General

"First of all, CSU is a really good football team, Mike Bobo has done a really good job with them. That was a classic I would say. One of those types of games that everybody loves to come watch and I think games like these will really keep the rivalry truly going. I am so proud of our young men, locker room, those who were not able to dress out. I am so proud of our coaches and I am extremely grateful to be the head coach of Colorado. I really enjoyed tonight. Winning is fun. That was good for us. I think you keep seeing our team grow up; I said it at Hawai'i. I still believe in this team. Last week we were able to put a team away, this week we played a very good football team and found a way to come and win it and kept fighting. Last year we fought and fought but couldn't find a way to win it. Tonight we found a way to win it; we found a way to block a field goal, found a way to make a kick, found a way to make a play. We got down, kept battling. I think it shows you a young group of men, we are still a young team, but we are not babies anymore, we are growing into men. So I think you are seeing us grow up in front of your faces."

"Oh no none at all. Not one bit. That's the only one he has missed. You've seen him kick in practice. You better be able to bounce back and he is able to do that. I had all the confidence in the world in him. He had a tough one, one kick was blocked earlier then we had that one happened and he came back and made the kick. So I was very proud of him."

On Overtime

"I think we know to just keep playing, fighting, and battling. For example, the fourth down and one play we were debating and I said, 'Nah. We got the guts in us, we can do this.' And we did it and ended up missing the field goal. We battled in overtime. It was unique. They had made some runs on us there is no doubt. We kept battling, we are in great condition. We get that roughing the passer on the first down played, that's second and ten there. So it looks like, 'Wow they might just try to run it in.' and we just bowed up somehow, found a way down four to two inside and stopped them. We had enough energy and power and just rushed that field goal. That's late in the game and they found an extra set of energy."

On QB Sefo Liufau's Performance

"Sefo, he is so tough. I say that all the time. I think he is the toughest quarterback I have ever been around. I think he is the toughest. He is a warrior. He just kept battling and battling and ended up making some plays for us that he

needed to make. I was excited for him. I knew they were going to stack up against the run and do some things. When Michael Adkins went down, Patrick Carr went down, Phil Lindsay went down with ribs; we were down to Christian Powell and Kyle Evans ready to go. So we were kind of limited there. But Christian and those guys kept battling and I think they did some great things for us."

On The Fourth Quarter

"They could have hung their head after we got the penalty saying the late hit and now they get to move the ball down to the 12-yard line and we have to stop them. But our guys bowed up and did it. I was really, really, really impressed with that. I felt like we were going to do, but they had to go do it. There was a lot of momentum swings: we missed the field goal, had that penalty next. But our guys found their character and their work ethic and trust in each other. They found an extra energy, they did. And that's a will to win and they have learned to do that."

On His Team's Morale

"I still feel good about our team. Of course we wanted to stop them and there were some things going on. We just have to keep battling. They're hardened. They've been through a lot. When you go through a lot of different adversity, you don't let that kind of stuff affect you. You just keep playing. That's what happened to us last year and they knew they'd find a way to win. That's what they're doing now."

On Ejection Calls

"I know there's been a lot of talk about targeting on all of the sports talk shows now and ESPN. That's the call they made, that's the rule. We need to protect people, there's no doubt about it. We have to make sure we do that. I have to go watch it on tape. The one last week, they got Afolabi [Laguda] with that hit. Those are all kind of judgement calls. I think we need to protect everybody and go with what the referees say. After the season is over, they need to look and see if it's really truly an intent of the player, if they're trying to hurt them. We need to look over the rules committee. If they hit up in the head area, they're going to call it and that's part of the game. We need to keep working with our guys."

On The Second Half

"I thought it was kind of a slug fest. I thought that both teams were battling hard and that someone was going to have to make a play. Kenneth Ogburn made a good play and they went down and made a really good fourth down play. We kind of got messed up on it. Both teams ended up making plays and we really made two more plays than they did."

On The Game's Atmosphere

"I thought the crowd made a big difference. It's a unique game. When they score it's loud. When we score it's loud. It's raring all the time. It's never really silent. It's an interesting dynamic and I think that makes it really fun for the players."

On Gamboa's Performance

"[Ricky] Gamboa is a really smart, hard-nosed football player. He's a redshirt freshman. He got thrown in there tonight. He's been playing some but he had to play basically every snap. Rick's done a really good job. It was very satisfying to see him do that."

On The Defensive Scheme

"What happened was that we had some underneath man coverage and the QB scrambled a couple of times and dumped it at the last second and ran away from our linebacker. That's what happened. Later on we played a different defense when we made the big play. We had seen it and our kids were able to react to it. They had been throwing screens on that down and distance so we held up a screen card and our defensive linemen saw it and I think that helped them too."

ON PLAYING IN A COMPETITIVE GAME LIKE THIS - "It's arguably one of the best feelings I've ever had in my life. I wish I could relive that moment again right now. It was just so amazing and I'm glad we got that win. It's the best game I ever played in my life too. It was fun, excitement, everything coach Mac talks about like trusting everything, trusting your teammates, and it was just a great game."

ON YOUR TOUCHDOWN PLAY - "We knew that the linebacker was covering me. I guess they thought they could cover me with a linebacker, so we decided to go up top on them with a little inside fade and Sefo trusted me to throw it up to a spot and I just had to come down and get it."

ON GETTING THE PASSING GAME GOING— "Yeah I mean we just started watching film and saw they play a lot of man, contesting us down field to see if we could get open, it was a great opportunity for our receivers. The running game has been working the first two weeks and we're going to do whatever is working, whatever helps us win, that's all that really matters."

ON TRYING TO ESTABLISH THE RUNNING GAME EARLY - "There's a lot of things we needed to work on you know going into this next game here with our running game. They stacked the box and we knew that going into the game, we knew it was going to be a tough game and we knew we were going to have to run hard and just open it up for our receivers. Our job is to run hard and make those yards and hopefully get our receivers open."

ON THE DEFENSE MAKING A CONCERTED EFFORT TO STOP THE RUN - "Yeah they definitely knew that we were going to be running a lot and I feel like they stacked the box and they were really keying on us with the run but for us we just have to keep getting those pushes."

ON HIS LAST CSU GAME - "I feel amazing. It's truly a blessing to come out my final year and go out with a bang and on top. They can't take that away from me."

ON THE MORALE AT HALFTIME - "The morale was super high. Coach always tells us that the score at halftime is the least important score of the game. We were down a little bit but we felt like we had the momentum and we knew we were going to go out and win the third and fourth quarter."

ON TRAILING EARLY AND HAVING TO RALLY - "I think it's just us trusting each other. I think from an offensive perspective we sputtered in the beginning, I think it was obvious there. And it wasn't just one position; I think everyone kind of took their turn. We kept trusting each other, and we ended up pulling it out and getting something going."

ON WINNING CLOSE GAME - "It feels amazing. These guys, we all put in a lot of work this summer, and it's finally showing. We played four quarters-plus. I believe that we were in more shape than they were. It showed tonight. I'm proud of the guys, it feels amazing. We'll enjoy it tonight, and then get ready for next week."

ON WORRY AFTER HIT TO HIS ARM - "Not worried, it was a small bruise. I think anyone can play through a bruise. I wouldn't want to be the guy who sits out just because of that. Everything is fine, I'll be ready to go next week."

ON MOMENTUM SHIFTS - "Yeah, I think especially in a rivalry game sometimes that will happen. It will be an up-and-down, back-and-forth, but if you're down you can't worry about the mistakes or the team, or worry too much about getting back in the game. If you're up really high, it's the same thing. You just have to take it one play at a time, each game that you play. I think we did a really good job of that tonight."

ON TEAM NEVER QUITTING - "I think it comes from, first of all individually, and then I think collectively as a team after that. Because, we're pushing each other, telling the other person not to quit; not to give up. That starts in fall camp. That starts in summer training when none of the coaches are here. Pushing each other to make your times on sprints, basically. It's a year-round thing that we've been working on for a while. I'm just proud that we don't quit."

ON FIRST TD TO WR SHAY FIELDS - "Yeah, we saw a mismatch there and Shay did a really good job of getting open down the sideline. I finally hit a deep ball, I guess, which is good to see. He did a really good job of getting separation for that deep pass which I think gave the offense a little spark."

ON ANY DIFFERENCE PLAYING AT AN NFL FIELD - "No, I don't think so. I think that the rivalry game aspect and the atmosphere that we played in, I think that it's great for guys to be a part of that; the loud atmosphere, and playing through all that and communicating. I think we'll be really prepared for whatever stadiums we play at this year going forward."

ON IF THIS GAME IS A RIVALRY - "Yeah, it's a rivalry. You know, all week I say that we don't want to make a big deal about it because you have to treat it just like another game. You don't want to go in and over-hype it to your teammates. Everyone knows it's a rivalry, but you just go in with a calm mind, just go in like it's another game. ON PLAYING WITH LESS PRESSURE ON HIM - "The defense played really well tonight, and I applaud them for everything; the big stops they had, the turnover (and touchdown) they had. I don't think I played mistake free, there's always something that you can work on to improve on for the next game. I think I played well, but that's also a testament to the offensive linemen, the receivers making plays. I scrambled one play and [WR Nelson] Spruce rolled out with me to help complete that pass. It's not just me, it's the whole team."

ON CSU SLOWING DOWN CU'S RUN GAME - "Yeah, I think they loaded the box more. I think that's what helped us get one-on-one on the outsides; which is why you had [WR] Shay [Fields] twice, three times actually, I missed one of them, and [WR] Devin [Ross] had another deep one (for a touchdown). Just them packing the box, which gave our receivers more time to work on the outside."

ON EMOTIONS DOWN 14-0 - "I would say pissed off. Because I think that as a team we thought that we could play better than the way we were playing. It's just frustrating to kind of fall that deep and the offense sputtering as it was. I take that on my shoulders as the quarterback. Light a fire under them (the offense) and try to get them going. I think that after that we kind of got into a rhythm and wearing the defense down with our tempo, which is really good to see."

COLORADO STATE HEAD COACH MIKE BOBO

(general)

“That was another hard-fought effort by our kids. They played extremely hard. They showed some resolve there in the 4th quarter when we had the pick-6 (and) came back to tie the ballgame up. The defense bows their neck and we get the ball back to possibly win it in regulation, and we didn’t, it went into overtime again and didn’t get the job done.”

“Again, I thought we played better as a football team. I think we’ve improved from week one to week two and week two to week three. The hard thing is we’re 1-2, and there are some hurt kids in there who laid their hearts on the line for three straight weeks and haven’t received the benefits of hard work.

“What we’ve got to do as coaches and players is continue what we’re doing. I believe in our football team and I believe in the way they’re playing, I think it’s a special group. It’s an easy thing to do to say we’re 1-2 and stop working the way we’re working, but that’s not how I’m wired and that’s not how my team is going to be wired. We’re going to get after it and we’ll be ready to play Saturday, and they’re going to fight their tails off for Colorado State.”

(on not finishing drives)

“We had some drives and we couldn’t finish the drives. We’ve got to do a better of getting in the right plays so we can be successful. We’ve got to do a better job of executing the plays that are called. The worst thing you can do is not get points. There’s going to be a million things when you go back and look at the game of ‘we had an opportunity here, we had an opportunity there;’ the thing we try to tell our team is you never know when that opportunity is going to come. There can be six or seven plays in that game that are going to come that are going to be the difference in the game. What we try to do is keep playing the same way every play, doing your job, I think that’s what makes people great. And we’re having some mistakes offensively, but our defense is playing hard, playing like I want them to; we played better as an offensive unit tonight, but we still didn’t capitalize when we had some momentum on some drives, but again there was no quit in our team, but we’ve got to do a better job of finishing drives.”

(on coming up short two weeks in a row against teams from Power 5 conference)

“There’s not any consolation. I said it last week, you work hard, you play—we all play the game—to win the game. We’re all competitors, and like I just told a couple of the seniors in there, I really believe we have a special football team, and I expect them to do what needs to be done, and that’s continue to work. It’s easy sometimes for kids to say we haven’t worked this hard, we haven’t done this much, we’re 1-2; but we have to look at the positives, we’ve got to correct the mistakes, and we’ve got to continue to get better. In my mind this is a football team that will fight your tail, and I’m proud of it. Am I proud of being 1-2? No. I hate losing and they hate losing, but we’ve got to get back to work and we’ve got to find a way to win a football game.”

(on sending Wyatt Bryan on the field in the 4th then sending the offense back in)

“I thought we had the momentum again, and then we stalled out, and I had a third-down call that I liked but I wanted to spread out to the right. We had practiced it once to the left and we felt good about going ahead and calling the play to the left and we executed the play great. It was just more of a left-hash call, the one I wanted to go with, and felt good about.”

(on the play that resulted in the pick-6)

"I don't know, I'd have to go back and look at the film, sometimes there's a little bit of different rules when the ball's behind the line on a screen of when you can hit a guy. The guy made a great play, we were cracking the backside 'backer and he came off the tight end and made a good play. I've got to credit him for making that play."

(on any other factors that made him go for it on 4th down late in the game)

"I was tired of stalling out and not getting seven. I thought our defense was playing well, I know they hit a couple big plays on us, but if we didn't get it, I felt we were going to get the ball back – I still felt there was enough time. I had trust in the play that we called but I had more trust that if we didn't get it that our defense would be able to hold them."

(on whether there was a thought to go to Rashard Higgins on the possession in OT)

"The first play was designed where he was the number one progression on that play. They ran a different kind of blitz and we had a wheel route on a tight end, and then after that we felt like we were controlling the line of scrimmage and we wanted to try to hammer it in. Then when it was at third and four we tried to stay in regular. He was an option on that last play depending on what the coverage did. I'd have to go back and watch the film of why Nick went there, but I wouldn't say 'hey, you're going directly to Rashard.'"

"We're a little bit off on our accuracy but we just went with the best play that we thought would work at that point."

(on failing to take advantage of opportunities)

"They won the game, Terry, you've got to give them credit. They were down 14-0, 14-3-nothing ... they fought, they played hard, they made enough plays that win the ballgame. Every time you lose a ball game you're going to go back and say we would've done this if we had the chance and we would've done that, but you've got to give those guys credit. They played hard and made more plays in the right time than we did."

(on field goal kicking)

"We missed three field goals, one of them was a little long for us to probably try, but he made the one to get us into overtime last week. We feel that he's the best guy. We have to keep putting him into those situations. We have to do better on offense and not settle for field goals, but at the end of the day when you stall you have to get points and we haven't done that enough. We lost the turnover battle again."

(on message to the team)

"This is my message; no team that I coach is not going to play hard ... quit, and not be all in. For three games we played hard, we've been all-in and played for 60 minutes-plus in the last two games. I expect the same thing on Monday. If that's not for you or you doubt what we're doing, my office will be open tomorrow and you can come in, but the guys who are going to wear the green and gold are going to play hard for the green and gold every week."

(on Dalyn Dawkins' effort)

"Dalyn Dawkins is a stud. He might weigh 173 pounds soaking wet, but he's the hardest worker on our football team. That's how he practices every single day; full speed. I love that kid, he has more heart than anybody and his hamstring got a little tight. I thought that J.O. (Jasen Oden) came in and did a nice job running. Dalyn is what you want; a guy who comes to play every day as a football player. He doesn't say a word, if you ask him to do something he does it."

(on availability of Treyous Jarrells)

“Treyous was available in the fourth quarter, but we felt that it was a little tight. Then Dawkins and J.O. were running the ball well. We left some runs out there a couple of times, probably seeing a little too much, but Dawkins is a first-year guy who ran hard. J.O.’s getting a lot of carries, more than he’s ever got. It takes times and coming into the season I knew it would take time offensively when you lose a 1,000-yard-plus rusher and lose a 4,000-yard passer at quarterback. I felt we needed to play great defense and we’re playing great defense. We’re getting better on offense, the record is just 1-2 and if we stick to the plan I believe we will be fine this year.”

(on QB Coleman Key)

“At the start of the game we weren’t going to play him unless we felt that we needed him to play. Nick practiced better this week. Coleman has to continue to practice the way we want him to. You have to earn the right to play on Saturdays by the way you work during the week. Coleman Key has a bright future for this football team. I expect him to come back and have a great week this week and be ready to play if his number is called.”

(on Rashard Higgins’ presence on the field)

“When he’s out there he’s a confident guy and he lifts up the whole team. Last year when I would watch games he would make these plays to flip the field and turn the game around. It’s been tough, Rashard has missed some time. He missed a lot of time in spring, fall camp, then he had the foot sprain and really didn’t practice the whole practice until Thursday. He was a little winded tonight, but I think it was good to get him back in the groove. We have a long season, we haven’t even started conference play, but I think we are building to where we’re going to be able to play the way we want to play. First things first is next week against (UT) San Antonio. Rashard needs to have a great week of practice and be ready to go on Saturday.”

(on Nick Stevens’ performance)

“I thought Stevens played well. Anytime you look at the tape you’re going to go back and say that we had a chance on this and that one, but you’re not going to hit every throw and you’re not going to make every correct decision, you have to keep playing. I think it showed a lot of resolve in him and a lot of belief in the offense in him to do that after the pick-six. It would’ve been easy to hang your head. I thought he played confident, I thought he was into the game and got us into the right play, but we have to continue to improve in that position. I think he’s improved from last week. That team we played last week was very good defensively, especially in the secondary, and we knew it was going to be a rough day. We thought we would be able to do a few things tonight which we did, but we just didn’t do enough. We didn’t capitalize on enough opportunities, but that’s football. At the end of the day we still had a chance with the ball in our hands at the end of the game and we didn’t finish. Then we got the ball in overtime and didn’t finish like we need to do to win a ball game.”

(on changes to the offensive line)

“Nick Callender came back this week and we wanted to get Nick in there, he’s very athletic, and (Zack) Golditch at guard improved a bit athletically in size and strength. Last week was a rough week in the middle. I thought our offensive line played better tonight. We still had too many execution issues and some missed assignments that we have to continue to get better at. That happens when you have a new coach, new coaching staff, new offense, and nuance’s here and there. We’re not doing everything we would want to do offensively, but I do think we’re improving and moving in the right direction. Which is hard to say and a tough pill to swallow.”

Junior LB Kevin Davis

(on losing a second consecutive game in overtime)

“Going into overtime twice and losing, it’s hard on us but we have to stay together as a team and get prepared for next week.”

(on what they can take away from the game)

“We have to finish. We have to learn how to finish. Once we get to doing that, we’ll be good.”

(on whether or not he feels the team has regressed after being able to finish games well last season)

“No, not really. It’s not on the coaches, it’s on us and we just have to stay together.”

(on how he feels the defense is playing despite having a 1-2 record)

“There’s still stuff we have to do as a defense. We need to stop them from scoring points.”

(on how they plan on bouncing back after losing games in overtime in consecutive weeks)

“It’s hard but we’re just that much closer to winning so maybe with a little more push from us as a team will get us the W.”

Sophomore QB Nick Stevens

(on losing a rivalry game)

“Any time you lose it definitely hurts, especially in overtime and especially in a rivalry game. Everyone on the field fought for the entire 60 minutes and the overtime period. When you give it your all and it doesn’t pan out for you, it’s tough, but we have to take it how it is, come back next week, and focus on winning the rest of the games.”

(on whether or not he felt he rebounded this week)

“I felt like I played better today than last week and I think the offense moved the ball really well. We didn’t have too much of a lull, and we moved the ball pretty much every drive, we just didn’t finish. The biggest thing is putting points on the board.”

(on whether close losses this year are “payback” for winning close games last year)

“No I don’t think so at all. We’re going to be all right and we need to focus on next week rather than what has happened these past two weeks and I think we can definitely do that.”

(on the offense not finishing drives with points)

“The biggest thing was finishing, even in overtime when you get on offense first, you have to try to score a touchdown so the other team doesn’t have to just kick a field goal. We drove down to the opposite side of the field just about every drive and we just didn’t finish. We have to come out and focus on that next week.”

(on the level of frustration after the game)

“I think everyone is really frustrated. When we went in to overtime, we were saying it wasn’t going to happen twice in a row, but it did. We just have to focus and press on and focus on the next week.”

(on whether or not he felt his receiver was hit early to cause the pick-six)

"I got hit on that play and I looked on the big screen afterwards. It looked like it bounced off of the defender's shoulder up in to the air. I'm not the judge of whether he was early or not. It was definitely tight coverage."

(on whether or not he feels he should have made the throw that turned into the pick-six)

"You just have to take it how it is. Hindsight is 20-20. It definitely wouldn't have happened if I threw it at his feet but at the time with the defender coming from the outside, it looked like he would have been able to turn up field and make a big play. Looking back on it now with that result, obviously not but at the time I thought it was a decent decision. "

(on the missed field goals)

"At the end of the day we wouldn't be in those positions if we moved as an offense and put the ball into the end zone. I think we rushed on some of those third downs and we have to focus on converting and ending the drive with a touchdown and a PAT. That didn't happen, so obviously there is frustration there but I think the special teams have been great the past couple weeks and we just have to put it on our shoulders to do something about that. It's not his (Wyatt Bryan)'s fault."

(on how tough the loss is)

"They're all tough. I think we have to focus on not dwelling on it and come out next week and get the win."

Sophomore RB Dalyn Dawkins

(on his strategy for running the ball in today's game)

"I think just running downhill and getting vertical every chance I got. I think that's what worked best."

(on how tough it was to lose in overtime)

"It makes it even tougher [since] it happened two weeks in a row. Same type of situation. We're not going to give up. We're going to keep going, keep grinding, keep working."

(on the interception CU returned for a touchdown that was intended for him and if the defender hit him early)

"Yeah, he did. But that's alright. You're not going to get every call. That's life. That's football."

(on how it felt to have a great individual game but lose)

"It hurts. It hurts. I was really just hoping that we'd pull it off. We worked. We worked out there every snap, giving it all. I definitely don't doubt any of our guys' effort. It hurts even more because the same thing happened last week, you know, the same type of loss. "

(on what happened momentum-wise after CSU's good start to the game)

"That's why we can never be satisfied. We've just got to keep going, got to keep going. I think we just weren't finishing our drives. We continued to move the ball, we just didn't finish drives."

(on his hamstring injury and if he had a chance to go back in the game)

"Yeah, I was on the sideline working to see if I was going to be able to do it. The thing is, I was able to jog but I just can't sprint. I'll be back next week."

(on his hardworking, quiet mentality)

"All my life, I've always played with a chip on my shoulder. I just knew a lot of people doubt me because of my size, and I've just always worked. I've always worked and grinded because of that. Every day at practice, you know, I go hard because you've got to treat every day like gameday."

Junior WR Rashard Higgins

(on if he felt that him being back on the field brought automatic confidence to the passing game)

“Absolutely. Anytime my presence is being felt, it brings a lot of energy to the team, and I’m glad I can bring that.”

(on not finishing drives)

“We’ve got to score once we get into the redzone. I’m pretty sure Coach knows that. We’ll do a pretty good job of that going into next week.”

(on Dalyn Dawkins’ performance)

“Dalyn Dawkins, man. He’s crazy legs. He’s going to do what he does. Whenever he has the ball in his hands, we’re expecting something big out of him and he showed up today.

(on Dawkins’ impact on the offense)

“It’s a great feeling. Whenever we don’t have to pass the ball, and we can rely on the run game, it’s a great feeling. Dalyn Dawkins and Jasen Oden can provide that.”

(on CSU’s motivation going forward)

“I say, just don’t hang our heads down right now. Everything happens for a reason. We worked the fourth quarter. We’ve been battling. We just came up at the short end of the stick. We’ll get it done.”

(on how he felt during the game)

“I felt good. I’m pretty sure you all saw me out there catching touchdowns. I felt good, man. Finally being back in rhythm. Me and Nick linked up. You all saw it.”

(on if he felt like he had the chance to be a difference-maker at the end of the game)

“You know what, Coach calls the plays and I can only execute what’s called. I’m just doing my job.”

(on how confident he is that the team can stick together going forward)

“I’m confident. Everything happens for a reason, that’s how I believe it. Just going into this next game, we can’t put our heads down. We’ve got to lift each other up. That’s what we’ll do.”

(on if the two straight OT losses give CSU motivation going into next week)

“Absolutely. Just losing the game period, man, brings a lot of fire because we feel like then we’ve got a chip on our shoulder to get a win. We’re going to bring it to the UTSA game.”

(on if he feels like CSU should be 3-0 this season)

“Oh, absolutely, man. I don’t know what it is. We just keep losing in overtime. We’ll find a way to get there.”

(on if it’s harder being so close but losing)

“Yeah, man. It hurts. That blocked field goal man; that hurts. We did all we could. We just came up on the short end of the stick. We never want to lose to a rival. But you know what, life goes on. We’ve got to get prepared for the next game.”

Senior S Trent Matthews

(on the team)

"It kills your joy, your momentum, and makes you wonder what type of team you are. I will tell you this team we have right here is going to stick together we are a family and sometimes things happen to family. As a leader I am going to continue to encourage my teammates because we are a good football team and we are going to be successful."

(on the difference from last year to this year)

"Last year we finished. This year we are not finishing where we are supposed to. Last year we had an electrifying offense, this year we have an electrifying defense. That's the key component for this year and last year. We have the same brotherhood, same logo, same jerseys, and we just could not find a way to win tonight."

(on defense's performance this year despite being 1-2)

"It hurts but I tell you what, when the opponent puts on the film they only have a few choices. Either they are going to play hard or quit. I think we are successful, we are going to be successful in the future because we choose to want to be great. Right now it's dark in the tunnel but our defense and our team we see the light right now. I have to continue to be encouraging, we are going to watch film tomorrow, and see what we can correct. It probably is the little things and at the end of the day you win or you lose, and we lost tonight but we have lots of games to play."

(on losing two consecutive overtime games)

"Some people have fear that we might not win another game, but without fear there isn't courage. I think our team is based off of courage, I think our team is based off of wanting to win, and wanting to be great. We are not going to stop doing that and it can go to overtime every week and we are still going to try and find a way to win. I am going to continue to encourage my team and keep leadership going, and next week we are going to find a way."

(on using the losses as motivation)

"I mean next week, we haven't looked at the film yet. We are going to my hometown, I am a San Antonio native born and raised and I am excited about next week. Right now I am still hurting and we still have a lot to show on offense, defense and special teams. We have a chip on our shoulder and we aren't going to stop till we win."

"It hurts man, two in a row like that, it really hurts. I mean I don't have many words to say but it hurts. "

(on not being able to hold onto the lead)

"Little mistakes, we gave up big plays and we can't have that next week or for the rest of the season."

(on what's next for the team)

"We need to come together, and try to win the rest of the games till the end of the season"

(on his confidence levels)

"We have to keep confident, we have to keep confident and keep up our hope."

(on rivalry games)

"Yes, it hurts worse. I don't know, but it had me crying and I don't cry often. It's tough to lose games during your senior year."

**QUICKLY** CBS College Sports let KOA's **Larry Zimmer** voice the prerecorded opening for the broadcast of the game (Zimmer did his 480th CU football game tonight) ... Colorado sold **31,796** tickets (**7,145** student) for the game, CSU sold 31,601 and the Broncos 2,856; keep in mind 30% of CU's season ticket holders opted not to take their tickets for the game and received an equal value in number for a Pac-12 game (and yet most of the difference was made up by single game sales) ... Colorado is now **7-2** in non-conference games under Mike MacIntyre (2-1 vs. CSU), and the Buffs now lead the series **63-22-2** (**9-6** in Denver) ... CU has won two games in a row for the first time since Mac's first two games in Boulder (2013); CU will be going for three straight for the first time since the first three games of the 2008 season ... CSU opened the scoring 7:13 into the game, snapping a **49:35** scoreless run by the CU defense—the longest since the 2010 opener when Colorado held CSU scoreless the first 50:24 (and a 57:07 run counting the

'09 finale) ... With **two** interceptions tonight, CU has **five** on the year in three games (after having just three in all of 2014) ...

**OVERTIME** Colorado is now **6-7** in overtime games (2-0 versus CSU); CU snaps a three-game losing streak in OT games. Both OT games against CSU were won on field goals after CU made a defensive stop (Terrence Wheatley INT in 2007 in a 31-28 win; Kevin Eberhart kicked the game winner then; tonight S Tedric Thompson blocked a field goal before Diego Gonzalez' kick).

**COMEBACK** Colorado rallied from **14** points down for the win, tying its eighth largest comeback in its history; it eclipsed its largest deficit ever against the Rams to come back for a victory: in 1988, CSU jumped out to a 13-0 lead early in the second quarter but the Buffs rallied for a 27-23 win (on a Sal Aunese-to-Mike Pritchard 13-yard TD pass with 0:38 left).

**NICE HABIT** For the second straight game, CU did not commit a turnover or allow a quarterback sack – now **18** times in its history (CU is **16-2** in those games). It was the sixth game under MacIntyre that CU did not turn the ball over (4-2) and the 74th dating back to 1946 when records are available (49-21-4).

## INDIVIDUAL LINER NOTES

► **OLB Kenneth Olugbode (INT/TD)**. He had the first interception of his career and returned it 60 yards for a touchdown... on his 20th birthday (Sept. 19). It was CU's first INT return for a touchdown since Sept. 7, 2013 (Jered Bell 78 yards versus Central Arkansas). *CU's last defensive touchdown was later in the season (fumble return against USC, also by Bell).*

► **WR Nelson Spruce (6-63)** moved into fourth place all-time in receiving yards with 2,490; he is now 59 yards shy of the top spot (he added to his all-time lead in receptions with 225). He had been 4-of-4 for 71 yards and 3 TDs passing before throwing his first career incomplection.

► **QB Sefo Liufau (28-15-0, 220, 2 TD)** moved into fifth place in all-time passing yards with 5,523 (skipping by Koy Detmer's 5,390), and passed Darian Hagan into fifth all-time in total offense with 5,831 (Hagan had 5,808).

► **CB Ken Crawley**. He made his third career interception in the second quarter, his first since his sophomore season (when he two, the last against California); he went 16 games between picks.

► **PK Diego Gonzalez (3-3 PAT, 2-4 FG)**. He made his first five field goals of his career, including his long of 52, until the blocked attempt near the end of the half. He hit the 32-yard game winner to join Mason Crosby (vs. Kansas, 2003), Kevin Eberhart (vs. CSU, 2007) and Aric Goodman (vs. West Virginia, 2008) to kick winning field goals in overtime for the Buffs.

► **WR Shay Fields (3-79, 1 TD)**. He made the second longest reception of his career (65 yards for a TD in the second quarter); his longest was a 75-yard TD pass, also from Sefo Liufau, to open last year's game at Arizona.

► **WR Devin Ross (2-36, 1 TD)**. He had his first career touchdown catch, a 24-yard pass from Sefo Liufau in the third quarter.

► **SS Tedric Thompson** had CU's first block of an opponent field goal since Sept. 4, 2010, when DE Will Pericak blocked one late in the first half against CSU. It was the first blocked kick of any kind in the MacIntyre Era, as CU's last blocked kick was by Nate Bonsu against Arizona State in Boulder in 2012.

► **P Alex Kinney (7-39.1, 3 In20)**. The freshman had his best game to date, and minus two kicks inside CSU territory, he averaged 42.0 on five kicks.

### NOTES – Colorado State vs. Colorado

Saturday, Sept. 19, 2015

---

- The overtime game was CSU's second in a row and fifth in school history. It marked the second time that the Rocky Mountain Showdown has gone into overtime (2007).
- Saturday's attendance of 66,253 was the largest in the Showdown since 2008 (69,619). A total of 31,601 tickets were distributed by CSU, 31,796 by CU and 2,856 through the Denver Broncos.
- Of the six neutral-site games in the NCAA FBS in 2015 thus far, the Rocky Mountain Showdown's attendance ranks third (Auburn/Louisville in Atlanta, Ga., 73,927; Texas A&M/Arizona State in Houston, Texas, 66,308; Colorado State/Colorado in Denver, Colo., 66,253; Wisconsin/Alabama in Arlington, Texas, 64,279; Tennessee/Bowling Green, Nashville, Tenn., 61,323; South Carolina/North Carolina, Charlotte, N.C., 51,664).
- Statistically, CSU's offense put up more yards (500 to 345), first downs (27 to 18), rushing yards (218 to 125) and passing yards (282 to 220).
- CSU has now had 170 or more rushing yards in all three games this season. The Rams totaled 218 yards, led by 118 by Dalyn Dawkins (5.9 per carry) and 80 by Jasen Oden, Jr. (3.2).
- Dawkins rushed 20 times for a career-most 118 yards and caught six passes for 59 yards, becoming the first CSU player since Raymond Carter on Sept. 25, 2010 to have more than 100 rushing yards and 50 receiving yards in the same game.
- Nine different Rams caught at least one pass.
- Junior WR Rashard Higgins led all players with eight catches for 125 yards, including a first-half touchdown catch and a 37-yard reception in the second half.
- The Rams limited the Buffs to 3-of-13 on third down. Conversely, CSU converted 8-of-18 third-down attempts.
- Junior LB Kevin Davis led CSU with nine tackles, including a career-high-tying 1.5 for loss. Both TFL came on the same drive when CU was deep in CSU territory late in the second quarter.
- Senior S Trent Matthews and senior LB Cory James each finished with eight tackles. Matthews was one tackle shy of his career high, while James was two.
- CSU had the ball on CU's side of the field 11 times, but could only score on four of the drives.
- The Rams' opening score marked the first time since 2012 that CSU has scored first in the Rocky Mountain Showdown (22-17 win). CSU has scored first in all three games this season.
- The 10-play, 52-yard scoring drive took 5:18 of the clock, CSU's longest scoring drive of the season. Entering the game, the Rams had been using an average of 1:31 over 14 scores.
- CSU took a two-score lead to begin the Showdown for the first time since 2009, when it led 17-0 (23-17 win in Boulder).
- CSU's 14-10 halftime lead was the first time since 2009 that the Rams held the lead at halftime.
- Higgins' first-quarter touchdown catch was the second in as many games this season. For his career, the junior has 25 touchdowns (school record) in 15 different games.
- Higgins has now made at least one reception in all 28 games he has played in during his career.
- Saturday marked the fifth time in the past eight games that CSU has had a rusher and receiver over 100 yards.
- Sophomore WR Deionte Gaines returned the game's opening kickoff for 51 yards, the second-longest kickoff return of his career (61, Oct. 25, 2014 vs. Wyoming).
- Dawkins' 13-yard touchdown run in the first quarter marked the second consecutive game that he has scored the game's opening points.

- Following a Ken Crawley interception, CU started its final drive at the CSU 35. The Rams recorded three tackles for loss on the drive, with it ending with a blocked field-goal attempt (36 yards) by junior Preston Hodges. It was CSU's first blocked field goal since Oct. 25, 2014 vs. Wyoming.
- QB Nick Stevens started the game 8-for-9 for 79 yards, including completions to six different receivers. The sophomore finished with 25-of-39 for 282 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions.
- Dawkins' third-quarter, 42-yard rush was CSU's second-longest play from scrimmage this season (49; Coleman Key to Joe Hansley vs. Minnesota).
- All 68 yards from CSU's field-goal drive to start the third quarter were on the ground (9 attempts).
- CSU punted just three times, averaging 44.3 yards per punt.
- After CSU took an early 14-0 lead, CU responded with the game's next 17 points.
- Senior DL Terry Jackson made his season debut after missing the first two games with concussion-like symptoms. He recorded one tackle.
- CSU's captains were DeAndre Elliott, Joe Hansley, Joe Kawulok and Eric Williams.
- CSU is sad to share the news that the 24th sheep to serve as CSU's CAM mascot died Saturday morning. He was an older Rambouillet ram, 6 years old. The ram on the sidelines Saturday was a 6-month-old Rambouillet.
