FIRST HALF

Carona to kickoff for Texas Tech. Clemons deep to receive for Colorado. The kickoff sails through the end zone for a touchback

On QB Tyler Hansen's status

"He was having a hard time breathing which made me a little bit nervous. We'll see how he comes out. The initial X-Ray was negative in terms of something being cracked."

General

"It was tough to come up one play short. The kids played hard, they battled in a back-and-forth game. There is going to be a lot of games like that so they'll get up tomorrow. Half of life is getting up one more time when you're down so they'll do it. It's a tough way to be in the locker room and I feel bad for those guys. It wasn't for a lack of effort. They got one more play than we did."

On the offensive performance late

"They were crowding the box a bit which took away the running game. It kind of forced us to throw. We got a couple of throws and then we were just off on a few. It would have extended some drives but we weren't able to get it done."

On rugby punt

"It's about trying to find a comfort zone for him (Zach Grossnickle), on what he feels best with."

On if P Zach Grossnickle struggles with normal punting

"Sometimes he is a little more comfortable going sideways with it."

On QB Cody Hawkins' performance

"He did ok coming off of the bench, but I would be the first one to tell you that it is about winning the game. It's not about stats and all that. He certainly made some good throws and some guys made some plays for him, but down the stretch I would have liked him to get something in there."

On team's defense

"Early on it was great. The good news-bad news I think is that us going no huddle was in sense good for us offensively, but it also puts (the defense) back on the field sooner which kind of helps them stay in rhythm. But early on we were doing a pretty good job."

On WR Paul Richardson's performance

"He's a good player. As he gets experience I think he is only going to get better. He can run, he's a very smart and smooth guy with good hands and a good feel for the position."

On what to tell fans about keeping faith in program

"We are just going to keep hanging in there and we need them to hang in there."

On passing game

"It was kind of what they were giving us, sometimes they came up and pressed us and we kind of converted. Cody (Hawkins) told Paul (Richardson) on a certain route that if they pressed him to nod at him. The other one to Toney Clemons was built in there."

On young players

"There are a lot of good players here. I thought Terrel (Smith) did a nice job for his first time out there. He had some big plays. You can tell that he can run and as he gets more comfortable and again a tough outing for him to have to start against (Texas Tech) because they are going to put you in space a lot."

On how his well being is

"I'm good, I really am. I think we just need to go back to the grindstone every time and keep staying after it. You just have to get up one more time after you get knocked down. It is not easy for anybody."

On sticking with PK Aric Goodman for field goals

"He made three in a row."

On how tough it is to depend on the kicking game

"It is hard for those guys too. You would love to get a guy in a groove and get him going, but the good thing about it is that they keep battling. It makes it tough on everybody."

On Texas Tech's effectiveness against the run

"You never know what their alternative is. I think they didn't expect us to throw the ball like that so they stacked the box a little bit. They kind of jumped into some double Eagle Bear stuff; it really outnumbers you at the point of attack. That is why we threw it a little bit more."

On developing young players

"These guys always scrap and there is a good core of those kids. You just keep coaching them and keep working them with the little details, trying to get one play better, get practice better and stay with them."

On if one play stands out in letting the 10 point lead slip away

"No, you would like to crack the cement a little bit. Try and get one more on the board, try to open up a little bit. I thought our guys were feeling pretty relaxed and it probably hasn't had an effect that way, it didn't happen."

On if QB Tyler Hansen will start against Oklahoma

"We'll see what his health is like. We'll see how he turns out."

On if QB Tyler Hansen will start against Oklahoma if healthy

"Yeah."



Texas Tech Head Coach

Tommy Tuberville

General

"It's fun to win a game. Things are hard, especially on the road. Obviously we're not playing great on both sides of the ball, but at the same time we make some mistakes, we don't get a lot of turnovers. Somehow, somehow today we kept our presence about us and didn't panic when we were 10 points back. We were able to make enough plays to win the game. We fought hard, we still have some more injuries, but the thing about it is how our defense reacted. We pressed them; we played a lot of man coverage. They hit a go-route on us, that was a great throw, but other than that we pretty much shut them down defensively. The field-goal kicker (Matt Williams) did good. Our special teams did great in multiple areas. We gave up a punt return, but that was good coaching on their part; they brought it all the way from the sideline across the field. They had a picket fence set up and that was well executed. Overall, it wasn't a great day on both sides, but we scratched and we clawed and we found a way to win the game.

On Shutting Down Colorado's Running Game

"They quit running the ball when their first quarterback (Tyler Hansen) went out. They were throwing the ball more, so we went to more of a press-man coverage and played man on the wide receivers. We had eight or nine men in the box. They tried to run a little bit, but they tried to do the short routes and the curl routes. Some of them worked and some didn't. You know, number five (Rodney Stewart) is slippery, and I'm kind of glad they started throwing the ball. They're well coached; that's what you do against that defense.

On Team's Defense

"That's a new defense we put in this week. We put it in because we don't have an advantage on pass protection. What we try to do is we try to create a five-man rush and play man coverage instead of zone. That defense kind of takes you out of your game plan."

On Team's Offense

"We kept calling the run, although we're a passing team. They were playing press-man coverage on the outside, and playing their safeties deep. They were giving us the run, so we had to run the ball. They were making enough plays in the first half and they didn't give us enough first downs to get things going. Then once we got the run going our pass opened up in the second half. It was fun to watch; that's the way that offense is supposed to work. You take advantage of what they do to you. [Kicker] Matt Williams, I'm proud for him. He's been a little inconsistent throughout the year, but I knew when we had the wind in the fourth quarter he really had a shot. He's pretty accurate with the wind behind him and he made those two which were obviously huge."

On Effect of Wind

"We were going to defer anyways, but us getting the ball in the fourth quarter [with the wind] was obviously [important]. It enables you to play better man coverage, tighter man coverage when they're going into the wind. We've got the wind at our back and it [helps] your kickers and your punters. We went with two returners: I thought that was the biggest play with [Harrison Jeffers] catching that ball on the line drive and not letting it go 25 more yards. That was good of our special teams group; they did a good job of making that adjustment."

On Halftime Adjustments

"We're not a team right now that can step back, and say, 'Hey we can roll in anywhere and win.' The way we played today, we can't. We are still not getting any turnovers, but we did make plays today on both sides of the ball. The key is getting the ball back to this offense which we did several times in the fourth quarter.

"We were able to get the ball down the sideline on a couple throws on the deep routes. Our pass protection got better to be honest with you. They did a little five and six-man rush in the first half; the second half they played mostly four-man rush. That enabled Taylor [Potts] a little more time to get it down the field on them. That's pretty much what you have to do. You get tired. You can't just stay in [the same coverage as in the first half]. Sooner or later you have to play some zone, and we were able to get the ball deep."

On Impact of Win

"It's huge for us. Getting to 4-3 after our first win on the road, really, in terms of being in another teams' stadium. We've got some big ones coming up, some tough ones. But you need to win like this to get some confidence on both sides of the ball and in the kicking game. We played better today; that's one of our better overall games that we've played."



Colorado Players

QB Cody Hawkins

ON BEING PREPARED TO PLAY – “I think – having been here five years – I get used to the no huddle pace. It’s stuff we do every day in practice and regardless of whether or not I’m taking snaps in practice or on Saturday’s, it’s something we focus a lot on doing the week. We didn’t get it done in the red zone like we should have today, but we made some good plays.”

ON TEXAS TECH MAKING FOURTH QUARTER ADJUSTMENTS – “No, they were doing a lot of the same stuff, we just had some miscommunication on routes and we have to get those fixed. We have to be able to throw the ball and catch it. I thought the O-line played great today, even though we didn’t call upon them very often to run the ball, we started doing no huddle stuff, they responded when we needed them to and we just have to continue to make plays in the passing game, it was a little sporadic.”

ON GOING DOWN FIELD MORE ON OFFENSE – “It’s the same stuff we always do. I trust the athletes that we have a lot; you look at (Paul Richardson). It’s funny every day in film we always have to grade ourselves and I’m always saying ‘Throw it to 80 (Richardson), throw it to 80, throw it to 80,’ I’ve been telling him the whole time, if I get in and get a shot to get him the rock, I’m going to do it. On that long touchdown, that’s not even the route he’s supposed to run, but I told him if he gets pressed and has a shot to go downfield, I want him to do it. Before the snap, I looked at him and he gave me a nod and he went out and made a great play.”

ON HIS DAD BEING CRITICIZED – “First of all, I’m a college student so I don’t have enough money to buy a newspaper which is probably a good thing. Being a fifth-year senior I spend a lot of time in here [in Dal Ward] watching film trying to get better. As a captain, it’s our job to go out there and prepare, keep everybody positive and keep them focused on their assignments regardless of what your records is or who your opponent is. We try and go out every week and compete against ourselves, as a captain and leader on this football team, you have to go out when everybody’s trying to drink that negative kool-aid, you have to hydrate them with the right stuff.”

“There are a lot of people out there talking and a lot of people say different stuff. The same bad things you say about our football team, I’m saying bad things about you guys [the media], so it works both ways. You don’t like it when somebody near and dear to you is getting criticized, but the bottom line is this is college football and you have to win football games. We know we have the talent to win. I was talking to the radio show about a drive in the second half and why we didn’t have any run plays when we got to the 31, but it’s not about play calling, it’s just great execution. We had a miscommunication on a route and a dropped ball and then other than that, we kick a field goal. If we would’ve caught those balls, everybody would say ‘Wow, great job, way to

throw it down field and take a shot and punch one in.’ Going out and competing and focusing on our assignments, that’s all we can do. It’s college football, it’s the greatest sport in America, everybody is going to speculate and everybody loves their football team so everybody’s going to talk about it all the time. We just have to go out and be as positive as we can be.”

ON MISCOMMUNICATION IN PASSING GAME – “It’s just new guys out there. We have so many guys. We had the one where Luke Walters, he doesn’t do a whole lot of no-huddle stuff, usually that’s Ryan Deehan’s thing. Ryan Deehan is a real versatile guy for us, he can play both tight end positions, full back, and he runs a lot of no huddle and is in charge of protection stuff when we do run no-huddle. We tried to get him out for a breather, and Luke almost ran into Paul (Richardson) and kind of messed us up right there. You just have to keep working on those and make sure even those guys who aren’t the starters are prepared as well.

“A lot of that is just reads we have to make. Because of our offense, we have to make a lot of reads down the field. When Texas Tech comes out and they’re doing more man coverage than they’ve shown this season. They’re not a big blitzing team, and they didn’t do a lot of that today, but they mixed it up. Just going out and preparing is just something we’re going to have to go out and keep doing just based on the defenses you’re going to get, just based on adjustments going on down the field.”

ON BEING SURPRISED ABOUT BEING 3-4 – “We’re definitely surprised. Nobody sits in the film room over the summer or hangs out in the weight room talking about how great it would be to be 3-4 in the middle of the season. Regardless of who we’re playing, we do have the talent to go out and win football games if you take care of your assignment. That’s why so many people talk about taking care of their job. If everybody takes care of their assignment to the best of their ability, we have the talent, we can beat anybody on our schedule if we execute. It’s the great teams that do execute. You have a team like Oklahoma; they’re No. 1 in the country for a reason. They have great athletes, and they execute each and every week, that’s going to put you in a great situation. We know we have the athletes; we just have to work on the execution because we know we can compete with anybody in the country.”

“A lot of it is just a little bit of mojo. Regardless of how you slice it and dice it, a lot of these people are kids, you have a lot of young kids going out, Paul Richardson is 18, and he’s one of the biggest contributors in the game today, but a lot of people are just kids. When a lot of negative stuff happens, you’re just a kid, and it’s tough not to look at the negative side of things. When you’re rolling, you think you’re invincible, and things are bad, people think they’re really bad. You just have to keep working on your improvement, the team’s improvement, and keep moving forward.”

ON HAVING A BREAK-OUT GAME – “The coaches really prepped me well this week. I knew it was my time to step up so I was just waiting and I was ready.”

ON HAVING A STRONG FINISH TO THE SEASON – “I knew coming in here I would have to prove myself. I knew in the beginning, I wasn’t going to have much trust, but over time I’ve gained a lot of trust, so it is going to happen. Now they trust me more, I’m starting to touch the ball more and I’m getting more comfortable and making plays.”

ON HIS INTERCEPTION – “I felt like I had the opportunity to make a play. The ball was in the air and I went ahead and took that shot and I was hoping that would get the game turned around, but unfortunately we weren’t able to make the plays when it counted the most and we couldn’t march down the field a little bit.”

ON DB TERREL SMITH – “I thought he played great. I looked up a few times and he made a few awesome plays. You couldn’t even tell he was a freshman out there. You would think he had been out there for a while. Obviously, if we watch film, he made a few negative plays, but for the most part he was great. I tip my hat to him to get out there as a freshman, first game, and make the plays he made.”

ON TEXAS TECH IN THE SECOND HALF – “I feel like they came out the second half and switched up their plan a little bit and they were able to defeat our defense a little bit. We weren’t able to get on the same page on some plays in the second half, and that’s where we made some mistakes.”

ON BEING DISCOURAGED LOSING THE LAST TWO GAMES – “It’s definitely discouraging, losing close games like we have the last two weeks. We just have to go ahead at practiced and play the way we know how to play. I think a lot of times guys will try and do a little too much instead of just their job, we have to go back to the basics and play the game of football how it’s supposed to be played. That will help us in the future.”

ON PLAYING OKLAHOMA NEXT WEEK – “We’ll approach it the same way, this week at practice we just have to put more effort into it. We need to spend as much time as we can on the practice field, as much time as we can watching film and try not to take any plays off. When you’re tired out there, we have to just keep going and keep pushing because this is a big game for us. They’re ranked high, they show they can play some pretty good ball, and we’re going on the road. It will be tough, but if we can keep going at practice, we should be able to do a good job out there.”

DB Terrel Smith

ON THE LOSS – “I felt like everyone gave it their all. We just came up short; it’s disappointing, I’m upset and I know everyone else is upset. We just got to get back for next week.”

ON HIS FIRST GAME – “I had fun. I really did, I enjoyed every play and every minute of it. I’m ready for next week and I just had fun. It came down to it and I felt good out there.”

“I know I’m young; I’m a true freshman. I have time to learn and get better and practice and critique the mistakes that I had. I just got to get better.”

**QUICKLY** The series for the time being concludes at 5-5; the home team won the first eight games, with the road team breaking through for the final two (each is 4-1 at home and 1-4 on the road) ... The first quarter took all of 32 minutes to play (and that included 5½ of commercial breaks) ... Travon Patterson's 43-yard punt return in the first quarter was the longest CU punt return since Josh Smith had a 51-yarder vs. Eastern Washington on Sept. 6, 2008 ... CU has now outscored the opponent **60-28** in the third quarter (14-7 today) ... **P Zach Grossnickle** had his first collegiate punt for 50 or more yards (51-yarder in fourth quarter) ... Tech rushed for 144 yards after CU had held it under 100 the last four games in the series (91, 91, 31, 39) ... Ten different Buffs had a hand in earning the team's 20 first downs ... **QB Tyler Hansen** piloted the offense for 26 plays (for 80 yards) prior to leaving the game with a rib injury in the second quarter; **QB Cody Hawkins** directed 59 plays for 284 yards ... Tech averaged 6.9 yards on first down, well below the 10-plus both Georgia and Baylor had averaged in CU's last two home games; three plays accounted for 107 of its 233 first down yards ... The Buffs are 0-3 in Big 12 Conference play for the first time in the 15 year history of the league, and dropped their first three league games since opening 0-4 in the Big Eight in 1983 ... TTU scored one touchdown rushing, just the fourth allowed on the ground this season; the Buffs are among the national leaders in fewest rushing TDs allowed (tied for fifth coming into today) ... The Buffs final game against Big 12 South teams is next Saturday at Oklahoma; as of now, CU is an even **22-22** in regular season play against the South, plus another 1-3 in league championship games.

**BALL HOGS** Colorado came in ranked fourth in the nation in time of possession (33:59), and promptly came out and

held the ball for **20:03** in the first half (10:21 in the first quarter). The Buffs have held the time advantage in all seven games this season, though Tech made it closer today than in any of the seven, as TTU had it for 19:26 in the second half.

**TRIO MAKES FIRST STARTS** Mainly due to injuries, three players started for the first time, all on defense: **DE Nick Kasa**, **SS Terrel Smith** and **CB Jonathan Hawkins** (at the nickel position). Smith is the second true freshman to start a game this year, joining Jered Bell, who started last week (vs. Baylor) at strong safety. **OT Bryce Givens** also made his first start of the season at right tackle.

**TB RODNEY STEWART (20-34, 0 TD)** He was held to a season-low 34 yards (previous low was 67 against CSU), but he did convert on two 3rd-&-1s and a 4th-&-1 to improve to **12-of-13** in those situations this fall (23-of-26 for his career). He is also **18-for-22** in third/fourth down rushing this season from all distances.

**CB JALIL BROWN (1 INT)** He made his third interception of the year, giving him six for his career; that ties him for 28th all-time at CU, the 43rd player to make six career picks.

**QB CODY HAWKINS (43-22-0, 274, 2 TD)** He became only the third player in CU history to pass for 6,000 yards in a career, finishing the day with **6,269**; he joins **Joel Klatt** (7,375) and **Kordell Stewart** (6,481) as the three who have done it. He added to his all-time CU mark of TD passes, as he now has 48, and also became the third player in Buff history to eclipse 6,000 yards in total offense (6,124).

**WR SCOTTY MCKNIGHT (5-50, 0 TD)** He extended his NCAA-active best regular season streak to 43 games with at least one reception (every game of his career, 44 including postseason). He is inching closer to 200 career receptions (196), adding to his all-time CU mark with every catch, and he has 2,238 career receiving yards, 209 shy of third place (Charles E. Johnson, 2,447).

**WR PAUL RICHARDSON (4-79, 2 TD)** He became the first true freshman in CU history to have two touchdown receptions in the same game, and just the third frosh (true/redshirt) to do it, joining WR Michael Westbrook (1991 vs. Missouri) and Brody Heffner (1996 vs. Iowa State ... before he tacked on Liddiard to his last name). The four catches and 79 yards are career highs for Richardson. Scotty McKnight was the last player to have two TD catches in a game (vs. Nebraska in Boulder last year and vs. Iowa State at Folsom in 2008).

**TODAY'S PUNCH VS. PUNCH WINNER: COLORADO.** Texas Tech came in converting just under 45 percent on third down, but the Buffs held the Red Raiders to 5-of-15 (33%, just a shade above CU's average allowed of 32.4). The Buffs also had two quarterback sacks and an interception on third down plays.

Texas Tech's 11-game streak of televised games came to an end today at Folsom Field in Boulder. None of the Big 12 television partners chose to air today's clash between the Red Raiders and Buffaloes. Prior to today, Tech had been on television 11 straight times beginning with the Kansas game on Oct. 31, 2009. Tech's last non-televised game was against rival Texas A&M on Oct. 24, 2009.

## STREAKS THAT WERE CONTINUED

Seniors Detron Lewis and Lyle Leong continued their consecutive games streak with a reception as Lewis caught six passes for 84 yards and Leong made five grabs for 32 yards. Lewis has caught at least one pass in 34 consecutive games while Leong has made at least one catch in 30 consecutive games.

## LYLE LEONG TIES FOR THIRD ON CAREER TOUCHDOWN RECEPTIONS LIST

Senior Lyle Leong caught a touchdown pass in the fourth quarter to mark his 23rd career touchdown reception which ties him for third on the Tech all-time list.

## TAYLOR POTTS MOVES UP TO 3RD ON TECH ALL-TIME CAREER COMPLETIONS LIST

Senior Taylor Potts' second completion of the game moved him into third place on the all-time on the Texas Tech career completions list. Potts finished the game 24-for-38 for 286 yards with two touchdown passes.

## FINDING THE ENDZONE AT FOLSOM FIELD

Aaron Crawford's 1-yard touchdown run in the second quarter marked the first touchdown for the Red Raiders at Folsom Field since 2002. Tau-rean Hederson was the last Red Raider to score a TD here when he scampered into the end zone on a 2-yard rush in the second quarter of that game on Oct. 26, 2002. Tech's touchdown drought at Folsom Field covered eight years but just seven total quarters (Tech was held to just two field goals in 2006).

## STEPHENS SETS CAREER RETURNS RECORD

Eric Stephens surpassed another record of Donny Anderson's this afternoon when he picked up his 57th career kickoff return with 12 seconds remaining in the first half. Stephens is now the career leader in both kickoff return yardage (1,469) and total returns (58).

## NOTING THE RED RAIDERS

- True freshman defensive end Dartwan Bush had his redshirt removed on Tech's second defensive series of the game. The Red Raiders ended up allowing a touchdown that gave Colorado a 7-0 lead with 4:48 remaining in the first quarter. Bush became the sixth true freshman to see playing time this season.
- For the second straight week, Texas Tech was unable to turn its first three offensive possessions into points and just like the OSU game the Red Raiders converted on their fourth possession. Aaron Crawford tied the game for Tech with a 1-yard touchdown run (6:10 remaining in the first half) and the TD marked his first of the season.
- Redshirt freshman Pearlie Graves recorded his first career sack on Colorado's fourth possession of the game. The sack ended the CU drive with 11:10 remaining in the second quarter. Graves ended the game with two sacks.
- Sophomore receiver Alex Torres scored Tech's second touchdown of the game on a 15-yard reception with 8:43 remaining in the third quarter. The touchdown pulled Tech to within three points (17-14) and was his third touchdown reception of the year.
- Senior kicker Matt Williams made the score 24-17 as the fourth quarter began with a 40-yard field goal, his longest FG of the season and the second longest (43-yard FG vs. Baylor - 2009) of his career. **He later kicked the game-winning field goal with a 36-yard field goal with 2:08 left to play. It marked the fifth time in his career he has made two field goals in a game, which is a career-high.**
- Taylor Potts found Lyle Leong for a seven-yard touchdown with 10:54 left in the fourth quarter to tie the score, 24-24. The touchdown was Leong's 10th of the season and the 23rd of his career... The touchdown pass by Potts marked his 20th of the season and 47th of his career.
