A BRIEF PREVIEW

The Sacramento State football team will continue its tour of Football Bowl Subdivision teams when it travels to historic Folsom Field to take on Colorado on Saturday, Sept. 8, in Boulder, Colo. The game will kick off at 1 p.m. MT.

There will be multiple ways to follow this week's game. Hornet fans can tune in to Classic 93.1 FM and KAH 950 AM in the foothills to hear the radio call of Jason Ross, Steve McElroy and Danny Sullivan. Live audio streaming is also available via www.hornetsports.com and on the iHeart Radio application for mobile devices.

The game will also be televised by the newly created Pac-12 Network. Matt Smith will handle the play-by-play with color commentary coming from Colorado All-American and freestyle moguls skiing Olympian Jeremy Bloom.

This week's game will mark the first time the Hornets will play an FBS team in consecutive weeks. The only other time Sacramento State has played a pair of FBS teams in the same season came in 2007 (Sperbeck's first) when it played at Fresno State and New Mexico. The Hornets are also slated to face Arizona State and San Jose State in 2013.

The 2012 season began with a 49-19 loss at New Mexico State last Thursday. The Hornets fell behind early, 28-3, but rallied to close within nine (28-19) midway through the third quarter. From there, three turnovers led to 21 unanswered points by the Aggies.

Colorado lost a 22-17 affair to in-state rival Colorado State in a game played at the Broncos' Sports Authority Field. The Buffaloes jumped to a 14-3 lead but saw it evaporate behind a pair of fumbles. Junior quarterback Jordan Webb, who transferred from Kansas in the offseason, completed 22-of-41 passes for 187 yards and two touchdowns but was sacked five times in the loss. As a team, CU was limited to 58 rushing yards while allowing 125.

THE COACHES

Marshall Sperbeck is in his sixth season as the head coach at Sacramento State. During that span, Sperbeck has produced a 24-32 overall record. For a complete bio, please see page 2.

Colorado is coached by Jon Embree who is in his second season. A former player at CU, who most recently was an assistant with the Washington Redskins, Embree owns 3-10 overall record.

THE SERIES

Sacramento State and Colorado have never met in football until this season. The Hornets are 6-1 against Colorado teams, losing at Colorado State in 2008 and going 6-0 against Northern Colorado.

QUICK HITTERS

- Sacramento State will be looking to open the season 1-1 for the fourth time in the last five years.
- The team has faced a Football Bowl Subdivision opponent each season since 2002 — a streak which dates back to a game against UTEP.
- The team's lone win against an FBS team came last season where Sacramento State recorded a 29-28 overtime victory at Oregon State.

MARSHALL SPERBECK BIO

Marshall Sperbeck is in his sixth year as the Sacramento State head coach. Sperbeck was hired to lead the Hornets on Jan. 13, 2007 and became the ninth head coach in school history.

No coach in Hornet history has won more games overall or in conference in their first five seasons than Sperbeck. His overall and conference winning percentages also rank second in school history through four seasons, trailing only legendary head coach Ray Clemons.

In 2010, Sacramento State enjoyed one of its finest seasons since moving to Div. I. The Hornets had 13 players earn all-Big Sky honors, including defensive end Zack Nash who was a second team All-American. The Sacramento State offense, which is under Sperbeck's direction, thrived over the last seven weeks of the year, averaging 36.6 points per game and scoring at least 40 points three times.

Sperbeck's transformation of the program began to show in 2008 when the team posted the second most victories in the school's Div. I-AA/FCS era. Sacramento State also set team records on both sides of the ball and had three players named first team all-Big Sky.

In 2009, Sperbeck had 10 members of his team earn all-Big Sky honors, raising his total of 35 during his career. Among those honored were defensive tackle Christian Clark who was named second team All-America by The Sports Network.

In his time with the Hornets, Sperbeck has coached three All-Americans, including Nash who earned the honor in 2010 and 2011.

Prior to coming to Sacramento State, Sperbeck was the head football coach at Foothill College for 15 years. During that time, he produced a 109-53 overall record and led the Owls to 11 bowl games.

A native of Sacramento, Sperbeck graduated from Valley High School. He later played at Nevada from 1981-82 and led the team to a pair of winning seasons while throwing for 3,425 yards.

Sperbeck earned a bachelor's of science degree in physical education from Nevada in 1984 and later added a master's of education in 1989.

THE LATEST ACTION

The Sacramento State football team cut a second half deficit to just nine points but couldn't complete the comeback against New Mexico State, losing 49-19 on Thursday night at Aggie Memorial Stadium.

Sophomore quarterback Garrett Safron threw for a career high 308 yards and two touchdowns on 23-of-35 passing and the Hornets had three pass catchers — DeAndre Carter, Morris Norrise and T.J. Knowles — each tally more than 75 yards receiving. Junior running back Ezekiel Graham led the Hornets with 46 rushing yards on 16 carries.

After going down early on two long touchdown passes from NMSU quarterback Andrew Manley and a 2-yard run by Tiger Powell, the Hornets got on the board after junior kicker Edgar Castaneda booted his first career field goal from 32 yards out with 2:35 left in the first half. New Mexico State scored again on an 84-yard touchdown pass shortly after but the Hornets did not fold going into the break.

After a long pass from Safron to Carter down the Hornets' sideline, the duo hooked up again on an 8-yard touchdown strike on 4th-and-goal with 17 seconds left in the half.

Sacramento State carried that momentum into the third quarter, with Castaneda's second field goal, this time from 25 yards out, on the Hornets' first drive of the half. The Sacramento State defense forced a three-and-out which led to a 25-yard strike to tight end T.J. Knowles.

New Mexico State rallied in the fourth quarter, turning three Sacramento State turnovers into 21 fourth-quarter points to put the game away.

Safron's passing total was the first 300-yard performance by a Sacramento State quarterback since Jeff Fleming totalled 333 yards against NAU in 2010.

Defensively, Todd Davis amassed a team high 11 tackles to give him seven double-digit games since the start of last season. Robert Beale added a career high nine stops and Jeff Badger provided seven, including a pair of forced fumbles.

DOUBLE UP

- Sacramento State has played a Football Bowl Sub-division opponent each season since 2002. This year, however, will mark just the second time that the Hornets will play two games against an FBS foe. Including the loss at NMSU, Sacramento State is now 1-11 when playing up a subdivision.
- Last season, Sacramento State shocked the football world with a 29-28 overtime victory at Oregon State. The win was the first for Sacramento State over a Pac-10/12 opponent and one of just six by a Football Championship Subdivision team over an FBS team in 2011.
- The Hornets have primarily faced Pac-12 opponents when playing up and that streak will continue when the team will play at Arizona State in 2013 and at Washington in 2015.

SAFRON MAKES HIS MARK

- Making his first opening day start, redshirt sophomore Garrett Safron recorded a career day at New Mexico State. Safron completed 23-of-35 pass attempts for 308 yards and a pair of touchdowns. He also rushed for 27 yards which was the second highest total on the team.
- Safron's yardage total was his first 300-yard game and placed him 37th in school history. He also became the 17th Hornet quarterback to surpass the 300-yard plateau. Ryan Leadingham (2001-04) holds the school record with seven career 300-yard games.
- Last season, Safron played in five games in relief of the injured Jeff Fleming. During several of those contests, he shared snaps with Tommy Edwards.
- Safron nearly matched his completion total (24) from a year ago while setting career highs in nearly every category. His previous bests were 11 completions, 31 attempts and 155 yards which came in the season finale against UC Davis. He also matched his touchdown best of two set against Northern Arizona.
- In his debut season, Safron threw for 394 yards and also used his athleticism to rush for 286 yards. He found the end zone six times with an equal amount through the air and on the ground.
- Safron also showed good decision making during the course of the season, not throwing an interception in his 57 pass attempts. That streak came to an end when a pass was juggled by a Hornet receiver and intercepted by NMSU on his final attempt of the game — ending his run at 91 consecutive pass attempts without a pick.

ADDING IT UP

- A career high passing total led to several career receiving performances.
- Sophomore DeAndre Carter matched his career total with four receptions for a career best 81 yards and also caught his first career touchdown. Among Carter's total was a 59-yard bomb which led to his 8-yard TD grab.
- Senior tight end T.J. Knowles, who caught one pass for 22 yards a year ago, grabbed five passes for 75 yards, including a 25-yard touchdown down the middle of the field.
- The big haul came from junior Morris Norrise who caught a team-high seven passes for 84 yards. Norrise also moved into the 15 in school history with 80 career receptions.
- In all, seven Hornets caught at least one pass during the game, including the first career grabs for JC transfer Ezekiel Graham and redshirt freshmen Blake Robertson and Shane Harrison.

- The Oxnard, Calif., native has played in all 34 games of his career. His biggest output came as a freshman where he rushed for 130 yards and a touchdown against Northern Arizona.

SHARING THE LOAD

• Junior college transfer Ezekiel Graham showed why he led all California junior college players in 2011 with 2,227 all-purpose yards en route to earning Junior College All-America honors. Graham led the team with 47 rushing yards and also caught three passes for 41 yards in his Sacramento State debut at New Mexico State.

• Senior A.J. Ellis also saw some time in the backfield, earning four carries against the Aggies. Ellis played his first three seasons at Fresno State before transferring to Sacramento State in the spring. Ellis was able to transfer despite having just one season remaining due to the fact that he earned his bachelor's degree from Fresno State and is currently pursuing a master's degree at Sacramento State.

DOUBLE VISION

• Todd Davis has shined in the spotlight of big games since moving to linebacker to start the 2011 season. The Palmdale, Calif., native made his first start at Oregon State and promptly tallied 12 tackles in the win over the Beavers.

• Davis was an honorable mention all-conference selection and was named to the preseason all-conference team after leading the team with 96 tackles. The junior had 10-plus tackles in four games and at least eight tackles in eight of the 11 games.

• Davis began 2012 much like his sophomore campaign, tallying a team high 11 stops at New Mexico State. Included in that total was a sack, 1.5 tackles-for-loss and a pass break-up.

THE HORNET BADGER

• Fellow linebacker Jeff Badger ranked third on the team a year ago with 85 tackles. After recording seven stops at New Mexico State, Badger now has 133 career tackles with just two full years on the defensive side of the ball (he opened his career as a running back where he rushed for 109 yards).

• Despite starting 22 straight games at linebacker, Badger had not forced a fumble in the last two years. That changed against the Aggies when the Windsor, Calif., native jarred the ball loose on back-to-back plays in the first quarter — both of which were recovered by NMSU.

• Since joining the Div. I-AA/FCS ranks, Sacramento State has had four players earn All-America honors at linebacker. Among those players is Cyrus Mulitalo who was recognized in 2006-08.

ON HIS OWN

• Last season, punter Smith Heath had the challenge of taking over for his brother, Augie, midway through the year. The younger Heath played in three games, but struggled to find consistency, averaging 33.3 yards per punt with a long of 42 on 16 kicks.

• Against New Mexico State, Smith nearly averaged his long from a year ago, punting five balls for an average of 41.2 yards. Amongst his kicks was a 51-yard bomb as well as a near-perfect coffin-corner punt which sailed 46 yards before going out-of-bounds at the 3-yard line.

KEEPING THE STREAK ALIVE

• With the surprising release of long snapper Lonie Paxton by the Denver Broncos it appeared that the streak of last least one Sacramento State player in the NFL which dates back to 1996 would be in jeopardy.

• That streak was kept alive when the Minnesota Vikings elected to keep McLeod Bethel-Thompson as their third quarterback and release veteran Sage Rosenfels. Bethel-Thompson attended training camp with the San Francisco 49ers in 2011 and was on the Miami Dolphins' practice squad later in the year.

BRINGING THE PRESSURE

- The graduation of Zack Nash, who is the school's all-time leader in sacks with 29.5, left a void in the Hornet defense heading into 2012.
- The team responded with four sacks from four different players against New Mexico State for a combined loss of 21 yards.
- Not only were the sacks split among individuals, they also came from all parts of the defense with one coming from defensive end Trent Eskew, defensive tackle Matt Lawrence, linebacker Todd Davis and cornerback Osagie Odiase.

WORTH THE WAIT

- Robert Beale joined the Sacramento State team in 2009 after graduating from Pitman HS in Turlock, Calif. Beale redshirted that first season and returned for 2010 where he did not play in a game.
- Last year, Beale earned his way onto the field in a pair of contests but did not make a tackle.
- The lack of playing time did not discourage Beale who earned the starting job at field safety with a strong showing in training camp.
- That effort carried over to the season opener where Beale ranked second on the team with nine tackles, including five solos. He also had a tackle-for-loss.

HANDING OVER THE REIGNS

- For the first time in his head coaching career, Marshall Sperbeck will not be calling the offensive plays. Sperbeck handed over the play-calling duty when he hired Paul Peterson as his offensive coordinator in January of 2012.
- Peterson most recently served as the quarterbacks and receivers coach at Southern Utah. Prior to that, he had coaching stints at Northern Carolina State and BYU.
- As a player, Peterson was the starting quarterback at Boston College where he led the Eagles to a pair of bowl victories.
- The only other change to the staff was Tyler Almond who was elevated from GA to linebackers coach.

COACHES LUNCHEONS RETURN

- The Hornet Club Football Luncheons will return on Monday, Sept. 10, at Buca di Beppo on Howe and Hurley. The luncheons will feature head coach Marshall

Sperbeck as well as a student-athlete and will take place from 11:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m.

- The luncheons will take place each Monday throughout the season with the exception of Sept. 17 which is the date of the Bob Mattos Memorial Golf Tournament.

JUST THE FACTS

- With the addition of Cal Poly, UC Davis, North Dakota and Southern Utah to the Big Sky Conference for the football, the league now has 13 teams.
- That number is the largest in the FCS and is only matched by SEC and MAC in the FBS.
- After making just one field goal in the first 10 games of 2011, Sacramento State has now made two in each of its last two contests. Jason Diniz made two in the 2011 season finale against UC Davis and Edgar Castaneda connected from 32 and 25 yards at NMSU.
- Sophomore Derek Stickney, who started the final eight games in 2011 at tackle, will miss the year with a foot injury.
