Four Home Games Remain on the Schedule in 2012

Bruins continue on the road at California next week



ROSE BOWL: THE 31st YEAR

The 2012 season marks the 31st year that the Rose Bowl, currently undergoing a renovation, will serve as home of the Bruins.

The focus of the renovation project is to expedite tunnel ingress/egress, improve concourse circulation, increase the number of concession stands and restrooms, provide state-of-the-art premium seating products in a rebuilt press box and install a new scoreboard and video board.

UCLA moved to Pasadena from the L.A. Coliseum in the summer of 1982 and went 6-0-1 in that first year, capping the season with a victory over Michigan in the Rose Bowl game.

The 2006 season-opening win against Utah was UCLA's 100th at the Rose Bowl. The Bruins own a record of 126-57-2 since moving to Pasadena, including a 3-2 record in Rose Bowl games.

In July of 2007, the Rose Bowl was selected the No. 1 sports venue by SI.com/Slon-Campus.

GAME 5 — The Bruins (3-1, 0-1) play their first Pac-12 Conference road game of the season at Colorado (1-3, 1-0) on Saturday, September 29 in Boulder, CO. Kickoff is set for 4:00 p.m. MT/ 3:00 p.m. PT and the game will be televised by the Pac-12 Networks with Ted Robinson and Adam Archuleta in the booth and Yogi Roth on the sidelines.

The Bruin IMG Radio Network (Chris Roberts, Matt Stevens and Wayne Cook) will radio broadcast the contest on 1150am in the Los Angeles area. The game will also be aired nationally on SIRIUS (Ch. 139).

VS. COLORADO — The Bruins lead the series 5-2, capturing the last meeting with a 45-6 win a year ago in the Rose Bowl. The Bruins scored on their first three possessions of that contest and jumped out to 21-0 lead. A 21-point fourth quarter made the final score 45-6. Johnathan Franklin ran for 162 yards. Quarterback Kevin Prince passed for 225 yards and four touchdowns. The Bruins became bowl eligible with last season's win over CU.

The two teams last did battle in Boulder, CO in the 2003 season. Colorado came away with a 16-14 victory. CU scored the winning touchdown in the final two minutes of the contest. Quarterback Drew Olson came off the bench, following an injury to Matt Moore, to complete 13 of 23 passing attempts for 164 yards and two touchdowns. Tight end Mercedes Lewis made six receptions for 96 yards and one touchdown.

UCLA has not won a game in Boulder since the 1984 season. Freshmen running backs James Primus and Gaston Green combined for 169 yards on the ground in a 33-16 victory. Quarterback Matt Stevens threw for 193 yards and one touchdown. John Lee booted four field goals on the day and became UCLA's career scoring leader after converting an extra point in the fourth quarter.

****RB Johnathan Franklin** ranks fourth in the nation in rushing (146.50/g) after putting together three straight 100-yard rushing games, including two season-opening 200-yard plus efforts against Rice (214) and Nebraska (217)...he ranks seventh in the nation in all-purpose yardage (180.75)

****QB Brett Hundley's** 404 yards of total offense against Oregon State ranks fifth all-time at UCLA and is the sixth 400-yard game in school history; He ranks 10th in the nation in total offense (337.50)

****The Bruins** top the Pac-12 with 12 turnovers gained (eight ints.-tied for first in Pac-12 and four fumbles)

****This** is the second time in Franklin's career he has had three-straight 100-yard rushing games, also 2010

****UCLA** has played three teams ranked among the top 32 teams nationally in total offense its first four games of 2012 (9-Nebraska, 30 Rice, 32 Houston)

****Senior cornerback Sheldon Price** leads the nation in interceptions (1.33 per game)

****UCLA** has not gained at least 500 yards of total offense in any three previous three-game stretch (complete records date back to the 1958 season) ... **Franklin's 3,255 yds rushing ranks fourth among active FBS players (1-Robbie Rouse of Fresno State-3,674)
 **Houston was Franklin's 13th career 100-yard rushing game, tied for 5th on all-time list (DeShaun Foster)
 **The UCLA defense scored in each of the first three games of the season (fumble returns at Rice and vs. Houston for touchdowns and a safety vs. Nebraska)
 **UCLA had six 200-yard rushing games last season and opened the 2012 season with a 247-yard total vs. Houston, 344-yard total vs. Nebraska and a 343-yard total at Rice ... The Bruins have won 23 straight games in which they have rushed for at least 250 yards (80-3-1 all-time)
 **With a career total of 3,255 yds, Franklin has vaulted into second on the all-time school list He is 477 yards shy of Gaston Green's (1984-87) mark of 3,731 yards.

Punter **Jeff Locke**(#18) has been named to the All-Conference academic team the past three seasons; he has finished 12th (2011), fourth (2010) and 16th (2009) in the nation in punting average ... OL **Xavier Su'a-Filo** (#56) spent the last two years on an LDS mission in Alabama and Florida during which time he learned the Spanish language ... LB **Anthony Barr**'s(#11) dad, Tony Brooks, was a fourth-round pick of the Eagles in the 1992 draft, after playing at Notre Dame ... A school-record 17 true freshmen played for the Bruins in 1977. Thirteen played in 1975, 12 in 1978, 1980 and 2004 and 10 played in 1979. In recent years, nine played in 2005, eight in 2006, two in 2007 and 11 in 2008. UCLA played 10 freshmen in 2009. The Bruins played 10 freshmen in 2010. Tight end Raymond Nelson (no longer on the roster) was the lone first-year player to see action in 2011.

THE OFFENSE

QUARTERBACK — Redshirt freshman **BRETT HUNDLEY (#17)** scored a touchdown after taking his first snap as a college player at Rice. He raced 72-yards to paydirt on UCLA's initial offensive play from scrimmage.

The 372 passing yards for Hundley against Oregon State marked the third straight game above the 300-yard mark, a first in UCLA history. The 372-yard effort is the second-highest total in a single game by a UCLA freshman (Tommy Maddox 409 vs. USC, 1990). In addition, it was the most aerial yards by a Bruin since Drew Olson threw for 510 against Arizona State in 2005. The 404 yards of total offense by Hundley are the second-highest total by a UCLA freshman in a single game (Maddox, 445 in 1990 v. USC) and the fifth-highest in school history.

Hundley threw for 202 yards and two touchdowns in the opener against Rice. He also ran seven times for 68 yards. The redshirt freshman totaled 305 yards and ran for 53 yards against Nebraska for 358 yards of total offense. He threw for 320 yards against Houston, seventh on the all-time freshman list.

Hundley graduated early from Chandler HS in Chandler, AZ and joined the Bruins in Winter Quarter 2011 (January). He took part in spring practice at UCLA, but was limited early in the 2011 fall camp due to a summer knee injury. Hundley did not see action in the 2011 season. He participated in a second spring practice in 2012 and won the starting job in pre-season camp.

He threw for 2,348 yards as a senior in high school with 20 scoring passes, two interceptions. He also led his team in rushing with 856 yards and nine touchdowns. Following his senior season, he won the passing competition at the Under Armour All-America Game Skills Challenge. As a junior, he threw for 1,517 yards and 16 touchdowns with two interceptions. Hundley rushed for 1,208 yards and 12 touchdowns. He was named Arizona's Gatorade Player of the Year in 2009.

Redshirt senior **KEVIN PRINCE (#4)** saw his first action of 2012 in the fourth quarter of the Houston game. He started the last eight games (10 starts overall) of 2011. Prince completed his junior season ranked among UCLA's all-time best in total offense (8th), pass completions (8th) and passing yards (9th). He finished up with 424 yards rushing for 2011 (most by Bruin qb since Jeff Dankworth racked up 815 in the 1976 season). His 163 yards rushing v. Cal marked the first time a Bruin quarterback had rushed for at least 100 yards in a game since Dankworth in 1976. It was the most rushing yardage by a quarterback since John Sciarra totaled 178 versus Tennessee in 1974.

In 2010, Prince appeared in five games, all starts. He was sidelined for the balance of that season after undergoing arthroscopic knee surgery on Oct. 23. In 2009, Prince started all 11 games in which he played. He became the second freshman quarterback in UCLA history to pass for over 300 yards three times in a season (Tommy Maddox, 1990).

True senior **RICHARD BREHAUT (#12)** saw action for a few plays in the second half of action against Nebraska and completed one pass. He came on in the fourth quarter of the Rice game and threw for 101 yards.

In 2011, he appeared in seven games, with four starts. He came on in relief of Kevin Prince in the opener at Houston and went on to start game two against San Jose State. He came off the bench against Texas and then started games at Oregon and at Stanford. He suffered a broken leg after starting game six against Washington State. He came back for a brief appearance in the Pac-12 Championship Game and threw his first interception in 141 passing attempts.

In 2010, Brehaut appeared in nine games, with seven starts. He started the final six games of the season. At Arizona State, he set school records with his 33 pass completions (old record, 32 by Troy Aikman v. USC in 1988) and 56 pass attempts (old record, 51 by Dennis Dummit v. Cal in 1970). He also set personal bests with 321 passing yards and three touchdown passes.

OFFENSIVE LINE — The Bruins started three freshmen on the offensive line in a season-opening game for the first time in history. Redshirt freshmen Torian White joined true freshman Simon Goines at the tackle positions, Jake Brendel handled the center spot.

Redshirt senior **JEFF BACA (#60)**, the team leader with 35 career starts, started at guard in the first two games of the 2012 season. He started at tackle for 11 contests last season before sliding to guard against Illinois in the bowl game. In 2009, he started all 13 games at left guard. In 2008, he appeared in nine games with eight starts at left tackle.

True sophomore **XAVIER SU'A-FILO (#56)** returns to UCLA after serving a two-year Mormon mission. Su'a Filo started the first four games of 2012 at guard. He re-enrolled in school for the 2012 Winter Quarter and was back on the field in the spring. In 2009, he started all 13 games at left tackle which was the most starts by a Bruin true freshman at any non-kicking position. Su'a-Filo became the first Bruin true freshman to start a season-opener on the offensive side of the ball and earned Honorable Mention All-Pac-10 honors.

Redshirt freshman **JAKE BRENDL (#54)** made his first start in the 2012 opener at Rice. He was named Coach Ed Kezirian "Coach K" Award winner for Academic and Athletic Balance. Redshirt freshman **TORIAN WHITE (#77)** enjoyed a solid spring and started his first game at Rice. True freshman tackle **SIMON GOINES (#70)** started his first college game at Rice. Redshirt junior **GREG CAPELLA (#64)** came on for Baca at guard in the second half at Nebraska and saw action off the bench against Houston. He lined up at guard for 13 games and moved in at center for the San Jose State game in 2011. Redshirt senior **BRETT DOWNEY (#78)** was a member of the Bruin special teams unit for placekicks in 2011 and appeared in two games at tackle. He made his first career start (OT) in the bowl game against Illinois. He started at guard in games three and four of 2012 against Houston and Oregon State.

RUNNING BACKS — Redshirt senior tailback **JOHNATHAN FRANKLIN (#23)** has started 36 career games. He kicked off the 2012 season with a pair of 200-yard plus rushing games, the second and third of his career, to match Gaston Green (1985, 1986, 1987) and Karim Abdul-Jabbar (three in a row 1995) for the most in school history. In game three against Houston, he racked up 110 yards on the ground and caught a career-best four passes for 58 yards.

UCLA ON THE RADIO

The 2012 season will be UCLA's 16th with Clear Channel and the Bruin games are aired on AM 570 KLAC in Southern California. The broadcasts are produced by IMG, UCLA's corporate and media-rights holder.

The Los Angeles all-sports station's broadcast includes a two-hour pre-game show (one hour local, one hour network) and a post-game show. Hall of Fame broadcaster Chris Roberts, a four-time Golden Mike Award winner, completed his 20th season as the voice of the Bruins. Former Bruin quarterback Matt Stevens was in his 15th year on the broadcast team and his 11th as the analyst in the booth. Former Bruin quarterback Wayne Cook finished up his 10th season as sideline reporter.

AM 570 KLAC also provides ancillary programming, including head coach and player interviews during game weeks.

UCLA IMG Sports Network games are also available nationally through an agreement with Sirius XM Satellite Radio, the Official Satellite Radio Partner of UCLA Athletics.

Games can also be heard via the internet at uclabruins.com (a UCLA All-Access pass is needed).

UCLA ON TELEVISION

Entering the Colorado game, 99 of UCLA's last 100 games have been televised live, including 37 in a row.

All 14 of UCLA's games in the 2011 season were on live TV. In 2010, each of the 12 contests were broadcast live. The Oregon State game in 2009 is the last game not to be aired live (it was delayed).

The Pac-12 Networks will air conference games and ancillary programming which will feature football coach and player interviews during the season

Franklin began the 2012 season with a 214-yard effort at Rice, which included two 70-plus yard runs for touchdowns. He raced 74 yards midway through the first quarter and then navigated 78 yards for a score late in the second quarter. He became the first Bruin to have two runs of over 72 yards in a game. Franklin was named the Pac-12 Player of the Week for his efforts against the Owls. Against Nebraska, Franklin compiled a career-best 217 yards on the ground on 26 carries. He also caught a nine-yard scoring pass in the fourth quarter. For the second week in a row, he was named Conference Player of the Week. UCLA had never before had the same player earn back-to-back POW honors from the Pac-12/Pac-10.

The big start to the new season has vaulted Franklin into second place on the all-time school rushing list. He posted his 13th career 100-yard rushing day against Houston, which ties him with DeShaun Foster for fifth on the all-time school list. Franklin ran for a previous career-best 216 (30 carries) in a 2010 contest against Washington State (it was the most since Maurice Jones-Drew ran for 322 at Washington in 2004).

In 2010, Franklin appeared in all 12 games and made 10 starts. He led the Bruins in rushing with 1,127 yards (5.3 ave), the 10th-best season mark in school history. He became UCLA's first 1,000-yard rusher since Chris Markey in 2006 (1,107), and totaled the highest yardage by a Bruin since Skip Hicks (1,282-1997). He ran for 118 yards against USC to become the first Bruin back to hit the century mark versus the Trojans since DeShaun Foster in 1998. Franklin saw action in all 13 games in 2009, making eight starts. He led the team with 566 rushing yards, 12th in the Pac-10 and No. 6 on UCLA's freshman rushing list.

DEFENSIVE LINE —

True senior defensive end **DATONE JONES (#56)** has started 2012 in a big way with two games in which he has totaled three tackles for loss and he added a touchdown reception against Houston. In game one at Rice, he totaled six tackles to tie his career-best, two for loss and a sack. He also forced a fumble which Damien Holmes scooped up and raced 44 yards for a touchdown. *NFC Coach of the Year with the Falcons

On December 10, 2011, former NFC Coach of the Year Jim Mora was named UCLA's 17th head coach in school history. Mora comes to UCLA after spending part of 2010 and most of 2011 as a television analyst and contributor for the NFL Network and the NFL on Fox. He brings 25 years of NFL coaching acumen with him to UCLA, including four years of NFL head coaching experience while at the helm of the Atlanta Falcons (2004-06) and the Seattle Seahawks (2009).

Mora took over for Mike Holmgren as head coach of the Seattle Seahawks in 2009. He had served as assistant head coach and defensive backs coach for Seattle in the 2007 and 2008 campaigns. The Seahawks went 10-6 and finished first in the NFC West in the 2007 season and won the Wild Card game in the playoffs. In his initial season as the head coach of the Falcons in 2004, Mora guided the team to an 11-5 record, becoming just the eighth rookie head coach in NFL history to win 11 games and the 11th to bring home a Division title. Atlanta captured the NFC South title and earned an appearance in the NFC Championship game for only the second time in franchise history. Mora was selected as the NFC Coach of the Year. The Falcon's defense improved from a league ranking of 32nd in 2003 to No. 14 overall the next season, fueled by a league-leading and franchise record 48 quarterback sacks. Atlanta topped the NFL in rushing in all three of coach Mora's seasons as head coach. In 2006, Michael Vick became the first quarterback in NFL history to rush for at least 1,000 yards in a season.

Mora had joined the Falcons from the San Francisco 49ers where he spent seven seasons, from 1997-2003, including the last five as the defensive coordinator. In his first year, the 49ers finished No. 1 in the NFL in total defense, No. 2 in pass defense (with 25 interceptions), takeaways (41) and run defense, as well as No. 3 in the League in sacks (with 54). The 1998 squad tied for No. 1 in the NFC, and No. 4 in the NFL, with 21 interceptions. In the 2002 and 2003 seasons with San Francisco, the defense finished no worse than fourth in the NFL versus the run and in 2003, produced 42 sacks to tie for second in the conference. The 1997 team advanced to the NFC Championship Game and had three defensive players voted to the Pro Bowl, while the 1998 and 2002 squads captured Wild Card Game wins.

Mora worked the previous five seasons (1992-1996) on the staff of his dad, Jim E. Mora, as the secondary coach with the New Orleans Saints. His defensive expertise began to take shape and the Saints boasted the No. 1 pass defense in the NFL during his first two years. In 1985, Mora broke into the NFL coaching ranks with the San Diego Chargers under head coach Don Coryell. He spent seven seasons with the Chargers, advancing from the league's first quality control coach position to defensive backs coach, while working for head coaches Coryell, Al Saunders and Dan Henning.

Mora began his coaching career in 1984 at the University of Washington. He joined the staff of head coach Don James in the role of defensive assistant following a four-year playing career as a defensive back for the Huskies. While at UW, Mora had the opportunity to be a part of two Rose Bowl teams (1981-loss to Michigan and 1982-win over Iowa) as a player, in addition to helping the Huskies land a berth in the 1985 Orange Bowl (win over Oklahoma) as a graduate assistant. During his five seasons in the Husky program, Washington compiled a 48-12 record, ranked among the nation's top 10 teams on three occasions, and did not finish lower than second in the Pac-10 standings.

Three Bruin coaches and 11 players, including 2012 inductee Jonathan Ogden, 2010 inductee Randy Cross and 2008 inductee Troy Aikman, are enshrined in the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame.

UCLA has 15 former players currently working in the broadcast media - Troy Aikman, Charles Arbuckle, Wayne Cook, Randy Cross, Terry Donahue, Danny Farmer, Ryan Nece, Rick Neuheisel, David Norrie, Ron Pitts, Tom Ramsey, Matt Stevens, J.J. Stokes, Rick Walker, James Washington.

Twenty-two UCLA players have been selected to CoSIDA Academic All-America teams a total of 27 times. Offensive lineman Chris Joseph (2006, 2007) and wide receiver Cormac Carney (1981, 1982) were two-time first-team selections.

UCLA is the only school to produce six quarterbacks — Troy Aikman, Steve Bono, Billy Kilmer, Tommy Maddox, Tom Ramsey, Jay Schroeder — to have played that position on a Super Bowl team.

During the last 30 years (including 2011), UCLA has been ranked in the final Associated Press Top 25 on 12 occasions, second only to USC (17) among Pac-10 schools. Washington is next with 10 rankings.

The selection of tight end Mercedes Lewis by the Jacksonville Jaguars in the first round of the 2006 NFL draft marked the 29th time a UCLA player has been taken in round one.

Quarterback Drew Olson finished eighth in the 2005 Heisman Trophy balloting. It marked the 21st time that a Bruin has finished in the top 10 of the Heisman Trophy voting.

UCLA has had at least one former player participate in 28 of the last 31 Super Bowl games.

The only three-time consensus All-Americans in Pac-10 history are Bruins (LB Jerry Robinson and S Kenny Easley).

In the initial decade of the 2000's, UCLA had 12 finalists / winners of the National player awards --- 2009 Kai Forbath - Groza Award winner; 2005 Mercedes Lewis-Mackey Award winner; 2004 M. Lewis, Mackey finalist; 2002 Mike Seidman-Mackey finalist; 2004 Chris Kluwe-Ray Guy Award finalist; 2003 Dave Ball-Bronco Nagurski Award finalist; 2001 Robert Thomas-Dick Butkus Award finalist; 2000 Freddie Mitchell-Fred Biletnikoff Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Vince Lombardi Award finalist; 2006 Justin Hickman-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Chevrolet National Defensive Player of the Year Award.

On May 13, 2007 UCLA became the first school in history to win 100 NCAA team championships. The Bruins currently have 108 NCAA titles to their credit (winning women's volleyball in 2011-12).

Redshirt senior punter **JEFF LOCKE (#18)** has had four punts land inside the twenty in each of the last three games, helping the team win the field position battle. He has 29 kickoffs and 25 touchbacks.

Locke ranked fifth in the Pac-12 and 12th in the nation with a 44.34 average in 2011. He also kicked his first field goals, making two against Texas. He was named to the 2011 second-team Pac-12 All-Academic squad and was selected UCLA's male Scholar-Athlete for 2011-12.
