Some Game Themes

A couple of teams whose performances depend on inner-core values and pride, with little else on the line... Teams with youth-dotted lineups in search of some momentum for the future... One side plugs along in the always challenging first-year of new system, while other side awaits the unknowns of a first-year coach next year... Someone sheds a weight after this one as the Cats work for their first road victory of the year on their penultimate trip, while the Buffaloes look for a first-ever Pac-12 victory... Some low-rated team rushing squads (UA 112th, CU 114th) with individuals on both sides who can do it when helped... Quarterbacks Nick Foles and Tyler Hansen go to work against pass efficiency defenses rated near the bottom of the FBS heap... Each team has allowed more than 400 yards per game and about 35 points, so a defensive struggle might not be suggested... For Arizona, Foles sees if he can continue to fling the rock at a single season and career record clip... With bowl eligibility out of the equation, which squad will dig down deeper to find some purpose? On Arizona's sideline, the motivation for younger players is impressing a soon-to-be new coach on film, while the senior members conclude some outstanding careers both statistical and otherwise... UA visits Boulder for the first time since 1986 when Larry Smith's Wildcats earned a narrow 24-21 victory...

Arizona Football Media Policies

Postgame Interviews

Arizona has a closed locker room policy after games. There is no player availability on the field immediately after the game.

Head coach Mike Stoops will address the assembled media only after his postgame radio show responsibilities have been completed both at home and on the road. Coach Stoops will address the media prior to any player comments.

At home games, individual players and coaches will be made available to media members for postgame interviews in the Media Room near Gate 15 only through request and approval of the media relations and coaching staffs. On the road, the locker room situation will dictate postgame protocol. Please consult the UA SID staff members.

Weekly Practices

All practices will be closed to the media during the season. Arizona players and coaches will be available post-practice to the media on Monday-Wednesday only. Players and coaches will not be available to the media post-practice on Thursdays and Fridays. Media members are requested to make post-practice interviews with individual players through the media relations staff.

Arizona Last Week

Arizona accumulated 457 yards but most of it was between the 20s as the Cats dropped a Pac-12 Homecoming tilt to Utah, 34-31. UA ventured twice into the red zone and came away empty-handed. The first came on the opening drive when it reached the Utes 15 yard-line and subsequently tried a fake field goal that didn't work. The second came in the fourth quarter when a 1st-and-goal at the Utah 1 turned into a nightmare when Conroy Black stepped in front of a Nick Foles pass and took it back to midfield with UA trailing 27-14. The Utes cashed in on that drive and put the game away. Way earlier, a Greg Bird block of a UA punt at Arizona's 25 yard-line set Utah up for a six-yard scoring drive; and a first of the two interceptions off Foles inside UA's half of the field set up a 30-yard scoring drive. Utah, to its credit, made the most of 332 yards in total offense by protecting the ball (no turnovers to UA's three) and taking advantage of four red-zone trips with four scores. Another partially blocked punt by Bird hurt UA's field position and in the end the Cats played a lot of the game on their end of the field. Foles threw for 326 yards and two scores by David Douglas, who had a career-high 10 catches for a career-high 156 yards. Three UA backs totaled 137 yards led by sophomore Daniel Jenkins' best-ever 57 markers (6 carries) and a score of 29 yards as time wound down. The Cats had 28 first downs, 6.1 yards per play, a season-low (tying) three penalties and converted eight of 14 third downs, but special teams' play and three turnovers spoiled any chances at momentum. The victory was Utah's first-ever Pac-12 road win.

The Coaches

Arizona - Tim Kish (Otterbein '76), interim head coach (1-2).. This is Kish's first assignment as a head coach. The 36-year veteran of the college ranks has coached at Pac-12, Big Ten (Illinois, Northwestern), the Ohio prep ranks, Mid-American Conference schools (Ball State, Bowling Green State, Ohio) and a service academy (Army). He has been on Mike Stoops' Arizona staff as linebackers coach each of the latter's eight years in Tucson, the last two as co- or defensive coordinator. Kish played college ball as a DB at Otterbein, and later earned a master's degree from Bowling Green. He began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Mariemont High School in Cincinnati, Ohio, in 1976. He has been on the defensive side of the ball all but one year in his college career, the 1982 season as QBs coach at Ball State. He and his wife, Angela, have two daughters and a son. His eldest, Megan, is a student at Ohio State. **Colorado - John Embree (Colorado '88), first year at CU (1-9)** and first year overall. A four-year Colorado letterman tight end (1983-86), Embree began coaching as a volunteer under Bill McCartney at CU in 1991. He was a 10-year assistant at Colorado, a three-year assistant at UCLA, and coached four seasons in the NFL at Kansas City and Washington. His coaching background has been on both sides of the ball.

Coaching Faces in the Crowd

Colorado assistant head coach and QB mentor Rip Scherer was an assistant at Arizona under Dick Tomey in 1989 and 1990 after serving a year as recruiting coordinator for the Cats before becoming OC for those two seasons... CU's other coordinator, Greg Brown, was a co-coordinator for Mike Stoops at Arizona in 2010... CU wide receivers coach Bobby Kennedy served as Arizona's running backs coach under John Mackovic in 2001... CU defensive line coach Mike Tuiasosopo was a fixture in the same capacity for Mike Stoops' first seven seasons in Tucson from 2004-10 before moving with Brown to join Embree's first staff... UA secondary coach Ryan Walters played four years at Colorado (2005-08) before following a mentor, Brown, to Tucson and serving as a defensive graduate assistant last season before assuming a full-time role last spring...

Youth Movement

Arizona has trotted out 23 regular contributors who are either true freshmen (10) or redshirt freshmen (13) this season, including five different true freshmen that have started on UA's defense. The Cats have used DT Sani Fuimaono (started), LBs Rob Hankins and Hank Hobson (each with starts), DBs Tramayne Bondurant (three starts) and Cortez Johnson (mostly on special teams, one start) on defense. Other key true freshmen contributors include RB Ka'Deem Carey, DE Reggie Gilbert, TE Michael Cooper, WR Trevor Ermisch (special teams) and Josh Elias (snapper). Arizona also has played 13 redshirt freshmen -- OT Mickey Baucus (starter), OT Fabbians Ebelle (starter), DT Aiulua Fanene, safety/nickel back Jourdon Grandon (formation starts), defensive back Blake Brady (special teams) receiver Austin Hill (has started), OG Carter Lees (has started), DE Dan Pettinato, WR Tyler Slavin, OT Trent Spurgeon, DT Kirifi Taula (has started), and receiver Garic Wharton (KOR starts).

Staring at the Stats

With three games to play Arizona has more first downs (235) than it had in any year from 2000 to 2006 in the transition years of Dick Tomey/John Mackovic/Mike Stoops. Stoops' club last year set the school record with 308 and 23.6 per game. This year's team is averaging 26.1. The 17.2 passing first downs per game would blow away the record of 12.2 set by Willie Tuitama and the 2007 Wildcats... A couple of statistical-program anomalies, once fixed, put Arizona's team net punting at 34.1 yards per kick although the NCAA report this week shows a 37.4 figure. (Blocked punts at OSU and against Utah initially exited the stat program used by the NCAA as non-punts.) The altered figure drops UA from the reported 44th in net punting to around No. 100 and should be reflected in next week's numbers. Arizona has allowed opponents to record a net punting figure of 42.1 yards, which would rate No. 3 in the nation if it was a team's net kicking... Seven missed red zone opportunities (27-for-34) this year have cost Arizona a perfect-world 49 points -- which would give UA the same total score as opponents (313) and possibly computer to something other than a 2-7 record... Arizona is in danger of recording its lowest defensive sacks total in its Pac-10/12 history. Mike Stoops' 6-6 Arizona club checked out with 15, while the current squad has less than one per game, 8. On the other side of the ball the young offensive line has given up 16 which project to a solid overall total considering the unit entered the year with one career start across the five positions... After starting the year with 11 penalties in each of the first two games the Cats have had nine total in the last two games. UA's first five games saw 43 flags against the Wildcats and the last four have seen 23... Arizona's bowl streak (2008-10) saw it score 33, 19 and 20 rushing touchdowns, respectively. The 2011 club has 11 rushing TDs...

Keep An Eye On...

- Juron Criner is one touchdown reception shy of tying Theopolis "T" Bell's school record of 30 scores set from 1972-74.
- Nick Foles is 284 passing yards shy of matching Willie Tuitama's (9,221 from 2005-08) school record for career passing yards.
- Foles is six passing touchdowns shy of matching Tuitama's school record of 67 career TDs.
- Foles needs 28 more pass attempts to tie Tuitama's school record of 1,276 in a career.
- Foles is 83 yards shy of equaling Tuitama's career record of 8,727 yards of total offense.
- Foles needs 67 passing yards to match Jason Johnson's 3,327 passing yards in 2002 for second-most in single season history. Tuitama holds the most with 3,683 in 2007.
- Foles' next passing touchdown will tie Tuitama's mark of 23 in 2008 for second-most in a single season. Tuitama has the single season record with 28 in 2007.
- Foles is two completions short of tying his own 2010 mark of 286 completions in a season, which is second-most. Tuitama had a school-record 327 in 2007.
- Foles is 13 pass attempts short of matching his own 2010 mark of 426 throws in a season, which is second-most. Tuitama had a school-record 524 in 2007.
- Keola Antolin (24) is one rushing touchdown short of tying Trung Canidate for No. 4 all-time in school history. Antolin is three TDs short of matching Ronald Veal's No. 3 mark of 27.
- Antolin needs 111 more rushing yards to surpass Jim Upchurch (1972-74) for No. 9 on the all-time rushing chart.
- David Douglas is four receptions short of matchin Jon Horton's 136 catches for the No. 6 spot on the all-time charts.
- Juron Criner is 12 points shy of tying for No. 9 on school's all-time scoring list.
- Trevin Wade is one interception shy of matching three players with 13 interceptions for the No. 7 spot on the school charts.
- Wade needs two more pass breakups to match Chris McAlister and Kelvin Hunter for No. 9 in school history (27 career PBUs).

Taking a Long Drive

Arizona has made six scoring drives off opponent turnovers, with two of those instant-points on pick-six returns. The others -- a 1-play 18-yard drive, a 6-play 59-yard drive, an 8-play 63-yard drive, and a 5-play 59-yard drive took more time after the sudden change. It's clear the Cats haven't received many gifts. In fact, the average on the 40 Arizona scoring drives (not take-backs) this year is 8 plays and 67 yards. That's one reason UA is above 4,100 yards in total offense. When clicking, Arizona has put together solid sustained drives.

Passing Fancy?

Arizona has played four of the top six pass defenses (yardage) in the Pac-12 and leads the league by more than 70 yards per game, 369.6. So it figures the Wildcats will get their passing yards. Turning the moving ability into points will be Arizona's quest in its final fourth of the year. The Cats have passed for more than 400 yards twice (NAU/USC) and 380 yards three times. The UA's 319 yards against UCLA came with 254 yards rushing and helped UA to its lone Pac-12 victory, so perhaps trying to run the ball against the league's 12th-rated rushing defense might be the plan. Too, the Buffaloes won't shy from trying the same thing against Arizona's 10th-rated rushing defense. Nick Foles could own a couple more Arizona passing records when 2011 is over, but he and the Cats would trade them for some Ws.

Running Crown

Senior running back Keola Antolin, No. 10 on UA's career chart with 2,279 yards, can move up a notch with another 110 yards. He has 449 yards on 91 attempts to match his career average of 4.9 yards per tote. He had 600-plus yards each of the last two seasons to lead the club and appears on track to do it for a third season, accomplished previously (since 1958) by only Hubert Oliver (1978-80), David Adams (1984-86), Ontiwaun Carter (1991-94), Trung Canidate (1997-99) and Mike Bell (2002-05). Bell was the only Arizona rusher ever to lead the team four years. Freshman Ka'Deem Carey (71-304, 4.3) and soph Daniel Jenkins (24-129, 5.4) are getting a piece of Antolin's pie of late.

Historical Look

At 2-7 the Wildcats need some focus and verve to wrap up the year in decent fashion. Why not? Winning out would mean 5-7, no worse than 11 other Arizona overall records in the 33 years of Pac-10 play. Losing out would match the program's low-water mark of 2-10 by the 2003 club coached by John Mackovic through 1-4 and Mike Hankwitz 1-6 down the stretch. Winning another game would place UA around Mike Stoops' first two teams (3-8) in 2004-05. Nothing's easy and games at 1-9 Colorado, at (current 6-3) Arizona State and a home finale against (current 8-2) Louisiana-Lafayette all pose their challenges. A team Arizona beat by 36 points is currently tied for the Pac-12 South lead so don't write anything down before it's over.

Just Kick It

In what's noted as "scientifically rigorous conferments," UA senior kicker John Bonano has received attention from the College Football Performance Awards (collegefootballperformanceawards.com) for his 2011 kicking. He was Kickoff Specialist of the Week for his NAU work and honorable mention for the Utah, Oregon and Oregon State games. He also earned honorable mention Placekicker Performer of the Week for his kicking at Washington. The organization notes it "eliminates the politics and biases that vitiate balloting-based awards" and uses some objectivity and science to determine which players increase the overall effectiveness of their teams. Bonano evidently is doing some good stuff.

David's Day

Not to be lost amid the frustration and disappointment of last week's Homecoming loss to Utah was a career performance by senior wide receiver David Douglas. A native of McKinney, Texas, Douglas hauled in career highs for receptions (10) and yards (156). His two receiving touchdowns were the first two of the season, tied a single-game career high and boosted his career tally to nine scores. The 10 receptions moved Douglas up to No. 7 in school history with 132 career catches. He has 1,406 career receiving yards, which puts him within reach of catch Syndric Steptoe, whose 1,584 receiving yards rank No. 13 in program history on the all-time charts.

Daniel's Day

A bright spot in UA's 34-21 loss to Utah last week was the effort of sophomore running back Daniel Jenkins. The Moreno Valley, Calif., native led the Wildcats with 57 yards on the ground and his first career rushing touchdown. The 29-yard scoring scamper late in the fourth quarter was his first career score and the longest gain of his career. After projecting as the team's No. 2 running back on the fall camp depth chart, Jenkins suffered an ankle sprain that limited in the first few weeks of the season. His perseverance has paid off to this point as he has bounced back to gain 129 yards on 24 totes this season. His 5.4 yards per carry is tops on the team to date, and his steady improvement and speedy burst on the field is sure to earn him some more carries down the stretch.

Scoring Points

Arizona has 17 players that have scored a point this season, which matches the totals of Oregon and Stanford for most in the Pac-12. A total of 13 Wildcats have scored a touchdown this season, which does not include quarterback Nick Foles who has four career rushing touchdowns from his sophomore and junior campaigns. The Wildcats' scoring leader is Juron Criner, who has eight receiving touchdowns for 48 points. Next on the list is Ka'Deem Carey who has four rushing scores and one receiving touchdown for 30 points. Then you find placekicker John Bonano, who in three games as the starter has yet to miss a kick (5-5 FG, 12-12 PAT) for 27 total points.

Two Good Ones

With the Wildcats officially not eligible for a bowl this year, it can definitively be stated that senior defensive backs Trevin Wade and Robert Golden are down to their final three games as Wildcats. Wade was an overlooked talent out of Round Rock, Texas, that earned a scholarship to play in the secondary under Mike and Mark Stoops despite being a "two-star" prospect by recruiting services and whatever skill, if any, they have in evaluation. Golden was a highly touted prospect out of Fresno, Calif., that played as a true freshman and has bounced from corner to safety to corner and back to safety in his days as a Wildcat. Each has started 35 games in the defensive backfield and both are now senior team captains. Wade has 12 interceptions in his career, which ties for third-most actively in the nation and ranks No. 10 all-time at the school. Golden has four interceptions and four forced fumbles to his credit. Both have two interception returns for touchdowns and over 200 INT return yards each. With three games left, they can add to those numbers with a few more big plays.

Rushing Quartet

Arizona is still trying to get to 1,000 rushing yards on the season, which it could do with 148 more yards. In actuality, the club has surpassed that number with 1,090 yards gained, but 238 lost yards (many due to sacks) have kept the net number below the 1K figure. But the rushing quartet of Keola Antolin, Daniel Jenkins, Ka'Deem Carey and Taimi Tutogi (short yardage situations) has been pretty steady when called upon. The four runners -- all offer different skill sets -- have combined for a 4.6 yards per carry clip, which is pretty respectable. They have combined for all 11 rushing touchdowns for the team this season.

Tra'Riffic

True freshman LB/DB Tra'Mayne Bondurant has made the most of his three consecutive starts as part of a hybrid/roving linebacker/nickelback back on Arizona's defense. Called upon to make his starting debut against UCLA three weeks ago, Bondurant has since recorded eight tackles in each contest, has one sack, two tackles for loss and two pass breakups. He has shown a nose for the football, isn't afraid of contact and is willing to listen and learn from his coaches and elder teammates. It is clear that he has a very bright future at Arizona whether his future be at linebacker, in the secondary or some combination as he is currently playing. The new coaching staff will be glad to have him for the coming years.

Caretaking Coaching

UA defensive coordinator Tim Kish's fill-in work as a head coach (following the Oct. 10 dismissal of Mike Stoops) is unusual but not exclusively so. The acting job is a second for the Wildcats in the past decade. Then AD Jim Livengood removed John Mackovic from head coaching duties on Sunday, Sept. 28, 2003 after UA opened the season with a 1-4 record. He appointed defensive coordinator Mike Hankwitz to take over the program for the duration of the season. Hankwitz, now defensive coordinator at Northwestern, led UA to a 1-6 finish for the program's lowest mark in the modern era, 2-10 (.0167). (The 1957 club under Ed Doherty, 1-8-1, had a lower winning percentage (.015). A few months after Mackovic's ouster, Mike Stoops was appointed. A search by UA Athletics Director Greg Byrne for his successor is well under way.

Toughest Schedule

According to Jeff Sagarin's NCAA Football ratings, Arizona's schedule ranks as the toughest in the Pac-12 and the fifth-toughest in the nation to date. While not an excuse by any measure, four of UA's six losses have come on the road, while the two home foes (Stanford, Oregon and Utah) are a combined 22-5 on the season. Added together, Arizona's seven losses have come against teams with a combined 46-13 record. Three of those teams are ranked in the top six spots of the AP Top 25 poll and BCS standings this week, with Stanford and Oklahoma State boasting undefeated records and national championship talk.

Banged Up Defense

It started in spring practices and has continued each week throughout the season: Arizona's defense cannot shake the injury bug. Starters Adam Hall (safety) and Jake Fischer (linebacker) tore ACLs in spring practices and are out for the season. Defensive tackle Willie Mobley, projected to be in the two-deep rotation at the interior spots, later tore an ACL in a non-football activity in May forcing his season to end before it ever began. Starting cornerback Jonathan McKnight tore an ACL right before the start of the season in August to end his season as well. Since then, Arizona has lost starts to starting defensive tackle Justin Washington (knee/foot), starting ends CJ Parish (ankle) and Mohammed Usman (ankle) and starting cornerback Shaquille Richardson (ankle). True freshman linebacker Hank Hobson, who started at USC, has also battled a knee injury in recent weeks. Corner Trevin Wade has battled injuries off and on as well, but has started every game. And of course there are the usual week-to-week nicks and dings that all players sustain. Added up, the Wildcats haven't had any luck putting a consistent lineup of players on defense all season long. In the end, some younger guys have gained some premature experience that may be a blessing in disguise for years to come under a new coaching regime.

Criner Climbing

Senior wide receiver Juron Criner has been etching his name into the Arizona career records for some time, but now he's quickly moving up some of the conference's all-time charts. Most notable are Criner's 29 receiving touchdowns, which put him No. 7 all-time in league history. One more scoring catch will give the 6-foot-4 target a share of No. 5 with Mario Bailey (Washington, 1988-91) and Mike Williams (USC, 2002-03). Two more grabs will equal Sean Dawkins (California, 1990-92) mark that ranks fourth, and three more will match Jason Hill (Washington State, 2003-06) and Ken Margerum (Stanford, 1977-80), who share second place. Dwayne Jarret (USC, 2004-06) is the league's all-time touchdown receptions leaders. Criner is challenging for position on the chart with Washington's Jermaine Kearse, who has 28 scoring touchdowns entering this week's action. Criner ranks No. 40 all-time with 2,510 receiving yards and No. 23 with 184 career receptions. On the national scale, Criner's 29 receiving touchdowns rank fifth-most for active players, trailing only Oklahoma's Ryan Broyles (45), Notre Dame's Michael Floyd (34), Oklahoma State's Justin Blackmon (34) and Texas A&M's Jeff Fuller (31).

Spread the Wealth

How effectively has Nick Foles spread the ball around this season? Consider that 13 different targets have a reception. Nine players have at least 100 receiving yards, nine have a reception of 26 yards or longer and nine have a touchdown reception. Seven players have a reception of 40 yards or longer. Added together, the group averages 11.5 yards per reception. The headliner – Juron Criner – has 607 yards and eight touchdowns on the season. The supporting cast includes seniors Gino Crump (46-442), David Douglas (46-530) and David Roberts (35-354). It also includes junior Dan Buckner (39-577), sophomore Richard Morrison (20-190) and redshirt freshman Austin Hill (19-276). The aerial attack also includes backfield targets Ka'Deem Carey (9-140), Keola Antolin (16-116) and Taimi Tutogi (5-51), who all have receiving touchdowns on the season. Those are some pretty talented players that Foles has to work with, and he includes them all.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) -- Nick Foles threw for 412 yards and had three of his five touchdown passes in third quarter, helping Arizona shake off a first-half funk to open the season with a 41-10 win over Northern Arizona Saturday night.

The Wildcats flew around the field while building a 14-0 lead in the first quarter, then went stagnant in the second, allowing the FCS Lumberjacks to get within four points.

Triggered by Trevin Wade's interception, Arizona pulled away in the third quarter on touchdown passes from Foles to Keola Antolin, Richard Morrison and Austin Hill.

Juron Criner also caught a TD pass, finishing with six catches for 151 yards. Foles was 34 for 42 passing.

Northern Arizona's Cary Grossart threw for 179 yards on 20 of 26 passing. Zach Bauman ran for 99 yards on 27 carries.

The Wildcats were hoping Northern Arizona would serve as a warmup for a schedule that's about to get real tough.

After the Lumberjacks, Arizona has a short turnaround for a road game against No. 9 Oklahoma State on Thursday. Two home dates follow: against No. 7 Stanford and Heisman Trophy favorite Andrew Luck on Sept. 17, then third-ranked Oregon on Sept. 24.

With plenty of new players, including the entire offensive line, the Wildcats needed this game to build some confidence -- for the inexperienced guys and the ones who suffered through the season-ending five-game losing streak in 2010.

Everyone looked good early against Northern Arizona.

Foles opened by hitting Criner on a 42-yard play-action pass, then floated in a 10-yard touchdown pass to him in the corner of the end zone two plays later.

Arizona kept rolling, Taimi Tutogi making it 14-0 in the closing seconds of the first quarter on a 5-yard TD run through a huge hole off right tackle.

Arizona's defense was good, too, swarming the Lumberjacks while holding them to 14 yards on 12 plays.

Rout on the way, right? Not quite.

Once the second quarter started, the offense sputtered, with the running game nonexistent -- five yards on six carries in the first half -- and Foles unable to find his receivers as readily.

Grossart started to find some seams going the other way, picking the Wildcats apart to go 16 of 17 for 145 yards in the first half.

Matt Myers hit a 28-yard field goal midway through the second quarter, and Grossart found Khalil Paden on a 12-yard touchdown pass in the closing seconds of the half, getting NAU within 14-10.

Arizona quickly moved into position for a field-goal attempt, thanks to a 42-yard up-for-grabs catch by Criner, but Jaime Salazar's 36-yard attempt was way right.

It wasn't too much of a surprise that Northern Arizona kept it close; the Lumberjacks were within a touchdown in the fourth quarter against Arizona State last season and had the Wildcats still in their sights at halftime the year before.

Arizona was still in a fog to open the second half, going three-and-out.

Wade's interception jolted the Wildcats back.

Stepping front of a receiver on NAU's second play, Wade made the pick at the 12-yard line, and Antolin scored on a swing pass the next play, bowling over a defender, tightropeing the sideline then diving the final few yards to the pylon.

Morrison followed with a 24-yard touchdown reception from Foles across the middle, and Hill all but sealed it with his first career catch, a 24-yard TD that Arizona up 34-10.

Arizona's defense was just as dominant, holding Northern Arizona to 25 yards in the third quarter and no points in the second half.

STILLWATER, Okla. (AP) - Brandon Weeden connected with Justin Blackmon on two short touchdown tosses, Joseph Randle ran for two scores and No. 9 Oklahoma State used an early burst of offense to beat Arizona 37-14 on Thursday night in a rematch of last year's Alamo Bowl.

The Cowboys (2-0) scored on their first three drives to open a 21-0 lead in the first 16 1/2 minutes, then put it away with two scores midway through the second half.

Randle had 121 yards rushing and nine catches for 99 yards, and Blackmon had 128 yards on 12 receptions to extend his NCAA record streak to 14 straight games with at least 100 yards receiving.

Weeden finished with 397 yards passing, one less than Arizona's Nick Foles, in a duel between the nation's top two passers from the first week of the season.

The Wildcats (1-1) played without Juron Criner, who was the Pac-10's top receiver last season and tied the school record with 11 touchdown catches. He had an appendectomy on Monday, and it's unclear whether he'll be able to return in time for Arizona's home games the next two weeks against No. 6 Stanford and No. 12 Oregon.

But even with Criner out, Foles flung it around without many issues. Texas transfer Dan Buckner had 10 catches for 142 yards, including a 54-yarder for a touchdown, and Austin Hill had 128 yards on eight receptions.

The Wildcats' running game continued to struggle. Keola Antonin had just 22 yards on 13 carries, including a 1-yard touchdown run during a stretch when Arizona made five straight defensive stops to give itself a chance.

Oklahoma State flipped the field when punter Quinn Sharp took off for a 23-yard gain on a fake, and the Wildcats then got in their own way with a series of penalties that backed them up to their own 1-yard line before punting it back.

Weeden capitalized on the short field by feeding Blackmon on four straight plays, the last one a 3-yard fade pattern to the right side of the end zone. Randle highlighted the Cowboys' next drive by coming out of the backfield to catch a 63-yard flip over the middle and set up Jeremy Smith's 6-yard TD run that made it 34-7 early in the fourth quarter.

Buckner answered with his long TD on a stop-and-go down the right sideline against Devin Hedgepeth, but it was too little, too late for Arizona.

The Wildcats, who lost 36-10 in the Alamo Bowl to complete a five-game free fall at the end of last season, hadn't put up nearly enough resistance at the start and lost to OSU for the second time in nine months.

Weeden completed 19 of his first 20 passes as Oklahoma State charged down the field on scoring drives of 88, 80 and 70 yards. Randle had touchdown runs of 1 and 4 yards, and in between Weeden tossed a 3-yard fade pass that Blackmon caught over his shoulder before tapping his right foot in the corner of the end zone.

Weeden's first 13 passes were completed before he overshot Tracy Moore on a deep ball. He then reeled off nine more completions before finishing the first half with 240 yards on 28-for-32 passing.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) - Andrew Luck threw for 325 yards and had both of his touchdown passes in the second half, helping No. 6 Stanford pull away for a 37-10 victory over Arizona on Saturday night in the Pac-12 opener for both teams.

Stanford (3-0) struggled to find the end zone in the first half, then wore Arizona down in the second.

Luck picked the Wildcats apart on 20-of-31 passing, throwing touchdown passes to Zach Ertz in the third quarter and Levine Toilolo in the fourth. Stepfan Taylor added a career-high 153 yards rushing and Stanford had a balanced 567 yards to win its 11th straight game, the Cardinal's longest run since taking 13 straight from 1939-41.

Nick Foles threw for 239 yards and a touchdown, but couldn't overcome Arizona's anemic running game by himself. The Wildcats (1-2) had just 51 yards rushing on 23 carries in their sixth straight loss to an FBS team.

Stanford rolled through its first two games, outscoring San Jose State and Duke by a combined score of 101-17. Luck, not surprisingly, was the catalyst, throwing for 461 yards and six touchdowns with one interception.

Playing Arizona in the desert figured to be a stiffer challenge for the Cardinal.

The Wildcats have one of the nation's best quarterbacks in Foles, who, like Luck, figures to be a first-round NFL draft pick. The 6-foot-5 senior doesn't have the polish that Luck has, but is prolific, completing 76 percent of his passes for 810 yards and six touchdowns the first two games.

Arizona also sent Stanford home with a disappointing loss in its last trip to Tucson, scoring two touchdowns in the fourth quarter for a 43-38 comeback victory.

That was just two years ago, but it seems like forever with the direction these teams have headed since.

The Cardinal rolled over the Wildcats 42-17 last season behind Luck's 293 yards and two touchdowns. Luck may be even better this season and Arizona struggled against a good passer last week, allowing Oklahoma State's Brandon Weedon to pick it apart for 397 yards and two touchdowns in a 17-point loss.

The Wildcats also have been one-dimensional on offense, relying almost solely on Foles while the running game has averaged just 58 yards per game, 115th in the nation. Stanford was second nationally through the first two games, allowing 28.5 yards per game, so it was weakness against strength.

And, though it wasn't pretty at times, the game turned out about how you might think.

Arizona again had trouble running the ball - minus-6 yards on 10 carries in the first half - but Foles made up for it, completing his first 17 passes while throwing for 198 yards and a touchdown. The score went on a 6-yard pass to Juron Criner, who showed no ill effects from the appendectomy that kept him out of last week's game against Oklahoma State.

The Wildcats kept it close, but could have been closer: Jaime Salazar missed field goals to end the second quarter and start the third, making him 1-for-4 on the season after Arizona was haunted by missed kicks a year ago.

Stanford's kicking game worked just fine - Jordan Williamson hit from 20, 45 and 33 yards - but the Cardinal wanted touchdowns after getting so deep into Arizona's end. The only one Stanford got came late in the first quarter, when Anthony Wilkerson scored on a 24-yard run on a fourth-and-a-foot misdirection play.

Leading 16-10 after one half, Stanford stomped the Wildcats down in the second.

Luck hit tight end Ertz on a 16-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter, then had two choices to open the fourth quarter on a defensive breakdown by Arizona. He settled on Toilolo (he was deeper), who scored easily on a 34-yard pass to put the Cardinal up 30-10.

That's seven touchdowns to tight ends - out of nine - for Luck this season and 53 TDs overall, moving him one ahead of Jim Plunkett for third all-time in Stanford history.

Stanford closed it out with a drive that took nearly seven minutes, capped by Jeremy Stewart's 2-yard TD run.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) - LaMichael James kept zipping and zagging through the desert night, playing the Road Runner to Arizona's Wile E. Coyote.

By the time he had finished slashing his way through and around the Wildcats on Saturday night, he had a school record 288 yards. He also broke the Oregon mark for career rushing touchdowns with two scores to lead the No. 10 Ducks to a 56-31 victory over Arizona in their Pac-12 opener.

Oregon (3-1), the two-time defending Pac-10 champion, won its 13th consecutive conference game, blowing open a 35-3 lead and then holding off a Wildcats rally before pulling away again with its lightning-quick offense.

All but the last of the Ducks' seven touchdown drives lasted less than three minutes. Darron Thomas passed for two scores and ran for two more.

Nick Foles completed 33 of 55 passes for 391 yards and three touchdowns for the Wildcats (1-3).

Arizona, playing its third consecutive top-10 team, has lost eight of nine dating to last year. The lone victory was this season's opener against Northern Arizona.

Oregon has the top-ranked offense in the Pac-12. Arizona's defense statistically is the worst. So the results from the opening kickoff were predictable.

James, who also had a 51-yard punt return, averaged 12.2 yards per carry in his second consecutive and fifth career 200-yard rushing game. He broke Oregon's single-game rushing record of 257 yards by Ontario Smith against Washington State in 2001.

With his touchdown runs of 12 and 19 yards, the speedy back has 43 scoring runs, breaking Derek Loville's school record of 42.

Oregon coach Chip Kelly said defenses have a tough time with the Ducks' triple running threat of James, Thomas and Kenjon Barner.

The Ducks amassed 516 yards, 415 on the ground.

With his team down 35-3, Foles led the Wildcats to three consecutive touchdowns. His 7-yard pass to David Roberts, and 2-point conversion toss to David Douglas, cut Oregon's lead to 35-24 with 3:14 to go in the third quarter. Kelly had seen Foles do this in previous encounters.

But the Ducks simply zipped to another score. James had a 31-yard run, and Thomas went the final 5 yards for the touchdown.

Foles got Arizona to the Oregon 6 on the subsequent kickoff, but the drive stalled. On fourth down he was sacked.

The Ducks reeled off five of their trademark lightning-fast touchdown drives, in six possessions, to open a 35-9 lead at the half.

James led the way, rushing for 133 yards in 11 carries in the first two quarters.

Oregon's first-half TD drives went 2:42 (8 plays, 80 yards), 2:19 (10 plays, 72 yards), 2:06 (8 plays, 80 yards), 2:02 (6 plays, 55 yards) and 1:37 (4 plays, 28 yards).

The Ducks amassed 300 yards in the first two quarters, 214 on the ground. Barner also ran for a pair of scores.

Of the Ducks' 28 touchdown drives this season, 22 have taken less than three minutes. Another went 3:01.

The stadium was almost full, and the student section was packed at kickoff, but about half of the students and a good share of the rest of the crowd was gone by halftime.

Foles' performance included a left-handed toss as he was being swarmed on the sideline - 11 yards to Keola Antolin and a first down at the Oregon 34 as the third quarter ended.

LOS ANGELES (AP) -- Matt Barkley passed for a school-record 468 yards and four touchdowns, Robert Woods made 14 catches for 255 yards and two scores, and Southern California outlasted Arizona 48-41 Saturday.

Freshmen Marqise Lee and Xavier Grimble caught TD passes from Barkley, who also rushed for a score while breaking Carson Palmer's 2002 yardage record with a blistering performance against Arizona's maligned defense.

The Trojans (4-1, 2-1 Pac-12) needed almost every yard against Arizona's Nick Foles, who passed for 425 yards and four TDs of his own. USC outgained Arizona 582-554 in a game largely devoid of defense.

Ka'Deem Carey rushed for two touchdowns and caught another scoring pass for the Wildcats (1-4, 0-3), who haven't beaten an FBS opponent in nearly a year.

Barkley went 32 for 39 with one interception, bouncing back from a rough start at Arizona State last week with another landmark game. After setting the USC record for single-game completions in the season opener, the junior has thrown nine TD passes in his last two home games.

Woods is having the most prolific season by a receiver in USC's long history through five games, starting off this chapter with an 82-yard score on the Trojans' second play.

The speedy sophomore, who set the USC mark with 17 catches in that season-opening win over Minnesota, fell 5 yards short of R. Jay Soward's 260-yard school record when Arizona held him to one catch for 2 yards in the fourth quarter.

Keola Antolin rushed for 87 yards for Arizona, which has lost four straight despite its prolific offense. Star receiver Juron Criner was limited to three catches for 29 yards and a touchdown.

Foles went 41 for 53, but threw two drive-killing interceptions to T.J. McDonald in the first half that allowed USC to pull away with a 27-12 halftime lead. The Trojans stayed ahead throughout the second half to stay unbeaten in four home games this season, repeatedly covering up for defensive struggles with offensive brilliance.

Woods took charge from USC's second play, catching a short pass from Barkley and splitting two defenders before outrunning the entire Arizona secondary down the sideline for a score. Lee caught a wide-open 38-yard TD pass from Barkley late in the first quarter when Arizona's entire defense appeared to focus on Woods, and Grimble caught a 7-yard scoring strike midway through the second quarter.

Arizona's spread offense also moved the ball easily against USC, punting just once in the first three quarters -- but Foles' mistakes put the Wildcats in a huge hole. Foles' first interception of the season killed the Wildcats' second drive in USC territory, and Foles badly overthrew David Douglas in the Trojans' end on the next drive.

McDonald, the hard-hitting safety, made both interceptions for the Trojans, who had just one interception in their first four games.

Woods caught a 28-yard TD pass down the middle just 2:03 into the third quarter, putting the Trojans up 34-12. But Foles kept the Wildcats moving for back-to-back touchdowns in the third quarter, bookending Barkley's only turnover.

After Curtis McNeal rushed for a 9-yard score with 9:28 to play to put the Trojans up by 14 points, USC turned the ball over on downs at midfield in the closing minutes. Austin Hill caught a 4-yard TD pass from Foles with 1 minute to play, but McDonald recovered an onside kick to seal it.

USC has won nine of its last 10 meetings with the Wildcats, who won in their last visit to the Coliseum two years ago.

CORVALLIS, Ore. --- Sean Mannion threw for 267 yards and two touchdowns and Oregon State defeated the mistake-prone Arizona Wildcats 37-27 on Saturday for the Beavers' first victory of the season.

Quarterback Nick Foles was intercepted twice and the Wildcats (1-5, 0-3 Pac-12) lost two fumbles in their fifth straight loss overall and eighth straight conference loss.

Oregon State (1-4, 1-2) led 27-6 at halftime and nearly squandered it but held on to snap a six-game losing streak dating to last season.

With only a narrow 30-27 lead and 5:22 left, Oregon State went for it on fourth-and-2 -- succeeding when Mannion hit diving tight end Joe Halahuni for the touchdown.

The Beavers made a crucial stand on the other end when the Wildcats also took a chance on fourth down with two yards to go, and Dan Buckner couldn't catch Foles' pass in the end zone.

Foles completed 31 of 45 passes for 378 yards and a touchdown to Buckner, who caught eight passes for 144 yards.

Mannion, a redshirt freshman who didn't become the Beavers' official starter until the third game of the season, completed 32 of 41 passes.

The Wildcats were hurt early after starting wide receiver Juron Criner left with what appeared to be a right knee injury. Criner, ranked second in career touchdown catches for the Wildcats, has three this season.

The Beavers went up on Jovan Stevenson's 1-yard touchdown run, then extended it in the second quarter when Clayton York blocked an Arizona punt and ran the ball back for a score.

Arizona answered with Foles' 28-yard TD pass to Buckner, but Alex Zendejas' extra-point attempt was wide left to make it 14-6.

The Beavers pulled off a fake punt to keep alive a drive that ended with Trevor Romaine's 37-yard field goal. On Arizona's ensuing drive, Foles' arm was hit and he was intercepted by Michael Doctor and the Beavers capitalized with Mannion's 3-yard scoring pass to Halahuni.

The Wildcats had one more chance in the first half, but fumbled and gave the ball back to the Beavers, who got a 40-yard field goal from Romaine.

Arizona running back Daniel Jenkins fumbled on Arizona's first drive of the second half and Beavers safety Lance Mitchell recovered, before the Beavers went up 30-6 on Romaine's 20-yard field goal.

The Wildcats had a scary moment midway through the third quarter when Foles was hit hard and stayed prone on the field for several moments while trainers attended to him. After he made his way to the sidelines, Keola Antolin ran 13 yards for a score. Foles came back and completed the two-point conversion pass to David Douglas.

The Wildcats' rally continued when Mannion was intercepted by Shaquille Richardson, who ran it back 20 yards for a touchdown. This time the two-point try failed, but Arizona was back in it at 30-20.

Oregon State missed a chance to extend its lead when James Rodgers' catch in the end zone was called back by a penalty and Romaine's 42-yard field goal attempt at the end of the third quarter went wide left.

Arizona pulled to within 30-27 early in the fourth quarter on Ka'Deem Carey's 1-yards scoring run.

The Wildcats have struggled this season with a brutal schedule, with losses to top-10 teams Oklahoma State, Stanford and Oregon, as well as their 48-41 loss last weekend at USC.

The Beavers were off to their worst start since 1996. After a season-opening overtime loss to lower-division Sacramento State, Oregon State dropped games to Wisconsin, UCLA and Arizona State.

Last season, Foles threw for 440 yards and three touchdowns against the Beavers, but Oregon State pulled out a 29-27 upset over the then-No. 9 Wildcats. Rodgers went down with a knee injury in that game that would require two surgeries and keep him out until the Beavers' third game this season.

TUCSON, Ariz. -- Tim Kish has had a simple message for his players since taking over for Mike Stoops: Have fun.

The Wildcats did just that with an emotional victory that was marred by a wild brawl, giving their interim coach a victory in his first game while sending UCLA's coach possibly closer to losing his job.

Dusting off an aggressive defensive scheme and relying on a recharged running game to complement Nick Foles' passing, Arizona ran over the Bruins 48-12 Thursday night.

Foles threw for 291 yards and connected with Juron Criner for three touchdown passes. That wasn't much of a surprise considering the way Arizona (2-5, 1-4 Pac-12) has piled up yards through the air.

The running game, dormant all season, came to life behind huge holes created by the much-maligned offensive line, churning out 254 of Arizona's season-high 573 yards and three touchdowns -- two by Taimi Tutogi.

The defense, another sore spot under Stoops, was just as good behind a throwback scheme called the "Double Eagle Flex," an aggressive front designed to clog up lanes against good running teams.

The combination allowed the Wildcats to build a 35-point halftime lead and cruise to an emotional victory, ending a five-game losing streak that had cost Stoops his job on Oct. 10.

The Bruins (3-4, 2-2) couldn't withstand the emotion of a team playing under a new coach and may have put theirs in jeopardy with a lackluster effort. On the hot seat before the season started, Rick Neuheisel may have taken big blow with a loss that puts a serious dent in UCLA's bowl chances.

Within a half-game of Arizona State and USC in the Pac-12 South heading into the game, the Bruins came out flat against Arizona in front of a national TV audience, which likely won't go over well back in Southern California.

One of the nation's best rushing teams, UCLA had 37 yards on 25 carries against a team that was 100th in the nation at 196 yards per game. Kevin Prince was mostly ineffective in his return to the starting lineup, hitting 17 of 35 passes for 286 yards and a touchdown.

The Bruins also lost a pair of fumbles in the first half and the defense had no chance at stopping the Wildcats -- ground or air -- as the game quickly got out of hand.

Frustration boiled over in the closing seconds of the first half, when a wild brawl spread about 60 yards across the field after a streaker dressed like an official ran onto the field.

Players pushed and shoved, a few wild punches were thrown and two players were ejected: Arizona defensive back Shaquille Richardson and UCLA receiver Taylor Embree.

The streaker? He got down to his underwear before a security person made a crushing tackle -- one as good as any UCLA made in the entire first half.

One of Kish's main goals was to make football fun again for the Wildcats, who had lost 10 straight games against FBS opponents and eight straight in conference.

They certainly enjoyed themselves against UCLA, getting touchdowns on all six of their first-half drives while scoring 42 points, their most in a half in Pac-10/Pac-12 play and more than any of their previous six games.

Keola Antolin ran for 77 yards on just eight carries, freshman Ka'Deem Carey had an 18-yard TD run and Criner finished with 10 catches for 101 yards to give Arizona its first win over an FBS opponent since beating UCLA 29-21 last Oct. 30 in Pasadena.

Neuheisel was concerned about Arizona's passing game and rightly so after Foles had thrown for more than 2,200 yards and 15 touchdowns the first six games.

Foles did what he expected, hitting 26 of 39 passes while connecting with Criner on TD passes of 4, 7 and 25 yards in the first half.

What Neuheisel didn't anticipate was getting run over by the Wildcats.

One of the nation's worst rushing teams, Arizona carved out huge holes in UCLA's defense that Antolin, Tutogi and Carey had no trouble racing through. The Wildcats surpassed their season average of 71.8 yards per game after one quarter and had 174 by halftime.

Arizona also had been plagued by slow starts, left scrambling after being outscored 41-3 in the first quarter in its previous five losses.

No such problem this time.

Foles hit Criner on a 4-yard TD pass on the Wildcats' opening drive. Carey followed with a juking, dive-for-the-ylon score from 18 yards out.

Criner added his second touchdown by snatching the ball away from UCLA's Aaron Hester early in the second quarter. UCLA fumbled, Tutogi scored on a 1-yard dive, then Foles and Criner connected again, this time from 25 yards.

SEATTLE, Wash. -- Chris Polk scored five touchdowns and became the first player in Washington history with 100 yards rushing and receiving in a game as the Huskies rallied for a 42-31 over Arizona on Saturday night.

Washington (6-2, 4-1 Pac-12) withstood another crazy play in the series with the Wildcats - a bobbled pass that was intercepted and returned 91 yards for a touchdown by Robert Golden - and another night of shoddy defense to become bowl eligible for the second straight season.

Polk finished with 144 yards rushing on 34 carries and 100 yards receiving. He scored on touchdown runs of 1, 1, 5 and 2 yards and had a 17-yard TD reception from Keith Price. Polk's 5-yard scamper with 8:21 left gave Washington the lead, and he pushed the advantage to 11 with 3:59 left when he high-stepped in from the 2.

Nick Foles threw for 388 yards for the Wildcats (2-6, 1-5) but couldn't do enough to counter Polk's monster night. Foles finished 32 of 50 passing, and receiver Juron Criner had 11 catches for 118 yards and touchdowns of 24 and 9 yards.

But any Arizona rally and hope of a second straight win under interim coach Tim Kish was dashed when Sean Parker picked off Foles at the Washington 20 with 2:10 left. Foles was intercepted for a third time with 29 seconds left by Washington's Cort Dennison.

Following Polk's third rushing TD to put the Huskies up 35-31, Foles led the Wildcats to midfield, but on a quick screen, Criner was stripped by Washington's Will Shamburger, and freshman linebacker Princeton Fuimaono recovered. Price then hit Jermaine Kearse for 24 yards, Polk sprinted for 14, and the Huskies were back on the Wildcats' doorstep. On third-and-1 at the Arizona 3, Polk squeezed for the needed yard, then scored on the next play.

Polk set a new school record with his 18th career 100-yard rushing game and topped 1,000 yards for the season.

Kearse ran for a 6-yard touchdown in the first quarter on a lateral pass from Price.

It wasn't the sharpest night for Price, who didn't get much help from his receivers at times. Price was 16 of 30 for 277 yards and a TD. He threw a career-high three interceptions, but one came when the receiver slipped and another on one more strange bounce in this series.

After a 43-yard pass to Polk, Washington was on the cusp of taking a two-touchdown lead early in the third quarter. Price threw for James Johnson, who stumbled and never gained full control of the pass. The ball deflected out of his hands and into the arms of Golden. He wove through Washington's offensive personnel for a 91-yard interception return for a touchdown.

The wacky play rivaled Mason Foster's game-winning interception return for Washington two years ago in a 36-33 win over the Wildcats that bounced off the foot of an Arizona receiver and into Foster's arms.

Washington answered with Polk's second touchdown run, but Arizona ran off the next 10 points and led 31-28 going to the fourth quarter.

Washington got the big play it needed when freshman Kasen Williams took a quick post from Price, bounced off one tackle and carried another defender for a 48-yard gain to the Arizona 21 with less than 10 minutes remaining. After a 26-yard pass to Kevin Smith got the Huskies to the Arizona 5, Polk walked in to give the Huskies a 35-31 lead with 8:21 left.

Arizona still carved up Washington's struggling defense for 424 total yards a week after the Huskies surrendered 615 yards to No. 4 Stanford. At one point in the first quarter, the Wildcats had 132 total yards to Washington's minus-10.

But Arizona twice settled for first-half field goals when touchdowns were needed.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) - John Hays threw for 199 yards and a pair of touchdowns, and Utah's defense hounded Arizona quarterback Nick Foles into a pair of big mistakes en route to a 34-21 win over the Wildcats on Saturday.

Utah (5-4, 2-4 Pac-12) had another solid defensive game, hitting Foles early and often to set up two interceptions.

Hays continued to build confidence after his solid start against Oregon State last week, connecting on 12 of 21 passes. John White added 109 yards and a pair of touchdowns on the ground, moving Utah within a game of becoming bowl eligible for the ninth straight season.

Needing to win its final four games to become bowl eligible, Arizona (2-7, 1-6) fell flat.

The Wildcats had trouble protecting Foles and had some ugly miscues on special teams in the first half, including two blocked punts and a badly botched fake field goal.

Foles hit 25 of 43 passes for 326 yards and had a pair of touchdown passes to David Douglas, but threw two interceptions, including one in the end zone with the Wildcats on Utah's 2-yard line in the fourth quarter. Douglas finished with 10 catches for a career-high 156 yards.

The game figured to be a clash of strengths. Arizona has one of the nation's best passing offenses behind Foles, the nation's leader with over 32 completions per game.

Utah, despite its struggles in the Pac-12, has the nation's 22nd-ranked defense, allowing just over 325 yards per game, and is second in the conference in defensive scoring.

The advantage went to the Utes.

Utah pressured Foles relentlessly, sacking him twice in the first half while forcing him to make numerous throws on the run or with someone in his face throughout the game.

The Utes forced an interception in the second quarter by getting to Foles, who threw off-balance and Utah linebacker Matt Martinez made a diving grab at Arizona's 30-yard line. White scored four plays later on an 18-yard run off of the left tackle to put Utah up 17-0.

Utah had sustained success on special teams, too, breaking through to block two punts in the first half.

Greg Bird got to Kyle Dugandzic's first punt of the game, setting up a 32-yard field goal by Coleman Peterson. He missed from 42 yards after another partially-blocked punt in the second quarter.

Utah's offense wasn't bad, either.

Arizona stacked the box to stop the run early in the game and Utah made them pay for it, using play-action to spring DeVonte Christopher for a 65-yard touchdown pass from Hays that put the Utes up 10-0 on the second play of the second quarter.

Hays also opened the second half with a 44-yard touchdown pass to Reggie Dunn after Arizona cornerback Lyle Brown slipped, putting the Utes up 27-7.

Arizona's offense struggled before finally showing some life late in the second quarter, moving 73 yards in seven plays to set up Douglas' acrobatic 23-yard touchdown catch from Foles. Douglas made the catch over his shoulder while diving and barely got his foot in for the highlight-worthy score.

Foles hit Douglas again late in the third quarter, throwing on the run for a 42-yard touchdown that cut Utah's lead to 27-14.

Foles again had the Wildcats driving midway through the fourth quarter, but his lazy fade pass in the end zone from the 2-yard line was picked off by Utah's Conroy Black, who returned it across midfield. White followed with an 11-yard score to put the game out of reach.
