UCLA AT COLORADO — UCLA (5-2, 2-2) will travel to Colorado (2-5, 0-4) on Saturday, Oct. 25 for a battle which will kickoff at 11:00 a.m. PT/Noon MT. The game will be televised by the Pac-12 Networks with Kevin Calabro, Yogi Roth and Lewis Johnson on the call. The Bruin IMG Radio Network (Chris Roberts, Matt Stevens and Wayne Cook) will radio broadcast the contest on am570 Fox Sports LA. The game will also be aired on Sirius (Ch. 139)/ XM (Ch. 197).

The No. 7 AP preseason ranking was the highest for the program since it was also ranked No. 7 prior to the 1998 campaign. UCLA climbed as high as No. 7 on both the AP and Coaches polls (Oct. 30) during the regular season in 2005. Tickets for 2014 are on sale at uclabruins.com/tickets. The Bruins have three home games remaining this season at the Rose Bowl – Homecoming on Nov. 1 vs. Arizona, Nov. 22 vs. USC and Nov. 28 vs. Stanford.

**NCAA Top 15-Ranked Bruins -- Eric Kendricks #13 in tackles/g (11.0); Ishmael Adams is #10 in Combined Kick Returns YDs (511 yds); Brett Hundley is #1 in pass compl. % (.725); Hundley #6 in pass efficiency (166.1); Hundley is #11 in yds per pass attempt (9.10); Paul Perkins is #15 in rush yds/g (116.6), Perkins is #14 in rush yds (816).

**Brett Hundley, with 66, needs one more TD pass to move into a tie for #2 with Drew Olson and two to move into a tie for first on all-time school list with Cade McNown at 68

**Eric Kendricks has led/tied for the team lead in tackles in each g this season; has 20 career double-digit tackle games

**Brett Hundley now owns five of the 10 400-yard total offense games in UCLA history after his 424-yard effort at Cal; It was his third 400-yard plus game of 2014. No other Bruin had recorded more than two in their career.

**Eric Kendricks now has three career defensive TDs, one shy of the school record mark held jointly by DB Alterraun Verner (2006-09) and LB Spencer Havner (2001-05) ... Kendricks became the 4th Bruin to reach the 400 tackle plateau in the Oregon game... He has moved into 2nd on all-time school tackle list (59 shy of tying Jerry Robinson at #1) ...He is first Bruin to have back-to-back 100-tackle seasons (106-'13/ 150-'12) since '88-89 (Craig Davis) ... The only players with three straight 100 tackle seasons are Jerry Robinson (1976-78) and Don Rogers (1981-83)

**During the Cal game, Hundley became UCLA's all-time leader in completions and the first player to go over the 700 completion mark and moved up into second on the all-time school passing yards list

**Jordan Payton has at least five catches in all but the Texas game (4) and his 151 yards receiving at ASU is most by a Bruin since '09

JIM MORA HEAD COACH THIRD SEASON 24-10 RECORD

On December 10, 2011, former Atlanta Falcons and Seattle Seahawks head coach Jim Mora was named UCLA's 17th head coach in school history.

In year two, Mora led the Bruins to the eighth 10-win season in school history, tying the school mark for wins in a season. His total of 19 wins during his first two seasons at the helm is the most ever by a UCLA head coach in their initial couple of seasons on the job. The team captured its 10th win by besting Virginia Tech in the Hyundai Sun Bowl. UCLA remained in the Associated Press rankings throughout the full 2013 season for the first time since 1998. Linebacker Anthony Barr was selected as a first-team All-America and as the school's first winner of the Lott IMPACT Trophy. A school record 18 true freshmen saw action during the season and seven true freshmen position players started in a game to match that school record. Five Bruins, the most by the program since 2002, were selected in the NFL Draft, headed by Barr's pick at No. 9 overall by the Minnesota Vikings.

In his first year, Mora guided the Bruins to the 2012 South Division Championship of the Pac-12 Conference and matched the school-record for wins by a first-year coach, with nine. The Bruins, who played in the Holiday Bowl, set numerous offensive records during the course of the 2012 season, including establishing a new school rushing leader, in Johnathan Franklin, and several passing marks achieved by Brett Hundley. On defense, Barr emerged as one of the most dynamic performers in the country in his first season as a linebacker and led the nation in sacks for a good portion of the year. Eric Kendricks led the conference in tackles, ranking 11th in the country. Four players were selected in the 2013 NFL Draft, including defensive end Datone Jones in the first round by the Green Bay Packers.

Mora, a former NFC Coach of the Year, came to UCLA after spending part of 2010 and most of 2011 as an analyst and contributor for the NFL Network and the NFL on FOX. He brought 25 years of NFL coaching acumen with him to UCLA, including four years of NFL head coaching experience while at the helm of the Atlanta Falcons (2004-06) and the Seattle Seahawks (2009).

Mora took over for Mike Holmgren as head coach of the Seattle Seahawks in 2009. He had served as assistant head coach and defensive backs coach for Seattle in 2007 and 2008. The Seahawks went 10-6 and finished first in the NFC West in the 2007 season and won the Wild Card game. In his initial season as the head coach of the Falcons in 2004, Mora guided the team to an 11-5 record, becoming just the eighth rookie head coach in NFL history to win 11 games and the 11th to bring home a Division title. Atlanta captured the NFC South title and earned an appearance in the NFC Championship game for only the second time in franchise history. Mora was selected as the NFC Coach of the Year.

The Falcons' defense improved from a league ranking of 32nd in 2003 to No. 14 overall the next season, fueled by a league-leading and franchise record 48 quarterback sacks. Atlanta topped the NFL in rushing in all three of coach Mora's seasons as head coach. In 2006, Michael Vick became the first quarterback in NFL history to rush for at least 1,000 yards.

Mora had joined the Falcons from the San Francisco 49ers where he spent seven seasons, from 1997-2003, including the last five as the defensive coordinator. In his first year, the 49ers finished No. 1 in the NFL in total defense, No. 2 in pass defense (with 25 interceptions), takeaways (41) and run defense, as well as No. 3 in the League in sacks (with 54). The 1998 squad tied for No. 1 in the NFC, and No. 4 in the NFL, with 21 interceptions. The 1997 team advanced to the NFC Championship Game, while the 1998 and 2002 squads captured Wild Card Game wins.

Mora worked the previous five seasons (1992-1996) on the staff of his dad, Jim E. Mora, as the secondary coach with the New Orleans Saints. His defensive expertise began to take shape and the Saints boasted the No. 1 pass defense in the NFL during his first two years. In 1985, Mora broke into the NFL coaching ranks with the San Diego Chargers under head coach Don Coryell. He spent seven seasons with the Chargers, advancing from the league's first quality control coach position to defensive backs coach.

Mora began his coaching career in 1984 at the University of Washington. He joined the staff of Don James in the role of defensive assistant following a four-year playing career as a defensive back for the Huskies. While at UW, Mora had the opportunity to be a part of two Rose Bowl teams (1981-loss to Michigan and 1982-win over Iowa) as a player, in addition to helping the Huskies land a berth in the 1985 Orange Bowl (win over Oklahoma) as a graduate assistant. During his five seasons in the Husky program, Washington compiled a 48-12 record, ranked among the nation's top 10 teams on three occasions, and did not finish lower than second in the Pac-10 standings.

ROSE BOWL: THE 33rd YEAR

The 2014 season marks the 33rd year that the Rose Bowl will serve as home of the Bruins.

UCLA moved to Pasadena from the L.A. Coliseum in the summer of 1982 and went 6-0-1 in that first year, capping the season with a victory over Michigan in the Rose Bowl game.

The 2006 season-opening win against Utah was UCLA's 100th at the Rose Bowl. The Bruins own a record of 135-61-2 since moving to Pasadena, including a 3-2 record in Rose Bowl games. UCLA is 11-5 under Coach Mora in games played in the Rose Bowl. The Bruins are 16-6 in the last 22 home contests and last posted an unbeaten home season in 2005 (6-0).

- **Brett Hundley with a completion % of .725 and a pass efficiency rating of 166.1 is threatening school season marks of .693 (Rick Neuheisel-1983) and 168.6 (Cade McNown-1997)
- **Ishmael Adams has tied the school record with two interception returns (at UVA, at ASU) for touchdowns in a season; current NFL performer Alterraun Verner holds the school career mark with four returns for score.
- **The Bruins are 25 for 25 in the red zone this season (18 tds) to tie for the best % mark in the NCAA this season
- **Thomas Duarte is averaging 18.3 yds on his 18 catches ;Eldridge Massington is averaging 17.2 yds per his 17 catches
- **UCLA has won its last seven games played away from the Rose Bowl (4-0 this season);last time it had a longer streak was in 1997-98 (10)
- **Brett Hundley became first UCLA QB to record a fifth 400-yard career total offense game with his 424-yard effort at Cal; He extended his own school record with his 15th 300-yd total offense game vs. the Golden Bears (424) ... He posted the 8th career 300-yd passing game (330) at Berkeley which is second behind Cade McNown's total of 11
- **Paul Perkins racked up a career-best 190 yards on the ground v. Oregon. It was the most rushing yardage by a Bruin since Johnathan Franklin totaled 194 at Stanford in 2012. Perkins came up just shy of a third straight 100-yard game (99 v. Utah). He had the first two 100-yard games of his career vs. Texas (126) and at ASU (137) earlier this season.**UCLA has won 25 of its last 30 games when winning the turnover battle (83%) and owns a 19-36 record in its last 55 games (34%) when losing or tying the turnover ratio
- **UCLA is 11-4 in true road games (4-2 in '13 and '12) under Coach Mora...In 2012, the Bruins won as many as four road games in a season for the first time since 2002...UCLA is 8-3 in regular season P12 away games since 2012
- **UCLA vs. Ranked Teams Since 2012 (6-6) -- 2014-L #12 Oregon, W at #15 ASU; 2013-W at #23 USC, L at #17 ASU, L at #2 Oregon, L at #13 Stanford, W at #23 Nebraska; 2012-L at #8 Stanford, L #11 Stanford, W #21 USC, W #24 Arizona, W #17 Nebraska.
- **The record of UCLA's remaining opponents is 21-13 (UA is 5-1, UW and USC 5-2, Stanford is 4-3, Colo 2-5)
- **Paul Perkins has run for at least 50 yards in 13 career games, including a career-best 190 yards v. Oregon this season
- **Senior Owamagbe Odighizuwa picked up a sack at Cal and has 6.5 tackles for loss which surpasses his previous season-best total.
- **UCLA played seven true freshmen (OL Najee Toran, DB Jaleel Wadood, DL Jacob Tuioti-Mariner, DL Matt Dickerson, LB Zach Whitley, LB Kenny Young, WR Mossi Johnson) in the opener at UVA. RB Nate Starks joined the list against Memphis and Alex VanDyke at ASU. Last season, it established a school record by playing 18 true freshmen during the year. It also matched the school record of seven true freshmen position players starting in a game (2013 games at Oregon, vs. Colorado).
- **Sophomore LB Myles Jack recorded a career-best 13 tackles at UVA. He became the first player in Pac-12 Conference history to be selected both Freshman Offensive and Defensive Player of the Year. He was also one of five finalists for the Hornung Award as the nation's most versatile player. He has 15 carries this season for 55 yds and one rushing touchdown.
- **PK Ka'imi Fairbairn has connected on 23 straight FG attempts from 35 yards and in; he is now 9th in career scoring at UCLA and has seen 26 of his 44 kickoffs go for touchbacks this season.
- **UCLA is 19-3 under Coach Mora when scoring first, 10-0 when doing so at home; the Bruins are 21-0 under Mora when ahead at the half
- **Brett Hundley completed a school-record-tying 33 passes (for 396 yards and three scores) against Memphis.
- **QB Brett Hundley has thrown for and/or run for a touchdown in all but the Texas game (33/34g) in which he was injured in the first quarter...He has at least one scoring pass in 30 of his 34 career games (not v. Texas-'14, at UVA-2014, at USC-'13, at Stanford '12)...He has thrown for multiple scores in 23 contests and as many as four scores in three contests.
- **Hundley is the first UCLA quarterback to ever throw for at least 300 yards in three straight games (305 Nebraska/320 Houston/372 Oregon St. in 2012).

- **Myles Jack's 75 tackles ranked second on the all-time true freshman tackle list behind Kenny Easley (93 in 1977). Jack's four rushing touchdowns against Washington in 2013 set a true freshman record for a single-game. Five of the team's touchdowns versus the Huskies were scored by defensive players.
- **Returning defensive players who saw action on offense in 2013 include - LB Myles Jack; DL Eddie Vanderdoes; DL Kenny Clark -- They have each seen action this season as well as DL Eli Ankou and DB Ishmael Adams.
- **Brett Hundley finished the 2013 season with one interception in his last 158 passing attempts and none in his final 77. He threw his first interception after 146 attempts v. Memphis. The school mark-199 by Drew Olson in 2005.
- **It was announced at the Memphis game that QB Troy Aikman's jersey #8 would be retired at the Stanford contest Nov. 28.

VS. COLORADO — UCLA leads the series, 7-2 and has captured the last three meetings. UCLA has won all three meetings since the Buffs joined the Pac-12 Conference in 2011. Last season in the Rose Bowl, Brett Hundley threw two scoring passes to Devin Fuller (76, 6 yds) and ran for two more scores (11, 1) himself in a 45-23 Bruin win. Fuller came back to run for a score in the fourth quarter of that contest. CU scored first in the game, but UCLA led 21-13 at the half. The Bruins opened up a 35-13 margin in the third quarter. In 2012, the Bruins came away with a 42-14 victory in game 5 of the season in Boulder. Brett Hundley passed for 281 yards in that contest and threw scoring passes to Darius Bell and Joseph Fauria. Hundley also ran for a couple of scores. In 2011, UCLA stormed out to a 21-0 first quarter lead, outscored the Buffaloes 21-0 again in the fourth quarter, and went on to a 45-6 win in the Rose Bowl. The Bruins became bowl eligible with the win as quarterback Kevin Prince connected on his first eight passes, and 15 of 19 in the game, while throwing for four touchdowns.

Hundley scored a touchdown after taking his first snap as a college player at Rice in 2012. His 372 passing yards against Oregon State in 2012 marked the third straight game above the 300-yard mark, a new school record. It was the second-highest total in a single game by a UCLA freshman (Maddox, 409 vs. USC, 1990).

Hundley graduated early from Chandler HS in Chandler, AZ and joined the Bruins in Winter Quarter 2011 (January). He took part in spring practice at UCLA, but was limited early in the 2011 fall camp due to a summer injury. Hundley did not see action in the 2011 season. He participated in a second spring practice in 2012 and won the starting job in pre-season camp.

The 2014 season is UCLA's 18th with Clear Channel Radio. This will be the eighth year for the Bruins games to be aired on AM 570 Fox Sports LA in Southern California. The broadcasts are produced by IMG, UCLA's corporate and media-rights holder.

The Los Angeles all-sports station's broadcast includes a two-hour pre-game show (one hour local, one hour network) and a post-game show.

Hall of Fame broadcaster Chris Roberts, a four-time Golden Mike Award winner, has been the voice of the Bruins for over 20 years (this is year 23). Former Bruin quarterback Matt Stevens ('83-86) is set to begin his 17th year on the broadcast team and his 13th as the analyst in the booth. Former Bruin quarterback Wayne Cook ('91-94) is in his 12th season as sideline reporter.

AM 570 Fox Sports LA also provides ancillary programming, including head coach and player interviews during game weeks.

UCLA IMG Sports Network games are available nationally through an agreement with Sirius XM Satellite Radio, the Official Satellite Radio Partner of UCLA Athletics.

Games can also be heard via the internet at uclabruins.com, and on the tunein radio app on your mobile devices.

UCLA ON TELEVISION

Following the Cal game 129 of UCLA's last 130 games have been televised live, including 65 in a row.

All of UCLA's games in the 2013, 2012 and 2011 seasons were on live TV. In 2010, each of the 12 contests were broadcast live. The Oregon State game in 2009 is the last game not to be aired live (it was delayed).

The Pac-12 Networks will air conference games and ancillary programming which will feature football coach and player interviews during the season. UCLA is being featured on "The Drive" this season which airs each Wednesday at 7 p.m. PT

BRUIN TIDBITS

Three Bruin coaches and 12 players, including 2014 inductee John Sciarra, 2012 inductee Jonathan Ogden, 2010 inductee Randy Cross and 2008 inductee Troy Aikman, are enshrined in the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame.

UCLA has 15 former players working in the broadcast media - Troy Aikman, Charles Arbuckle, Wayne Cook, Randy Cross, Terry Donahue, Danny Farmer, Ryan Nece, Rick Neuheisel, David Norrie, Ron Pitts, Tom Ramsey, Matt Stevens, J.J. Stokes, Rick Walker, James Washington.

Five Bruins have been voted in to the NFL Hall of Fame-OL Johnathan Ogden-2013; QB Troy Aikman-2006; DB Jimmy Johnson-1994; WR/coach Tom Fears-1970; QB/P/PK/DB Bob Waterfield-1965.

The selection of linebacker Anthony Barr by the Minnesota Vikings in the first round of the 2014 NFL draft marked the 31st time a UCLA player has been taken in round one.

Twenty-two UCLA players have been selected to CoSIDA Academic All-America teams a total of 27 times. Offensive lineman Chris Joseph (2006, 2007) and wide receiver Cormac Carney (1981, 1982) were two-time first-team selections.

UCLA is the only school to produce six quarterbacks — Troy Aikman, Steve Bono, Billy Kilmer, Tommy Maddox, Tom Ramsey, Jay Schroeder — to have played that position on a Super Bowl team.

Quarterback Drew Olson finished eighth in the 2005 Heisman Trophy balloting. It marked the 21st time that a Bruin has finished in the top 10 of the Heisman Trophy voting.

UCLA has had at least one former player participate in 30 of the last 33 Super Bowl games.

The only three-time consensus All-Americans in Pac-10 history are Bruins (LB Jerry Robinson and S Kenny Easley).

Since 2000, UCLA has had 17 finalists / winners of National player awards --- 2013 Anthony Barr - Lott IMPACT Trophy winner, Lombardi Award finalist, Bednarik Award finalist; Myles Jack - Hornung Award finalist; 2012 Johnathan Franklin - Doak Walker Award finalist; 2009 Kai Forbath - Groza Award winner; 2005 Mercedes Lewis-Mackey Award winner; 2004 M. Lewis, Mackey finalist; 2002 Mike Seidman-Mackey finalist; 2004 Chris Kluwe-Ray Guy Award finalist; 2003 Dave Ball-Bronco Nagurski Award finalist; 2001 Robert Thomas-Dick Butkus Award finalist; 2000 Freddie Mitchell-Fred Biletnikoff Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Vince Lombardi Award finalist; 2006 Justin Hickman-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Ted Hendricks Award finalist; 2003 D. Ball-Chevrolet National Defensive Player of the Year Award.

On May 13, 2007 UCLA became the first school in history to win 100 NCAA team championships. The Bruins currently have 111 NCAA titles to their credit (winning women's soccer and women's tennis this past year).

- **LB Eric Kendricks tops the team with 36 career starts; QB Brett Hundley is next at 34
- **The Bruins had played as a ranked team for the previous 24 straight games heading into Cal last week. UCLA was ranked going into 25 straight contests in 1997-99.
- **Thirty-two freshmen and sophomores saw action in the opener vs. Virginia - seven true freshmen / 9 have played this season
- **UCLA played three of its first four games away from home for the first time since 2001 season when it played at Alabama, at Kansas, home to Ohio State, and at Oregon State in a 4-0 start
- **Devin Fuller's 93-yard pass play vs. Utah ties for the second-longest in school history and is the longest since 2005
- **Hundley's pair of 80-yard completions at ASU marked first time a UCLA QB had two completions of at least that distance in same game
- **Ishmael Adams' kickoff return for a score at ASU was first by Bruin since Matthew Slater (now NE Pats) in 2007 v. Arizona.
- Comparing Adams at ASU to the school records --- 296 Adams' all-purpose yards / record is 384 Maruice Jones Drew v. UW 2004 and his 201 return yards / record is 206 Terrence Austin 2008 v. Fresno St.
- Adams' KOR and Int. Return for scores were the first by a FBS player in a road game since 2003 (Adam Jones, WVU)
- **UCLA has won 10 of its last 11 non-conference matchups, losing to Baylor ('12). It has won all nine regular season non-conference games and split a pair of bowl games under Coach Mora.
- **The 20-17 win at Texas marked the 23rd straight game the Bruins have won when the opponent has scored less than 20 points. UCLA's last setback when holding an opponent to less than 20 came in a 17-16 decision against BYU in the 2007 Las Vegas Bowl. The last regular season loss came in a 2003 date at Colorado (14-16) which has been followed by a streak of 42 straight Bruin wins in regular season games that the opponent has scored less than 20 points.
- **UCLA's three defensive scores at UVa were the first by a Bruin team since a 1986 contest at Oregon State, played in Portland, Ore., where LB Eric Smith (fumble), DB Craig Rutledge (int.) and DB Alan Dial (int.) each scored.
- **Junior receiver Jordan Payton made a career-best eight catches at UVa and set a career-high with 151 yards at ASU.
- **DL Kenny Clark registered a career-best eight tackles in the opener at UVa and matched that total at Cal, adding 1.5 TFLs.
- **DL Owamagbe Odighizuwa totaled a career-best eight stops vs. Utah and added a career-high 4.0 tackles for loss
- **The Bruins became the first FBS team since 2009 to score three defensive touchdowns in one quarter; they also were the first in a decade to score three in one half against a Power Five conference opponent.
- **UCLA had as many as four players selected in the first four rounds of the 2014 NFL Draft for the first time since 1996.
- **2013 was the first season UCLA has managed to be ranked in each of the year's AP polls since the 1998 campaign. The No. 16 ranking in the final AP poll was the first time UCLA has been listed in the season-ending rankings since 2005 (also 16).
- **The coaching staff was kept virtually intact, with Mike Tuiasosopo (OLB/Special Teams) joining the group for Spring practice. Kennedy Polamalu (Running Backs) was added to the staff in time to coach for the Sun Bowl.
- **LB Eric Kendrick's blocked FG v. Washington in '13 was 12th kick blocked by Bruins since Jim Mora became head coach
- **Hundley's completion percentage of .668 in 2013 was the highest by a Bruin starter since 1983 (Rick Neuheisel - .693). Hundley was the first Bruin QB to lead the team in rushing since Larry Zeno in 1964.
- **UCLA started a true freshman on OL in season-opener for 3rd straight season (Najee Toran-2014; Alex Redmond-2013; Simon Goines-2012)
- **Coach Jim Mora's 19 wins in his first two seasons are the most by any Bruin coach in their first two campaigns at the school. Bob Toledo holds the mark for the most wins in the first three years on the job (25). The 2013 Bruins became the 8th team in school history to have won more than 9 games and tied the school mark with 10 wins.

Last season, the Bruins won at Utah on a Thursday night and at home versus Washington on a Friday night. UCLA had also played a Friday game during the regular season in 2011 at Arizona State. The most recent previous home game to have been played on Friday was against Arizona on Oct. 27, 1978.

In 2012, UCLA opened the season with a win at Rice on a Thursday evening. In 2011, it played at Arizona on a Thursday evening. In the 2010 season, the Bruins played three non-Saturday games - Thu. Oct. 21 at Oregon, Thu. Nov. 18 at Washington and Fri. Nov. 26 at ASU.

Prior to 2010, the last time the Bruins played a regular-season non-Saturday game was Friday, Nov. 28, 2008 at Arizona State, dropping a 34-9 decision. The Bruins also played a Monday night game that year, defeating Tennessee, 27-24 in overtime on Labor Day night (Aug. 30). Before 2008, UCLA had not played on a week night since Thurs., Sept. 30, 1993, a 52-13 victory at San Diego State. The Bruins also played at San Diego State on Thurs., Sept. 26, 1991 (won, 37-12).

AT THE STARTING LINE — Redshirt senior linebacker Eric Kendricks tops the team with 36 career starts. The player with the most offensive starts (34) is redshirt junior Brett Hundley. The position player with the longest starting streak on the squad is Hundley with 34. Position players making their first career starts this season include - LB Deon Hollins, DB Tahaan Goodman, LB Kenny Young, DB Jaleel Waddood, OL Najee Toran, FB Nate Iese, WR Eldridge Massington, (OL Malcolm Bunche started at Miami), REC Tyler Scott, OL Kenny Lacy, DB Marcus Rios, OL Conor McDermott, DL Takkarist McKinley, DB Priest Willis.

Fifteen true frosh saw action in the 2013 opener against Nevada. UCLA played 12 true freshmen in 2012. One first-year player saw action in 2011. In both 2009 and 2010, UCLA played 10 true freshmen.

UCLA has started a true freshman in each of the last three season-openers along the offensive line. The last true freshman defender to start an opener was safety Rahim Moore in 2008 vs. Tennessee.

LINEBACKER — Senior **ERIC KENDRICKS (#6)** became just the fourth Bruin defender to total as many as 400 tackles for a career during the Oregon game. He moved into second on the all-time school list for tackles during the Cal game.

Kendricks has three defensive touchdowns in his career, one shy of the school record held jointly by future NFL performers Alterraun Verner (2006-09) and Spencer Havner (2001-05). He led or tied for the team lead in tackles for all seven games this season. He had 10 stops v. Oregon which was the 20th double-digit tackle game of his career. At UVA, he began the 2014 season with 16 tackles. The co-captain added a forced fumble which was returned for a touchdown and a 37-yard interception return for a touchdown of his own. Kendricks was named the National Defensive Player of the Week by Nagurski, Athlon and Walter Camp and the Pac-12 Conference POW.

He started all 11 games he played in 2013 and served as co-captain. He led the team in tackles for the second straight season; ranked third in the Pac-12 in tackles average (8.8). He posted four double-digit tackle games topped by 13-stop efforts at Utah and at Arizona. In 2012, he started all 14 games in 2012. He led the Pac-12 in tackles with an average of 10.64, a mark which ranked 11th in the nation. He was the first Bruin to lead the conference in tackles since Spencer Havner in 2004. During 2012, Kendricks returned two fumbles for scores (23 yards Houston/40 at Washington St.), blocked a punt (USC) and made his first career interception (USC). His total of 150 tackles was the most by a Bruin player since Jerry Robinson registered a school-record 161 stops in 1978. He had a best of 17 tackles at Arizona State. He was named Pac-12 Player of the Week after the USC and Arizona wins.

He appeared in all 14 games in 2011, starting the final three games. Kendricks was second on the squad in tackles.

Kendricks' dad, Marv, played at UCLA and led the team in rushing in 1970 and 1971. Eric's brother, Mychal, played linebacker for Cal and is now starting his third season in the NFL with the Eagles.

True sophomore linebacker **MYLES JACK (#30)** registered nine stops, including a tackle for loss, v. Oregon. He added three carries on offense (14 yds) and ran in a two-point conversion. Jack had seven tackles v. Texas and had five carries on offense for 14 yards. He had six tackles, one for loss, and carried three times on offense for one score v. Memphis. Jack recorded a career-best 13 tackles in the opener at UVA and was credited with two pass defenses. He did not see action on offense versus the Cavaliers.

Last season, he became the first player in conference history to be named both Offensive and Defensive Freshman of the Year by the Pac-12 coaches. He was also a finalist for the Hornung Award as the nation's most versatile player. Jack joined the starting lineup at linebacker last year in game two at Nebraska. CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. – Brett Hundley was all smiles, mostly because of his defense.

Seventh-ranked UCLA scored three defensive touchdowns in the second quarter Saturday, and Hundley led them on a critical second-half scoring drive as the Bruins escaped Virginia 28-20 in the opener for both teams.

“Sometimes a game like this might be good to get our team understanding that every game we have to come with it,” the quarterback said. “We have to understand what we train for and we have to do it. ... We have a lot of stuff to work on.”

Hundley, widely regarded as one of the nation’s top quarterbacks, was harassed all day by Virginia’s pressure defense, which sacked him five times, and made the biggest play of the day for UCLA with his feet. It came on a 6-yard touchdown run late in the third quarter when safety Quin Blanding met him around the 3 yard-line, and Hundley overpowered him.

The Bruins have no such problem behind center, and when he needed to, Hundley showed why. UCLA led just 21-17 and had not scored an offensive touchdown when it took over at its 34 late in the third quarter.

Hundley completed passes of 15 yards to Eldridge Massington and 25 yards to Thomas Duarte on the 66-yard march, and capped it with the run up the middle, bullying over safety Blanding for the TD. That made it 28-17, and all the momentum brought by Johns’ play dissipated.

PASADENA, Calif. – Brett Hundley passed for 396 yards and three touchdowns, Paul Perkins rushed for two scores and No. 11 UCLA survived a fourth-quarter scare for a 42-35 victory over Memphis on Saturday night.

Thomas Duarte caught two TD passes and linebacker Myles Jack rushed for his first score of the season for the Bruins (2-0), who barely held off the underdog Tigers (1-1) despite 540 yards of total offense.

Memphis safety Fritz Etienne returned an interception 17 yards for the tying score with 13:44 to play moments after Doroland Dorceus’ 40-yard TD run, stunning a Rose Bowl crowd expecting an easy win.

But Duarte caught a 33-yard TD pass with 10:52 left, and the Bruins’ defense made three late stops to secure their fourth straight win in a home opener.

Kenneth Walker III caught an early 62-yard TD pass as the Bruins’ offense bounced back from a weak effort in their closer-than-expected 28-20 victory at Virginia last week, which included just one offensive touchdown.

The Bruins had little trouble scoring at the Rose Bowl, but their defense struggled against the Memphis offense led by Lynch, racking up 469 yards.

Jack, the Bruins’ two-way star, saw action at running back for the first time this season, and he scored on a bruising 4-yard rush in the third quarter. The sophomore linebacker was the Pac-12’s offensive and defensive newcomer of the year last season.

Texas went three-and-out, and took only 71 seconds off the clock. But the Bruins didn't need much time.

Paul Perkins had 126 yards on 24 carries for the Bruins, and caught five passes for 69 yards.

PASADENA, Calif. – The No. 18 UCLA football team lost to No. 12 Oregon, 42-30, before 80,139 fans at the Rose Bowl in a Pac-12 showdown on Saturday afternoon.

UCLA's offense accounted for 553 total yards, with running back Paul Perkins leading the way. Perkins had a career-high 190 rushing yards on 22 carries for the Bruins (4-2, 1-2 Pac-12).

Quarterback Brett Hundley accounted for four UCLA touchdowns (three passing, one rushing), totaling 216 passing yards and 89 yards on the ground. Hundley completed 26 of 37 pass attempts and had one pass intercepted.

Oregon (5-1, 2-1) took an 8-0 lead with 4:47 to play in the opening quarter and led for the rest of the game. The Ducks got on the board with a 13-yard run from quarterback Marcus Mariota, who accounted for four total touchdowns on Saturday – two in the air and two on the ground.

Mariota finished the game having completed 17 of 27 passes for 210 yards and two touchdowns. The Ducks' quarterback netted 75 rushing yards on seven attempts, including a pair of rushing touchdowns.

Hundley finished the game having completed 19 of 29 passes for 115 yards and one touchdown. On the ground, the Bruins' quarterback netted 85 yards on 20 carries.

BERKELEY, Calif. — Brett Hundley threw for 330 yards and two touchdowns and added a third score on the ground to help UCLA snap a seven-game skid at California with a 36-34 victory Saturday.

Hundley accounted for 424 yards of offense to overcome his own fumble and interception as the Bruins (5-2, 2-2 Pac-12) won at Memorial Stadium for the first time since 1998.

It wasn't easy with the Bruins not taking the lead for good until Ka'imi Fairbairn kicked his third field goal, a 26-yarder with 3:40 remaining that provided the go-ahead score and helped UCLA get back on the winning track after losses to Utah and Oregon.

The win was sealed when Marcus Rios made a juggling interception on a Jared Goff pass at the 2-yard line with 51 seconds left to thwart Cal's comeback attempt.

Goff threw for 303 yards and two touchdowns for the Golden Bears (4-3, 2-3), who have lost back-to-back home games after an impressive 4-1 start to the season.

But Hundley responded by leading the field goal drive and then got the big play from his defense to win it.

The Bruins were then held to a field goal following Mossi Johnson's 67-yard kickoff return and the Bears managed to take the lead late in the third when Davis made a leaping grab while being interfered with by Jaleel Wadood for a 24-yard score.

UCLA answered on Hundley's 15-yard run in the closing seconds of the third to take a 33-28 lead heading into the fourth.
