K-STATE TRAVELS WEST TO FACE COLORADO IN BOULDER

BOWL-ELIGIBLE WILDCATS LOOK TO CLOSE OUT BIG 12 PLAY WITH A ROAD WIN

Kansas State, coming off a 38-28 loss at No. 20 Missouri, will look to wrap up Big 12 play with a road win this weekend as it travels to Boulder, Colo., to face the Colorado Buffaloes. The contest, which was not selected for television, will be streamed live online at www.k-statesports.com as a part of the K-State All-Access premium service beginning at 1:10 p.m. CT.

The matchup can also be heard along the K-State Sports Network, online (for free) at www.k-statesports.com and on SIRIUS satellite radio channel 156. Wyatt Thompson will call the action with Stan Weber serving as the color analyst and Matt Walters providing sideline updates. Live stats are also available through CBS College Sports' Gametracker, while Twitter updates will also be a part of k-state-sports.com's gameday coverage.

A QUICK LOOK AT THE WILDCATS

Kansas State will look to get back on track this weekend at Colorado following last week's 10-point setback at No. 20 Missouri. The Wildcats, currently bowl-eligible at 6-4 overall and 3-4 in Big 12 play, were plagued by turnovers against the Tigers but got solid performances from Collin Klein at quarterback (141 yards rushing) and freshman Tre Walker (12 tackles, 1 interception) at linebacker.

On offense, K-State continues to rank as one of the top rushing attacks in the Big 12 Conference, averaging 200 yards a contest on the ground. All-America candidate Daniel Thomas continues to rank among the best running backs in not only the Big 12 Conference but also the nation. The senior currently ranks ninth in the nation with his 116.8 rushing yards per game average, which also ranks seventh nationally among running backs, and sixth on the K-State single-season rushing charts. Quarterback Collin Klein has rushed for 100 or more yards in consecutive games, marking the first Wildcat signal caller since Eli Roberson in 2001 to achieve that feat.

K-State's defense has collected six interceptions in the last two games and has continued to make strides as a unit over the past month. Stephen Harrison and Terrance Sweeney have combined for 24 passes defended and currently rank sixth and 18th, respectively, in the country. David Garrett ranks third in the Big 12 in tackles for loss with 11.0, while Prizell Brown's 5.0 sacks lead the charge. A pair of freshmen have come up big as of late for the Cats as Walker (23) and safety Ty Zimmermann (13) have combined for 36 tackles in the last two games.

Kansas State fans will have the opportunity to watch the Wildcats' final two regular season football games online as the Colorado game on Saturday will be webcast live on k-statesports.com as part of the K-State All-Access exclusive premium subscription service, while the November 27 season finale at North Texas will be broadcast live on ESPN3. As a result of the Colorado game not being selected as part of the Big 12 television package, both Kansas State and Colorado worked with conference officials and gained approval for the webcast on the basis that it be carried on both schools' premium internet platforms. Saturday's game will kick at 1:10 p.m. CT from Folsom Field.

The live webcast, which will include the audio play-by-play description of Wyatt Thompson and Stan Weber from the K-State Sports Network, will be available free to current monthly or annual subscribers to K-State All-Access. Fans who are not subscribers to the service can view the game, and all other exclusive video content available, by registering for either a monthly (\$9.95) or annual (\$79.95) subscription. To sign up, go to www.k-statesports.com/allaccess and create a login account. For questions or technical issues, fans are encouraged to visit cbssportscs.custhelp.com. Current subscribers can log in to their K-State All-Access account and begin watching the game.

A LOOK AT COLORADO

K-State will face a Colorado team on Saturday that is coming off a big 34-14 win at home over Iowa State under interim coach Brian Cabral. Cabral replaced Dan Hawkins, who was relieved of his coaching duties following the Kansas game. The Buffs are 4-6 overall on the season and 1-5 in Big 12 play heading into Saturday's divisional matchup.

The Buffs have the third-leading rusher in the Big 12 in Rodney Stewart, who has run for 1,035 yards and eight touchdowns this season. Stewart ran for 123 yards in last week's win over Iowa State and has five 100-yard rushing performances this season. At quarterback, Cody Hawkins is coming off a 16-of-24 outing against the Cyclones where he threw for 266 yards and three touchdowns with no interceptions. Hawkins has completed 100-of-180 passes for 1,368 yards this season with nine touchdowns and three interceptions. At wide receiver, Scotty McKnight leads the group with 43 catches, while Paul Richardson is coming off a five-catch, 121-yard game last week.

On defense, linebacker Michael Sipili leads the team in tackles with 76, while B.J. Beatty's five sacks are tops on the squad. The CU defense recorded 8.0 sacks in last week's win over Iowa State. In the secondary, Ray Polk has collected 60 tackles on the year, while Jalil Brown has a team-best three interceptions.

K-STATE IS BOWL ELIGIBLE

K-State qualified for its first bowl game since 2006 and first under Snyder since its Big 12 Championship and Fiesta Bowl run in 2003 with its 39-14 win over Texas on November 6. The Wildcats' bowl success under Snyder is also well-documented with the program's 11 straight postseason appearances under the legendary head coach. Wildcat fans are encouraged to secure bowl tickets in advance through K-State and can visit www.k-statesports.com/bowlgame for official bowl travel and ticket information.

K-STATE VERSUS THE NORTH

K-State will conclude its Big 12 Conference portion of the schedule against a north division opponent on Saturday against Colorado. The Wildcats are 46-28 (.622) vs. division opponents since 1996, which is second to only Nebraska among Big 12 North schools. Kansas State's first three conference games of 2010 have come against divisional opponents and it will look to improve to 3-2 against the north this weekend. All-time against Colorado, the Wildcats are 20-44-1, which includes a 6-11-1 mark against the Buffs under Bill Snyder. Since 1997, K-State is 6-4 against Colorado with Snyder leading the program.

SNYDER AMONG BEST ACTIVE COACHES

The author of the greatest turnaround in college football history, Bill Snyder is in act two of guiding K-State, and his work ranks among the best in college football when compared to other active coaches. Snyder, who currently ranks 12th all-time in wins among active FBS coaches, is one of just two active BCS coaches who have served at the same school for at least 18 years and have never held the same position at another school (Joe Paterno of Penn State).

Also, Snyder holds the 11th-best winning percentage among active FBS coaches with at least 125 wins. What might be even more amazing is that Snyder has tallied the fifth-most victories among active coaches since 1990 despite a three-year hiatus. Snyder has guided K-State to 147 victories since the 1990 season, only to be out-done by Mack Brown, Frank Beamer, Joe Paterno and Steve Spurrier.

CLOSING STRONG

K-State heads into the final two weeks of the season with a 6-4 overall record and a 3-4 mark in Big 12 play. The Wildcats are looking to have a November to remember and under head coach Bill Snyder, the Cats have a track record of successful stretch runs. Since 1991 under Snyder, K-State is 42-14 in the month of November, which includes a stretch of 13 seasons of winning records in the month (1991-2003) and six seasons with an undefeated final month.

RED ZONE ALERT

K-State has been one of the Big 12's best in terms of red zone offense this season. The Wildcats have currently converted on 30-of-34 trips inside their opponents' 20-yard line, 26 of which have gone for touchdowns and four field goals. That figure ranks fourth in the league. Also, in last week's game at Missouri, K-State turned the ball over in the red zone for just the first time this season.

DRAWING FIRST BLOOD

Scoring first has been a big sign of good things to come for the Wildcats. Since 1990, K-State's record when scoring first is very impressive as the Wildcats have gone 128-24 (85-percent) when drawing first blood. This season, the Wildcats are 5-1 when getting on the board first after taking the early lead in their first three games of this season, in their wins against Kansas and Texas and in the loss to Oklahoma State.

HALFWAY HOME

There's no better indicator of a Wildcat victory than when K-State leads or is tied at the half. Since 1990, the Cats have protected a halftime lead 97-percent of the time, going 142-5 when leading at halftime.

AYE, CAPTAIN

Head coach Bill Snyder named six captains for the 2010 season as senior quarterback Carson Coffman and junior linebacker Alex Hrebec were named captains for the second straight season. Junior defensive backs Tysyn Hartman and Emmanuel Lamur, along with senior offensive lineman Zach Kendall and sophomore quarterback Collin Klein were each named captains for the first time in their careers.

CATS OWN NATION'S 10TH-LONGEST SCORING STREAK

Kansas State extended one of the nation's longest scoring streaks against Missouri as the Wildcats have now tallied points in 174 consecutive games. The 174-game stretch is the 10th-longest streak in the nation. The Wildcats have not been kept off the scoreboard since Colorado shutout K-State, 12-0, on Nov. 16, 1996. In the Big 12, only Nebraska (186 games) owns a longer streak than the Cats.

GROUND GAINS

So far this season, K-State has established its running game and rushed its way to 1,998 yards through the first 10 games of the season, including five games with 200 or more yards, a figure that ranks second in the Big 12 and 21st nationally. Daniel Thomas has paved the way with 1,168 of those yards, which ranks ninth in the nation, while William Powell has also provided a spark, averaging 10.9 yards per carry.

Against Texas, K-State ran for 261 yards, which were the second-most yards the Horns had given up all season, behind quarterback Collin Klein's 127 yards and Thomas' 106. In fact, the Wildcats only attempted four passes and threw for nine yards in the win over the Longhorns. Last week, K-State rushed for 187 yards at Missouri, 141 of which came from Klein again.

TAKING TO THE AIR... WHEN NEEDED

Although the Wildcats have shown the ability to be a physical team up front with a power running game, quarterback Carson Coffman has proven that the Cats can take to the air when needed. Coffman had two of his better games as a Wildcat last month as the senior completed 35-of-45 his passes for 415 yards and two scores in games at Kansas and Baylor. Against the Jayhawks, Coffman compiled an efficiency rating of 231.6, which was the highest mark for a K-State quarterback in five seasons.

Last week, Coffman connected on 11-of-19 passes for 170 yards and a touchdown in limited action against Missouri. K-State currently ranks fifth in the Big 12 in passing efficiency, while Coffman ranks sixth in the league with his 136.8 pass efficiency rating.

THE LAST MEETING

MANHATTAN, Kan. - Kansas State's defense came up big against Colorado to give the Wildcats a 20-6 homecoming victory and remain atop the Big 12 North standings. K-State limited the Buffaloes to 244 total yards on offense and just 60 on the ground.

While the Wildcat defense was able to shut down the Buffalo offense, K-State's own offense controlled the tempo of the game with quick strikes in the first half to build a lead and long clock-eating drives in the second half to hold off the Buffaloes.

After Colorado scored on its opening drive, K-State stifled the Buffaloes the remainder of the game by not surrendering any points. It was the lowest point total allowed to a Big 12 opponent by the K-State defense since Oct. 8, 2005 against Kansas.

With Colorado threatening to score late in the game on fourth down from the two-yard line, Emmanuel Lamur came up with his second interception of the day to preserve the win. Both of Lamur's picks were on passes where he ripped the ball out of a receiver's hands as they both got to the play at the same time.

Daniel Thomas carried much of the load for K-State with a career-high 145 yards rushing on 20 carries with one score. Defensively for K-State, Ulla Pomele led with seven tackles, including his first sack of the season. Jeffrey Fitzgerald continued his strong play with 1.5 sacks and a number of QB pressures.

A 35-yard rush by Thomas down the K-State sideline helped the Wildcats march down the field on their first drive of the game and put points on the board first with a 24-yard field goal by Josh Cherry to cap off the drive of 61 yards.

The Buffaloes also scored on their first drive of the game to answer K-State's field goal with a touchdown by Rodney Stewart. Colorado would miss the extra point, however, to lead 6-3.

Thomas tallied his ninth TD run in the second quarter, as the Cats completed a 58-yard drive to reclaim the lead, 10-6.

K-State saw the momentum shift to its side with the game's first turnover, when Colorado quarterback Tyler Hansen fumbled the snap on a first-and-20 situation from the Buffaloes' own 15-yard line. Pomele recovered the fumble for the Wildcats, and K-State kicked a 27-yard field goal after the Wildcats could not punch the ball into the endzone to lead, 13-6.

CONTINUITY ALONG THE FRONT

Although the Wildcats have broken in two new starting tackles along the offensive line this season, the experience of guards Zach Kendall and Kenny Mayfield and center Wade Weibert have helped pave the way for Daniel Thomas and the K-State rushing attack this season. The group has led the way for the second-ranked rushing attack in the Big 12, averaging 200 yards a game on the ground. K-State returned four of its five regular starters from a season ago (89 combined starts) and has a combined 112 career starts among all of its current linemen. This season marks the third time since 1997 that four starting offensive lineman from the previous season return (also happened in 2007).

CLEANING IT UP

So far in 2010, K-State has ranked among the Big 12's best in terms of being penalized. Through 10 games, the Wildcats have been flagged for 50 penalties and 397 yards, both of which are the fewest in the league. In the national ranks, K-State's 39.7 yards of penalties per game rank 13th in the country, while its 5.0 penalties per game average ranks 18th.

PICK ME

K-State saw its national ranking in turnover margin improve from 42nd to 15th in just one week after forcing Texas into five turnovers, while not committing any itself. The five turnovers were all interceptions and were the most in a game since forcing six against Iowa back in 1987. K-State has now forced 13 turnovers in the past four games and are +4 in turnover margin heading into this week's contest. Dating back to last season, K-State has forced 35 turnovers in its last 14 games while committing 23 (+12).

HIGH RATE OF RETURNS

Kansas State has ranked among the nation's leaders in kickoff returns over the last several years and behind the running ability of former walk-on running back William Powell, and the Wildcat kickoff return team, those numbers are returning to form here in 2010. Powell, the Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week following the Iowa State game, currently ranks first in the Big 12 and tops nationally with his 34.6-yard return average, while the Wildcats as a team rank first in the Big 12 and second nationally in the category. So far this season, the Wildcats have collected 11 kickoff returns of 30 or more yards, all of which have come from Powell, including his school record-long 100-yarder against Baylor.

KOR DEFENSE STEPS UP

On the other side of the field, K-State has also been very solid in kickoff return yardage defense as it currently ranks 10th nationally and tops in the Big 12 - giving up just 19.07 yards per return.

JUST FOR KICKS

K-State's success on special teams is not just limited to returns as the Wildcats' steady punt team unit has climbed to a No. 10 national ranking this week. Ryan Doerr has averaged 42.0 yards a punt this season and as a team has netted 39.45 per punt, which also ranks fourth among Big 12 schools.

VERY SPECIAL TEAMS

The rise of K-State football over the last two decades has much to do with the emphasis on special teams. Since 1990, Kansas State is 42-15 when scoring on special teams and 16-1 when scoring on special teams and on defense.

And, in non-offensive touchdowns, the Cats have ranked among the nation's best over the past 11-plus seasons. Since 1999, the Wildcats rank second nationally in non-offensive touchdowns with 76, behind only Virginia Tech (81). K-State had five non-offensive touchdowns in 2009 - four kickoff returns and one interception return - and three so far in 2010 (fake field goal, fumble and kickoff return).

BLOCK PARTY

Kansas State's play on special teams has been unparalleled as the Cats have the fifth-most blocks in the nation since 2002 with 36, which includes a school-record-tying nine total blocks in 2008 (four punts, two extra points and three field goals) and three (one punt, one field goal and one PAT) in 2009, two of which came from safety Emmanuel Lamur.

Also, Kansas State has amassed 52 total blocked kicks since 1996 and currently ranks second among Big 12 schools, behind Texas, in total blocks in the 14-plus year history of the league.

WELCOME HOME

Kansas State has become a haven for transfers returning to the state of Kansas after spending time at other FBS institutions. K-State boasts five Division I transfer players on its roster - all originally from the state of Kansas - including wide receivers Chris Harper (Wichita; Oregon) and Brodrick Smith (Garden City; Minnesota), who have returned to the playing field after sitting out in 2009. New to the squad this season are brothers Arthur (Miami, Fla.; linebacker) and Bryce (Tennessee; running back) Brown from Wichita, as well as offensive lineman Nick Puetz (Salina; Wyoming) after all three enrolled at K-State for the fall semester. Brown was rated the nation's top recruit two seasons ago by numerous recruiting services.

CAT FANS POURED THROUGH THE TURNSTILES in 2010

Kansas State averaged 49,816 fans at Bill Snyder Family Stadium in six home games this season, which includes four sellout crowds against UCLA, UCF, Nebraska and Oklahoma State. K-State has set new attendance records for a season opener and the first three non-conference games of a season, while the average of 49,816 is a new school record for a six-game home schedule and is the third-highest average in school history.

K-STATE NO. 1... AGAIN

Kansas State can stake claim as the Big 12 leader in all-sports graduation rate for an unprecedented fourth straight year as the NCAA released its latest graduation rate data. K-State's graduation success rate of 81-percent, which studies the 2000-2003 cohort for all Division I institutions, bested Missouri for the top spot among Big 12 schools. The GSR reflects the federal graduation rate cohort and adds those student-athletes receiving aid who entered mid-year as well as those who transferred into the institution. The Wildcats' four-class average of 67-percent, which is based on data from scholarship student-athletes receiving aid who were designated as freshmen for the 2003-04 academic year, tied Iowa State for the highest ranking and marked the fourth straight year that Kansas State led the Big 12 in this category.

GRADUATING EARLY

Kansas State has been the Big 12 leader in all-sports graduation rate by student-athletes each of the last four years. The same holds true specifically for football as the program led the conference in graduation rates each of the last three years.

So it should come as no surprise that the Wildcats are one of the national leaders when it comes to players who have completed their degree or are on track to finish this semester. K-State is fourth nationally with active graduates on its roster with eight. That number is also the most in the Big 12 and will grow to as many as 13 following the fall semester.

KEEPING THE PACE

Senior running back Daniel Thomas, who is ninth in the nation in rushing, sprinted out of the gates and has maintained a solid pace this season, totaling 1,168 yards on 226 attempts with 14 touchdowns. His week-one rushing total of 234 yards against UCLA was the highest by a Wildcat in a season-opening game in school history, while he has also set the school record for the highest rushing total through each game except for the fifth game of the season in which he was outdone by Darren Sproles in 2004 (684). Thanks to his quick pace of racking up yards this season, Thomas tied Darren Sproles' 2004 school record for fewest games played in a season to reach 1,000 yards at nine.

THE MOST OF EVERY CARRY

Daniel Thomas became the seventh player in school history to top the 2,000-yard rushing mark for a career when he did so against Kansas. After the 11th 100-yard rushing performance of his career against Texas and 66 yards last week at Missouri, the Hilliard, Fla., product now has 2,433 yards on 473 career rushes, good for a 5.1-yard average. Among all career 2,000-yard rushers in school history, Thomas ranks second in yards per rush. Darren Sproles, who rushed for a school record 4,979 yards on 815 carries, is also the career record holder in yards per rush at 6.1.

WORKHORSE

Daniel Thomas brings a lot more to the table than just his rushing ability. Thomas registered 276 total touches out of 802 offensive plays in 2009 (247 rushes, 25 receptions and 4 pass attempts), which was 34.4-percent of the total offense. Thomas has been even more involved in 2010 as he has totaled 241 touches (226 rushes, 25 catches, 5 pass attempts) in K-State's 642 offensive plays, which is 39.9-percent of the total offense. Thomas' highest percentage this season came against Iowa State when he rushed 34 times out of K-State's 62 offensive plays, good for a 54.8-percent clip.

FASTEST TO 1,000

Needing just four yards against Texas to get to 1,000 for the season, running back Daniel Thomas did so in dramatic fashion as he took his first hand off 34 yards for a touchdown less than a minute into the game. With the rush, Thomas tied Darren Sproles' mark in 2004 of needing nine games to get there. Thomas, who climbed over 1,000 yards on his 197th carry of the year, ranks eighth in that department.

IRONMAN

Daniel Thomas has received a majority of the work in 2010. The senior, who has 13 career games with 20 or more carries, has 226 attempts this year and is on pace for 271 rushes during the regular season, which would rank second to Darren Sproles' school record of 306 during the 15-game 2003 season. Thomas also has 473 rushes in his career to rank eighth in school history and needs 18 to move into a tie for sixth.

QUARLES COMING ALONG

After an injury sidelined him for all of 2009, wide receiver Aubrey Quarles has taken two steps forward in 2010. The Aurora, Colo., product leads the team in catches (41), receiving yards (562) and touchdowns (4) through 10 games. Quarles was productive over a two-week span against Baylor and Oklahoma State, notching career highs in yards with 131 against the Bears and catches with nine against the Cowboys. After not recoding a catch against Texas, Quarles came back last week at Missouri to set a new career high in yards (133) and tied his career high in receptions. He has tallied 969 receiving yards in his career and needs 31 yards to become the school's 25th career 1,000-yard receiver.

KLEIN RUSHES TO HISTORY

Sophomore quarterback Collin Klein has delivered in his first two games of extensive action at quarterback. In his first career start under center two weeks ago against Texas, Klein rushed for 127 yards and two touchdowns, leading the Wildcats to bowl-eligibility for the first time since 2006. Klein set a school record for rushing yards by a quarterback in his first career start, bettering Eli Roberson's mark of 119 yards at USC in 2001. Although Klein didn't start last week against Missouri, he rushed for a career high 141 yards, setting the record for total rushing yards by a quarterback in any two-game stretch in school history with 268.

AERIAL ASSAULT

Carson Coffman performed at a high level over a three-game stretch against Kansas, Baylor and Oklahoma State, combining to go 58-of-80 (72.5-percent) for 585 yards and two touchdowns through the air, while he also added five rushing scores during that span. Coffman had his most effective game as a Wildcat at Kansas in which he recorded a pass efficiency of 231.6 (15-for-16 for 184 yards and two touchdowns), the highest by a Wildcat since Allen Webb's school record of 300.9 in 2005. His completion percentage against the Jayhawks was just 0.3-percent lower than the Big 12 record of 94.1-percent by Missouri's Chase Daniel in 2008. Coffman also ran for 42 yards and three scores against the Jayhawks.

POWELL YIELDS HIGH RATE OF RETURN

Kansas State has received the most from former walk-on running back William Powell. He leads the nation with a kickoff return average of 34.6 yards, thanks in part to four returns covering more than 50 yards, including a 100-yarder at Baylor and a 62-yarder against Texas. His average is over 3.25 yards per return better than the No. 2 returner in the country, while it is 0.2 yards per return shy of the Big 12 record of 34.8 by Oklahoma State's Chris Massey in 2001.

WALKER STEPPING UP

True freshman Tre Walker has become a force at linebacker over the past few games, earning more playing time each week. The Olathe, Kan., product, who started his first career game last week at Missouri, has carded 23 tackles over the past two games, the most by a Wildcat freshman since 1996. Then-red-shirt freshman Mark Simoneau totaled 24 stops over a two-game stint against Texas A&M (11) and Oklahoma (13). Walker, who had a then-career high seven tackles at Kansas, was a force against Texas two weeks ago with 11 stops before picking up 12 last week in Columbia. The freshman also picked off his first career pass against the Tigers and returned it 17 yards.

LOCAL PRODUCT STARTING TO SHINE

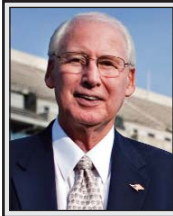
Not to be outdone by Walker, another true freshman, Ty Zimmerman, has been one of Kansas State's most consistent defenders over the past month. The Junction City, Kan., native is fourth on the team in tackles with 56, thanks to five straight games with six or more stops. He notched his career high with 12 tackles, including two for a loss, against Oklahoma State, which was sandwiched between an eight-tackle effort at Baylor and seven stops against Texas. Zimmerman, who played quarterback in high school, has been a ball hawk as well as he had a 24-yard fumble return at Kansas and intercepted two Texas passes.

SWATTING IT AWAY

Stephen Harrison and Terrance Sweeney have been two of the better defensive backs in the Big 12 in terms of passes defended as the duo has combined for 20 pass breakups and four interceptions this season. Harrison, who was seventh in the Big 12 and 33rd nationally last year in passes defended, has 13 this year to rank second in the league and sixth in the NCAA. Of his 13 passes defended, 12 have come against Big 12 foes, which leads the league. Sweeney is right on Harrison's heels as the Houston, Texas, product has 11 to rank fifth in the conference and tie for 18th nationally.

ADAMS ON TARGET

The most unsung hero on K-State's roster, and perhaps the Big 12, is long snapper Corey Adams. Adams, a First Team Midseason All-American by Phil Steele, has been perfect on a combined 455 snaps in his three-plus year career and has appeared in all 46 games of his Wildcat career. This season, Adams has been true on all 49 field goal/PAT attempts and 49 punt snaps. The Monument, Colo., product has also excelled off the field as he is a semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy, which is considered the "Academic Heisman." He was also named to the preseason candidate list for the Senior CLASS Award.



HEAD COACH

BILL SNYDER**19th season at
Kansas State**

The 2009 season saw one of the greatest legends in college football return to the sidelines in hopes of revitalizing a program that he once built, piece by piece, into a national force.

The architect of the "greatest turnaround in the history of college football" Bill Snyder returned to lead the Kansas State football program in 2009 after 17 ultra-successful seasons as the head coach from 1989-2005. And in his first season back, Snyder led the Wildcats to a 6-6 record and a second place finish in the Big 12 North. In fact, K-State was just one win away from advancing to the Big 12 Championship game as the Wildcats played at Nebraska in the season finale with a championship game berth on the line. Not bad for a program that was picked by most preseason publications to finish fifth or even sixth in the 2009 Big 12 North race.

K-State claimed more First Team All-Big 12 selections on offense than any other school with four last season. Big 12 Newcomer of the Year Daniel Thomas led the league in rushing in his first year at the position, while Nick Stringer, Jeron Mastrud and Brandon Banks also garnered first team accolades.

Named the 32nd head football coach at Kansas State on Nov. 30, 1988, and again as the 34th on Nov. 24 2008, Snyder has amassed a 148-78-1 (.659) record during his tenure with the Wildcats, including an 82-61-1 (.578) mark in Big 8/12 games. His 146 victories are the 12th-most among active FBS coaches and are more than triple the man in second place on K-State's all-time coaching victories list (Mike Ahearn, 39 wins).

But to fully understand the turnaround ushered in by Snyder at Kansas State one must only consider that the Wildcats were in the midst of an 0-26-1 run when he was hired. It also took K-State 51 seasons (1938-1988) to total just 130 wins, while the 12 head coaches prior to Snyder's arrival in Manhattan combined to win just 116 games from 1945-1988.

Snyder led Kansas State to 11 straight bowl berths between the 1993 and 2003 seasons, making K-State one of only seven programs in the nation to appear in the postseason every year during that stretch. During that span, Snyder's Wildcats won

nearly 80 percent of their games, chalking up 109 victories - a staggering average of nearly 10 wins per season - and making Kansas State the nation's second-winningest program over that period.

And Snyder continued to break new ground with the Wildcats. Kansas State's 35-7 victory over top-ranked Oklahoma in the 2003 Big 12 Championship game lifted K-State to its first conference championship since Pappy Waldorf's 1934 squad and secured the school's first BCS bowl berth in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.

With an 11-4 record in 2003, K-State was the only team in the country to win 11 games in six of the previous seven years and just the second program in the history of college football to win 11 games six times in a seven-year stretch.

Snyder's unprecedented success in 17 years at Kansas State did not go unnoticed. He was named the National Coach of the Year on three occasions (1991, 1994 and 1998). He has been a finalist for the prestigious Bear Bryant/FWAA National Coach of the Year Award in 1993 and 1995 before winning in 1998; a finalist for the Football News National Coach of the Year Award in 1995 and 1998; and a finalist for the Kodak/AFCA National Coach of the Year Award in 1993 and 1998.

During his three-year hiatus, Snyder remained involved with the university and is currently a member of the Missouri and Kansas Halls of Fame, the K-State and Austin College Athletics Halls of Fame while also being inducted into the Holiday Bowl Hall of Fame. The long-time mentor also remained active in the community as he currently is the Chairman of the Kansas Mentors Council and the Kansas Leadership Council, a member of the Board of Directors for Kansas Leadership Center, the Board of Trustees for the Kansas Sports Hall of Fame, the KSU Leadership Studies Advancement Council, the Terry C. Johnson Cancer Research Center Advisory Council, the Manhattan Community Foundation Board of Trustees, the KSU Foundation Board of Trustees and is the Honorary Co-Chairman of the Kansas Masonic Partnership for Life.

Snyder, 70, received his B.A. from William Jewell in 1963. He earned his M.A. from Eastern New Mexico in 1965. As a player, he was a three-year letterwinner as a defensive back at William Jewell. Snyder and his wife, Sharon, have two sons (Sean and Ross) and three daughters (Shannon, Meredith and Whitney). They also have eight grandchildren, Sydney, Katherine, Tate, Matthew, Alexis, Gavin, Kadin and Tylan, and one great-grandson, D.J.

Daniel Thomas registered career highs in rushing yards (234), rushing attempts(28) and longest run (44) in K-State's 31-22 season-opening win over UCLA. Thomas recorded the 12th 200-plus yard game in school history and the fifth-highest for a single game.

MANHATTAN, Kan. (AP) - Daniel Thomas rushed for 234 yards and two touchdowns and Kansas State rallied for a 31-22 victory over UCLA Saturday before a crowd of 51,059, the biggest for a home opener in Wildcats' history.

There were three touchdowns in the final 123 seconds and Kansas State had two, including Thomas' 35-yard gallop after the Wildcats fell on UCLA's onside kick.

Thomas, the Big 12's leading rusher last year, set up scores with several big runs, including one for 44 yards and another for 29. His 28 carries and 235 yards were both career highs.

After Carson Coffman's 5-yard TD pass to Brodrick Smith put Kansas State ahead 24-16 with 2:03 left, Kevin Prince led the Bruins on a lightning-quick drive, hitting Cory Harkey for 35 yards and then connecting with Ricky Marvray on a 29-yard TD toss. With 1:19 to play, the Bruins elected to go for 2. But Prince's pass into the end zone fell incomplete and Kansas State's Travis Tannahill recovered the ensuing onside kick.

Seemingly just trying to run out the clock, the Wildcats handed the ball to Thomas and the quick, rugged senior burst through a hole over the right side and dashed 35 yards for the TD that clinched Kansas State's 21st consecutive victory in a home opener.

William Powell had 72 yards on just six carries for Kansas State, which erupted in the second half after managing only nine total yards in the entire second quarter. Coffman was 11 for 16 for just 66 yards and was sacked five times by a Bruin defense that had an answer for everything except Thomas. The pre-season pick for offensive player of the year in the Big 12 also had two receptions, including one for 21

yards that set up the first touchdown.

The Bruins held on fourth-and-goal from the 1, but an illegal participation penalty on UCLA gave Kansas State another shot and Thomas scored.

A 60-yard punt and a great open field tackle pinned Kansas State deep in the second quarter and Coffman fumbled the snap. Akeem Ayers recovered for the Bruins, and on the next play, Prince faked left and bootlegged right, dashing untouched into the end zone.

UCLA's Kai Forbath, who struggled all week with a sore groin, kicked three field goals and ran his streak to 40 in a row from inside 50 yards. His 44-yarder put UCLA on top 10-7 near the end of the first half and he added one from 35 and one from 42. The last one came with 6:28 to go and pulled UCLA to 17-16.

Thomas' tackle-breaking 44-yard run in the third quarter was followed by William Powell's 28-yard touchdown run, giving Kansas State a 14-10 lead.

Kansas State's Anthony Cantele had a 35-yard field goal near the end of the third quarter following Thomas' 29-yard burst. Thomas was the first Wildcat to rush for more than 200 yards in six years.

MANHATTAN, Kan. - Carson Coffman threw three touchdown passes and Daniel Thomas rushed for 137 yards as Kansas State rolled to a 48-24 victory over Missouri State on Saturday night.

The Wildcats (2-0) led 27-7 at halftime, showcasing a productive passing attack to augment the running of Thomas, who rushed for 234 yards last week against UCLA and has been touted as a Doak Walker Award candidate.

Coffman, who threw for only 66 yards a week ago, was 18 of 26 for 280 yards before sitting out the fourth quarter. With the undersized Bears (1-1) geared to stop the run, Coffman connected on scoring throws of 42 and 7 yards to Brodrick Smith, and 23 yards to Aubrey Quarles.

Missouri State is 1-24 all-time against FBS opponents.

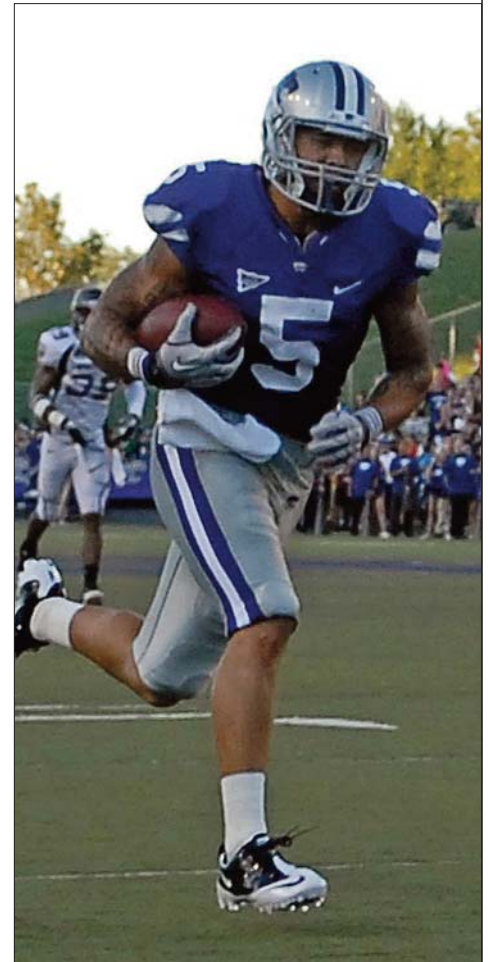
Kansas State had 108 yards rushing in the opening half, with 45 of those coming on a touchdown run by Thomas with 11:50 left in the first quarter.

The Wildcats went to their bag of tricks to take a 13-0 lead with 9:45 left in the second quarter. Kicker Anthony Cantele, who earlier missed a 26-yard field goal, lined up for a 20-yarder. But holder Ryan Doerr took the ball on an option to the right side and pitched to a trailing Cantele for a 3-yard touchdown.

Cantele missed the extra point to take away some of the luster, but the Wildcats quickly made it 20-0 a couple of minutes later when Coffman found Smith for the 42-yard touchdown pass.

Missouri State finally got its offense in gear with a 66-yard touchdown pass from Cody Kirby to Jermaine Saffold with 1:22 left in the first half. But Kansas State answered with the 23-yard score from Coffman to Quarles for a 27-7 halftime lead.

The Wildcats had 493 yards of total offense in tuning up for their Big 12 opener against Iowa State next Saturday.

KANSAS CITY, Mo. - Daniel Thomas rushed for 181 yards and two touchdowns on a career-high 34 carries, and Kansas State rallied to beat Iowa State 27-20 on Saturday.

Carson Coffman added 104 passing yards for the Wildcats (3-0, 1-0 Big 12), who have won back-to-back conference openers for the first time in 10 years.

Austen Arnaud threw for 122 yards and a touchdown to lead Iowa State (1-2, 0-1), which lost its third straight to Kansas State.

Thomas's 2-yard TD run gave Kansas State a 24-20 lead with 6:47 left. Brandon Harold then sacked Arnaud with 1:58 left and recovered a fumble, setting up a 42-yard field goal by Josh Cherry 20 seconds later.

The Cyclones drove to the Wildcats' 36-yard line with 19 seconds left, but Arnaud threw a pair of incompletions to end the rally.

Down three early in the fourth quarter, Kansas State jumped back ahead 24-20 with an 83-yard touchdown drive. Thomas capped it with five straight carries, including the touchdown run off a pitch from Coffman, after Brodrick Smith came back to the ball for a crucial 47-yard catch.

Iowa State rolled the dice, converting a fourth-and-1 from their own 17 with 4:57 left and on fourth-and-1 from their own 28 a few plays later. But Arnaud never saw Harold coming, and Harold scooped up the ball at Iowa State's 25-yard line.

Iowa State burned all its timeouts to get the ball back with 1:38 left and a chance to tie it. The Cyclones got close, but Arnaud missed a wide-open Alexander Robinson downfield, and Iowa State didn't get any closer.

Thomas opened the second half with a 23-yard

run, and it looked like the Wildcats were finally poised to take over a game they had controlled to that point.

Thomas had a spectacular 1-yard touchdown plunge midway through the third quarter, putting the Wildcats back ahead 17-14.

Grant Mahoney's field goal tied the game at 17 late in the third quarter, and he put Iowa State ahead 20-17 with 11:26 to go.

The Wildcats ran it 28 times for 163 yards against Iowa State's rush defense in the first half and rushed 50 times for 262 yards for the game.

Kansas State quarterback Carson Coffman engineered a 13-play, 67-yard drive, which was capped by his own seven-yard touchdown run with 24 seconds remaining in the contest. K-State scored 14 fourth-quarter points after trailing 7-3 through three quarters.

MANHATTAN, Kan. - Carson Coffman's 7-yard touchdown run with 24 seconds left lifted Kansas State to a come-from-behind 17-13 victory Saturday over Central Florida, giving the Wildcats a 4-0 start for the first time since 2003.

Delayed by weather for almost 1 1/2 hours in the first quarter, the game was dominated by Central Florida (2-2) for much of the day. But the Knights failed to make good on several touchdown opportunities, and Kansas State took its first lead of the day when Coffman engineered a 13-play, 67-yard scoring march on the Wildcats' final possession.

Daniel Thomas, who came in as the nation's second-leading rusher, totaled only 76 yards on 22 carries but had a key 12-yard gain during the game-winning drive.

Nick Cattoi, who missed two field goals, connected from 27 yards for a 13-10 Central Florida lead with 5:14 to play, and Kansas State took over on its own 33.

Coffman, on third-and-10, connected with Andre McDonald for 18 yards to keep the drive going. Thomas picked up 12 yards to the 22, and Coffman connected on another third-down pass to set up a first-and-goal from the 10. Two plays later, Coffman kept the ball and darted through a big hole.

Ronnie Weaver ran for 130 yards for Central Florida and freshman quarterback Jeff Godfrey added 99 yards, often on quarterback keepers in which he took advantage of the slower Kansas State defense.

With less than 3 minutes gone in the first quarter, officials halted play because of lightning accompanying a heavy storm bearing down on the area. Dark, boiling, ominous-looking clouds rarely seen on the Great Plains seemed to envelop the stadium before

heavy rains pelted the area and caused a delay of 1 hour, 26 minutes.

In the second quarter, Godfrey went up the middle for 10 yards on a keeper. He then sped 20 yards around left end and possibly would have scored if Ty Zimmerman's ankle tackle hadn't brought him down on the 25.

A 4-yard loss and a 5-yard penalty pushed the Knights back and Cattoi missed a 42-yard field goal attempt.

Late in the third quarter, Weaver broke a 31-yard run to the 9. But Stephen Harrison broke up Godfrey's pass in the end zone, and Cattoi missed from 23 yards.

Both of Kansas State's first two scores came off big pass plays to wide-open receivers. Tramaine Thompson got open for a 73-yard catch-and-run, leading to Josh Cherry's 27-yard field goal. Then the Wildcats tied it 10-10 when Coffman found Aubrey Quarles all alone on the sideline for a 58-yard touchdown play.

MANHATTAN, Kan. - Nebraska quarterback Taylor Martinez rushed for 242 yards and four touchdowns Thursday night and the seventh-ranked Cornhuskers ended a 99-year rivalry with Kansas State with a 48-13 win.

Martinez, the redshirt freshman who has rushed for 737 yards in his first five games for the Huskers (5-0), also threw a 79-yard touchdown pass to Tyler Reed for a 38-6 lead in the third quarter. His rushing total broke Jammal Lord's Nebraska record for a quarterback and his four rushing TDs tied the team quarterback mark. He was replaced by Cody Green with almost 10 minutes left in the game.

Martinez finished 5-of-7 for 128 yards as the Huskers piled up 587 yards total offense in the Big 12 opener for both teams.

Daniel Thomas, a senior running back who was averaging 157 yards a game for the Wildcats (4-1), was held to 63 yards on 22 carries.

Kansas State did not have nearly enough quickness to keep up with Martinez and the Huskers. Roy Helu broke loose for a 68-yard TD run in a 21-point third quarter that made a rout of what could be the last game these two schools ever play. In a rousing start to their farewell Big 12 tour, the Huskers' shortest touchdown play was 14 yards.

Headed next year to the Big Ten, they said goodbye to Kansas State with a six-game winning streak that raised their overall record against the Wildcats to 78-15-2, a series they began in 1911 with a 59-0 blowout and dominated almost start-to-finish.

But the Huskers had too much speed and too much Martinez. Their scoring drives in the third quarter covered 80 yards in three plays, 68 in one and 80 in two.

Kansas State's only TD came on a 2-yard pass on

fourth down from Carson Coffman to Chris Harper late in the fourth quarter. Brodrick Smith, Kansas State's sophomore wide receiver, hurt his left leg on the third-down play and was taken off the field on a cart as play was stopped for several minutes.

Martinez got the Huskers rolling with a 14-yard TD run in the first quarter. In the second, he went around right end, the linebacker bit on the fake to the running back, and Martinez went 35 yards to the end zone. He made it 24-3 58 seconds into the third quarter when he burst up the middle through a big hole and raced 80 yards untouched.

Helu's 68-yard run made it two touchdowns in four plays for the Huskers.

LAWRENCE, Kan. - Carson Coffman ran for three touchdowns and threw for two more, completing 15 of 16 passes and leading Kansas State past Kansas 59-7 on Thursday night in one of the most lopsided routs in an emotional rivalry that dates to 1902.

Coffman hit eight different receivers with passes. He also rushed for 91 yards and three TDs on 18 carries.

After a dull first quarter ended 3-0, Kansas State (5-1, 2-1 Big 12) scored on seven straight possessions - six of its own and one by the Jayhawks, on Stephen Harrison's 85-yard fumble return.

Kansas (2-4, 0-2 Big 12) did not stop the Wildcats until coach Bill Snyder started putting in his reserves with a 52-0 lead early in the fourth quarter. By then, Kansas' worst loss since a 66-14 shellacking by No. 2 Texas in 2005 was assured.

Snyder, who had not won a road game since ending a three-year retirement in 2009, raised his personal record against the Wildcats' archrival to 15-4. He has won 14 of his last 15 against the Jayhawks.

Daniel Thomas, who had been held under 80 yards each of the last two games, gained 91 yards on 18 carries, including a 9-yard touchdown run.

The Wildcats dominated this one as they've rarely done in 107 previous meetings.

Until the final minutes, the Jayhawks had only one scoring threat, driving to a first-and-goal from the 10 in the third. But Harrison leaped in front of a receiver and intercepted the pass in the end zone.

On the very next play, William Powell broke through a huge hole and sped 56 yards to the 24. Coffman capped the six-play drive with a 2-yard run for a 52-0 lead.

Taking advantage of every Kansas mistake, the Wildcats put the game away with a 28-point second

quarter and led 31-0 at halftime.

Tramaine Thompson caught Coffman's pass in the right flat, juiced a would-be tackler and raced 35 yards to the 28. A few minutes later on fourth-and-1, Coffman went over the right side for an 8-yard TD run on the first play of the second quarter.

On Kansas' next play from scrimmage, Prizell Brown knocked the ball out of DeShaun Sands' hands and Ty Zimmerman recovered for Kansas State and ran 24 yards to the Jayhawks 25. Coffman ripped off gains of 10 yards on consecutive carries and dived over the top for a 1-yard TD run with 12:25 left in the half.

David Garrett sacked Webb on fourth-and-2 on KU's next possession and the Cats went 58 yards in four plays, keyed by Coffman's 35-yard pass to Chris Harper. Thomas scored on a 9-yard run.

Harrison picked up James Sims' fumble a few minutes later and dashed 85 yards untouched. Coffman's 2-yard run made it 52-0 with 1:23 left in the third.

Running back Daniel Thomas rushed 22 times for 113 yards and a pair of touchdowns against Baylor. With his efforts, he moved into fourth in 100-yard rushing games, ninth in school history in career touchdowns (20) and 10th in career rushes.

WACO, Texas - Jay Finley rushed for a school-record 250 yards, Robert Griffin threw for a career-high 404 yards and four touchdowns and Baylor became bowl eligible for the first time since joining the Big 12, beating Kansas State 47-42.

Baylor (6-2, 3-1) has not played in a bowl game since 1994, back when the Bears were a member of the now defunct Southwest Conference.

Griffin was 26 of 38 passing and Finley averaged 9.6 yards per carry to key an offense which gained 683 yards, breaking a school record that was set three weeks ago.

One week after thumping rival Kansas 59-7, the Wildcats (5-2, 2-2) missed out on becoming bowl eligible.

Josh Gordon and Kendall Wright each had two receiving touchdowns as the Bears scored on eight of their first 10 possessions.

William Powell returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown and Daniel Thomas rushed for 113 yards and two scores for the Wildcats. Powell's kickoff return brought the Wildcats within 34-28.

Kansas State caught a break when Finley fumbled just before getting to the end zone on an 82-yard run. Finley was originally ruled down, but Kansas State got the ball after the call was reversed.

The Wildcats didn't score on their next two drives and the Bears were able to pull away.

Finley powered in for a 2-yard touchdown run, his second of the game, and Griffin threw a 30-yard touchdown pass to Wright to extend Baylor's lead to 47-28 early in the fourth.

Quarterback Carson Coffman's 1-yard touchdown run made it 47-42 with 7 seconds left. Baylor recovered an onside kick and took a knee on the final snap to clinch things.

The game was delayed 1 hour, 47 minutes because of a thunderstorm. Four plays into the game, lightning was spotted in the area and players and coaches were sent back to their locker rooms.

When play resumed, Baylor's big-play offense went to work as it piled up 387 yards in the first half.

Griffin, who tossed a 52-yard touchdown pass to Wright earlier in the second quarter, hooked up with Gordon on a 47-yard scoring pass that gave Baylor the lead for good at 28-21 with 4:17 left in the first half.

Griffin has thrown for 10 touchdowns of 40 yards or longer this season, including six of more than 50.

MANHATTAN, Kan. - Kansas State will be forced to continue its search for the elusive sixth win next week, as Brandon Weeden threw two touchdown passes and No. 20 Oklahoma State's high-powered offense overcame a solid K-State defensive effort to beat Kansas State 24-14 Saturday afternoon.

An offensive attack that came into the game No. 3 nationally in total offense and No. 2 in scoring sputtered much of the day, particularly in a 7-7 first half. But aided by Dan Bailey's precise placement punting and Johnny Thomas' touchdown on an interception return, the Cowboys scored 17 straight points in the second half.

Daniel Thomas' 1-yard touchdown run shaved the lead to 24-14 with a little more than 4 minutes left, and Kansas State recovered the ensuing short kick. But an offsides penalty forced Kansas State to kick it again and OSU carefully gathered in the ball.

Weeden, No. 2 in the nation in yards passing per game, was 22 for 39 for 298 yards and the two scores. He hit Michael Harrison with a 15-yard TD strike in the second quarter and connected with Josh Cooper for 16 yards in the third. Kendall Hunter rushed for 143 yards on 28 carries for the Cowboys, who were coming off a 48-13 loss to Nebraska.

About as valuable as anyone for Oklahoma State was punter Quinn Sharp. With near-perfect trajectory and help from his coverage team, Quinn forced the Cats to start drives on their own 4, 8, 7 and 1.

After starting from the 1 midway through the fourth quarter, Kansas State struggled to a first down on the 14. But Thomas stepped up to pick off Carson Coffman's pass and snaked his way 26 yards into the end zone, making it 24-7 with 7:06 to play.

Weeden was 5 for 6 for 56 yards on an 11-play,

80-yard drive to go up 14-7 right after Kansas State squandered a great scoring opportunity. In the span of five plays, Oklahoma State was called for roughing the passer, a personal foul and having 12 men on the field. But given a first down on the 11, the Wildcats wound up missing a 24-yard field goal attempt by Josh Cherry, who had been 6 for 6. The Cowboys responded to take the lead on Weeden's pass to Harrison. Isaiah Anderson had a 40-yard reception during the drive.

Joseph Randle caught a 28-yard pass from Weeden to fuel a 10-play drive on Oklahoma State's next possession, capped by a 34-yard field goal by Dan Bailey, who is 16 for 16 and perfect on 44 extra-point attempts.

Thomas rushed for 101 yards for Kansas State, which took a 7-0 lead in the first quarter on William Powell's 8-yard run following Hunter's fumble.

It was the fourth sellout in five games at Bill Snyder Family Stadium.

MANHATTAN, Kan. - Collin Klein and Daniel Thomas ran for two touchdowns apiece and Kansas State intercepted Garrett Gilbert five times en route to a 39-14 victory Saturday night over Texas.

Thomas ran 34 yards for a touchdown on the second play from scrimmage, and things went downhill from there for the Longhorns (4-5, 2-4 Big 12), who are guaranteed their worst record in Mack Brown's 14 years as coach. The victory made Kansas State (6-3, 3-3) bowl eligible for the first time since 2006.

The win was also K-State's third straight against the Longhorns as the Wildcats have now scored 125 points in those three wins.

Klein, a surprise starter at quarterback over Carson Coffman, rushed for 127 yards and scored on runs of 12 and 10 yards.

Gilbert put more passes in Kansas State hands than did Klein, who was 2 for 4 for 9 yards. Klein's only completions were short tosses to Thomas, who went over the 1,000-yard rushing mark with 106 yards on 18 carries.

Gilbert was 32 for 59 for 272 yards and one touchdown. His interceptions led to 17 Kansas State points.

Another Kansas State touchdown drive was kept alive by two personal foul penalties against the Longhorns.

Stephen Harrison's interception of a tipped ball set up Josh Cherry's 30-yard field goal. Klein's 10-yard TD run followed Tysyn Hartman's first interception. Hartman's second interception led to Thomas' 9-yard scoring run.

Gilbert's 31-yard run in the fourth quarter set up Cody Johnson's 4-yard TD run, and with 31 seconds remaining, Gilbert tossed a 1-yard scoring pass to Dominique Jones.

Even when Texas did something right, it backfired. After William Powell made it 37-0 with an 8-yard run late in the third, Cherry's extra-point attempt was blocked. So Cherry simply picked up the ball, went to his left and carried it in for a 2-point conversion.

At one point, Gilbert threw interceptions on three straight passes. With only seconds to go in the first half, Ty Zimmerman stepped in front of the receiver in the end zone and may have scored if Gilbert hadn't brought him down on the Kansas State 41.

Hartman then intercepted Garrett's first pass of the second half, returning it 34 yards to set up Thomas' 9-yard run.

Next, it was Zimmerman's turn again. He scooped in Garrett's underthrown ball on his next throw.

COLUMBIA, Mo. - Blaine Gabbert accounted for three touchdowns in a strong bounce-back effort and No. 20 Missouri made just as many big plays on defense in a 38-28 victory over Kansas State.

The Tigers capitalized on three fumble recoveries, two of them huge swing plays, and scored 17 straight points to put away the Wildcats.

Kansas State had four turnovers, one of them wasting an opportunity to tie it in the final minute of the half when quarterback Carson Coffman fumbled the center snap at the Missouri 1. Jacques Smith's fumble recovery preserved Missouri's 21-14 lead and the defensive end scored on a 53-yard fumble return in the third quarter after Aldon Smith leveled Coffman with a sack.

T.J. Moe caught two touchdown passes from Gabbert, who was 17 of 25 for 208 yards with an interception while running for a season-best 89 yards on 14 carries.

Gabbert opened with seven straight completions, including a 25-yard scoring pass to Moe.

Coffman started for Kansas State, but the Wildcats had a lot more success with backup Collin Klein, who had 141 yards rushing on 18 carries.

Klein's running set up two short touchdown runs by Daniel Thomas in the first half.

Missouri led 38-14 before Kansas State scored a pair of late touchdowns on Klein's 35-yard pass to Adrian Hilburn and Coffman's 26-yard throw to Aubrey Quarles.

Gabbert had a big first half, going 11 of 13 for 98 yards and a touchdown and rushing for 70 yards on seven carries, including a 32-yard score.

Wide receiver Wes Kemp had a big peelback block on Gabbert's scoring scramble, leveling Terrance Sweeney. Kemp was among three wide receivers

who got carries in the first half, and Jerrell Jackson's 9-yard run made it 14-12 with 4:12 to go in the half.

Thomas, who had 66 yards on 12 carries, scored two touchdowns for the second straight game.
