Colorado Head Coach

Mike MacIntyre

General

"First of all I'm just excited for our seniors to start the season off like this with a great rivalry game. I thought the crowd was phenomenal. I'm not sure about the size of it but the loudness of it. It was a back-and-forth game, what a great game, that's what I told our guys when we messed up another kickoff coverage—and that will get fixed—but I went down there and said, 'wow what a great game guys, they just made a great play now it's time for us to make a great play and enjoy the moment.' They just kept fighting and playing through it, I was really impressed with what they did—their resilience—that's the first time I've been on the field with them and they definitely could have let their heads down and not fought but they fought tremendously. I think our conditioning paid off tremendously, the way we practice, our repetitions, if you come and stay at practice you know what we do, we practice really hard, we don't have picnics, I'll tell you that so I appreciate what our kids do."

On His Fist Pump At The End Of The Game

"We won. Just we won, I'm so happy for those kids. I was so excited for them and knew it at the time."

On Quarterback Connor Wood

"I was really impressed with Connor today, that's what we've been seeing, I knew he had the ability to do it, I'm very proud of him. Now he has to regroup and do it again Saturday and that's when we'll find out if he can do it back to back, which I believe he can, and I think we'll have a really good quarterback, but for today he was excellent."

On The Defense

"I thought they fought extremely hard. The times that we needed to pin them down there we did, which is good, unfortunately they called a pick call going in the end zone, we would have scored but we ended up kicking a field goal. I thought the defense did a really good job, we had to stop them on two different fourth down plays, and that sealed the game really, so I'm proud of the way our defense played. I thought they tackled well, I thought we tackled and swarmed and leveraged the football well."

On His Thoughts On The Blown Coverage Touchdown To Paul Richardson

"Don't fall down, don't drop it throw it right to him, I thought all of that at once."

On Not Kicking The 52 Yard Field Goal In The Third Quarter

"We wanted to pin them down there; he would have kicked a 52 yard field goal, at that time I thought we were playing really well on defense. If Darragh (O'Neill) wasn't so good at what he does, I knew he could put it down there inside the 10, he put one inside the 2. Defensively I thought at that time if we pinned them down there we would have a better chance to go down and score with the better field position. Now there are certain times in the game where we won't do that, pending on momentum and pending on what time it is in the game, that kind of thing."

On The Up-Tempo Offense

"We've worked extremely hard on it, there were a couple times where it really worked, I think it also helped with the missed coverage type of thing because you're going so fast and you have to check and look for where number 6 (Paul Richardson) is, and

double him and cloud him and all that kind of stuff, and I think it helped us spring him open a couple times."

On LB Addison Gillam

"Well, he had 11 tackles at halftime, I don't know what he had after that. He's a player, I've always known he was a player since he was a junior in high school. He was up in the hills of California (Palo Cedro, Calif.), nobody looked at him but us (San Jose coaching staff), and I'm glad he's here. He's 6-foot-3 and three-quarters, he's 235 pounds, can run a 4.5 (second 40-yard dash), naked 4.4. High school tailback, extremely smart, he's a really, really good player and I was excited about what he did (against CSU). I thought he might pee down his leg the first game, but he didn't. I told him to go to the restroom a couple times before we went out."

On Team Having Positive Momentum

"It's just one game. It was great, but we have to keep doing it. What I kept telling (the team) was, and I always do, 'just keep playing, enjoy playing. They're going to make plays on you, they're on scholarship too, but we have to keep making more plays, we have to keep fighting, we have to keep doing all the fundamentals, we have to keep communicating, we have to keep staying pumped up.' I think they did that, and they'll continue to do that. If we can just keep weathering those storms and I think we'll have a good football team. We passed the test today and we have to regroup and pass the test next week. Now, they have to go around and instead of being told how bad they are, they'll be told how good they are for a week. So, we have to reverse that, 'don't eat the cheese', so to speak, 'don't eat the cheese, get ready to play.'"

On Being Happy For The Players

"It's great to see the joy in the players, especially the seniors. The seniors spoke before the game, Gus Handler talked at halftime again, because they've been there and done that and they wanted to do it. I really am happy for them, and our coaches. For our coaches families, it's an emotional deal, the wives, their husbands will be happy for at least a day and then they go back to work again and then they'll be grumpy again."

On Offense Putting Up Big Numbers

"I think we'll stay with that. CSU is really good on defense, and were going to play some really stout defenses, defenses that will be top-ten ranked type defenses as the season goes on. The key we have to do is we have to keep taking care of the football—I know all coaches say that, but it's true—and we have to keep causing turnovers which we did. We do that drill every day in practice, 'win-the-edge' drill, where we strip the ball, and I'm yelling at them and we make them scoop it correctly and go score and keep (the ball) high and tight. That exact drill; strip, scoop, score and what a game-changing play that was. I'll tell you about Chidera (Uzo-Diribe). The play before (Uzo-Diribe stripped the ball) he came out of the game with a stinger and (shook it off) and then he just runs back in. Then, with that same arm, he guts it out and sees the ball and strips it. To me, that's a warrior, a team captain, team leader that wanted it. Most times, guys might sit there and say, 'I can't go', but not him. I was really very proud of him making that choice to do that because it really showed some guts."

On QB Connor Wood Improving

"Scheme has something to do with it, there's no doubt, but work ethic, repetition—rep after rep, after rep, after rep—he has thrown those routes a million times, he's made those calls a million times, he's handled it all, he's had bad snaps in practice and had to get that figured out. So, I think it's just the repetitions and (offensive coordinator) Brian Lindgren is a great quarterback coach, not just a good one, a great one. I saw him do it last year, I see him doing it now when I watch every day. Our other quarterbacks are getting better and better. If Connor ever got hurt, we got guys that I think can come in because they get a lot of reps in practice themselves. Our scheme is very good, we know how to attack things and the quarterback knows where to go with the ball. Believe it or not, (Wood) had some reads tonight—when he watches tape he'll go, 'oh gosh'—that he could have hit, and he'll hit those next week and hopefully put up some even bigger numbers."

On Offensive Line

"I credit them a lot. I don't think we gave up any sacks. We had the one intentional grounding, but we weren't blocking that guy and we were hoping he would dive down but he read it and did a good job. But, I think the offensive did a really good job, they competed the whole night. I thought they did a good job of giving Connor [Wood] time, and I thought they did a good job knocking (CSU players) off the ball at times. Hopefully, we'll bust one of those (runs) eventually. When you get a 200 yard night (rushing), you've got to bust one for 50 or 60 (yards) and we didn't bust one, but hopefully we will do that eventually."

On Play Of Secondary

"Again, the repetitions we get in practice. I know I'm over using that, but if you see the same route over and over, and see trips and doubles (receivers) and empties (backfield). And then doing all of their communication with hand signals and talking and looking at each other, that's how you play good in the secondary. All five of them have to be on the same page, because four of them could play great but one breaks down then it's history. We've got to get a little bit better rushing the passer, but we were bound and determined to stop the run and we did. But we'll get better at that also."

ON COMING BACK FROM AN INJURY-“It feels good. I keep saying over and over again how happy I am to be back with my teammates. This was bigger than me having a couple hundred yards. This was for the team. This was for us having to go through our third coaching staff. This is for all the things we’ve gone through this off season with our facility, with our program, and getting this big win means a lot.

ON THE FIRST TOUCHDOWN-“The corner was crowded on me, so I was anticipating the safety being over top of me. The safety bent on the under route and let me go free.”

ON THE IMPORTANCE OF THE WIN-“I think this ranks high in the wins just because it was our first game. As a team, we only got one last year. To come back and start off this season with one means a lot. Since we lost to them last year, it means even more. It is just game one. We have eleven more to go. It ranks high, but at the same time we have to put it behind us and get ready for Central Arkansas--which is a great team.”

ON CONNECTING WITH CONNOR WOOD-“It felt great. Coach joked a couple of weeks ago about guys that ‘when the going gets tough, they don’t the play to come their way’, whether that is making a tackle or making a run. My soul was burning for the ball to come my way. I wanted to be the guy that helped us pull away from that team. When the ball came my way, in that moment I ran hard through the goal line even though I was sore and tired. I just embraced all my teammates.

ON THE DEFENSE IMPROVEMENT- “In fall camp, I saw the level of physicality pick up and I was proud of that. What I learned more from them in fall camp was what they displayed tonight. They made some third and short stops and some fourth and short stops. It was when we needed it the most. Yes, they [CSU] made some plays on special teams, it happens. For the defense to make those crucial stops and for us to capitalize right after on offense shows how much we have grown.”

ON WORKING WITH CONNOR WOOD- “It started long before spring. It started eleven months ago when I was recovering from my surgery and he wasn’t really ‘the guy’ (so to speak). We would work out. I wasn’t supposed to be running around, but I was. I was out there running routes and sometimes I would try to sneak out there without my brace. We started to build our chemistry early. We didn’t know if I was going to be the same me. We didn’t know if he was going to have this spot, but last year we had free time. We took advantage of that opportunity. We have just been working throughout this winter, winter, summer, and fall camp. Today, it came full circle.”

ON BEING A HUNDRED PERCENT- “Today was a good battle test for us as a whole offense and defense. I think it helped me build some confidence. We have eleven games. This is just the beginning.”

ON QB CONNOR WOOD’S CONFIDENCE- “He played like a grown man. I was so proud of him. I couldn’t even tell you how good he feels. For it to be his first season opener and he did that well—I am proud of him.”

ON HOW IT FELT TO WIN- “It meant that the work that we have been putting in has paid off. How much we put in is as much as we will get out. I can’t say it enough. I am so proud of my team.”

It’s kind of funny when other players see kickers running around tackling. We have just really worked on it. We shuffle and everything. ON THE IMPORTANCE OF DEFENSE TONIGHT-"The coaches always have us do a turn over circuit. Stripping the ball and then scooping it up to score is just routine. All I have to do is pick it up and keep it high and tight to make a big play for my team."

ON BECOMING A PLAYMAKER-"I strive to be a play maker. I missed the interception and I am mad about that. I am trying to cause more turnovers because if you want to be great you have to cause turnovers."

QB Connor Wood

ON THE RETURN OF PAUL RICHARDSON - "It's Christmas in September. It's nice to have him back."

ON OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR BRIAN LINDGREN-"He has furthered my game tremendously and given me confidence. It's from speaking confidence in your player."

ON FEELING THE NEED TO PROVE HIMSELF TODAY - "Yes, because we hadn't played a game yet. During the pre-season there was a lot of talk and stuff going on especially with having a new coaching staff and athletic director. To go out and do what we did was a good thing for us as a team. We talked a lot in the offseason but it is something else to back it up with a win."

ON HIS CONFIDENCE BEING NAMED STARTER LAST WEEK - "Yes, it gave me confidence last week being named a starter. To hear the coaches say that we believe in you, you're going in. To hear that in a job or wherever that 'we believe in you,' it really brings out the best in them."

ON THINKING ABOUT CSU IN THE OFFSEASON -"Yeah, we've been talking about it all summer. In the summer workouts, as the grind kind of gets going in July we were talking about CSU because it kind of gave us some motivation. So we've been talking about it for a while about this game, but we had a bad taste in our mouths from last year. It's good to be in that position and to see that trophy hoisted."

ON IF THE WIN HAS SOAKED IN YET-"It has a little bit but I'm still in the zone of the game"

ON HOW HE VISUALIZED THE GAME TO PLAY OUT AND THE ACTUAL REALITY OF THE GAME-"Well you want to do the best that you can and stick to your reads and I tell you (offensive coordinator Brian) Lindgren made some great calls today and you know, I was hoping that he would have a great game calling and so it's great to see that and always great to get that W."

"Not at all, not at all, it's a new and improved Connor. I give all the credit to the coaches for my speaking confidence in me and my teammates rallying around me. When I was named starter they were all supportive and said, 'we have your back'. We have to pull together as a family."

POSTGAME QUOTES

HEAD COACH JIM McELWAIN

(opening statement on the game)

"We got beaten by a team today that was opportunistic. They created big plays, which whenever you go in to a first game, you know that's something you've got to worry about. Obviously we didn't do a very good job of keeping our defense off the field and sustaining drives. I thought we missed a couple of opportunities here and there, but I want you to know this: we've got a very good football team. I believe in our football team. I believe in their commitment, and I believe in what they've done. We have a ways to go, I get it, I get it. I've got shoulders, and I'll take it all. But I do believe in this football team and I think we have a lot of good things to look forward to.

"Obviously, containment and a couple of busted coverages on their number six (Paul Richardson), you know guys, you can't do that. You can't let somebody who runs that fast just run down the sideline on you. The fumble actually (hurt). They were opportunistic. They had a good strip and took it down in and sealed it. I never thought we were out of it by any stretch of the imagination. When it comes to field position, we've got to get better at that. We had an opportunity to get a first down coming off the goal line and we didn't do it. So there are a lot of things, but we'll learn from this. Give them credit. I thought their quarterback played one heck of a game, I really do. He was accurate, got the ball out of his hand, and we didn't get much pass rush. Give their offensive line a lot of credit there. But you know, I'm disappointed, to be honest with you. I thought we would win the game. I still believe in these guys and I think we're a good football team."

(on the two busted coverages against Paul Richardson)

"On the first one, it was motion and we didn't get the check. The corner thought he had help, and the safety thought he had support. You know what, the guy caught it. I was hoping he was going to drop it. The second one they came out in the cone formation, pistol and there again there was a check we were supposed to make from a cover standpoint, and you know what, we didn't get it done so that's on us."

(on the team's preparedness)

"The communication on a couple of those formational things (hurt us). Things they hadn't done before. But there again, you have to be sound. I'm not using that as an excuse at all. I'm making no excuses. Our guys were prepared, they were energized, and they hung in there. We didn't overcome big plays obviously and we left a lot of offense out on the field which is something we've got to get remedied."

(on whether the team was ineffective on third downs)

"That's an understatement. But I know this: We've done some good things. We've got to get better in a lot of phases. I didn't think we ran the ball as much as we should have as far as controlling the line of scrimmage. I'll be honest there. Certainly we've got to step back and evaluate that a little bit because we were just on the edge of getting some big runs too which would have kept our defense off the field a little bit."

(on the play of QB Garrett Grayson)

"He would like to have a couple of the plays back, but I thought he managed it pretty well. I really did. He made a couple of plays with his feet, but we didn't probably push the ball down the field enough to be honest. There were some things in there that we didn't take advantage of. Everything was horizontal today, so that's something we need to look at. He did alright."

(on why Grayson was selected as the starter)

"We felt based off of his preparation and how he took control of our 1-reel, we felt he was ready. I'm not putting this loss on Garrett by any stretch of the imagination."

(on the play of running back Kapri Bibbs after Donnell Alexander's injury)

"He had a little juice; I would have liked to have seen him keep his feet. I thought he could have hit a couple of home runs actually keeping his feet. But we put one on the ground and you can't do that and play successful football. He did come in and energize us a little bit. As far as Donnell, we'll have to look at that hand and see what's going to happen there."

(on whether he knew ahead of time who the starting QB would be)

"We took it up to the last second."

(on whether Grayson will start against Tulsa)

"We will look at the video. As of right now, without (seeing the video) I would probably say yes."

(on who was listed as the number two starter at quarterback)

"He (Nick Stevens) was prepared to go in as the number two."

(on the Rams' special teams play)

"I thought our kickoff coverage was much better. I thought we obviously made some explosive plays in the special teams. We worked hard on it, and it's one of the phases of the game that you have to be good at. I thought we did some pretty good things. Really, it's what got us into the game and it was good."

(on dropped passes by receivers)

"Rashard (Higgins) had one that was pretty big there on third down, and he did a couple of (good) things and he'll learn from this game. I think Joe (Hansley) might have spit one out. Obviously, the running backs dropped a couple in some check downs. I don't think they were trying to miss it; we'll come back and work on it."

(on whether youth was a factor in receivers dropping passes)

"I guess you could use that as an excuse, but I don't think so. We have just got to make plays and we have to force ourselves offensively to make plays. As far as inexperience goes, they've been through camp and they need to be ready to go."

(on the play of WR Joe Hansley)

"He tweaked his ankle there a little bit at the end, we'll have to see if he's ready to go next week, but he showed up big. He showed up like the Colorado Gatorade player of the year like he was. I'm proud of him because he came and really competed."

(on the new targeting rule)

"It's something that us as stewards of the game need to teach the proper way of tackling. Don't hit defenseless players. They did a good job today on the one they called today on Cory (James). They reviewed it, and that's part of the rule. He put his head sideways, and wrapped up just like you're supposed to. They called it but, the official didn't have anything to do with this game and I think as long as we all teach it, it will be good for the game."

(on moving forward)

"It's tough to move on, especially with a rivalry game, but our guys have been through a lot. They've come together. The beauty of athletics and sport is there is going to be a winner and there is going to be a loser. The life lessons that you learn and how you pick yourself up and go forward (is what matters). I think we will have some resolve, I really do. You know, it hurts guys and I still think we should win the game. I'm gonna tell you I think we should win the game next year. So go ahead and put it in their locker room now. That's what I believe. I do, and I'm good with that because I know they've got my back and I've got their back and that's something that is really comforting as a coach."

(on the lack of pass rush)

"I was pretty impressed with their offensive line. We did not get home at all. I felt that would be a big part of our game, but give their offensive line credit. They stoned us pretty good at the line of scrimmage and we didn't get much done."

(on how much he thought CU's defense would be improved)

"I knew they would be better. They are still recruiting Pac-12 guys. You can say what you want but I don't believe that we are taking a back seat to any of it. They played good, they played sound, they ruined a couple of our things that you know obviously they did a good job in their summer study. Give them credit. They had their guys prepared, and we had our guys prepared. Like I said, we'll come back."

(on next week's game)

"It will be a short week for us. We have to jump on a plane and head to Tulsa. We have to leave early on Friday. We'll get on that plane and we will go out and play our hearts out."

(on getting the tight ends involved)

"I don't think we had enough opportunities for them. I would have liked to have had them involved a little bit more and that's something we need to move forward with."

It was CU's first **turnover free** season opener since 2000 ... The 2-point conversion pass from Connor Wood to D.D. Goodson was CU's first since making one against Georgia in 2010 ... Colorado utilized **32,779** tickets of its allotment (including **7,538** student); CSU moved **23,392** and the Broncos **3,430** for an attendance of **59,601** ... **So much for Vegas:** the Buffs came in 3-point underdogs, and the over/under was 49½. IT'S OVER: Colorado entered the year allowing at least one TD pass in 36 straight games, but that streak ended today.

Mike MacIntyre joined **Rick Neuheisel** as the only two of CU's 15 head coaches since 1932 to win their debut games at Colorado; Neuheisel's '95 Buffs plastered Wisconsin in Madison, 43-7; he placed a congratulatory call to MacIntyre after the game ... Colorado is now **24-1** when scoring first in season openers dating back to 1967 ...

WHITE UNIS / GOLD PANTS Prior to today, the last time Colorado wore white jerseys with gold pants was Nov. 1, 2008 in a 24-17 loss at Texas A&M (1,764 days ago; that's the game where **Von Miller** broke **Rodney Stewart's** leg with a horse collar tackle). CU had lost five straight in the look, with the last win before today in the 2004 Houston Bowl (33-28 over UTEP).

QB CONNOR WOOD (46-33-0, 400, 3 TD; 4-8 RUSH, 408 YD) He became the third Colorado quarterback to throw for 400 yards in a season opener (see list); he threw all of 42 passes last season, and the 46 attempts were the second most in a game in CU history without an interception (Tyler Hansen had 49 against Cal in 2011). It was the 11th 400-yard passing game in school history overall, and just the ninth 400-yard total offense game.

HE'S BACK: PAUL RICHARDSON (10-208, 2 TD REC) enjoyed just the fourth 200-yard receiving game in CU history, and he owns two of the four and the all-time mark of 284 against Cal in 2011. The 82-yard play to open the scoring tied for the 10th longest pass play in school history (and tied for the second longest in a season opener). Richardson ended the night with career

numbers of 83 receptions for 1,277 yards, as he jumped from 25th to 20th in catches and from 21st to 10th in yards.

ADDISON GILLAM (14 TT, 2 TFL, 1 QBS) In becoming just the second true freshman to start a season opener at inside linebacker in CU history, he unofficially recorded 14 tackles (5 solo), with two for losses including a quarterback sack, a pass break up, two third downs stops and a fourth down stop as he played a vital role in limiting CSU to under 300 yards (295). ► **OG Alex Kelley** saw his first action for the Buffs today; the redshirt freshman was also a grayshirt out of the 2011 recruiting class, meaning it's been **999** days between game action for him.

► **PK Will Oliver (4-4 FG, 3-3 PAT, 15 points)** He was perfect, with his field goals coming from 22, 41, 44 and 52 yards out. The 52-yard boot matched his career long and was a pressure kick, it put the Buffaloes back into the lead, 26-24, with 13:07 left in the game. It is the second time in his career he has made four field goals in a game (he had six all of last year), and he went from 38th to 32nd on CU's career scoring list (123 points) and from 13th to ninth in kick scoring. He has made 33 straight PAT kicks.

► **WR Nelson Spruce (8-99, 0 TD)** just missed out on his second 100-yard game the second game in a row—he ended 2012 with 10 catches for 98 yards (1 TD) against Utah.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Attendance for the 85th renewal of the Rocky Mountain Showdown was 59,601.
- Today's captains were LB **Shaquil Barrett**, TE **Kivon Cartwright**, DB **Trent Matthews** and OL **Weston Richburg**.
- **Garrett Grayson** made his ninth career start for Colorado State after a quarterback battle that wasn't settled until Sunday. He finished 22-of-39 for 201 yards with no touchdowns and no interception.
- Several Rams saw their first career action on Sunday: DL **Austin Berk**, RB **Kapri Bibbs**, LB **Deonte Clyburn**, WR **Rashard Higgins**, P **Hayden Hunt**, DL **Terry Jackson**, DL **LaRyan King**, LB **Danny Nwosu**, RB **Davon Riddick**, WR **Robert Ruiz**, DL **LaRyan King**, S **Jake Schlager** and WR **Jordon Vaden**. Four are true freshmen (Berk, Clyburn, Higgins and Schlager).
 - Late in the second quarter **Kapri Bibbs** ran the ball in from seven yards out for his first career touchdown. Bibbs added on with a second touchdown to give the Rams their only lead of the game, 24-23, with 2:51 to play in the third quarter.
 - Freshman wide receiver **Rashard Higgins** hauled in his first reception midway through the third quarter and finished with 6 catches for 57 yards, including a long of 22.
 - Freshman punter **Hayden Hunt** booted his third career punt 59 yards and on the final play of the third quarter Hunt boomed a 69-yard punt from the back of his own end zone. In his first collegiate game Hunt averaged 49.7 yards per punt on 7 attempts.
- Connor Wood's first-quarter 82-yard TD pass to Paul Richardson was the longest pass play against the Rams since Aug. 30, 2003 when Colorado's Joel Klatt connected with Derek McCoy for an 82-yard score.
- Sophomore linebacker **Kevin Davis** returned to action for Colorado State after tearing his ACL on Oct. 27, 2012 on the opening kickoff against Hawai'i.
- Late in the first quarter junior quarterback **Garrett Grayson** connected on a 40-yard pass to sophomore wide receiver **Joe Hansley**. The 40-yard catch was the longest reception of Hansley's career.
- **Hansley** hauled in a team-high eight receptions for 91 yards. The eight receptions represent a career high for Hansley. His previous best came in the season finale in 2012 against New Mexico.
- After the Rams defense forced a three-and-out on Colorado's second-half opening drive, Hansley returned the punt 74 yards for a score. The last time Colorado State returned a punt for a touchdown was Sept. 30, 2006 at Fresno State by Damon Morton (58 yards). Hansley's 74-yard

return is the second-longest of his career, with his longest coming at home against Hawai'i on Oct. 27, 2012 (76 yards).

- Junior kicker **Jared Roberts** continues his success against Colorado, hitting a 39-yard field goal early in the second quarter and followed it up with a 30-yarder with 3:47 left in the fourth quarter. Against the Buffaloes in his career, Roberts is 5-for-5 with all field goals coming from 30 yards and out.
 - Jared Roberts has now connected on eight consecutive kicks. His last miss came in the 2012 home-opener against North Dakota State.
- Safety **Kevin Pierre-Louis** racked up a career-high 15 tackles. His previous high was six tackles at Boise State on Nov. 17, 2012.
- **Bernard Blake's** 11 tackles set a career high. Previous high was seven vs. UNLV on Nov. 10, 2012.
- **Cory James'** nine tackles set a career high. Previous high was eight at San Jose State on Sept. 15, 2012.
- **Thomas Coffman** 84-yard kickoff return, which set up the Rams at CU's 16-yard line, the longest since Aug. 31, 2008 by John Mosure vs. Colorado (90 yards). The Rams ended up scoring a touchdown and taking their first lead of the game.
- **Austin Gray** saw his first collegiate action at wide receiver. Gray has spent his first two seasons playing safety for Colorado State, where he registered 88 tackles.
- **Shaquil Barrett** tallied a career-high 3.5 tackles for loss on Sunday. His previous high was 1.5 tackles for loss vs. North Dakota State on Sept. 8, 2012.
- The Tackle Hunger Food Drive—a collaboration between the two universities—raised more than \$3,000 Sunday. The proceeds will go to the Food Bank for Larimer County, Community Food Share of Boulder and Broomfield and Food Bank of the Rockies in Denver.
