Game Brief

Charleston Southern takes on a PAC-12 opponent for the first time in program history as the Bucs travel to Boulder to meet Colorado. The matchup will be CSU's 13th against an FBS foe, and sixth against a Bowl Championship Series conference member.

The Bucs maintained their perfect mark under first-year coach Jamey Chadwell and clinched a winning season with a 25-17 victory over VMI last Saturday. Redshirt freshman quarterback Danny Croghan III led the way for the Bucs, completing 18-of-27 passes for 245 yards and two touchdowns in just his second career start. CSU put up over 400 yards of total offense for a third straight week, tallying 456 en route to posting a 36:38-23:22 advantage in time of possession. Sophomore receiver Larry Jones III made two of the bigger plays for the Bucs in a breakout five-reception, 103-yard performance. Jones brought in a 25-yard reception to convert a third-and-eight late with CSU trailing 17-16 late in the third quarter, and then gave the Bucs the lead for good with a 48-yard touchdown on the following snap.

CSU faces a Colorado team that has struggled at 2-3. The Buffaloes have lost three in a row by an average of 36.3 points per game since opening the year with wins over Colorado State and Central Arkansas. Part of those struggles have certainly been due to the caliber of opponent, as Colorado has lost to No. 2 Oregon and Oregon State and Arizona State teams that were nationally ranked earlier this year. The Buffaloes have had particular difficulty on defense, ranking 119th nationally in total defense, passing defense and scoring defense. Offensively, Colorado turned to a true freshman at quarterback in last week's loss to Arizona State as Sefo Liufau took over for Connor Wood and went 18-of-26 for 169 yards, a touchdown and two interceptions.

18 GAMES FOR CSU? WHAT IF...

Charleston Southern could make NCAA history if the Bucs were to make the FCS Playoffs and piece together a run. The Bucs, theoretically, could play 18 GAMES this season with 13 in the regular season and a five-game run in the postseason. The 13 games is the most ever in a REGULAR SEASON by an FCS team.

COLORADO BOUND

Charleston Southern has added an Oct. 19 trip to Colorado to its 2013 schedule in a rare, mid-season add to the slate. The game makes it seven straight seasons the Bucs have faced an FBS team and becomes CSU's eighth road game this season, the most in the country.

BREAKFAST WITH THE BUCS

CSU will play three of the earliest games in the Eastern Time Zone this season in college football. The Bucs will kickoff at 11 a.m. against Shorter, North Greenville (Oct. 5), and Liberty (Nov. 23), opposed to their previously traditional 1:30 p.m. kickoff times. CSU will kickoff at 1 p.m. against Charlotte (Oct. 26) and Coastal Carolina (Nov. 9).

ROAD WARRIORS

The Bucs will certainly get their fill of the road in 2013. CSU plays eight road games on the season with the addition of the Colorado game. That trip to Boulder will be the Bucs' longest (1,700 miles by road) since trips to face Hawaii in 2007 and 2010.

HOME-AND-HOMES

The Buccaneers open two home-and-home series on their 2013 schedule, beginning with Campbell in Week 3. Campbell will visit CSU in the 2014 season, while CSU returns a game to Charlotte in '14

SEC AHEAD - GEORGIA AND VANDERBILT

Two games on CSU's 2014 schedule were announced when the Southeastern Conference teams began announcing their schedules in August. CSU will face Vanderbilt on Oct. 11 and Georgia on Nov. 2 in 2014.

CSU has previously faced Florida and Kentucky from the SEC.

THE BUCS THIS WEEK

THE MATCHUP

Charleston Southern visits Colorado in its 13th all-time game against an FBS opponent. The Bucs will look to continue their production offensively against a Colorado defense that has struggled against high caliber FCS opponents, including No. 2 Oregon. CSU has recorded over 400 yards of offense each of the last three weeks, while Colorado has allowed over 500 vards of offense each of the last three weeks. On offense, CSU will have to counter CU freshman quarterback Sefo Liufau, who is expected to make his first career start after coming on in relief of Connor Wood last Saturday against Arizona State. Junior receiver Paul Richardson will pose the CSU secondary a challenge. Richardson was a preseason All-PAC 12 selection in several publications, and has backed up that billing with 35 catches, 660 yards, and five touchdowns through five games.

THE COACHES

CHARLESTON SOUTHERN: Jamey Chadwell looks to keep his unblemished start as CSU coach intact in what figures to be the Bucs' biggest challenge of the season. Chadwell led the Bucs to their fifth road win of the season last week against VMI, tying a Big South record for single-season road victories. CSU had won just two road games over the last four seasons, and had not come out on top in a Big South road game since November 2009 prior to last week's triumph over the Keydets.

COLORADO: Mike MacIntyre is in his first season at Colorado after being hired to lead the Buffaloes last December. MacIntyre earned his post at Colorado after leading San Jose State to a 10-2 record and a No. 24 national ranking last season. He compiled a 16-21 record in three seasons at San Jose State, helping turn around a program that had struggled to a 1-12 season in 2009 prior to his arrival. Before taking over at San Jose State, MacIntyre spent five seasons in the NFL as a defensive backs coach with the Dallas Cowbovs and New York Jets. He has spent most of his career in the college ranks, including a four-year stint as wide receivers and defensive backs coach at Ole Miss. While with the Rebels, MacIntyre helped recruit future NFL stars Eli Manning and Patirck Willis to Ole Miss. During his two-year stint as defensive backs coach at Ole Miss, MacIntyre worked with a unit that included current CSU secondary coach Marcus Woodson.



Jamey Chadwell

Head Coach - 1st Season at CSU East Tennessee State, 2000

Jamey Chadwell was named the head coach of the CSU football team in January of 2013, returning to Charleston Southern after a four-year stint where he served as the head coach at North Greenville and Delta State.

Chadwell becomes the third head coach in CSU history. He replaces Jay Mills who retired after 10 seasons as CSU's head coach.

Chadwell, who is 25-21 in his four seasons as a head coach, spent five seasons at CSU as an assistant, all as a part of Mills' staff, and now returns to head a program he helped build.

Chadwell takes over the CSU program after spending the last four seasons as a head coach at

two Division II programs. This season, he served as the first-year head coach at Delta State University in Cleveland, Miss. Prior to DSU, he put North Greenville University on the national map at the D-II level.

The east-Tennessee native went from 2-8 in his first season at NGU to 11-3 in 2011 and a berth in the NCAA D-II Quarterfinals, where his Crusaders lost to Delta State, 28-23. In his three seasons at North Greenville, Chadwell was 22-14 as a head coach and led NGU to its first-ever national ranking finishing the 2011 season rakned 12th-nationally in the American Football Coaches Association DII Poll.



Chadwell takes over one of the most improved teams in the FCS this past season. The Bucs' five-game improvement in their 5-6 season in 2012 was second only to Villanova (six more wins) for the largest one-year improvement.

Chadwell spent five seasons at on Mills' staff at CSU before leaving for North Greenville. He helped the Bucs' program reach new heights, claiming the 2005 Big South Conference title with a 7-4 record and a 3-1 record in league play. In

2006, he became the Bucs' wide receivers coach, while continuing to serve as recruiting coordinator.

Chadwell's five-year stretch at CSU was the most successful stretch in program history. The Bucs won 14-straight games from 2005-'06 and three of the four winning seasons in the program's short history.

Following the 2006 season, Mills' promoted Chadwell to Assistant Head Coach and the former East Tennessee State quarterback would finish out his time at Charleston Southern in that capacity. During his five seasons with Mills, CSU accumulated 28 wins and one Big South Conference title.

Chadwell played at East Tennessee State University (1995-99) and was a two-year starter at quarterback.

Chadwell began his collegiate coaching career at his alma mater ETSU in 2000. From 2000-2003, the former Anderson County High School star worked with quarterbacks, tight ends and running backs while assisting with recruiting and offensive game planning.

As a four-year letterman for the Buccaneers, Chadwell spent two seasons as a costarter at quarterback. He was twice named Team Captain and he helped lead ETSU to the Southern Conference title game two times during his career (1995-1999).

He received his bachelor's degree in Economics and Business Education in May 2000 from East Tennessee State. He also completed his master's in Business Administration from Charleston Southern in May 2006.

Chadwell is married to the former Solmaz Zarrineh and the couple has one son, Jameson (4) and daughter, Avery, born in January 2013

REYES ON VERGE OF RUSHING RECORD

Christian Reyes shattered the rushing record at College of Siskiyous last season with 1,958 yards on the ground, and is 46 yards away from setting the CSU single-season mark. Even without playing in the second half against Shorter and sparingly against VMI, Reyes has 729 yards with an average of 5.3 yards per carry. If Reyes was to continue his current pace of 104 yards per game for the entire season, he would finish with 1,352 yards. The current CSU single-seaon rushing record is held by Vinson Blain, who ran for 774 yards in 1998.

TOPS IN TURNOVERS

CSU is +9 and tied for 8th nationally in turnover margin. The Bucs are tied for the national lead (Tennessee State) with just four turnovers committed, while forcing 13. The Bucs have thrown two INTs and lost two fumbles this season.

IN THE POLLS

Charleston Southern moved into the national rankings for the second time in program history following its 28-14 win over North Greenville. The Bucs checked into the FCS Coaches Poll at No. 25, and moved up to 24th after their Big South Conference opener 25-17 win over VMI. CSU's only previous national ranking came in November of 2006, when the Bucs were placed 24th in the coaches poll thanks to a 9-0 start.

CROGHAN STEPS IN AND STEPS UP

CSU redshirt freshman Danny Croghan III was pressed at quarterback into action when senior captain Malcolm Dixon went down with an injury late in the fourth quarter against Appalachian State. Croghan delivered the game-winning touchdonwn pass against the Mountaineers, and has produced consecutive solid perfromances in his first two starts. Croghan picked up Big South Freshman of the Week accolades for his outing against VMI, completing 18-of-27 passes for 245 yards and two touchdowns. He once again showed his ability to run the Bucs' spread option attack as well, running for 30 yards on 15 carries while leading CSU to a whopping 13:16 advantage in time of possession.

BURNS NAMED BIG SOUTH SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF WEEK

Croghan was not alone in being honored by the Big South, as CSU freshman punter Truett Burns earned Special Teams Player of the Week accolades. Burns pinned VMI inside its own 20-yard line three times, including once at the one-yard line. He averaged 39 yards on his four punts and recorded a new career-long punt of 48 yards.

JONES FLASHES FRESHMAN YEAR FORM

Larry Jones III gave the VMI secondary fits for a second consecutive year in CSU's 25-17 win over the Keydets. A year after scoring two touchdowns and earning Big South Freshman of the Week accolades for his performance agianst VMI, Jones found the end zone again to highlight a five-catch, 103-yard day. Jones' 48-yard touchdown gave CSU a 22-17 lead it would not relinquish with one second left in the third quarter. It followed a 25-yard reception that moved the chains on a crucial third-and-eight. Jones' big play ability was evident last year, when he caught four touchdowns and averaged over 20 yards a catch to earn a spot on

the Big South All-Freshmen Team.

BUCS AGAINST THE FBS

CSU's 13th game of the 2013 season is the program's 13th against a member of the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS). The Bucs are 0-12 all-time in such matchups, with their best effort coming in a 38-27 loss to Miami (OH) in 2008. After Saturday's game against the Buffaloes, CSU will now have taken the field against opponents from five of the six Bowl Championship Series (BCS) automatic qualifying conferences, with the Big 12 being the only exception. CSU's first matchup against an FBS foe came on November 2, 2002, when it fell to South Florida, 56-6.

A WINNING FORMULA

CSU has developed an identity during its 7-0 start under first-year coach Jamey Chadwell, and the formula has been simple. The Bucs are running the football out of their spread option attack, getting the opponent off the field on third down, and generating turnovers while taking care of the football themselves. Here's a look at where CSU stacks up nationally in some of those categories

TAKING THE ROAD LESS TRAVELED

Charleston Southern entered the 2013 season 2-20 on the road over the last four years, and had not won a Big South road game since November 2009. The Bucs have turned around their road fortunes in a big way this year, going a perfect 5-0 on the road with attention-generating victories over The Citadel and Appalachian State. CSU's five road wins are the most in a regular season in Big South history. The five road wins are also a program record, eclipsing the three that the 9-2 2006 team claimed.

THE GOOSE CREEK GO-TO MAN

CSU junior wide receiver Kevin Glears has emerged as one of Dixon's favorite targets in the passing game. Glears has made the most of his 20 catches, as five have gone for touchdowns. The 6-0, 180 speedster did not have a touchdown in his first two years as a Buc, although he did catch 18 passes while playing in 17 games and starting four times. Glears' 64-yard touchdown against The Citadel jumpstarted CSU's offense in the 32-29 comeback win. He then caught a pair of touchdowns in the first half against Shorter, with both catches coming over the middle over good coverage. Glears made yet another big play in Saturday's win over Campbell, aiusting to the football to pull in a 41-yard pass that set up a TJ Higgins field goal to give the Bucs a 10-3 halftime lead. Glears caught a career-high seven passes for 64 yards against App State, and his brilliant leaping catch for the winning touchdown certainly stands as one of the highlight reel plays in program history.

HUNT PUTTING HURT ON QUARTERBACKS

Will Hunt was a preseason all-Big South selection, and the redshirt senior defensive end has played up to that standard through the season's first seven games. Hunt had two sacks against North Greenville and now leads the Big South with five for the season, marking a career-high already. Hunt has hardly been alone in getting in the oppo-

nent's backfield. Defensive line mates Dylan Black and James Smith, along with middle linebacker Calvin Bryant, are tied for fifth in the league with 2.5 sacks each.

STATEMENT WIN

CSU earned one of the biggest wins in the program's 23-year history when it downed App State, 27-24. The win was CSU's third-ever over a Southern Conference opponent, and was even more special due to the Mountaineers' illustrious history. App State won three straight FCS National Championships under Jerry Moore from 2005-07, and has advanced to the playoffs each of the last eight seasons. The Mountaineers are destined for the FBS level and the Sun Belt Conference next season.

TOUGH IN SECOND HALF

CSU's defense has been at its best in cruch time this season. The Bucs have allowed only 50 points in the second half (7.2 per game), including holding VMI to three points last week in a 25-17 win after triling at the break, 14-13.

WILD LAST 30 GAMES

CSU was one of the most improved teams in the FCS in 2012, going from 0-11 in '11 to 5-6 for the second-largest win increase at the FCS level behind Villanova (+6). The Bucs have kept the momentum rolling in 2013 with a 7-0 start to improve to 12-3 over their last 15 games.

BLACK BOLSTERING BUCS' D-LINE

While redshirt senior defensive end Will Hunt gets the most attention on the CSU defensive line and for good reason - the man manning the other side of the Bucs' front three is putting together a terrific junior campaign. Dylan Black posted a career-high nine tackles and matched a careerbest with 1.5 tackles for loss in the Norfolk State win. His fumble recovery and touchdown following a strip sack of NSU quarterback Tyler Clark is perhaps the biggest defensive play of the Bucs' young season, as it helped clinch the 20-12 win. Black earned National Defensive Performer of the Week honors from College Football Performance Awards for his play. For the season, he has 24 tackles and is tied with senior middle linebacker Calvin Bryant for second on the team in sacks with 2.5 - tied for fifth-most in the Big South.

GOOD THINGS COME IN SMALL PACKAGES

Jamey Chadwell and CSU offensive coordinator Gabe Giardina raved about the speed and bigplay ability of freshman running back Ben Robinson before the season. So far, the 5-7, 170-pound speedster from Tallahassee. Fla. has shown reason for the excitement. Robinson collected Big South Freshman of the Week honors for his effort against Norfolk State, rushing for a career-high 98 yards and his first collegiate touchdown. Robinson sparked the Bucs' offense to break a scoreless tie on CSU's first possession of the second quarter. He broke out of a swarm of NSU defenders to get outside for a 39-yard gain to start the drive, and added a 20-yard scamper down the left sideline to set up first-and-goal. Robinson then finished off the march by going into the end zone on an option pitch from two yards out to give CSU a 7-0 advantage. The Lincoln High School product is third on the team with 320 yards rushing, and leads the squad with 5.3 yards per carry.

STILL PERFECT

Charleston Southern's victory over VMI gave the

program only its second 7-0 start in 23 seasons of football. The Bucs' only other 7-0 start came in 2006.CSU won the first nine games of its 2006 season, and has enjoyed only three other winning streaks of at least four games (2005 - 5, 2008 - 4, 20009 - 4).

STARTING WITH A STATEMENT

Jamey Chadwell became the first Charleston Southern head coach to win his debut as the Bucs overcame a 16-0 deficit to defeat The Citadel, 32-29, on August 31 at Johnson Hagood Stadium. The victory marked just the second time CSU has ever won a season-opener on the road, with the other coming over Presbyterian as part of a 9-0 start in 2006. CSU's victory over a Citadel team coming off a 7-4 2012 season - and expected to be an FCS Playoff contender in 2013 - earned the Bucs some national recognition. CSU received four votes in the Top-25 FCS Coaches Poll, and two in the Sports Network's poll. The Bucs only national ranking came during the 2006 season, when they climbed as high as 12th in the College Sports Report's poll.

FRESHMEN/NEWCOMERS IN ACTION

Youth was featured prominently for CSU in the season opener at The Citadel, particularly on the offensive side of the football. Four of CSU's starters on offense made their collegiate debut, while six made their first career start. The Bucs started an offensive line with only one combined start outside of right guard Clayton Truitt's 16. In all, 16 Bucs have made their CSU debut in 2013

THE WAIT IS OVER

No. 4/6 Coastal Carolina travels to Liberty this Saturday in the most anticipated Big South game of the season, and it will air on ESPN3. It is the 11th meeting between the schools and the series is tied at 5-5. The winner of this match-up has won or shared the Big South football Championship eight times. The Chanticleers won three-straight over Liberty from 2004-06 en route to three consecutive titles (two outright, one shared). The Flames were victorious from 2007-09 while winning three-straight Big South crowns (two outright, one shared). Coastal won last season's meeting and both teams shared the title in 2012 as well as 2010.

A CLOSER LOOK AT COASTAL-LIBERTY

The Chanticleers lead the League in scoring offense and is fifth in the nation at 43.0 points, while Liberty tops the Conference in scoring defense at 16.7 points allowed to rank sixth nationally.

BURNING UP THE HOUSE

Liberty carries its Big South-record 18-game Conference home win streak into Saturday's game against Coastal Carolina, and has swept its home Big South schedule six consecutive seasons. During this stretch, the Flames have scored 777 points (43.2 points per game), scored more than 30 points in 15 contests, and has held its League brethren to 335 points (18.6). The last Big South team to defeat Liberty inside Williams Stadium was Gardner-Webb on Oct. 21, 2006 (27-24).

START ME UP

Charleston Southern and Coastal Carolina are 1-0 in Big South play. The Buccaneers are 1-0 for the first time since 2008 and the fourth time overall. The Chanticleers are 1-0 for the first time since 2011 and the eighth time in school history. Looking ahead to this week, Coastal is looking for its first 2-0 League start since 2006.

SECOND-AND-TWO

Saturday will be the second and final week featuring Conference openers, as Liberty begins its Big South slate at home against Coastal Carolina, while Presbyterian College opens League play at home vs. VMI. The Flames are 8-3 all-time in Big South openers and have won their last six Conference lid-lifters -- with an average of 45.3 points in those six contests. PC is looking for its first-ever 1-0 start in League action (0-4).

THE UNDEFEATEDS

Charleston Southern is the second team in Big South history to open the season 7-0, joining the 2006 Buccaneers (9-0). Coastal Carolina (6-0) is the fourth to open at least 6-0, and the Big South is the only FCS Conference with two undefeated teams. In addition, CSU first-year head coach **JAMEY CHADWELL** is the first head coach to start 7-0 in his first season in the Big South.

THE 20/20 EXPERIENCE

Defending Big South co-champion Coastal Carolina has won its last six Big South games, the longest active streak in the Conference. The Chanticleers have won each of those six League tilts by at least 20 points -- extending their Big South record, with a 31.2 average margin of victory in the six wins.

RECORD ROAD WARRIORS

Charleston Southern's five road wins this season are the most in the regular-season in League history and ties the Conference record for most road victories in a single-season. That record was established last season by Coastal Carolina, which included a road playoff win. The Buccaneers have also matched the Big South record for longest road winning streak (5). Liberty first set the mark with its five consecutive road wins from Oct. 20, 2007 - Oct. 4, 2008. Meanwhile, CSU's 25-17 win at VMI this past Saturday was its first Big South road victory since a 46-32 win at Presbyterian on Nov. 7, 2009 -- snapping a streak of 9-straight road losses in Conference games.

SECOND HALF SHUTDOWN

Coastal Carolina has allowed just 53 points in the second half this season -- an average of 8.8 points. In the third quarter, the Chants have permitted just 17 markers for an average of 2.8 points allowed. Coastal has held its last two opponents (Elon, Gardner-Webb) scoreless in the second half.

BLUE SWARM

Charleston Southern is nationally-ranked for the second consecutive week, as the Buccaneers are No. 24 in this week's FCS Coaches poll. CSU is ranked in the Top 25 this season for the first time since the week of Nov. 6, 2006, following the Bucs' 9-0 start to the season (No. 24 - *Sports Network*, No. 25 - Coaches). Charleston Southern's entry marks the third Big South program to be ranked this year -- the second time in League history that three teams were nationally-ranked at any point of the season.
