2013 NFFCC NEWS & NOTES

ADAMS STATE UNIVERSITY (5-2, 3-2 RMAC)

Team Notes: The Grizzlies defeated New Mexico Highlands last week, 24-20. The win moved them above .500 in the conference to 3-2. ASU will play Western New Mexico this Saturday.

COLORADO MESA UNIVERSITY (5-2, 4-1 RMAC)

Team Notes: The Mavericks shutout out Fort Lewis on Saturday, 42-0, in the Skyhawks Homecoming game. CMU will play host to Colorado Mines this Saturday at 1 p.m.

COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES (4-3, 3-2 RMAC)

Team Notes: Colorado School of Mines suffered their second loss of the conference season, falling to undefeated and the No. 3 ranked team in the nation, CSU-Pueblo. CSM lost on the road to the ThunderWolves, 48-28. The Orediggers will play at Colorado Mesa Saturday at 1 p.m.

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY (3-4, 1-1 MWC)

Kapri Bibbs (R-Sophomore, Running Back, 5-11, 203, Plainfield, Ill./Snow College/Front Range)

Bibbs became the 16th player in Colorado State history to rush for 200-plus yards in a single game after he carried the ball 29 times for 201 yards and three touchdowns in a win at Wyoming. COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY - PUEBLO (7-0, 5-0 RMAC)

Morgan Fox (Sophomore, Defensive End, 6-4, 238, Fountain, Colo./Fountain-Fort Carson HS)

Fox earned the third-most sacks in a game in school history Saturday night against Colorado School of Mines, recording 3.5 sacks in the Pack's 48-28 win. He was part of a defensive effort that sacked Mines' quarterbacks nine times. Fox anchored a CSU-Pueblo defensive line that combined to produce 30 tackles, eight sacks, 11 tackles for loss, a forced fumble and five quarterback hurries.

Team Notes: CSU-Pueblo tied a Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference record by claiming its 27th consecutive RMAC victory in defeating Colorado School of Mines 48-28. The ThunderWolves also extended its regular season winning streak to 33 games (also an RMAC best) with the win. The win also marked the 50th career coaching win for head coach John Wristen.

FORT LEWIS COLLEGE (2-5, 1-4 RMAC)

Scottie Gallardo (Junior, Punter, 6-0, 225, Alamogordo, N.M./Colorado/Alamogordo HS)

Gallardo punted six times against Colorado Mesa, and averaged 52.7 yards per punt. Three of his punts went at least 50-yards, including his first punt of the game that went 77 yards. Gallardo leads NCAA Division II in punting average

2013 NFFCC NEWS & NOTES

UNITED STATES AIR FORCE ACADEMY (1-6, 0-5 MWC)

Team Notes: Air Force did not play last week. The Falcons will host Notre Dame this Saturday for a 3 p.m. game.

UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO (2-3, 0-3 PAC-12)

Michael Adkins (Freshman, Tailback, 5-10, 200, San Diego, Calif.)

In Colorado's 43-10 win over No. 23-FCS Charleston Southern, he rushed 13 times for 137 yards and four touchdowns (with one reception for one yard). In his first career start, he rushed for the fifth most yards by a freshman (fourth-most by a true frosh) in a first career start; the four touchdowns set a CU freshman single-game record, snapping the old mark of three held by Herchell Troutman at Texas in 1994, and Christian Powell vs. Sacramento State in Boulder in 2012.

Team Notes: Colorado averaged eight yards per play on offense (8.0) for the first time since 2005 (8.14 vs. North Texas). Colorado dropped to 0-6 on the coin toss in 2013. The first half took 1 hour, 16 minutes to play. The final game time was 2:50, CU's first sub-3:00 game since 2011 at UCLA (2:54), and the fastest since Nov. 23, 1991 at Iowa State (a 17-14 win in a blizzard). Colorado improved to 3-2 all-time vs. FCS programs, Charleston Southern fell to 0-23 against FBS teams. Colorado held CSU to 46 yards and just two first downs in the second half (0-of-6 on third downs). DE Chidera Uzo-Diribe forced his fifth fumble of the year (leads the NCAA). There were 111 total plays in the game (CU averaged 8.0 on its 52, CSU 3.3 on its 59 (which ate up 36:47 on the clock); 34 fewer than in any game to date involving CU. The two-point conversion was added to college football in 1958; this marked the first time a CU punter played a role in converting one when Darragh O'Neill ran it in.

UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN COLORADO (1-7, 0-4 BSC)

Tromaine Dennis (Senior, Running Back, 5-11, 217, Jersey City, N.J./Butte College/Dickinson)

Northern Colorado hadn't topped 100 rushing yards as a team against a Division I opponent all season and senior Tromaine Dennis carried 18 times for a season-best 135 yards and one touchdown. Dennis now owns the Northern Colorado career Division I record for rushing yards with 1,434, breaking the previous record of 1,336 by Andre Harris (2009-10). Dennis scored a touchdown on a 43-yard carry, the team's longest rush of the season (previous long was 26 yards by Darius Graham last week at Idaho State).

WESTERN STATE COLORADO UNIVERSITY (1-5, 1-3 RMAC)

Team Notes: Western State dropped a 42-34 decision at Western New Mexico last week. They will return home to face Fort Lewis this Saturday at 1 p.m.
