## MAC Storylines

• MAC football continues this weekend with eight games against schools from BCS Automatic Qualifier Conferences. MAC schools face three Big Ten opponents (Michigan State, Northwestern, Indiana), two Big 12 schools (Missouri, Colorado) and one opponent from the Big East (Pittsburgh), ACC (Boston College) and WAC (Boise State).

• The University of Akron will open their new football stadium, InfoCision Stadium -- Summa Field, this Saturday at 2:00 p.m. against Morgan State. Construction began in February of 2008 on Infocision Stadium, a 30,000 capacity stadium, built right on campus in downtown Akron. The facility boasts 522 club seats, 152 open-air loge seats, 17 suites and a state-of-the-art video board with scoreboard and sound system.

• Buffalo earned an impressive road win Saturday night at UTEP with a 23-17 road victory. The Bulls jumped out to a 23-7 lead and held on for the victory as senior WR Naaman Roosevelt set a school record with his 20th career touchdown reception. The road win marked the Bulls first opening road win since 1980 (at Brockport State).

## News Around The Mid-American Conference...

• **Through the Air...**Three MAC QBs topped the 300-yard passing plateau, including one topping the 400-yard mark, as Toledo QB Aaron Opelt threw for 423 yards at Purdue, Bowling Green QB Tyler Sheehan added 339 yards through the air, while Temple QB Vaughn Charlton threw for 317 yards.

• **All-Purpose Leader...**Kent State's senior RB Eugene Jarvis added punt and kick return duties to his resume this year and Jarvis responded with 265 all-purpose yards in the Flashes 18-0 win over Coastal Carolina. Jarvis leads the nation in all-purpose yardage as he rushed 27 times for 141 yards (5.2 avg.) and a touchdown, which marked his 17th career 100-yard effort. In addition, Jarvis added 30 receiving yards and 94 yards in punt and kick returns.

• **Kent State defense shines in opener...**The Flashes snapped a 163-game span without a shutout with an 18-0 victory over Coastal Carolina last Thursday night at Dix Stadium. Defensively the Flashes allowed only 185 yards of offense (78 rush/107 pass). The shutout was also the first blanking in a home opener since 1967.

• **Rockets offense scores 31 on the road...**In Toledo's 52-31 loss at Purdue, Rockets QB Aaron Opelt threw for a career-high 423 yards, which marked fifth-most in school history, and threw for three touchdowns on 41-of-67 passing. Opelt's 67 attempts is a single-game school record, while his 41 completions are the second most in Toledo annals.

• **Bowling Green opens with victory for Head Coach Dave Clawson...**Bowling Green's 31-14 win over Troy last Thursday gave Dave Clawson his first win as Falcons head coach. In Bowling Green history, no Falcon first-year head coach has lost his opening game since Harry Ockerman in 1935. Bowling Green bosses are 9-0-1 since then, including Robert Whittaker (1941), Doyt Perry (1955), Bob Gibson (1965), Don Nehlen (1968), Denny Stolz (1977), Moe Ankney (1986), Gary Blackney (1991), Urban Meyer (2001), Gregg Brandon (2003) and Dave Clawson (2009).

• **Falcons offense carries BG to victory...**Bowling Green opened with an impressive offense performance in the 31-14 win over Troy. WR Freddie Barnes set a school record with 15 receptions in the game and also set a personal-best 157 yards and tied his mark with two touchdowns. Bowling Green was a perfect three-for-three in redzone opportunities as QB Tyler Sheehan threw for a career-best 388 yards, his third career 300-yard performance.

• **MAC receivers extend consecutive reception streaks...**In last week's action, three MAC wide receivers extended personal receptions streaks and the conference boasts three of the top six receivers in the nation in that category. Central Michigan WR Bryan Anderson had two receptions at Arizona and extended the nation's top consecutive reception streak to 41 games. Buffalo WR Naaman Roosevelt has the nation's second longest streak at 39 games as he added five receptions for 91 yards in the Bulls 23-17 road win at UTEP. Also, Central Michigan's Antonio Brown added five receptions at Arizona to extend his streak to 28 games, which ranks sixth in the nation.

## MAC Spotlight

### Brandon Crawford, Ball State Senior DE



Crawford started his 28th consecutive game in the Cardinals season opener vs. North Texas. A native of Fort Wayne, Ind., Crawford earned a bachelor's degree in criminal justice in 2008. Crawford worked in an automotive factory after high school and before joining the Marine Corps in 1999. He went to Military Occupational Specialties school and then to Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point in Havelock, N.C. The 33-year old received an honorary discharge in 2003 and enrolled at Ball State in the summer of 2004.

**News Around The Mid-American Conference** (Cont.)...

• **Ohio University sets record crowd at home opener**... The Bobcats had their largest home crowd in program history as 24,617 fans packed Peden Stadium for the opener, a 23-16 loss against Connecticut.

• **Television tracker**... MAC football takes center stage this week as this Friday night (Sept. 11) Toledo will host Colorado in their home opener at 9:00 p.m. as the game will be televised by ESPN. Also, ESPN2 has picked up the Central Michigan road game at Michigan State in East Lansing at Noon on Saturday. Eight of 12 MAC games this weekend will be televised, while three others will be available in the All-MACcess Live Streaming package (Morgan State at Akron; New Hampshire at Ball State; and Western Illinois at Northern Illinois).

• **Double digit receptions**... Three MAC wide receivers topped the 10+ reception barrier this weekend. Toledo WR duo of senior Stephen Williams added 15 receptions for 185 yards and freshman Eric Page added 12 receptions for 128 yards. Williams receptions matched his career-high and it marked the first time since 2007 for Toledo to have two receivers both top the 100-yards receiving in the same game. Not to be outdone, Bowling Green receiver Freddie Barnes matched Williams effort with 15 receptions for 157 yards, which set a Bowling Green school record.

• **Impressive performance by Zips LB**... Akron's junior linebacker Mike Thomas added six tackles and led the Zips vs. eighth-ranked Penn State as the Akron defense only allowed the Lions to rush for 99 yards on 29 carries. Thomas added 0.5 tackle for loss, one interception, a fumble recovery and one pass break up in the setback.

• **Northern Illinois inks Kill to two-year extension**... Northern Illinois announced late last week that Head Coach Jerry Kill signed a two-year contract extension through 2015. The Huskies program continues to rise as evident by Saturday's tough 28-20 road loss at Wisconsin. Sophomore QB Chandler Harnish completed 15-of-24 passes for 174 yards and added a two-point conversion to pull Northern Illinois within eight points, as he led the Huskies on a pair of fourth-quarter scoring drives.

• **Topping 100 yards offensively**... Two MAC running backs topped the 100-yard mark as Kent State's Eugene Jarvis rumbled for 141 yards vs. Coastal Carolina and Ball State's MiQuale Lewis notched 103 on the ground vs. North Texas. In the receiving corps., four receivers topped 100-yards, including Toledo's Stephen Williams (185 yards), Bowling Green's Freddie Barnes (157), Western Michigan's Juan Nunez (151) and Toledo's Eric Page (128).

• **MAC football 2009 season**... MAC football opened its 63rd season of competition this past weekend and will hold its 13th championship game in 2009. This year's Marathon MAC Football Championship tilt will be Friday, Dec. 4th, at Ford Field in Detroit. This will be the league's sixth championship event at Ford Field. Buffalo is the defending MAC champion as the Bulls surprised then No. 12 ranked Ball State, 42-24, last year. UB's title trophy was its first-ever on the MAC gridiron.

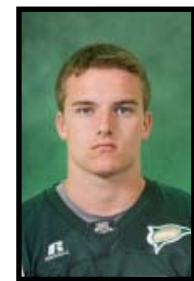

**MAC Players of the Week****EAST DIVISION****Freddie Barnes, Offensive Player of the Week**  
Bowling Green, Senior, Wide Receiver

Barnes (Chicago Hts., Ill.) set a new school record with 15 receptions and a career-high 157 yards receiving in the Falcons 31-14 win over Troy last Thursday night at Doyt Perry Stadium. Barnes matched a career-mark with two touchdown receptions, including a 31-yard score from QB Tyler Sheehan in the second quarter and an eight-yard score in the third stanza to tie the game, 14-14.

**Cobrani Mixon, Defensive Player of the Week**  
Kent State, Junior, Linebacker

Mixon (Cincinnati, Ohio) led Kent State with a game-high 12 tackles in a 18-0 win over Coastal Carolina. Mixon aided in Kent's first shutout since 1994, as Coastal could only manage 185 net yards of offense. He added a tackle for loss, one pass breakup and aided the Flashes opening score by forcing a Coastal Carolina running back into the arms of teammate Kevin Hogan for a safety.

**Matt Weller, Special Teams Player of the Week**  
Ohio University, Freshman, Kicker

Weller (Twinsburg, Ohio) nailed a 50-yard field goal and added one PAT in the Bobcats 23-16 loss to Connecticut. Weller's 50-yard field goal with 2:36 remaining in the fourth quarter made the contest a one possession game. Weller's 50-yard boot ranks tied for 10th on the program's all-time list. Weller also averaged 65 yards per kickoff.

**WEST DIVISION****Aaron Opelt, Offensive Player of the Week**  
Toledo, Senior, Quarterback

Opelt (Freemont, Ohio) completed 41-of-67 passing for 423 yards and 3 TDs in the Rockets 52-31 loss at Purdue. Opelt's 67 pass attempts is a single-game school record, his 41 completions rank second, while his 423 passing yards rank fourth. His 423 passing yards were a also career-best. Opelt moved up in Toledo's career rankings and now sits fourth in completions (512) and fifth in attempts (880).

**Cory Hanson, Defensive Player of the Week**  
Northern Illinois, Senior, Linebacker

Hanson (Minneapolis, Minn.) collected two interceptions and added three tackles in the Huskies 28-20 road loss at Wisconsin. His two interceptions rank him as tied for fourth in the country. Hanson's second interception came one play after NIU's first touchdown and set up the Huskies' final touchdown, giving NIU the ball at the Wisconsin 31-yard line.

**Mike Salerno, Special Teams Player of the Week**  
Northern Illinois, Senior, Kicker

Salerno (Orland Park, Ill.) added two field goals and converted an onside kickoff in the Huskies 28-20 loss at Wisconsin. Salerno accounted for the Huskies' first quarter scoring with field goals of 40 and 29 yards. Salerno averaged 68.0 yards on four kickoffs. His most valuable play came on his last kickoff as his onside kickoff was recovered by NIU with 2:46 remaining to give the Huskies a final chance.

## OFFENSE

- QB Tyler Sheehan of Bowling Green had his third 300-yard game of his career with 339 yards passing in the Falcons 31-14 win over Troy.
- RB Dwayne Priest of Eastern Michigan rushed 19 times for 85 yards and scored on a one-yard touchdown rush in a 27-14 setback vs. Army.
- WR Eric Page reeled in a Toledo freshman record 12 receptions for 128 yards, including a 34-yard touchdown reception in the Rockets 52-31 loss at Purdue.
- QB Dan LeFevour moved into a tie for fourth on Central Michigan's career rushing touchdowns list with his five-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter in a 19-6 loss at Arizona. It was his 33rd career rushing score, matching the career total of Jessie Lakes (1969-71).
- WR Juan Nunez of Western Michigan hauled in a career-high 151 yards receiving on seven catches, including a 73-yard touchdown reception from QB Tim Hiller in a 31-7 road loss at Michigan.
- WR Naaman Roosevelt led the Bulls with five receptions for 91 yards, including a 42-yard touchdown reception in Buffalo's 23-17 road win at UTEP.
- QB Chandler Harnish was 15-of-24 passing for 174 yards and ran 13 times for 10 yards in the Huskies 28-20 road loss at Wisconsin. Harnish helped orchestrate a pair of fourth-quarter scoring drives in the eight-point loss in Madison.

## DEFENSE

- DE Brandon Downs of Eastern Michigan led the team with 10 tackles, five assisted, 2.5 tackles for loss and recorded two sacks for 12 yards in Eastern's 27-14 loss vs. Army.
- DB Roger Williams of Bowling Green made his first career start and had a team-high 10 tackles and his first career interception to help the Falcons to a 31-14 win vs. Troy.
- DE Douglas Westbrook of Toledo recorded his first collegiate interceptions, picking off two Purdue passes in the Rockets 52-31 loss.
- LB Nick Bellore of Central Michigan totaled a game-high 10 tackles in Central's 19-6 loss at Arizona. It marked the 14th time in 28 career games for Bellore to make at least 10 tackles, and extended his streak of double-digit tackles to eight consecutive games dating back to last year.
- LB Austin Pritchard of Western Michigan racked up a team-high 11 tackles, including eight solo tackles, and forced a fumble in a 31-7 loss at Michigan.

- S Sherrod Lott of Buffalo collected seven tackles, including four solo, and a career-best three pass breakups in the Bulls 23-17 road win at UTEP. Lott's final pass breakup came on the final play of the game as he deflected UTEP's last attempt.

- KR Domic Cook of Buffalo had a key kick return to help the Bulls' defeat UTEP, 23-17. After the Bulls recorded a safety, Cook returned the ensuing kickoff 62 yards to the UTEP 25 yard line and Buffalo scored two plays later.
- P Zach Johnson of Eastern Michigan punted 6 times for 281 yards for a 46.8 yards average, with a long of 60 yards. Johnson also dropped one punt inside the 20, at the Army 9-yard line, in Saturday's 27-14 loss.
- K Alex Steigerwald of Toledo tied his career-long with a 48-yard field goal in the fourth quarter in the Rockets 52-31 loss at Purdue.
- P Ben Armer of Western Michigan punted six times for 239 yards for a 39.8 yard average in a 31-7 loss at Michigan. Armer had a long punt of 44 yards and two punts inside the 20-yard line.
- K Jerry Phillips of Bowling Green connected on his only field goal attempt of the evening, a 21 yarder, and nailed four extra points for seven total points in the Falcons 31-14 win over Troy.
