Morgan registered a career high 15 tackles (12 solo), including one tackle for loss, and scored his first touchdown on a 73-yard fumble return, which gave the Rams

a 14-point lead. His 73-yard fumble return is the third longest fumble returned for a touchdown in program history. Additionally, the fumble return was the second longest of the season among Mountain West teams. Morgan's 15 tackles at Hawai'i is the ninth most in the NCAA this season and his 12 solo stops is the fifth highest total nationally in 2013. He led a defense which held the Rainbow Warriors to only two third-down conversions out of 17 attempts (11.7%) and limited UH to only 32 rushing yards. In the end, Morgan's performance helped the Rams earn their second straight Mountain West road victory, a feat that hasn't been accomplished by a CSU team since 2002. Saturday also marked the first back-to-back victories under second-year coach Jim McElwain.

2013 NFFCC NEWS & NOTES

ADAMS STATE UNIVERSITY (6-2, 4-2 RMAC)

Team Notes: The Grizzlies recorded their sixth win of the season after defeating Western New Mexico, 41-20, at home. The Grizzlies will play at Fort Lewis this Saturday at 1 p.m. in the annual Musket Game.

COLORADO MESA UNIVERSITY (5-3, 4-2 RMAC)

Team Notes: The Mavericks lost only their second game of the season - and their first home game - against Colorado Mines on Saturday, 27-10. CMU will travel to CSU-Pueblo for a 6 PM game.

COLORADO SCHOOL OF MINES (5-3, 4-2 RMAC)

Justin Dvorak (R-Freshman, Quarterback, 6-0, 185, Tomball, Texas/Tomball HS)

Dvorak accounted for three fourth-quarter touchdowns on Saturday to lead the Colorado School of Mines football team to a 27-10 victory on the road at Colorado Mesa. Entering the fourth quarter down 3-0 and making his first collegiate start, Dvorak accounted for two touchdowns on the ground and one through the air en route to his first collegiate win under center. He finished 30-of-49 for 356 yards and a touchdown while adding 62 yards on 15 carries and two more touchdowns for 418 yards of total offense.

Team Notes: Colorado Mines captured a 27-10 victory over Colorado Mesa on Saturday at Stocker Stadium in Grand Junction. The Orediggers (5-3, 4-2 RMAC) have now won the last five matchups against the Mavericks (5-3, 4-2 RMAC) in the series, including all four contests since the Nyikus Cup series was instituted in the 2010 season. With one more victory, the Orediggers will record their seventh-straight winning season and their 12th in 14 seasons under head coach Bob Stitt. The victory on Saturday was the 95th of Stitt's career. A low scoring, 3-0 battle through the first three quarters, Mines scored touchdowns on four of its six fourth quarter drives to turn a close, competitive game into a lopsided win. Before the fourth quarter scoring output, the story of the game was Mines' defensive unit, which limited CMU to just three first-half points and 10 total in the contest. The squad intercepted three passes, including one each by Billy Sprague, Ryan Wood and Jalen Champagne. Sprague added eight tackles (six solo) and 0.5 tackle for loss as well. Senior Tyler Denson led the team with 12 tackles (four solo), a pass breakup and 0.5 sack. The New Braunfels, Texas, product also had a pick-six that was called back on a roughing the passer penalty. Ryan Griffith, Dallas Fields, Chad McGraw and Jake Utley each added seven tackles apiece, with Griffith adding a forced fumble and Fields and McGraw combining for 3.0 tackles for loss. Junior Kole Kadavy added a 13-yard sack and 2.0 tackles for loss in addition to five tackles as well. Justin Dvorak led the offense with 356 yards and a touchdown on 30-of-49 passing in his first collegiate start. He was intercepted twice but also ran for 62 yards and two touchdowns on 15 carries for 418 yards of total offense. Dan Palmer added 53 yards and a score on 16 totes while Tevin Champagne recorded 16 rushing yards on nine carries. Palmer caught three balls for 15 yards while Champagne added 24 yards and a touchdown on three receptions. Jimmy Ellis posted a game-high 10 receptions while Young topped all players with 162 receiving yards on seven receptions. Ellis added 42 yards on four punt returns, a 45-yard kickoff return and 92 receiving yards for a total of 179 all-purpose yards in the game. Avery Llewellyn finished 3-of-4 on extra points and averaged 44.0 yards per punt on three kicks. The Orediggers will return home next weekend to host Western State (1-6, 1-4 RMAC) at noon at Campbell Field in Golden.

COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY - PUEBLO (8-0, 6-0 RMAC)

Josh Sandoval (Senior, Wide Receiver, 5-11, 180, Pueblo, Colo./Pueblo East HS)

Sandoval scored two touchdowns in a 51-17 win over Black Hills State, scoring twice on gains of 60 yards or more. Each of his two scores were on the same pattern, turning a dump pass in the slot into a long score with over 50 yards after the reception on each score. With 162 total receiving yards, logged the most receiving yards in a game of any ThunderWolf since the program was re-introduced in 2008. He helped the undefeated and third-ranked ThunderWolves win its 28th straight RMAC game, setting a new conference record, as well as win its 34th straight regular season game, the longest streak in the nation.

FORT LEWIS COLLEGE (3-5, 2-4 RMAC)

Thaddeus Brown (Senior, Cornerback, 6-0, 190, Pasadena, Calif./Nevada-Reno/Notre Dame HS)

Brown recorded five tackles at Western State and an interception. Brown's interception came with 6 minutes left in the game with Western State on the FLC five-yard line. On third-and-goal, Brown intercepted the ball in the end zone to preserve the Skyhawks 10-9 win.

UNITED STATES AIR FORCE ACADEMY (1-7, 0-5 MWC)

Team Notes: Air Force played host to Notre Dame last week, falling to the Fighting Irish, 45-10. The Falcons will play their third straight home game of the year against Army on Saturday at 10 AM.

UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO (4-4, 0-4 PAC-12)

Team Notes: The Buffaloes wore all black against Arizona, as it was the annual Blackout Breast Cancer; the look included pink accessories (and the Ralphie logo was pink as well); but the Buffs dropped to 21-22-1 all-time wearing all black (0-3 with black helmets). Colorado fell to 61-33-5 in 99 homecoming games, to 50-50-2 in night games overall (6-1 vs. Arizona, 24-13-2 at home). Paul Richardson's 75-yard touchdown reception was his sixth play of 50 yards or longer this season, tying the modern day record for most plays 50 yards or longer in year (and it was the 12th of his career). Woodson Greer started on the inside (at the will spot) with the Buffs opening in the nickel. Arizona ran 39 first down plays, and gained yardage on 36 of those; the other plays were two rushes for zero and an incomplete pass as UA averaged 9.97 yards on first down; CU averaged a healthy 6.4. Jered Bell made his third interception of the season, which he has returned for 109 yards and a touchdown; his four career picks he has returned 146 yards. Darragh O'Neill punted three times inside UA territory, placing all inside the 15. Will Oliver made his career long field goal of 53 yards; he previously had two from 52 yards.

Team Notes: Northern Colorado did not play last week. They are back in action this Saturday at home against Montana State.

WESTERN STATE COLORADO UNIVERSITY (1-6, 1-4 RMAC)
