## QUICK HITTERS

- Cal welcomes Colorado to Berkeley for the Golden Bears' Pac-12 home opener. This will be Colorado's first trip to Berkeley since 2010 and the first time meeting between the teams in Berkeley since the Buffaloes started playing Pac-12 games.

- The Cal passing offense currently ranks third in the Pac-12 and 13th nationally at 335.3 ypg. Quarterback Jared Goff threw for 380 yards, three touchdowns and a passer rating of 192.7 last Saturday at Arizona. Goff connected with eight different receivers, including Bryce Treggs who hauled in season highs of five catches for 119 yards including a career-high 80-yard touchdown reception.

- Goff boasts nine career multi-touchdown games and six games with three or more touchdown passes. He is tied for seventh all-time at Cal with nine 250-yard passing performances and tied for second with six 300-yard passing outings. His 294 first-half passing yards at Arizona were the second most in his career after he posted 345 in the first half against Washington State last year on his way to a school-record 504 yards in the contest.

- Cal produced three rushing touchdowns against the Wildcats. Daniel Lasco garnered a 44-yard touchdown run on the opening drive of the game, and Khalfani Muhammad scored two touchdowns in the fourth quarter. Lasco (123) and Muhammad (95) both rushed for career high totals with the team's 193 yards rushing a season-best.

- Cal has outscored its opponents, 97-20, in the first half through the first three games. Cal led Northwestern, 31-7, at halftime, Sacramento State, 45-7, and Arizona, 28-6. The numbers are even more dramatic for the first quarter as the Bears have outscored their opponents, 56-0. Last year, opponents outscored Cal in the first quarter (181-51) and first half (335-146).

- Cal has posted nine plays of at least 40 yards this season, including four last Saturday at Arizona. Cal has produced six plays of 50 or more yards, three of 60 or more, two of 70 or more and a season-high 80-yard TD pass from Jared Goff to Bryce Treggs at Arizona last Saturday.

- Several underclassmen have been making their presence felt through the first three games including sophomore safety Griffin Piatt and sophomore linebacker Jake Kearney. Piatt notched his third career interception in as many games against Arizona and co-leads the conference while ranking tied for third in the nation with 1.0 interceptions per game. In his first collegiate start, Kearney tied for the team lead in tackles against the Wildcats with eight, including seven solo tackles.

- Cal leads the Pac-12 and ranks ninth nationally with an average of 16.2 yards per completion. Five Cal wide receivers are averaging over 20.0 yards or more per catch – Trevor Davis (8-181, 22.6), Ray Hudson (4-87, 21.8), Stephen Anderson (2-43, 21.5), Maurice Harris (3-63, 21.0) and Darious Powe (9-188, 20.9).

- Cal is 7-4 in Pac-12 home openers since 2003 but have not won a conference home opener since 2010 when they defeated UCLA, 35-7.

- Cal's five starting offensive linemen – C Chris Adcock, LG Chris Borrayo, RG Alejandro Crosthwaite, LT Steven Moore and RT Jordan Riggsbee – have amassed career totals of 89 games played and 79 starts.

- Saturday's game will be dedicated to Alzheimer's Disease awareness. The awareness efforts are the first of their kind at a college football game with the initiative started by head coach Sonny Dykes' wife, Kate.

## First Half and First Quarter Dominance

- Cal has outscored its opponents, 97-20, in the first half through the first three games. Cal led Northwestern, 24-7, at halftime, Sacramento State, 45-7, and the Bears led Arizona at the half, 28-6.
- The Bears have outscored their opponents, 56-0, in the first quarter through the first three games this season. Cal led Sacramento State, 28-0, and both Northwestern and Arizona, 14-0.
- Last year, opponents outscored Cal in the first quarter (181-51) and first half (335-146).

## Nine Plays Of 40 Yards Or More

- Cal has nine plays of 40 or yards or more from the line of scrimmage, including four last Saturday at Arizona.
- Jared Goff and Bryce Treggs hooked up on the team's longest play from the line of scrimmage with an 80-yard touchdown connection at Arizona. Goff has been involved in five of the nine plays of 40 or more yards, adding passes to Trevor Davis for a 76-yard touchdown at Northwestern and 55 yards against Sacramento State. Goff has also connected with Chris Harper and Powe on completions of 41 and 40 yards, respectively. Fellow quarterback Luke Rubenzer found Darius Powe for a 60-yard touchdown against Sacramento State. Running backs Daniel Lasco (Sacramento State) and Khalfani Muhammad (Arizona) have both scored on touchdown runs of 50 yards, while Lasco also scored on a 44-yarder at Arizona.

## Dykes Has Shown Second-Year Improvement Before

- Sonny Dykes led Cal to back-to-back wins to start the 2014 season before a heartbreaking last-second loss at Arizona last Saturday following a 1-11 finish in his first season at Cal in 2013. Dykes' team also showed tremendous improvement at his previous stop as the head coach at Louisiana Tech (2010-12). After finishing 5-7 in 2010 and starting 1-4 in 2011, Louisiana Tech came back to win its final seven regular-season games to capture the school's first Western Athletic Conference title in a decade, play in the Poinsettia Bowl and finish 8-5 overall. Dykes was named the WAC Coach of the Year as a result. He continued the improvement in his third and final season at Louisiana Tech when the 2012 Bulldogs finished 9-3 overall and reached as high as No. 18 in the national polls according to USA Today, as well as No. 19 in the Associated Press Top 25, after jumping out to a 9-1 start.

## Red Zone, Third and Fourth Down Efficiency Improvement

- Cal ranks tied for first nationally in red zone offense, having converted on all 12 red zone trips this season, with nine of those scores being touchdowns. Last year, Cal scored on only 72% of its 43 trips to the red zone (21 touchdowns, 10 field goals). Cal only made one trip to the red zone last Saturday at Arizona. Khalfani Muhammad hit pay dirt from six yards out on that drive.
- Cal has converted on 23-of-47 (49%) third downs thus far in 2014 for a percentage that is second in the Pac-12 and 29th nationally after finishing 2013 with a third-down conversion percentage of 34 percent. The Bears have also gained first downs four of the six times they have gone for it on fourth down, good for a percentage of 67% that ranks them tied for third in the Pac-12 and tied for 36th nationally. Cal was only 42 percent on fourth downs in 2013.

## Goff Continues To Improve as a Sophomore

- Quarterback Jared Goff has completed 56-of-86 passes for 890 yards with 10 touchdowns and two interceptions this season. He is among the Pac-12 and NCAA leaders in multiple categories including passing efficiency (185.8, 3rd Pac-12, 7th NCAA), passing yards per game (296.7 ypg, T-3rd Pac-12, T-18th NCAA), touchdown passes (T-4th Pac-12, T-12th NCAA) and total offense (5th Pac-12, 29th NCAA).
- Last Saturday at Arizona, Goff threw for 380 yards and three touchdowns. One of his touchdown passes was an 80-yarder to wide receiver Bryce Treggs, marking his second longest pass play at Cal. Goff threw four passes over 25 yards in the game and completed passes to eight different receivers.

## Lasco And Muhammad Both Busy In The Desert

- Cal running backs Daniel Lasco and Khalfani Muhammad combined for 218 rushing yards on 31 carries last Saturday at Arizona, both rushing for career high yardage totals
- Lasco rushed for 123 yards on a career-high 20 carries. He scored on a 44-yard run on the opening drive of the game after notching a 50-yard touchdown run against Sacramento State.
- Muhammad scored twice in the fourth quarter against the Wildcats, his first multi-touchdown performance at Cal. He ended the night with 11 carries for a career-high 95 yards and the first multiple-touchdown game of his career, including a 50-yard scoring run. Muhammad also capitalized on the Bears' lone trip to the red zone, scoring on a six-yard run in the fourth quarter.
- Lasco is Cal's leading rusher on the season with 37 carries for 239 yards and two rushing touchdowns. He ranks fifth in the Pac-12 in rushing with an average of 79.7 yards per game.
- Muhammad is second among the Cal running backs with 28 carries for 138 yards and a team-high three rushing touchdowns.

## Many Wide Receivers Making Contributions

- Cal currently has five wide receivers with at least eight catches on the season.
- Bryce Treggs is Cal's leading receiver through three games with 10 catches for 162 yards and two touchdowns. He is tied in receptions with Kenny Lawler, who boasts 101 receiving yards and a team-high three touchdown catches. Darius Powe leads the team in receiving yards with 188 on nine catches with one touchdown. Chris Harper also has nine receptions on the season with 143 receiving yards and two touchdowns, while Trevor Davis has eight catches for 181 yards and one touchdown.
- A total of 10 Cal receivers have at least two receptions on the season with eight different receivers making catches at Arizona.
- Five Cal wide receivers are currently averaging over 20 yards per catch – Davis (8-181, 22.6), Ray Hudson (4-87, 21.8), Stephen Anderson (2-43, 21.5), Maurice Harris (3-63, 21.0) and Powe (9-188, 20.9). Anderson made his season debut at Arizona, with one of his two receptions going for a 26-yard touchdown.

## Piatt, Kearney and Young Bear Defenders Rise

- Five of Cal's top seven tacklers are either sophomores or freshmen. Junior Jalen Jefferson leads the team with 22 and is followed by sophomores Jake Kearney and Michael Barton with 16 each. Sophomore Griffin Piatt is tied with senior Michael Lowe with 14 tackles, while sophomore Cedric Dozier has 13 and redshirt freshman Darius Allensworth has 12.
- Piatt has recorded an interception in each of his first three collegiate games. He currently ranks first in the Pac-12 and tied for third nationally in interceptions per game (1.00). Piatt also leads the team in passes defended with six. He ranks first in the conference and tied for third nationally in passes defended (2.00).
- Kearney, a junior college transfer from College of San Mateo, tied for the team best in tackles last Saturday at Arizona with eight..
- Dozier and Allensworth are tied for second on the team with two passes defended each.

## Experience On The Offensive Line

- Cal's five starting offensive linemen has amassed a total of 90 career games played and 79 career games started. Jordan Riggsbee is Cal's most experienced starter on either side of the ball having started all 27 games possible since 2012. Chris Adcock has played in 22 games and started 18, Alejandro Crosthwaite has played in 18 career games with 12 starts, Steven Moore has played in 15 career games with 14 career starts, and Chris Borrayo has started all eight games he's played since debuting in the final five games last season.

## Brian and Bryce Treggs: Like Father, Like Son

- Wide receiver Bryce Treggs collected his 100th career reception at Northwestern and his 1,000th career receiving yard vs. Sacramento State. He's attempting to out-do what his father, Brian Treggs, did while he was a wide receiver at Cal from 1988-91.
- Thus far, Bryce Treggs boasts 108 career receptions, 1,129 receiving yards, four touchdowns and three 100-yard performances. Bryce notched a personal-best 80-yard touchdown reception at Arizona last Saturday, part of his third 100-yard receiving performance (119) to lead the Bears.
- Brian finished his collegiate career with as then-school record 167 receptions (now fifth all-time at Cal), 2,335 receiving yards (tied for fifth all-time at Cal), 15 receiving touchdowns (eighth all-time at Cal), six 100-yard receiving games (tied for seventh all-time at Cal) and registered a single-game school-record-tying touchdown receptions (Pacific, 1991).

## National Championship Week

- Since 2006 Cal has honored its national champions and this week marks the 2014 National Championship Week. Some of the Bears' best student-athletes from the 2013-14 will be honored during a halftime ceremony on Saturday.
- Men's swimming and diving and rugby again claimed national team titles, while two freshman swimmers – Ryan Murphy and Missy Franklin – won individual crowns while also contributing to NCAA relay titles. In addition, three Cal boats – the men's second and third varsity eight and the women's varsity four – were the best in the nation in their respective races last spring.
- Last year was the 41st consecutive year that Cal has produced at least one national champion.

## Cal Family

- Cal has 10 players with fathers or grandfathers that were student-athletes at Cal in Joe Castignani, Justin Dunn, David Garner, Jared Goff, Austin Hinder, David Ortega Jr., Robbie McInerny, Hardy Nickerson, Griffin Piatt and Bryce Treggs.
- Treggs' father, Brian, was a wide receiver at Cal from 1988-91, while Nickerson's father, Hardy Sr., was a linebacker at Cal from 1983-86 and enjoyed a long NFL career, primarily with Pittsburgh and Tampa Bay. Garner's father, Dwight, was a letterwinner at Cal from 1982-85, and made one of The Play's five laterals in the win over Stanford in 1982.
- Goff's father, Jerry, a more accomplished baseball player at Cal, also played one year of football for the Bears. During his MLB career, Jerry played with Montreal (1990, 1992), Pittsburgh (1993-94) and Detroit (1995-96). Hinder is the grandson of longtime coach and Cal Athletic Hall of Famer Jim Hanifan.
- Castignani's father, Jim, was a two-sport athlete at Cal and a member of the 1980 national championship rugby team. Dunn's father, Steve, played football at Cal and was on the field for "The Play". Ortega's father, David, is in the Cal Athletic Hall of Fame and is the school's all-time tackles leader and currently works in the Cal public affairs office. McInerny's father, Dan, was the starting right fielder on Cal's 1980 College World Series team. He serves as vice chair of the Cal Baseball Foundation and earned the Carl Van Heuitt Award as the Cal baseball team's Alumnus of the Year in 2012. McInerny's late grandfather, Dick Dunn, played baseball and football at Cal, setting the school's single-game touchdown record in 1922 with six. Griffin Piatt is the grandson of former Cal men's basketball player the late Ed Dougery.



## CAL IN THE NFL

Cal has a total of 30 players on active 53-man NFL rosters as of Sept. 23, 2014, which opened the 2014 NFL season as the second-most among Pac-12 schools and tied for 10th nationally. Cal has had 46 NFL Draft selections in the 12 drafts held since 2003, including eight first-rounders.

- Running back Jeffrey Coprich has founded the Essence K. Coprich Book Club at 116th Street Elementary School in South Central Los Angeles in memory of his eight-year-old sister who was killed in a car crash that Jeffrey survived when he was three years old.
- Offensive lineman Chris Adcock has been on two mission trips to Ghana to help build a school and the Christina Adcock and Sons Christian Hospital, which now serves roughly 200,000 people in Western Ghana and serves about 10,000 patients per year.
- Wide receiver Bryce McGovern's 38 games played are the most among active Cal players. McGovern is a wide receiver and one of Cal's top special teams players. In addition, longsnapper John Sheperdson has started the last 26 consecutive games at long snapper.
- Linebacker Ed Tandy also plays rugby, has applied to the Haas School of Business and is the first member of his family to attend college.
- Quarterback Joey Mahalic is a 25-year-old sophomore who spent five seasons as a pitcher with the Cleveland Indians after being drafted by the organization in the 32nd round of the 2007 MLB Draft. - Placekicker James Langford is related to baseball great Ty Cobb and former President Harry S. Truman. Langford also is a six-time All-American in youth track & field, winning USA National silver and bronze medals in the 1,500 and 3,000 meter races at the USA Junior Olympic Championship National Finals.
- Defensive tackle David Davis is the grandson of NFL Hall of Fame defensive end Willie Davis and the son of accomplished actor Duane Davis, who has appeared in many films and TV shows.
- Bud "Dog" Turner (assistant football operations) will celebrate his 45th season involved with Cal football in 2014 and likes to say that he is "halfway through his career."

## Jeff Kent Starts Women Driven Scholarship Endowment

- Jeff Kent, the former California baseball player who retired from the Major Leagues in 2008 as one of the most prolific second basemen in history, has created The Jeff Kent Women Driven Scholarship Endowment to support the education of female student-athletes at Cal, it was announced Monday.
- Kent's donation of \$531,000, augmented by \$100,000 in matching funds, will create a fully endowed scholarship in perpetuity for Cal Athletics.
- Kent will return to the Bay Area to be recognized for his generosity and commitment to Cal during Saturday's game against Colorado.

## Hanifan Named Seaborg Award Winner

- Jim Hanifan, a former Cal All-American who led the nation in receiving in 1954 then went on to become one of the most respected offensive line coaches in the NFL, has been chosen as the recipient of the 2014 Glenn T. Seaborg Award.
- The award, named after the former University of California chancellor and 1951 Nobel Prize-winning scientist, is presented annually to a former Cal football player for his career accomplishments who represents the honored Cal principles and traditions of excellence in academics, athletics, leadership and attitude. Hanifan will be recognized for the honor during a ceremony during Saturday's game.

Another former Bear, Mike Mohamed was one of 16 national finalists in 2010.

- During the 2014 season the Bears will wear patches on their jerseys and decals on their helmets in honor of Ted Agu who tragically passed away on Feb. 7, 2014. Agu would have been a fifth-year senior on the team this season. A defensive lineman from Bakersfield, Agu played in 12 career games for the Bears. He was a public health major who intended to go to medical school and was known by many of his friends as Pre-Med Ted.

Kabam Field at California Memorial Stadium is located on Piedmont Avenue in Berkeley between Bancroft Way and Hearst Avenue, adjacent to the Simpson Center for Student-Athlete High Performance at 2227 Piedmont Avenue.

### MEDIA PARKING

Parking at Cal is always at a premium and visitors are encouraged to use public transportation. The Downtown Berkeley BART station is located about a mile west of Memorial Stadium, in close proximity to Haas Pavilion, Edwards Stadium/Goldman Field, the Hellman Tennis Courts and Spieker Aquatics Complex. Hourly guest parking on non-football gamedays is available in the Recreation Sports Facility garage along Bancroft Way adjacent to Haas Pavilion and at the Underhill Garage.

Underhill also serves as the football gameday parking location. Entrances are off either Channing Way or Haste Street, just west of College Avenue. The lot is about three blocks from Memorial Stadium. Media can either take the short walk to Media Will Call at Gate 5 in Memorial Stadium) or use a media-only shuttle that begins running two hours before game time. A media shuttle is also available postgame from the pregame dropoff point along Warring Street to the Underhill Garage.

Parking passes cannot be left at will call on gamedays and must be picked up or mailed in advance.

Television crews should order parking passes for their crews by sending in the Special Event Parking Arrangements form found on the university's website ([pt.berkeley.edu](http://pt.berkeley.edu)) in advance. Request the Underhill Garage for football games. Note that the campus parking office does not accept credit cards – only cash or check.

## HEAD COACH SONNY DYKES



Sonny Dykes is moving full-steam ahead with the rebuilding of the Cal football program in his second season as the Golden Bears' head coach and his 20th as a collegiate football coach in 2014. There is much optimism for the future with a 2-1 start and signs of progress in all areas for a program that had a combined 16 freshmen and sophomores listed as starters on its final 2013 depth chart, improved its single-season Academic Progress Rate (APR) score 46 points to 969 in 2012-13 and became one

of Cal's most active teams in the community in the first year under Dykes.

Dykes and the Bears got off on the right foot to begin the 2014 with a back-to-back wins over Northwestern and Sacramento State.

Despite being an inexperienced unit that was the nation's second-youngest to start the season and battling injuries that caused players on the preseason depth chart to miss 138 games due, Cal still set school records in 2013 for single-season passing yards (3,977), pass completions (368) and total plays (1,046). The passing offense finished the regular-season third in the Pac-12 and 10th in the nation with an average of 331.4 yards per game that was also the best in school history. Cal's 5,443 yards of total offense was the third-highest total in school history and its average of 453.6 yards per game ranked fourth all-time at Cal.

Dykes tutored true freshman quarterback Jared Goff, who started all 12 games and was the first true freshman quarterback in school history to start a season-opener. Goff set school records in passing yards (3,508), yardage gained (3,508), total offense (3,446) and completions (320) in his first season as the Bears' signal caller. He also finished the regular season among the nation's top 25 in completions per game (6th, 26.67 cpg), passing yards per game (12th, 292.3 ypg), passing yards (18th) and total offense (24th, 287.2 ypg).

Dykes came to Cal after spending three seasons at Louisiana Tech where he directed an offense that led the nation in both scoring offense (51.50 ppg) and total offense (577.92 ypg) during his final campaign at the helm in 2012. He spent three seasons as head coach for the Bulldogs, compiling a 22-15 record and winning 16 of 17 regular-season games during one stretch over the 2011 and 2012 schedules.

Dykes guided his 2012 Louisiana Tech team to a 9-3 mark, including road victories over FBS opponents Illinois (52-24), Houston (56-49) and Virginia (44-28). The Bulldogs also lost a narrow 59-57 decision to a Texas A&M team that later defeated top-ranked Alabama and earned a spot in the Cotton Bowl. Louisiana Tech reached as high as No. 18 in the national polls according to USA Today and was No. 19 in the Associated Press Top 25 after jumping out to a 9-1 start.

Dykes' high-energy style of offense produced a prolific unit that in addition to leading the nation in both scoring offense and total offense in 2012 produced the fifth-highest per-game scoring average ever by a team in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS). The squad also finished among the NCAA's top 20 in passing offense (3rd, 350.75 ypg), sacks allowed (7th, 0.83 per game), turnover margin (10th, +1.08 per game) and rushing offense (17th, 227.17 ypg). The Bulldogs scored more than 40 points in 11 of 12 games and over 50 points on eight occasions.

Quarterback Colby Cameron was named the 2012 Western Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year and earned the Sammy Baugh Award presented to college football's top passer by The Touchdown Club of Columbus.

During his tenure at Louisiana Tech, Dykes engineered a turnaround for a program that improved all three seasons under his leadership. The Bulldogs were 4-8 the year before he arrived in 2009, then proceeded to finish 5-7, 8-5 and 9-3 in successive campaigns. In 2011, Louisiana Tech started just 1-4 before winning seven consecutive games to clinch the Western Athletic Conference title – the team's first conference championship in a decade – and a berth in the Poinsettia Bowl. Dykes was named the WAC Coach of the Year for the effort.

Dykes, the son of former longtime Texas Tech coach Spike Dykes, boasts a resume that includes additional stops in the Pac-12, Big 12 and SEC, where he served under such head coaches as Mike Stoops (Arizona), Mike Leach (Texas Tech) and Hal Mumme (Kentucky).

As offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Arizona for three seasons from 2007-09, Dykes helped the Wildcats to the 2008 Las Vegas Bowl and 2009 Holiday Bowl after having not reached the postseason for

10 years. Arizona posted marks of 8-5 both seasons and tied for second in what was then the Pac-10 in 2009 with a 6-3 league record.

Under his direction, the Wildcat offense established five single-season records. Arizona ranked 10th nationally in passing yards in 2007, and the Wildcats were 16th in scoring and 33rd in total offense in 2008.

Prior to his tenure at Arizona, Dykes spent seven seasons at his alma mater, Texas Tech, serving as receivers coach from 2000-04 and adding the title of co-offensive coordinator from 2005-06. The Red Raiders made seven straight postseason appearances and won 56 games during the span, including four postseason victories in the Tangerine, Houston, Holiday and Insight bowls over his last five seasons. In his final campaign at Texas Tech, the Red Raiders ranked No. 3 nationally in passing offense (369.5 ypg) and sixth in total offense (447.9 ypg). In 2006, Dykes received the Mike Campbell Top Assistant Coach Award from the American Football Coaches Association, the same year he was recognized as one of the top 25 recruiters in the country by Rivals.

Dykes began his collegiate coaching career with a two-year stint at Navarro College in Corsicana, Texas, from 1995-96. He also was a baseball assistant at Monahans High School in Texas in 1994 and a football assistant at Pearce High School outside Dallas in 1995.

Born in Big Springs, Texas, Dykes received his bachelor's degree in history from Texas Tech in 1993 and was a member of the Red Raider baseball team for two seasons. He is married to the former Kate Golding and they have two daughters, Alta (Ally) and Charlotte (Charlie).

# CAL-COLORADO SERIES HISTORY

## Last Meeting: at Colorado 41, California 24

November 16, 2013 • TV: Pac-12 Networks • Attendance: 38,252

BOULDER, Colo. – Colorado quarterback Sefo Liufau threw for a career-high 364 yards to lead the Buffaloes to a 41-24 victory over California on a windy afternoon.

The Golden Bears rushed for a season-high 197 yards and got a 55-yard scoring run from freshman Khalfani Muhammad and two touchdown rushes from sophomore Brendan Bigelow. But after coming back from a 10-0 deficit to tie the game in the second quarter, Cal could not keep pace with the Buffaloes in the second half.

Cal quarterback Jared Goff seemed to struggle with the gusty conditions, finishing 23-for-45 for 173 yards. He was briefly replaced by Zach Kline in the second half before coming back to lead a couple of scoring drives in the fourth quarter.

Tony Jones scored on a 10-yard pass from Liufau to give the Buffs a 17-10 lead late in the first half. Colorado then attempted an onside kick and caught Cal off guard, with Isaac Archuleta pouncing on the football and setting up the Buffs in Bears territory. Eight plays later, Christian Powell powered in from 2 yards out to extend the lead to 24-10 at halftime.

Michael Adkins gave the Buffaloes a 34-10 lead early in the fourth quarter when he took a screen pass from Liufau and sprinted 63 yards for a score.

Later, after Bigelow scored on a 1-yard run, the Buffs sealed the win when Cal tried to onside kick it only to have Spruce take off for a 46-yard touchdown.
