On Throwing For 474 yards – “I’d rather have the win, I’d be ok throwing 20 yards and getting a ‘W’. It feels good getting the passing game going, we got to get the running game going though, we got to get those guys up front to pull the ball. It seemed like we didn’t get the running game going until overtime.”

On The Offensive Line – “They did a good job, I don’t think I was sacked. We got to get the running game going for sure.”

On Cal Defense – “They were doing some things coverage wise, their safeties were aggressive, really low on the alignment and they were real aggressive on the run game and their corners were playing tough, they were giving us the short stuff.”

On Paul Richardson – “He has this look to him during a game or practice where you know his in the zone. He had that look again today; he’s a special player.”

On Overtime – “They did a good job up front; those guys up front were coming up off the ball, we need to get every play and act like it’s the most important play. Those two plays where we were inside the five they did a job plugging up the hole.”

On The Offense Succeeding – “It’s real important; I’m the leader of that group. I think that when we do everything right and guys do their assignments I think we are really good offensively. The first half we had those first two drives it came down to that fourth and one that we didn’t get. We get touchdowns on those first two drives, so it’s a whole different ball game. I think we did a good job of starting fast this week.”

On Losing The Run Game – “I wouldn’t say losing; certain guys are losing individual battles and certain plays. We just need those five up front to mold and play together and play as one unit. Especially in the running game we need to play as a unit.”

On Embree In The Locker Room – “He just talked about when is enough, enough? When is someone going to step up and say, ‘This is enough, I’m tired of this, we’re going to win.’ The message was simple, he was fired up.”

On Jon Embree – “Absolutely Coach Embree did a great job motivating us. I love the guy; I’ll go out there and do whatever I need to do for the guy. I think he does a great job motivating us to go play.”

On The 0-2 Start Before CSU – “We played two good teams, Hawaii is no slouch and Cal is a good team. We’re down to 0-2. Next week is a must win for us, we have to treat it like a playoff game.”

On Rodney Stewart – “Speedy screen passes are working for us. He kind of hides behind those offensive linemen and backers and kind of straddles them, and he has a good feel for it, and we are going to keep using it. I think every week we need to have a screen to Rodney.”

On The Confidence Of His Kicker – “Will (Oliver) does a great job. I’m really proud of him. He’s a freshman, and he looks like he is 12. He steps up and that’s a pressure kick, it’s 3rd-and-27 you got to make that field goal to go into overtime and he steps up and makes that kick so we are really proud of him.”

On The Advice From The ‘01 Big 12 Champion Team – “They did. They said go out here in the second half and get after those guys. We were playing well and doing what we needed to do, but the score wasn’t what we wanted. They said, ‘Keep fighting, keep fighting,’ and we did.”

On The Emotional Loss – “We have seniors crying in the locker room, there is no one is talking, it is a real down locker room because we were so close and we wanted this one for Coach Embree and the 2001 team. We were so close, we were fighting, we were up and down, and tied; it takes a toll on you. Coach Embree, he took it pretty hard.”

LB Jon Major

On The 1st-and-30 in Overtime – “You got to give them props for making that play. You know that’s an inch away from winning the ball game for us. You know that’s just the way it falls; that’s football.”

On Overtime – “Credit to them, they made the plays when they had to and they made one more than us.”

On If He’s Played With Someone With Paul Richardson’s Explosiveness – “Not in a long time, not here.”

On Bouncing Back From A Loss – “It’s a lot of emotion; a lot of fire. Mark my words, but this is going to be a pivotal moment of the season, so we’ve got to respond.”

On The Inconsistent Play Of The Defense – “Yeah I guess right now we got to be more consistent. We are there to make the plays, we just got to make them... It’s just making plays that are there to be made. I think if you watch the film, watch the replay you have the opportunity, you just have to capitalize.”

LB Douglas Rippy

On The 1st-and-30 in Overtime – “It wasn’t good coverage, it was just good play by the receiver. We played our hearts out all four quarters, especially in overtime.”

On Paul Richardson’s Play – “You know that’s P-Rich, that’s him every day. Obviously he’s very persistent and that’s what he does in practice, so you know whatever he does in practice he does in the game.”

On Bouncing Back From A Loss – “We got a game next week, you know this is already behind us. At the end of the day it’s a game, but you still want to win, and we got to get ready for the next one.”

On Exploiting The Secondary- "Every little hole I saw I tried to attack, whenever I saw an opening I took it."

On Throwing The Ball Downfield More - "The coaches understood that was a strength of ours, and we rehearsed it all week, so when we executed on the down field plays (it was because) we were well prepared."

Thoughts On Breaking The Single-Game Receiving Yardage record- "I didn't even know I broke the record, but without the coaches putting together the game plan and without (Tyler Hansen) being able to throw the ball it would not have happened."

On What The Offense Can Learn From This Game - "That the game is never over until it's over. We made plays, we got excited, we got the lead, then we just (needed) to finish, and that's what we didn't do."

On Settling For Field Goals In The Red Zone - "It was sickening. We see (scoring in the Red Zone) as a strength of ours. It was unfortunate that we were getting down there, and only getting three points out of it. I expect us to be able to fix those issues and get those touchdowns instead of field goals."

On Importance Of The Run Game - "It's very important, the run game is what we have been working on, and we have a really strong running game when we are clicking and all doing our jobs. It's our job (as receivers) to make the blocks on the perimeter and spring (Rodney Stewart) free, and we can do that, and we are going to do that (in the future)."

WR Toney Clemons

On Kickoff Returns- "We need to take advantage of the opportunities we get when they kick it off. We need guys to block their man and return men to return it the way (special teams coach J.D. Brookhart) draws it up, and just hit it. We were definitely better about that last year, and we can be even better this year. QUICKLY Colorado dropped to 5-5 in overtime games, 5-4 in single OT affairs and 3-3 when the opponent plays defense first ... CU's last OT game was on Sept. 18, 2008 here in Folsom, a 17-14 win over West Virginia ... Colorado went from allowing seven sacks last week (on 37 called pass plays) to zero today on 49; the downside of that is today marked the first time the Buffs have ever lost a game when not committing a turnover or allowing a sack; CU is 14-1 since 1972 in such situations ... CU had three sacks, giving the Buffs at least one in 32 of the last 33 games ... Colorado's 582 yards of offense was its most since recording 518 against Nebraska in a 65-51 win on Nov. 23, 2007 ... CU had 474 yards passing, its first 400-yard game since throwing for 401 against Texas A&M in Boulder on Oct. 8, 2005; it tied for the second most passing yards in CU history, matching the number against San Jose State in 1999 and behind only 533 against NE Louisiana in 1995.

—TE Ryan Deehan: his 37-yard touchdown reception was the third TD of his career, as well as the longest play (old: 34 yards).
 —After waiting five years, OT Sione Tau saw his first action from scrimmage after OT Jack Harris left with a leg injury; Tau did play on the FG/PAT team last week and earlier in the game.
 —WR Tyler McCulloch made his first career start, the seventh player at CU since 1973 to start a game as a true freshman.

Richardson now has six career plays of 50 yards or longer (four of 60), and his 10 career TD catches have covered 362 yards (3, 60, 62, 4, 3, 50, 15, 21, 66, 78). ◆ **California Golden Bears (2-0, 0-0 Pac-12) 36, Colorado Buffaloes (0-2, 0-0 Pac-12) 33 (OT); Folsom Field, Boulder (September 10)**

TB RODNEY STEWART (24-73, 0 TD RUSH; 7-86 0 TD RECEIVING)

He remained in fifth place on CU's all-time rushing yards list, inching closer to fourth, closing the game with **2,869** yards; Charlie Davis ('71-73) holds fourth with 2,958. With the 86 receiving yards, he now had 582 in his career, becoming just the 12th player in CU history to record 500-plus yards both rushing and receiving in a Buff career.

PERICAK BUSTS THROUGH Junior DT Will Pericak became the first player to block an extra point since **DE James Garee** batted one away against Clemson in the 2005 Champs Sports Bowl. Overall, opponents had made **154** in a row (**151** regular season), the last miss coming on a wide kick by Baylor in 2007; but the enemy had tried **195** PAT kicks without a Buff breaking through to reject one.

PK WILL OLIVER (4-4 FG, 3-3 PAT, 15 PTS) Oliver, a true freshman, became just the second freshman to kick a 50-yard or longer field goal in school history, with his 52-yard boot in the second quarter the longest ever by frosh. The short list of 50-plus field goals by freshman Buffs:

52 Will Oliver vs. California in Boulder, Sept. 10, 2011
51 Tom Field vs. Oregon in Boulder, Sept. 8, 1979
50 Tom Field vs. Oklahoma State in Boulder, Nov. 10, 1979

Field was also a true freshman; that game, incidentally was the first college football game televised by ESPN, though tape-delayed. For those wondering, Mason Crosby's long as a frosh

was from 44 yards. Oliver also tied the freshman record for most field goals made in a game with four (Aldrich was also a true frosh), and his 15 points is the most by a freshman specialist in a game:

Cal Football Postgame Notes – at Colorado (Saturday, September 10, 2011)

Cal-Colorado Series History

- The Golden Bears visited Boulder today for the first time since 1982 when Cal came away with a 31-17 victory. Today's contest was the second in a home-and-home series the schools scheduled for the 2010 and 2011 seasons prior to the Buffaloes joining the Bears in the Pac-12. The 2011 game will be played as a non-conference contest and not count as part of either team's league record, although the two schools are now in the same league.

With today's 36-33 overtime victory by Cal, the Bears have now won the last three meetings. Following the win in 1982, Cal was a 52-7 winner over Colorado at Memorial Stadium on Sept. 11, 2010. The teams have played only five other times in their history, with Cal a 10-0 winner in the first ever meeting in Berkeley (Sept. 28, 1968) before Colorado won each of the first two of three meetings in Boulder (20-10 on Sept. 9, 1972; 34-27 on Sept. 13, 1975).

Tedford Ties Cal's All-Time Win Mark

- Head coach Jeff Tedford tied Cal's all-time record for victories with the Golden Bears' win at Colorado. Tedford is now 74-42 (.638), equaling the school's all-time leader Andy Smith (74, 1916-25). Tedford became Cal's all-time modern-era victory leader as well as its all-time leader in games coached during the 2010 season.

Second Win in a Row on the Road

- Cal picked up its second straight win in a true road game dating back to a victory at Washington State in the final road game of the 2010 season. Cal had lost five straight true road games prior to the last two victories.

Jones Picks up 100th Career Catch

- Marvin Jones picked up the 100th catch of his Cal career with his first catch of the game. On the day, he finished with five receptions for 55 yards. On the season, he has totaled 10 grabs for 173 yards and two touchdowns last week against Fresno State. For his career, he now has 104 catches for 1597 and 12 touchdowns.

Sofele Garners 20 Carries for Second Straight Game

- Isi Sofele finished the day with 20 rushes for 82 yards, giving him 44 carries and 170 yards with two touchdowns on the season. Last week, he had 24 carries for 88 yards and the two scores against Fresno State.

Keenan Allen Comes Up Huge

- Keenan Allen made the two biggest catches of the day in Cal's overtime drive. He hauled in the game-winning touchdown from Zach Maynard after snagging a huge catch inside the 5-yard-line two plays before. He finished the day with six receptions for 104 yards (including a season-high 37-yard reception) and a touchdown. It was the third 100-yard performance of his career, second of 2011. Allen also completed a 27-yard pass to quarterback Zach Maynard. On the year, Allen now has 14 catches for 216 yards and a touchdown. For his career, Allen now has 60 receptions for 706 yards and six touchdowns.

Zach Maynard Throws Four Touchdown Passes

- Zach Maynard completed 17-of-34 passes for 239 yards with four touchdown passes and one interception. He completed passes to seven different receivers. His four touchdown passes were the most by a Cal quarterback since Kevin Riley had four in a home game vs. Colorado on Sept. 11, 2010. Maynard also had a 27-yard reception from wide receiver Keenan Allen. Maynard has now completed 33-of-69 passes for 505 yards with six touchdowns and two interceptions on the season.

Mychal Kendricks and D.J. Holt Pace Bears in Tackles

- Mychal Kendricks and D.J. Holt paced the Bears with 7.5 tackles against Colorado. Kendricks also chipped in a tackle for loss (5 yards). Kendricks is in his fourth season at Cal and has played in all 40 games possible during his

career. He is the Bears' active career leader in tackles (168.5), tackles for loss (25.5), sacks (11.0), fumble recoveries (5) and blocked kicks (1). Holt's three career forced fumbles are the most by any active Cal player, while his 151.5 career tackles are second to Kendricks.

Anthony Miller Picks up Two TD Catches for First Time

- Anthony Miller picked up two touchdown catches for the first time in his career. Miller's two TD grabs doubled his career total to four.

Nico Dumont Catches TD Pass on First Career Touch

- Nico Dumont scored on a two-yard touchdown pass from Zach Maynard with 14:14 remaining in the second quarter. The catch came on the first touch of Dumont's career, marking the first time a Cal player has scored on the first touch of his career since Anthony Miller's two-yard TD reception from Nate Longshore with 2:41 remaining in Cal's 24-17 Emerald Bowl win over Miami, Fla., on Dec. 27, 2008.

Offensive Line Now Has 95 Combined Starts

- The Bears' 2011 offensive line features several players with a significant amount of experience as the five members of the group that have started the first two games of the season have now combined to make 95 collegiate starts in Mitchell Schwartz (40), Justin Cheadle (25), Brian Schwenke (15), Matt Summers-Gavin (15) and Dominic Galas (3).

Cal Hits 30-Point Mark, Wins Again

- Cal is now 57-5 all-time when putting 30 points or more on the scoreboard under head coach Jeff Tedford, adding to its win total with today's 36-33 overtime victory at Colorado. When the Bears don't score at least 30 points, their record under Tedford is 17-37.

First Overtime Win in Five Years

Today's overtime game was the first time Cal played an overtime game since Oct. 21, 2006, when the Bears defeated Washington, 31-24. Marshawn Lynch scored the game-deciding touchdown. On the following Husky drive, Cal garnered an interception to end the game.

Turnover Margin a Key

The turnover battle has been emphasized since head coach Jeff Tedford's arrival in 2002 and rightly so. The Bears are 41-6 when committing fewer turnovers than opponents during the Tedford era, compared to 17-10 when tied and 16-26 when opponents win the battle. In conference games, the stats are even more decisive as Cal is 25-4 with a positive margin in turnovers, 10-7 when the turnover table is tied and 9-22 with a deficit. Cal and Fresno State both committed two turnovers (one interception, one fumble) in Cal's 36-21 win over the Bulldogs last Saturday. Zach Maynard was intercepted once in the game's only turnover today.

Penalty Differential

A big key to Cal's victory over Colorado on Saturday was the penalty differential. Colorado was penalized 13 times for 103 yards to the Bears' five penalties for 50 yards.

Lots of New Faces

A total of 15 Cal players – C.J. Anderson (Jr., TB), Michael Coley (Fr., S), Kameron Jackson (Fr., DB), Mustafa Jalil (Fr., DE), Kameron Krebs (Jr., LB), Mike Manuel (Jr., TB), Zach Maynard (Jr., QB), Chris McCain (Fr., LB), Stefan McClure (Fr., DB), Bryce McGovern (Fr., WR), Viliami Moala (Fr., DL), Richard Rodgers (Fr., TE), Brennan Scarlett (Fr., LB), Avery Sebastian (Fr., DB) and Cecil Whiteside (Fr., LB) – made their first appearance in a Cal uniform for the 2011 season opener against Fresno State.

Jed Barnett (Fr., P), Allan Bridgford (So., QB), Gabe King (Fr., DE) and Bill Tyndall (So., LT) are others on the two-deep that have yet to see action at Cal.
