Kickoff – Cal at Colorado (Saturday, Nov. 16, 2:30 p.m. PT)

Hitting the road for the final two weeks of the season, the Cal football team faces Colorado this week for the first time since winning in overtime the last time the teams met in 2011. Saturday's game marks the Golden Bears and Buffaloes will meet as conference opponents. While Colorado was in the Pac-12 when they last played, the game was a nonconference game that had been scheduled prior to Colorado joining the league. Cal leads the all-time series, 4-2, and has won the last three in a row.

The Bears rank third in the Pac-12 and eighth nationally in passing offense, averaging 345.3 yards per game, and will go up against a Colorado defense that ranks 11th in the conference allowing 273.4 passing yards per game.

The Cal rushing attack has improved the past two games and will face a Colorado rush defense ranks last in the conference (211.9 ypg). The Bears averaged a season-high 5.1 yards per carry last week against USC, setting a season high in total rushing yards with 190 yards on the ground.

Quick Hitters

- Jared Goff has reached 3,141 passing yards and now ranks second in single-season passing yards at Cal, needing 359 yards to break the school record of 3,499 set by Pat Barnes in 1996. Goff also ranks fourth on the single-season list in total offense (3,070). Goff has already completed (287) and attempted (467) more passes than any player in school history.
- Bryce Treggs and Chris Harper moved their names up the single-season reception list in the Cal record book last week. Treggs now ranks sixth with 69, while Harper is seventh with 68. Lavelle Hawkins is fifth with 72 receptions. Harper also has a team-high 842 yards receiving and is just 30 yards away from the school's top 10 list.
- Kenny Lawler has five touchdown receptions in the last two games, notching a career-high three against Arizona and then two more last Saturday against USC. The three touchdown catches against Arizona were the first by a Cal player since DeSean Jackson vs. Minnesota in 2006. Lawler also tied his career high in catches in both games with six, matching the six he had against Ohio State.
- Cal has a current offensive and defensive depth chart that features a combined total of 17 freshmen (10) and sophomores (7) listed as starters. Only two seniors are in that role.
- Cal has 13 players who have started or were projected starters prior to the season that are either out for the season or have missed multiple games due to injury – Chris Adcock, Nathan Broussard, Matt Cochran, Darren Ervin, Nick Forbes, Mustafa Jalil, Daniel Lasco, Alex Logan, Hardy Nickerson, Stefan McClure, Brennan Scarlett, Avery Sebastian, Bill Tyndall. Five others – Michael Barton, Khairi Fortt, Jalen Jefferson, Khalfani Muhammad and Richard Rodgers – have missed one game each due to injury. Three players – Gabe King, Chris McCain and David Wilkerson – are no longer in the program.

Goff, Harper, Treggs, Move Up in Record Book

Jared Goff, Bryce Treggs and Chris Harper moved their names up the lists in the Cal record book last week, needing 359 yards to break the school's single-season record of 3,499 set by Pat Barnes in 1996. Goff also ranks fourth on the single-season list in total offense (3,070). Goff has already completed (287) and attempted (467) more passes than any player in school history. Treggs ranks sixth on Cal's single-season top 10 list for receptions with 69, while Harper ranks seventh on that list with 68. Lavelle Hawkins is fifth with 72 receptions. Treggs is 10 catches away from his 100th career catch, which Harper reached two games ago against Arizona. Harper is also just 30 yards away from the single-season top 10 list in receiving yards.

Improved Ground Attack

Cal entered the Arizona contest two weeks ago averaging 3.0 yards per carry but has edged that number up to 3.3 yards per game after setting season highs each of the past two games. After averaging a season-high 5.0 yards per rush on the ground against Arizona, Cal came up with a season-high 190 rushing yards last Saturday against USC. Khalfani Muhammad, Cal's leading rusher on the year with 322 yards, three touchdowns and an average of 5.5 yards per carry, posted 61 yards on 10 carries and scored his third rushing touchdown of the season against the Trojans. Jeffrey Coprich added a career-high 55 yards on the ground to give Cal two or more players over 50 yards rushing for the third time this season.

Bears Have Nation's Third-Toughest Schedule

With a docket that features eight teams that played in bowl games a year ago, Cal's 2013 schedule ranked as the nation's third-most difficult by Phil Steele and was No. 4 in the country according to Sporting News heading into the season. The Bears were the only team in the nation who had seven teams on its schedule ranked in the preseason top 25 as well as eight 2012 bowl teams on its slate. In addition, Ohio State was a perfect 12-0 last season but ineligible to go to the postseason. Cal has played four teams ranked in the top 25 at the time of their meeting in 2013 in Oregon (No. 2 AP/No. 2 USA Today), Ohio State (No. 4/3), UCLA (No. 11/13) and Northwestern (No. 22/No. 22). Three other opponents – Oregon State, USC and Washington – have been ranked at one point during the season. Cal will face a fifth top-25 and third top-10 team when the Bears visit Stanford (No. 4 BCS/No. 5 AP/No. 5 USA Today) for the 116th Big Game at Stanford Stadium to end the season on Saturday, Nov. 23.

Youthful Squad

Cal's 2013 squad facing the nation's third-toughest schedule is also one of the nation's youngest with a preseason experience rating that was No. 12 in the Pac-12 and No. 125 out of No. 126 teams nationally according to Phil Steele's combined experience chart. Ironically, head coach Sonny Dykes' former school, Louisiana Tech, was the only team in the nation at the start of the season according to Steele with less experience than the Bears. Cal has a current offensive and defensive depth chart that features a combined total of 17 freshmen (10) and sophomores (7) listed as starters on the team's depth chart with only two seniors in that role.

Different Depth Chart

The Cal depth chart has had numerous changes to the one the Bears opened their 2013 training camp with. Only 10 of the 29 players listed as starters on offense or defense heading into training camp – Brendan Bigelow, Dan Camporeale, Deandre Coleman, Alejandro Crosthwaite, Khairi Fortt, Lucas Gingold, Chris Harper, Jalen Jefferson, Bryce Treggs, Jordan Rigsbee – are listed as starters on this week's depth chart. Cal has 13 players who have started or were projected starters prior to the season – Chris Adcock, Nathan Broussard, Matt Cochran, Darren Ervin, Nick Forbes, Mustafa Jalil, Daniel Lasco, Alex Logan, Hardy Nickerson, Stefan McClure, Brennan Scarlett, Avery Sebastian, Bill Tyndall – either out for the season or have missed multiple games due to injury.

Success In The Air

Cal ranks eighth in the nation and third in the Pac-12 in passing offense (345.3 ypg), with the Golden Bears ahead of the school-record pace 321.5 yards per game posted by the 1997 team. With 3,453 total passing yards on the season, the Bears are also 252 yards away from the school record for most passing yards in a season (3,705 in 2003). Cal has produced 460 or more passing yards three times against Washington State (season-high 521), Portland State (485) and Northwestern (460). Cal also had 371 yards of passing offense against Ohio State and 352 at Washington. In the Bears' win against Portland State, Cal had a season-high 616 yards of total offense topped by Jared Goff's 485 passing yards. Cal and Portland State combined for 1,169 total offensive yards to rank second all-time at Cal. The Bears were also over 500 yards of total offense against Washington State (585), Northwestern (549) and Ohio State (503), with Goff throwing for a school-record 504 yards against Cougars. One of Goff's passes against Washington State went for an 89-yard touchdown to Chris Harper, the second longest pass play in the history of the program.

Goff Nearing Cal's Single-Season Record For Passing Yards

Jared Goff has 3,141 passing yards on the season and has moved within 358 yards of the school's single-season record of 3,499 by Pat Barnes in 1996. Goff ranks in the top 15 nationally in passing yards (5th, 3,141), completions per game (6th, 28.7 cpg) and passing yards per game (11th, 314.1 ypg). He is also third in the Pac-12 in passing yards per game. Goff has completed 287-of-467 passes (61.5%) with 17 touchdowns and nine interceptions for a 126.11 passer efficiency rating over his first 10 collegiate contests.

In addition, Goff is 599 yards shy of the NCAA freshman record for passing yards that was set last year by UCLA's Brett Hundley (3,740 yards).

Against Washington State, Goff passed for a school single-game record of 504 yards, surpassing Pat Barnes' 503 yards in a quadruple-overtime win against Arizona in 1996. Goff owned three of the top four single-game passing performances in school history after his first five contests as he also had 485 yards in the air against Portland State and 450 against Northwestern. Goff also became the second Pac-12 quarterback to ever throw for 450 yards in three games in his career (Andrew Walter, Arizona State, 2002). One of Goff's two touchdown passes against the Cougars went for 89 yards to Chris Harper. It was the second-longest pass play in school history. Goff has seven touchdown passes in his last two games.

Harper Hits Century Mark

Chris Harper currently has 109 career receptions at Cal. Harper's season totals for 2013 include 68 receptions, 842 yards receiving and five touchdown catches. He is also seventh on Cal's top-10 list for single-season receptions with 68 and 30 receiving yards shy of the single-season top list in that category. Harper ranks fourth in the Pac-12 in per-game receptions (6.8 rpg) and third in receiving yards (84.2 ypg). He is 18th in the nation in per-game receptions and 34th in per-game receiving yards.

Harper had a career day against Washington State with 14 catches for 231 yards, including an 89-yard touchdown reception from Jared Goff, the second-longest pass play in school history. The receptions and receiving yards rank third in each category on Cal's single-game lists. He became the fifth Cal receiver to post 200 yards receiving in a contest and the first since Geoff McArthur accomplished the feat against Stanford in 2003, with McArthur's 16 catches in the same game setting the school record.

Harper and Treggs Create One-Two Punch

Chris Harper and Bryce Treggs have combined for 137 catches, 1,523 receiving yards and six touchdown receptions in the first 10 games. Treggs has career highs of 69 receptions and 681 yards receiving, while matching his single touchdown from last season. His 69 receptions rank sixth on Cal's single-season top 10 list.

Treggs is third in the Pac-12 and 18th in the nation in per-game receptions (6.9 rpg), as well as 12th in the Pac-12 and tied for 79th in the nation in per-game receiving yards (68.1 ypg).

Against Washington State, Harper posted career highs of 14 catches and 231 receiving yards while adding a touchdown. Treggs added six catches for 70 yards to give the duo 20 catches for 301 yards, with the yardage total the second most by two Cal receivers in a single game. The record is 327 set by Wesley Walker (8-289) and Jesse Thompson (4-38) on Oct. 2, 1976, against San Jose State.

In the season opener against Northwestern, Treggs notched career highs of 13 catches and 145 yards receiving against the Wildcats. The 13 receptions ranks tied for fourth all-time in Cal single-game history. Combined with Harper's 11 catches for 148 yards, their performances marked the 11th time in school history that Cal had two receivers go over 100 yards receiving in the same contest. The 293 yards receiving by Harper and Treggs against Northwestern ranks tied for third on the school's all-time list for yards receiving by two receivers in a game.

Lawler Posts Five Touchdowns in Two Games

Kenny Lawler has scored five touchdowns in the last two games, the first five of his career, including two last week against USC. The week before against Arizona, Lawler became the first Cal player since DeSean Jackson vs. Minnesota in 2006 to catch three touchdowns in a game. His three-yarder in the third quarter, a one-handed grab with his left hand, was ranked the No. 8 play of the day by ESPN. He earned CFPA Honorable Mention WR of the Week honors for his efforts against the Wildcats. In both games against USC and Arizona he tied his personal best with six catches.

Chris Harper and Bryce Treggs are both on the watch list for the 2013 Biletnikoff Award given annually to college football's most outstanding receiver by the Tallahassee Quarterback Club Foundation, Inc., the creator and sponsor of the award. Harper was announced on the preseason watch list in July, while Treggs was one of nine receivers added Sept. 24. Fans can vote for Treggs and Harper online at BiletnikoffAward.com. Every fan can vote once daily on the Biletnikoff Award Fan Vote page. The aggregate tally will be counted as one official vote when semifinalists, finalists and the winner are selected. The 10 semifinalists for the award will be announced on Nov. 18, with the three finalists selected on Nov. 25 and the winner announced Dec. 12 on The Home Depot College Football Awards Show.

Muhammad Top All-Purpose Threat

True freshman Khalfani Muhammad leads Cal, ranks sixth in the Pac-12 and 15th nationally with an average of 145.6 all-purpose yards per game. Muhammad has a team-high 1,310 all-purpose yards (322 rush, 169 receiving, 819 kick return) in nine games, missing the Washington State contest due to injury. At UCLA, he compiled a career-best and team season-high 224 all-purpose yards. In addition to his career highs of 158 return yards on seven kick returns against the Bruins, Muhammad garnered his first collegiate start at running back and finished the game with a career-high 14 carries for 63 yards. Against Oregon State, Muhammad secured a personal-best 52-yard kick return among his five kick returns for 148 yards. At Washington, Muhammad rattled off a career-high 73-yard touchdown run, giving him 90 rushing yards on the night to go with his second rushing touchdown. Against Arizona, he scored his third career touchdown, which was also his first career receiving touchdown. Last week against USC, Muhammad notched his third rushing TD of the season.

Muhammad has totaled team highs of 35 kick returns and 819 kick return yards on the season, with his average of 23.4 yards per kick return ranking fourth in the Pac-12 and tied for 48th nationally.

Against Portland State, Muhammad had 13 rushes for 68 rushing yards as well as his first collegiate touchdown on a four-yard scoring run that capped Cal's first drive of the game. Muhammad also caught four passes for 85 yards, including a career-long 62-yarder, and added one kick return for 21 yards against the Vikings.

D'Amato Tied For 10th Nationally and Second in Pac-12 In Field Goals Made

Fourth-team Phil Steele Midseason All-American and Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award semifinalist Vincenzo D'Amato is tied for 25th nationally and fifth in the Pac-12 in field goals made per game with an average of 1.40. D'Amato has made 14 of his 17 attempts to rank fifth in the conference in field goal percentage (82.4%). He tied his career high with three makes in each of the first two games and added two more against Ohio State and Washington State. He also booted a season-high 51-yard field goal at UCLA, one yard shy of his career best 52-yarder at Washington State in 2012.

In addition, D'Amato threw his first career touchdown pass against Northwestern. On the opening drive of the season, Cal lined up for a field goal only to run a fake when holder Jackson Bouza flipped the ball back to D'Amato, who then passed it back to Bouza who ran in for the score to open the Sonny Dykes era. Those efforts helped Cal garner its first conference player of the week honors as D'Amato was named the Pac-12 Special Teams Player of the Week for the opening week of the season against Northwestern.

Leininger Having a Solid Sophomore Campaign

Cole Leininger ranks second in the Pac-12 and No. 24 nationally with a 43.0 yard punt average. His average currently ranks eighth on Cal's single-season list, and his career average of 41.4 ranks 10th at Cal. His first punt of the season went for a career-long 70 yards against Northwestern, while he has punted for 50 or more yards 11 times. Leininger had a career-best average of 49.0 against Ohio State, while he punted a career-high 10 times in his most recent game against Washington with nine of the punts coming in the first half. Leininger was a third-team preseason All-Pac-12 choice of Phil Steele after a solid freshman season when he played in all 12 games and averaged 39.9 yards per punt.

D'Amato Leads Cal's Phil Steele Midseason Honorees

Vincenzo D'Amato was selected as a fourth-team All-American to lead five Cal players honored on Phil Steele 2013 Midseason All-American and All-Pac-12 teams announced on Oct. 17. D'Amato was also a second-team Midseason All-Pac-12 pick along with Chris Harper. Deandre Coleman, Khalfani Muhammad and Jordan Rigsbee earned third-team All-Pac-12 recognition. In addition, D'Amato was also recently named one of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award.

Khairi Fortt Named Butkus Award Semifinalist

Khairi Fortt is one of 12 collegiate semifinalists for the prestigious Butkus Award® honoring the nation's top linebackers at the high school, collegiate and professional levels. Fortt had started every game this season before missing last week's game due to injury, and is tied for the team lead with 64 tackles, while adding 3.5 tackles for loss. Fortt had career highs of 13 tackles and 2.0 tackles for loss (-2 yards). The 13 tackles are the most by a Cal player in 2013, while the 2.0 tackles for loss equal the most.

Young Defenders Take Advantage of Opportunity

With a Cal defense that has seen 10 prominent players (Nathan Broussard, Austin Clark, Nick Forbes, Mustafa Jalil, Alex Logan, Stefan McClure, Hardy Nickerson, Brennan Scarlett, Avery Sebastian, Sione Sina) out for the season due to injury or miss at least most of the season due to injury and another three (Gabe King, Chris McCain, David Wilkerson) dismissed or leaving the team younger players a chance to take on a bigger role. Khairi Fortt and Nickerson are tied for the team lead in tackles with 64 tackles, while Cameron Walker (57) and Jalen Jefferson (54) each have over 50 stops, with Walker posting career highs in four consecutive games at UCLA (8), vs. Oregon State (9), at Washington (10) and at Arizona (13).

Pac-12 Leaders

Cal ranks first in the Pac-12 in first downs with an average of 25.0 per game and a total of 250 (74 rush, 157 pass, 19 penalty), kickoff coverage (42.6 net average) and opponent penalties (68.4 ypg).

The History of Memorial Stadium

Originally completed in November 1923, Memorial Stadium is dedicated to University of California, Berkeley students, alumni and other Californians who lost their lives in World War I. Cal boasts an all-time record of 320-224-16 (.586) at Memorial Stadium. The Bears have enjoyed 12 undefeated home campaigns, including three in the past decade (2004, 2006, 2008). Cal has twice won eight home games in a season (1924, 1938). Memorial Stadium is also home to one of the most memorable moments in college football history - "The Play" - Cal's five-lateral kickoff return on the final play of the 1982 Big Game to beat Stanford.

Home Field Advantage

Despite falling to USC in the 2013 home finale at Memorial Stadium, Cal is 44-21 in its last 65 home games and 40-20 at Memorial Stadium during the stretch. The Bears were 4-1 in home games at AT&T Park in 2011 while Memorial Stadium was being renovated.

Cal-Colorado Connections

- Colorado defensive coordinator Kent Baer spent 5 seasons (1987-91) in the same position at Cal. He has worked at all three Bay Area (FBS) schools - Cal, Stanford, and San Jose State.
- Colorado director of player development Darian Hagan is the father of former Cal defensive back Darian Hagan Jr. Hagan Jr. played in 38 games with 26 starts in the final four seasons of his Cal career (2007-10) and earned honorable mention All-Pac-10 honors as a senior.
- Austin Hinder (Steamboat Springs, CO/Steamboat Springs HS) lists his hometown within Colorado.
- Defensive backs coach Randy Stewart also lists his hometown as Denver, CO.

Brazinski Named Semifinalist for Campbell Trophy

Mark Brazinski is one of 170 candidates across all divisions of college football for the 2013 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Awards, and he is also a semifinalist for the 2013 William V. Campbell Trophy, which recognizes an individual as the absolute best scholar-athlete in the nation. The award is often referred to as the "Academic Heisman" Among the senior offensive lineman's academic accomplishments at Cal include being the youngest person to ever be admitted to an information technology master's program in Silicon Valley at the age of 20 (most of his classmates are in their mid-late 30's). Brazinski received two bachelor's degrees (Business Administration, Media Studies) in his first three years at Cal and is currently a graduate student in information technology. Brazinski is also a member of Mensa International, which is the largest and oldest high IQ society in the world. It is a non-profit organization open to people who score at the 98th percentile or higher on a standardized, supervised IQ or other approved intelligence test.

In addition, Brazinski was selected last week to the 2013 Capital One Academic All-District 8 First-Team for NCAA Division I football.

In addition, Forbes has been a speaker at a local elementary school and to youth football teams speaking on the importance of education, respect, treating others right and staying out of trouble. He hosted Cal's Oski Student Awards show in the spring of 2013 and also organized both a fashion show fundraiser and a student-athlete formal earlier this year.

Stewart was an assistant coach during the Tom Holmoe era from 1997-2001, while Buh was a defensive administrative assistant from 2000-01.
- Cal has seven players who had fathers that also played at Cal. Wide receiver Jackson Bouza is the son of former Cal player and three-year letterwinner Matt Bouza (1978-80). Wide receiver Bryce Treggs' father, Brian, was a wide receiver at Cal from 1988-91, while linebacker Hardy Nickerson's father, Hardy Sr., was a linebacker at Cal from 1983-86. Defensive back David Garner's father, Dwight Garner, was a letterwinner at Cal from 1982-85, and also made one of The Play's five laterals. Duke Moran's father, Michael, was a member of the Cal squad in 1979 and 1980 but did not earn a letter. Quarterback Jared Goff's father, Jerry, a more accomplished baseball player at Cal, also played one year of football for the Bears
- Jared Goff's father, Jerry, was a catcher who played Major League Baseball with Montreal (1990, 1992), Pittsburgh (1993-94) and Detroit (1995-96) following his collegiate baseball career at Cal that included All-America, All-District 8 and All-Pac-10 honors in 1986
- Austin Hinder is the grandson of Cal Athletic Hall of Famer Jim Hanifan, a longtime NFL and collegiate coach.
- Bud "Dog" Turner is in his 44th season involved with Cal football and likes to say that he is "halfway through his career." He helps with team operations.
- Jeffrey Coprich has founded the Essence K. Coprich Book Club at 116th Street Elementary School in South Central Los Angeles in memory of his eight-year-old sister who was killed in a car crash that Jeffrey survived when he was three years old.
- Kyle Kragen's father, Greg, appeared in three Super Bowls and five conference championship games over 13 seasons as an NFL defensive lineman with Denver (1985-93), Kansas City (1994) and Carolina (1995-97), earning All-Pro honors three times (1989, 1991, 1992) and being selected to the Pro Bowl once (1989) while registering 28.5 sacks and one interception in 200 career games,
- Mark Brazinski is a nominee for the 2013 National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete Awards. He received two bachelor's degrees (Business Administration, Media Studies) after his first three years at Cal and is currently a student in the Information Technology master's program.
- James Grisom and Isaac Lapite were both walk-ons who earned scholarships at the end of training camp. Grisom joined the team during spring workouts after a walk-on tryout among interested students. He had been a student at Cal since August of 2010 but not previously a member of the football program.

Cal in the NFL

Head Coach Sonny Dykes

Sonny Dykes is in his first season as the head coach at Cal in 2013 and picked up his first win against Portland State on Sept. 7. Dykes has compiled a 23-24 overall record in his fourth season as a head coach and is 1-9 in his first campaign at Cal.

The new Cal head coach picked up some strong preseason endorsements. Lindy's picked Dykes as a Top Five Coaching Hire, while The Sporting News ranked him No. 6 in the New Head Coach Confidence Rating. Athlon tabbed Dykes the No. 8 New Head Coach and a Grade A- Coaching Hire.

Last season Dykes directed an offense that led the nation in both scoring and offense a year ago at Louisiana Tech. Dykes, 43, brings 18 seasons of collegiate coaching experience to Berkeley. He spent the past three years as head coach at Louisiana Tech, where he compiled a 22-15 record and won 16 of 17 regular season games during one stretch over the 2011 and 2012 campaigns.

Dykes guided his 2012 Louisiana Tech team to a 9-3 mark, including road victories over FBS opponents Illinois (52-24), Houston (56-49) and Virginia (44-28). The Bulldogs also lost a narrow 59-57 decision to a Texas A&M team that later defeated top-ranked Alabama and earned a spot in the Cotton Bowl. Louisiana Tech reached as high as No. 18 according to USA Today and was No. 19 in the Associated Press Top 25 after jumping out to a 9-1 start.

Dykes' high-energy style of offense produced a prolific offense that in addition to leading the nation in both scoring offense (51.50 ppg) and total offense (577.92 ypg) posted the fifth-highest per-game scoring average ever by a team in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and was also among the NCAA's top 20 in passing offense (3rd, 350.75 ypg), sacks allowed (7th, 0.83 per game), turnover margin (10th, +1.08 per game) and rushing offense (17th, 227.17 ypg). The Bulldogs scored more than 40 points in 11 of 12 games and over 50 points on eight occasions.

During his tenure at Louisiana Tech, Dykes engineered a turnaround for a program that improved all three seasons under his leadership. The Bulldogs were 4-8 the year before he arrived in 2009, then proceeded to finish 5-7, 8-5 and 9-3 in successive campaigns. In 2011, Louisiana Tech started just 1-4, and then won seven consecutive games to clinch the Western Athletic Conference title – the team's first conference championship in a decade – and a berth in the Poinsettia Bowl. Dykes was named the WAC Coach of the Year for the effort.

Dykes, the son of former longtime Texas Tech coach Spike Dykes, boasts a resume that includes additional stops in the Pac-12, Big 12 and SEC, where he served under such head coaches as Mike Stoops (Arizona), Mike Leach (Texas Tech) and Hal Mumme (Kentucky).

As offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Arizona for three seasons from 2007-09, Dykes helped the Wildcats to the 2008 Las Vegas Bowl and 2009 Holiday Bowl after having not reached the postseason for 10 seasons. Arizona posted marks of 8-5 both campaigns and tied for second in what was then the

Pac-10 in 2009 with a 6-3 league record.

Under his direction, the Wildcat offense established five single-season school records. Arizona ranked 10th nationally in passing yards in 2007, and the Wildcats were 16th in scoring and 33rd in total offense in 2008.

Prior to his tenure at Arizona, Dykes spent seven seasons at his alma mater, Texas Tech, serving as wide receivers coach from 2000-04 and adding the title of co-offensive coordinator from 2005-06. The Red Raiders made seven straight postseason appearances and won 56 games during the span, including four postseason victories in the Tangerine, Houston, Holiday and Insight bowls over his last five seasons. In his final campaign at Texas Tech, the Red Raiders ranked No. 3 nationally in passing offense (369.5 ypg) and sixth in total offense (447.9 ypg). In 2006, Dykes received the Mike Campbell Top Assistant Coach Award from the All-American Football Foundation, the same year he was recognized as one of the top 25 recruiters in the country by Rivals.

Dykes spent two non-consecutive seasons at Kentucky, first as a graduate assistant working with tight ends in 1997 and later as special teams/wide receivers coach in Mumme's "Air Raid" attack in 1999. During the fall of 1999, James Whalen developed into a first-team All-American and set a Division I-A record for tight ends with 90 receptions.

Sandwiched in between his two stints in Lexington, Dykes was the wide receivers coach at Northeast Louisiana in 1998, where he helped receiver Marty Booker set school season and career records while earning spots in the Blue-Gray Football Classic and East-West Shrine Game before being selected in the third round of the 1999 NFL Draft by the Chicago Bears.

Dykes began his collegiate coaching career with a two-year stint at Navarro College from 1995-96. He also was a baseball assistant at Monahans High School in Texas in 1994 and a football assistant at Pearce High School outside Dallas in 1995.

Born in Big Springs, Texas, Dykes received his bachelor's degree in history from Texas Tech in 1993 and was a member of the Red Raider baseball team for two seasons. He is married to the former Kate Golding and they have two daughters, Alta (Ally) and Charlotte (Charlie).

BERKELEY – Two untimely interceptions proved to be the difference as No. 22 Northwestern escaped Berkeley with a 44-30 victory over California. Playing in his first collegiate game as a true freshman, Jared Goff threw for 445 yards, the highest passing total by a Cal quarterback in a regulation game in school history. His 63 pass attempts also set a school record. Goff connected with sophomore Chris Harper for two touchdown passes, including a 52-yarder. Harper and fellow sophomore Bryce Treggs both caught double digit passes and went over the century mark. Treggs' 13 receptions tied for third all-time at Cal.

The Golden Bears ushered in the Sonny Dykes era with some trickery on the first drive of the season. On a field goal attempt, holder Jackson Bouza flipped the ball back to kicker Vincenzo D'Amato who then threw the ball to Bouza for a 10-yard score. It was the first touchdown for both Bouza and D'Amato.

In the third quarter, Goff settled down and hit Harper for the two scores while the defense clamped down. The Wildcats only managed one offensive touchdown in the second half, and that came in the game's final two minutes.

The Cal offense ran 99 plays, which ranked tied for third in school history. The 2012 season high was 79 against Ohio State.

BERKELEY – Cal garnered its first win of the 2013 season and the Sonny Dykes era against Portland State, behind another strong performances from Jared Goff who posted 485 yards, besting his 460 against Northwestern for the second-high passing single-game today in school history.

The Bears had to earn the win over Portland State after the Vikings scored touchdowns on three of their first four drives.

Goff connected with his receivers for some big pass plays. He hit Bryce Treggs for a 50-yard reception to the one-yard line. Goff ended the drive with his first career rushing touchdown. He later found Richard Rodgers for a 75-yard touchdown reception that was the longest pass play since Zach Maynard and Keenan Allen set a school record 90-yard touchdown reception two years ago. Maurice Harris notched his first career touchdown with a one-handed catch.

The two teams combined for 1,169 total yards which ranks second in school history at Cal.

The Cal defense eventually clamped down on the Vikings, keeping them off the scoreboard in their last six consecutive drives and 11 of their last 13.

BERKELEY – In front of a sell-out crowd at Memorial Stadium, the Bears got its contest against No. 4/3 Ohio State off on the wrong foot when Cal allowed the Buckeyes to jump out to an early 21-0 lead in the first quarter. One of Ohio State’s touchdowns came on a 90-yard reception that was the longest play from scrimmage in the history of Ohio State and the second longest pass play against Cal in the history of its program.

Jared Goff posted three touchdown passes for the first time in his career, including a 61-yarder to James Grison for the Bears’ first score. Goff entered the game as the nation’s leading passer. Goff also found Chris Harper and Bryce Treggs for his other two touchdown passes. For Treggs, that was his first touchdown since the 2012 season opener against Nevada.

Harper’s touchdown reception cut the deficit to 10 at 24-14 at the end of the first quarter. That would be as close as the Bears would get, though.

With the game out of reach, Daniel Lasco scored his second career touchdown late in the fourth quarter, and ended the day as the Bears’ leading rusher.

The Bears committed turnovers on five of their first six possessions of the game and trailed 27-0 at the end of the first quarter. Starting quarterback Jared Goff lost two fumbles and running backs Brendan Bigelow and Khalfani Muhammad lost one each as heavy rain and wind tormented Cal’s ball security.

Bigelow rushed for 61 yards on 18 carries while redshirt freshman Jeffrey Coprich scored his first career touchdown on a 1-yard run midway through the third quarter. Daniel Lasco caught five passes for 35 yards.

Stefan McClure broke up three passes to lead Cal’s defensive effort. Deandre Coleman led the Bears with eight tackles.

BERKELEY – Despite losing to Washington State for the first time since 2002, Jared Goff completed 33-of-59 passes for a career-high and school record 504 yards, completing two for touchdowns, including an 89-yarder to wide receiver Chris Harper for the second longest pass play in school history. Goff is now the first player at Cal to throw for over 400 yards three times and the second QB to throw for 500 yards (Pat Barnes - 503 vs. Arizona in 1996).

Harper added his name to Cal's record book, too, with career highs in catches (14) and yards (231). Both totals put him No. 3 on the Bears' all-time list in those categories. He is the fifth Cal receiver to record more than 200 yards in a game.

Despite the big numbers, the Bears suffered three fumbles and two interceptions and gave up several big plays to the Cougars.

Cal and Washington State combined to throw for 1,027 passing yards, which set a school record for combined passing yards in a game. The previous record was 921 set in a four-overtime game against Arizona in 1996.

The Bears continued to be hit by the injury bug with three defensive players having to leave the game in linebacker Jalen Jefferson and defensive backs Joel Willis and Stefan McClure. In addition, cornerback Kameron Jackson only played a short while trying to come back from an ankle injury suffered at Oregon last week.

PASADENA – Cal's defense put on an inspired performance but the Bears' offense was limited to 320 yards in a 37-10 loss to No. 11 UCLA at the Rose Bowl on Saturday night.

The Bears (1-5, 0-3 Pac-12), despite missing a slew of significant players on defense due to injury, overcame a slow start and held the Bruins' potent offense in check for most of the final three quarters. After putting together sustained drives on each of its first three possessions and jumping out to a 17-0 lead, UCLA's offense became inconsistent for most of the rest of the night.

After UCLA moved to the Bears' 13 on its first possession of the game, the Bears' defense tightened and forced the Bruins into a 24-yard field goal by Kaim Fairbairn. UCLA then put together a pair of touchdown drives to take a 17-0 early in the first quarter, but from then on the game was essentially even.

The Bears got on the board on a 51-yard field goal by Vicenzo D'Amato, and then sliced the deficit to 17-10 after a 14-play, 81-yard drive that culminated in a 6-yard touchdown run by Daniel Lasco with 2:35 remaining in the first half. UCLA came up with a big answer, getting a 27-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Brett Hundley to Thomas Duarte with just 40 seconds remaining before the half.

That was the score at halftime, and neither offense did much the rest of the game until the Bruins added a late touchdown to cap the scoring.

SEATTLE – Two big plays that bridged halftime proved to be too much for Cal's football team to overcome, and the Bears fell to Washington 41-17 at Husky Stadium.

Quarterback Jared Goff threw for 336 yards and a touchdown and wide receiver Chris Harper hauled in six catches for 98 yards and a touchdown, but Washington scored touchdowns at the end of the second quarter and early in the third to pull away.

After falling behind 17-0 in the first quarter, the Bears put together a 13-play, 75-yard drive that culminated in a 5-yard pass from Goff to Harper for a touchdown. Running back Khalfani Muhammad got Cal going with a 16-yard run to the Bears' 41-yard line. Goff then got it going, completing 8 of 9 passes on the possession for 37 yards. The touchdown pass to Harper made the score 17-7 with 12:48 left before the half.

Cal's defense was up to the task for most of the rest of the quarter, keeping the Huskies at bay and the game close until Washington running back Bishop Sankey broke free for a 59-yard touchdown run with 1:08 remaining before halftime. That gave the Huskies a 24-7 lead at the intermission.

After the Huskies made it 38-7, Cal sustained another long drive late in the third quarter, going 68 yards on 10 plays and getting a 25-yard field goal from kicker Vincenzo D'Amato. The Bears got another score when Muhammad reeled off a 73-yard touchdown run midway through the fourth quarter to make it 41-17. It was the longest run by a Cal player this season.

Defensive back Cameron Walker led the Bears with 10 tackles.

Game 9

Arizona 33, at Cal 28

November 2, 2013 • TV: Pac-12 Networks • Attendance: 41,874

BERKELEY – Redshirt freshman wide receiver Kenny Lawler caught three touchdown passes, including one that cut the deficit to five points with 1:42 remaining, but Cal fell to Arizona, 33-28, at Memorial Stadium.

Freshman quarterback Jared Goff tossed a career-high four touchdown passes while sophomore wide receivers Chris Harper and Bryce Treggs each moved into the top-10 on Cal's single-season receptions list.

Two of Lawler's TD catches came in spectacular fashion. His 3-yard scoring grab late in the third quarter was a one-handed diving play. His final score came when he out-jumped an Arizona defender in the corner of the end zone.

After Lawler's final touchdown catch made it 33-28, the Bears attempted an onside kick which was recovered by Arizona. The Wildcats notched one first down and were able to run out the clock.

Goff was 34-for-56 for 289 yards and four touchdowns for the Bears, who set the single-season team record for completions and passing attempts during the game. Goff now has 2,881 passing yards this season, good for 5th all-time at Cal.

Harper now has 62 catches, good for a tie for ninth all-time at Cal. Treggs is right behind at 61 for the season, which ranks 10th on the school's all-time list.

USC 62, at Cal 28

November 9, 2013 • TV: FOX • Attendance: 49,199

BERKELEY – California rushed for a season-high 195 yards, piled up 30 first downs and scored 28 points against one of the nation's best defenses, but the Golden Bears found themselves on the wrong end of a 62-28 final score.

The Trojans returns three punts for touchdowns, including one off a block, en route to their 10th straight victory over Cal. Nelson Agholor had two of the returns, including a 75-yarder for the game's first score. By the end of the first quarter, USC led, 21-0, before the Bears mounted a challenge.

Early in the second quarter, Cal drove 81 yards for its first points, a 4-yard pass from Jared Goff to Kenny Lawler. Just over three minutes later, the Bears used a flea-flicker to add to their total. Goff handed off to Daniel Lasco, who then flipped the ball back to Goff who found Darius Powe in the end zone for Powe's first touchdown this season on a 24-yard play.

In the third quarter, Khalfani Muhammad reached the end zone for the Bears, with a 7-yard run for this third rushing touchdown of the year. Lawler capped Cal's scoring with another 4-yard reception from Goff.

USC came into the game ranked 11th in the country in total defense, allowing 323.6 ypg, but the Bears totaled 483 against the Trojans.

Cal-Colorado: Series History and Notes

California 36, at Colorado 33 (OT)

BOULDER, Colo. – Keenan Allen hauled in a 5-yard TD pass in overtime from his half brother, Zach Maynard, lifting California to a thrilling 36-33 win over Colorado on Saturday despite a record-setting offensive day by the Buffaloes.

Maynard lofted a pass into the corner for Allen, who easily beat Colorado defensive back Parker Orms to set off a wild celebration by the Bears (2-0) near the goal line.

The game-winning touchdown catch gave Allen his second straight 100-yard performance of the season (104).

The catch by Allen came moments after Colorado kicker Will Oliver connected on a 22-yard field goal in overtime, his fourth of the game. Oliver also nailed a 32-yarder with 30 seconds remaining to extend the game for the Buffaloes.

Tight end Anthony Miller caught two of Maynard's four TD passes, and C.J. Anderson scored on a 19-yard scamper in the fourth quarter.

The Bears faced a first-and-30 at the 35 in overtime, but Maynard completed a pass to Allen near the goal line. Two plays later, the tandem hooked up again for the game winner.

2013 Cal Football Media Information

An A-Z guide detailing the policies and services of Cal's athletic communications offices for the 2013 football season is below. WELCOME TO CAL FOOTBALL

The 2013 University of California Information Guide is produced to provide information on the Golden Bears for anyone interested in learning more about the program. Media covering Cal football should review this section in detail to learn about Cal's policies and services. Please contact a member of the Athletic Communications staff if you have any questions or concerns.

MEMORIAL STADIUM DIRECTIONS

Attending a Cal football game at Memorial Stadium is an exciting entertainment experience. Memorial Stadium is located along Piedmont Avenue between Bancroft Way and Hearst Avenue on campus in Berkeley. The best way to get to Memorial Stadium is to plan ahead and consider all transportation options available to you.

BY AUTOMOBILE

From San Francisco Airport, take Highway 101 north to Interstate 80 and cross the Bay Bridge. Once over the bay, take Highway 24 toward Walnut Creek. Exit at Claremont Avenue and turn left. Turn left onto College Avenue (third light). Turn right onto Channing Way, then left onto Prospect Street, which will lead to the south end of the stadium.

From Oakland Airport, take Interstate 880 north, then Highway 24 east toward Walnut Creek and follow directions above.

Gameday media parking is located in the Underhill Garage at the corner of College Avenue and Channing Way.

These directions provide the most direct routes to Memorial Stadium, but other city streets and freeway exits provide alternate routes that fans are encouraged to use to avoid congestion. Please call 511 or go to 511.org for real-time traffic conditions.

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

Public transportation is highly recommended when visiting Berkeley. There are multiple public transportation options that lead directly to Memorial Stadium, and the Downtown Berkeley BART station is about a mile west of the venue. Please visit bart.org, actransit.org or 511.org for more information.

The Pac-12 Conference and each of its members use Collegepressbox.com. The site contains a large amount of information available for download by media members. Contact Kyle McRae for more details, including a username and password for full access to the site.

CREDENTIAL REQUESTS

All requests/questions for media, photo and parking credentials for 2013 Cal football home games should be made to Herb Benenson (510-334-0791, benenson@berkeley.edu) in the Athletic Communications Office at 349 Haas Pavilion, University of California, Berkeley, CA 94720. Only media who cover the Bears on a regular basis will be considered for season credentials. A lost season credential will result in that member of the media being moved to the single-game list.

All single-game requests should be made as far in advance as possible to help ensure space availability both in the press box and on the field. Requests for media covering a visiting team for a Cal home game should be made through the opposing school's football media relations contact. Credentials will be available for pick up at Media Will Call located in the third-floor lobby of the Simpson Center for Student-Athlete High Performance just inside Gate 5 near Warring Alley the day of the game unless other arrangements are made.

Media should consult CalBears.com/media for complete media and credential policies.

MEDIA PARKING

Parking at Cal is always at a premium and visitors are encouraged to use public transportation. The Downtown Berkeley BART station is located about a mile west of Memorial Stadium, in close proximity to Haas Pavilion, Edwards Stadium/Goldman Field, the Hellman Tennis Courts and Spieker Aquatics Complex. Hourly guest parking on non-football gamedays is available in the Recreation Sports Facility garage along Bancroft Way adjacent to Haas Pavilion and at the Underhill Garage.

Underhill also serves as the football gameday parking location. Entrances are off either Channing Way or Haste Street, just west of College Avenue. The lot is about three blocks from Memorial Stadium. Media can either take the short walk to Media Will Call at Gate 5 in Memorial Stadium) or use a media-only shuttle that begins running two hours before game time. A media shuttle is also available postgame from the pregame dropoff point along Warring Street to the Underhill Garage.

Parking passes cannot be left at will call on gamedays and must be picked up or mailed in advance.

Television crews should order parking passes for their crews by sending in the Special Event Parking Arrangements form found on the university's website (pt.berkeley.edu) in advance. Request the Underhill Garage for football games. Note that the campus parking office does not accept credit cards – only cash or check.

MEDIA WILL CALL

Media Will Call is located at Gate 5 in Memorial Stadium. It will open six hours before kickoff and remain open through the conclusion of the first quarter. Identification is required to pick up credentials or tickets. Parking passes cannot be left at will call.

Media who arrive after the end of the first quarter should call the press box at (510) 642-3098 to obtain their credential.

PRACTICE AND POSTGAME MEDIA COVERAGE

Cal is normally scheduled to practice at Memorial Stadium during the 2013 season Monday-Thursday. Mondays, open practice starts at 5:30 p.m. with coach/player availability scheduled for the completion of practice at approximately 7:30 p.m. on the field. Every Tuesday at noon, Cal will hold its weekly press conference in the Tahir Family Meeting Room. Sonny Dykes will normally speak first at noon followed by multiple players at 12:30 p.m. On Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons, open practice starts at 4:30 p.m. with on-field player availability at approximately 6:30 p.m. Thursday's closed practice begins at 4:30 p.m. and will conclude at approximately 5:45 p.m. Coaches will be available on the field after practice, but there is no player availability. There is no availability on Friday. For Saturday's 12:00 p.m. game vs. USC, coaches and players will be available after the contest in the Tahir Family Meeting Room.
