Stanford Faces Colorado For First Time Since '93 Cardinal Look for School-Record Tying 13th Win

The Game

The Stanford Cardinal (4-0, 2-0 Pac-12 North) will look to extend the nation's longest winning streak to 13 games on Saturday when it plays host to the Colorado Buffaloes (1-4, 0-1 Pac-12 South) at Stanford Stadium/Foster Field (50,000). Kickoff is set for 4:30 p.m. Stanford is coming off a 45-19 victory over UCLA on Saturday, extending its winning streak to 12 games, which is the longest active winning streak in the country. Colorado dropped a 31-27 home decision to Washington State. The Cardinal is ranked 7th by AP and 4th in the USA Today Coaches polls this week.

Television/Radio Plans

Saturday's Stanford-Colorado game will be televised live by Versus, with **Ted Robinson** (play-by-play), **Glenn Parker** (analyst) and **Akbar Gbaja-Biamila** (sidelines) calling the action. The game will also be carried live on Stanford's flagship station, KNBR 1050 AM, with **Dave Flemming** (play-by-play), **Todd Husak** (analyst) and **John Platz** (sidelines) handling the broadcasting duties. All radio broadcasts begin one hour prior to kickoff with the Cardinal Tailgate Show and will conclude with the Cardinal Locker Room Report following the game. Stanford student station KZSU will also broadcast Saturday's game. All Stanford radio broadcasts can also be heard on GoStanford.com via the All-Access player.

Stanford-Colorado Series

Stanford and Colorado have split their previous six meetings, with the Cardinal coming out on top in each of the last two games in 1991 and '93. The two schools first met in 1904, with Stanford posting a 33-0 victory. Colorado then won the next three meetings in 1977 (27-21), 1987 (31-17) and 1990 (21-17) prior to Stanford's current two-game winning streak (1991 - 28-21; 1993 - 41-37).

Cardinal Clips

- Now 4-0 (2-0 Pac-12 North) after Saturday's 45-19 home victory over UCLA...has won 12 straight games dating back to last season, marking the program's longest winning streak since 1939-41, when Stanford won 13 straight over the course of three seasons, tying a school record...streak is the longest in the nation among FBS teams and tied for second longest in school history.
- Has posted a 29-13 (.691) record over the last three-plus seasons and are 24-6 (.800) dating back to the 2009 campaign.
- Ranked 7th this week in the AP Top 25 and 4th in the USA Today Coaches poll...have been ranked in the Top 10 of the AP poll for 13 straight weeks, marking the program's longest run as a Top 10 team in school history.
- Have won eight straight home games and are 19-2 in its last 21 home games at Stanford Stadium dating back to the final home game of the 2007 season.
- Last Stanford first year head coach to start his career 4-0 was **Chuck Taylor**, who led the Indians to nine straight wins in his inaugural season in 1951.
- Lead the Pac-12 in five defensive categories -- rushing defense (62.25), total defense (312.0), scoring defense (11.50), tackles-for-loss per game (8.50) and sacks per game (3.50).
- Defense has held the opponent scoreless in nine out of 16 quarters this season and have allowed just five offensive touchdowns...have not been scored upon in either the first quarter and has allowed just six points in the third quarter over its first four games.
- Ranks seventh nationally in scoring offense, averaging 45.75 points a game...have scored 40 or more points 13 times in the last 30 games dating back to the 2009 season...averaging 41.6 ppg (707 total) over the last 17 contests...have set school scoring record each of the last two seasons.
- Built a 17-7 halftime lead against UCLA...have outscored its last 17 opponents 378-117 in the first half...last trailed at halftime vs. Notre Dame in 2009 (24-20)...were tied at the half last year against USC (14-14)
- Was 6 for 6 in the red zone vs. UCLA and have come away with points in all 22 trips to the red zone this season (5 TDs, 2 FGs)...have converted 91.3 (84-92) of its red zone chances over the last two seasons.
- Heisman Trophy candidate **Andrew Luck** completed 23 of 27 passes for 227 yards and three touchdowns vs. UCLA...now has 56 career TD passes which rank third on Stanford's all-time list behind only **John Elway** (77) and **Steve Stenstrom** (72)...Stanford is 24-5 (.827) in Luck's 29 career starts...his 24 career wins as a starter are tied with Stenstrom for first all-time among Stanford QBs.
- Tight ends **Coby Fleener** (5), **Zach Ertz** (3) and **Levine Toilolo** (1) have accounted for nine of Stanford's 12 TD receptions this season and 13 of the last 16 scoring strikes dating back to the Orange Bowl.
- Are averaging 197.5 yards on the ground after averaging 213.8 a year ago...**Stepfan Taylor** has rushed for over 100 yards in back-to-back games at Arizona (153) and vs. UCLA (112).

Shaw Quick Facts

- Named Bradford M. Freeman Director of Football on January 13, 2011, becoming the 34th head coach in Stanford history.
- A 1994 Stanford graduate, he is the fifth alum to hold the position of head football coach, joining Charles Fickert (1901), Carl Clemans (1902), Chuck Taylor (1951-57) and Paul Wiggin (1980-83).
- Four-year letterwinner (wide receiver) at Stanford from 1991-94...member of Stanford's 1991 Aloha Bowl team coached by Denny Green...also was a member of the Cardinal's 1992 Blockbuster Bowl-winning team coached by Bill Walsh...finished his career with 57 catches for 664 yards and five TDs.
- Earned his degree in sociology.
- Previously served as Stanford's offensive coordinator for past four seasons (2007-10)...Stanford set school scoring records each of the past two seasons...team scored 40 or more points in 11 games during his time as offensive coordinator.
- Play-calling ability in the red zone helped Stanford convert on a national-best 57.6 percent of its chances inside the 20-yard line.
- Tutored five running backs that combined for the second-highest rushing total (2,063 yards) in school history in 2010.
- Prior to his appointment at Stanford, served as wide receivers and passing game coordinator at the University of San Diego, where he helped guide the nation's top Division I-AA offense that paced the Toreros to the Pioneer League championship and NCAA Division I-AA Mid Major title.
- Coaching resume also includes nine years of NFL experience with the Philadelphia Eagles (1997), Oakland Raiders (1998-2001) and Baltimore Ravens (2002-05).
- David's father, Willie, had two separate coaching stints at Stanford (1974-76; 1989-91) during his 33-year coaching career, which also included stops with the Detroit Lions, Kansas City Chiefs, Minnesota Vikings, New Orleans Saints, Oakland Raiders, San Diego Chargers and St. Louis Rams.
- Union City, Calif.-native was born in San Diego... wife Kori...three children--Keegan, Carter and Gavin.

Stanford Notebook

Stanford Looks to Extend Nation's Longest Winning Streak Against Colorado

Stanford (4-0, 2-0 Pac-12 North) will look to extend its winning streak to 13 games on Saturday when the Cardinal welcomes the Colorado Buffaloes (1-4, 0-1 Pac-12 South) to Stanford Stadium. Kickoff is set for 4:30 p.m. and the game will be televised by Versus.

A win would give Stanford its first 5-0 start since 1951, when the Indians won their first nine games of the season on the way to the Rose Bowl, and extend the Cardinal's winning streak to 13 games, tying a school record.

The Cardinal has won eight straight games at Stanford Stadium, where it was 19-2 in its last 21 home games dating back to the final home game of the 2007 season.

Saturday's game marks the first meeting between Stanford and Colorado since 1993, when the Cardinal won a wild, 41-37 affair at Stanford Stadium.

A Look Back at Recent Stanford-Colorado Matchups

1977: Colorado 27, Stanford 21: In Bill Walsh's first game at Stanford's head coach, the Cardinal falls to the 12th-ranked Buffaloes at Folsom Field, 27-21. **Darrin Nelson**, playing in his first collegiate game, ran for 99 yards on 15 carries and also caught four passes for 77 yards, including a 56 yard TD reception off a screen pass from quarterback **Guy Benjamin**. Benjamin finished the day completing 20 of 34 passes for 258 yards, prompting Colorado head coach **Bill Mallory** to say after the game, "God, I hope I don't ever see a quarterback better than Benjamin. He plumb wore me out."

1987: Colorado 31, Stanford 17: Colorado's wishbone offense proved unstoppable for the Cardinal as Stanford yielded 413 rushing yards in suffering a 31-17 defeat at Folsom Field. **Eric Bienenmy** rushed for 119 yards on just 14 carries to lead a Colorado rushing attack that averaged over 5.0 yards per carry.

1990: Colorado 21, Stanford 17: Stanford built a 14-0 lead against the sixth-ranked Buffaloes at Folsom Field only to see Colorado rally for two touchdowns in the third period to tie the game and watched as **Eric Bienenmy** carried over from one yard out with just 12 seconds left, giving the Buffaloes a 21-17 victory. **Glyn Milburn**, playing in his first game as a Cardinal after transferring from Oklahoma, amassed 158 yards in total offense, including a 73-yard punt return in the first quarter. Colorado would go on to claim a share of the national championship.

1991: Stanford 28, Colorado 21: After dropping its first two games of the season to Washington and Arizona, Stanford posted its first win of the season against the defending co-national champion Buffaloes at Stanford Stadium. The Cardinal held the ball for more than 36 minutes and piled up 247 yards on the ground behind the rushing of **Tommy Vardell** (29-114) and **Glyn Milburn** (9-106). Two fourth-quarter touchdown runs by Vardell helped Stanford overcome a 14-7 deficit.

1993: Stanford 41, Colorado 37: In one of the most entertaining games of the 1993 season, Stanford and Colorado combined for 1,022 yards in total offense as the Cardinal scored 14 points in the final 3:33, including the game-winner with eight seconds left, to upset the seventh-ranked Buffaloes at Stanford Stadium. **Steve Stenstrom** hit tight end **Tony Cline** over the middle with eight seconds remaining for the game-winning touchdown. Stenstrom completed 30 of 42 passes for 382 yards and two touchdowns while Cline (111) and **Justin Armour** (155) combined for 266 receiving yards. Armour also caught three TD passes.

The Polls

Stanford is ranked 7th by the Associated Press and 4th in the USA Today Coaches polls this week. Stanford has been ranked in the AP poll for 20 consecutive weeks since the Sept. 5th poll of 2010, marking the program's longest continuous stay in the AP poll since 1991-93 (26 weeks). Stanford's longest continuous run in the AP poll was during the 1969-72 seasons, when the program spent 43 consecutive weeks in the Top 20.

Stanford has been ranked in the Top 10 of the AP poll for 13 consecutive weeks dating back to last season, marking the Cardinal's longest run as a Top 10 team in school history (previous was 8 in 1940).

Winning Streak

Stanford has won 12 straight games dating back to last season, marking the program's longest winning streak since 1939-41, when the Indians won 13 straight games over the span of three seasons to tie a school record.

Stanford's winning streak is also the longest active winning streak in the nation and is tied for the second longest in school history. The school-record for consecutive victories is 13 (1904-05; 1939-41).

The longest unbeaten streak in school history (15 games) was set over three seasons from 1925-27. Under the direction of the legendary "**Pop**" **Warner**, Stanford won its last two games of the 1925 season, posted a 10-0-1 record in 1926 and won its first two games of the 1927 campaign before losing to Saint Mary's.

The Win Total

Stanford has posted a 29-13 (.690) record over the last three-plus seasons, finishing 5-7 in 2008, 8-5 in '09, 12-1 last season -- along with this year's 4-0 start.

The Cardinal has also posted a 16-4 (.800) record in conference play over the last three seasons, finishing 6-3 in 2009, 8-1 last season and 2-0 this season. The 16 conference wins over the last three seasons rank second only to Oregon's 18 during that same period.

Stanford is looking to nail down its third straight winning season. The last time the Cardinal strung together three straight winning campaigns was from 1968-78, when Stanford recorded 11 consecutive winning seasons.

The Home Record

The Cardinal has won eight straight home games at Stanford Stadium and is 19-2 in its last 21 home contests dating back to the final home contest of the 2007 season.

The Cardinal posted a 6-0 record at home last season, marking the program's first undefeated home season since 1977 and ninth all-time at Stanford Stadium (1924, '26, '30, '33, '34, '40, '69, '77, '10).

The Cardinal is averaging 40.0 points a game (798 total) over its last 20 home games (2008-11) while allowing 21.0 (421).

Stanford was just 3-16 on its home turf from 2005-07.

The Start

Stanford is off to its second straight 4-0 start to a season and seventh 4-0 dating back to 1940 (1940, '50, '51, '52, '86, 2010). A win over Colorado on Saturday would give Stanford its first 5-0 beginning since the 1951 season, when **Chuck Taylor's** Indians won its first nine games on its way to the Pacific Coast Conference championship and a berth in the Rose Bowl.

High-Scoring Cardinal

The Cardinal is averaging 45.8 points (183 total) after four games and ranks second in the Pac-12 and seventh nationally in scoring average. Oregon leads the the nation in scoring, averaging 52.0 points a game.

With its 45-19 victory over UCLA, Stanford has scored 40 or more points 13 times in its last 30 games dating back to the 2009 season and has scored 50 or more five times during that same stretch. The team is averaging 41.6 (707 total) points over its last 17 contests.

Stanford has set school scoring records each of the last two seasons, tallying 524 points last season and 461 in 2009.

Defensive Doings

Stanford's defense has allowed just five touchdowns this season and has allowed just 12 TDs in its last 10 games dating back to last season. The defense has yielded just 102 points in those 10 contests (10.2).

The Cardinal's defense has not allowed points in nine of 16 quarters this season and has not been scored upon in the first quarter this season while allowing just six points in the third period.

Stanford ranks first in the Pac-12 in six defense categories, including rushing defense (62.25), total defense (312.0), scoring defense (11.50), tackles-for-loss (8.50), sacks per game (3.50) and red zone defense (0.58).

Stanford's rushing defense ranks fourth nationally behind Alabama (39.60), Virginia Tech (58.20) and LSU (60.40) while its also ranks in the Top 10 nationally in scoring defense (6th), tackles-for-loss (8th), sacks per game (t-4th) and red zone defense (5th).

Chase Thomas Among National Leaders

Outside linebacker Chase Thomas ranks leads the Pac-12 and ranks fourth nationally in sacks-per-game (1.13; 4.5 total), trailing only Nordly Capi of Colorado State (1.60), Sean Porter of Texas A&M (1.38) and Brett Roy of Nevada (1.25). Thomas now has 19 sacks in 30 career games (0.6 per game).

Thomas also ranks third in the conference and 16th nationally in tackles-for-loss (1.63) and is tied for fifth in forced fumbles per game (0.75).

No Picks

With Oregon State, Kansas and Rice recording its first interceptions of the season last weekend, Stanford is now just one of three FBS teams without an interception so far this season, along with Akron and Utah State.

Last season, the Cardinal finished with 18 interceptions, which was the second highest total in the conference.

Scoring First

Stanford has scored first in 14 of its last 17 games dating back to last season. The Cardinal has come away with points on its first drives in 12 of its last 17 games (9 FGs, 3 TDs).

Fast Starts

Stanford built a 17-7 halftime lead against UCLA and has now outscored its last 17 opponents 378-117 in the first half. The Cardinal outscored its opposition 301-90 in the first half last season and 267-156 in 2009.

Scoring Margins

With its 26-point victory over UCLA, Stanford's last 24 victories dating back to the 2009 season have come by a margin of 25.2 (604 total) points, while its six losses have been by a margin of just 8.8 points (53 total). Stanford is 8-8 in its last 16 games decided by a touchdown or less.

Wire-to-Wire

Stanford has won 12 of its last 17 games in wire-to-wire fashion, while it has trailed for just 53:28 in the five other games. Stanford has not trailed at any point this season.

Kicker **Jordan Williamson** also got his first start. SS **Devon Carrington** made his first career start at Duke.

Luck Ties Stenstrom for Career Wins Among Stanford Quarterbacks

Stanford's 45-19 win over UCLA on Saturday improved the Cardinal's record to 24-5 (.827) with Andrew Luck as its starting quarterback. Luck's 24 wins as a starter ties Steve Stenstrom (1991-94) for first all-time among Stanford quarterbacks. **Jim Plunkett** piloted Stanford to 22 wins in his illustrious career while **Guy Benjamin** (1974-77) and **John Elway** (1979-82) recorded 15 wins each in their career starts.

Luck's .827 career winning percentage ranks first all-time among Stanford quarterbacks and ranks second only to Boise State's **Kellen Moore** among active FBS signal callers.

Luck Among Active Leaders

Andrew Luck ranks in the top-10 among active quarterbacks in various statistical categories, including passing efficiency (2nd; 161.35), passing touchdowns (10th; 56), total offense per game (11th; 268.7), completion percentage (9th; 65.41), passing yards (15th; 6,926), total offense (12th; 7,791) and TDs responsible for (12th; 62).

Luck's .827 career winning percentage ranks first all-time among Stanford quarterbacks and ranks second only to Boise State's **Kellen Moore** among active FBS signal callers.

Dual Threat Quarterback

Andrew Luck has rushed for 865 career yards on 127 carries (6.8 avg.) with six rushing touchdowns. Both totals rank first all-time among Stanford quarterbacks.

Last season, Luck finished as Stanford's second leading rusher a year ago with 453 yards on 55 attempts and three TDs.

He also has three career runs over 50 yards (58 at Cal; 52 TD vs. Wake Forest; 51 TD at Washington).

Go-To Tight Ends

Tight ends **Coby Fleener** (5), **Zach Ertz** (3) and **Levine Toilolo** (1) have accounted for nine of Stanford's 12 touchdown receptions this season, with the other three being distributed among **Chris Owusu** (2) and **Ryan Hewitt** (1).

Going back to last year's Orange Bowl win over Virginia Tech, tight ends have combined to catch 13 of Stanford's last 16 touchdown passes.

Fleener (13), Ertz (8) and Toilolo (1) have combined for 21 career touchdown receptions.

Taylor's Tale

Running back **Stepfan Taylor** has rushed for over 100 yards in each of his last two games against Arizona (career high 153) and UCLA (112), giving the junior nine career 100-yard efforts, which ranks tied for fifth on Stanford's all-time career list.

With four rushing touchdowns this season, Taylor now has 21 rushing TDs in 30 career games, which is tied for sixth on Stanford's career charts with **Mike Mitchell** (1993-97). He needs two more rushing TDs to tie **Kerry Carter** (1999-02) for fifth and three more to tie **Darrin Nelson** (1977-81) for fourth. **Toby Gerhart** (2006-09) holds the school's all-time record for rushing touchdowns with 44.

The O-Line

Stanford's offensive line consisting of center **Sam Schwartzstein**, right guard **David DeCastro**, right tackle **Cameron Fleming**, left tackle **Jonathan Martin** and left guard **David Yankey** has allowed the third fewest sacks in the nation (0.50; 2 total) while paving the way for a Cardinal running game to average 197.5 yards per game on the ground.

Stanford's offensive line has combined to make 70 starts with DeCastro (30) and Martin (28) accounting for 82.8 percent of the starts. Schwartzstein, Fleming and Yankey are first year starters.

It Happened Against Colorado

1977 -- In Bill Walsh's first game as Stanford's head coach, the Cardinal fall to the 12th ranked Buffaloes, 27-21 at Folsom Field...Darrin Nelson, playing in his first collegiate game, ran for 99 yards on 15 carries and caught four passes for 77 yards.

1987 -- Colorado's wishbone offense rolls up 413 rushing yards as the Buffaloes roll to a 31-17 victory at Folsom Field.

1990 -- Stanford builds a 14-0 lead against the 6th-ranked Buffaloes only to see Colorado rally with two third quarter TDs to tie the game, setting up Eric Bieniemy's game winning TD with just 12 seconds remaining...Glyn Milburn accounts for 158 yards in total offense in his first game as a Cardinal.

1991 -- Tommy Vardell (29-114) and Glyn Milburn (9-106) combined for 220 yards in rushing as Stanford posts a 28-21 victory over the defending co-national champions at Stanford Stadium.

1985 -- Stanford rallies from a 17-7 halftime deficit and scores 21 unanswered points, including 14 in the fourth quarter, to upset 19th-ranked Arizona, 28-17. John Paye, who suffered a separated shoulder the week before against USC, comes off the bench to lead the Cardinal on three second half scoring drives.

1993 -- Before a national television audience on ESPN, Stanford and Colorado combine for 1,022 yards in total offense as the Cardinal score 14 points in the final 3:33, including the game-winner with eight seconds remaining, to upset the 7th-ranked Buffaloes at Stanford Stadium. Steve Stenstrom connected with tight end Tony Cline over the middle for the winning touchdown.

Stanford's National Championships

NCAA championships are commonplace at Stanford University, as Cardinal teams have combined to win 101 NCAA team championships, including 61 men's championships and an NCAA-best 40 women's titles. Stanford teams have combined to capture a national-best 84 NCAA titles since 1980 and 61 since 1990. Stanford has won at least one NCAA championship for 35 consecutive years and has won four national titles in a single year nine times.

Nine different teams have won at least five national titles, including men's tennis (18), women's tennis (17), men's water polo (11), women's swimming and diving (9), men's swimming and diving (8), men's golf (8), women's volleyball (8), synchronized swimming (6) and women's cross country (5). A total of 19 Stanford teams have won at least one national championship after women's rowing captured its inaugural NCAA title 2009.

#7/6 Stanford 57, San Jose State 3 September 3, 2011 | Stanford, CA

STANFORD, Calif. -- Stanford ushered in the David Shaw Era with a dominating 57-3 victory over visiting San Jose State before an announced crowd of 47,816 at Stanford Stadium. Heisman Trophy candidate Andrew Luck completed 17 of 26 passes for 171 yards and two touchdowns and also ran for another as the Cardinal posted its highest point total in a season opener since 1969. After freshman Jordan Williamson opened the scoring with a 23 yard field goal at the 4:37 mark of the first quarter, Luck capped off a nine play, 70-yard drive with a one yard touchdown run just before the end of the first period. Following a Spartan turnover on its next possession, Luck connected with tight end Zach Ertz for a 13-yard touchdown to boost the lead to 17-0. Williamson's second field goal of the day -- a 37-yarder at the 9:48

mark -- extended the lead to 20-0. Stanford increased its lead to 27-0 with 2:25 left before half when Luck connected with Ryan Hewitt on a two-yard touchdown pass play. Running back Stepan Taylor's two touchdown runs highlighted a 16-point third quarter, helping the Cardinal boost its lead to 43-3. Stanford added two more touchdowns in the final period, the first coming on a 16-yard run by Tyler Gaffney, followed by a 39-yard touchdown pass from Brett Nottingham to tight end Coby Fleener which closed the scoring at the 9:04 mark. The Cardinal defense limited the Spartans to just 26 yards in rushing, with linebacker Shayne Skov recording a team-high seven tackles. The win was Stanford's ninth in a row dating back to last season, the program's longest winning streak since 1951. It also marked the 11th time in the last 27 games dating back to 2009 that Stanford had scored 40 or more points in a game.

#6/6 Stanford 44, Duke 14 September 10, 2011 | Durham, NC

DURHAM, N.C. -- Quarterback Andrew Luck matched his career high with four touchdown passes to lead Stanford to a 44-14 win over the Duke Blue Devils before an announced crowd of 24,785 at Wallace Wade Stadium. The win was Stanford's 10th in a row dating back to last season marking the program's longest winning streak since 1939-41, when the Indians won 13 straight over the course of three seasons. Luck finished the day completing 20 of 28 passes for 290 yards. The four touchdown passes ran his career total to 51, good for fourth place on Stanford's all-time career list. Coby Fleener (2), Chris Owusu and Zach Ertz were on the receiving end of Luck's scoring strikes, as the Cardinal utilized 10 different receivers in its passing game for the second straight week. Luck's only miscue on the day came in the second quarter,

when his pass intended for Chris Owusu was deflected and then intercepted by Lee Butler, who returned it 76 yards for a touchdown to cut Stanford's lead to 10-7. After Duke recovered its onside kick, the Cardinal defense quickly responded with a dominating series, turning back the Blue Devils with a three-and-out. Following a punt, Stanford took just :38 seconds and four plays to march 59 yards for a touchdown to increase its lead to 17-7. Luck was 4 for 4 on the drive, which culminated with a 10 yard touchdown pass to Chris Owusu. Owusu finished the day with seven catches for 106 yards, marking his fourth career 100-yard game. The Cardinal added a pair of touchdowns in the third quarter, the first coming on a 60-yard pass play from Luck to Fleener at the 6:41 mark. On the Cardinal's next possession, Jeremy Stewart broke lose for a 30-yard run to increase the lead to 30-7 with 4:06 left in the period. Luck's final touchdown pass of the day came at the 14:56 mark of the fourth quarter, when he found Zach Ertz in the back of the end zone. A one yard touchdown run by junior Tyler Gaffney with eight minutes left in the game accounted for Stanford's final score. Stanford's defense registered six sacks on the day and limited the Blue Devils to just 26 yards on the ground. Shayne Skov led the team with 11 tackles, while Chase Thomas had 2.5 sacks among his six total tackles.

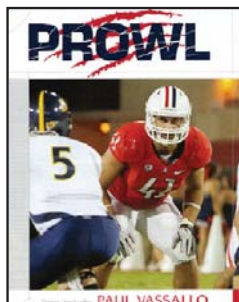

TUCSON, Ariz. – Stanford won its Pac-12 Conference opener to improve to 3-0 on the season with a 37-10 victory over Arizona in Tucson. Running back Stepfan Taylor rushed for a career high 153 yards on 22 carries while Andrew Luck completed 20 of 31 passes for 325 yards and two touchdowns to pace the Cardinal to its 11th straight win overall. Jordan Williamson also added three field goals, including a season-long 45-yarder in the second quarter that gave Stanford a 13-3 lead. He also converted from 20 and 33 yards out to remain perfect on the year. Stanford's defense shutout the Wildcats in the second half, despite playing without the services of linebacker Shayne Skov who suffered a season-ending knee injury in the second quarter. The Cardinal limited the Wildcats to just 51 yards rushing and recorded five sacks among its 10 tackles-for-lost yardage. Luck's touchdown passes came in the second half, as he connected with Zach Ertz on a 16-yard scoring strike at the 5:22 mark of the third period to give the Cardinal a 23-10 lead. His 34 yard touchdown pass to Levine Toilolo culminated an eight play, 80 yard scoring drive that gave Stanford a 30-10 cushion early in the fourth quarter. Anthony Wilkerson and Jeremy Stewart also added touchdown runs as the Cardinal rolled up a season high 242 yards in rushing.

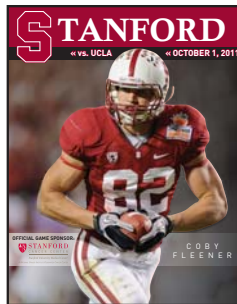

#4/6 Stanford 45, Arizona 19 October 1, 2011 | Stanford, CA

STANFORD, Calif. – Stanford kept the nation's longest unbeaten streak intact with a 45-19 victory over UCLA before a sellout crowd of 50,360 at Stanford Stadium. Andrew Luck was razor sharp in completing 23 of 27 passes for 227 yards and three touchdowns, while Stepfan Taylor rushed for 112 yards on 17 carries, including two touchdowns. Two of Luck's touchdown passes went to tight end Coby Fleener, whose one-handed grab in traffic got Stanford on the board with nine seconds remaining in the first period. Fleener was also on the receiving end of a 51-yard scoring strike from Luck at the 14:15 mark of the third quarter. Fleener wasn't the only player to make a one-handed catch. On Stanford's first scoring drive, Luck handed off to Tyler Gaffney, who then handed to Drew Terrell. Terrell found Luck down the right side and when his pass sailed just a little long, the Heisman Trophy candidate made a sensational one-handed grab and got one foot inbounds. The 13-yard gain pushed the ball down to the 15 yard line and five plays later, Luck found Fleener over the middle and the tight end made a leaping, one-handed catch in tight coverage. The play climaxed a 99 yard scoring drive after the Cardinal had turned back UCLA with a goal line stand on the game's first series. Stanford opened a 14-0 lead in the second quarter. Chase Thomas forced a fumble after sacking Bruin quarterback Jeff Breahtaut that was recovered by Devon Carrington. Taylor would finish the drive with a two yard plunge that gave the Cardinal a 14-0 lead at the 9:19 mark. Jordan Williamson's 23 yard field goal gave the Cardinal a 17-7 halftime lead.
