Colorado Buffaloes (3-1, 0-0 Pac-12) vs. Oregon Ducks (2-2, 0-1 Pac-12)

October 3, 2015 • Folsom Field • Boulder, Colo. • 8:07 p.m. MDT

"GREEN GAME NOTES" Instead of running up to 60 pages of notes and statistics, Colorado has gone "green" to conserve paper. All seats in the press box receive the CU "short stack," 4-6 pages plus stats; we do have a few sets of full in-depth game notes for those who would like them. Also, due to former NCAA regulations and limitations, we stopped printing a bound media guide (those restrictions were actually done away with in 2014 but word did not make it down to most SIDs); we do have all that information available in a supplement, but since we thought we could not bind, most of our books are loose leaf; you can punch holes in it or take to Fed Ex Office to have it wire bound. Just ask for either or both at the Colorado SID area of the press box!

THE QUICK OF IT The **Colorado Buffaloes** (3-1, 0-0 Pac-12) open their fifth-year of play in the Pac-12 Conference tonight in hosting one of last year's College Football Playoff's finalists, the **Oregon Ducks** (2-2, 0-1 Pac-12) in a 8:07 p.m. kickoff here at Folsom Field ... Kickoff could slide back five minutes to 8:12 if the Mississippi at Florida game on ESPN runs long ... This is CU's first appearance on the ESPN's "matriarch" channel since Oct. 11, 2012 (Arizona State); it will also be available in Spanish online on ESPN3 ... A crowd in the 46,000 range is expected tonight, as just over 44,700 tickets had been sold though the close of business Friday ... There will be a moment of silence prior to the national anthem to honor those who died in Thursday's shooting at Umpqua Community College in Roseburg, Ore. (which is about 60 miles south of Eugene in Interstate 5) ... CU is out to end an 11-game losing streak in Pac-12 games, and is 1-3 in Pac-12 openers (**79-40-2** all-time in conference openers) ... CU has won three straight games for the first time since the first three contests of the 2008 season ... In its final non-league tune-up, Colorado defeated Nicholls State last Saturday, 48-0 in Boulder; it was a dominating performance on many levels; e.g., Colorado did not have a negative play on offense against Nicholls until its 92nd and 93rd plays—two kneel-downs at the end of the game CU is dressing 77 players tonight, for the first time ever in black helmets-silver jerseys-black pants (**64** scholarship): **12** seniors, **21** juniors, **23** sophomores, **13** redshirt frosh and **8** true freshmen (or **33** upper- and **44** underclassmen); three regulars are out due to injury (**TB Michael Adkins**, **TB Patrick Carr**, **ILB Addison Gillam**).

LATE WORKERS About 40 minutes after the game, we'll provide a snack for those working into the early evening (pizza).

GAME REPLAYS Tonight's game will be replayed on ESPN at 1:30 a.m. MDT Monday morning (Oct. 5); it will also be featured on the Pac-12 Network's "Football in 60" on Tuesday at 1 a.m., 6 a.m. and 11 a.m. (and numerous other times on Pac-12 Mountain). Also on Tuesday (Oct. 6), the Pac-12 Network will feature in "**Pac-12 Classics**," the Colorado at Missouri game from 1990 – 25 years to the day of the infamous "Fifth Down."

THE WELCOME To our guests from Oregon, including athletic director **Rob Mullens** and sports information staffers **Dave Williford**, **Andy McNamara** and **Rob Moseley** (UO SID seats: row 1, 19-21). Former longtime Denver Bronco general manager **John Beake** is a guest with us tonight, as is former *Boulder Camera* sportswriter **Ryan Thorburn** who is now with the Eugene Register-Guard. Several NFL scouts are here this evening, three from the Minnesota Vikings in town to play the Broncos Sunday (including general manager **Rick Spielman** and assistant GM **George Paton**), along with representatives from the Broncos (**Brian Stark**), Chicago, Dallas, Detroit, N.Y. Jets and San Diego.

THE WEATHER The temperature at kickoff is expected to be around 55 degrees, with a 60 percent chance of scattered thunderstorms with humidity in the 80 percent range but with mild winds (8 mph from the northeast). The temperature is forecast to be 50 degrees come the 11 O'clock hour.

- **Last Time Rain at Folsom:** light rain fell in the second half on Oct. 14, 2006 vs. Texas Tech.
- **Last Heavy Rain at Folsom:** fourth quarter on Sept. 14, 1996 vs. Michigan (most/all of game: Sept. 11, 1982 vs. California).
- **Last Snow at Folsom:** throughout the game on Nov. 11, 2000 vs. Iowa State (snow has fallen during a game at Folsom just six times since 1949).
- **Last Significant/"Game Affecting" Winds at Folsom:** all game long on Nov. 16, 2013 vs. California (wind gusts of 32 to 47 miles per hour).

THE LOOKOUT Some things to look for in tonight's game from the CU perspective:

- ☒ CU is looking to win **four** games in a row since a five-game winning streak during the 2002 season.
- ☒ **TB Christian Powell** has **1,946** career rushing yards (19th all-time); he needs 54 to become the 18th player at CU to reach 2,000.
- ☒ **S Jered Bell** has **6** interceptions; only two players since 1999 have more (14, Terrence Wheatley, 2003-07; 7, Medford Moorer, 2000-03).
- ☒ **TB Phillip Lindsay** has **931** career kickoff return yards (8th all-time); only six CU players have 1,000-plus, thus needs 69 to become the seventh.
- ☒ **QB Sefo Liufau** is tied for second with Joel Klatt (2002-05) in touchdown passes (**44**), trailing only Cody Hawkins (60, 2007-10); he has 862 attempts (fourth), needing 11 to pass Tyler Hansen (872, 2008-11) into third. He has **6,072** yards of total offense (fifth); he needs 110 to move into fourth to pass Hansen (6,183). He's fifth in total plays (**1,004**), needing 48 to pass Hansen (1,051) into fourth.
- ☒ **WR Nelson Spruce** has locked up the all-time lead in career receptions with **230** (he's now 30 shy of becoming the all-time Pac-12 leader) and in receiving yards with **2,570**. He is tied for third with **20** career touchdowns (Scotty McKnight had 22 from 2007-10, Paul Richardson had 21 from 2010-13). He has caught at least one pass in **29** straight games (multiple in **25** straight, another record).

THE WEEK AHEAD The team will meet on Sunday ahead of a short practice (4:50-5:50); there is an interview window afterward. **Monday:** NCAA mandatory day off; **Tuesday:** 8:45-10:50 a.m. and **Wednesday:** 8:45-10:50 a.m.; player interviews allowed after both and also later any of those days per athlete discretion. The team will depart Friday (Noon) for next Saturday's game at Arizona State. **Mike MacIntyre's** weekly press luncheon are on Tuesdays, and we likely will be in Touchdown Club in the Dal Ward Center once again but will confirm via Email on Monday (11:30 a.m. lunch, 11:45 QB Sefo Liufau, 12:00 MacIntyre, other players TBA).

LOCKERROOM POLICY... Colorado's locker room is closed; **Mike MacIntyre** and 3-4 players will speak to the media in the press conference room (319) in the new Champions Center; additional players will be available outside the CU locker room in the "thundershoot." Graduate assistant SID **Anthony Lepine** will coordinate the conference; student assistants **Cydney Tanner** and **Dave Collins** will coordinate player interviews (no deadline to submit requests). **David Plati** coordinates notes and the injury report. Oregon's postgame will be held in the lobby area outside the back entrance to their locker room.

ESPN & ABC Sports both operate under a basic **3-4-3-4** commercial format for television broadcasts (three each in the first and third quarters and four each in the second and fourth quarters). The below are all guaranteed and are the only breaks; here are the actual lengths of each, including the 10 seconds of both lead-in and get-out time:

ESPN/ABC may take floater breaks (4 x :30) at its own risk without the game being stopped by the TV liaison. As always, the intent is to not call a media timeout that will interrupt the flow of the game, e.g., each team having one possession at the start of each half if the team that gets the ball first commits a turnover. In those rare instances where there are not three natural breaks in a quarter, timeouts not taken will be made up later in the game (at an appropriate time). All team timeouts not utilized as part of the media commercial format will be 35-seconds in length; the 25-second clock will start at the end of these 35 seconds, so timeouts taken by the media are at their own risk.

INSTANT REPLAYS: TV has the option of going to a commercial break (2:30) in any quarter when there is a booth review; it cannot ask the redhat (TV liaison) for a break if it has already used all four breaks in a quarter, so throwing it to a commercial by either TV or radio is at their own risk.

Break between 1st & 2nd Quarters: 205 seconds (3:25).

Break between 3rd & 4th Quarters: 205 seconds (3:25).

Overtime: If there is overtime, television will not break away and will remain live through the coin toss for the overtime period. Following the toss, there will be a 180-second break (3:00) taken prior to the start of the first overtime period; there will be an 80-second break (1:20) after each overtime period. If a team takes its one allotted timeout during an overtime period, the maximum length is 90 seconds (1:30) and will NOT be extended for television (it's a 60-second timeout, official waits 5 seconds, then declares the ball ready for play and starts the 25-second clock. Remember, coaches have the option of making it a 30-second timeout, and that the team that called the timeout may request that play be resumed at any time, and, if the opponent is prepared, the ball will be declared ready for play (thus there is no assurance how long these breaks could be).

REMINDER-NCAA RULE: The play clock will start upon return from the commercial break at the redhat signal; it will be 25 seconds in length, NOT the 40 between plays, unless there was a defensive injury or a helmet came off a defensive player; in those cases, the play clock would be set at 40 seconds. **Team Timeouts** not utilized as media timeouts will be 30-second breaks (the 25-second play clock starts at end of 30 seconds).

SERIES HISTORY—CU vs. OREGON

Colorado and Oregon have met 19 times, with the Ducks winning the last five games to take an **11-8** advantage, its first lead in the series since leading 1-0 (the Buffs then won five of the next six, Oregon caught CU at 12 games (6-6), but the Buffs won the next two to go up 8-6 before the Ducks' current run). The 19 games are the most involving the Buffs and a previous Pac-10 Conference school (CU has played Utah 61 times). Oregon leads 5-2 in Eugene, where it has won the last four games (1984, 1986, 2012, 2014) and is ahead in Boulder as well, 5-4; the Ducks went 24 years between visits to Folsom since the 1987 season opener and 2011; the three meetings between the two schools in that period were all in the postseason ('96 Cotton, '98 Aloha, '02 Fiesta). That Sept. 12, 1987 game was the first career contest for several notable Buffaloes, including future All-Americans **Alfred Williams**, **Eric Bieniemy**, **Kanavis McGhee** and **Joe Garten**. Overall points in the series were as close as can be, with Oregon owning a slight 323-319 edge, until the last four years, when the Ducks have outscored the Buffs by 216-42 (45-2, 70-14, 57-16 and 44-10); those wins by the Ducks extended their edge to 539-361. Oregon owns the high-point game in the series with its 70 it put on the scoreboard in Eugene in 2012; CU's high of 51 came in the '98 Aloha Bowl and UO has registered the lone shutout (35-0 in 1956). The two schools, based in very similar liberal-minded towns, formed a tremendous bond in 1984 when CU tight end **Ed Reinhardt** suffered a life-threatening brain injury and would spend a month in a coma in a Eugene hospital before he awoke and was able to return to Colorado; he continues rehab for the injury to this day.

SERIES DID YOU KNOW?—Perhaps the biggest play in the series for Colorado was a defensive one. In 1985, Colorado had switched to the wishbone offense and won its opener over Colorado State, 23-10; the Buffs were in search of their first 2-0 start since 1978. Oregon was up next, in Boulder, and that 2-0 goal would be in danger. The Buffs opened up a quick 14-0 lead on "Ed Reinhardt Day," honoring CU's tight end who suffered a brain injury the previous year against in Eugene. However, UO bounced back to go up 17-14, but a Mark Hatcher 22-yard run put CU back on top, 21-17, early in the fourth quarter. The Ducks mounted a final threat that had them in a first-and-goal at the CU 5. The Buffs squelched the first three tries, and on fourth-and-goal with seven ticks remaining, SS Mickey Pruitt sacked QB Chris Miller for a 14-yard loss, preserving the CU win and back-to-back victories to open a season in seven years.

SERIES SIGNATURE ANNIVERSARY GAME — 30th. On Sept. 14, 1985, the Buffaloes were playing just the second game in their new wishbone offense, having dispatched Colorado State a week earlier, 23-10. It was "Ed Reinhardt Day" on the CU campus, a tribute to both Ed, the CU tight end who suffered a serious brain injury in the 1984 game at Oregon, and the people of Eugene who responded in droves to help Ed and his family in a time of need. CU jumped to a 14-0 first quarter lead on touchdown runs by **FB Anthony Weatherspoon** and **QB Mark Hatcher**, only to see Oregon rally to take a 17-14 lead heading into the fourth quarter. Hatcher scored from 22 yards out midway in the quarter to put the Buffs back up, 21-17, but the Ducks worked to a 1st-and-goal from the CU 5 in the final minute. After failing on its first three tries with the ball on the CU 3, Mickey Pruitt's sack of Oregon quarterback Chris Miller (*right*) as time ran out preserved CU's 21-17 win over the Ducks, capping an emotional day at Folsom Field. CU opened with a 2-0 record for the first time since 1978.

COLORADO & CONFERENCE OPENERS

In 121 conference openers in its history, Colorado has compiled a **79-40-2** record (a 66.1 winning percentage), including a 36-15-1 mark at Folsom Field (and 51-16-1 at home overall). Colorado was not a member of a conference from 1890-92 and did not play a conference schedule in 1905. Colorado was **7-8** in Big 12 Conference openers, as the Buffaloes started league play on the road six times in the final eight years it was a member of the league. In 63 conference openers in the Big Seven/Eight/12, the Buffs were **36-26-1** overall, including a 23-12-1 mark at home. CU is 1-3 in Pac-12 conference openers, its win coming at Washington State in 2012 (by a 35-34 score). The breakdown:

SIGNATURE CONFERENCE OPENER ANNIVERSARY GAME — 20th Backup quarterback **John Hessler** made his first career start, doing so against the arrogance of Oklahoma coach Howard Schnellenberger, who implied he'd rather CU be healthy so there "wouldn't be a damn asterisk when we beat their --." **Koy Detmer** went down with a knee injury the previous week and Hessler came off the bench to lead CU to a 29-21 win over #3 Texas A&M. After spotting OU a 10-0 lead, Hessler and the Buffs dismantled the 10th-ranked Sooners, as the sophomore signal caller threw a school record five touchdowns in CU's 38-17 rout in Norman. He carved up the Oklahoma secondary by completing 24-of-34 passes for 348 yards with the five TDs and no interceptions, remaining in the game after he took a shot to the ribs late in the first quarter (ESPN's Lee Corso predicted on the air that the Sooners would put Hessler out of the game and he didn't want Corso to be right. WR Rae Carruth caught five of those balls for 112 yards and two scores.
