- Ka'Deem Carey leads all FBS player in rushing (161.0 ypg).
- Carey has topped 100 yards rushing in nine-straight games (also 150+ all-purpose yards in 9-straight).
- Carey set a school record with 40 carries last week. His 236 rushing yards are No. 3 in UA single-game history.
- Carev is No. 5 all-time at UA with 3.159 career rushing yards. He is four shy of No. 4 (Mike Bell, 3,163).

**Some Game Themes:** Two squads feeling good following lengthy droughts between victories ... Arizona had lost two in a row and sprinkled in a pair of bye weeks before downing Utah last Saturday. Meanwhile, Colorado was in a similar boat with a three-game skid, a bye week and a canceled game that led to the addition of Charleston Southern, which the Buffaloes defeated last week . . . Fresh off his season-high 236 rushing yards, Ka'Deem Carey is again the nation's rushing leader and goes toe-to-toe with the Buffaloes, who he set a conference record against with 366 yards on Homecoming a year ago in Tucson . . . Arizona guarterback B.J. Denker is riding high following his two best games of the season and faces the squad he made his first career start against a year ago ... Colorado figures to turn to its talented freshman quarterback, Sefo Liufau, who has steadily completed 69.6 percent of his passes and surely gained confidence in last week's victory ... Indeed, CU can throw the ball around, but the Wildcats have been pretty strong defending the pass, especially if the pass rush continues to improve as it did against Utah . . . The Buffs' playmaker is Paul Richardson, who already has 782 receiving yards and six touchdowns this season ... Arizona's improved defense will include Paul's cousin, Shaquille Richardson, who has two of the club's nine interceptions this year . . . The Wildcats find themselves on the road again in a stretch that has them playing four of five away from home to open Pac-12 play ... A pivotal game in the big picture as the school's think about potential bowl eligibility down the road ... It's CU's annual Back To Boulder Homecoming Game and the Buffs are encouraging fans to Blackout Breast Cancer . . . Make no mistake, Saturday will have a big game feel to it on both sidelines..

Last Week: Arizona started strong, faltered a bit in the third quarter, rallied back and eventually held off a pesky Utah squad for a 35-24 victory at Arizona Stadium last week. Junior running back Ka'Deem Carey set the tone with bookend highlights while setting a school record with 40 carries in a workhorse effort. Carey took his first touch of the game 30 yards and punctuated a 236-yard day with a 44-yard burst to paydirt for the final score with 90 seconds left that all but put the Utes away. Quarterback **B.J. Denker** complemented Carey with 51 markers and a pair of rushing touchdowns of his own, while he added 168 yards and a score without an interception in the passing game. The Arizona defense was up for a stern test and it didn't back down against a Utah unit that averaged 470 yards of offense per game. The Wildcats held them to their lowest total of the season to date (329 yards), and by and large made the big plays when needed. Linebacker Marquis Flowers registered a 14-yard interception return for a touchdown in the second quarter that helped hand the Wildcats a 20-7 halftime lead. The Utes appeared to gather some momentum when they scored 14 guick points in the third quarter to claim a one-point lead. Johnny Jackson muffed a punt at UA's own 17-yard to aid a short-field score, then Utah backup quarterback **Adam Schulz** hit **Sean Fitzgerald** on a 55-yard flea-flicker on the first play of the next drive. The Utes looked to keep their foot on the gas pedal on their next possession, but on thirdand-two from the UA 45-yardline, **Sione Tuihalamaka** stuffed **Kelvin York** for a four-yard loss to force a punt and send Uncle 'Mo back to the Wildcats' sideline for the fourth quarter. In the final frame, Denker found Nate Phillips on a switch route deep down the sideline for a 36-yard conversion on third-and-three. A few plays later, Denker connected with Phillips again on third down, this time for a seven-vard touchdown to regain the lead and spark a 15-3 run for the Wildcats to end the game. The win delighted the Family Weekend crowd of 50,871 and marked Arizona's 575th all-time victory.

2012 Colorado at Arizona Recap: Ka'Deem Carey carried the Wildcats to a 56-31 Homecoming victory against Colorado in a rare 11:30 a.m. kickoff at Arizona Stadium. In the process, Carey gained 366 rushing yards on 25 carries to shatter the school record (288) and break the Pac-12 record (357). Nearly half his rushes (12) went for 10-plus yards and he had four of 30-plus yards, including bursts of 71, 64 and 46 yards. His 14.6 yards per carry average easily set a new school record for players with a minimum of 20 attempts. He scored five times on the ground, which set a new school record and tied the conference record. To boot, Carey had 34 receiving yards, giving him an even 400 all-purpose yards - another school record. But before all of that happened, the game was off to an inauspicious start for the Cats, who were without their starting quarterback **Matt Scott**. Junior **B.J. Denker** filled in and fumbled on his first play inside the five-yard line, setting up an easy Colorado touchdown on the next play. Arizona found itself down 10-7 going into the second guarter, when Denker and the offense settled into a rhythm. The southpaw completed 12-of-14 passes on the day for 136 yards, including a pair of touchdown tosses to **Dan Buckner**. Denker also added 44 rushing yards of his own to go with his 214.5 pass efficiency rating, the highest single-game mark for a UA guarterback in 2012. The Buffs found some offense, too, but it wasn't enough to match the Wildcats who moved the ball at will. CU's 437 yards of offense came on 76 snaps, while the Cats needed just 52 plays to rack up 574 yards - an astounding 11.0 yards per play. A consistent Buffs' ground game produced 224 yards led by **Christian Powell's** 137 markers and two scores on 32 totes. It helped produce a 41:48-18:12 advantage in time of possession, which was meaningless since the Cats didn't need the ball long to score and top 50 points for the fourth time at home last year. The win improved Arizona to 6-4, making them bowl eligible for the fourth time in five seasons.

The Coaches: Arizona - Rich Rodriguez (West Virginia '86), second year at Arizona (12-7) and 19th as a head coach overall (132-91-2). At Arizona, Rodriguez's teams are 9-2 at Arizona Stadium, 2-6 on the road, 1-0 at neutral sites, 5-7 in Pac-12 games and 1-0 in bowl games (2012 Gildan New Mexico). Rodriguez was introduced as the 30th head coach of the UA football program on Nov. 22, 2011. He carries Division I records of 12-7 at Arizona, 60-26 at West Virginia (2001-2007) and 15-22 at Michigan (2008-10). He began his head coaching career at Salem University (W.Va.) in 1988 and then coached at Glenville State (W.Va.) from 1990-96. Rodriguez's West Virginia teams were Big East Champions in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007 while appearing in two BCS bowls, the 2005 Sugar Bowl with a victory over Georgia for an 11-1 record and a victory over Oklahoma in the 2007 Fiesta Bowl to finish 10-2 shortly after Rodriguez had left for Michigan. His teams have appeared in bowls in eight of 11 seasons an FBS head coach ... Colorado – Mike MacIntyre (Georgia Tech '89), first year at Colorado (3-3) and fourth overall as a head coach. Spent three seasons revamping the San Jose State program, which he led to a 10-win season in 2012. Previously served as defensive coordinator at Duke where he was the 2009 AFCA FBS Assistant Coach of the Year. Has NFL roots with the Jets and Cowboys, where he worked under Bill Parcells. MacIntyre is the son of George MacIntyre, who coached at Vanderbilt (the 1982 national coach of the year).

**Pac-12 Player of the Week:** Arizona junior running back **Ka'Deem Carey** was named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week on Monday. Against Utah, he set a school single-game record with 40 carries and ran for the third-most yards in school history (236). His 44-yard touchdown burst with 90 seconds left in the game sealed the win for the Wildcats. Carey's weekly honor marks the third for a Wildcat this season. Junior safety **Tra'Mayne Bondurant** was the Defensive Player of the Week for his two-interception effort against Northern Arizona (Aug. 30). Senior kicker **Jake Smith** collected the Special Teams Player of the Week honor after setting a school record with 16 points, including 3-of-4 field goals, in a win at UNLV (Sept. 7).

**Another Record-Breaking Game: Ka'Deem Carey** continues to rewrite the Arizona rushing records. Last week against Utah, Carey carried the ball 40 times for 236 yards and a touchdown. The attempts broke the school record of 36 set by **Ontiwaun Carter** against Colorado State on Oct. 8, 1994. Not to be overshadowed, the 236 yards ranked as the third-highest single-game rushing total in program history. Only **Trung Canidate's** 288 against Arizona State in 1998 and Carey's 366 against Colorado last season stand above last week's effort.

**3,000-Yard Club:** Behind his 236 rushing yards last week, **Ka'Deem Carey** became the sixth player in school history to total 3,000 career rushing yards. Now at 3,159 all-time yards, Carey is No. 5 on the school charts after passing **Hubie Oliver** (3,096) last Saturday. Next up is **Mike Bell** (3,163) who is only four yards ahead of Carey at No. 4. The top three include: **Trung Canidate** (3,824), **Ontiwaun Carter** (3,501) and **Art Luppino** (3,381).

**'Zona Defense:** You won't confuse this bunch of Wildcats for the Desert Swarms teams of the 1990s, but Arizona has made significant strides on the defensive side of the ball. Nearly all of the personnel is the same as it was in 2012, but a year of experience and development in Jeff Casteel's 3-3-5 odd stack defense has produced markedly improved numbers. Here's a look at the major defensive statistics and where Arizona has ranked among the FBS teams each of the last two seasons:

**On the Road, Again:** It was nice for the Wildcats to stop by Arizona Stadium last week for Family Weekend, but now they are back on the road. It's nothing new as Arizona's slate has it playing four of its first five conference games on the road this season. In fact, last weekend's home game was the only one scheduled at Arizona Stadium in a 55-game span with six of seven weeks scheduled as road games or byes. This weekend's trip to Colorado will mark the fifth state that the Wildcats have played in already this season.

**No Denk and Dunk:** Over the last two games, Arizona has begun to stretch the field through the passing game. Quarterback **B.J. Denker** has completed eight passes for 20 yards or longer against USC and Utah after only tallying four such completions in the first four games of the season. Freshman receiver **Nate Phillips** has provided a pair of big catches in the two recent games, including a 57-yard touchdown against the Trojans and a 36-yard grab to set up his own seven-yard touchdown last weekend. Junior receiver **Garic Wharton**, perhaps the fastest player on the club, leads Arizona with five receptions of 20-plus yards this season.

**Dashing Denker:** While **B.J. Denker** has shown more confidence in the passing game in recent weeks, he remains a dangerous runner. The senior has gained 327 yards on 75 carries and has four runs of 30 or more yards this season. In fact, Denker ranks No. 10 in the Pac-12 with 54.5 rushing yards per game, which makes Arizona one of only two schools (Oregon) to have two players among the top 10 rushing leaders in the conference. Denker leads Arizona with eight rushing touchdowns (No. 9 in Pac-12 scoring), including two last Saturday against Utah.

**Cats Converting:** Third-down conversions are critical to keep drives alive, and Arizona's offense has been good in that department. The Wildcats have converted 50-of-101 third downs this season, a 49.5 percent clip that ranks No. 19 nationally. Such conversions were key to Arizona's win over Utah last week, as the Wildcats went 12-of-20 on third downs while at the same time limiting the Utes to a lowly 5-of-18 clip. Expect third downs to be a point of interest this week, too. Colorado has converted only 31 percent of its third downs this season, but its defense has limited opponents to a similar 35 percent clip.

**Conversion Cats:** Senior quarterback **B.J. Denker** and true freshman wide receiver **Nate Phillips** formed quite the connection on critical fourth quarter drive last Saturday. With the Wildcats trailing by a point and facing a third-and-three, Denker tossed a perfectly thrown ball on a switch route down the right sideline to Phillips who hauled in the catch. Three plays later, the duo hooked up again to convert third-and-goal from the seven-yardline. Denker rolled left and fired a strike to a sliding Phillips to give the Wildcats the lead for good.

**Difference Makers:** Two of the unsung heroes in Arizona's win last Saturday were defensive linemen **Reggie Gilbert** and **Sione Tuihalamaka**. Gilbert, a junior, registered four tackles, including two for loss, and registered his second sack of the season. Tuihalamaka collected a career-high eight tackles, including one-and-a-half for loss. The senior from Hawthorne, Calif., provided perhaps the biggest momentum-changing play of the game. Utah had possession and a one-point lead in the middle of the third quarter when it faced third-and-two from the UA 45-yardline. That's where Tuihalamaka stuffed Kelvin York for a four-yard loss to force a punt, and Arizona would outscore Utah 15-3 the rest of the way. On the season, Gilbert has 16 total tackles, including 4.5 for loss and a team-leading 2.0 sacks. Tuihalamaka has added 23 tackles and leads the club with 5.0 tackles for loss.

- During four seasons as an offensive coordinator at Tulane (1997-1998) and Clemson (1999-200), his teams went a combined 34-13.

Show Low KVWM 970 AM **Desert S.W.A.T.:** Defensive coordinator **Jeff Casteel** utilizes his S.W.A.T team in most third down passing situations. The concept is to get fresh bodies, more speed and better coverage ability on the field, while disguising where pressure may come from. The Wildcats typically swap out their entire defensive line and insert **Kirifi Taula** at nose tackle to anchor the middle, while using backup linebackers **Sir Thomas Jackson** and **Derrick Turituri** as pass rushers at defensive end. **Jake Fischer** or **Marquis Flowers** usually stay on the field at the linebacker position, where they are joined by reserve speedster **Tellas Jones**. In the back end, **Devin Holiday** assumes a corner position and **Shaquille Richardson** slides to a second free safety spot as part of spread of six defensive backs.

**Four Score:** Arizona's defense has four touchdowns to its credit this season all via interception returns. The Wildcats and their relatives at Northwestern lead the nation in pick-sixes with four apiece. Senior linebacker **Marquis Flowers** was the latest to get in on the scoring with his 14-yard return last week, which marked his first career touchdown. Earlier this season at UNLV, **Jake Fischer** scored his first touchdown on a 49-yard return. In that same game, **Tra'Mayne Bondurant** had a 52-yard return for a score — his second in as many games (also 23 yards vs. NAU). Bondurant has three career touchdown returns, the first of which came on a 29-yard return against Colorado on Nov. 12, 2011, during his true freshman season. Arizona's single-season school record for interceptions returned for touchdowns is six in 1996.

**Turning Points:** Perhaps no statistic is more indicative of Arizona's success in recent seasons than the turnover battle. The Wildcats have won 16-consecutive games, including all seven under **Rich Rodriguez**, when they win the turnover battle (last loss was vs. USC on Oct. 25, 2008). Considering all games since the start of 2008 (last 70 games), Arizona is 19-2 when it wins the turnover battle, 13-10 when it ties and 7-19 when it loses the turnover battle. That adds up to a 32-12 mark when Arizona wins or ties the turnover battle. Under Rodriguez, the Wildcats are 10-2 when winning or tying the turnover battle.

**Turning Points Part II:** The Wildcats enter play this week with a plus-five turnover margin for the season, which is good enough for No. 21 nationally. The Wildcats have only turned the ball over six times while they have secured 11 takeaways in six contests. It's a positive trend for Arizona, which has not finished a season with a positive turnover margin since 2008 (+6). In 2012, the Wildcats turned the ball over 28 times and gained 27. The net result was a 122-104 deficit in points scored off turnovers. So far in 2013, Arizona enjoys a 55-13 advantage in points off turnovers.

**In a Rush to Win:** Arizona has won nine of its last 13 games dating to last season, a trend that may or may not coincide with a dominant rushing attack. Over their last 13 games, the Wildcats have gained 3,474 yards on 600 rushing attempts, a 5.79 yards per carry clip good enough for 267.23 yards per game. The Wildcats have rushed for 300 or more yards in five of the 13 contests with a perfect 5-0 record in those games. Arizona is 7-1 when it rushes for 250-plus yards and 8-1 when it tops the 200-yard mark.

**100-Yard Rushing Nuggets:** Arizona has rushed for 100 or more yards in all but one game under **Rich Rodriguez** (89 at Oregon, 9/22/2012). Prior to Rodriguez's arrival, the Wildcats gained 100 rushing yards only five times in 2011 . . . An Arizona player has rushed for 100 yards in a game in 10-straight contests (last time failed to do so: at UCLA, 11/3/2012) . . . Under Rodriguez, a Wildcat has rushed for 100 yards 16 times in 19 total games, including 14 of the last 15 . . . **Ka'Deem Carey** (15), **Daniel Jenkins** (1) and **Matt Scott** (1) have combined for 17 100-yard performances in the 19 games under Rodriguez. Arizona had gone 17-straight games without a 100-yard rusher prior to Rodriguez's arrival (last was **Keola Antolin**, 111 yards, at UCLA on Oct. 30, 2010).

**Disciplined Cats:** Arizona ranks as the second-least penalized team in the Pac-12 having been flagged for only 36.5 yards per game. That figure also ranks No. 15 nationally and is a healthy improvement from a season ago when the Wildcats finished No. 77 (55.1 per game). Interestingly, Arizona's opponents have been penalized for 63.0 yards per game — which is the 16th-most nationally for opponent penalty yards.

**Defensive Development:** What a difference a year makes for defensive coordinator **Jeff Casteel**. In his first season implementing the 3-3-5 stack at Arizona, Casteel inherited one of the thinnest and youngest defenses in the nation evidenced by more than half of his depth chart comprising freshmen or sophomores. This year, things have shifted in his favor with more depth and more experience. In fact, Wildcat defenders have combined for 276 career starts. Senior lineman **Sione Tuihalamaka** and senior cornerback **Shaquille Richardson** lead with 30 career starts apiece, while senior linebackers **Marquis Flowers** and **Jake Fischer** boast 29 and 27 starts, respectively. Junior "spur" safety **Tra'Mayne Bondurant** has tallied 24 starts, including 24 of Arizona's last 25 games (only missed 2012 New Mexico Bowl). True freshman linebacker **Scooby Wright** is the only player without prior starting experience and has earned the nod in each of his first six collegiate games.

**Run KDC:** The reigning national rushing champion is back on top. **Ka′Deem Carey** is averaging 161.0 rushing yards per game, which is a full 13 yards more than Western Kentucky's Antonio Andrews, who is second with 148.0 per game.

- In 2012, became first Wildcat to lead the nation in rushing since **Art Luppino** in 1955 (also 1954).
- Has 38 career total touchdowns (No. 2 at UA and tied No. 3 among active FBS players).
- Has 35 career rushing touchdowns (No. 2 at UA and No. 4 among active FBS players).
- Has 3,159 career rushing yards (No. 6 among active FBS players).
- Leads all active FBS players with 108.9 rushing yards per game (career).
- Has 4,349 career all-purpose yards (No. 10 among active FBS players)
- Averages 6.0 yards per carry (No. 8 in FBS) on 528 career rushes.
- Leads all active Pac-12 players and ranks No. 3 in FBS for career 100-yard games (15).
- Set UA single-season record with 1,929 rushing yards in 2012.
- Set an Arizona program record with 23 rushing touchdowns in 2012.
- Led the Pac-12 with 10 100-yard rushing games in 2012 and matched Trung Canidate (1999) for the school record for 100-yard games in a season.
- Finished the 2012 season with 2,248 all-purpose yards, falling one yard shy of **Dennis Northcutt's** single-season school record of 2,249 set in 1999.
- Carey finished the 2012 season with 24 total touchdowns to tie Art Luppino (1954) for the most individual touchdowns in school single-season history.

**Fine Nine:** Running back **Ka'Deem Carey** has rushed for 100 yards in nine consecutive games — a stretch that includes some remarkable performances. Here's a look:

**Carey Closing In:** Junior running back **Ka'Deem Carey** is closing in on a few milestones (see complete career stats on page 12 of this release):

- 4 rushing yards away from No. 4 in UA history (Mike Bell, 3,163).
- 222 rushing yards away from No. 3 in UA history (Art Luppin, 3,381)
- 44 rush attempts away from No. 6 in program history (Nic Grigsby, 572)
- 29 all-purpose yards away from No. 6 in program history (Trung Canidate, 4,378)
- 9 rushing touchdowns away from No. 1 in school history (Art Luppino, 44)
- 10 total touchdowns away from No. 1 in school history (Art Luppino, 48)

**Carey Streaking: Ka'Deem Carey**, the nation's leading rusher in 2012, is working on several impressive streaks heading into Saturday's game:

- Has rushed for 100-plus yards in nine-straight games (13 of last 14) played
- Has 150-plus all-purpose yards in nine-straight games played
- Has a rushing touchdown in 16 of last 18 games played
- Has 16 or more carries in 15-straight games played
- Has a pass reception in 19 of the last 20 games played
- Has scored a touchdown in 18 of last 20 games played

**3,000/4,000: Ka'Deem Carey** became the fourth player in school history with 3,000 rushing yards and 4,000 all-purpose yards for a career. He joined **Trung Canidate** (3,824 rushing/4,378 all-purpose), **Ontiwaun Carter** (3,501 rushing/4,023 all-purpose) and **Art Luppino** (3,381 rushing/4,963 all-purpose) as the only Wildcats to accomplish the combined feat.

A Different Zone: A look at the stat sheet shows Arizona scoring on 82-percent of its red zone drives this season (18 of 22) with 14 drives resulting in touchdowns. However, Arizona has 13 touchdowns this season outside the red zone (of 20 yards or longer), including 10 by the offense. The Wildcats have touchdown runs of 91 yards (Daniel Jenkins), 61 yards (Javelle Allen), 58 yards (Ka'Deem Carey), 44 yards (Carey), 35 yards (twice, B.J. Denker) and 30 yards (Denker). Last Thursday at USC, the Wildcats had passing touchdowns of 57 yards (Nate Phillips), 45 yards (Garic Wharton) and 28 yards (Wharton) from outside the redzone. Arizona's defense has three interception returns for scores from outside the 20-yardline.

**Scooby Doo(ing) it Wright:** There are some talented freshman in the Pac-12 Conference, but perhaps the most underrated of the group is Arizona linebacker **Scooby Wright**. The true freshman has started all six games at strongside linebacker and has not disappointed. The Windsor, Calif., native is tied for the team lead with 40 tackles and has added and four tackles for loss. He's registered a tackle for loss in four of six games to open his college career and has shown he has the toughness to be an impact player right away. At No. 16 Washington on Sept. 28, Wright collected a career-high nine tackles, including one for loss, as the Wildcats held the Huskies to a season-low 409 yards of offense.

**Shaq on the Attack:** Senior cornerback **Shaquille Richardson** intercepted his ninth career pass last week against Utah. A 30-game starter in his four-year career, Richardson has broken up 26 passes (tied for 12th in program history) and registered 157 tackles for the Wildcats. He's also forced three fumbles and recovered two, while collecting eight tackles for loss. Already in 2013, Richardson has 26 tackles and three behind the line — a new single-season career high for tackles for loss.

**Desert Bloom:** It was in fall camp a year ago when **Marquis Flowers** was shifted from safety to linebacker to add depth at a position of need. Now, some 15 months later, Flowers has settled in to become one of the top linebackers in the Pac-12. Six games into his senior season, Flowers has 37 tackles, including 4.5 for loss, and has one fumble recovery for 36 yards. Last week against Utah, Flowers intercepted his first pass of the season and returned it 14 yards for a score — his first career touchdown. As a junior, he was second on the squad with exactly 100 tackles and led the team with 13 tackles for loss and a team-high 5.5 sacks. He also proved to have a nose for the football, intercepting three pass, forcing three fumbles and recovering another.

**Tackling Machine:** Senior linebacker **Jake Fischer** continues to rack up the tackles. Against Utah last week, Fischer had a season-high 12 tackles, including 0.5 for loss. That increased his season tally to 40, which is tied with fellow linebacker Scooby Wright for most on the team. A year ago, the Oro Valley, Ariz., native led Arizona with 119 stops and ranked third in the conference with 9.2 tackles per game. In his career, Fischer has registered 224 tackles, including 16 for loss. He has broken up six passes, forced three fumbles, recovered six fumbles and returned one interception 49 yards for a touchdown (at UNLV on Sept. 7, 2013).

**Mr. Versatility:** One of Arizona's offensive leaders is the ever versatile **Chris Putton**, a fifth-year senior who has mastered all five positions on the offensive line. Putton doesn't claim a natural position — he willing says he will play wherever coaches need him — but his skills are perhaps best suited at guard where he has made 24 career starts. In a pinch, he can slide out to tackle if needed behind starters **Fabbians Ebbele** and **Mickey Baucus**, or take the controls at center. His experience and versatility will pay dividends in the trenches this season.

**Bookend Tackles:** Junior tackles **Fabbians Ebbele** and **Mickey Baucus** account for 61 of Arizona's 100 career starts along the offensive line. The duo started 28 consecutive games together before Ebbele missed a start while recovering from an ankle injury at Washington on Sept. 28. Now Baucus accounts for 31 career starts and Ebbele was back in the starting rotation at USC to bump his total to 30. Together, Ebbele and Baucus are literally a big reason the Wildcats have run the ball so successfully the last two seasons. They've also done an admirable job protecting the quarterback as the Wildcats have surrendered only 27 sacks over the last 19 games.

**Special Teams Standouts:** One of the most underappreciated aspects is not just the kicking game, but those who are on coverage units whether it be the kickoff or punt teams. Arizona has several players who excel on coverage teams and last Saturday against Utah was a perfect example. Terris Jones-Grigsby, a running back/slot receiver, had a career-high four tackles, including three solo stops, against the Utes. Trevor Ermisch, a receiver, added two tackles in the game and is a regular on the coverage units. The Wildcats leading tackler on special teams happens to be Shane Wilson, a cornerback, with four tackles. Wilson was named a special teams game captain for the Utah game.

Scholarships Earned: Several walk-ons earned the praise of head coach Rich Rodriguez, who rewarded them with scholarships this offseason. Nose guard Tevin Hood, linebacker Sir Thomas Jackson and receiver Johnny Jackson earned scholarships in the spring, while running back Terris Jones-Grigsby and receiver Trevor Ermisch were put on scholarship this fall. Rodriguez values a strong walk-on program and benefitted such a program himself. At West Virginia, Rodriguez started as a walk-on in 1981 and became a three-year letter winner as a defensive back from 1982-84.

**Gridiron Graduates:** Eight Wildcats have earned their degrees from the University of Arizona, a tally that ranks fifth nationally for FBS programs. Included are running backs **Daniel Jenkins** and **Kylan Butler**, receivers **Terrence Miller** and **Richard Morrison**, defensive backs **Derrick Rainey** and **Justin Samuels**, offensive lineman **Eric Bender-Ramsey** and defensive lineman **Sione Tuihalamaka**.

**Up Next:** Arizona has one more road trip before it hosts three-straight home games. The Wildcats will travel to Berkeley, Calif., to take on the California Golden Bears on Saturday, Nov. 2. Kickoff is scheduled for 12:30 p.m. (PDT) with a live television broadcast on the Pac-12 Networks.

**TUCSON, Ariz. (AP)** - Ka'Deem Carey ran for a Pac-12 record 366 yards and scored five touchdowns, powering Arizona to a 56-31 rout of Colorado on Saturday.

Carey, who carried 25 times, broke the record of 357 rushing yards set by Washington State's Rueben Mayes at Oregon on Oct. 27, 1984. The sophomore's five rushing TDs — of 10, 13, 30, 8 and 3 yards — tied a conference record. Carey, whose longest gain of the day was 71 yards, smashed the school record of 288 yards set by Trung Canidate against Arizona State in 1998.

Arizona's Ka'Deem Carey ran for 366 yards and 5 touchdowns Saturday, becoming the seventh player since 2000 with at least 300 yards and 5 touchdowns in the same game. Here's a look:

With Pac-12 leading passer Matt Scott out with a concussion, junior college transfer B.J. Denker completed 12-of-14 passes for 136 yards and two touchdowns in his first start for Arizona (6-4, 3-4). He also ran for 44 yards and a touchdown as the Wildcats became bowl eligible with their sixth win, rebounding from a 66-10 embarrassment at UCLA the previous week

In his first start this season, Colorado's Nick Hirschman was 12 of 13 for 123 yards and one interception. Connor Wood relieved Hirschman and went 4 of 7 for 90 yards and a touchdown. Christian Powell rushed for 137 yards and two scores for the Buffaloes (1-9, 1-6), and Donta Abron gained 83 yards in 13 attempts.

Wood connected on a 71-yard pass play to Scott Fernandez for a touchdown that cut the lead to 49-31 with 10:22 left. It was Fernandez's first career catch. But after the subsequent kickoff, Carey broke through on a 64-yard run to the Colorado 3, then scored from there to provide the final 56-31 score.

The Buffaloes had the ball for 41 minutes, 48 seconds, yet still lost by 25.

Denker and Carey messed up a handoff on Arizona's first offensive play, and Derrick Webb recovered for the Buffaloes at the Arizona 7. Powell rumbled into the end zone on the next play and Colorado led 7-0.

The Wildcats scored touchdowns on their next seven possessions.

First came a nine-play, 80-yard drive, capped by Carey rushing 10 yards for the first of his three first-half touchdowns. Denker was 3 of 3 for 42 yards on the drive.

The Buffaloes mounted their longest drive, in time elapsed, of the season, consuming 8:24 to go 69 yards in 15 plays. On fourth-and-goal at the 1, Colorado chose Will Oliver's 18-yard field goal, which put the underdog Buffs up 10-7.

The lead lasted just under two minutes. Denker completed three straight passes, then Carey rushed in from the 13 and Arizona was up for good, 14-10 with 13:31 left in the half.

Hirschman, replacing Jordan Webb -- who started the first nine games -- completed his first eight passes before his toss into the left flat went right into the hands of Tra'Mayne Bondurant. Had he not bobbled the ball, Bondurant would have scored easily, as he did with an interception return at Colorado last season.

As it was, Arizona took over at the Colorado 49. Garic Wharton gained 19 on an end-around, then Carey broke a series of tackles in a 30-yard run that made it 21-10.

Another long, time-consuming drive moved the Buffaloes 75 yards in 13 plays, using up 7:51. Powell scored from the 1 to cut it to 21-17 with 2:44 left in the half.

That was plenty of time for Arizona, even without Scott. Carey started the drive with a 26-yard run and had another for 21 yards to set up Denker's 21-yard scoring pass to Dan Buckner, and Arizona led 28-17 at the half.

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) -- In January, Daniel Jenkins announced he was transferring from Arizona to Washington State. He left school, but not for long.

A few months later, Jenkins was back, and on a rainy Friday night, the speedy senior made the most of Ka'Deem Carey's absence in the Wildcats' 35-0 season-opening victory over Northern Arizona.

Jenkins ran 91 yards for a touchdown, the third-longest rushing play in Arizona school history, and also caught a scoring pass in the opener of Rodriguez's second season in Arizona.

B.J. Denker threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to Jenkins and ran 30 yards for another score. Moments after Denker left the game in the fourth quarter, backup Javelle Allen ran 61 yards for a TD.

Tra'Mayne Bondurant had two interceptions, returning one 21 yards for a touchdown.

Carey, Arizona's All-American running back and the nation's leading rusher last season, was suspended for the game "per team policy," the school said. The punishment apparently stemmed from trouble the running back had during the offseason, including an arrest for an incident involving his girlfriend. The charges were later dropped. Carey also was kicked out of a basketball game in a run-in with arena management and local police.

Jenkins gained 139 yards in 12 attempts. Denker completed 9 of 13 passes for 87 yards and rushed for 71 yards in 13 carries.

Rodriguez had not announced a starting quarterback to replace the departed Matt Scott, but most assumed it would be Denker, and it was.

After the opening kickoff, the senior directed an 11-play, 75-yard touchdown drive. Denker completed both passes on the drive for 42 yards, including the TD toss to the wide-open Jenkins. Denker also rushed five times for 23 yards on the drive. He said he was never told he was the starter

The rain began to fall a short time later and neither offense accomplished much until Jenkins, a 5-foot-9 senior, raced up the middle and outran the Lumberjacks 91 yards to the end zone to make it 14-0 with 5:32 left in the half.

The only longer TD runs in Arizona school history were 96 yards by Trung Canidate against San Diego State in 1997 and 94 by Nic Grigsby, also against Northern Arizona, in 2009.

On the first play of the second half, Kyren Poe's pass was tipped by freshman linebacker Scooby Wright, then intercepted by Bondurant, who returned it 21 yards for a touchdown to put the Wildcats up 21-0. It was Bondurant's second career interception return for a score.

Northern Arizona was forced to punt from its own end zone and Arizona took over at the Lumberjacks' 48. A pass interference penalty set up Denker's 30-yard touchdown dash. The quarterback was hit just before the goal line but made it into the end zone to put the Wildcats up 28-0 with 8:34 left in the quarter.

Andy Wilder missed field goal attempts of 42 and 45 yards for the Lumberjacks, a Football Championship Subdivision school with 18 starters back from last season's 8-3 Big Sky Conference team. Jake Smith missed a 26-yard attempt for Arizona.

Poe completed his first 10 passes for Northern Arizona and finished 21 of 36 for 176 yards. He was intercepted three times, all in the third quarter.

Zach Bauman finished with 71 yards in 21 carries. He needs 48 yards to become Northern Arizona's career rushing leader.

**LAS VEGAS (AP)** — Comparing UNLV's first two games, things went from bad to a complete disaster.

Just like in the Rebels' season opener at Minnesota, big plays and turnovers doomed them again Saturday night in their home opener against Arizona, falling 58-13.

Wildcats' star running back Ka'Deem Carey, who was suspended for the Wildcats' opening game against Northern Arizona and sat in Saturday's first quarter, rushed for 171 yards with two touchdowns. His first carry was a 58-yard score through the middle.

UNLV quarterback Nick Sherry struggled and was under pressure several times, completing 6 of 22 for 111 yards, including two interceptions for touchdowns in the second quarter. The interceptions counted for two of the three Rebels' turnovers

Sherry's lone highlight was a 69-yard touchdown pass to Devante Davis on the first play of the second quarter.

"You can't come into a game against a Pac-12 team and turn it over for touchdowns and scores and hope to win it," UNLV coach Bobby Hauck said. "(Arizona) did a really nice job in the first half and we didn't handle it at all. We've got to flush this game and move on to the next one."

Caleb Herring replaced Sherry on UNLV's first drive in the third quarter as the second-half pace seemed to be on afterburners after the Wildcats (2-0) led 45-6 at halftime. That score also sent many of the 26,950 fans home early as the second string players played in a near empty Sam Boyd Stadium during the second half.

UNLV (0-2) stays at home the next two weeks, hosting two non-BCS opponents in Central Michigan and Western Illinois respectively.

"Our team will come back. They are resilient," Hauck said. "The guys will come out and play their tails off next week."

**TUCSON, Ariz. (AP)** — B.J. Denker ran for two touchdowns and passed for another, leading Arizona past outmatched UTSA 38-13 Saturday night.

Denker, the senior who won the offseason competition to succeed Matt Scott at quarterback, had TD runs of 35 and 1 yards and threw 13 yards to Samajie Grant for another score.

Ka'Deem Carey carried 27 times for 128 yards, including touchdown runs of 4 and 7 yards. Denker had 10 rushes for 90 yards and completed 14 of 21 passes for 158 yards with no interceptions.

Arizona improved to 3-0 against a soft early schedule, beating Northern Arizona, UNLV and UTSA by a combined 131-26.

Eric Soza completed 30 of 46 passes for 277 yards with one interception for the Roadrunners (1-2). He also fumbled the ball away.

UTSA, formerly known best as Texas-San Antonio and in just its third season of college football, took the opening kickoff and drove 58 yards in 11 plays, but the offense stalled and Sean lanno's 34-yard field goal made it 3-0.

The Roadrunners' only lead of the night didn't last long.

On its first possession, Arizona went 82 yards in 11 plays with Denker throwing 13 yards to Grant for the touchdown. Denker completed 6 of 7 for 82 yards on the drive. Four of them went to Grant for 46 yards. The TD catch was the first of his young collegiate career.

After the ensuing kickoff, Soza's pass was intercepted by Jourdan Grandon, who returned it 16 yards to the UTSA 34. Three plays later, Denker ran 35 yards for the score, rolling on top of teammate Garic Wharton for the final yard. Initially, he was ruled down at the 1-yard line but after a review he was given the touchdown to put the Wildcats ahead 14-3.

Leading 17-6, Arizona took advantage of a short UTSA punt and went 53 yards in seven plays for the score. Carey rushed four yards for the touchdown to make it 24-6 with 2:57 to play in the half.

The Wildcats scored again on their first possession of the second half, Denker running it in from the 1. He had a 17-yard run in the drive and a 16-yard pass to Wharton to put the ball at the Roadrunners' 4.

Jake Fisher scooped up Soza's fumble and returned it 13 yards to the Roadrunners' 36 to set up Arizona's final touchdown. Carey carried it in from the 7 for the touchdown. Carey, the nation's leading rusher a year ago, has 33 rushing touchdowns in 26 career games.

Soza's 35-yard pass to Kenny Bias set up UTSA's Ione touchdown on David Glasco's 4-yard run with 9:39 to play.

Arizona has a bye week before beginning Pac-12 play Sept. 28 at Washington. UTSA, in its first season in Conference USA, plays its league opener next Saturday at UTEP.

**SEATTLE (AP)** -- With wind and rain wreaking havoc throughout Husky Stadium on Saturday night, Washington coach Steve Sarkisian turned to the ground game and running back Bishop Sankey time and time again.

Sankey had carried just four times last week in a blowout win over Idaho State. Against Arizona, Sarkisian put the game on Sankey's back.

Sankey carried a school-record 40 times for 161 yards and a touchdown and Keith Price threw for two scores to lead No. 16 Washington to a 31-13 victory over the Wildcats.

Sankey outperformed Arizona's Ka'Deem Carey, the NCAA's leading rusher in 2012, as Washington improved to 4-0 for the first time since 2001. Sankey surpassed the school record of 38 carries set by Corey Dillon in 1996 against Washington State as stormy conditions forced both teams to limit their passing game.

Sankey carried 35 times against Illinois two weeks ago -- a number of carries Sarkisian admitted was more than he would like for his starting tailback. But with the soggy conditions Saturday, Sarkisian trusted Sankey to carry the load. Sankey was more than happy to oblige.

Sankey, who entered as the country's No. 2 rusher at 148.7 yards per game, continued to be brilliant for the Huskies. He carried for 101 yards on 23 carries in the first half alone as Washington (4-0, 1-0 Pac-12) built an 11-6 lead.

Arizona quarterback B.J. Denker struggled to cope with the wet conditions. His first pass was intercepted by Sean Parker as it sailed high over Johnny Jackson.

Four plays later, Keith Price connected with Kevin Smith for a 7-yard touchdown to give the Huskies a 6-0 lead after a botched extra point attempt.

The rain intensified and both offenses struggled to move the chains in the downpour.

Arizona (3-1, 0-1) failed to convert a first down on their first five possessions of the game against Washington's stifling defense. After a safety on a punt snapped through the end zone, Kasen Williams returned the ensuing free kick 48 yards to the Arizona 28-yard line. Travis Coons converted a 42-yard field goal to take an 11-0 lead.

After their fifth straight three-and-out of the half, Arizona coach Rich Rodriguez visibly chewed out Denker along the sidelines.

Denker and the Arizona offense finally pieced together a scoring drive to end the half. Facing fourth-and-2 at the Washington 36-yard line, the Huskies sold out to stop Carey and Denker kept for a 33-yard gain to the Washington 3. Carey scored on a 3-yard touchdown to pull Arizona within 11-6 at halftime after a failed PAT. Carey ran for 132 yards and a touchdown for the Wildcats.

The rain lessened and the offenses came out firing after the break. Washington needed to convert just one third down as the Huskies marched on a 95-yard scoring drive to open the third quarter. Price capped the drive with a 1-yard touchdown pass to Austin Seferian-Jenkins to give Washington an 18-6 lead. Price was efficient in throwing for 165 yards with two touchdowns and an interception.

Facing another fourth down, Carey ran for 24 yards on fourth-and-10 to move the Wildcats to the Washington 11. Two plays later, Denker ran around left end for a 7-yard touchdown to pull within a score of the Huskies.

Price connected on a 49-yard pass to Smith to quickly move Washington back into Arizona territory. Sankey blasted into the end zone from 1-yard out to extend the Washington lead to 25-13.

The Wildcats were driving again when Denker was intercepted by Marcus Peters, causing Rodriguez to fume again and spike his headset into the turf along the Arizona sideline. Denker completed just 14 of 35 passes for 119 yards and two interceptions.

Jesse Callier added a 2-yard touchdown run for Washington.

**LOS ANGELES (AP)** -- Although Ed Orgeron claims he isn't a very happy man most mornings, he was ecstatic from the moment he awoke Thursday for his first game as Southern California's interim coach.

That's the attitude Orgeron has spent nearly two weeks attempting to instill in his Trojans, who didn't have much fun during a desultory start to the season under Lane Kiffin.

So far, Orgeron's plan is working well enough to send him to bed in the same marvelous mood

Nelson Agholor caught seven passes for 161 yards, Javorius Allen rushed for two touchdowns and USC got off to an impressive start under Orgeron with a 38-31 victory over Arizona.

Cody Kessler passed for 297 yards and two TDs as the revitalized Trojans (4-2, 1-2 Pac-12) survived Arizona's second-half rally to win for the stalwart defensive line coach who replaced the fired Kiffin on Sept. 29. Orgeron set a familial mood from the moment USC entered the Coliseum, gathering the players in a circle at midfield for an emotional pep talk and prayer.

Agholor caught a 62-yard touchdown pass and Tre Madden had a 63-yard TD catch in the first quarter for the Trojans, who had the Coliseum rocking as they roared to a 25-point lead in the first half.

After Garic Wharton caught his second TD pass for Arizona with 4:18 to play, Silas Redd punctuated his season debut for USC with seven consecutive clock-draining runs for 43 yards in a drive that began at the Trojans' 4, allowing USC to ensure a sideline shower for Orgeron.

Nearly 12 days after Kiffin's stormy four-year tenure ended in a dark airport parking lot, the Trojans played with passion and excitement for Orgeron, who promised to return fun to a season dominated by drudgery. The Coliseum crowd that booed frequently last month amid chants of "Fire Kiffin!" gave several standing ovations to the Trojans in a rare Thursday night game at the historic stadium.

Clay Helton, the Trojans' new playcaller in Kiffin's absence, dialed up an aggressive game plan that succeeded even without star receiver Marqise Lee, who sat out with a sprained knee. Justin Davis also rushed for a score for the Trojans, who racked up 546 total yards.

Orgeron's first game brought a new vibe to the Coliseum, which loved the coach's enthusiasm and passion for USC. Six fans in the front row of the student section painted "COACH O" on their bare chests -- a fitting tribute to a coach who was known to rip off his own shirt to fire up his players in his Ole Miss days.

B.J. Denker passed for 363 yards and four touchdowns for the Wildcats (3-2, 0-2) in their second straight loss.

Ka'Deem Carey rushed for 138 yards in his eighth straight 100-yard game for Arizona, while Nate Phillips and David Richards also caught touchdown passes. Once the Wildcats recovered from the USC offense's biggest plays early on, they controlled much of the second half.

Although USC had just two healthy scholarship receivers, Helton regularly called long, daring pass plays — something the notoriously conservative Kiffin rarely tried. USC managed just one pass play longer than 60 yards under Kiffin this season, but the Trojans had two TD catches longer than that in the first 10 minutes against the Wildcats.

Kessler threw a long pass down the middle on the Trojans' first play of their second series. Agholor, the speedy sophomore who replaced Robert Woods in this season's starting lineup, sprinted to make a fingertip catch just 3:39 in, stunning a crowd starved for exciting football.

Madden caught a midrange pass over the middle a few minutes later and romped through the Arizona secondary.

Davis scored from 11 yards out in the second quarter before Allen made a high dive into the end zone for a 28-3 lead. Phillips slipped behind USC's defense for a 57-yard touchdown catch 56 seconds before halftime.

Richards caught a 9-yard TD pass with 6:48 to play, and Wharton pulled the Wildcats within seven points before Redd ran out the clock with a 10-yard run on third-and-8 with 1:38 left. Redd, the Penn State transfer who led USC in rushing last season, had 80 yards on the ground after missing the first five games of this season with a persistent knee injury.

**TUCSON, Ariz. (AP)** -- Ka'Deem Carey rushed for 236 yards in a school record 40 carries, capping off his night with a 44-yard touchdown run with 1:30 to play to seal Arizona's 35-24 victory over Utah Saturday.

B.J. Denker ran for two touchdowns and passed for another for the Wildcats (4-2, 1-2 Pac-12) in their first conference victory of the season.

Utah (4-3, 1-3), coming off its stunning upset of then-No. 5 Stanford, lost quarterback Travis Wilson with an injury to his right hand late in the first half.

Backup Adam Schulz threw a 55-yard touchdown pass to Sean Fitzgerald to put Utah up 21-20 early in the third quarter after Arizona led 20-7 at the half.

Carey, the nation's leading rusher last season, amassed the second-most yardage in his career, exceeded only by his Pac-12 record 366 against Colorado last season.

Moments before his late TD run, Carey had fumbled for the first time this season, giving Utah, down just 28-24, the ball at the Arizona 39. But the Utes stalled at the 23 and Andy Phillips' 40-yard field goal was wide left. Phillips, 11 for 11 on field goals this season entering the game, also missed a 42-yarder. He made one from 44 yards.

After the miss, Carey took the ball repeatedly as the Wildcats moved downfield, then burst through for the long run that clinched the victory.

Down 20-7 at halftime, Utah scored 14 points in a span of 91 seconds to take the lead.

Arizona's Johnny Jackson muffed a punt and the Utes' Chase Dominguez recovered at the Wildcats' 17. Schulz threw 16 yards to Dres Anderson, then Kelvin York scored on a one-yard run to cut the lead to 20-14.

After the kickoff, the Wildcats drove the ball to midfield, then went for it on fourth-and-two from the Utah 46, and Carey was stopped a yard shy of the first down. On the next play, Schulz threw deep to a wide open Fitzgerald for a 55-yard touchdown and the PAT put the Utes up 21-20 with 9:08 left in the third quarter.

It was Utah's first and only lead of the game.

Arizona went back ahead early in the fourth quarter. Nate Phillips made a tough catch of Denker's 36-yard pass to the 9-yard line. On third-and-goal from the 7, Denker rolled to his left and drilled a pass to Phillips in the end zone. Denker ran for the two-point conversion and the Wildcats were back on top, 28-21, with 13:32 remaining.

Phillips' 44-yard field goal cut it to 28-24 with 7:11 left.

Carey started his night much the way he ended it.

On Arizona's first play of the night, the junior running back burst through for a 30-yard gain. Seven plays later, Denker scored on a 10-yard run and the Wildcats were up 7-0.

The Utes took the subsequent kickoff and tied it with an eight-play, 71-yard drive. Luckey Radley had runs of 17 and 37 yards and, on third and goal, Wilson threw two yards to Nate Orchard for the touchdown to tie it at 7-7.

Arizona responded with a 17-play drive but on fourth-and-one at the Utah 2-yard line, Denker was sacked by Trevor Reilly.

That only temporarily derailed the Wildcats.

With Utah pinned at its 10 in a third-and-nine situation, Wilson's pass over the middle was picked off by Marquis Flowers, who ran untouched 14 yards to the end zone and Arizona led 14-7 less than a minute into the second quarter.

Carey's running and Denker's passing led Arizona on a 13-play, 72-yard touchdown drive later in the quarter. Denker scored from the 1-yard line, the PAT attempt was blocked and the Wildcats were up 20-7.

Wilson left late in the first half and was on the sidelines in the second half with the thumb on his throwing hand taped.

Schulz had thrown only five passes this season before Saturday night.
