2013 NFFCC NEWS & NOTES

ADAMS STATE UNIVERSITY (1-0, 0-0 RMAC)

Team Notes: Adams State started their season with a 44-0 win over Wayland Baptist. The Grizzlies will play their second non-conference game of the season at Oklahoma Panhandle State.

COLORADO MESA UNIVERSITY (1-0, 0-0 RMAC)

Team Notes: Colorado Mesa posted a shutout season opening win at home on Saturday over Menlo College, 44-0. They will travel to Montana State on Saturday.

COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES (1-0, 0-0 RMAC)

Matt Brown (Junior, Quarterback, 6-3, 205, Limon, Colo./Limon)

Brown led the Colorado School of Mines offense during its season-opening 72-6 win over South Dakota Mines on Saturday at Campbell Field in Golden. The Limon native registered 473 yards of total offense in just two-plus quarters of action, including 401 yards through the air on 37-of-51 passing with three touchdowns. He also carried 12 times for 72 yards and three more scores for a total of six touchdowns on the day. Brown was a major cog in Mines' school-record 108-play, 727-yard offensive output in the victory.

Team Notes: The Colorado School of Mines football team opened up its season with a bang on Saturday after recording a school-record 727 yards of offense and tying a 40-year old NCAA Division II record with 42 first downs. Junior quarterback Matt Brown led the Colorado School of Mines offense during its season-opening 72-6 win over South Dakota Mines on Saturday at Campbell Field in Golden. The Limon native registered 473 yards of total offense in just two-plus quarters of action, including 401 yards through the air on 37-of-51 passing with three touchdowns. He also carried 12 times for 72 yards and three more scores for a total of six touchdowns on the day. Sophomore backup Joe Schneider finished 16-of-23 for 119 yards and two scores during the second half. Junior running back Tevin Champagne totaled 84 all-purpose yards and added a rushing score as well. Sophomore wideout Jimmy Ellis led the receiving corps with 10 catches for 104 yards, while redshirt freshman Ty Young added six catches for 79 yards and two touchdowns. Senior Jordan Ward scored once on five receptions with 75 yards and Alex Waner and Diamond Gillis each added a score through the air as well. The Mines defensive unit was swarming all day in registering 9.0 tackles for loss and holding SDSMT to just 195 yards, including just 30 on the ground. The Orediggers improved to 7-7 all-time in season openers under head coach Bob Stitt with the win. Mines will host 17th-ranked Carson-Newman on Saturday, September 14, at Campbell Field in Golden in the Boulder Broker Classic.

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY (0-2, 0-0 MWC)

Jordon Vaden (R-Freshman, Wide Receiver, 6-3, 185, Henderson, Colo./Prairie View HS)

In his first career start and only his second collegiate game, Vaden hauled in receptions of 52 and 19 yards (touchdown). The three receptions, 80 yards and one touchdown are all career-highs.

National Football Foundation - Colorado Chapter Player of the Week

Team Notes: CSU-Pueblo faced Northern Colorado in its first ever game against an NCAA FCS opponent, coming away with the 41-36 win. The victory was its first ever against Northern Colorado, entering the game 0-11-2 all time against the Bears. The win marked the Pack's sixth-straight season-opening win.

FORT LEWIS COLLEGE (0-1, 0-0 RMAC)

Jamal Campbell (Senior, Defensive Back, 5-11, 180, Stockton, Calif./Lincoln HS)

Campbell recorded a game high 10 tackles in a 49-0 setback to Division I Southern Utah University. Eight of his tackles were solo stops.

UNITED STATES AIR FORCE ACADEMY (1-1, 0-1 MWC)

Team Notes: Air Force suffered a 52-20 setback in their Mountain West Conference opener on Saturday against Utah State. The Falcons will play their first road game of the season this Friday night at Boise State.

UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO (2-0, 0-0 PAC-12)

Jered Bell (Junior, Free Safety, 6-1, 195, Ontario, Calif./Colony HS)

Bell played all 81 snaps on defense and recorded eight tackles (seven solo), one shy of his career-high; but it was his second career interception that turned the momentum back to Colorado: four minutes into the fourth quarter with Central Arkansas ahead 24-17 and driving after making an interception of their own, Bell perfectly read the play coming in his direction and picked the ball off at the CU 21 and raced 79 yards for the tying touchdown.

Team Notes: CB Greg Henderson now has two return touchdowns this year (including 53-yard fumble return for a score against CSU last week). WR Paul Richardson recorded 11 catches for 209 yards and two touchdowns. The 11 receptions tie the school record for most in a game, and his 209 yards marked the fifth 200-yard receiving game in school history, the first two in back-to-back games.

UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN COLORADO (1-1, 0-0 BSC)

Team Notes: Northern Colorado fell to CSU-Pueblo Saturday afternoon, 41-36, at home. The Golden Bears will hit the road this weekend when they face Wyoming on Saturday at 2 p.m.

WESTERN STATE COLORADO UNIVERSITY (0-1, 0-0 RMAC)

Team Notes: Western State lost 21-48 to visiting West Texas A&M Saturday afternoon. The Mountaineers will face Idaho State on the road on Saturday.
