TREVOR EGGLESTON
ADAMS STATE

SOPHOMORE, QUARTERBACK, 6-2, 200
TUCSON, ARIZ./SALPOINTE CATHOLIC HS

Eggleston, who is now 5-2 as a starter, completed 17 of 23 passes for 338 yards and three scores without being intercepted. The effort was his second career 300-yard day. He completed three passes for 50 or more yards, including an 85-yard scoring catch-and-run to Shane McBurney, the longest in ASC's NCAA Division II history (1992-Present). His 73.9 percent completion rate was the third best in the Grizzlies' available single-game history and the best in seven years. His 14.7 yard per pass attempt average and impressive 240.4 pass efficiency rating were also the best in available single-game school history. He had 258 passing yards at halftime and then completed all seven of his second-half passes for an additional 80 yards before being relieved early in the fourth quarter.

National Football Foundation Player of the Week

Team Notes: The Grizzlies racked up 576 yards of total offense in Saturday's 34-14 win over Dixie State (Utah) helping assistant head coach and offensive coordinator Manny Wasinger celebrate his 50th birthday. The 576 yards were the most in all 23 of Wasinger's games in his Grizzly coaching tenure and were the most since Oct. 8, 2005 and the third most in ASC's available single-game history (1997-Present). Grizzly quarterbacks Trevor Eggleston (Tucson, Ariz.) and Sean McDougal (Fort Collins, Colo.) combined for 381 passing yards, the fifth most in available single-game history, and the most since Oct. 15, 2005 (vs. Mesa State). The Grizzlies out-gained the Red Storm 576-190 and had a 494-92 advantage in total offense through three quarters. The Grizzly defense recorded six sacks, eight total tackles for losses and held the Red Storm to just 23 net rushing yards and a single fourth-quarter touchdown with the game well in reach. The Grizzlies also recorded a score of their own as sophomore rover James Ackel (Riverside, Calif.) tallied a 31-yard interception return for a touchdown putting the Grizzlies up 27-7. The 23 net rushing yards allowed were the fewest since the Grizzlies 2008 season-ending win at Colorado State-Pueblo, when they held the ThunderWolves to negative 10 yards. The Grizzly defense also came up with a pair of fourth-down stops and held the Red Storm passing game in check for 3-plus quarters as Red Storm quarterbacks completed just three of their first 21 passes. The Grizzlies' victory was their first season-opening win since 2006 when the Grizzlies also beat Dixie State, 37-7. The victory was also ASC's first non-conference win since 2006 and snapped a 7-game non-conference slide. The home team has now won all four meetings between Adams State and Dixie State. Junior wide receiver Shane McBurney (Chandler, Ariz.) and sophomore Scott Kellogg (Littleton, Colo.) combined for 13 pass receptions as both recorded their first career-100 yard games. McBurney had six catches for 150 receiving yards while Kellogg had seven catches for 120 yards. Both caught touchdown passes. Saturday's game was the first since Oct. 15, 2005 (vs. Mesa State) in which two Grizzlies had 100-yard receiving efforts. The Grizzlies racked up 724 all-purpose yards, second most in the team's available single-game history and the most since Oct. 8, 2005 (766, vs. New Mexico Highlands. Four different players recorded 100 or more. Scott Kellogg had 196 while fellow receiver Shane McBurney had 150. Redshirt freshman running back Chris Jamison (Mesa, Ariz.) tallied 104 while junior Terjean Saffold (Stockton, Calif.) had 103. Saffold is the first Grizzly since 2001 (Pheon Bright) to rush for 100 or more yards in the first game of the campaign. He racked up 45 of his 101 ground yards on a fourth-quarter touchdown. The Grizzlies will look for their first 2-0 start since 1996 this week when they take on Division I-FCS opponent Northern Colorado in Greeley. The Bears hold a 13-10-1 edge in the fairly balanced all-time series. Adams State has lost six straight to the Bears and have not defeated them since 1968. The last time the teams faced each other was on Oct. 25, 2003 when the Bears claimed a 55-14 win in their first year after leaving the NCAA Division II ranks.

COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES (0-1, 0-0 RMAC)

James Tucker (Senior, Linebacker, 6-0, 230, Highlands Ranch, Colo./ThunderRidge HS)

Tucker led all players with 15 total tackles (four solo) in the Orediggers' 34-29 loss to #10 Washburn University on Aug. 28 at Campbell Field. He also finished the contest with 1.5 tackles for a loss.

Team Notes: The Orediggers amassed 314 yards passing against the tenth-ranked Ichabods in both teams' season-opening game on Aug. 28 at Campbell Field (formerly called Brooks Field). CSM will return to action on Sept. 4 at South Dakota School of Mines and Technology (6 p.m. MDT kickoff) in Rapid City, S.D.

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY (0-0, 0-0 MWC)

Team Notes: Colorado State will face Colorado Sept. 4 at Invesco Field for both team's season opener.

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY - PUEBLO (1-0, 0-0 RMAC)

Jesse Lewis (Junior, Running Back, 5-6, 173, Loveland, Colo./Loveland HS)

Lewis ran for 100 yards or more for the sixth consecutive game (dating back to last season). He carried the ball 22 times for 145 yards and two scores in the ThunderWolves season opening win at Oklahoma Panhandle State. He averaged 6.6 yards per carry in a 26-14 win. Lewis rose to 11th on the CSU-Pueblo all-time list in both career rushing yardage (1,387 yards) and career all-purpose yards (2,010).

WESTERN STATE COLLEGE (0-1, 0-0 RMAC)

Curtis Prock (Junior, Tight End, 5-11, 225, Castle Rock, Colo./Douglas County HS)

Prock led the RMAC in receptions during the opening weekend of the season after he caught a career high 10 passes for 97 yards in the season opening loss at Fort Hays State, 20-45. This was his first appearance since 2008 after sitting out the 2009 season with an injury. The Mountaineers gained five first downs on his receptions.

Team Notes: The Mountaineers will wrap up the non-conference schedule this week with the two-time defending Division I Football Championship Subdivision national runner-up Montana. It is the final game in a two-year contract with the Grizzlies. Western State held Montana to 10 first-half points a year ago in a 38-0 loss. Miles Gorham went 21-of-32 for 218 yards and no interceptions in his first collegiate start last week against Fort Hays State. Gorham has gone 78 straight passing attempts without an interception dating back to the 2008 opener against Emporia State. Curtis Prock led the RMAC through the opening weekend with a career-high 10 receptions. The Mountaineers went three-of-three in the red zone with three touchdowns. Western State was one of two RMAC teams to go 100 percent in the red zone during the first weekend. Shaun Suttorp caught five receptions against Fort Hays State, and now needs 11 to tie the career reception record of 183 set by Tyrone Johnson from 1990-93. Johnny Pieper was one of four conference players to force a fumble this season and added a career-high six solo tackle.
