K-STATE HOSTS COLORADO ON HOMECOMING

WILDCATS AND BUFFALOES MEET IN EARLY FOX COLLEGE SPORTS BROADCAST

Kansas State, which currently sits atop the Big 12 North standings after a dominating win over Texas A&M, continues its current homestand Saturday at 11:30 a.m. with a Big 12 North showdown against the Colorado Buffaloes. The matchup with Colorado will cap Homecoming weekend at K-State as alumni from across the country descend on Manhattan for the weekend.

The game will be televised live for the second consecutive week by Fox College Sports as Dan McLaughlin, Yogi Roth and Samantha Steele will have the call. A live audio broadcast is also available across the K-State Sports Network, online at www.k-statesports.com and on SIRIUS satellite radio channel 147. Wyatt Thompson will call the action with Stan Weber serving as the color analyst and Matt Walters providing sideline updates.

K-State and Colorado, both coming off big conference wins last weekend, will be meeting for the 65th time overall on Saturday as the Buffaloes hold a 44-19-1 advantage in the all-time series. Under head coach Bill Snyder, the Wildcats are 5-11-1 against the Buffaloes and 7-6 during the Big 12 era.

A QUICK LOOK AT THE WILDCATS

K-State will look to ride the momentum from an impressive 62-14 win over Texas A&M last week and improve upon its 3-0 record at home in 2009 on Saturday.

The Wildcats continue to get solid play at the running back position as Daniel Thomas is coming off a 91-yard, four-touchdown performance against the Aggies, all of which came in the first half. The league's third-leading rusher, Thomas has found the endzone eight times this season and currently leads the Big 12 in rushing touchdowns in league games with four. Quarterback Grant Gregory is coming off a very efficient game against the Aggies in which he was 10-of-13 for 147 yards and a touchdown with 33 yards on the ground as well.

The Wildcat defense was the story of last week's win over Texas A&M as the unit shut down one of the league's top offenses. K-State, with six sacks last week, doubled its season total to 12 and picked off Aggie quarterback Jerrod Johnson three times after he had set a new Big 12 record for consecutive pass attempts without throwing an interception. Jeffrey Fitzgerald, John Houlik and Joshua Moore led the defense last weekend as Fitzgerald had 2.5 sacks, forced a fumble and recovered another, Houlik had 3.5 tackles for loss and a breakup and Moore had three breakups, an interception and 1.5 TFL's.

A LOOK AT THE OPPONENT

Colorado heads into Saturday's matchup with a 2-4 overall record and a 1-1 mark in Big 12 Conference play after its big 34-30 win over Kansas last week. The Buffs have been among the Big 12's best in stopping the run in conference play and have seemed to find some rhythm offensively with quarterback Tyler Hansen. Colorado has yielded just 38 total rushing yards in its two Big 12 contests, which includes holding Kansas to -8 yards on the ground last week.

Rodney Stewart has led the offense with 418 yards rushing and five touchdowns, while Hansen has completed 17-of-30 passes on the season and also poses a threat running the ball. Scotty McKnight leads the receivers with 35 catches for 370 yards and three scores. On defense, Colorado is paced by Jeff Smart's 46 tackles, while Marquez Herrod's 4.5 sacks and 7.0 tackles for loss leads the defense and Jalil Brown has six breakups and two interceptions in the secondary.

HOMECOMING ACTIVITIES

K-State hosts Colorado Saturday in the annual celebration of Homecoming in Manhattan. Wildcat Frontier: K-State Homecoming 2009 will be highlighted by events such as the All-University Homecoming Philanthropy 5K Race (10 a.m. Sunday), Pant the Chant (8 p.m. Monday in Bramlage Coliseum), Paint the 'Ville (10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday in Aggieville), Wildcat Request Live lip sync competition (8 p.m. Wednesday at Bramlage Coliseum), Children's Carnival (6 p.m. Thursday at the K-State Union) and Homecoming Parade and Pep Rally at 5 p.m. Friday in Aggieville. WHAT A TURNAROUND

K-State's 62-14 win over Texas A&M was impressive in all three phases of the game. A week after dropping a 66-14 contest at Texas Tech, the Cats responded with a 100-point turnaround from being defeated by 52 points to winning by 48. In fact, the 100-point differential is the largest in school history in consecutive games as the next closest was a 92-point difference in 1999 after the Nebraska and Missouri games.

AGAINST THE NORTH

K-State will look for its third straight win (second this season) against a north division opponent on Saturday. The Wildcats are 42-24 (.631) vs. division opponents since 1996, which is second to only Nebraska among Big 12 North schools.

PAPER OR PLASTIC

Kansas State had collected just six total sacks heading into last weekend's game against Texas A&M. But, with the front seven having its best overall outing of the year last week, the unit sacked Aggie quarterback Jerrod Johnson six times on the evening, 2.5 by Jeffrey Fitzgerald, doubling its season total to 12. The sack total was the most in a game since also recording six total sacks in 2006 against Iowa State.

TURN IT OVER

Kansas State was ranked 61st nationally in turnover margin heading into last weekend's game against Texas A&M, after forcing six turnovers (three interceptions and three fumbles), the Wildcats moved all the way up to No. 24 in this week's national rankings. The six turnovers forced were the most in a game since forcing Baylor into seven turnovers back in 2007. Also, the three interceptions were noteworthy as A&M quarterback Jerrod Johnson had not thrown an interception all season leading up to last week and also had set a Big 12 record for consecutive pass attempts without a pick.

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES

Kansas State has put an emphasis on defensive improvement in 2009 after the Wildcats finished towards the bottom of the NCAA rankings a year ago; and after seven games this season, the Cats are well on their way to being one of the most improved units in all of college football.

After averaging nearly 218 yards rushing allowed and 261 yards passing a year ago, K-State has held its opponents to just 339.4 total yards a game, 233.0 through the air and 106.4 on the ground. The numbers through seven games compared to last year are more impressive as the Cats have surrendered nearly 100 less total yards a game. The Cats rank fifth in the Big 12 in total defense, sixth in rushing defense and seventh in passing defense.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

Through seven games this season, K-State's defense has done a masterful job of holding its opponent and getting its offense back on the field. The Cats have forced their opponents into 21 three-and-outs, including five against Texas A&M and four each against Louisiana, Tennessee Tech and Iowa State, but what is more impressive is that K-State has held opponents to six plays or less (without scoring) on 57 drives this season. Also, the Wildcats have allowed 26 plays of 20 or more yards this season after surrendering a whopping 75 all of last season (33 through the first seven games).

GROUND GAINS ON DEFENSE

K-State's rush defense has yielded just 106.4 yards on the ground this season and held both Texas A&M (-13 yards) and Tennessee Tech (-19) to negative rushing yards, the fewest surrendered since the 2002 Baylor game (-37). Also, the two negative rushing performances were the fourth (-19) and seventh (-13) lowest totals allowed in a game this season in the nation.

GROUND GAINS ON OFFENSE

Kansas State's controlled running game this season has been led by running backs Daniel Thomas and Keithen Valentine as the duo has combined for 995 yards (5.4 yards a carry and 142.1 yards per game) in seven games. Valentine has quietly averaged a Big-12-best 8.1 yards a carry, while Thomas has been the workhorse for the Wildcat offensive attack.

GRINDING IT OUT

Kansas State has shown the ability to grind it out offensively through seven games as the Wildcats have collected 132 first downs and averaged 184.0 rushing yards a game. Of K-State's 27 scoring drives this season, 16 have covered 50 or more yards and eight have consisted of 10 or more plays. Because of the consistent rushing attack and the ability to sustain drives, K-State has possessed the ball for an average of 34:41 per game this season, a figure that currently ranks first in the Big 12 and second in the nation.

LIGHT UP THE BOARD

Kansas State's offensive outbreak against Texas A&M ranks as one of the top scoring performances by a Bill Snyder-coached team and in school history. The 62 points scored last week were the most against a Big 12 South opponent under Snyder and were the most in a conference game since scoring 64 points at Kansas in 2002. Also, K-State's 38 points in the first half tied for the second-most in a Big 12 Conference game. The Cats also scored 38 in a half against Kansas in 2000.

SNYDER AMONG BEST ACTIVE COACHES

The author of the greatest turnaround in college football history, Bill Snyder has begun his second tour of duty guiding Kansas State. And, despite enduring two losing seasons at the end of his first tenure and a three-year hiatus, Snyder's work still ranks among the best in college football when compared to other active coaches. Snyder, who currently ranks 14th all-time in wins among active FBS coaches, is one of just two active BCS coaches who have served at the same school for at least 17 years and have never held the same position at another school as he shares that distinction with Joe Paterno of Penn State. Also, Snyder holds the 12th-best winning percentage among active FBS coaches with 100 wins.

What might be even more amazing is that Snyder, despite the three-year layoff, has tallied the sixth-most victories among active coaches since 1990. Snyder has guided Kansas State to 139 victories since the 1990 season, only to be out-done by the likes of Mack Brown, Bobby Bowden, Frank Beamer, Joe Paterno and Steve Spurrier.

SNYDER IN OCTOBER

Fast starts propelled the Wildcats to winning seasons throughout the Bill Snyder's era at K-State. The Wildcats' success in the month of September under Snyder is well-documented and K-State has also been a solid team in October under Snyder. Since the inception of the Big 12 Conference, K-State is 26-19 (.578) in October under the legendary head coach.

Kansas State extended one of the nation's longest scoring streaks last week against Texas A&M. The Wildcats have now tallied points in 159 consecutive games. The 159-game stretch is the 10th-longest streak in the nation after Colorado and Washington State - who each held a spot in the top 10 - were blanked in a game last season. The Wildcats have not been kept off the scoreboard since Colorado shutout K-State, 12-0, on Nov. 16, 1996. In the Big 12, only Nebraska (169 games) owns a longer streak than the Cats.

HOME SWEET HOME

Few teams in college football have taken care of their home field as well as the Wildcats since the start of the 1990 season. Over the past 18 years, K-State is an amazing 104-23-1 (.816) when playing at Bill Snyder Family Stadium, including a 50-17-1 mark (.743) in league games (combined Big 8/Big 12).

ON THE TUBE

Saturday's game against Colorado will mark Kansas State's sixth overall appearance this season on television. The game will be the Wildcats' 117th television appearance all-time as Kansas State is 59-57 (.509) when playing on television, including a 2-3 mark this season. A little history regarding K-State football and television: Kansas State's homecoming contest on October 28, 1939, against Nebraska became the second college football game ever televised, following the Fordham-Waynesburg contest in New York earlier that fall. The Cornhuskers spoiled homecoming with a 25-9 triumph in Manhattan before a limited Nebraska ETV audience in the surrounding area.

DRAWING FIRST BLOOD

Scoring first has been a big sign of good things to come for the Wildcats. Since 1990, K-State's record when scoring first is very impressive as the Wildcats have gone 121-22 (85-percent) when drawing first blood. This season, the Wildcats are 3-1 when getting on the board first.

HALFWAY HOME

There's no better indicator of a Wildcat victory than when K-State leads or is tied at the half. Since 1990, the Cats have protected a halftime lead 96-percent of the time, going 136-5 when leading at halftime. This season, K-State is 3-0 when leading at the halfway mark.

VERY SPECIAL TEAMS

The rise of Kansas State football over the last two decades has much to do with the emphasis on special teams. Since 1990, Kansas State is 42-13 when scoring on special teams and 16-1 when scoring on special teams and on defense. And, in non-offensive touchdowns, the Wildcats have ranked among the nation's best over the past 10 seasons. Since 1999, the Wildcats rank second nationally in non-offensive touchdowns with 72, behind only Virginia Tech (76). Kansas State currently has four non-offensive touchdowns in 2009 as Brandon Banks has a Big 12-best three kick returns for scores and Jeffrey Fitzgerald had a 17-yard interception return for a touchdown at Texas Tech.

BLOCK PARTY

Kansas State's play on special teams has been unparalleled since 1990 as the Cats have the fourth-most blocks in the nation since 2002 with 36, which includes a school-record-tying nine total blocks last season (four punts, two extra points and three field goals) and three (one punt, one field goal and one PAT) this season, two of which have come from safety Emmanuel Lamur. Also, Kansas State has amassed 52 total blocked kicks since 1996 and currently ranks second among Big 12 schools, behind Texas, in total blocks in the 13-year history of the league.

IRONMAN

It has been evident through the first half of the season that a majority of the Wildcat offense has been designed to utilize the athleticism of running back Daniel Thomas. Thomas, a former junior-college quarterback, has 164 touches (145 rushes, 17 receptions, 2 passes) which equates to 34.0-percent of K-State's 482 offensive plays.

RUNNING WILD

Daniel Thomas has done most of his damage on the ground as he is second in the Big 12 with 669 rushing yards on a conference-high 145 attempts. Thomas, who is 25th nationally in rushing yards per game, is seventh in the country in rushing attempts. When you also add in his 17 receptions for 187 yards, Thomas is fifth in the Big 12 in all-purpose yardage at 125.9 yards per game. Thomas' season was jump-started by a consecutive 100-yard rushing games against UMass and Louisiana, the first time since Cornelius Davis in 1966 that a Wildcat had back-to-back 100-yard rushing games to start a career.

SCORING MACHINE

Running back Daniel Thomas moved into elite status against Texas A&M as he was a vital part in the Wildcats' rout of the Aggies. Thomas, who entered the game with four rushing touchdowns, scored four touchdowns on the ground - all in the first half. His four rushing touchdowns tied for second in school history as he became the sixth player (seventh occurrence) to register four or more rushing scores in a game. Even more impressive is that his four rushing scores were the most in the Big 12 this season, as well as the fourth best in the nation.

OFF TO THE RACES

Last season, Brandon Banks was known as the small, shifty wide receiver that collected over 1,000 receiving yards. This season, Banks is becoming known as the versatile athlete who can make a significant contribution on special teams as well.

Banks exploded with returns of 91 and 92 yards for scores against Tennessee Tech, setting a school and Big 12 record for kickoff return touchdowns in a single game. Also, Banks tied the NCAA Division I-A record, becoming the 12th player (13th time) to return two kickoffs for scores in a single game.

Banks came back to return a kickoff 97 yards for a touchdown against Texas A&M to set the school and Big 12 record for kickoff-return touchdowns in a season, while he tied the conference record with four in a career. The Garner, N.C., native's 29.6-yard average on kickoff returns currently ranks first in school and Big 12 history.

ALL-PURPOSE PLAYER

When you add his receiving number to his kickoff return yards, Brandon Banks also ranks as one of the best players in school history in all-purpose yardage. Banks, who is second in the Big 12 and 10th nationally in the category, currently ranks second in school history in all-purpose yardage per game (155.1), while he needs just 56 yards to tie for 10th in a career. Also, Banks' current 173.1-yard mark this season currently ranks third in school history.

Against the Tennessee Tech, Banks had 303 all-purpose yards, the fifth-most in school history and the most since Darren Sproles notched the school record of 351 on September 18, 2004, against Louisiana.

TWO-YEAR CAREER

Even though Brandon Banks will only play two seasons in a Wildcat uniform, he will crack the career receiving charts in many categories. Banks, who is tied for 10th in school history in career touchdowns, is 15th in career receiving yardage at 1,403. If Banks continues his 50.6-yard average per game, he will end his career with 1,656 yards, which would rank ninth in school history. Banks also has 97 career receptions, just four away from the top 10.

CAREER MILESTONE

Senior tight end Jeron Mastrud, who is on the watch list for the Mackey Award, is turning out to be one of the best tight ends in school history. Against Massachusetts in the 2009 opener, Mastrud became the third tight end in school history to top the 1,000-yard receiving mark in a career. The Beaverton, Ore., native, who is 18th at Kansas State in career receiving yardage, moved to second on the tight end list against Texas A&M. He now sets his sights on the all-time tight end receiving record as he is 183 yards behind Henry Childs for the record.

HARD WORK OFF THE FIELD

Not only does Jeron Mastrud produce on the field, but he also produces off. The senior tight end, who was an Academic All-Big 12, All-District and All-American selection in 2008, was named a candidate for the Allstate/American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Good Works Team prior to the season, which honors college football players who make outstanding contributions in the areas of volunteerism and civic involvement. Mastrud added to his candidacy as he was named a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy. Formerly known as the Draddy Trophy, the Campbell Trophy is presented to the player with the best combination of academics, community service, and on-field performance, thus being considered the "Academic Heisman Trophy."

MR. CONSISTENT

Jeron Mastrud, a team captain and player representative, leads by example as he is one of the most consistent players on K-State's roster. Mastrud, who has played in all 43 games in a Wildcat uniform, has been productive game-in and game-out as he has caught a pass in each of the past 23 games, dating back to Nov. 3, 2007, against Iowa State. Since 1990, only two other K-State players have a streak longer than Mastrud's, but both were wide receivers.

Mastrud carded his 100th and 101st career receptions against Texas A&M to move into 10th place in career receptions. But, his 101 receptions are the most by a tight end in school history.

HUMAN BULLDOZER

Kansas State is tied for second in the Big 12 in rushing at 184.0 yards per game and, although he only has four carries on the season, fullback Braden Wilson has a large part to do with the potent Wildcats rushing attack. The true freshman has played in all seven games, including one start, and has been a lead blocker for a majority of K-State's rushing plays.

He has been valuable to running backs Daniel Thomas and Keithen Valentine, who have combined for 77-percent of the Wildcats' rushing yards and 60-percent of the total carries. Wilson has eight rushing yards this season, but has also caught three passes out of the backfield for 29 yards, including an 18-yarder against Texas A&M.

PICK ME

Backup quarterback turned starting safety Tysyn Hartman did not have an interception or a pass break up in 2008, but has made up for it in 2009. Hartman has intercepted four passes this season to rank third in the Big 12 and 11th nationally. The Wichita, Kan., product also has a total of nine passes defended, which is fifth in the conference and 17th in the NCAA. Hartman had his season jump started by picking off two passes and breaking up two others against Massachusetts. He also recorded interceptions against Tennessee Tech and Texas A&M.

Hartman is also second on the team in tackles with 32, including a season-high seven stops at Louisiana.

GIVING THEM FITZ

Senior defensive lineman Jeffrey Fitzgerald sat through a lost year of eligibility in 2008 after transferring from Virginia, but has made up for his lost time in 2009 as he has a team-high 7.0 tackles-for-loss and 4.5 sacks. In the season opener against UMass, Fitzgerald recorded K-State's first sack of the season, which was his first sack since his last game with UVa in the Gator Bowl on Jan. 1, 2008.

Fitzgerald has been nearly unstoppable in Big 12 play as he has 4.5 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks against conference foes. His 3.5 sacks in Big 12 play are second in the league. He did most of his damage last week against Texas A&M as he had 2.5 sacks.

The Richmond, Va., native showed his versatility at Texas Tech when he returned a 17-yard interception for a touchdown. It marked the first pick-six for the Wildcats this season and the first interception by a defensive lineman since Brandon Balkcom intercepted Texas Tech in Manhattan last year. And, although he is a defensive lineman, the interception was old hat for Fitzgerald as he picked off four passes during his time at Virginia.

"AIR" LAMUR

Junior-college transfer Emmanuel Lamur has been vital to the Wildcats' resurgence on defense this season as he is tops on the team with 36 tackles. He has been aggressive from his safety spot as he has at least five tackles in six of the first seven games, including a career-high seven stops against Iowa State.

Lamur has also skied twice this season to block to field goals, including a potential game-tying extra point against Iowa State. The Cyclones scored a touchdown with 32 seconds left in the game to pull within one, but Lamur jumped straight up to block the extra point and seal the one-point victory for the Cats. Lamur also blocked a 43-yard field-goal attempt by Massachusetts in the 2009 season opener.

MOORE CONSISTENT

Junior defensive back Joshua Moore is harassing Big 12 quarterbacks for the second-straight season as he has recorded nine passes defended his season, including six in conference play, to tie for fifth in the Big 12 overall and tied for third in conference play. His nine passes defended are also 17th best in the nation.

Last week against Texas A&M, Moore tallied a career-high four passes defended, including one interception. In 2008, Moore he recorded 15 passes defended, which were tops in the Big 12 and tied for 13th nationally.

LOCKDOWN CORNER

Stephen Harrison walked on to Kansas State in 2006 as a wide receiver and did not see the field in each of his first three seasons. In 2009, Harrison switched positions to defensive back and, not only is he receiving playing time, the Dallas, Texas, product has started the first three conference games.

Harrison has made the most of his opportunity as he has two passes defended in each of the last three games to bring his total to seven this season. His seven passes defended are tied for seventh in the Big 12 and 23rd nationally, while his six break ups against Big 12 competition is tied for third in the conference.

MANHATTAN, Kan. - Carson Coffman tossed a pair of touchdowns to senior wide receiver Attrail Snipes to help Kansas State to a 21-17 win over Massachusetts before a season-opening record crowd of 50,750 on Saturday night at Bill Snyder Family Stadium.

Coffman, who was making his starting debut for the Wildcats, completed 14-of-27 passes for 182 yards and a career-high two touchdowns to go with another score on the ground. He connected on a 40-yard strike to Snipes with 5:34 play in the second quarter for his first touchdown pass of the season. He followed with a second to Snipes right before the half with a 12-yard bullet.

Coffman got plenty of help from the running game, as backs Daniel Thomas and Keithen Valentine helped the squad post its highest rushing total (225) since collecting 262 yards against Missouri on October 21, 2006. Thomas, making his debut in a Wildcat uniform, rushed for 104 yards on 23 carries. The 104 yards were the most by a K-State running back in a debut since 1993. Valentine added 89 yards on 11 touches.

Down 3-0 to UMass after one quarter of play, the Wildcat offense grabbed the lead on a one-yard touchdown run by Coffman to cap an eight-play drive. Thomas and Valentine both had key runs on the drive, including a 34-yard scamper by Valentine to put the Wildcats in scoring range at the UMass 6.

A field goal block by Emmanuel Lamur set up the Wildcats' next score, as Coffman and company drove 74 yards on five plays capped by the 40-yard pass to Snipes. A blocked punt by Chris Carney set up the final score of the second quarter. Coffman guided the Wildcats to the end zone on just two plays, first a 28-yard pass to Brandon Banks and then the 12-yard strike to Snipes.

Trailing 21-3 at the half, UMass made a near comeback with two second-half touchdowns, both set up by K-State miscues.

Kyle Havens turned the first turnover-a muffed punt by Brandon Banks- into on a 4-yard touchdown pass to Andrew Krevis late in the third quarter. On K-State's next drive, D.J. Adeoba scooped up Jeremy Horne's blocked punt and rumbled 26 yards for a touchdown to get the Minutemen within four.

LAFAYETTE, La. - Tyler Albrecht's first career field goal attempt was a memorable one as the junior nailed a 48-yarder with 32 seconds left to give Louisiana-Lafayette a 17-15 victory over Kansas State on Saturday night.

Albrecht did not attempt a field goal in his first two seasons and was limited to six extra points in a season-opening 42-19 victory over Southern last week.

The Ragin' Cajuns, unbeaten through their first two games for the first time since 1990, trailed 15-14 before driving from their 33 to the Kansas State 30. Louisiana-Lafayette had only two first downs in the second half before quarterback Chris Masson completed four passes for 30 yards in the final drive.

Kansas State (1-1) rallied from a 14-2 deficit with two fourth-quarter touchdowns.

Wildcats running back Daniel Thomas threw for one score and ran for one in that quarter, throwing a 3-yard jump pass to Jeron Mastrud off a direct snap on the first play of the final quarter.

Seven minutes later, Thomas capped an 86-yard drive with a 3-yard run, and Josh Cherry hit the extra point for the 15-14 lead with 8:08 left.

Thomas finished with 136 rushing yards, 92 in the second half.

The Wildcats took a 2-0 lead when Masson ran out of his own end zone after a bad snap with 2:43 left in the opening quarter.

Masson, who finished 20-for-36 for 185 yards, came back to guide the Ragin' Cajuns on a 61-yard drive that was capped by Undrea Sails' 9-yard touchdown run with 9:37 left in the first half.

Louisiana-Lafayette drove 73 yards in the final 2:19 of the half to take a 14-2 halftime lead on Masson's 1-yard pass to Luke Aubrey.

The Ragin' Cajuns had three first-half turnovers, but the Wildcats couldn't take advantage despite having five first-half possessions in Ragin' Cajun territory. Kansas State was 0-for-8 on third-down conversions in the first half.

PASADENA, Calif. - Kevin Craft threw for 186 yards and a touchdown to lead unbeaten UCLA to a 23-9 victory over Kansas State at the Rose Bowl.

Craft, filling in at quarterback for Kevin Prince, completed 13 of 24 passes with one interception including a game-clinching 51-yard scoring pass to Terrence Austin with 6:18 remaining.

Carson Coffman completed 20 of 34 passes for 193 yards with two interceptions and was sacked six times for the Wildcats (1-2). Daniel Thomas, who became the first player to begin his Kansas State career with consecutive 100-yard rushing performances since Cornelius Davis accomplished the feat in 1966, was held to 54 yards on 15 carries.

After being held to one field goal in the first half, Kansas State moved 80 yards on 14 plays on their first possession of the third quarter, scoring on a 7-yard run by Thomas to trim UCLA's lead to 13-9. The conversion failed after a botched snap. Thomas carried eight times for 43 yards on the drive, which consumed nearly eight minutes.

Ryan Doerr pinned the Bruins deep in their territory with a 53-yard punt to the 4 yard line late in the third quarter, and after forcing a punt, the Wildcats got the ball back at the UCLA 41. But Josh Cherry missed a 40-yard field goal in the opening minute of the final period.

The Bruins then moved to the Kansas State 23 before Forbath connected from 40 yards, extending UCLA's lead to 16-9 with 9:55 remaining.

Kansas State moved into UCLA territory following the opening kickoff before Alterraun Verner intercepted a pass by Coffman at the Bruins 36-yard line. Craft's 16-yard completion to Nelson Rosario on a third-and-10 play triggered a 64-yard, 11-play drive that Franklin capped with a 3-yard run to give UCLA a 7-0 lead.

The Wildcats then drove into position for a 26-yard field goal by Cherry to draw within four points.

Craft's 18-yard touchdown pass to Ryan Moya on UCLA's second possession was nullified by an illegal man downfield, forcing the Bruins to settle for a 39-yard field goal by Forbath on the second play of the second quarter. Forbath added a 35-yarder later in the second quarter to make it 13-3, and that's how it stood at halftime.

The Bruins had another potential scoring chance in the second period, but Joshua Moore picked off Craft's long pass at the Kansas State 19-yard line.

MANHATTAN, Kan. - Senior Brandon Banks became the 12th player in NCAA history, including the first Big 12 player, to return two kickoff for touchdowns in the same game, as Kansas State rolled past Tennessee Tech, 49-7, on a beautiful Saturday afternoon at Bill Snyder Family Stadium.

Banks, whose 303 all-purpose yards ranks fifth in school history, broke a 7-all tie with a 91-yard kick return with 2:28 remaining in the first quarter then jump-started the second half with a 92-yard return to give the Wildcats a 28-7 lead. Banks also had three receptions for 90 yards, including an electrifying 64-yard reception to set up a 2-yard score by junior running back Daniel Thomas in the second quarter. The last player to achieve the feat of two kickoff returns for touchdowns was UCLA's Brandon Breazell against Northwestern in the Sun Bowl on Dec. 30, 2005.

Banks' banner day overshadowed another fine outing by Thomas, who recorded his third 100-yard rushing game of the season with a career-high 139 yards to go with two touchdowns. Two other rushers - seniors Keithen Valentine (73 yards on 10 carries) and Grant Gregory (58 yards on nine carries) - tallied 50 or more yards to help the Wildcats post their highest rushing total since 2005.

Junior quarterback Carson Coffman was also solid on the day, completing 8-of-9 passes for 131 yards. He also capped K-State's second offensive scoring drive with a 5-yard score in the second quarter.

Backup signal caller Grant Gregory saw his most significant action of the season, playing most of the third and fourth quarters. Gregory was a perfect 2-of-2 passing for 21 yards to go with 58 yards rushing. He scored his first career touchdown as a Wildcat on a one-yard run with 10:50 left in the fourth quarter that capped the scoring. The K-State offense finished with a season-high 49 points, which was four more than it had totaled in its three previous games of the season. The squad also collected season bests for total yards (448) and rushing yards (296).

The defense was again stellar on the afternoon, holding the Golden Eagles to just 107 yards of total offense including negative 19 yards rushing to go with three sacks.

KANSAS CITY, Mo. - Sophomore defensive back Emmanuel Lamur blocked the tying extra-point with 32 seconds remaining to help Kansas State earn its first Big 12 win with a 24-23 victory over Iowa State at Arrowhead Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

Senior quarterback Grant Gregory threw two fourth-quarter touchdowns in his first career start as a Wildcat, completing 16 of 23 passes for 206 yards to go with 29 yards rushing on 14 carries and one touchdown. The go-ahead score came with 5:36 remaining in the game in which Gregory rolled out to avoid the rush before hitting senior wideout Brandon Banks on a 54-yard strike.

Junior running back Daniel Thomas nearly collected his fourth 100-yard game of the season, posting 96 yards on 25 carries. He also had five catches for 38 yards, including a 13-yard catch. Banks, the reigning Big 12 Special Teams of the Week, totaled 164 of all-purpose yards, including four catches for 66 yards and a touchdown and three kickoffs for 67 yards.

The offenses were nearly identical with Iowa State (3-2, 0-1 Big 12) holding a narrow advantage on total yards, 371-360. The Wildcats (3-2, 1-0 Big 12) had 206 yards passing to go with 154 yards on the ground. Once again, K-State held the edge in time of possession (33:33 to 26:27) and converted eight of 16 third-down conversions.

Gregory got the scoring started with a 2-yard run to cap a 13-play, 89-yard drive on its opening possession that consumed seven minutes of the first quarter. Thomas got the ball on the first five possession and totaled 30 yards on seven rushes.

The defense was led by the play of linebacker Alex Hrebek, who had a team-high eight tackles. Defensive back Joshua Moore had 5 1/2 tackles and a break-up, while Jeffrey Fitzgerald totaled five tackles. Linebacker John Houlik posted 4 1/2 tackles and one fumble recovery and defensive back Stephen Harrison had four stops and two pass break-ups.

Kansas State scored its second touchdown-and its only offensive one- midway through the fourth quarter when Keithen Valentine ran for an 8-yard touchdown to whittle the margin to 59-14. Valentine rushed for a career-high 96 yards on eight carries.

MANHATTAN, Kan. - Daniel Thomas ran for four touchdowns in the first half and Brandon Banks returned the second-half kickoff 97 yards for another score, leading Kansas State to an improbable 62-14 rout over Texas A&M Saturday night.

A week after allowing 66 points and more than 700 yards in a disheartening loss to Texas Tech, Kansas State (4-3, 2-1 Big 12) steamrolled Texas A&M on both sides of the ball for its most lopsided conference win since beating Iowa State 58-7 in 2002.

The Wildcats led 38-0 at halftime after Thomas scored on runs of 7, 3, 9 and 17 yards, then scored 21 points over the first 5:12 of the third quarter before Texas A&M (3-3, 0-2) finally started to put points on the board. Keithen Valentine ran for a pair of touchdowns in the second half and Grant Gregory was steady after being replaced by Carson Coffman last week, throwing for 147 yards and a touchdown on 10-of-13 passing.

Kansas State's defense forced five turnovers while holding the Aggies to 70 first-half yards and minus-13 yards rushing overall.

The Wildcats also harassed Jerrod Johnson, the Big 12's total offense leader, with six sacks and three interceptions, ending his Big 12 record at 242 pass attempts without throwing a pick. He finished with 314 yards passing and threw two touchdowns to Uzoma Nwachukwu -- both after Kansas State had built a 59-0 lead. The defensive dominance gave the Wildcats a short field most of the game and they took advantage, scoring on six of seven drives for their most points in a half since scoring 50 against New Mexico State in 2001.
