BRUINS BACK HOME IN THE ROSE BOWL — UCLA (5-2, 2-2 ranked #17 in the *Associated Press* and 19th in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll/20th in BCS) will return home to the Rose Bowl to take on Colorado (3-4, 0-4) on Saturday, Nov. 2. Bruin great Mercedes Lewis, who won the 2005 John Mackey Award as the nation's top tight end, is this week's Honorary Captain. The game will kickoff at 4:35 p.m. PT and be televised by Fox Sports 1 with Craig Bolerjack (play by play), Joey Harrington (color) and Ryan Nece (field reporter) calling the action. The Bruin IMG Radio Network (Chris Roberts, Matt Stevens and Wayne Cook) will air the contest on am 570 Fox Sports Radio. The game will also be broadcast on SIRIUS (Ch. 139), XM (Ch. 190).

BRUINS VS. THE BUFFS — The Bruins lead the series, 6-2. UCLA has captured both meetings since the Buffs joined the Pac-12 in 2011. The Bruins won 42-14 in game 5 of last season in Boulder, bouncing back from a home loss to Oregon State in game 4. Brett Hundley passed for 281 yards in the contest and threw scoring passes to Darius Bell and Joseph Fauria. Hundley also ran for a couple of scores.

In 2011, UCLA stormed out to a 21-0 first quarter lead, outscored the Buffaloes 21-0 again in the fourth quarter, and went on to post a 45-6 win in the Rose Bowl. Shaq Evans caught a 54-yard scoring pass from Kevin Prince to start the night's scoring. UCLA had once again lost the previous week, this time at Utah. The Bruins became bowl eligible with the win as Prince connected on his first eight passes, and 15 of 19 in the game, while throwing for four touchdowns.

JIM MORA HEAD COACH SECOND SEASON 14-7 RECORD

On December 10, 2011, former NFC Coach of the Year Jim Mora was named UCLA's 17th head coach in school history. In his first season in Westwood, Mora guided the Bruins to the 2012 South Division Championship of the Pac-12 Conference and matched the school-record for wins by a first-year Bruin coach with nine. The team set numerous offensive records during that initial campaign, including rushing yards, passing yards, total offense and points scored. Four players went on to be selected in the 2013 NFL Draft, including first-round pick defensive end Datone Jones.

Mora came to UCLA after spending part of 2010 and most of 2011 as a television analyst and contributor for the NFL Network and the NFL on Fox. He brought 25 years of NFL coaching acumen with him to UCLA, including four years of NFL head coaching experience while at the helm of the Atlanta Falcons (2004-06) and the Seattle Seahawks (2009).

Mora took over for Mike Holmgren as head coach of the Seattle Seahawks in 2009. He had served as assistant head coach and defensive backs coach for Seattle in 2007 and 2008. The Seahawks went 10-6 and finished first in the NFC West in the 2007 season and won the Wild Card game. In his initial season as the head coach of the Falcons in 2004, Mora guided the team to an 11-5 record, becoming just the eighth rookie head coach in NFL history to win 11 games and the 11th to bring home a Division title. Atlanta captured the NFC South title and earned an appearance in the NFC Championship game for only the second time in franchise history. Mora was selected as the NFC Coach of the Year.

The Falcon's defense improved from a league ranking of 32nd in 2003 to No. 14 overall the next season, fueled by a league-leading and franchise record 48 quarterback sacks. Atlanta topped the NFL in rushing in all three of coach Mora's seasons as head coach. In 2006, Michael Vick became the first quarterback in NFL history to rush for at least 1,000 yards.

Mora had joined the Falcons from the San Francisco 49ers where he spent seven seasons, from 1997-2003, including the last five as the defensive coordinator. In his first year, the 49ers finished No. 1 in the NFL in total defense, No. 2 in pass defense (with 25 interceptions), takeaways (41) and run defense, as well as No. 3 in the League in sacks (with 54). The 1998 squad tied for No. 1 in the NFC, and No. 4 in the NFL, with 21 interceptions. The 1997 team advanced to the NFC Championship Game, while the 1998 and 2002 squads captured Wild Card Game wins.

Mora worked the previous five seasons (1992-1996) on the staff of his dad, Jim E. Mora, as the secondary coach with the New Orleans Saints. His defensive expertise began to take shape and the Saints boasted the No. 1 pass defense in the NFL during his first two years. In 1985, Mora broke into the NFL coaching ranks with the San Diego Chargers under head coach Don Coryell. He spent seven seasons with the Chargers, advancing from the league's first quality control coach position to defensive backs coach.

Mora began his coaching career in 1984 at the University of Washington. He joined the staff of Don James in the role of defensive assistant following a four-year playing career as a defensive back for the Huskies. While at UW, Mora had the opportunity to be a part of two Rose Bowl teams (1981-loss to Michigan and 1982-win over Iowa) as a player, in addition to helping the Huskies land a berth in the 1985 Orange Bowl (win over Oklahoma) as a graduate assistant. During his five seasons in the Husky program, Washington compiled a 48-12 record, ranked among the nation's top 10 teams on three occasions, and did not finish lower than second in the Pac-10 standings. ROSE BOWL: THE 32nd YEAR

The 2013 season marks the 32nd year that the Rose Bowl will serve as home of the Bruins.

The recent Rose Bowl renovation project has focused on improving spectator ingress/egress, expediting concourse circulation of fans, increasing the number of restrooms and concession stands, providing state-of-the-art premium seating options in a rebuilt press box and installing of a new scoreboard and video board. UCLA moved to Pasadena from the L.A. Coliseum in the summer of 1982 and went 6-0-1 in that first year, capping the season with a victory over Michigan in the Rose Bowl game.

The 2006 season-opening win against Utah was UCLA's 100th at the Rose Bowl. The Bruins own a record of 132-58-2 since moving to Pasadena, including a 3-2 record in Rose Bowl games.

In July of 2007, the Rose Bowl was selected the No. 1 sports venue by SI.com/SlonCampus.

**UCLA has won 18 of its last 23 games when winning the turnover battle (78%) and owns a 16-33 record in its last 49 games (33%) when losing or tying the turnover ratio

**16 different receivers caught at least one pass v. New Mexico State and 12 different receivers accomplished the feat v. Nevada

**UCLA put up a school-record total of 692 yards of total offense against New Mexico State after racking up 504 yards of offense at Nebraska and recording 647 yards of offense vs. Nevada...It had not gained at least 500 yards of total offense in any three-game stretch during a season, prior to the 2012 season (complete records date back to 1965 season) ...Years in which UCLA has had at least three games, with at least 500-yards of total offense -- 2013 3 (Nevada=647/Nebraska=504/New Mex. LEWIS RETURNS HOME AS HONORARY CAPTAIN — Bruin great Mercedes Lewis, who won the 2005 John Mackey

Award as the nation's top tight end, is this week's Honorary Captain. The only Mackey Award winner in UCLA history, Lewis's 121 career receptions, 1,571 yards and 21 touchdowns rank No. 1 in school history for tight ends. As a senior in 2005, he set single season school records for a tight end with 58 catches for 741 yards and 10 touchdowns, while earning First-Team All-America honors and First-Team All-Pac-10 acclaim. He was the 28th selection in the first round of the 2006 NFL Draft by Jacksonville, and has played for the Jaguars for his entire eight-year career. Prior to the 2013 season, Lewis ranked third in franchise history in reception yardage (3,224), fifth in receptions (272) and third in receiving touchdowns (21). A 2010 Pro Bowl selection, he led all NFL tight ends in average yards per catch in 2009 and 2010. Lewis is a graduate of Long Beach Poly High School.

UCLA ON THE RADIO

The 2013 season is UCLA's 17th with Clear Channel Radio. This will be the seventh year for the Bruins games to be aired on AM 570 Fox Sports LA in Southern California. The broadcasts are produced by IMG, UCLA's corporate and media-rights holder.

The Los Angeles all-sports station's broadcast includes a two-hour pre-game show (one hour local, one hour network) and a post-game show.

Hall of Fame broadcaster Chris Roberts, a four-time Golden Mike Award winner, has been the voice of the Bruins for over 20 years (this is year 22). Former Bruin quarterback Matt Stevens ('83-86) is set to begin his 17th year on the broadcast team and his 13th as the analyst in the booth. Former Bruin quarterback Wayne Cook ('91-94) is in his 12th season as sideline reporter.

AM 570 Fox Sports LA also provides ancillary programming, including head coach and player interviews during game weeks.

UCLA IMG Sports Network games are available nationally through an agreement with Sirius XM Satellite Radio, the Official Satellite Radio Partner of UCLA Athletics.

Games can also be heard via the internet at uclabruins.com, and on the tunein radio app on your mobile devices.

COACHES' RADIO SHOW

An exciting new addition this year will be a weekly coaches' radio show, the Bruin Insider Show, which will air Tuesday nights from 7 to 8 pm, live from Barney's Beanery in Westwood (either on AM570 Fox Sports LA or 1150AM).

The Bruin Insider Show will make its debut on Tuesday, Aug. 27. UCLA head football coach Jim Mora will be a weekly guest on the show during football season, and UCLA men's basketball head coach Steve Alford will be featured during basketball season. Also featured throughout the year will be UCLA Athletic Director Dan Guerrero and various coaches and student-athletes from UCLA's storied athletic program that has won a national-best 109 NCAA Championships. Local broadcaster John Ramey will be the host of the show. Ramey finished his fourth season as the play-by-play voice for the 2013 College World Series champion UCLA baseball team.

UCLA ON TELEVISION

Following the Oregon game, 116 of UCLA's last 117 games have been televised live, including 51 in a row.

All 14 of UCLA's games in the 2012 and 2011 seasons were on live TV. In 2010, each of the 12 contests were broadcast live. The Oregon State game in 2009 is the last game not to be aired live (it was delayed).

The Pac-12 Networks will air conference games and ancillary programming which will feature football coach and player interviews during the season.

BRUIN TIDBITS

Three Bruin coaches and 11 players, including 2012 inductee Jonathan Ogden, 2010 inductee Randy Cross and 2008 inductee Troy Aikman, are enshrined in the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame.

UCLA has 16 former players currently working in the broadcast media - Troy Aikman, Charles Arbuckle, Brendon Ayanbadejo, Wayne Cook, Randy Cross, Terry Donahue, Danny Farmer, Ryan Nece, Rick Neuheisel, David Norrie, Ron Pitts, Tom Ramsey, Matt Stevens, J.J. Stokes, Rick Walker, James Washington.

Five Bruins have been voted in to the NFL Hall of Fame-OL Johnathan Ogden-2013; QB Troy Aikman-2006; DB Jimmy Johnson-1994; WR/coach Tom Fears-1970; QB/P/PK/DB Bob Waterfield-1965.

The selection of defensive end Datone Jones by the Green Bay Packers in the first round of the 2013 NFL draft marked the 30th time a UCLA player has been taken in round one.

Twenty-two UCLA players have been selected to CoSIDA Academic All-America teams a total of 27 times. Offensive lineman Chris Joseph (2006, 2007) and wide receiver Cormac Carney (1981, 1982) were two-time first-team selections.

UCLA is the only school to produce six quarterbacks — Troy Aikman, Steve Bono, Billy Kilmer, Tommy Maddox, Tom Ramsey, Jay Schroeder — to have played that position on a Super Bowl team.

Quarterback Drew Olson finished eighth in the 2005 Heisman Trophy balloting. It marked the 21st time that a Bruin has finished in the top 10 of the Heisman Trophy voting.

UCLA has had at least one former player participate in 29 of the last 32 Super Bowl games.

The only three-time consensus All-Americans in Pac-10 history are Bruins (LB Jerry Robinson and S Kenny Easley).

Since 2000, UCLA has had 13 finalists / winners of the National player awards --- 2012 Johnathan Franklin - Doak Walker Award finalist; 2009 Kai Forbath - Groza Award winner; 2005 Mercedes Lewis-Mackey Award winner; 2004 M. Lewis, Mackey finalist; 2002 Mike Seidman-Mackey finalist; 2004 Chris Kluwe-Ray Guy Award finalist; 2003 Dave Ball-Bronco Nagurski Award finalist; 2001 Robert Thomas-Dick Butkus Award finalist; 2000 Freddie Mitchell-Fred Biletnikoff Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Vince Lombardi Award finalist; 2006 Justin Hickman-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Chevrolet National Defensive Player of the Year Award.

On May 13, 2007 UCLA became the first school in history to win 100 NCAA team championships. The Bruins currently have 109 NCAA titles to their credit (winning baseball in 2012-13).

He helped pave the way for running back Johnathan Franklin who set new school records for career rushing yardage and single-season rushing yardage and the lineman was named a third-team Associated Press All-America and first-team All-Pac-12 Conference.

Redshirt junior linebacker **ERIC KENDRICKS (#6)** ranks second in the Pac-12 in tackles (9.1). He started all 14 games in 2012. PASADENA, Calif. – Brett Hundley passed for 274 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for two more scores, leading No. 21 UCLA's second-half surge to a 58-20 victory over Nevada on Saturday night.

LINCOLN, Neb. – UCLA's emotional week ended with the Bruins making a comeback the likes of which rarely, if ever, has been seen at Memorial Stadium.

Brett Hundley threw three touchdown passes while No. 16 UCLA wiped out an 18-point deficit to defeat No. 23 Nebraska 41-21 and stun into silence a record crowd of 91,471 on Saturday.

The win came six days after UCLA receiver Nick Pasquale was killed when he was struck by a vehicle while he was walking in his hometown and a day before coaches and teammates travel to San Clemente, Calif., for his memorial service.

The Bruins wore No. 36 patches on their jerseys in memory of Pasquale. The Huskers wore No. 36 decals on their helmets, and there was a moment of silence for Pasquale before the game.

According to STATS, the 18 points marked the biggest deficit overcome by a Nebraska opponent in Lincoln since at least 1996. Neither STATS nor Nebraska sports information officials had complete records on opponent comebacks available prior to 1996.

Yes, Brett Hundley is the quarterback who can do everything, and with a UCLA defense that did more than its part by making six interceptions, there was no way he could lose.

Hundley hit the trifecta with a touchdown each passing, rushing and receiving Thursday night to lead the 12th-ranked Bruins to a 34-27 win over Utah that lifted UCLA to 4-0 for the first time since 2005.

Hundley, who went 17 for 27 for 211 yards, also had an interception, throwing an ill-advised pass into the flat that Keith McGill picked off and returned 19 yards for a touchdown to tie it at 24 with 13:23 left.

STANFORD, Calif. – Tyler Gaffney ran for 171 yards and two touchdowns, and No. 13 Stanford downed ninth-ranked UCLA, 24-10 on Saturday.

Kevin Hogan threw for 227 yards and a spectacular touchdown to Kodi Whitfield as the Cardinal (6-1, 4-1) regrouped again after losing at Utah last week. Stanford has not lost consecutive games since October 2009.

Hundley completed 24 of 39 passes for 192 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions to Jordan Richards - the second with a little more than 2 minutes remaining to seal Stanford's victory. UCLA (5-1, 2-1) has not started 6-0 since 2005.

EUGENE, Ore. — Byron Marshall ran for 133 yards and three touchdowns and No. 2 Oregon wore down No. 12 UCLA's stout defense for a 42-14 victory on Saturday night.

Marcus Mariota threw for 230 yards and a score and De'Anthony Thomas returned from a three game absence to run in another for the Ducks (8-0, 5-0 Pac-12).

The Bruins (5-2, 2-2) went into halftime with the score knotted at 14 but were shutout by the Ducks in the second half.

Brett Hundley completed 13 of 19 passes for 64 yards and a touchdown but also threw two interceptions, including one early in the fourth quarter that led to an Oregon touchdown. He also ran for 64 yards and a score.

UCLA has not won at Autzen Stadium since 2004, and hasn't defeated the Ducks since a 16-0 blanking in 2007. The two teams last met in 2011, when Oregon downed UCLA 49-31 in the inaugural Pac-12 championship game.

The Ducks are the highest ranked opponent the Bruins have faced since they played the No. 1-ranked Ducks in the 2010 season. Last weekend UCLA fell 24-10 to No. 13 Stanford.
