TIM JEFFERSON
AIR FORCE

SENIOR, QUARTERBACK, 6-0, 205

ATLANTA, GA. (WOODWARD ACADEMY)

Jefferson rushed for 66 yards on 20 carries and scored two touchdowns in a home win over Navy. His second touchdown broke a 14-14 tie and was the game-winner late in the third quarter. He hit 6-of-12 passes for 122 yards with a long of 37. He connected on a 35-yard strike to Zack Kauth to set up the team's first touchdown the cut the lead to 14-11 midway through the third quarter. Jefferson had a key five-yard run in the fourth quarter for a first down which allowed Air Force to then run out the clock. With his 122 yards passing, he became just the fourth player in school history to surpass the 4,000-yard mark in career passing yards. He has 4,091 career passing yards. Jefferson has improved to 6-1 as a starter, including 4-0 vs. Army, in service academy games. He is the only quarterback in service academy history to win six games against service academies.

2011-2012 NFFCC News & Notes

ADAMS STATE COLLEGE (5-5, 3-5 RMAC)

Team Notes: The Grizzlies held the Mavericks to 193 yards on Saturday (107 passing, 86 rushing), but were hindered by four turnovers. Senior Terjean Saffold rushed the ball 26 times on Saturday, rushing at least 25 times for the fourth time this season and raising his total to 202 carries this season. Senior Delton Prescott was the favored target in the game, catching eight balls for 84 yards. Prescott's 66 catches this season move him into second on the Grizzlies' available history single season list. Rocco DeLorenzo led the defense with 10 tackles, while James Ackel had nine tackles and 3.0 for loss. Adams State will return to Rex Stadium next weekend for their season finale, the Colorado Classic against Western State. Adams State won 28-19 last season and has now won nine straight against the Mountaineers.

COLORADO MESA UNIVERSITY (4-6, 3-5 RMAC)

Team Notes: The Mavs posted their second consecutive win Saturday afternoon. It was their first home victory this year and first win over Adams State since the 2007 season. Jake Cimolino is 83-yards shy of rushing for 1,000 yards. CMU closes out the regular season at Chadron State this Saturday. CMU's defense caused four turnovers against ASC (three interceptions and one fumble). The Mavs have registered at least one sack in eight of 10 games. CMU honored 15 seniors Saturday on Senior Day.

COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES (8-2, 6-2 RMAC)

Team Notes: Dan Palmer finished the game against Chadron State with 94 yards and a touchdown inching him closer to 1,000 yards on the season as he currently sits a 982. If Palmer rushes for at least 18 yards next Saturday he becomes the third running back in the history of CSM to rush for 1,000 yards in a season. CSM head coach Bob Stitt won his 84th career game tying him for most all-time wins by a CSM football coach. With a win next Saturday he would have the most wins of any football coach in the history of CSM. Clay Garcia finished the game with 260 yards passing and a touchdown. Matt Brown caught seven passes for nine yards and a touchdown.

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY (3-5, 1-2 MWC)

Team Notes: Colorado State did not play last week. They will return to the field Nov. 12 for a 4 p.m. home game against San Diego State.

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY-PUEBLO (10-0, 8-0 RMAC)

Ross Dausin (Junior, Quarterback, 6-5, 230, San Antonio, Texas/Butler County CC/Warren HS)

Dausin set career highs with three touchdown passes and four total touchdowns (three passing, one rushing). He completed 15 passes on 22 attempts for 261 yards (no interceptions). He also carried the ball four times for 18 yards and a score. Dausin became the CSU-Pueblo career passing leader, breaking the mark previously held by head coach John Wristen of 3,283 yards. He broke the record in exciting fashion, connecting with Marcial Williamson on a 64-yard touchdown pass. He is now just two touchdown passes away from setting a school record for career touchdown passes.

Team Notes: CSU-Pueblo improved to 10-0 for the first time in school history with its 41-3 win over Western State, clinching at least a share of the program's first RMAC Championship since 1980. CSU-Pueblo becomes just the seventh RMAC squad since 1960 to begin a season 10-0. CSU-Pueblo extended its NCAA Division II-best win streak to 14 games, a school record. With its win over Western State, CSU-Pueblo defeated all five Colorado schools in the same season for the first time since 1980. CSU-Pueblo's ranking of No. 2 in the AFCA Coaches' poll marks the highest ever national ranking in the history of the football program. It previously reached a ranking of third in the nation in 1980, when it was an NAIA school.

FORT LEWIS COLLEGE (2-8, 1-7 RMAC)

Team Notes: Fort Lewis fell 54-7 at Nebraska-Kearney in its last home game of the season. They will finish the season at New Mexico Highlands on Nov. 12.

UNITED STATES AIR FORCE ACADEMY (5-4, 1-3 MWC)

Tim Jefferson (Senior, Quarterback, 6-0, 205, Atlanta, Ga. (Woodward Academy))

UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO (1-9, 0-6 PAC 12)

Tony Clemons (Senior, Wide Receiver, 6-2, 210, New Kensington, Pa./Valley)

In Colorado's 42-17 loss to Southern California, Clemons continued his recent solid play with five catches for a career-high 112 yards and two touchdowns. His 37-yard reception for a touchdown put CU up 7-0 early, the Buffs' first lead in five games (244:10 of game time).

Team Notes: USC extended its lead in the series with Colorado 6-0 (3-0 in Boulder/3-0 in Los Angeles). CU has lost seven straight games in the same season since opening 0-7 in 1980; overall, it's the longest losing skein since 10 in a row over the 2005-06 seasons. Colorado is now 23-11-2 all-time in Folsom Field night games (2-2-1 in November; this was first-ever Friday night one. CU has lost eighth straight against ranked teams (last win: 34-30 over Kansas in 2009). Colorado's first quarter touchdown was the first touchdown the Buffs scored against USC in three games in Boulder (lost 14-0 in 1963, 40-3 in 2002). That score gave CU its first lead since late in the Washington State game (Oct. 1), with a span of 244:10 in-between leads for the Buffs. It was just the second time in 10 games that CU was on offense first; the only other time was at Stanford when CU recovered a fumble after kicking to the Cardinal. Colorado went from committing five turnovers last week at Arizona State to having none tonight. Opponents have now scored in 28 of the last 29 quarters against CU dating back to the CSU game. USC finished with 561 total yards thanks to the last drive; that's five straight games CU has allowed 500 or more (a school first; it had never happened more than three times). CU has also allowed over 30 points in seven straight games and 40-plus five straight games, the latter for the first time since 1980. The Buffs have played three ranked opponents in as many games 14 times, but this was only the third time CU has been swept in those games. Colorado donned its all black garb (jersey/pant) for the first time since the 2009 Nebraska game and the 41st time overall; the Buffs are now 21-19-1 when decked out in all black. It was just the second time the Buffs wore black helmets; the lone other occasion was a "throwback" game against Baylor in 1998.

UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN COLORADO (0-10, 0-7 BSC)

Team Notes: Northern Colorado lost a 34-14 decision at Northern Arizona. They will conclude their season this Saturday at home against Portland State.

WESTERN STATE COLLEGE (1-9, 1-7 RMAC)

Team Notes: Western State fell to CSU-Pueblo 41-3 last week. They finish the season at Adams State at 1 p.m. on Nov. 12.
