Cameron McDondle continued his dominate ways with 238 rushing yards and three rushing touchdowns in the 42-10 victory at Black Hills State. The performance marked his third 200-plus running game of the season and fifth time with three or more touchdowns. He carried the ball 30 times for an 8.3 yards per carry average. His touchdowns went for 71-, 4- and 32-yards.

McDondle leads the nation in rushing yards (1,783 yards), rushing yards per game (199.2 ypg) and rushing touchdowns (22).

SEPTEMBER 7

JUSTIN DVORAK, COLORADO MINES | JUNIOR, QB, 6-0, 200 | TOMBALL, TEXAS/TOMBALL

Dvorak tied the RMAC record and broke Mines record with eight touchdown passes Saturday afternoon in a 68-23 season and home opening win against South Dakota School of Mines. His 555 yards passing is a career-high. He threw six touchdowns in the first half alone. His longest pass of the day was 59 yards. As the holder, Dvorak converted a fake field goal into a touchdown pass to defensive lineman Michael Kelso.

SEPTEMBER 14



The CU offensive line paved the way for 59 rushing attempts for 390 yards (6.6 avg.) and 5 touchdowns. The last time CU rushed for over 300 yards in a game was on Sept. 22, 2007 against Miami-Ohio in Boulder (63-359); it was the most since the last time the Buffs ran for 400 yards (48-427) at Kansas on Oct. 12, 2002. CU scored its first six offensive touchdowns of the year via the rush before the Liufaut-Spruce TD pass. Colorado averaged 9.1 yards per first down rushing play – picking up five or more yards 19 times in 28 tries. Of the 59 carries, 51 gained yardage (30 5-plus, 9 10-plus, 4 20-plus). Sunday marked the 45th time CU has had two players run for 100-plus yards in game (three have done it twice in a game, the last time in 1980). In addition, the offensive line did not allow a quarterback sack.

SEPTEMBER 21



KENNETH OLUGBODE, COLORADO | JR., ILB, 6-1, 220 | SAN JOSE, CALIF./BELLARMINE PREP

In a 27-24 overtime victory over Colorado State, Olugbode had a team high 17 tackles (7 solo), a third down stop and his first career interception, which he returned 60 yards for a touchdown that gave CU a 24-17 lead with 8:50 remaining in the game. It was CU's first interception return for a touchdown since Sept. 7, 2013 (Jered Bell 78 yards versus Central Arkansas). He became the 15th Buffalo since 1992 to return his first career pick for a score. In addition, he did all this on his 20th birthday.

SEPTEMBER 28



AUSTON HILLMAN, ADAMS STATE | JUNIOR, QB, 6-2, 185 | GLENDALE ARIZ./DEER VALLEY HS

Junior quarterback Auston Hillman engineered the largest comeback in program history as Adams State collected a 52-51 double overtime victory against Western State. After coming off the bench in the second quarter, Hillman accounted for 371 yards of total offense and six touchdowns. He completed 21-of-35 pass attempts for 284 yards and five touchdowns while running the ball 15 times for 87 net yards and a touchdown. Trailing 42-6, Hillman found receiver Chad Hovasse for a Hail Mary touchdown on the final play of the first half. The big play shifted the momentum as Hillman added a passing touchdown and rushing touchdown in the third quarter. He followed with two more touchdown passes in the fourth and another during overtime.

OCTOBER 5

McDondle continued to show why he leads the nation in rushing, as he racked up 203 yards and three touchdowns on 19 carries in the 56-0 victory at Adams State. He averaged 10.7 yards per carry and recorded rushing touchdowns of 73, 41 and 17 yards. He only carried the ball once in the second half, as he totaled 186 yards and two touchdowns on 18 carries (10.3 ypc) in the first two quarters. He added one reception for seven yards to round out his day on an even 210 yards of offense. He guided a Pack offense that totaled 386 yards rushing, which was the most since the program re-started in 2008. McDondle entered the game leading the nation in rushing yards, ranked second in rushing yards per game and sat fourth in rushing touchdowns.

BRODIE HICKS, AIR FORCE | JUNIOR, DB, 6-2, 200 | COLORADO SPRINGS, COLO./FALCON HS

Hicks recorded career highs in every defensive category with five unassisted tackles, three assisted tackles and eight total tackles in a 31-17 win over Wyoming. He recorded the first two interceptions of his career and also recovered the first fumble of his career. Hicks is the first Falcon since Weston Steelhammer last season vs. Boise State to record three turnovers in a game and just the third Falcon in the last five years to do it. He is the first Falcon since Steelhammer last year with multiple interceptions in a game. His fumble recovery came inside the Air Force five yard line.



OCTOBER 19

JOHNNY FEAUTO, ADAMS STATE | FRESHMAN, QUARTERBACK, 6-1, 180 | FREDERICK, COLO./FREDERICK

True freshman Johnny Feauto amassed 444 yards passing during a 44-24 win against BHSU. His passing total now serves as a single-game program record for a freshman. In his third collegiate start he went 32-of-41 (78%) along with four touchdowns (three touchdowns during first half) and one interception. He added 20 yards rushing on seven carries. He connected with seven different receivers over the course of the game. As a team the Grizzlies finished with 633 yards of total offense and dominated time of possession (41:11).



OCTOBER 26

CAMERON McDONDLE, CSU-PUEBLO | SENIOR, RB, 5-7, 202 | LITTLETON, COLO./COLUMBINE HS

Cameron McDondle rushed for a single-season school record 308 yards in the 49-21 victory against No. 7 Colorado Mines. He totaled two touchdowns and carried the ball 27 times for an 11.4 yards per carry average. He helped the ThunderWolves total 400-plus rushing yards (434 yards) for the second straight game.
