Rams put unblemished record on the line

This week's notable storylines...

- Rivalry? CU has played CSU more than any opponent in its history. Only Wyoming has played the Rams more often than the Buffs. CU is the Rams' oldest rival, as the teams first met on Feb. 11, 1893.
- For the first time since 1941, the Rams will play the Buffs with a record of 2-0 or better. For the first time since 1939, the Buffs will play the Rams with a mark of 0-2 or worse.
- CSU can open a season 3-0 for the second time in three seasons (also 2009, when the Rams won in Boulder).
- Both head coaches, CU's Jon Embree and CSU's Steve Fairchild, took over teams for whom they'd previously played and coached, returned from NFL jobs, and proceeded to surround themselves with several former players, pupils and fellow assistants on their staffs.
- In fact, all four Division I programs in the state feature a head coach at the helm of his alma mater, including Air Force's Troy Calhoun and UNC's Earnest Collins.
- Combined, 69 players from the state of Colorado appear on the rosters of the two teams.
- Six Colorado high schools produced teammates that will be on opposite sidelines Saturday.
- This year's game and the 2015 contest are the only two in the current contract that won't occur on the first week of the season. It's the latest the teams have met since Oct. 1, 1988.

Welcome... The Colorado State athletic media relations office genuinely appreciates your coverage of CSU football, and looks forward to each and every time it can welcome you to Fort Collins. Members of the office, including director Zak Gilbert, assistant directors Danny Mattie and Danielle Marshall, and several student assistants, are available to assist with your coverage. The office is happy to help you however it can.

Interviews...

- All interviews with any member of the football program, including the coaching staff and student-athletes, must be coordinated through the athletic media relations office.
- Head Coach Steve Fairchild is available either in-person or by phone, by appointment through his assistant, Linda Krier (970/491-7818).
- Telephone interviews with a coach or student-athlete should be arranged at least 24 hours in advance of the requested session, through the athletic media relations office.
- Phone calls (cell, office or home), text messages or social media contact (FaceBook, Twitter, etc.) to any coach or student-athlete are strictly prohibited, unless previously arranged through media relations. Media should contact media relations, rather than the individual coaches and/or student-athletes, when needing personal contact information, such as phone numbers or e-mail addresses.

Postgame...

- All players and coaches must report immediately to the locker room before conducting interviews of any kind. Colorado State does not allow on-field interviews in the minutes following the final gun.
- Head Coach Steve Fairchild will meet the media, following his radio interview, in a designated area. When Fairchild is finished taking questions, CSU players and assistants will be made available to media upon request. The locker room is closed.

Injuries...

- At all times throughout the calendar year, including spring practice, Head Coach Steve Fairchild will serve as the sole source for injury information. All questions related to injuries should be directed to Fairchild. Athletic training staff members will refer injury questions to Fairchild.
- If Fairchild is unavailable, contact the athletic media relations office.

Photography/videography...

- Video cameras are permitted to shoot B-roll of practice as early as the first players arrive (usually 20-30 minutes prior to the start), but are asked to stop filming once the team's stretching period, usually very early in practice, concludes. Still photographers should take only tight shots during any 11-on-11 period, and no formations of any kind should be made public for competitive reasons.

3-0 starts: With a win Saturday, CSU would be 3-0 for the second time since 1994, arguably the most magical season in program history.

- CSU was 3-0 under Fairchild in 2009, gaining votes in both national polls, before losing its last nine games.
- The Rams in 1994, with several current coaches contributing, made their first-ever appearance in the AP top 25 and went on to a WAC championship and Holiday Bowl berth opposite Michigan. In the final polls, coaches ranked CSU No. 14 and the AP ranked the team No. 16.
- In fact, before 2009, that '94 team represented CSU's only 3-0 club over the past three decades. Prior to '94, the last time the Rams were 3-0 was 1977, when Head Coach Sark Arslanian led his team to a 9-2-1 mark, behind Arizona State and Brigham Young, who tied for the WAC championship. Mormon church leaders would not allow BYU to play on Christmas Day in the Fiesta Bowl, the WAC's only postseason game, so ASU received the bowl bid. If Arizona would have beaten ASU in the final week of the season, CSU would have gone to the Fiesta Bowl, but ASU won easily, and without a consolation bowl for the conference, tiebreakers left CSU on the outside looking in, despite one of the best records in program annals.

Beards: Not only will the Rams be putting their undefeated record on the line Saturday, there's also a lot of facial hair at stake.

- Beards are the buzz at CSU camp. Backup center Tyler McDermott dyed his thick beard black during August camp, like Giants closer Brian Wilson. That spurred Mike Finney and Dan Kleinholz, equipment manager Kris Young's top assistants, to begin working on impressive facial fuzz.
- Both Finney and Kleinholz have pledged that they will not shave until CSU loses a game this season. They also promised not to do anything as bold as McDermott; natural color only.
- They inspired technical intern/offensive line Phil Serchia and technical intern/defensive line Trevor Wikre to grow beards. Young jumped in, as well as WR Matt Yemm. None will shave until the Rams lose.

Family rivalry: CSU redshirt freshman Ty Sambrailo (sam-BRY-loh) is a versatile, athletic big man who can do back flips and freestyle skiing flips and tricks. He won the USSA titles in the Far West Division for his age group in the slalom, giant slalom and super G.

► His dad, Mark, graduated from the University of Colorado, where he was a pole vaulter. His Mom graduated from the University of Denver. But his brother, Erik, also is a CU graduate and competed as a skier in the Junior Olympics. In an athletic family, sister Kiersten currently plays volleyball at Oregon State, while grandfather Bill Sambrailo played football at Santa Clara, helping the team to a berth in the Orange Bowl

Same place, new name: Saturday's game will be played at a familiar venue that now sports a new moniker, when the Cinch Jeans Rocky Mountain Showdown returns to Denver, and the newly renamed Sports Authority Field at Mile High.

Familiar path to the bridge: Colorado State Head Coach Steve Fairchild and first-year CU head coach Jon Embree each took very similar treks to their first head coaching jobs.

Jon Embree was named the 24th full-time head football coach (and the 26th overall including two interim) in University of Colorado history on Dec. 6, 2010, returning home to the state where he starred as a player in both high school and college as well as where he got his start in coaching.

- Though this is his first head coaching position on any level, he brings 18 years of coaching experience to the CU program.
- That includes 10 seasons (1993-2002) as an assistant on the Colorado staff under three different head coaches, Bill McCartney (1993-94), Rick Neuheisel (1995-98) and Gary Barnett (1999-2002).

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

Rams defensive lineman Scott Carter matches up against his former teammate at Mountain Vista High School, Patrick Mahnke...Sophomore fullback Jake Levin played with CU's tight end Scott Fernandez at Legacy High School...Rams kicker Ben DeLine and Buffalos tight end Alex Wood both graduated from Steamboat Springs High School...Immanuel Mitchell, Greg Henderson and Chidera Uzo-Diribe, from the Corona, Calif., area, meet again...CSU and CU both have former members of Saddleback College on their teams; Dominique Vinson, who can play both ways for the Rams and Eric Richter, an offensive lineman...In 2006, Head Coach Steve Fairchild was an offensive coordinator for the Buffalo Bills; that year the Bills faced off against the Vikings, whose running backs were coached by Eric Bieniemy. The Bills won, 17-12.

TOP INDIVIDUAL EFFORTS VS. CU

- K Ben DeLine is 5-for-6 on field goals in his three games against CU, including a 3-for-3 performance in 2009.
- CB/PR Momo Thomas had a big punt return in addition to an interception in the 2010 Showdown.
- QB Pete Thomas made his first career start in this game last season.
- Head Coach Steve Fairchild made his debut at the helm of the Rams in the 2008 contest at then-Invesco Field.
- CB Elijah-Blu Smith made one of the most memorable hits in Rams history in the '09 Boulder win, separating Scotty McKnight from the ball.
- G Jake Gdowski got a season-opening start in that '09 game, on his birthday.

- ▶ Each played for, and later served as an assistant coach at their respective schools. Fairchild played quarterback for the Rams from 1978-80. Embree was a tight end at Colorado from 1983-86. Both men returned to their alma maters as assistant coaches, before taking over as the 19th and 24th head coaches, respectively, in each program's history.
- ▶ Each athletic department hired its coach from the NFL, where each individual was an assistant.
- ▶ Each coach, in turn, hired several former teammates, fellow assistants, and pupils from his respective program's history, to fill out his staff.

A returning starter against the Buffs: Colorado State sophomore QB Pete Thomas will become the first Rams signal-caller to start back-to-back seasons against Colorado since Caleb Hanie in 2006 and 2007.

▶ Hanie led the Rams to a 14-10 victory as a junior starter in 2006, completing 20-of-23 attempts for 233 yards and one touchdown. In 2007, the Forney, Texas, native was 20-for-27, recording 229 yards through the air and completing three touchdown passes in an overtime loss (31-28).

Better late than never: The Rams and Buffs hook up for a Week 3 meeting in this year's Cinch Jeans Rocky Mountain Showdown, marking the latest that the game has been played since the 1988 season, when the Rams hosted CU on Oct. 1.

▶ Colorado escaped Hughes Stadium with a 27-23 victory in that contest. Since that season, the Rams and Buffs have played eight games that didn't take place in the first week of the season.

▶ Colorado State has won the last two matchups against the Buffs when the Rams have played at least one game before seeing their in-state rivals, including the 2002 tilt, when Bradlee Van Pelt and Cecil Sapp carried the Rams to a 19-14 victory over the No. 7-ranked Buffs, a week after a road victory over No. 22 Virginia in the Jim Thorpe Association Classic.

Undefeated Rams against the Buffs: Colorado State enters Saturday's Cinch Jeans Rocky Mountain Showdown with a 2-0 record, having secured victories at New Mexico (14-10) and vs. Northern Colorado (33-14) to open the 2011 season. This marks the first time since 1941, and the seventh time overall that the Rams have faced CU with an undefeated record after two or more games. The Rams came away with victories in four of the previous six instances to extend their unbeaten streaks in 1916, 1919, 1925 and 1932.

Winless Buffs against the Rams: Colorado enters Saturday's Cinch Jeans Rocky Mountain Showdown with a record of 0-2, having

dropped season-opening games at Hawaii (34-17) and at home vs. Cal (36-33). The last time that CSU faced a CU squad that was 0-2 or worse was 1939, when both teams came in with 0-3 marks. CU picked up the victory in that contest, 13-0.

Rams, Buffs extend football series through 2020: The next generation of recruits and fans will experience the most exciting football rivalry in the Centennial State. And that rivalry, which has gained national prominence since it first moved to Denver in 1998, is in the midst of a return to the Mile High City.

► Paul Kowalczyk and Mike Bohn, the respective directors of athletics at Colorado State University and the University of Colorado, announced at this time in 2009 a 10-year extension to their football series, Colorado State's oldest and richest gridiron rivalry. The announcement was made in conjunction with the Metro Denver Sports Commission and Stadium Management Company.

► As part of the agreement, the 2010 game was moved to Denver, and the game will remain in Denver every season through 2019. In 2020, the contest will move to Fort Collins.

► "This is the state's signature college football event and the game belongs in Denver," Kowalczyk said in 2009. "Mike, MDSC, SMC and I have worked cooperatively and diligently to craft an agreement that is beneficial for all parties involved. This series benefits our institution, program and fans on many levels. This state is fortunate to have two premier football programs, and we're going to continue to showcase this rivalry for at least another decade."

This month in CSU football history

Aggies to Rams: The History of Football at Colorado State University

► 100 years ago – Sept. 4, 1911, Harry W. Hughes reports for his first day of work at Colorado Agricultural College (now CSU) as the new Director of Athletics. In the next 42 years, Hughes coaches baseball (three years), basketball (14 years), football (31 years) and track (41 years) to build a dominant athletic program at CSU between 1911 and 1953. In 1968, CSU names its new football stadium in his honor.

► 90 years ago – Sept. 21, 1921, the Aggie Booster Club is formed as one of the earliest donor organizations in the region. Men from the Lions Club, Rotary Club and Commercial Club band together to form the organization. Support comes in the form of all members wearing white pants and ringing cowbells along with closing businesses in Fort Collins on game days so that all can support the Aggies. This organization is the great, great grandfather of the current Ram Club that supports CSU student-athletes' scholarships.

► 75 years ago – Sept. 11, 1936, Glenn Morris Day at Colorado Field in Fort Collins. The former Aggie end, all-conference football player and member of the 1933 East-West Shrine team, is awarded the name "Greatest Athlete in World" after winning the decathlon in the 1936 Berlin Olympics. Morris presents the school with an oak tree that is to be planted in front of the new student union building. The tree does not survive but a second generation oak is planted near the newly renamed Glenn Morris Field House in 2010.

► 45 years ago – Sept. 8, 1966, the Commission of Higher Education approves the construction of a new 30,000-seat football stadium for Colorado State University to replace Colorado Field. CSU Athletic Director Jim Williams announces it is like, "Christmas in September!" The stadium, later named Hughes Stadium, is completed two years later and opens on Sept. 28, 1968.

► 35 years ago – Sept. 25, 1976, the Rams' defense holds the Wichita State Shockers to 3 yards rushing and only 103 yards of total offense in a 23-3 win at Hughes Stadium. Mike Bell and Al "Bubba" Baker shine in the game, but it is the eight unassisted tackles of Steve Krum that helps make CSU the leading team in the nation against the run.


► 25 years ago – Sept. 6, 1986, the Rams upset the Buffaloes at Folsom Field for their first win in Boulder since 1958. Rams running back Steve Bartalo rushes for one touchdown and 145 yards. Steve DeLine kicks three field goals and a Dale Carr interception return for a touchdown seals the 23-7 victory.

► 20 years ago – Sept. 28, 1991, CSU wide receiver Greg Primus sets the all-time record for yards in a game, against Hawaii at Hughes Stadium, for a 28-16 homecoming victory. Primus catches 10 passes, two for touchdowns, from quarterback Kevin Verdugo to rack up 256 yards on the day.

► 10 years ago – Sept. 8, 2001, injuries hit the Rams' running game, including a season-ending injury to star running back Cecil Sapp (a benign tumor on the bone of his left heel). But Duan Ruff fills in for the sidelined Sapp, Rashaan Sanders and Henri Childs, and rushes for 106 yards in a victory over Nevada.

Aggies to Rams, the first definitive publication on the rich history of football at Colorado State University, is still available in the CSU and Rams bookstores.

The book, which contains countless pictures, stories and information spanning every era of CSU football history, is the life's passion of author John Hirn. A CSU graduate, Hirn is unselfishly donating 80 percent of net profits to the university's Athletic General Scholarship Fund, so readers can help future Rams continue the tradition of excellence at Colorado State.

- The extension means the football programs will meet for at least 26 straight years (1995-2020), the longest uninterrupted string of games in the 116-year-old series since they met for 37 consecutive seasons from 1906-42, a streak ended by World War II.
- The programs, scheduled to meet for the 83rd time Saturday, first met on Feb. 11, 1893, in Fort Collins.
- The current agreement is believed to represent the longest football extension ever negotiated by the state's two largest institutions.

Against a first-year CU coach: For the 16th time in the history of the rivalry between Colorado State and Colorado, the Rams will take on a Buffs head coach in his first season.

- Colorado State is 5-8-2 in the previous 15 games against CU coaches in their first year on the sidelines, including victories in the previous two instances – 1999 vs. Gary Barnett and 2006 vs. Dan Hawkins.

The Rams' home away from home: Colorado State considers Denver a home market. Of CSU's current freshman class on the Fort Collins campus, a little more than half originates from the six-county Denver Metro Area. And of all CSU undergraduates registered this fall, more than 83 percent are from the state of Colorado.

- More than 43,000 Denver Metro Area residents hold degrees from CSU, and 73,000-plus Denver-area citizens have taken classes on the campus. When including donors, and other friends of the university, the number of CSU constituents in Denver rises to nearly 100,000.
- “This is more than a football game,” Kowalczyk said. “It's annually our institution's single greatest outreach to the Denver market.”
- Kowalczyk also noted that by having the game in Denver, regardless of whether CSU is the designated home team, the Rams will be able to offer the contest as part of their season-ticket package. That was not the case in 2009, when it was a traditional road contest, in Boulder.

Big deal for the Rams: It's no wonder the Rams look forward to the annual clash with their southern neighbors. The two campuses are just 54 miles apart, and the majority of the CSU community knows the rivalry very well.

- According to recent research, 83 percent of Colorado State's enrollment is from Colorado.

Fairchild against the Buffs: Steve Fairchild is 3-6 all-time against the Buffs, including 1-2 as a head coach.

- Before his 2009 win in Boulder and his debut as a head coach in the 2008 contest, the previous time CSU faced Colorado with Fairchild was Sept. 2, 2000, a 28-24 Rams triumph in the last college game played at Mile High Stadium. The venue was demolished following that year to make room for the new stadium.
- Prior to 2008, Fairchild's only lifetime meetings with the Buffs had been as a CSU assistant coach under Sonny Lubick. He did not see them as an assistant at any of his previous stops, or as a CSU quarterback.
- The Rams were 2-4 with Fairchild as an assistant coach, including back-to-back wins in 1999 and 2000.

Revenue comparison: By playing the game in an NFL venue, on a national stage, Denver offers both programs an opportunity to generate revenue unlike any event they could hold on their own campus.

► "The economic benefits of playing the game in Denver cannot be un-

derstated," Kowalczyk said. "If we expect to compete on the national stage and continue to grow our programs, it will take the kind of revenue this game generates."

- With the game in Denver, each institution has the opportunity to generate more than \$1 million in net revenue.

A nationally known rivalry: Since the series began being played in Denver during the 1990s, college football fans across the country have come to know of the series, and as a result, to know of both programs and institutions.

- When the Buffs and Rams meet in Denver, the game annually draws the state's largest single-game crowd for any college football contest.

Non-conference: The Rams have won six of their last 10 and eight of their last 13 non-conference games. They're 8-6 overall under Head Coach Steve Fairchild in games outside the Mountain West.

- That record includes four impressive wins, the 2009 landmark win at Colorado, a 2008 triumph over fledgling Heisman candidate Case Keenum and the Houston Cougars, a 2009 win over Nevada and the 2008 New Mexico Bowl, a victory over Fresno State.

First-year opponent coaches: The Rams on Saturday meet their second of three teams on the 2011 schedule with a coach in his first year at the reins of a program.

- Last week, they hosted Earnest Collins Jr., who replaced Scott Downing at the helm of the UNC Bears.
- They'll do it again on Saturday, when they face CU's Jon Embree, who replaced Dan Hawkins, in Denver.
- The last of the trio of games is against veteran Rocky Long, who replaced Brady Hoke as the San Diego State leader.

The big 3-0: The Rams are 9-1 under Steve Fairchild when scoring 30-or-more points, their only loss a 45-42 shootout at home against No. 17 BYU on Nov. 1, 2008.



CU-CSU series history

- CU is the second school CSU ever played in football when the two teams met on Feb. 11, 1893 making the Buffs the oldest rival of the Rams. They have played 82 football games, plus one forfeit game that was never played (1901). CU has played CSU more than any other school in their history and, behind Wyoming, CU is second on the list for CSU.
- From 1915-33, the record between the two schools was 9-9-1, the most balanced period in the rivalry. During those 19 seasons, CSU — then known as Colorado Agricultural College — won seven Rocky Mountain Conference titles and CU won two.
- On Nov. 22, 1958, the first two-point conversion in CSU history was scored when quarterback Joe Crider passed to halfback Wayne Schneider to seal a 15-14 victory in Boulder. The teams would not meet again until 1983.
- On Aug. 30, 2003, a crowd of 76,219 packed into then-Invesco Field at Mile High to watch the Rams and Buffs battle in an eventual 42-35 CU win. It remains as the largest crowd to watch a college football game in the state of Colorado.

TEAM NOTES

Single-digit first downs: The last time CSU held an opponent under 10 first downs was Dec. 2, 2006, at SDSU. Like the Bears on Saturday, the Aztecs had nine first downs that game.

Three-interception wins: The last time CSU won a game in which it threw as many as three interceptions was Sept. 30, 2000, at Nevada, where eventual MW Offensive Player of the Year Matt Newton threw three in a 45-14 win. Newton went on to lead the Rams to a conference title and a victory over Louisville in the Liberty Bowl.

In a rush: Raymond Carter posted the Rams' first 100-yard rushing day since Leonard Mason had 124 yards vs. New Mexico, Oct. 30. The Rams are now 10-6 under Steve Fairchild with a 100-yard ball-carrier.

► CSU's 242 yards rushing on the afternoon were its most since that same Oct. 30 game, when the Rams ran for 328 against the Lobos.

► Saturday marked the Rams' eighth 200-yard rushing game under Steve Fairchild. The team is 6-2 in those games, with losses at Air Force in 2010 and at UNLV in 2009.

Home openers: CSU has won four straight and six of its last seven home openers, its only loss in that stretch a close decision against DeSean Jackson and No. 10 Cal in 2007.

► Dating to Sonny Lubick's second year as head coach, 1994, when the Rams won their home opener en route to a 10-2 finish and a berth in the Holiday Bowl vs. Michigan, CSU has won 16 of its last 18 home openers.

► Those two losses, though, were to respective ranked Pac-10 and Big Ten opponents, including No. 22 Minnesota in 2004.

Best against the nation: UNC is the only opponent in the nation to whom the Rams have never lost while playing at least nine games. Top series winning percentages in CSU history:

Fairchild in home debuts: In his 12 combined years as a CSU assistant (1993-2000) and head coach (2008-11), the Rams are 11-1 in Fort Collins openers with Steve Fairchild on their staff. The Rams' only loss during that span was the first game of the Sonny Lubick era, Fairchild's first home contest as a Rams assistant, a 23-9 setback to the Oregon Ducks, in 1993. Fairchild has won 11 straight as a CSU coach.

Safety first: Max Morgan became the first CSU player to record a safety since Blake Smith on Oct. 28, 2005, in a win at New Mexico.

Shutout quarters: CSU did not allow a point from the second quarter at New Mexico until the 6:23 mark of the third quarter against UNC. The shutout streak lasted 68 minutes, 49 seconds.

► The last time CSU shut out an opponent through the first half was Sept. 3, 2003, vs. Weber State.

Brother starters: Austin and Crockett Gillmore formed the first pair of CSU brothers to start the same game since Erik and Morgan Pears took up two-fifths of the Rams' offensive line in the Liberty Bowl vs. TCU, Dec. 31, 2002. One year earlier, twins Justin and Jason Gallimore helped lead the Rams to the New Orleans bowls as fixtures in the starting defensive secondary.

2-0 starts: The Rams started a season 2-0 for only the third time in the last nine years (also 2006 and 2009). CSU's last six 2-0 starts:

Interception drought: Over an active 19-game stretch entering the day, before Ivory Herd's big first-quarter pick, CSU had only six interceptions. The Rams had picked off their opponent in only four games during the streak, which began at TCU Oct. 17, 2009. During the same stretch entering the day, the Rams had recovered 15 opponent fumbles.

One punt: The Rams punted just once on the afternoon, not until early in the fourth quarter. They scored on five of their first six possessions (four TD, one FG), including touchdowns on the first three series.

First career starts and debuts: Shaquill Barrett, Nordly Capi, Blake Jones and Austin Gillmore made their first career starts.

► Additionally, four players made their college debuts: RB Mark Woodbury, LB Aaron Davis (a true freshman), FB Joe McKay and LB Eric Niederberger.

Non-conference: The Rams have won six of their last 10 and eight of their last 13 non-conference games. They're 8-6 overall under Head Coach Steve Fairchild in games outside the Mountain West.

► That record includes four impressive wins, the 2009 landmark victory at Colorado, a 2008 triumph over fledgling Heisman candidate Case Keenum and the Houston Cougars, a 2009 win over a ready-to-launch Nevada team, and the 2008 New Mexico Bowl, a victory over Fresno State.

First-year opponent coaches: The Rams on Saturday met their first of three teams on the 2011 schedule with a coach in his first year at the reins of a program. This week, they hosted Earnest Collins Jr., who replaced Scott Downing at the helm of the UNC Bears. Then, they'll do it again next week, when they face CU's Jon Embree, who replaced Dan Hawkins, in Denver. The last of the trio of games is against veteran Rocky Long, who replaced Brady Hoke as the San Diego State leader.

► All four Division I programs in Colorado have a head coach who played for its school, including Collins and Embree. In addition to Fairchild, Air Force's Troy Calhoun also played for his team. CSU is the only school playing the other three foes.

The big 3-0: The Rams are 9-1 under Steve Fairchild when scoring 30-or-more points, their only loss a 45-42 shootout at home against No. 17 BYU on Nov. 1, 2008. First drive is critical: In six of the last seven games in which the Rams have pierced the end zone on their game-opening drive, CSU has parlayed that score into an eventual victory. The only loss in that stretch was at New Mexico, Nov. 21, 2009.

► Overall, the Rams are 7-4 under Fairchild when scoring a TD on their game-opening drive (wins Saturday vs. UNC, vs. Houston and Fresno State in 2008, at CU and vs. Weber State in 2009, and vs. UNLV and UNM in 2010; losses vs. TCU, at Utah and at Air Force in 2008, loss at UNM in 2009).

Halftime lead: CSU under Steve Fairchild is 9-2 with a scoreboard advantage heading into the locker room. The Rams are 4-1 in such games within their conference. Overall, they've won four straight.

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

► Raymond Carter has two career 100-yard rushing games, both on Ag Day. On Sept. 25, 2010, he had 104 rushing yards in a win vs. Idaho.

► Aaron Davis became the fifth true freshman to play this season for the Rams.

► Shaquill Barrett made his first Division I start, at middle linebacker.

► Ivory Herd picked off the second pass of his career (also at AFA, Oct. 9, 2010).

► Jake Levin caught only the second pass of his career, and his first touchdown reception since his days at Legacy High School in Brighton, Colo. Levin also caught a pass, his second 2011 reception, at the end of the first quarter..

► Pete Thomas, who hit 11 targets in the first half (and 11 overall in the game), connected on a 9-yard pass with Lou Greenwood early in the second half to eclipse 3,000 career yards. He became the youngest player in school annals to reach 3,000 career. No other CSU sophomore has reached that mark. Thomas is on pace to shatter Kelly Stouffer's career record, 7,142.

► Thomas also had a career-long 17-yard run early in the second half. His previous long was 12, at San Diego State, Nov. 6, 2010.

► Thomas tied a career high with three interceptions (also his first college game, Sept. 4, 2010, vs. Colorado).

► Ben DeLine had four touchbacks on five kickoffs. The four tied his single-game career high (also vs. UNLV, Oct. 16, 2010).

► Momo Thomas' 26-yard punt return was a career long, edging his 24-yarder against CU in 2010.

► Mike Orakpo led the team with a career-best 10 total tackles.

"The only thing that stands between men and their goals is merely **the will to try** and the faith to **believe it is possible**."

- ▶ As part of that theme, team advisor Johnny Square is meeting with players and coaches throughout the season.

NFL genetics: Colorado State now has six players, including brothers T.J. and Bobby Borcky, whose fathers played in the NFL.

- ▶ RB Donnell Alexander (Derrick Thomas, Kansas City Chiefs)
- ▶ DE Broderick Sargent (Broderick Sargent Sr., Arizona Cardinals, Dallas Cowboys).
- ▶ WR/QB T.J. Borcky & WR Bobby Borcky (Tim Borcky, Buffalo Bills)
- ▶ LB Davis Burl (Gary Burl, Miami Dolphins)
- ▶ K Ben DeLine (Steve DeLine, San Diego Chargers, Philadelphia Eagles)

Coaching staff changes: Saying, "Change can be good," Steve Fairchild emerged from an intense evaluation of his overall program fol-

lowing a second straight 3-9 season in 2010, and made several changes to the Rams.

- ▶ CSU's cupboard of talent was largely empty when the current staff took over before the '08 season, and most national experts agree that the Rams' coaches have ranked among the best in the country in terms of recruiting over the three classes in which they've worked been able to work the full 17-month period. But patience is no longer on the Rams' side, and Fairchild knows fans expect results this season, saying anything less than a bowl in 2011 would be an obvious disappointment.
- ▶ Believing in the recruiting effort his staff has made, he hired just one new coach, to replace Scott Brown, who departed for Arizona State. But that doesn't mean Fairchild didn't make significant changes. In an effort to curb the team's disturbing third-down struggles on defense, and improve the overall product on that side of the ball, he put a new individual in charge of every defensive unit, shifting Todd Stroud from tight ends to defensive line, and Tim Duffie from cornerbacks to the overall secondary, and hiring Bernard Clark to coach linebackers, replacing Brown, the former DL coach. In turn, he removed the linebackers responsibility from coordinator Larry Kerr, freeing the veteran coach to move to the press box and focus on the defense as a whole.
- ▶ The Rams also made several changes in terms of technique and scheme, after studying the nation's most successful defenses.
- ▶ Fairchild, who became more involved in the defense, also promoted safeties coach Larry Lewis to associate head coach and RB coach and moved Anthoney Hill from RBs to TEs. Across the country, only Nebraska is believed to have made as many similar changes to its coaching staff without significant turnover.
- ▶ In fact, CSU is one of just three schools in the MW, and one of only 34 teams in the country, that brought in one or fewer new coaches:

More changes: Fairchild and his 12-man Player Council, made up of leaders from every class, also opted to change spring practice time from afternoon to morning, and play music during every practice. Academic scheduling prevented the team from taking the morning practice times into the fall, but Fairchild hopes to implement morning practices next fall.

Offensive line experienced again: Two years ago, CSU had the most experienced offensive line in the country, returning four starters that combined for more career starts than any other national group. All four of those starters wound up in NFL camps following the season.

► Entering this season, the Rams once again bring back four starters on their offensive front: led by senior G Jake Gdowski and a preseason all-conference selection, senior T Paul Madsen, along with junior T Joe Caprioglio and the anchor of the unit, Freshman All-American C Weston Richburg.

► The other starter is a former grayshirt who lettered as a redshirt freshman last season, G Jordan Gragert. And with three set to return next season, the protectors of Pete Thomas figure to be again among the most experienced in the nation in 2012 and '13. Richburg alone, an honorable-mention all-conference choice as a freshman last year, has the opportunity to start every game in his college career.

► This season, CSU's 62 combined offensive-line starts returning ranks 69th in the nation and fourth in the conference, according to Phil Steele, who considers the category important in determining a given team's ability to succeed. The MW teams:

► Five players, Lovett, Clubb, Reilly, Davis and Jones, are true freshmen.

CSU debuts: In addition to the above 16 players, 18 total players have seen their first action in a CSU uniform this year, including two transfers, DL Colton Paulhus and LB Shaquill Barrett.

First starts: The following 11 players have made their first collegiate starts this season: G Jordan Gragert, FB Joe Brown, WR Marquise Law, TE Crockett Gillmore, DT John Froland, LB Mike Orakpo, S Austin Gray, DE Nordly Capi, TE Blake Jones, FB Austin Gillmore and LB Shaquill Barrett.

True freshmen, CSU history: WR Charles Lovett, WR Lee Clubb, S Drew Reilly, LB Aaron Davis and TE Blake Jones are true freshmen who have played so far this season for the Rams.

► Last season, nine true freshmen made their college debuts: LB Mike Orakpo, QB Pete Thomas, LB Charles Favors, CB Shaq Bell, DE Nordly Capi, RB Tony Drake, DE Crockett Gillmore, FB Jake Levin and WR Bobby Borcky. All except Levin (Sept. 18 at Miami-Ohio) and Borcky (Oct. 9 at Air Force) made their debuts in the 2010 season-opener, Sept. 4 vs. Colorado in Denver.

► Those nine were the most used in a single season by the Rams in 23 years. In 1987, under head coach Leon Fuller, CSU used 15 players fresh out of high school (RB Tony Alford, LB Jon Boyd, CB Andy Byrne, RB Tony Carr, DE Robert Chirico, LB Mike Epley, G Jeff Fixmer, P Alan Glazer, LB Don Hock, CB Craig Jersild, LB David Laskowski, FB Paul MacRenato, LB Ron Martin, TE Keith Sheaffer and LB Eric Tippeconnic).

► The most true freshmen the program has ever used was 24 in 1946. According to team historian John Hirn, there were 47 men on the roster in 1946 and 33 were true freshmen, 24 of which played. In the opener that year against Montana, 19 true freshmen saw the field. Two players in that freshman class, George Jones and future College Football Hall of Famer Fum McGraw, would lead the Aggies to some of the most successful seasons in program annals, including the team's first bowl, the Raisin Bowl at the end of the '48 campaign. McGraw, the first consensus All-American in program history, and Jones are CSU Hall of Famers.

► Colorado State used only three true freshmen in 2009 (P Pete Kontodidakos, RB Lou Greenwood and DE C.J. James).

► The year before, five true freshmen hit the field: Ben DeLine, Marquise Law, Adam Wilson, Momo Thomas and Michael Kawulok. Thomas and Kawulok started, while DeLine had served as the primary kicker after a preseason injury to Jason Smith.

► Over the previous two years combined (2006-07), the Rams used just two, both in 2007 (tight end Eric Peitz and long-snapper Steve Bryan). In 2006, CSU and Wake Forest were the only Division I programs that did not use a true freshman. From 2005-07, the number was just five, including S Clint Kubiak, DT Shaun McGoveran and DE Wade Landers in 2005. The last time CSU used as many as five true freshmen in an entire season was six in 2004 — WR Damon Morton, RB Gartrell Johnson, DE Matt Rupp, TE Kory Sperry, QB Caleb Hanie and RB Kyle Bell.

Selective service barely knows these guys: If the Week 1 depth chart is any indication, 2011 will rival 2010 in terms of true freshmen who forego their redshirt year this season.

► Despite using just four in the opener, the Rams still are expected to use at least seven true freshmen this year, and possibly eight. Eight actually made the 64-man travel roster at New Mexico: Lovett, Clubb, Reilly and Jones (the four that played), along with LB Aaron Davis, S Trent Matthews, S Kevin Pierre-Louis and OL A.J. Frieler.

► All told in 2010, CSU used nine true freshmen, its most in 23 years, since using 15 in 1987. Included in that group was the nation's only true freshman to start every game at QB for his team, Pete Thomas.

More youthful Rams to watch: The depth chart released by CSU before the season listed 15 frosh (six true, nine redshirt) in the two deep.

► Two of those redshirt freshmen are starters: DT John Froland and FS Austin Gray.

Experienced sophomores: An experienced sophomore class seems to monopolize the majority of the talent on the Rams' roster. That class, led by recently elected team captain Pete Thomas, freshman All-



American Weston Richburg and WLB Mike Orakpo, features six starters, including G Jordan Gragert, DE Nordly Capi and TE Crockett Gillmore. Meanwhile, RB Chris Nwoke, CB Shaq Bell, LB Shaquil Barrett and DTs Curtis Wilson and Te'Jay Brown figure to see plenty of playing time in their respective rotations.

Road streak is history: The Rams on Sept. 3 secured their first road victory since the resounding 23-17 triumph over CU in Boulder on Sept. 6, 2009. Since that game, the Rams had dropped 11 straight road games. Two of those losses (at Idaho and New Mexico in 2009) were by two points each, and three (including San Diego State in 2010), were five points or less. In 2008, the Rams were 2-3 in road contests, with wins at San Diego State and Wyoming.

► The 11-game road streak was the longest by a CSU team since a 16-game stretch from Nov. 8, 1986, to Sept. 9, 1989. The Rams, under Earle Bruce, snapped that stretch on Oct. 7, 1989, with a 34-20 win at New Mexico.

CSU to practice in Denver April 13: CSU, which has approximately 43,000 alumni and 70,000 former students living in the six-county Denver Metro Area, makes an annual fall appearance in Denver at the Cinch Jeans Rocky Mountain Showdown. Now, the Rams are going to make a Mile High City appearance in the spring.

► The CSU athletic department announced Aug. 24 plans to hold a football practice on April 13 at Infinity Park in Glendale, a Denver suburb. The evening session will take place at Infinity Stadium, near the corner of S. Cherry St. and E. Kentucky Ave. Concessions are expected to be available, as are Ram Town inflatables for kids.

► Also, in conjunction with the practice, the football team will attempt to arrange community-service appearances in the Metro Area. With its Community Service Initiative, CSU is believed to be the nation's only football program that requires 100 percent of its players to make a minimum of three community appearances each year. But those appearances to date have been only in Northern Colorado. This practice gives the Rams an opportunity to expand the initiative to the Denver area.

► Many more details will be announced as they are confirmed at a later date.

Ball security: The Rams are among the best teams in the nation over the Steve Fairchild era at protecting the football. Among FBS leaders, the Rams have lost only 17 fumbles in 39 games under Fairchild. Meanwhile, CSU's defense during the same span has recovered 32.

Ironmen: Safety Ivory Herd, linebacker Mychal Sisson and nose tackle Nuku Latu aren't just good friends, they're also the only players in CSU's senior class that haven't missed a single game in their Rams careers. The players shared a 37-game playing streak entering the 2011 season, and can close their college careers with 50 consecutive games played.

A third straight first-year starter: Finally in 2011, the Rams have a returning starter at quarterback in Pete Thomas, their first such player in the Fairchild era and first since Caleb Hanie in 2007.

► For the third consecutive season in 2010, the Rams sent out a first-year starting quarterback to begin their campaign. True freshman Pete Thomas followed in the footsteps of fifth-year seniors Grant Stucker (2009) and Billy Farris (2008).

► Only six total programs at the FBS level (Mississippi State, North Texas, Auburn, Buffalo, Purdue and CSU) opened 2010 with a first-year starter for at least a third straight year.

Former-Quarterback U: In addition to starting QB Pete Thomas, CSU has eight players that were high school quarterbacks, including current 300-pound center Weston Richburg:

► Bobby Borcky, WR (QB at Lake Highland Prep in Orlando).

► T.J. Borcky, WR (plays as WR, made switch from QB as a redshirt freshman after volunteering to do a test-drive as a scout-team WR, QB at Lake Highland Prep in Orlando).

► Lee Clubb, WR (QB at Iowa Park High School in Texas).

► Austin Gillmore, FB (QB at Bushland High School in Texas).

► Charles Lovett, WR (replaced graduated Tarean Austin, now with New Mexico, as a senior at Hillsborough High School in Tampa, Fla.).

► Byron Steele, WR (option QB at Arlington Lamar High School in Texas).

► Weston Richburg, C (QB early in Bushland High in Texas).

► Matt Yemm, WR (holder on all placements, plays as WR, QB at Fort Collins, Colo., High School).

Who needs fingers, anyway: CSU technical intern/defensive line assistant Trevor Wikre was a four-year starter (2005-08) at Mesa State. Wikre played his first two seasons as a defensive tackle before moving to offensive guard for his final two years, earning all-conference honors as a junior and All-America honors as a senior. Midway through that 2008 campaign, a compound dislocation of his finger caused ligament damage that doctors told him would prevent his return that season. But to preserve his college career, Wikre chose to have his finger amputated. The surgery forced him to miss the only game of his career, but he returned and played in the final five contests. The story spawned features in Sports Illustrated, People, the New York Times, USA Today, Sunday NFL Countdown and ESPN The Magazine, as well as guest appearances on ESPN's First Take and Mike and Mike in the Morning.

New Russell uniforms: CSU Athletic Director Paul Kowalczyk just before the 2010 season finalized a three-year contract with Russell Athletic. The deal is worth more than \$1 million.

► CSU kicked off the 2010 season with its first uniform change since 2003.

► "We are very pleased to extend our relationship with Russell," Kowalczyk said. "They have been a dedicated, long-standing partner and their renewed commitment to CSU — our team's sharp, new uniforms are but one obvious example — will continue to enhance our brand and benefit our image."

► With four jerseys — green, gold and traditional orange to wear at home, and white for road contests — and three colors of pants (white, green and gold), Head Coach Steve Fairchild and the Rams' captains have several options each week. In fact, including black and white Under Armour shoes, the team has 24 total uniform combinations.

► Fairchild and equipment manager Kris Young leaned heavily on the upperclass leaders of the team for direction during the design phase.

► As a tribute to their past, when the school colors were pumpkin and alfalfa, the Rams will don orange tops when they open their Fort Collins slate on Sept. 10 vs. UNC. Fans also are encouraged to "orange out" the stadium that day. CSU will wear gold at TCU.

► The Rams are 2-0 with green jerseys and gold pants, 0-1 with green jerseys and white pants, 0-1 with green jerseys and green pants, 0-2 with white jerseys and white pants, 1-2 with white jerseys and green pants, 0-1 with white jerseys and gold pants, 0-1 with gold jerseys and green pants, and 2-1 with orange jerseys and white pants.

Permanent team captains: CSU on Aug. 26 voted for team captains, naming Mychal Sisson and Ivory Herd defensive captains, Derek Good special-teams captain, and Paul Madsen and Pete Thomas offensive leaders.

- ▶ Thomas, 19, is believed to be among the youngest captains in CSU history.
- ▶ "I take captains very seriously," Fairchild said, "because I was a captain back in 1980 here at CSU."
- ▶ For the first time in since 1992, the Rams began in 2008 voting for permanent team captains. From 1993-2007, captains were selected on a game-by-game basis.

Four-star backfield: Raymond Carter, rated the No. 3 running back in the nation out of Crenshaw High School when he signed with UCLA in 2008, joins QB Pete Thomas (Valhalla, El Cajon, Calif.) as former four-star recruits starting together in the CSU backfield. In high school, the two players never played an organized game against each other, but they did meet during summer passing scrimmages.

Speaking of Crenshaw: The Los Angeles high school made famous as the setting for the movie *Boyz in the Hood* (Laurence Fishburne, Cuba Gooding Jr.) is famous in the CSU football program for producing new starting RB Raymond Carter and physical FS Elijah-Blu Smith.

- ▶ When Carter was searching for a school after deciding to transfer from UCLA in the spring of 2009, his former Crenshaw teammate Smith was right there to answer his questions about Colorado State.
- ▶ Crenshaw also has produced Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila, who broke Reggie White's career Green Bay Packers sacks record, and several others, including Olympic sprinter Johnny Gray, MLB pitcher Darryl Strawberry, rap artist and actor Ice-T, and several other prominent athletes in football, basketball and track.

In the polls: Colorado State's football program, fresh off a resounding 23-17 win at intrastate rival Colorado from the Big 12, received votes in both national polls for multiple weeks early in 2009.

- ▶ Previously, the last time CSU earned votes was after defeating Weber State on Sept. 13, 2003, the week of an eventual loss to Ben Roethlisberger and Miami (Ohio).
- ▶ After their win over Weber State Sept. 12, 2009, and over Nevada Sept. 19, 2009, the Rams continued to receive votes in both polls. They didn't get votes after their first loss, at BYU (Sept. 26).

\$20 million athletic facilities are open: Like a proud parent, the Colorado State athletic department formally introduced the public to its new fraternal twins Sept. 18, 2009.

- ▶ A ribbon-cutting ceremony dedicated CSU's new \$13 million Indoor Practice Facility and \$7 million Academic and Training Center.
- ▶ Following the ceremony, the public toured both buildings.
- ▶ Colorado State first announced plans for the new buildings, a \$20 million leap toward a vivid future, in April 2009. The buildings represent CSU's largest commitment toward athletic facilities in four decades, since the construction of Hughes Stadium and Moby Arena.
- ▶ "These buildings show that Colorado State is unmistakably serious about achieving its stretch goals," Director of Athletics Paul Kowalczyk said. "These buildings, combined with the recent renovations at our football stadium, put us where we need to be in terms of offering quality, state-of-the-art facilities to our coaches and student-athletes, those who are here now and those who are thinking about coming here. There has never been a better time to be a Ram."
- ▶ The process began in October 2006, when Kowalczyk and associate athletic director Doug Max made the new buildings a priority within the athletic department's long-term plans. But without the help of the CSU administration and the Board of Governors, the university would not have reached this point.
- ▶ Designed by Aller-Lingle Architects P.C., and RATIO Architects, Inc., the facilities were built by Saunders Construction, Inc. Aller-Lingle, a local firm instrumental in several campus projects, including recent Hughes

Stadium renovations, served as the lead architect on both new buildings. The firm sought the assistance of Indianapolis-based RATIO because of its recent experience in the design of similar venues at BCS universities such as Illinois, Oregon, West Virginia and Indiana. Saunders has played a significant role in the construction of several prominent Colorado projects, including the Denver Broncos' training center.

Band of brothers: The addition of Joe Kawulok in 2011 gives CSU 17 sets of brothers that have been in the program since Sonny Lubick became head coach in 1993:

Brotherly love, from coaches: Coaches moved Austin Gillmore from linebacker to fullback on Aug. 18. Nine days later, Head Coach Steve Fairchild dubbed Gillmore No. 1 on the depth chart entering opening week.

- ▶ Gillmore's family is used to such moves. His younger brother Crockett, signed in February 2010 as a tight end, shifted to defensive end shortly before his college debut in last season's opener. Then, nine days before the 2011 CSU spring game, coaches moved him back to tight end. He's been the starter at tight end ever since his first snap during that April practice, a reception from Pete Thomas.
- ▶ On Sept. 10, they formed the first pair of CSU brothers to start the same game since Erik and Morgan Pears took up two-fifths of the Rams' offensive line in the Liberty Bowl vs. TCU, Dec. 31, 2002.



- One year earlier, twins Justin and Jason Gallimore helped lead the Rams to the New Orleans bowls as fixtures in the starting defensive secondary.

The CSU offense: In a conference filled with "spread" offenses, Steve Fairchild's system at Colorado State, while one of three offenses currently in use by National Football League teams, is unique in the Mountain West.

- The system, sometimes called the Coryell Offense, has its roots where Fairchild grew up, in San Diego.
- Former Chargers head coach Don Coryell, using three future Hall of Famers (Dan Fouts, Charlie Joiner and Kellen Winslow), made the system famous while Fairchild was CSU's starting QB in the late 70s.
- Disciples of the offense include Ernie Zampese, Joe Gibbs, Mike Martz, Norv Turner and Al Saunders. Martz, Fairchild's coach at Mesa Community College in San Diego before Fairchild signed with the Rams as a JC transfer, also was influenced by Sid Gillman.
- Gibbs used the Coryell Offense to win three Super Bowls with the Redskins, using a system the Rams follow, with a smash-mouth running game powered by mobile and versatile "hogs" up front.
- While with the Cowboys, Turner used Michael Irvin, Emmitt Smith and Troy Aikman to win Super Bowls with a similar version of the offense.
- Led by Martz, the system led the St. Louis Rams to a Super Bowl title and another NFC championship in the last decade.
- One aspect of the offense that is unique is the flipping of offensive linemen, assigning two players always to the weak side of the formation and the other guard and tackle always to the strong side. The Rams do that to reduce the amount those linemen have to learn, increasing efficiency.

Significant improvements to stadium: Colorado State in August unveiled the first significant upgrades to the grounds surrounding Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium in the facility's 43-year history.

- The months-long project, which started in the spring, includes hundreds of trees and shrubs, improved walkways, an 18-hole disc golf course and a new gate that should help ease traffic congestion. The trees and shrubs - including Colorado blue spruce, Rocky Mountain juniper, ponderosa pine, Scotch pine and others - were transplanted from the nursery at CSU's Colorado State Forest Service headquarters on the Foothills Campus.
- "We wanted to improve the experience for our fans at Hughes by upgrading some of the landscaping and circulation around the stadium," CSU President Tony Frank said. "As home to the Colorado State Forest Service, CSU was fortunate to be able to work with its outstanding nursery to plant more than a mile of seedling trees as part of the overall project. In the end, our goal is to create an environment that is welcoming for the community, complements surrounding neighborhoods and better reflects our status as a major university."
- More than 300 large trees and numerous shrubs will have been planted when the project is complete. Some will line stadium access roads and pedestrian walkways, while others will beautify the stadium's south side.
- Many of the project upgrades are focused on Ram Town, an area on the southeast side of the stadium where fans meet prior to games to enjoy food, live music and a variety of inflatable playgrounds for kids. The area will now feature a large plaza with more than two acres of grass, an amphitheater and an arboretum.
- A fifth gate will be added to the southwest corner of the parking lot, giving fans direct access to County Road 42C, which runs along the south side of the facility. The new gate should improve traffic flow.
- The new disc golf course should be in place this fall. The 18-hole course is a collaborative project between CSU, the City of Fort Collins and the state, and will be open to the public.
- CSU Director of Athletics Paul Kowalczyk has been working to launch this project since arriving in 2006. He credited Frank and football Steve Fairchild for their support.
- "Hughes Stadium is in a beautiful setting, right up against the foothills, but it was built in a scruffy field that was not particularly attractive," he said. "This project will present the stadium and the university in the best possible light. We're showing our fans and supporters that we care enough about what we're trying to accomplish here that we're putting our best foot forward to create a better overall experience."

Close games: In Steve Fairchild's inaugural season as head coach, 2008, six of the Rams' seven wins, and eight of the team's 13 overall games, were decided in the final three minutes.

- The Rams in 2008 played six games decided by one score or less, and posted a 4-2 record in those contests. CSU's only two losses were to BYU (45-42) and TCU (13-7), two ranked teams at season's end.
- In 2009, the team saw five games decided late, but had only a 1-4 record in those games (24-23 win vs. Weber State, then four straight losses — 31-29 at Idaho, 24-17 vs. Utah, 29-27 at New Mexico, and 17-16 vs. Wyoming).
- Finding a way to win close games was one characteristic the Rams lacked during the program's slide in the middle of the 2000s. Prior to Sept. 6, 2008, when the Rams won on a walk-off field goal vs. Sacramento State, the last time the Rams won a game by a field goal or less was Nov. 22, 2003, at UNLV.
- Against arch-rival Colorado alone, the Rams lost three games by three points each over a four-year stretch, from 2004-07.
- Including the 2011 opener at New Mexico, a 14-10 win, and the 2010 season, when the Rams beat Idaho 36-34, and lost to San Diego State, 24-19, both in the final minutes, the Rams are now 7-7 under Fairchild in games decided by eight points or less.

- Each coach is featured in the videos, providing a personal look into his philosophies and assessment of football at CSU under new Head Coach Steve Fairchild. Linebacker Ricky Brewer takes visitors on a tour of the university's facilities, including the Joey Porter Locker Room. And, recent graduate Joey Rucks shares his thoughts on CSU's academic support for student-athletes. Additionally, Fairchild offers a personal blog, providing insight throughout the year.



The Rams on Twitter: CSU has two Twitter pages related to its football program. Twitter, a free social networking and micro-blogging service available at www.twitter.com, allows its users to send and read other users' updates (also known as "tweets"). Fans can receive updates on CSU football directly from a Twitter page or on their mobile phone.

- Head Coach Steve Fairchild is believed to be one of the only football coaches in the country who updates his page during halftime of each game (with the help of CSU media relations personnel).

The CSU Yankees: Although well over a thousand miles separate Fort Collins, Colo., and Yankee Stadium in the Bronx, N.Y., there is still a connection between the two. Sitting in the office of Yankees manager Joe Girardi is a Colorado State Rams helmet. Girardi wanted the helmet because he has family in the Fort Collins area.

100 percent of CSU players involved in community: Colorado State's football team is believed to be one of the only, if not the only program in the nation that involves 100 percent of its players in community service. And not just once during the year.

- Every calendar year, every player on the CSU roster will make at least three appearances in the community, including the latest round, completed by the Rams over the summer prior to the beginning of fall practice. Round 1 is in the spring and Round 3 will take place every year during the team's bye week(s).
- "I want our players to think about something other than themselves on a daily basis," said Head Coach Steve Fairchild, whose team likely devotes collectively the most community-service hours in the nation every year. "We're installing a giving-back mentality. I want our players realize how fortunate they are."
- Community service has focused on schools, hospitals and those needing medical assistance, rehab facilities and homeless shelters. Leaders in every position group on the roster are responsible for making sure their teammates at that position are accountable in making each ap-

pearance.

- ▶ Team advisor Johnny Square and director of football operations Tom Ehlers organized the first annual CSU football community initiative over the winter of 2009-10. All told, members of the football team made 10 appearances across Northern Colorado. To help structure the appearances, most featured a specific position group. Several upperclassmen took the lead in keeping their teammates accountable, and the Rams completed the very rewarding experience in time for the beginning of spring practice.
- ▶ "Pastor Square and Tom were a big help in organizing this for us," Fairchild said in the spring. "They went to work at the beginning of this past semester to come up with some places in the area where our players could be effective in making a difference. I was very proud of the leadership many of our seniors and other players displayed."

- ▶ The campaign features a Ram Fan of the Week competition, in which Colorado State fans can submit pictures of their green and gold spirit via e-mail with the chance of winning game tickets and concession coupons. Weekly winners automatically qualify for the Fan of the Year drawing that includes a grand prize of personalized gear, tickets to the MW tournament and a free tailgate spot in Ram Town.
- ▶ Fans will have the opportunity to attend Get Your Green On days held at local corporate partner retail outlets, where Cam the Ram, the Colorado State cheer squad and a wide range of CSU coaches will be on hand to greet fans. Ticket and apparel giveaways will take place in addition to the chance of winning a free tailgate in Ram Town. Giveaways at these locations and other university events will include beads, sunglasses, key chains and much more.
- ▶ TVendors in the Denver and Northern Colorado regions will be provided window clings, buttons for employees and other marketing material to encourage CSU fans to get their green on.

CSU names Taps official road venue: CSU's 2011 football season is here. The team has made its plans. Now, it's time for fans to make their plans to watch the road games here in town.

- ▶ Fans are encouraged to watch that Sept. 3 opener, and every CSU game away from Fort Collins, at Taps Sports Bar and Grill. That's because not only is the venue the official watch party location of the Rams, but Taps also will donate 10 percent of all net revenue from all food and beverage sales to CSU's Athletic General Scholarship Fund.
- ▶ In other words, fans that cheer on the Rams at Taps, located at 165 Boardwalk Drive in Fort Collins, help fund student-athlete scholarships

at the same time.

- ▶ "We are very excited about this year's season and our new partnership with CSU football," said Taps owner Mark Spring. "We are looking forward to this great opportunity. Being an alum and an avid Ram fan myself makes this a perfect match for a winning season."
- ▶ Taps, known for its outstanding selection of beer, is open daily at 11 a.m., with happy hour from 3-6 p.m. each day, and 10 p.m. to 12 a.m. Sunday through Thursday.

Individual Notes

Thomas has milestone: CSU quarterback Pete Thomas on Sept. 10 became the first sophomore in program history to reach 3,000 passing yards. The feat is remarkable considering none of the great passers that came before him — including first-round draft choice Kelly Stouffer, conference Players of the Year Matt Newton, Bradlee Van Pelt and Moses Moreno, and CSU Hall of Famer Anthoney Hill, reached that landmark prior to their junior years.

Capi's NCAA record paves road for honors: Nordly Capi wrote his name in the NCAA record book Sept. 3, and days later earned the Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week (Football Writers) as well as the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week. With the national honor, he earned a spot on the Nagurski Trophy watch list.

- ▶ A 6-foot-3, 248-pound sophomore from Ocoee, Fla., Capi had four forced fumbles, more than any player ever in a college football game, helping the Rams earn a conference road victory at New Mexico Saturday.
- ▶ The record, established on the road in one of only three conference games across the country this weekend, wasn't enough to earn Capi the national Walter Camp Defensive Player of the Week, as the organization instead chose Michigan LB Brandon Herron. Herron was the first player in Wolverines history to post two defensive scores, in a 34-10, weather-shortened game at home against Western Michigan.
- ▶ Previously, 10 players had recorded three forced fumbles in a game, according to the NCAA Records Book (which is missing TCU's Alex Ibiyole, who had a then MW-record three forced fumbles against Tennessee Tech last year). Others with three in a game: DeLawrence Grant, Oregon St. vs. San Diego St., Sept. 23, 2000; Antwan Peek, Cincinnati vs. La.-Monroe, Dec. 1, 2001; Mason Unck, Arizona St. vs. Stanford, Sept. 28, 2002; Quintin Mikell, Boise St. vs. Hawaii, Oct. 5, 2002; Grant Wiley, West Virginia vs. Cincinnati, Sept. 13, 2003; Derrick Johnson, Texas vs. North Texas, Sept. 4, 2004; Ramel Meekins, Rutgers vs. Navy, Oct. 14, 2006; Cody Grimm, Virginia Tech vs. North Carolina St., Nov. 21, 2009; and Armond Staten, Central Mich. vs. Western Mich., Nov. 5, 2010.
- ▶ Capi's 4½ tackles for loss tied for fourth-most in a single game in MW history. His 3½ sacks ranked fourth in Rams annals, behind the four of longtime NFL players Mike Bell (Nov. 19, 1977) and Brady Smith (Sept. 30, 1995), and the 4½ of Guy Miller, the most recent CSU Player of the Week, Oct. 16, 2010.
- ▶ Replacing Broderick Sargent, who left with a knee injury in the first quarter, Capi wreaked havoc on the New Mexico offensive line and quarterback Tarean Austin. His motor didn't stop until the last defensive snap, when he not only forced his record-breaking fourth fumble, but also recovered the loose ball at the CSU 18-yard line with nine seconds left. That play extinguished the Lobos' final threat and preserved the Rams' first road victory since Sept. 6, 2009.
- ▶ He shared MW weekly honors with Boise State's Kellen Moore (offense) and TCU kick returner Greg McCoy (special teams).
- ▶ Miller in 2010 was the first CSU individual to claim the MW's weekly defensive honor since Robert Herbert on Oct. 31, 2005. The last time the Rams secured more than one Defensive Player of the Week honor less than a year apart was the 2002 season, when they captured four such awards: Adam Wade (twice), David Vickers and Benny Mastropaolo. CSU that season won the conference and finished 10-4.
- ▶ Capi, an undeclared major, played last season as a true freshman. His unique first name translates to mean strength.
- ▶ A pillar in the Rams' community service initiative, which requires every player to extend time in the Northern Colorado community three times annually, he helped orchestrate Math Night at Fort Collins' Bauder Ele-

mentary, working with youngsters to help them learn math. Prior to 2011 fall practice, he interacted with teenagers at the Boys and Girls Club in Loveland, Colo. The Rams are believed to lead the nation in community appearances, combining for more than 345 each season, with 115 players making at least three.

► Capi is contemplating a career as a firefighter after his playing career

Unique number: CSU's 6-foot-3, 241-pound defensive end C.J. James dropped the 1 from his uniform number last year, going from 91 to 9.

► The last CSU lineman to wear a single-digit number was Joey Porter, who donned No. 8 as a senior DE in 1998 before launching his All-Pro NFL career.

► According to research by Utah State, which has a 351-pound player tied for the nation's heaviest single digit, DT Evan Huahulu (with Georgia NG Jon Jenkins, No. 6), James is among the 25 heaviest single-digit players in the country.

Matrimony: Paul Madsen, a preseason all-conference selection, became the team's only married player on June 25, when he married fiancé Ashley on March 12.

Loyalty: When Tampa, Fla., product Charles Lovett sees his name on the new CSU roster in 2011, he'll probably feel relief that it lists only one position, wide receiver. That's because Lovett, one of the most prolific receivers in city history through his junior season, carried a huge load for his Hillsborough team as a senior. After his 2009 campaign, Lovett had a chance as a senior to break nearly every career receiving record in Florida annals.

► After losing his quarterback Tarean Austin (New Mexico) to graduation, Lovett could've transferred to another school to help his own cause. Tampa doesn't penalize football players for transferring schools and he could've played for another team with a QB, without missing games.

► But not only did Lovett remain at Hillsborough, one of the oldest schools in Florida, he also unselfishly agreed to move to fill Austin's void at quarterback. Lovett was Hillsborough's field general for the first half of 2010 until the school had groomed a future starter.

► Lovett, called by longtime Hillsborough coach Earl Garcia the best all-around player he's had, also played running back and cornerback, and returned punts and kickoffs, in addition to wide receiver.

Sisson leads country: Mychal Sisson has nine career forced fumbles, more than any active player in the the nation other than Southern Mississippi's Cordarro Law (10). Sisson, however, leads the nation with 40 career tackles for loss. The national leaders (updated 9/12/11):

Tulsa to Siberia: New CSU tight end Blake Jones is an exceptional student that helped Tulsa Union, the school that produced former Rams starter Blake Smith, dominate the state of Oklahoma the past three years. One of his teammates might follow him to the Mountain West and see him on the gridiron whenever the Rams meet Air Force. Unfortunately, Blake's dad, Bobby, can only see about half of his games. That's because his career with an oil company takes him from Tulsa to Siberia every 21 days. The 52-hour trip requires five modes of transportation, including two planes, a bus and helicopter.

Four-for-four: Ted and Kim Kawulok, with CSU's signing of Joe Kawulok in 2011, have incredibly now had four sons earn Division I football scholarships. And, despite playing at Monarch High School in Louisville, Colo., just down the road from Folsom Field, three of the sons — Chris, Michael and now Joe — have chosen to play for the Rams.

► Ted played college football at Northern Arizona and serves as an assistant on the Monarch coaching staff. Oldest son Chris was a tight end for CSU from 2004-08. Michael is a senior-to-be for the Rams and enters the spring as a starting linebacker. Matt was a tight end at San Diego State. And no, the family isn't all boys. Little sister, Lia, has four older brothers. Michael told the Denver Post recently that he feels sorry for any boyfriend Lia invites over for dinner.

► Signing Day was actually Michael's birthday, so in essence, Joe's signing could be interpreted as a birthday present for his older brother, who says Joe actually has never given him a birthday gift. Regardless, the signing does make the Kawuloks one of only a handful of three-brother families to play football for the Rams. But, according to team historian John Hirn (coloradoaggies.com), it's not the school record.

► The Pittsburgh Steelers, 55 years before their appearance Sunday in Super Bowl XLV, made Gary Glick out of Colorado State the NFL's No. 1 overall draft selection in 1956. While Glick might've been the most prominent in his family, he wasn't the only one to play football. Like the Kawuloks, the Glick family had four brothers play at the major-college level. But unlike the Kawuloks, all four Glick brothers played and lettered in Fort Collins: Leon, Ivan, and Fred, who played in the old AFL.

► Other three-brother families at CSU include the French brothers, Jay, Jack and Jasper from Julesburg, Colo. (Fort Collins' largest high-school football stadium, French Field, is named after Jay, a longtime Fort Collins High School coach).

► Perhaps the most prominent player in CSU history, consensus All-American Fum McGraw, also had two brothers play for the school: Bill and Hersh. Bill did not last on the football team long enough to get a letter, but the 1946, '47 and '48 media guides state that Fum was the third brother in a line of Aggies athletes. Bill played on the 1941 team, while Hersh played on the 1942 squad and lost his leg in action during World War II. He returned as a coach and administrator at CSU for many years.

► More recently, the Stratton family — from another arch-rival's territory, Wyoming — has sent three brothers through Fort Collins. Ben, a safety, and Dane, an offensive lineman, were both starters for the Rams in the last decade. Youngest brother Alex, also a DB, played briefly before injury cut short his career two years ago.

► Before Sonny Lubick became coach in 1993 (see list), several other brothers have played for the Aggies and Rams, even going back to the inception of football in 1893, when Henry and Richard Calkins played on the very first team. Other sets of brothers include the Emich (1899), Hartshorn (1921), Hyde (1923), White (Albert and Wilbur 1929-34), Ashbaugh (1954-59), Graves (1953-58), Driscoll (1974-81), Bell (1974-78), Call (1979-83), Bartalo (1982-88) and Chirico (1982-90) families.

DT: Donnell Alexander has only some memories of his biological dad, who passed away when Donnell was young, but he shows similar athleticism. Alexander's father is the late Derrick Thomas, who still holds the NFL's single-game record with seven sacks. He was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2009 after an 11-year career with the Kansas City Chiefs, who made him the fourth overall selection in the 1989 NFL Draft, out of Alabama.

Battling adversity: New CSU lineman Justin Hansen, one of the state's highest ranked recruits, started on both sides of the ball at Longmont High School the past two years. He's now earned a major-college football scholarship and he's done it after battling Asperger's Syndrome, a disorder on the autism spectrum. An accomplished heavyweight wrestler, Hansen also competed for the Class 4A state championship at the Pepsi Center. He's also played basketball for Longmont, and earned all-conference recognition in track as a thrower.
