- The historic first Pac-12 Conference game kicks off Saturday at the Los Angeles Coliseum where USC will host league-newcomer Utah at 4:30 p.m. PT (Versus).
- Cutting their teeth early . . . 69 true freshmen saw action last week for Pac-12 teams, as well as 86 redshirt freshmen. That's a total of 155 student-athletes (12.9 per team) who made their debuts. Here's the breakdown: Arizona 10 Fr./9 RFr., Arizona State 3/9, California 10/1, Colorado 6/5, Oregon 5/3, Oregon State 8/8, Stanford 4/12, UCLA 1/7, USC 3/6, Utah 4/8, Washington 6/8, Washington State 9/10.
- Several Pac-12 quarterbacks were impressive in opening weekend victories. Arizona's Nick Foles 34-42, 417 yds, 5 TD/0 INT; USC's Matt Barkley 34-45, 304 yds, 3 TD/0 INT. Arizona State's Brock Osweiler 19-26, 262 yds, 2 TD/1 INT, Stanford's Andrew Luck 17-26, 171 yds 2 TD/0 INT. WSU's Marshall Lobbestael 14-19, 230 yds, 2 TD/0 INT. That's a combined 118-158 (74.7%), 1,384 yds, 14 TD/1 INT.

In recognition of the first-ever Pac-12 football game and the 10th anniversary of 9/11, the Pac-12 has created a commemorative painted game ball that will be signed by every head coach and donated to the 9/11 Memorial (www.911memorial.org).

USC will host Utah in the first football game in Pac-12 history on September 10 at the Los Angeles Coliseum.

The commemorative ball departed August 30 on a 12-day journey throughout the Conference, stopping on each head coach's desk for an autograph before moving on to the next school. The two-week trek began in Oregon and will culminate in Los Angeles where the ball will be presented to Pac-12 Commissioner Larry Scott at midfield during pregame festivities Saturday, September 10.

Woods, a sophomore from Carson, Calif., in No. 25 USC's season-opening home win over Minnesota, Woods caught 17 passes for 177 yards in No. 25 USC's season-opening home win over Minnesota. The 17 receptions broke Johnnie Morton's school mark of 15 (set in 1993). It was the second-most receptions in a game by a Pac-12 receiver (2 shy of the record). Woods hauled in three touchdowns (7, 43 and 2 yards, all in the first half) to tie a school game record. He also returned three kickoffs for 73 yards. He had 11 grabs for 115 yards in the first half.

Trufant, a junior from Tacoma, Wash., led all both teams with a career-high 11 tackles in the Huskies' 30-27 win over reigning NCAA FCS champion Eastern Washington. Trufant also had perhaps the most important play of the game as he intercepted a pass in the end zone with just 29 seconds remaining in the final quarter. Additionally, Trufant forced a fumble that was recovered by the UW in the first quarter.

Folk, a senior from Woodland Hills, Calif., was a perfect 3-for-3 on field goals in the Huskies' 30-27 win over defending NCAA FCS champion Eastern Washington. All three of Folks field goals came from outside of 40 yards, as he hit from 53, 47 and 40 yards. His 53-yarder was just a yard shy of his career best.

Also nominated for offensive player of the week honors were quarterbacks **Nick Foles** of Arizona, **Brock Osweiler** of Arizona State, **Andrew Luck** of Stanford, and **Marshall Lobbestael** of Washington State, running backs **Malcolm Agnew** of Oregon State, **John White** of Utah and **Chris Polk** of Washington, wide receivers **Marvin Jones** of California and **Paul Richardson** of Colorado, and tight end **Joseph Fauria** of UCLA. Also nominated on defense were defensive end **C.J. Parish** of Arizona, linebackers **Vontaze Burfict** of Arizona State, **Mychal Kendricks** of California, **Shayne Skov** of Stanford, **Brian Blechen** of Utah and **Alex Hoffman-Ellis** of Washington State, and cornerback **Torin Harris** of USC. Also nominated for special teams play were returner **Jamal Miles** of Arizona State, tackle **Matt Kalil** of USC and place kickers **Jordan Williamson** of Stanford and **Coleman Petersen** of Utah.

Five different players hauled in at least five passes each, including senior WR **Juron Criner** who caught six passes for 151 yards and a touchdown. . . The game with Oklahoma State is the first of four straight games against ranked foes (Stanford, Oregon and USC follow).

It was the second consecutive game in Sun Devil Stadium Miles has returned a kick for a score, as he had a 99-yarder in last season's home finale against UCLA. Miles joins teammate Omar Bolden, Terry Battle and Whizzer White as the only Sun Devils in school history with two career kickoff return touchdowns. . . The Sun Devils produced 517 total yards in a balanced attack (300 passing/217 rushing) in the season-opening win over UC Davis. . . Junior QB **Brock Osweiler** checks in at six foot eight inches tall, making him the tallest quarterback in the FBS.

Beaver Notes: A school-record eight true freshmen played in the season-opener. That's not just a single-game record, but rather a single-season record, surpassing the seven who played during the 1997 season, head coach Mike Riley's first year in Corvallis. True freshmen **Brandin Cooks** (WR) and **Malcolm Agnew** (RB) started on Saturday. They are the first true freshmen in Oregon State history to start a season opener at either position. . . Agnew made perhaps the best debut in the history of the Oregon State program in the Beavers' 2011 opener against Sacramento State. The diminutive back from St. Louis, Mo., rushed for 223 yards and three touchdowns. Agnew's 223 yards rushing is the ninth-best single-game total in Oregon State history.

Golden Bear Notes: A matchup with new conference foe Colorado. However, this game is a return game and will not count in the Pac-12 standings. . . Senior WR **Marvin Jones** caught two touchdown passes for the second multi-touchdown game of his career (UCLA, 2009). Jones finished the game with five catches for 118 yards and two

touchdowns. It was Jones' fifth career 100-yard game. Sophomore WR **Keenan Allen** hauled in a career-high tying eight receptions for 112 yards, his second 100-yard game. The last time two Cal receivers had 100 yards receiving was in 2006 when DeSean Jackson and Lavelle Hawkins accomplished the same feat on Sept. 19, 2006.

Buffalo Notes: Senior QB **Tyler Hansen** became the 11th player to throw for 3,000 yards in a CU career, finishing with 223 yards against Hawai'i to give him 3,045; he passed Gale Weidner 1959-61, 3,033) into 10th all-time on the overall list. . . Senior TB **Rodney Stewart** rushed for 52 yards on 18 carries, and added 98 receiving yards on four catches for 150 all-purpose yards.

James had a career-high six receptions and a team-high 61 receiving yards. . . JR QB **Darron Thomas** set career marks with 31 completions and 54 attempts. He has at least one TD pass in all 14 career starts (and 14 consecutive appearances).

The UW's current five-game winning streak is the sixth-longest (tied) in the nation. Only Auburn (16), Stanford (9), Nevada & Ohio State (7) and Oklahoma (6) have longer current win streaks.

Cardinal Notes: The nine consecutive wins is the longest since 1951 when the team started off 9-0. It is the fourth-longest streak in school-history. . . The 59-yard kickoff return for senior WR **Chris Owusu** to start the second half, was the seventh KOR for 50 yards or more in his career. . . Junior QB **Andrew Luck** found seven different receivers during his 17-of-26 performance for 171 yards and two TDs. He also rushed for one TD, his sixth career rushing touchdown. His two TD passes were the 46th and 47th of his career, moving him into sole possession of fourth place. He now has 6,084 yards in his career, passing Guy Benjamin for sixth all-time. Next up on the TD charts: No. 3 Jim Plunkett (52 TD passes from 1968 to 1970).

230 yards and a pair of TDs. . . WSU had 11 different players catch passes as the team racked up 301 passing yards to go with 289 rushing yards. The 590 yards in total offense is its highest total since putting up 638 in the win over Portland State (9/20/08). . . The 60 points were the most since beating Southwestern Louisiana 77-7 (11/8/97).

White, a JC transfer making his first NCAA appearance, had the best debut for a Ute running back since 1998, when Mike Anderson rushed for 150 yards against Utah State. White netted 150 yards on 19 carries (7.9 average) and scored two touchdowns (one rushing, one receiving). Rowe logged nine tackles. Peterson, whose past experience was on the scout teams, made field goals of 37 and 44 yards and three PATs. . . Since 2003, Utah has compiled an 80-22 overall record (78%) for an average of nearly 10 wins a season

Trojan Notes: Junior QB **Matt Barkley** completed 34 passes against Minnesota to eclipse Todd Marinovich's USC record of 33 (set in

1989). Barkley had a 75.6% completion percentage (on 45 attempts) while passing for 304 yards with 3 TDs and no interceptions. He hit 16 passes in a row at one point. He was 18-of-20 in the first half for 163 yards. . . OG **Jeremy Galten** became the first JC transfer to go directly from junior college to USC and start a season opener at offensive guard since Derrick Deese in 1990 versus Syracuse and the first JC transfer to start immediately on the offensive line since Taitusi Lutui did so at tackle all of 2004. . . Redshirt freshman TB **D.J. Morgan** became the first USC freshman to start a season opener at tailback since C.J. Gable in 2006.

**OREGON TABBED TO WIN PAC-12 TITLE
IN PRESEASON MEDIA POLL**

LOS ANGELES -- Defending Pac-12 champion OREGON is the choice to win the 2011 Pac-12 Conference football title in a preseason poll of media members who regularly cover the league. The Ducks were listed in the top spot in the North Division by 29 of the 42 voters participating in the poll, collecting 239 points. Twenty-eight of those pollsters tabbed the Ducks to come out on top in the inaugural Pac-12 Championship Game. STANFORD was picked to finish second in the North Division, collecting the other 13 first-place votes in the balloting for the division race, with 11 of those members of the media casting a vote for the Cardinal to capture the Pac-12 title.

USC was picked to win the South Division with 230 points, edging out ARIZONA STATE, which tallied 207 points. Due to NCAA sanctions, USC is on probation and ineligible to participate in the postseason. Therefore, the Trojans would not be able to represent the South Division in the Pac-12 Championship Game. Should USC capture the South Division crown, the team finishing second would be the South Division's representative in the Pac-12 Championship Game. Arizona State collected 13 first-place votes in the division race, with three of the pollsters predicting a Pac-12 Championship crown for the Sun Devils.

The media poll has correctly selected the Conference Champion in 27 of 50 previous polls, including 10 of the last 11. Following are the results of the preseason media poll (points 6-5-4-3-2-1, first-place votes in parentheses):

PAC-12 CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

The inaugural Pac-12 Championship Football Game will take place Friday, December 2 at 8 p.m. ET/5 p.m. PT and telecast to a national audience on FOX. The Championship game will match the winner of the North Division vs. the winner of the South Division. The game will be played on the campus of the division winner with the best overall conference record. The winner of the inaugural Pac-12 Championship will earn the league's automatic BCS berth.

TIE-BREAK PROCEDURES TO DETERMINE DIVISION CHAMPIONS AND CHAMPIONSHIP GAME HOST

The Division Champion will be determined by the record in all games played (both divisional and cross-divisional) within the conference. In the event of a tie, the following procedures will be applied to determine the Pac-12 Championship Game representatives

Two-Team Tie.

1. Head-to-head competition between the two tied teams.
 - a. If no game is played between the two tied teams or that game ends in a tie, the following tie-breaking procedures would be applied:
2. Record in games played within the division
3. Record against the next highest placed team in the division (Based on record in all games played within the conference), proceeding through the division.
4. Record in common conference games.
5. Highest BCS Ranking following the last weekend of regular-season games.
6. Total number of wins in a 12-game season. The following conditions will apply to the calculation of the total number of wins:
 - a. Only one win against a team from the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision or lower division will be counted annually.
 - b. Any games that are exempted from counting against the annual maximum number of football contests per NCAA rules (current Bylaw 17.9.5.2) shall not be included.
7. Coin toss.

Multiple-Team Ties.

The following procedures will only be used to eliminate all but two teams, at which point the two-team tie-breaking procedure will be applied.

1. Head-to-head (Best record in games among the tied teams).
2. Record in games played within the division.
3. Record against the next highest placed team in the division (based on record in all games played within the conference), proceeding through the division.
4. Record in common conference games.
5. Highest BCS ranking following the last weekend of regular-season games.

Pac-12 Championship Game Host

The Pac-12 Championship Game Host will be determined by the record in all games played within the conference. In the event of a tie, the following procedures will be applied to determine the Pac-12 Championship Game host.

Tie-breaking Procedure.

1. Head-to-head, if applicable.
2. Highest BCS Ranking following the last weekend of Pac-12 regular-season games.
3. Record against the next highest-placed common opponent in the conference (based on record in all games played within the conference), proceeding through the conference.
4. Record in common conference games.
5. Coin toss.

PAC-12 BOWL ARRANGEMENTS - 2011-12

The second year of a four-year bowl cycle kicks in this season and the Pac-12 welcomes a new addition to the lineup. The Gildan New Mexico Bowl in Albuquerque will feature the Pac-12's seventh selection against an opponent from the Mountain West Conference. The Pac-12 Conference has agreements with seven bowl partners. The lineup is led by the Rose Bowl presented by Vizio, which is the destination for the Pac-12 champion, unless said champion is ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the final Bowl Championship Series rankings. If that were the case, the Pac-12 champion would play in the BCS National Championship Game hosted by the Allstate Sugar Bowl. Regardless of the disposition of the Pac-12 champion, a second Pac-12 team may be selected for an at-large berth in the Bowl Championship Series in any given year and other Pac-12 bowl partner arrangements provide for that occurrence. In addition to the Rose Bowl presented by Vizio, Pac-12 bowl partners include, in order of selection, the Valero Alamo Bowl in San Antonio, Bridgeport Education Holiday Bowl in San Diego, Hyundai Sun Bowl in El Paso, the MAACO Bowl Las Vegas, the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl in San Francisco, and the Gildan New Mexico Bowl in Albuquerque.
