QUICKLY -- After opening Big 12 Conference play with a 41-36 victory against lowa State, No. 17 AP/No. 15 Coaches Kansas (5-0, 1-0 Big 12) travels to Colorado (1-4, 0-1) for a nationally-televised game on FSN at 6 p.m. Central.

- KU at 5-0, is one of nine remaining unbeaten teams in the country. Two schools are 6-0, while KU is one of seven listed at 5-0.
- KU owns a seven-game winning streak dating back to last year, which is tied for the nation's fourth-longest winning streak.
- KU is 5-0 for the fourth time since 1921 and looking to improve to 6-0 for the fourth time in that span (11-0 in 2007, 7-0 in 1995 and 7-0 in 1968).
- KU is looking to start conference play 2-0 for the third straight season.
- KU is 15-4 in its last 19 games against Big 12 North opponents.
- KU is 28-7 in its last 35 games dating back to late in 2006.
- KU is playing just its second road game of the season (won 34-7 at UTEP on Sept. 12).
- KU is 7-4 in its last 11 road games.
- KU is 4-2 in Big 12 road games since the beginning of the 2007 season.
- KU is starting the last part of its schedule, which includes just two home games, four road games and one neutral site contest.

BIG 12 NORTH VS. BIG 12 NORTH -- Since the start of 2007 Kansas owns a 9-2 record against other members of the Big 12 North Division. That is tied with Missouri's 9-2 mark to top the Division rivalries. Nebraska is third at 7-4 while Colorado is 3-7, Kansas State is 3-8 and lowa State is 2-10.

DID YOU KNOW? -- While Kansas' seven-game winning streak is tied for the fourth-longest active streak in the NCAA right now, it is the fourth-longest streak at KU in the last 56 years.

Head Coach Mark Mangino

Mark Mangino (Youngstown State, 1987) is in his eighth season as the head coach at Kansas. Mangino has continually improved the Kansas program, which had not posted a winning record in any of the six seasons before his arrival. Prior to coming to Kansas, Mangino helped in the turnaround of the Kansas State football program in the 1990s before becoming an assistant at Oklahoma. He also coached at New Castle (Pa.) High School, Youngstown State, Geneva College, and Ellwood City (Pa.) High School.

MANGINO HIGHLIGHTS

- · Consensus National Coach of the Year (2007).
- Only coach in NCAA to earn both the national coach of the year and the national assistant coach of the year honors (Broyles Award in 2000).
- Has been a part of 13 bowl games in his last 16 years of coaching.
- Is the first Kansas coach to have a winning record since Jack Mitchell (44-42-5) in 1966 (KU had seven full-time coaches in between).
- Was the offensive coordinator for the national champion Oklahoma Sooners in 2000.

KANSAS ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN MANGINO ERA

- Four bowl games in a six-year span (2003-present). That represents one-third of KU's bowl appearances in just six years (eight bowl games in the previous 56 years since KU's first bowl game in 1948).
- · Bowl games in consecutive years (2007 and 2008) for the first time in school history.
- Three consecutive bowl victories for the first time in school history.
- Eight wins in consecutive seasons (2007 and 2008) for the first time since 1908 and 1909.
- Twenty wins in a two-year period, the most in consecutive years in school history (won 18 games combined in 2006-07 and 1904-05).
- Six wins in four-straight seasons (2005-08) for the first time since 1903-06.
- · Combined 33-17 record from 2005-08 for the most wins in a four-year period in school history.
- · Set new home attendance average records in each of the last four seasons.
- KU returned to the national polls in 2007, the Jayhawks' first ranking since 1996.
- KU was ranked in a school-record 19 consecutive Associated Press polls from 2007 through half of 2008.
- Reached No. 2 in the polls after winning first 11 games in 2007.

KANSAS HONORS IN MANGINO ERA

- KU has produced 72 All-Big 12 selections.
- KU has produced 45 Academic All-Big 12 First Team selections.
- Four Jayhawks were drafted after the 2007 season, including first-round selection Aqib Talib.
- In 2007 and 2008 KU had a combined three All-Americans and 24 All-Big 12 selections.
- A number of Jayhawks have made national award lists, including two finalists in Aqib Talib (Nagurski Award) and Anthony Collins (Outland Trophy) in 2007.

ANOTHER TOUGH SCHEDULE -- Based on the opponents' record, Kansas had the nation's seventh-most difficult schedule in 2008 as Jayhawk opponents were a combined 79-53 for a 59.8 winning percentage when not playing KU. This year KU's 11 FBS opponents were a combined 78-54 last season for a winning percentage of 59.1 percent when not playing the Jayhawks.

20-6 LAST TWO YEARS -- Kansas posted a combined 20-6 record in 2007 and 2008. Five of those six losses were to ranked teams, including three teams that were ranked fourth in the nation at game times. The only non-ranked team the Jayhawks lost to in the previous two seasons was at Nebraska in 2008. The Huskers would finish the year 9-4 after defeating Clemson in the Gator Bowl.

EXPLOSIVE OFFENSE -- In the last two years the Kansas offense has ranked among the best in the country. The 2007 team set school records in total offense, passing and scoring. Last year's team set a new record in passing offense.

FORCING TURNOVERS -- In the last two years the Kansas defense forced a combined 60 turnovers (35 in 2007 and 25 in 2008). That total was the ninth best in the nation in that span.

PRESEASON POLLS -- For the second year in a row, and seventh time overall, Kansas was ranked in the Associated Press AP Top 25 poll at the start of the 2009 season. This year the Jayhawks were listed No. 25. In 2007 KU was ranked 14th. KU's other preseason AP Top 25 listings include 1952 (17th), 1961 (8th), 1968 (12th), 1976 (19th), and 1996 (25th).

KU VS. AP TOP 25 -- Kansas has won five of its 17 games against ranked teams in the Mark Mangino era. Prior to his arrival KU had posted five wins in its previous 60 games against ranked teams.

KU CONFERENCE FINISHES -- Kansas tied for the Big 12 Conference North Division title in 2007 with a 7-1 conference record and placed third in 2008 with a 4-4 league mark. Prior to the last two seasons, KU had not finished higher than fourth in the North Division in the first 11 years of the conference.

TV EXPOSURE -- In 2007 and 2008 19 of 26 Kansas football games were televised nationally, including 11 straight in 2008. For the first time in history, all four KU non-conference games are being broadcast in 2009 and it is expected that all 12 regular season games will be televised for the first time as well.

BOWL APPEARANCES (AND WINS) -- Kansas has played in four bowl games in the first seven years of the Mark Mangino era. The Jayhawks had played in eight bowl games in the previous 55 seasons. Under Mangino KU appeared in consecutive bowls for the first time in history. KU has also won each of its last three bowl appearances, a first in Kansas football history.

NEW STUFF -- Prior to the start of the 2008 season a football facility was built adjacent to Memorial Stadium. In 2009 a new playing surface was added to the stadium as FieldTurf was laid down this past summer.

RED JERSEYS -- Kansas is 7-1 (lost to Texas Tech last year) when wearing red jerseys in the Mark Mangino era, including 1-0 this year (beat Southern Miss.). Prior to the Mangino era, KU last wore red jerseys in the 1947 Orange Bowl.

This Week's Game

KU-CU SERIES -- Colorado leads the all-time series 41-24-3, including a 23-9 advantage in games played in Boulder. Kansas has won three straight in the series since CU won five consecutive from 2001-05.

LOOKING TO MAKE HISTORY -- With its current three-game winning streak, Kansas is looking to win four straight against Colorado for the first time in the series which dates back to 1903. The Jayhawks won three straight from 1962-64. KU posted a five-game unbeaten streak from 1906-1948 with two wins, a tie and two wins.

REESING MADE COLLEGIATE DEBUT IN 2006 GAME -- After sitting out the first eight games of his freshman year, Todd Reesing was summoned to the second half of the game against Colorado and rallied the Jayhawks from a 9-0 deficit to a 20-15 win. Reesing threw two touchdown passes and ran for another in his collegiate debut.

KU-CU LAST YEAR – RB Jake Sharp rushed for 118 yards on a career-high 31 attempts and scored three touchdowns to lead then No. 16 Kansas to a 30-14 victory at Lawrence on Oct. 11, 2008. Kansas limited Colorado to just 233 yards of total offense, nearly 100 yards shy of its 325 yards per game average. S Darrell Stuckey and CB Kendrick Harper both came up with interceptions. KU meanwhile produced 407 yards of total offense as QB Todd Reesing completed 27 of 34 passes for 256 yards. KU led 16-14 going into the fourth quarter before Sharp scored on touchdown runs of eight and seven yards to put the game away.

KU-CU LAST TIME AT BOULDER -- Behind the leadership of QB Todd Reesing, then 15th-ranked Kansas held off Colorado 19-14 at Folsom Field on Oct. 20, 2007. Kansas built up a 19-7 lead after scoring on a 15-play, 94-yard drive with 10:23 left in the game. Colorado scored a touchdown to pull within 19-14 at the 3:42 mark. After Colorado forced KU to punt, the Buffaloes took over at their own 42-yard line with 2:16 remaining in the game. Kansas stopped the Buffs on four plays (CU lost eight yards on the possession) and the Jayhawks won their seventh straight game of the year. Reesing completed 20 of 29 passes for 153 yards and a touchdown while also rushing seven times for 84 yards. KU's defense registered seven tackles for loss, including three sacks, and came up with three turnovers.

KU-CU CONNECTIONS -- Kansas players from the state of Colorado include walkon RB Ryan Burton (Colorado Springs/Air Academy HS) and OL Ian Wolfe (Fort Collins)... PK Jacob Branstetter originally enrolled at Air Force, while OT Michael Martinovich spent one year at Air Force before transferring... Colorado does not list any Kansans on its roster.

JAYHAWKS VS. COLORADO -- Here is a look at how some Jayhawks have done vs. Colorado:

- QB Todd Reesing made his collegiate debut in the second half against Colorado in 2006 completing seven of 11 passes for 106 yards and two touchdowns, while also rushing for 90 yards and another score to rally the Jayhawks from a 9-0 deficit to a 20-15 win... In two and one half games against the Buffaloes he is a combined 54 of 74 (73 percent) for 515 yards and four passing touchdowns... The top two rushing games of his career have come against Colorado with 90 in 2006 and 84 in 2007 (his third-best rushing game was 79 vs. Northern Colorado this year).
- WR Dezmon Briscoe did not have a catch at Colorado in 2007, but has recorded at least two receptions in his 23 games since then... He was shutout on receptions just one other time in his career (zero vs. SE Louisiana in game two of his freshman year.
- TE Tim Biere had his previous career bests in both receptions (two) and yards (26) against Colorado last year. He is coming off his new career game with three catches for 53 yards against lowa State last week.
- WR/TE AJ Steward had his only career reception (for six yards) against Colorado last season.

THINGS TO LOOK FOR AGAINST COLORADO

- KU has scored at least 30 points in six straight road games.
- KU is looking to post its first ever four-game winning streak in the series with Colorado.
- QB Todd Reesing (9,157) needs 343 yards to pass Bret Meyer of lowa State for fifth on the Big 12 career passing yardage list.
- WR Kerry Meier (1,801) needs eight yards to pass Emmett Edwards (1,808) for fifth on the KU career receiving yardage list.
- Meier (15) needs one touchdown reception to tie Mark Simmons (16) for fourth and two to tie Willie Vaughn and Bruce Adams (17) for second on the KU career touchdown reception list.

Kansas Team Notes

LAST TIME OUT -- Kansas senior WR Kerry Meier set a school record with 16 receptions for a career-high 142 yards and two touchdowns, while senior QB Todd Reesing tied his school record with 37 completions for a career-high 442 yards and four touchdowns as No. 16 Kansas outlasted lowa State 41-36. Reesing's main two targets for the afternoon were Meier, with his record-setting 16 receptions and junior wide receiver Dezmon Briscoe, who had 12 catches for 186 yards and two touchdowns. Meier and Briscoe ended the day as KU's career receptions leaders with Meier first at 167 and Briscoe second at 165. For Reesing, his 442 yards were second in school history.

- Reesing threw four touchdown passes in a game for the seventh time in his career. He has 81 in his career to tie for sixth in Big 12 history.
- Reesing also moved into sixth on the Big 12 career passing yardage list with 9,157.

The Jayhawks are also among the nation's elite in first downs (third at 28.00), red zone scoring percentage (tie for third at 96 percent) and fourth-down conversions (tied for fourth at 85.71 percent).

500 CLUB -- For the third time this season Kansas produced 500 total offensive yards in game with its 551 against lowa State last week. In the 31 games since the start of 2007, KU has produced 400 yards in 25 games, 500 yards in 12 games, and one 600-yard game.

40 POINTS AGAIN -- Also for the third time this year Kansas scored 40 points in a game with 41 against lowa State. In the last 31 games KU has scored at least 30 points 24 times, 40 points 15 times, 50 points six times and 70 points once.

RED ZONE – Kansas has scored on a remarkable 25 of 26 possessions in the red zone this year, including 22 touchdowns. The only non-scoring drive when the Jayhawks reached the opponent 20 was a missed field goal at UTEP. Three schools are perfect in the red zone this year in Arkansas (20 of 20), Virginia (14 of 14) and San Jose State (11 of 11). KU's 22 touchdowns in the red zone are tied for second nationally behind only BYU's 23 touchdowns (on 28 trips).

DEFENSE DOING WELL IN THE FOURTH QUARTER -- In the last two games, with the game on the line in the fourth quarter, the KU defense has managed to come up big when it needed to. Against Southern Miss. with the game tied heading into the fourth quarter, KU forced USM into an interception, two punts and a drive which ended on downs. Last week against lowa State, KU trailed 30-27 before holding ISU to a punt, a touchdown and a drive ending on downs in the final period en route to the victory.

REESING LEADS NATION -- KU QB Todd Reesing has the nation's longest active streak of games with a touchdown pass at 23 consecutive contests. Colt McCoy of Texas is second at 22, while Case Keenum of Houston is third at 21.

RECEIVER DUO SETTING RECORDS -- The wide receiver combination of Dezmon Briscoe and Kerry Meier has become guite a record-setting duo. Here are some notes on the two:

- Briscoe became KU career receiving yardage leader last week and has 2,420 career yards.
- Meier and Briscoe both passed the previous KU career receptions mark last week as Meier is now first with 167 catches and Briscoe second with 165. Mark Simmons held the old mark with 155.
- Briscoe extended his school records for touchdown receptions (25) and career 100-yard games (10).
- Meier broke the school record he had shared with Briscoe for receptions in a game (both had 14 last year) with 16 against lowa State last week.
- Meier has eight career 100-yard receiving games to trail only Briscoe's 10 in KU history.
- The two have combined for 40 career receiving touchdowns to tie for first among active duos in the NCAA.
- Meier has caught at least 10 passes in five games, including four times in the last seven games. He has caught at least four passes in eight straight games, at least two in 26 consecutive and at least one in 28 in a row
- Briscoe has caught at least four passes in eight straight games and at least two in 23 consecutive games.
- Briscoe has recorded at least 100 receiving yards in seven of his last eight games.

REESING RACKING UP NUMBERS TOO -- KU QB Todd Reesing's day against lowa State was on of the nation's best performances this season. His 442 passing yards marked the eighth best total in the country this season, while his 454 yards of total offense was ninth and his 37 completions 11th.

OFFENSIVE NOTES -- KU has run at least 80 plays in three games this season, which matches last year's 13-game total... KU has had one or fewer turnovers in three of five games... KU has scored at least four touchdowns in nine of its last 10 games, including all five this year... KU has scored at least 30 points in seven straight games dating back to last year, as well as in nine of its last 10... KU has scored in 19 of 20 quarters this season (exception was third quarter against Northern Colorado)... KU has had 10 scoring drives of at least 10 plays, including six in the last two games... KU has scored on nearly half of its possessions this year with 30 scores (27 touchdowns) on 61 possessions.

DEFENSIVE NOTES -- KU had allowed just 240 rushing yards in the first four games combined before lowa State rushed for 216 last week... Against lowa State the KU defense did not force a turnover for the first time in 11 games... KU's six sacks at UTEP is tied for the ninth best sack day in the country this year... Eight different Jayhawks have a sack as KU has recorded 16 sacks in five games this season after recording 29 in 13 games last year... KU defensive ends have eight interceptions in the last 29 games.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES -- KU has not attempted a field goal in the last two games and in fact has not attempted a field goal in six of its last nine games... KU has had better field position than its opponent in four of the first five games (exception was lowa State when the Cyclones averaged starting on their own 29 and KU its 26-yard line.

FIRST-TIME STARTERS -- This season 12 players have made their first career starts, including three true freshmen in RB Toben Opurum, WR Bradley McDougald and LB Huldon Tharp. OT Tanner Hawkinson has started as a redshirt freshman. Other first-time starters this year include OG Brad Thorson, OG Sal Capra, DE Maxwell Onyegbule, DT Patrick Dorsey, LB Drew Dudley, LB Justin Springer, CB Anthony Davis and DB Ryan Murphy.

FRESHMEN SEE PLAYING TIME -- In the season opener 10 freshmen saw action including three true freshmen in WR Bradley McDougald, LB Huldon Tharp and RB Toben Opurum. Redshirt freshmen who played for the first time included QB Kale Pick, S Lubbock Smith, CB Greg Brown, OL Trevor Marrongelli, OL John Williams, OL Tanner Hawkinson and DT Duane Zlatnik.

KU NOTABLE -- KU does not have a senior on its offensive line two deep, instead starting two juniors, two sophomores and one freshman... Kansas lists just 14 seniors on its roster with eight of those players listed as starters... S Darrell Stuckey leads the team with 35 consecutive starts and 35 career starts... QB Todd Reesing has started 31 consecutive games with OT Jeff Spikes (18), WR Kerry Meier (18), OC Jeremiah Hatch (17), DE Jake Laptad (11), and CB Daymond Patterson the only other players with at least 10-straight starts... Seven Jayhawks have started at least 20 games in their careers including Stuckey (35), Reesing (31), Meier (31), WR Dezmon Briscoe (27), DT Caleb Blakesley (26), S Justin Thornton (25), and CB Chris Harris (22).

50,000-PLUS -- Kansas has drawn crowds of 50,000-plus for three of four home games this season (48,203 in the cold vs. lowa State last week), as well as in 10 of its last 13 home games. The Jayhawks set season attendance average records in four straight years entering the 2009 campaign.

Has thrown for at least 300 yards in 16 games and 400 twice in his career and his career 269.3 yards per game is fourth among active quarterbacks in the country... Has thrown at least three touchdown passes in 16 games and four touchdowns in seven games... Has thrown at least one touchdown pass in a current NCAA-best 23 consecutive games and in 30 of 31 games (none in win at Texas A&M in 2007)... His 442 yards last week against lowa State were the second most in school history, while his 37 completions tied his own school record (he has done that three times)

KALE PICK - Saw first collegiate action against Northern Colorado and was two-of-two for 11 yards passing, while running for 47 yards on three carries... At UTEP ran twice for 87 yards, including a 55-yard rush... Had an 18-yard run vs. Duke... Did not play in last two games.... 2008 KU offensive scout team player of the year. KERRY MEIER - Started eight games at QB as a freshman in 2006... Career passing numbers are 133 of 218 (61.3 percent) for 1,598 yards and 17 touchdowns... As a backup QB the last two years he is 28 of 32 for 349 yards and four touchdowns... This season he is one of two for 56 yards.

RUNNING BACKS

JAKE SHARP - Has not played in the last two games due to an injury... Rushed for 100 yards in each of the first two games before playing sparingly against Duke due to injury (13 yards on five carries, seven-yard touchdown reception)... Has a touchdown reception in three straight games... His 168 career points are seventh in KU history... Is averaging 12.0 points per game... Has 2,050 career rushing yards.

TOBEN OPURUM - In last game against Southern Miss he became the first KU freshman since 2002 to rush for 100 yards in a game with 106... Followed that with 98 yards on 24 attempts against lowa State last week... The true freshman has rushed for seven touchdowns in the first four games... Against Southern Miss. he had a rushing and receiving touchdown.

WIDE RECEIVERS

KERRY MEIER - Has put together consecutive career-high receiving yardage games in the last two weeks with 141 yards on 10 catches against Southern Miss. and then a school-record 16 receptions for a new career-best 142 yards against Iowa State last week... Became the KU career receptions leader against Iowa State... Has recorded at least 100 receiving yards in five of the last seven games... Has five touchdown receptions in the last three games... Has caught at least 10 passes in four of the last seven games, at least four in eight straight, at least two in 26 consecutive and at least one in 28 in a row.

LAWRENCE, Kan. – To get the Jayhawks' 2009 season off on the right foot, senior quarterback Todd Reesing took matters into his own hands - and feet. Before a record crowd of 52,530, Reesing rushed for KU's first two scores and threw a pair of second guarter touchdown passes to give the 25th-ranked Jayhawks a 49-3 triumph over visiting Northern Colorado in the season-opener at Kivisto Field at Memorial Stadium Saturday evening. The senior quarterback accounted for 287 of KU's 543 yards in the game, carrying the ball 13 times for 79 yards and throwing for 208. On the Jayhawks' first play from scrimmage, Reesing hit fellow senior Kerry Meier on a slant pattern for 30 yards, which set the tone for the KU offense. Reesing capped the drive with a one-yard scamper around the left end in which he juked his way through a group of would-be tacklers to give KU a 7-0 lead. Reesing capped another long drive with a 13-yard run early in the second quarter and then threw touchdown passes to Jake Sharp on a shovel pass and Tertavian Ingram to give Kansas a 28-0 lead heading into the halftime break. Reesing led Kansas on one more scoring drive, a seven-play, 64-yard march, before giving way to backup quarterback Kale Pick early in the fourth quarter. Kansas ran for 328 yards, compared to just 74 on the ground for Northern Colorado. As impressive as the Jayhawk offense was, the defense might have been better. Kansas held the Bears to 246 yards of total offense, including 95 in the first half. Northern Colorado penetrated the Jayhawk 20-yard line just twice in the contest, with both drives ending with field goal tries.

EL PASO, Texas - Senior DE Maxwell Onyegbule and the Jayhawk defense set the tone early as Kansas rolled past UTEP 34-7. In the first half alone, Onyegbule had two sacks and four total tackles for loss to lead a defense that finished the half with five sacks, an interception and a pair of guarterback hurries. UTEP was forced to punt on six of its seven possessions of the period and mustered just three first downs. With the defense and special teams setting the tone, it gave the offense the breathing room it needed to get in rhythm. As it turned out, it was just what the offense needed after putting just three points on the board for the first quarter and a half. Kansas opened the scoring with a 21-yard field goal from junior PK Jacob Branstetter. After forcing UTEP to punt on its opening possession, the Jayhawks drove the ball 75 yards on their opening drive with the key play coming on a trick play where senior WR Kerry Meier hit streaking junior WR Dezmon Briscoe for 56 yards through the air. Kansas punted on its next two possessions then came to life, scoring on its next three. Kansas racked up 250 yards of total offense in the first half compared to just 49 for UTEP. Reesing went 17-of-26 through the air for 134 yards and a TD. UTEP was able to get on the board at the 12:39 mark of the fourth quarter on a 75-yard touchdown pass from Trevor Vittatoe to Donavon Kemp. The TD wiped away KU's attempt at a shutout, but the defense still had to walk away happy. For the game, the defense held UTEP to just 208 yards and seven first downs. Seven players recorded tackles for losses led by Onvegbule with five. Add to that line six guarterback hurries, three passes broken up and an interception, and it was a good night in El Paso. Reesing finished 25-of-41 for 260 yards, one touchdown and one interception. Kansas racked up 576 total yards and outdid the Miners 23-7 on first downs.

LAWRENCE, Kan. – Kansas QB Todd Reesing threw for 338 yards and three touchdowns and also collected 51 yards on the ground to lead Kansas to a 44-16 win over Duke. Reesing completed 28-of-41 passes against the Blue Devils, including touchdowns to three different receivers. His 338 yards in the air marked his seventh-straight game with 200 or more passing yards and his 14th career 300-yard passing game. Duke opened the game with a two-play 87-yard scoring drive capped by a 21-yard touchdown run by QB Thaddeus Lewis. Kansas answered right back with a with a 14-yard touchdown reception by WR Dezmon Briscoe just two and half minutes later to knot the score at 7-7 midway through the first quarter. The two teams traded punts on the next few possessions before Reesing connected with RB Jake Sharp for a six-yard TD with just under five minutes remaining in the first half. Reesing collected his third TD pass of the first half as he hit WR Kerry Meier in the end zone for a six-yard score with just over a minute to play before the break. The Jayhawk defense got the scoring started in the second half of play as DE Maxwell Onyegbule picked off a Lewis pass on the opening possession of the third quarter. Onyebule returned the interception for a 48-yard touchdown pushing the Kansas lead to 27-7. Briscoe finished the game with 117 yards receiving, his sixth-straight 100-yard receiving game. S Darrell Stuckey led the Jayhawk defense with a season-high 11 tackles. LB Huldon Tharp recorded a career-high 10 tackles, while LB Drew Dudley finished with a career-best eight tackles. KU finished with five sacks on the afternoon.

LAWRENCE, Kan. - Senior wide receiver Kerry Meier hauled in 10 passes for a career-high 141 yards and two touchdowns and senior quarterback Todd Reesing passed former Texas quarterback Vince Young for seventh on the all-time Big 12 total yards list as No. 20 Kansas defeated Southern Mississippi 35-28 at Memorial Stadium. KU's victory ended the nation's second longest winning streak at eight games. Reesing completed 30-of-41 passes against the Golden Eagles, including touchdowns to two different receivers. His 331 yards in the air marked his 15th career 300-yard passing game. The Jayhawks got off to an ideal start when Reesing connected with Meier for a 62-yard touchdown on the fourth play of the contest. After three-consecutive passes to begin the game's opening drive, Reesing found Meier open in the middle of field and the senior wide receiver did the rest, running away from his defender for his second touchdown of the season. After Southern Miss tied the game at 28, Kansas received ideal field position after Darrell Stuckey posted a 50-yard kick return to place the ball at the Southern Miss 40-yard line just before the end of the third quarter. The Jayhawks took advantage of the kick return, and Reesing found Meier uncovered for a 12-yard touchdown, his second of the game, to make the score 35-28. The KU defense then held USM to 27 yards in the fourth quarter as USM threw an interception, punted twice and had a drive end on downs to end the game.

LAWRENCE, Kan. - Kansas senior WR Kerry Meier set a school record with 16 receptions for a career-high 142 yards and two touchdowns, while senior QB Todd Reesing tied his school record with 37 completions for a career-high 442 yards and four touchdowns as No. 16 Kansas outlasted Iowa State 41-36. Reesing's main two targets for the afternoon were Meier, with his record-setting 16 receptions and junior WR Dezmon Briscoe, who had 12 catches for 186 yards and two touchdowns. Meier and Briscoe ended the day as KU's career receptions leaders with Meier first at 167 and Briscoe at 165. For Reesing, his 442 yards were second in school history. Despite the offensive fire power displayed by the Jayhawks, the team needed a fourth-down stop at its own 31-yard line to solidify the win. Trailing by five with 2:36 remaining in the game, ISU regained possession on its own 34-yard line and marched to the KU 31 before the Jayhawks' defense held fast to produce a turnover on downs. KU CB Chris Harris made a huge tackle of Iowa State receiver Jake Williams on second-and-10 and then broke up the third-down pass, resulting in a fourth-and-nine attempt for the Cyclones. On fourth down, pressure forced ISU quarterback Austen Arnuad's pass to sail incomplete. KU scored what proved to be the winning touchdown when Reesing hit Meier in the end zone with a six-yard touchdown pass, giving Kansas a 41-30 with 8:42 remaining on the game clock. Reesing went 5-for-6 for 61 yards on the drive, while Meier caught three passes and tallied his fifth touchdown of the season.
