



# 2013 COLORADO FOOTBALL / SPRING GAME NOTES

April 13, 2013 (Folsom Field, 10:36 a.m.)



**Quickly** Today marks the fourth and final major scrimmage of the spring, as CU has had previous sessions on March 15, March 22 and April 5 prior to today; The Buffs have also scrimmaged regularly at times during most of the practices, especially dealing with the red zone and situational scrimmages ... Spring practice was again split before and after spring break for the eighth time in nine years, with eight practices prior to the March 25-29 break and seven, including today, after; drills started on Thursday, March 7, the second earliest known start in school history (to March 6 in 2010) ... For the first time since at least 1977, the Buffs will have their final practice *after* the spring game ... Today's format will have 12-minute quarters with a running clock (except for the final two minutes of each half), with a 5-minute halftime .... There are about 150 football alumni in town rekindling friendships and taking part in the annual reunion events (Friday golf, evening reception, etc.); many were also here for an 8 a.m. memorial service at Old Main for the late **Bart Roth** ('76, linebacker), who passed away from a heart attack last December 20 ... The season opener against Colorado State (Sept. 1 in Denver, see below) is 140 days from today ... **Mike MacIntyre** will run out behind Ralphie for the first time today, the ninth full-time head coach to do so (joining Eddie Crowder, Bill Mallory, Chuck Fairbanks, Bill McCartney, Rick Neuheisel, Gary Barnett, Dan Hawkins, Jon Embree) ... Following the spring game, at 2:00, there will be a club lacrosse game in Folsom between CU and the University of Georgia.

**A First** Thanks to the advent of the Pac-12 Network, today marks the first time CU's spring game will be televised. It will air live on two platforms (Pac-12 Net and Pac-12 Mountain), and will be replayed up to 50 times in the coming months. The first replay is at 9 a.m. tomorrow morning (Sunday, April 14), followed by Monday, April 15 (2 p.m.), Tuesday, April 16 (7 a.m.), Wednesday, April 17 (5:30 a.m. and 10:30 p.m.) and Monday, April 24 (4 p.m.).

**RADIO:** KOA is also broadcasting the game live over the Colorado Football Network, with Mark Johnson and Larry Zimmer calling the action.

**The Wounded** For the second straight year, April 9 was not good for the Buffaloes: **QB Jordan Webb** suffered a torn ACL in practice earlier this week, the same day that **WR Paul Richardson** did the same in 2012. The injury picture for the Buffaloes as of April 12 a.m.; 11 players are definitely out, and three others who might or might not play who practiced on a limited basis this week (#—denotes off-season surgery):

➤ **Post-Spring Surgeries** As of now, **TE Austin Ray** (finger, surgery was actually yesterday) and **QB Jordan Webb** (surgery to be determined once swelling goes down) are the only players scheduled for surgery after spring ball (knock on wood).

**Looking Ahead** Here are the football reporting dates for this fall; the below are tentative as MacIntyre and his staff need to work out all details, but the listed item cannot occur prior to the date listed. The NCAA permits a maximum 29 on-field practice sessions. The tentative dates:

**Pac 12 Football Media Days** This year's Pac-12 media day has been set for Friday, July 26, once again in Los Angeles (site TBA). Coaches and two players from each team will be present; the coaches will again be doing an East Coast blitz the two days prior to heading to L.A. (done in 2010 and 2011 but not last year).



## CU-CSU Moving To Sunday

The CU-Colorado State game in Denver, previously scheduled for Saturday, August 31, has moved to the next day (Sunday, September 1). No kickoff time or television arrangements are known at this time for what has become known as the

**Cinch Jeans Rocky Mountain Showdown.** It will be the 85th meeting between the two state rivals (CU leads, 61-21-2); it will be the 13th meeting in Denver (CU holds a 7-5 edge in the previous dozen meetings). The first three were at the old Mile High Stadium (1998-2000), with the last 10 at Sports Authority Field at Mile High. The Buffaloes and Rams have played on a Sunday two previous times, during the 2008 and 2009 seasons (the schools split those games).



**Mr. Spring** Senior **TB Josh Ford** transferred to Colorado for his sophomore season, and in the three spring practices he has participated in, he's been a star on offense. In 10 main spring scrimmages, he has had 68 carries for 677 yards and five touchdowns, averaging 9.96 yards per carry; within those numbers are the two spring games, where he has 25 attempts for 305 yards (12.2 per) with three scores. This spring, he has 18 carries for 191 yards, averaging 10.6 per carry, with one score.

**Awards** The coaching staff brought back the spring awards that weren't issued last year, as well as some others that had been put into hibernation; the meaning for many have been revised, however. The roll call of this spring's honors:

**Reunions In 2013** There are no specific team reunions planned this fall (the most celebrated Buff team on a 5- or 10- year anniversary hit would be the 1998 Aloha Bowl champions, 8-4 overall). "C Day," a reunion of all letterwinners, is scheduled for the Central Arkansas game (Sept. 7), and the annual Living Legends (which honors all athletes who lettered for the first time 50 years ago) and Honorary C games have yet to be selected. As for other sports, it is the 40th anniversary of the 1974 NCAA champion ski team, and the 10th anniversary of the 2004 NCAA champion men's and women's cross country teams.

## Spring Football Game History

For 40 years, spring practice traditionally ended with a game between the Colorado Varsity and Alumni. Back at the turn of the century, an Alumni team usually served as the season opener for the varsity (13 times all told, with the Varsity owning an 11-0-2 edge in those games). The Varsity held a 20-3 edge in the old format of the spring series, which started back in 1953 under then head coach **Dal Ward**. After a pair of games, the series became dormant until 1963 when it was revived by Eddie Crowder. There was no game between 1974 and 1976, and the 1978 game was cancelled due to a blizzard.

A new format for the Varsity-Alumni game (implemented in 1988) had the alumni playing in the first and third quarters, with the first team of the varsity playing the second and fourth quarters. They were pitted against the second- and third-team members of the varsity, resulting in a competitive and fun game. The alumni and first-team varsity always wore black; this format was discontinued following 1992 for competitive reasons.

The format for the game in 1993 and 1994 was to pit the first-team offense and defense against the remainder of the squad. The results of this series:

An intrasquad game was started in 1987 and was dubbed the "Black & White" game (which evolved into the "Black & Gold" game). The format for this has varied through the years, depending on the health of the team; most years, the team is divided by the coaching staff into two units of comparable strength (exception: in 2010, the players drafted the teams themselves). Injuries in the 2001-03 and 2005 seasons forced an offense-defense formatted game with its own unique scoring system, and in 2006, 2007, 2011 and 2012 the team scrimmaged due to a lack of offensive linemen and/or injuries across the board. In 2008, the Black team was the first-team offense, the Gold team the second and third-teamers; that year, in response to a challenge by former head coach **Bill McCartney**, a CU spring record crowd of 17,800 turned out for the game. ## 2013 COLORADO FOOTBALL LETTERMAN ANALYSIS

Colorado has **63** lettermen returning for 2012 (61 from the 2012 team, with an additional two from the 2011 season); they break down into 29 on offense, 30 on defense and four specialists; the Buffs lose **11** lettermen off the 2012 squad (6 offense/4 defense/1 specialist). CU returns **18** starters from last season (9 offense/9 defense), losing 5 (2 offense/3 defense); several positions had multiple personnel shuttle in and out, so there are several other players back with starting experience. The 2012 starters are listed in bold (six or more starts, thus occasionally two players listed at same position if they shared time due to injury or rotated), and (\*) denotes letters earned primarily on special teams. **Spring Game Attendance** Three of the school's largest 10 crowds for the annual spring game have occurred the last four seasons, including a challenge by former head coach **Bill McCartney** in 2008 to fill Folsom Field lead to the all-time high of 17,800. The second largest (15,655) was in 2011, Jon Embree's first spring in Boulder, when he opted to play the first spring game at night. The 2012 game was also at night with the weather worsening as the game progressed (attendance was 7,150). Since admittance to the game is free and there is no hard ticket, CU officials are never really sure what to expect. Below are the top 10 CU spring game crowds in the school's history (#—first team Varsity and Alumni were on the same team and wore black jerseys):

**Schedule Notes** Colorado opens its third year of Pac-12 league competition on Sept. 28 at Oregon State, the only Pac-12 opponent the Buffaloes have not played since joining the conference on July 1, 2011. The Buffs and Beavers last faced each other in 1988, with CU winning 28-21 in Boulder; it will be Colorado's first-ever trip to Corvallis; the schools have played five times, three games in Boulder and two in Portland ... Colorado will play five games in November, just the fifth time in its history and the first since 1958 that many are scheduled in the "turkey month" ... The Buffs have back-to-back road games just once visiting defending Pac-12 North Division champion UCLA (Nov. 2) and then Washington (Nov. 9) ... The season finale will be at Utah on Saturday, Nov. 30; Colorado had played the Friday after Thanksgiving for the last 17 seasons, or every year from 1996 through 2012, but this year's rivalry game with the Utes returns to Saturday as the Pac-12's television partners (ESPN, FOX) selected other games for the Friday slots ... In fact, CU does not have a weeknight game in 2013, the first time since 1995 that the Buffaloes will play every regular season game on a Saturday ... The Buffaloes will have two byes, which fall on Sept. 21 and Oct. 19; while CU had two Saturdays off last year, it was because of a weeknight game against Arizona State; the last time Colorado had two natural byes in the same season was in 2008 ... The Buffs had two bye weeks every year from 1996 through 2005, one usually after non-league play and the other prior to the regular season finale against Nebraska.
